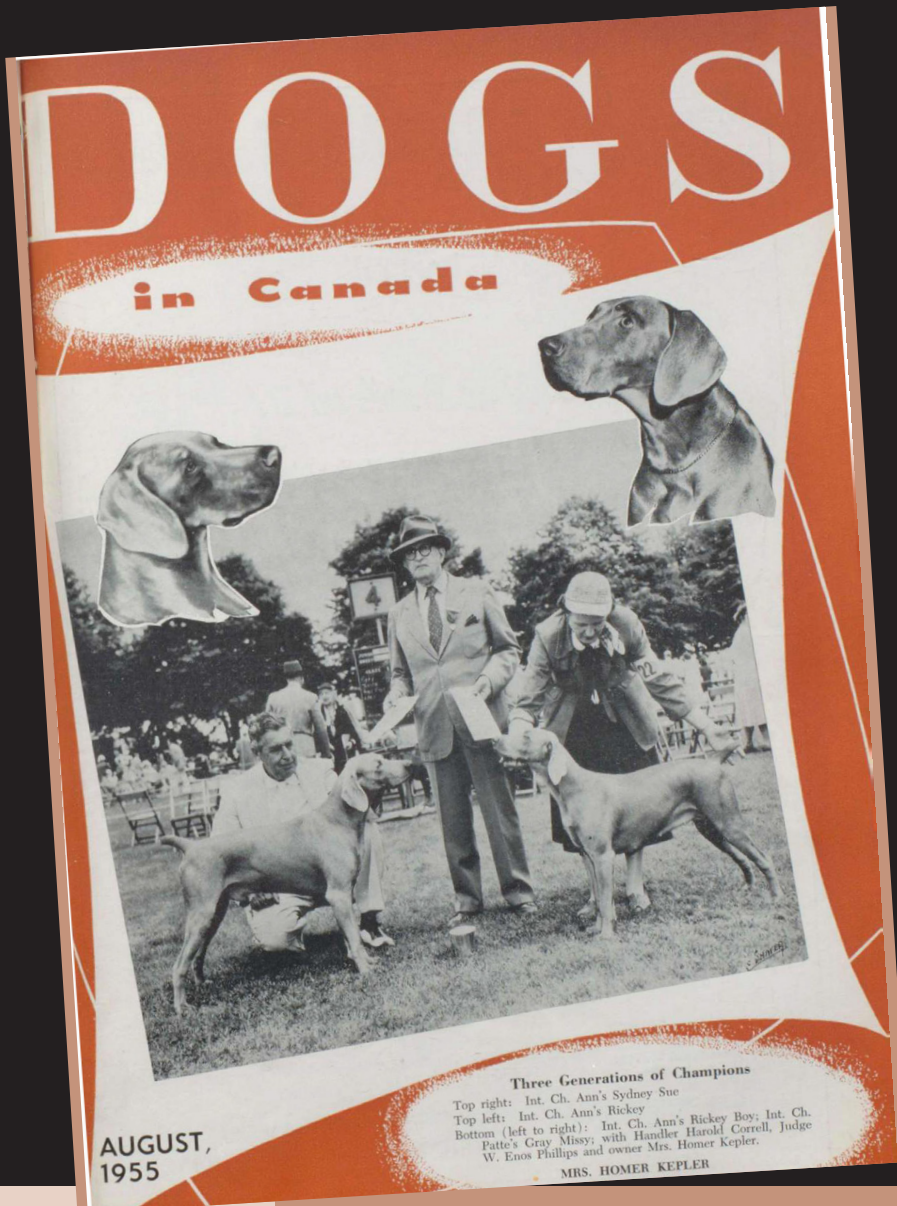

2020 ELECTIONS AND REFERENDUM: YOUR CLUB - YOUR VOTE

CKC is gearing up for the 2020 elections, which means it's time for you to have your say on who you want to represent your Zone on the CKC Board of Directors.

Responsible for presenting the concerns and opinions of the constituents in their respective Zones, Zone Directors also have the fiduciary responsibility to:

- act, at all times, in the best interests of The Canadian Kennel Club as a whole;
- with complete certainty, be aware of and fully understand all matters relating to the management of the corporation and shall, at all times, be comfortable that they are fully aware of all the facts prior to making any decision on any matter before the Board;
- continually maintain a level of mutual respect in the performance of their duties, whether those duties being performed are at the table, in their respective zones or in communication with the membership of The Canadian Kennel Club or the general public;
- respect and accept the decision of the majority and thereafter shall support any decision which is made by the Board as a whole, regardless of their personal opinions and regardless of the manner in which they may have voted at the time.

In addition to voting on proposed changes to CKC by-laws and the 2021-2023 Board of Directors members, during this year's election and referendum CKC Members have the opportunity to vote on three breeds – the Japanese Akita, Parson Russell Terrier and Russkiy Toy - and their ROE for full recognition.

