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DOGS IN CANADA ANNUAL PUBLISHES ON JULY 31

We've pleased to announce that - after a two year hiatus - the popular and respected *Dogs In Canada Annual* will return with a Sneak Peek edition publishing on July 31, 2013.

This special edition marks a return to form for *Dogs In Canada*, and hints strongly at the rejuvenated design, content and editorship that will be evident when the publication returns at full-strength in early 2014.

The *Dogs Annual* is a must-read publication for dog breeders and purebred lovers across Canada, and it returns with the backing and editorial excellence of one of the country's top-tier publishers behind it. The Globe and Mail won the publishing contract last year based on its vision to refresh the magazine, which has a long history of excellence. In addition to articles and columns on breeding, dog ownership and canine nutrition, The Globe will include more lifestyle articles to reach a wider audience, including more pet owners.

With a paid circulation of 40,000 copies including over 20,000 to CKC members, *Dogs Annual* has long been a bestseller on newsstands. The Globe will continue to distribute the magazine to CKC members, as well as expand the distribution to pet lovers in the Greater Toronto Area not yet exposed to the benefits of purebred ownership.

NOTICE FOR CONFORMATION JUDGES REGARDING REQUIRED PERMIT NUMBERS IN 2013

Effective January 1, 2013, any judge who is issued a new permit is required to judge the following number of dogs in order to complete the permit requirements:

Group 1	Full Group = 119	Half Group = 59

NOTICE TO CONFORMATION JUDGES REGARDING RAMPS

At the March 2013 meeting, the CKC Board of Directors approved a directive which strongly recommends that effective immediately the judging of Bulldogs and Basset Hounds should be performed on the ramp.

This will become mandatory effective January 1, 2015.

CKC BOARD PASSES EXTENSIVE LIST OF AMENDMENTS TO AGILITY RULES & REGULATIONS

At the June 2013 Board Meeting, Director Wendy Maisey (Alberta, NWT and Nunavut) presented over 50 amendments to the Agility Rules & Regulations. Speaking as a representative of the Agility Trial Council, her submission covered a range of issues regarding the size, height and type of obstacles, course distance and times, performance standards, judging and some fundamental clarifications in regard to the various classes of competition as well as the addition of a new titling game called Points & Distance (PAD). Most were unanimously approved with just five going back to council.

"These changes will go a long way in making CKC Agility more familiar to dogs and handlers who compete in events put on by other groups and associations. The Agility Council put in a tremendous amount of work, with increasing the number of entries and putting fun back into the sport as the primary goals," commented Ms. Maisey.

The changes will come in to effect on January 1, 2014. Full details of the changes will appear in the minutes, which will be published (once approved) shortly after the September board meeting.
