MICROCHIPS HAVE A VERY LONG LIFE SPAN. The microchip contains no internal battery but is powered by energy it receives from the scanner or reader--resulting in an extremely long life span.

EVERY MICROCHIPPED DOG REGISTERED WITH THE CKC IS AUTOMATICALLY ENROLLED IN THE CANADACHIP RECOVERY DATABASE. CANADACHIP is a national pet recovery program offered by the CKC. Any companion animal microchipped by a CKC member, is also part of the CANADACHIP program. Any veterinarian or breeder who is a member of the CKC can purchase microchips through the CANADACHIP program.

HOW DOES CANADACHIP WORK? When a lost animal is recovered, it is scanned for a microchip and a call will be made to the 24-hour recovery database. Based on the code number of the microchip, the pet owner listed in the database files can be easily traced and contacted, avoiding the delays and potential misinterpretations found with other forms of pet ID.

PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD

There may be occasions where CKC members wish to make a presentation to the Board and just don't know how to go about it. Suggestions and comments are brought forward through the MemberVoice initiative, either via the MemberVoice hotline at 1-866-988-7888 or by email at membervoice@ckc.ca. CKC also receives input through web surveys or more detailed research like the questionnaires regarding the new Strategic Plan. In many instances, our information and questions come to us, as individual Directors, directly from our members. Sometimes communication is directed through the Board Chair and presented as correspondence at the regular meetings of the Board.

All of these channels provide valuable input and allow us to stay in touch with the membership, but individuals or delegations may also want to communicate directly with the Board. This may be necessary in order to articulate specifics that require in-depth personal explanation on urgent matters and best done personally at a Board meeting. Individuals or delegations may make presentations to the Board and the procedure has straight forward requirements. To have an item placed on a meeting agenda, there is a simple three-step process that must be adhered to. By planning ahead, you can have your say and avoid the frustration of last minute attempts to add your presentation to a meeting agenda.

Details on how to formally make a presentation to the Board can be found in the CKC Policy and Procedures Manual (Chapter IX, Board of Directors, Section D. 3, 4 and 6), which is available on the member side of the CKC website under "Membership Services". In summary, however, here are the main steps in the process:

- A written submission outlining the intent of the presentation must be received by the CEO prior to set cut-off dates.

- The CEO is responsible for establishing reasonable cut-off dates for the submission of items to be placed on the agenda and has done so for the three-year term of this Board, including the final meeting in December 2011. The deadlines are included below and are also posted on the member side of the CKC website for your reference.

- The item has been approved by the CEO and Chair for inclusion on the agenda.

We hope that this information assists those wishing to make a presentation and also facilitates the process of expanding communications at all levels within the Club. We encourage the CKC membership to communicate, and regardless of how you choose to do so, we look forward to your input; and remember, all CKC Board Meetings are open for members, so if you have the opportunity, please join us in the gallery.

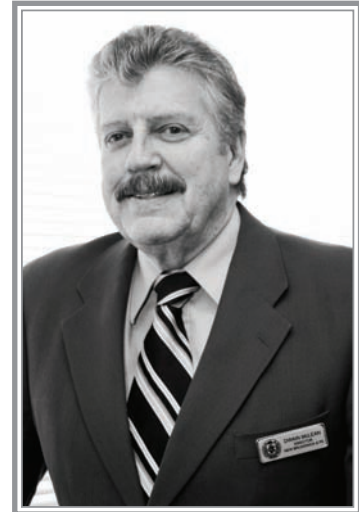

PROFILING YOUR DIRECTORS

DWAIN McLEAN DIRECTOR, NEW BRUNSWICK AND PEI CHAIR, CKC BOARD



While a child growing up in New Brunswick, Dwain McLean discovered his first American Cocker Spaniel when his dad brought home the family's first pet. Dwain's love for the breed has never wavered since that time. With a little more preparation some 25 years ago, Dwain purchased his own cocker spaniel and brought it home as the answer to his family's request for a dog.

Now retired, Dwain was a professional educator in New Brunswick for some 36 years, nine as a high school teacher of Mathematics and French, then twenty-seven years as an executive with the New Brunswick Teachers' Association. He is married to Joan, also a teacher, and they have four grown daughters and six grandchildren.

Since his retirement Dwain spends much of his time in volunteer activities - with the New Brunswick Association of Community Living, the New Brunswick Kindness Club Foundation, the Canadian Red Cross, the Canadian Deafblind Rubella Association (provincially and nationally), his church, and of course, the Canadian Kennel Club.

Dwain was elected to the CKC Board in a by-election in the summer of 2004. Later that year he was elected as its Chair. When re-elected to the CKC Board for 2005 – 2008, he was also re-elected as its Chair. Once again, on re-election to the CKC Board for 2009 – 2011, Dwain was honoured with his re-election to his third term as its Chair.

His love and commitment to the sport of dogs has kept him busy over the years with his own dogs, now including American Cockers (25 years), Yorkshire Terriers (20 years), and Labrador Retrievers (10 years), as well as with the sport itself. He breeds and shows all three breeds.

"I never tire of working with the dogs," Dwain says. "They still interest and fascinate me every day! In spite of the disappointment of losing a puppy or missing a Winners ribbon, I still love the time spent with the dogs, and with talking to, and helping others get involved in the sport."

The challenges today for the purebred dog fancy are many, but Dwain has no regrets with his own involvement, and loves to meet others with the same passion.

- 9. A motion was adopted to develop formal partnerships with the CVMA, Canadian Veterinary Colleges, the Canadian Federation of Humane Societies and the Canadian SPCA through the Responsible Dog Ownership Committee.

10. The firm of BDO Dunwoody was appointed auditors.
11. The firm of Gowling Lafleur Henderson LLP was appointed legal counsel.

14. A report on Apex Publishing Ltd. was presented by Ann McDonagh, Publisher.
15. The Directors’ allowance for Ontario North, Ontario Central, Manitoba and Quebec was raised to \$6000 to correspond with all other Board members.
16. A motion was adopted to amend the contract with Nestle Purina in order to allow 50% of the profits received from the March 2009 Purina National be donated to the Dog Legislation of Canada rather than the CKC Foundation.
17. The amateur status of Marie-Josée Moranville and Jamie Balesdent was approved effective December 6, 2009.
18. An interim report on the 2009 Purina National was presented.
19. A report on FCI was presented and a proposal to resolve the judges ban was endorsed.
20. A motion was passed to direct the CEO to develop a response to the concerns and recommendations raised by the Agriculture Canada in their correspondence to the Chihuahua Club of Canada
21. Mr. Werle presented a motion to reduce the Saskatchewan Director’s allowance from \$6000 to \$5500 with the \$500 reduction to be applied to the budget that Responsible Dog Ownership Committee for increased communication to develop formal partnerships and it was approved.
22. The Board approved the dates of July 7th and 8th, 2009 for the Canadian Agility Team fundraiser trials to be held in conjunction with the Blue Water Kennel Club Shows and Trials.
23. The Charity Event Committee was appointed for April 1st, 2009 to March 31st, 2012 comprised of: Mr. Furlan, the sponsor, Mr. Paquette, Mrs. Jones, Mr. Rowbotham, and the Director of the zone where the event will be held.
