

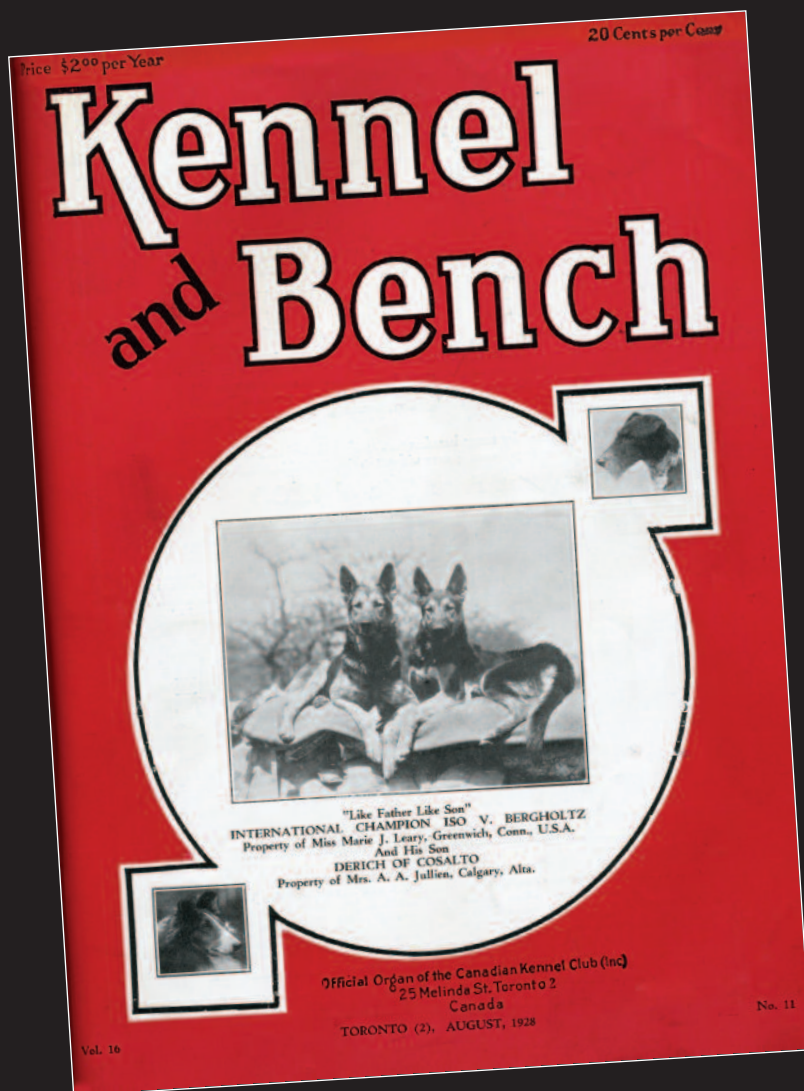

NOMINATION & ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS

An Overview and Explanation of the Process

The following information has been extracted from Section 12 of the current CKC *By-laws* governing elections. The information provided below has been paraphrased to simplify reading and understanding of the requirements. At all times, the content of the actual *By-laws* shall govern with respect to this process.

A. NUMBER OF BOARD MEMBERS TO BE ELECTED

1. Twelve (12) Board Members shall be elected for the 2012-2014 term in the manner prescribed by the *By-laws*. The year 2011 shall be an election year.
2. Each Board Member shall be elected on the vote of those members who are eligible to vote in each electoral zone. For the purpose of this election, those zones shall be as follows:

