

TAKING STEPS TO MINIMIZE CONTRACTION OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES

The CKC Genetics & Medical Committee is aware that there have been cases of Parvovirus infection in dogs that have attended shows in the United States and instances of the disease in Canada. We are currently unaware of confirmed cases of Parvovirus infection as a result of attending recent Canadian dog shows, but the committee may not be aware of all instances, and we share everyone's concern.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB FOUNDATION UPDATE

Efforts are underway to reinvigorate the Canadian Kennel Club Foundation, a non-profit federally registered charity, so it can carry out the important charitable work for which it was established, namely to fund original canine health research, to promote the human-animal bond and its benefits, and to support effective animal control legislation.

A small working board of directors has developed a strategic plan identifying the following priorities:

- Update the governance framework and build a high-functioning board
- 2. Establish and maintain effective administration for the foundation
- 3. Establish and implement an outcomes-focussed approach to funding projects that help achieve the mission and build the reputation of the foundation
- 4. Raise positive awareness of the foundation
- Raise the funds needed to make significant regular progress toward the mission
- Increase understanding of dogs by lawmakers and other decision-makers and influence positive actions on canine issues

Much work needs to be done if the foundation is to meet its selfimposed target of issuing a call for funding proposals by fall of 2013. Some of the work that needs to be done includes updating (or re-doing and/or hosting) the foundation website, helping implement the fundraising and communications strategies, drafting and legal counsel review of bylaw changes, writing board recruitment toolkits or drafting foundation policies on a variety of topics. The foundation's board of directors is seeking volunteers to help execute these tasks, most of which are shortterm or one-time in nature.

The foundation board also is seeking new potential board members, which does entail a more significant commitment. While a full profile of desired board member competencies has yet to be written, typically, a candidate should have good leadership skills with experience in one or more of the following disciplines: finance, legal, governance, fund-raising, charities, project assessment, marketing, donor stewardship, and administration. And, of course, they must be passionate about animals and especially dogs!

SHOW MODELLING TEST CONCEPTS **PROVE SUCCESSFUL**

The CKC would like to thank all those who provided input and were active participants in the Show Modeling exercise and to clarify some of the misunderstandings regarding rules and policies that have been implemented based upon the modeling concept.

With the unfortunate and continuing decline in Shows and Trials entries, and the negative impact this was having on affiliate clubs and the CKC, the Board of Directors approved the establishment of the Show Modelling concept at the September 2010 board meeting. Subsequently, a test project was conceived and offered in 2011 through to March 31st 2012, with the ultimate objective to increase Shows and Trials entries. Afterwards results were submitted for analysis and subsequently reported to the Board with recommendations on the implementation of successful test cases.

As was hoped, a variety of unique concepts above and beyond the current rules and regulations were developed and submitted by clubs. Most of the sports within the CKC were represented, as over one hundred CKC clubs were granted exemptions. Ideas and input were also invited and received from individual members and non-participating clubs. These unique ideas demonstrated that in some cases thinking outside the box can provide new life through the introduction of new ideas, as most clubs participating increased both the number of entries and revenue.

We're happy to report that the following concepts have been formally approved by the Board:

- Veterans Classes at all breed shows
- Altered Classes at all breed shows
- Day of Entry option for performance clubs
- Baby puppy classes

A note regarding Day of Entry. It must be clarified that this is an option that any performance club can choose to exercise (or not). But if a club does wish to offer this option, it should be stated in the premium list.