UPDATE RE: UKRAINIAN FLIGHT INCIDENT - CFIA STATEMENT ON NEW IMPORT RESTRICTIONS

Following the tragic loss of dogs on a Ukrainian flight that arrived in Toronto on June 13th, 2020, the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) has released a statement that commercial import permits for dogs less than 8 months old coming from the Ukraine will no longer be issued. In their July 6th [statement](#), the CFIA states:

“Effective July 6, 2020, the CFIA will no longer issue new permits for the importation of commercial dogs under 8 months of age from Ukraine.

The CFIA's decision is based on investigation findings of possible failures to comply with import requirements, including animal welfare concerns. These actions will remain in effect until the CFIA is satisfied that import conditions and international transport standards are in place and that animals will travel safely in the future.”

Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) is pleased with CFIA's decision to impose these new restrictions and we are cautiously optimistic they will contribute to an increased dialog on this issue that will have a lasting impact on the mass importation of dogs into Canada.

The large-scale importation of dogs and associated diseases into Canada is of grave concern to CKC. While this decision is a positive first-step, stronger regulations that permit the safe importation of small numbers of dogs for legitimate purposes, while restricting the mass importation of dogs into Canada, are still needed.

CKC continues to work with the American Kennel Club (AKC), National Animal Interest Alliance (NAIA), and other organizations including the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association and CFIA to strengthen dog importation regulations and develop proposed legislative changes that protect animal and public health from the risks associated with mass dog importation. CKC and its members are resolute in our stance that stronger government regulations are needed to control the mass importation of dogs while respecting the legitimate need for our members to import small numbers of purebred dogs safely for the purposes of breeding, events and competition. CKC IN TALKS WITH AKC AND NAI A RE: US DOG IMPORTATION LEGISLATION

The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) has been in discussions with The American Kennel Club (AKC) and the National Animal Interest Alliance (NAIA) regarding the newly introduced Healthy Dog Importation Act (H.R. 6921)—a Bill to amend the Animal Health Protection Act with respect to the importation of live dogs, and for other purposes.

Together, we are working to support the development of legislation that protects animal and public health from the risk of infectious diseases associated with dog importation, while supporting KKC members and their dogs who cross the US border for breeding, events and competition. We are aware that once written, the regulations may present challenges to our members and our US partners will work to ensure CKC members and Canadian dogs are well-represented during the regulatory process. We value the importance of our long-standing Canada/US relationship and are committed to strengthening this process, with the appropriate safeguards in place.

The proposed changes include:

- All imported dogs must be in good health, permanently identified and vaccinated, with certification of vaccination by a licensed veterinarian.
- Imported dogs for transfer to a third party such as resale, adoption, exchange, or donation, must be at least six months of age and accompanied by a U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) import permit before entering the country. (*Importing a dog for your own use is not affected by this requirement*)
- The new Act would also streamline and coordinate federal oversight, ensuring documentation and import permits are shared electronically between APHIS, CDC, and Customs and Border Patrol, while clarifying APHIS' key enforcement authority.
- All Certificates of Veterinary Inspection for transport in commerce are required to be sent to USDA for inclusion in a centralized database.

During a time when we are facing the threat of the spread of infectious disease in our respective countries, the need for stricter legislative measures is stronger than ever. In fact, CKC has been working with the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association on the issue of the mass importation of dogs and risks to public and animal health. CKC is committed to working with our partners on both sides of the border, to keep our communities and dogs safe, while protecting the interests of our members. Further updates will be provided once more information becomes available.

Announced at the most recent board meeting held virtually June 6 & 7, 2020, the CKC Board of Directors is pleased to share CKC Life Member Thora Brown and Dr. Eric Carnegie have been appointed as Honourary Chair of the CKC and Honourary Veterinarian for 2020, respectively.



Thora Brown has been a fixture of the Canadian Dog Fancy for over five decades. A world-renowned All Breed Dog Judge, Thora is the founding member of many CKC-recognized clubs, including the Ottawa Valley All Setter Association, the English Cocker Spaniel Club of Canada, Group VI Club of

Ontario, the Golden Triangle Cocker Spaniel Club, and more. Thora is known as an expert in the Setter breeds and has owned and shown BIS & BISS winning Cocker Spaniels, Irish Setters, Whippets, and Bulldogs. She is an excellent representative of our judging fraternity and the Dog Fancy, always keen to share her knowledge and skills with those willing to learn.

Thora currently sits as Chair of the CKC Rules of Eligibility Committee, was Chair of the Event Officiating Committee, and served as President of the Canadian Dog Judges Association from 2006-2013. Having also served on the CKC Board of Directors as Representative for Zone 5-Eastern Ontario for three years and as a past Chair of the CKC Board of Directors, the CKC Board was honored to invite Thora to sit as Honourary Chair of the CKC for 2020.
