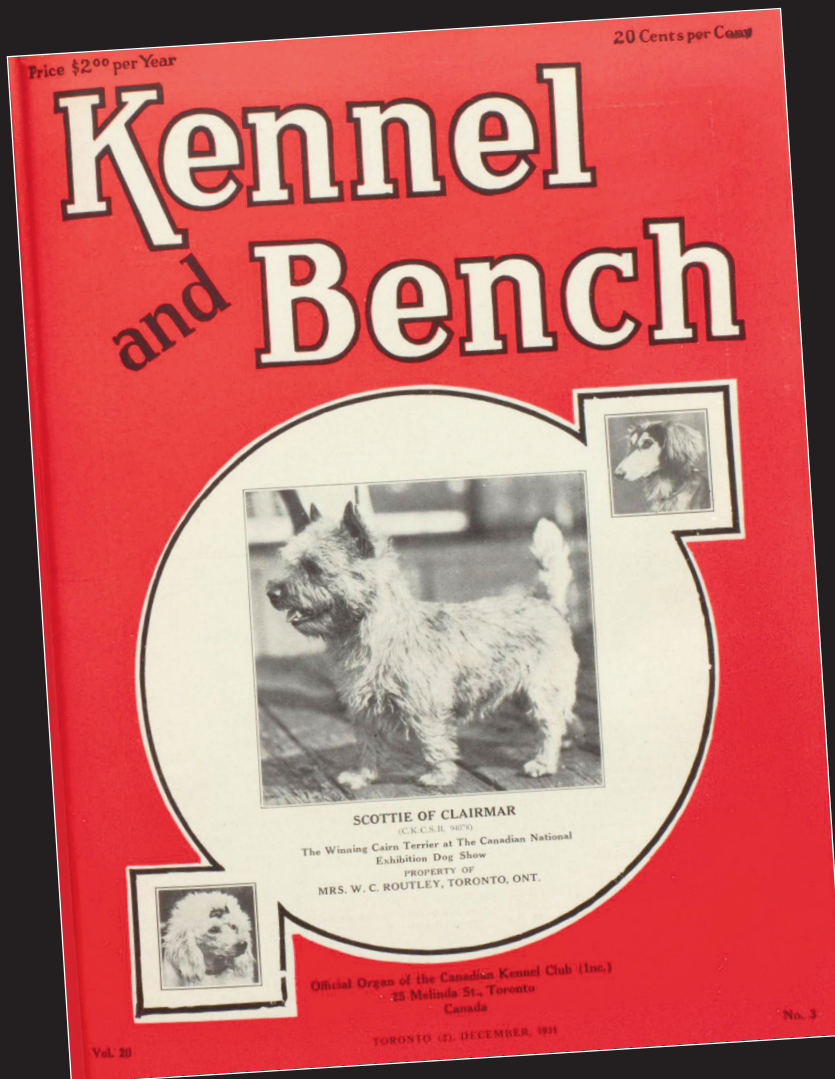

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WINTER AIR TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS FOR PETS

Due to chilly temperatures and increased passenger and cargo loads expected over the holiday season, winter restrictions are in effect for the transportation of pets travelling by air.

Please note that WestJet holiday embargo dates apply to pets travelling as checked baggage. Therefore, WestJet is unable to accept animals as checked baggage from December 15, 2014 to January 6, 2015. From December 11 to December 14, 2014, and from January 7 to January 10, 2015 a maximum of two animals will be accepted as checked baggage. Also note that WestJet Cargo is unable to transport pets from December 12, 2014 to January 10, 2015.

Air Canada is unable to transport pets within North America as checked baggage or via Air Canada Cargo from December 15, 2014 to January 12, 2015. This restriction applies to flights within North America, or on international flights with a connection in North America during this time.

Please note that pets weighing less than 4.5 kg (10 lb) cannot be accepted as checked baggage on any Air Canada aircraft from November 1, 2014 to March 31, 2015 (or when the temperature is 0 °C or less). Also note that at any time when the temperature is below 7 °C, Air Canada Cargo may not be able to accommodate animals.

As many countries place restrictions on the entry of animals, be sure to contact the embassy or consulate of your destination country for specific requirements.

CKC FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES "PAWSITIVITY" GRANTS

The CKC Foundation, a nationally registered charity, is pleased to announce up to \$20,000 in funding for new "Pawsitivity" grants in 2015. CKCF "Pawsitivity" grants are awarded with the primary objective of enhancing the health and welfare of dogs in Canada by supporting education on the diverse and beneficial role of dogs in society.

Pawsitivity Grant Opportunities

The types of activities envisioned for support could include service dog training, advocacy of canine-friendly legislation, promotion of responsible dog ownership, the benefits of dogs to society, or education on breeding healthy and well-adjusted dogs. "Pawsitivity" grants are in addition to the funding the foundation provides for scientific research into canine health issues.

Recipient Eligibility

CKCF grants recipients must be an eligible recipient for funds from a registered charity as defined by The Income Tax Act and able to issue official tax receipts for donations received.

However, in certain circumstances, and on a case-by-case basis, the CKCF may enter into agency agreements with groups that are NOT eligible under The Income Tax Act by contracting that organization to act as its agent in carrying out initiatives on the Foundation's behalf.