Zone 1 Newfoundland and Labrador & Nova Scotia

Zone 2 Prince Edward Island & New Brunswick

Zone 3 Québec

Zone 4 Ontario North

Zone 5 Ontario East

Zone 6 Ontario West

Zone 7 Ontario Central

Zone 8 Manitoba

Zone 9 Saskatchewan

Zone 10 Alberta, Northwest Territories & Nunavut

Zone 11 British Columbia – Southwest

Zone 12 British Columbia – Interior & Yukon

B. VOTER ELIGIBILITY

1. In order to be eligible to vote, nominate or seek office, a member must first meet all of the following requirements on the date the Official Voters List is created and again on the date the ballots are mailed:
 - a) Regular Member in good standing
 - b) Resident of the relevant electoral zone
 - c) Completed one (1) year continuous membership in the Club
 - d) Attained the age of nineteen (19) years
2. Any person in receipt of salary, wages, commission, bonus or any form of emolument from the Club, shall not be eligible to move or second a nomination, be nominated, stand for election and/or be elected as a

Board member. This does not pertain to those Board members, committee members, members and volunteers who may be paid a per diem or receive reimbursement for expenses in accordance with established CKC policy.

3. [Confirming your name on the voters list is easy, just visit our website or call the election information line at: 1-855-DOGSCKC \(1-855-364-7252\). Deadline for revisions to the voters list is Wednesday, September 14, 2011.](#)

C. ADMINISTRATION OF THE ELECTION

1. The accounting firm of BDO Canada LLP of Mississauga, Ontario, has been officially appointed to act as the independent and impartial Election Commission. It will be solely responsible for all administration and tabulation of the entire process, including nominations, election and results.
2. The Chief Executive Officer of the CKC shall be responsible for assisting the Election Commission and performing those functions as designated in the *By-laws*.

D. NOMINATION PROCEDURE

1. Only members entitled to vote (see item B) are eligible to nominate and second a candidate for Board Member. The nominator and seconder must reside within the electoral zone for which the candidate is being nominated. The person being nominated must also reside within the electoral zone for which he/she is being nominated.
2. A nomination paper is included in this issue. Using this form, or a photocopy of same, complete the nomination paper in its entirety ensuring that the nominee fully completes his/her section as well. All nomination papers must be signed by two (2) eligible members, as well as the nominee.
3. Completed nomination papers should be mailed postage prepaid to the Election Commission at the

following address and they must be received by the Election Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 30, 2011. Nominations received after that date will not be considered under any circumstances.

4. Upon receipt of nomination papers, the Election Commission shall verify that the nomination paper is in order by determining that the nominators and nominee all appear on the Official List of Voters for the appropriate zone and that the nominee has formally accepted the nomination by applying his/her signature to the form.
5. Within 5 (five) days of receipt, the Election Commission will provide the nominee with written confirmation that his/her nomination has been received and accepted. Each nominee will also be provided with a master list of all nominees as soon as reasonably possible following the close of nominations at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 30, 2011. This will also be accompanied by a letter stating that if candidates wish to withdraw, they may do so in writing no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 7, 2011, otherwise their names will appear on the ballots.

E. ELECTION PROCEDURES

1. On Thursday, September 15, 2011, the Chief Executive Officer shall deliver to the Election Commission, a certified List of Voters who, shall be eligible to vote in the 2011 election.
2. As soon as is reasonably possible following October 7, 2011, and no later than October 20, 2011, the Election Commission shall prepare a ballot in accordance with the *By-laws*. All ballots shall be marked by the Election Commission for the purpose of identification and verification. No other ballots will be taken into account.
3. On or before October 20, 2011, the Election Commission shall mail to every member entitled to vote, a ballot and a return envelope addressed to the Election Commission and marked "Ballot".
4. If through mistake, inadvertence, accident or other cause deemed reasonable by the Election Commission, the ballot and/or return envelopes are not mailed out on or before October 20, 2011, they shall

be sent out as soon as possible thereafter. Doing so shall not invalidate any election held in the manner prescribed in the *By-laws*.

5. Each eligible member shall mark the ballot with one "X", indicating his/her choice for a Board Member in his/her zone. The ballot should then be placed in the return envelope and forwarded to the Election Commission.
6. Ballots must be received at the office of the Election Commission prior to the poll closing at 12:00 o'clock noon on Wednesday, November 30, 2011. Ballots received after that deadline shall not be accepted or counted by the Election Commission. (Please note that due to Christmas mail, it may take longer than average for the mail to reach the Election Commission, therefore, mail your ballots as soon as possible.)

