CONFORMATION AND OBEDIENCE TRIAL CLUBS

Premium Lists and Judging Schedules

Throughout the past year more and more clubs have neglected to submit a Premium List and Judging Schedule to CKC Head Office. While this information is required in accordance with the rules, it also provides Head Office with important information that may be necessary when dealing with club or judge issues. Premium Lists and Judging Schedules can be forwarded via mail to 200 Ronson Drive, Suite 400, Etobicoke ON M9W 5Z9, Attention: Shows and Trials, or via e-mail directly to Shows-Trials@ckc.ca

CONFORMATION SHOW RULES

Section 6.1.3

“The show-giving club shall forward one copy of the premium list to each of the following: The CKC Head Office (Shows & Trials Division); the judges for the show; the local CKC Board member; and, the Conformation Show Representative. These are to be received not less than 60 days prior to the date of the show.”

Section 6.3.2

“At the time of distribution of the judging schedule to exhibitors, the show-giving club shall forward a copy to CKC Head Office (Shows & Trials Division), each judge on the panel for the show, the local CKC Board member and the Conformation Show Representative of the zone in which the show is to be held.”

OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES & REGULATIONS

Section 4.1.4

“At the time of distribution of premium lists to prospective exhibitors, 2 copies of the premium list must be sent to The Canadian Kennel Club and one copy each to the Obedience Trial Representative and Board member representing the zone in which the trial is to be held. When a specialty trial is held in conjunction with an all-breed event, it is the responsibility of the specialty club to separate its premium list data from the all-breed premium list and distribute copies as required, making sure that the event is clearly identified.”

Section 4.3.2

“An identification card (containing name and number of a dog, class entered, and name of exhibitor) and a judging schedule must be sent to all exhibitors once entries have closed. The judging schedule must include the number of dogs entered in each class. A copy of the judging schedule must be sent to the CKC Head Office, each officiating judge, the CKC Board member and CKC Obedience Representative representing the zone in which the trial is being held.”
