CANADIAN DOGS ROCK WESTMINSTER 2021!

While so many Canadians shudder at the thought of February weather, I along with countless other members of the Canadian dog fancy count down the days until we can go down to Manhattan (a trip to a spot sometimes colder than where we left) to take in Westminster Week.

I watched the Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show on the television with my father each and every year of my childhood and swore that one day I would go to the greatest dog show in North America. It's no secret that many things you look forward to in your youth don't shine as bright in real life,

but Westminster is a big exception. It may just be even more incredible to see in real life than it is to watch on television or stream online! From the Masters Agility to Meet the Breeds, the incredible benched conformation show to the dozens of vendors, and, of course, the thousands of stunning purebred dogs, Westminster delivers on all fronts. Additionally, having a big dog show in downtown Manhattan, just adds to the experience, as it allows "city folk" into the world of competitive dog sports.

This year, unfortunately, like so many other things, the Westminster Kennel Club could not go ahead with its regularly scheduled breed showing at the Piers and group judging at Madison Square Garden during its normal time slot (usually Family Day weekend, which means I don't have to use as many vacation days from work - score!). As the pandemic grew worse, the date and venue changed. Due to pandemic restrictions, I could not attend this year's show. I was disappointed, but through the magic of television and social media, I got to watch our Canadian dogs rock Westminster once again!

The 145th Annual Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show was held at Lyndhurst, a property of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, in Tarrytown, New York, on Saturday, June 12, and Sunday, June 13, 2021. Due to pandemic restrictions, a move to a later date for an outdoor dog show was necessary to uphold Westminster's commitment to the health and safety of everyone and dog who attends their show.

Westminster Weekend started off with the Masters Agility Championship on Friday, June 11, 2021, followed by junior showmanship, breed, group, and Best in Show judging on June 12 and 13, 2021. The Masters Obedience Championship was on Sunday, June 13, 2021.

This was a particularly exciting show for the four new breeds the American Kennel Club recognized, as this was their first time competing at Westminster. The new breeds are the Barbet, Belgian Laekenois, Biewer Terrier and Dogo Argentino.

Although we didn't have as many Canadian dogs competing this year, our dogs once again wowed at Westminster! Please join me in congratulations these outstanding Canadian dogs, their owners, their handlers and most importantly, their breeders.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB MISSION STATEMENT

Who We Are

The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) is the primary registry body for purebred dogs in Canada and currently recognizes 187 breeds. As a non-profit organization, the CKC is dedicated to encouraging, guiding, and advancing the interests of purebred dogs and their responsible owners and breeders in Canada and promoting the knowledge and understanding of the benefits which dogs can bring to Canadian society.

The CKC is incorporated under Animal Pedigree Act, a federal statute under the auspices of the Ministry of Agriculture. The organization includes approximately 20,000 individual members and over 700 breed clubs across Canada. The Club registers purebred dogs, regulates dog shows and performance events, and speaks out on major issues concerning dog ownership and the health & welfare of dogs across Canada.

Mission