F. REPORTING RESULTS

1. Upon the poll's closing, the Election Commission shall open the envelopes and count the ballots.
2. The Election Commission, as soon as is practical thereafter, shall furnish the Chief Executive Officer with a report of the election which shall be certified by the affidavit of a member of the Election Commission. Such report shall set forth the number of votes cast for each candidate in each zone. If applicable, names of all persons elected by acclamation and all zones for which no nomination had been received, will also be reported.
3. Upon receipt of the above report, the Chief Executive Officer shall forthwith provide each and every candidate for office, a copy of the report.
4. The Election Commission will seal the counted ballots in packages and deposit them with the Chief Executive Officer who shall preserve them in a secure place until April 1, 2012, at which time, they shall be destroyed.
5. An Election Report shall be presented by the Election Commission at the next Annual General Meeting following the election.

G. CANDIDATE ENTITLEMENTS

Each candidate is entitled to:

1. A list of voters in their respective electoral zones complete with telephone numbers. This list will be available after September 15, 2011, which is the date that the certified list of voters will be delivered to the Election Commission. This list is free of charge.

2. A set of self-adhesive labels for all voters in their respective electoral zones. There is a nominal fee for the purchase of the labels.
3. Place an advertisement in *Dogs in Canada* magazine at normal advertising rates. The cut-off dates for placing an ad is August 1st for the combined October/November issue.

H. PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF A BOARD MEMBER

1. Each member of the Board is encouraged to present the concerns and opinions of the constituents in their respective zones while debating any subject at the table. However, when exercising his or her vote in the decision making process, no Board member shall allow the interests of one group, zone or region to sway them from their fiduciary responsibilities to act, at all times, in the best interests of The Canadian Kennel Club as a whole.
2. It is the legal responsibility of the Board, collectively and individually, to exercise due care and diligence in the performance of their duties as the corporate managers of The Canadian Kennel Club. To accomplish this, each Board member shall, with complete certainty, be aware of and fully understand all matters relating to the management of the corporation and shall, at all times, be comfortable that they are fully aware of all the facts prior to making any decision on any matter before the Board.
3. The Board must be seen as a corporate body, managing as a whole and collectively acting in the best interests of The Canadian Kennel Club. It is therefore imperative that all Board members continually maintain a level of mutual respect in the performance of their duties, whether those duties being performed are at the table, in their respective zones or in communication with the membership of The Canadian Kennel Club or the general public.
4. Upon any vote having been taken at the table, all Board members shall respect and accept the decision of the majority and thereafter shall support any decision which is made by the Board as a whole, regardless of their personal opinions and regardless of the manner in which they may have voted at the time.
5. No Board members shall have the authority to take any action, make any decision or express any opinion on behalf of the Board without first having gained the approval of the Board as a whole, or, at the very least, without first having comfort in the knowledge that the opinion being expressed is that of a majority of the Board.

6. For further information on Board Authority, please refer to Section 9.12 of the *By-laws* and the Role and Responsibility of Board Members in Chapter IX of the Policy and Procedures Manual.

I. ASSUMPTION OF DUTIES BY NEWLY ELECTED BOARD MEMBERS

1. Board Members elected to office in the 2011 election shall assume their duties as of January 1, 2012.
2. The first meeting of the newly elected Board shall take place on Saturday and Sunday, January 14-15, 2012. At this meeting the Board members shall, by secret ballot, choose a Chair of the Board from their number, in accordance with Section 9.3 of the *By-laws*.
3. The Board generally meets four (4) times a year. The dates of these meetings for the entire three (3) year term will be determined at the first meeting of the Board.
4. Board Members will be granted a Board Member allowance, which shall be used for the purpose of carrying out their assigned duties and responsibilities as a member of the Board. Board Members will also be paid a per diem when attending their respective meetings. The per diem shall encompass all costs of meals and accommodations.
