NEW PROGRAM FOR CKC MASTER BREEDER AND INTERNATIONAL MASTER BREEDER COMING JANUARY 2013

The Canadian Kennel Club will be launching a new program on January 1, 2013, called CKC Master Breeder and International Master Breeder. The purpose of this program is to honor breeders who have consistently produced quality animals and who actively work hard to promote purebred dogs.

To be designated as a CKC Master Breeder or International Master Breeder, a breeder must meet specific requirements to be accepted into this CKC Master Breeder Program.

The requirements are:

- A minimum of twenty (20) consecutive years of membership
- Bred or co-bred the same breed or several breeds for a minimum of twenty (20) years.
- Bred or co-bred at least twenty (20) Canadian Champions in Conformation or Performance Events.
- Bred at least one of the following:
 - o An all-Breed Best in Show Winner (any country)
 - o A National Best in Specialty Winner (any country)
 - o Twenty (20) different Group First Winners
 - o Ten (10) High in Trial Winners, or any ten (10) other Performance Event Winners
 - o Must provide certification that applicable health screens are performed on sire and dam of litters bred.
 - o A proven record of registering 100% of live puppies that was produced, and
 - o At least twenty (20) years of verifiable membership in at least one CKC accredited club.

Participants will enjoy many benefits including:

- Master Breeder and International Master Breeder certificate
- Use of the Master Breeder logo in any advertisements
- Lapel Pin
- High priority transactions for registration purposes (10 working days turnaround time)
- All registration certificates featuring the words Master Breeder or International Master Breeder

SYNOPSIS OF THE SEPTEMBER 2012 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The following is a brief synopsis of the key items of business that were addressed at the September 15 and 16, 2012 meeting of the 2012 Board of Directors. The meeting was held in Etobicoke, Ontario. Please note that rules and policy changes shown below are paraphrased for the sake of brevity. In the event of dispute, the specific wording of such changes should be taken from the official minutes of the Board meeting. The detailed minutes of the meeting will be formally approved at the next regular meeting of the Board.

1. Minutes of the June 9 and 10, 2012 meeting of the Board of Directors were approved.
2. The following correspondence was received as information:
 - a. A facsimile received from Don Gillingham, HuntersBest Labradors giving notice that effective June 11, 2012 he will no longer be training.
 - b. A letter from FCI confirming the title of International Beauty Champion on a particular dog.
 - c. A copy of letter sent to Agri-Canada from Ève Pécelet, MP, La Pointe-de-l'Île re: Canadian West Highland White Terrier Club.
 - d. A letter from Bert-Jan Elfrink, President of the Dutch Quimmig Foundation re: Number of Canadian Eskimo Dogs dropping dangerously. The item has been referred to the Registration Committee.
 - e. An invitation from The College of Veterinarians of Ontario re participation in a leaders table on October 16, 2012 to discuss issues of tail docking and ear cropping of dogs in Ontario. A motion was passed to direct the Chair to contact Dr. John Reeve-Newson to ask him to attend as the CKC representative.
3. The following reports were received as information:

4. Agenda item 10.5 - Amendment to Policy and Procedures Manual, Chapter X Committees, Councils and Appointments, Section C, Subsection 4, be amended by adding (a) & (b).
5. The following amendments were made to the Policy and Procedures Manual, effective immediately:
 - a. Housekeeping amendment to Chapter IV, Registration, Appendix 3, Service Fee Schedule to Include the Fee for Master Breeder Program and International Master Breeder Program. The Policy for the Master Breeder Program and the International Master Breeder Program was approved by the Board at the December 2011 Board meeting. The fee was presented in the original concept of the program; however it was necessary that it be included in the Policy.
 - b. Chapter V-Club Policy, Section H - Electoral Irregularities. The section was deleted.
 - c. Chapter VII - Judges, Section G - Applicant Tracking Test Judge, Sub-Section 3, c, 3 - Examination. The amendment was made to bring in line with CKC policy on other disciplines with the same passing mark, example: Obedience, Rally and Agility.
 - d. Chapter VII - Judges, Section G - Applicant Tracking Test Judge, Sub-Section 4, b - Apprentice Judges.
 - e. Chapter X - Committees, Councils and Appointments, Section B - Standing Committees, Sub-Section 3 - Club Relations Committee. The Committee has received a number of requests for arbitration involving internal disputes between various clubs and their (former) members. Investigating these complaints involves innumerable hours of staff and committee time. The Committee feels that these matters should be resolved by and through the club's constitution and by-laws. Arbitration is a professional field with professional accreditation required. Accordingly, the Board approved a policy change removing reference to "arbitration" from the mandate of the Committee retroactive to all existing correspondence on this file. The Board also asked the Club Relations Committee to look at the rules and Policy and Procedures to ensure the Committee's activities are properly focused with regard to the purpose of club accreditation.
 - f. A housekeeping change was made to Chapter XI - Regulatory, Section B - Discipline Committee, Sub-Section 10 (a) - Internal Affairs of Clubs.
 - g. Chapter XI - Regulatory. Given that decisions of the Discipline and Appeal Committees are subject to judicial review, the Legislation Committee, in consultation with CKC legal counsel, undertook a thorough review of Chapter XI - Regulatory to ensure that the policies and procedures adhere to the principles of natural justice.

SYNOPSIS

6. The following amendments were made to the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations, effective January 1, 2013:
 - a. Order of Judging, Understanding the Show, Veterans Class, Point System and Associate Classes, Ribbons, Awards & Titles. The change was made to make Veterans Class optional at all-breed shows.
 - b. A new section, Appendix 1 - Baby Puppy Class, was added. The amendment was made to develop guidelines regarding how to stage 3-6 Baby Puppy Classes at their All Breed Shows.
 7. The following amendments were made to the Tracking Test Rules and Regulations effective January 1, 2013:
 - a. Chapter 6-Entries & End of Test, Section 6.10.1 - Program of Judging
 - b. New Section, Appendix 1 - Catalogue
 - c. New Section, Chapter 4 - Premium List, Section 4.1
 - d. Chapter 6 - Entries & End of Test, Section 6.11.1 - Tracks
 - e. New Section, Chapter 6 - Entries & End of Test, Section 6.11 - Tracks (New 6.11.5)
 - f. Chapter 10 - Standards for Tracking Tests, Section 10.1.5 -Tracking Test Grounds
 - g. New Section, Tracking Test Rules & Regulations, Chapter 10 - Standards for Tracking Tests, Section 10.3 - Equipment & Tracks (10.3.7)
 - h. New Section, Chapter 10-Standards for Tracking Tests, Section 10.3-Equipment & Tracks (10.3.9)
 - i. Chapter 10-Standards for Tracking Tests, Section 10.5.1 (c)-On the Track
 - j. Chapter 6 - Entries & End of Test, Section 6.1.9 - Entry Requirements
 8. The following appointments were made:
 - a. David Dibblee was appointed to the Event Officiating Committee
 - b. Dr. John Eckford, Dr. Carla Simon and Dr. Simon Verge were appointed to the Genetics and Medical Committee
 9. A motion was passed to finalize the strategic imperatives as a basis for the 2013 to 2015 Strategic Plan. It will include development of an outwardly focused positioning paper targeting the major issues facing the CKC. The paper will be circulated to the membership, staff, partners and other stakeholders for their assistance in the development of priorities and finite goals that will assist in the completion of the Strategic Plan.
 10. Dr. Simon Verge made a presentation on a DNA Certification program for the CKC. The Strategic Planning Committee was directed to consider developing a DNA Certification program as part of the planning process.
 11. A motion was passed that any owner whose dog has completed a CKC Grand Champion title before December 31, 2012 may apply after January 1, 2013 to be recognized as a CKC Grand Champion Excellent. A new certificate shall be issued by the CKC on application.
 12. A motion was passed to change the colour of the Baby Puppy ribbons from lavender to orange upon usage of existing stock.
 13. The issue of CKC affiliated clubs holding non-CKC conformation shows on the same dates as official CKC conformation events in close proximity was referred to the Legislation Committee for advice.
 14. A motion was passed to send the Chair to attend the 6th Annual Eukanuba World Challenge to be held in Orlando, Florida in December 2012, in conjunction with the AKC's 12th AKC/Eukanuba National Championship.
- A large number of agenda items had to be deferred to the December board meeting due to the length of discussion for some items on the September agenda.
