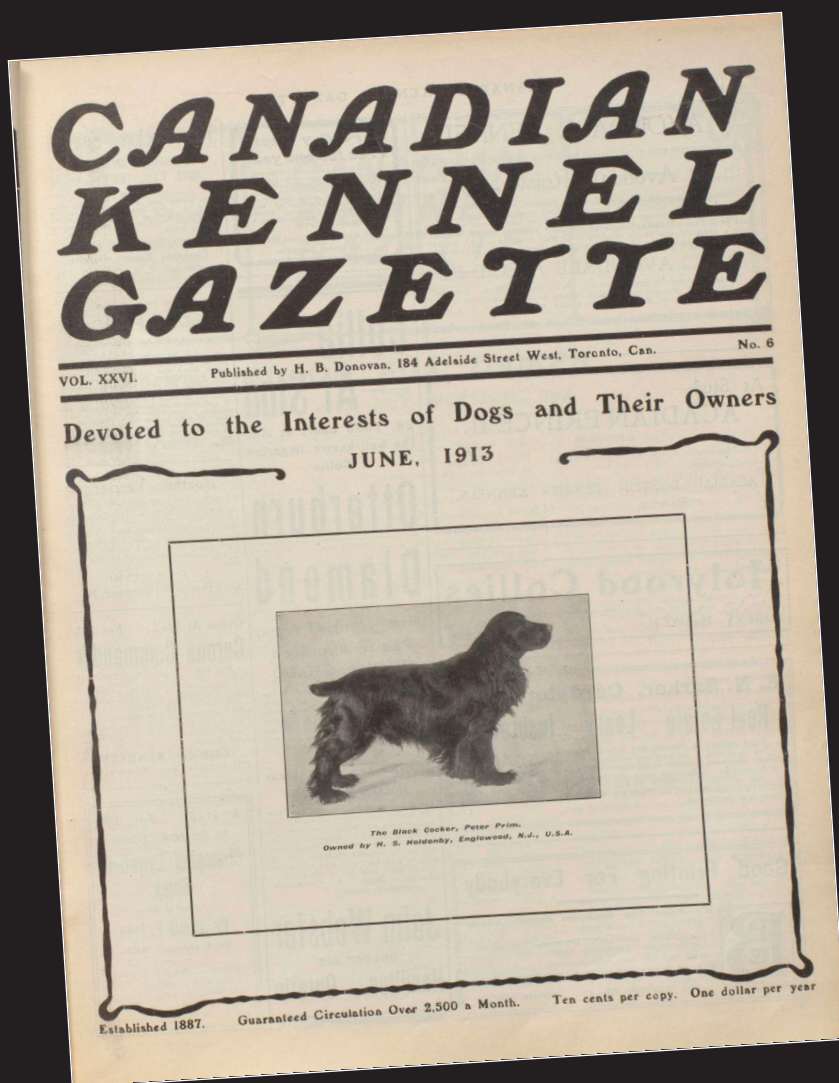

NEW CANINE COMPANION PROGRAM FOR CKC AGILITY, OBEDIENCE AND RALLY OBEDIENCE

The CKC wishes to inform you that a new policy was approved at the March 2014 Board Meeting that will allow mixed-breed dogs and unrecognized-breed dogs (purebred from CKC recognized registries) to compete in CKC Agility, Obedience and Rally Obedience Trials, alongside purebred dogs - and receive the same titles, effective July 1st, 2014.

The creation of the Canine Companion program responds to a desire in the fancy to open up competition on a broader level. Offering events that include mixed breeds and unrecognized breeds will encourage new participation and provide clubs with an excellent forum through which to educate and promote their breeds and breed clubs to a new audience - while furthering the growth and viability of their clubs.

This new, inclusive program will complement our diverse range of CKC purebred-focused dog events and will serve to strengthen our mission to align us to our strategic plan to speak for all dogs - and will give greater credence to the Club as *the* authority for dogs in Canada.

The program will also help the CKC to remain competitive with other event-giving organizations such as the North American Mixed Breed Registry, Agility Association of Canada and Canadian Association of Rally Obedience. The CKC is excited to follow in the footsteps of organizations such as the AKC who have already opened up competition to mixed-breed dogs, with great success.

How to Apply: In order to compete, mixed breed and unrecognized-breed dog owners must apply for a Canine Companion Number (CCN) and meet strict criteria for competition. 2014 IS AN ELECTION AND REFERENDUM YEAR!

In November of this year voting members will be asked to cast their vote for the Board of Directors for the 2015 – 2017 term as well as on a number of important amendments to the CKC By-laws.

For the very first time each voting member will have the opportunity to vote electronically! If you wish to vote electronically, please ensure that we have your current email address on file. If you wish to verify the information we have on file for you, please email Membership Services at information@ckc.ca or call 416-674-3699 or 1-855-364-7252. It is also important that we have your date of birth on file because in order to vote, you must have attained the age of 19 years.

You will still have the option to vote by paper ballot if you so choose. If you wish to receive a paper ballot instead, please send an email to paperballot2014@ckc.ca or contact Membership Services as noted above. Please let us know before October 15th so that the Election Commission can mail you a paper ballot by October 30th or shortly thereafter. Voting takes place between November 1st and November 30th.

GRANTS OF UP TO \$30,000 FOR CANINE HEALTH RESEARCH ANNOUNCED

The Canadian Kennel Club Foundation (CKCF) issued a call on April 15, 2014, for funding proposals of up to \$30,000. The call went to Canadian research institutions and is for canine health research involving causes, diagnosis and treatment of canine diseases.

"I am very pleased that the CKCF is moving forward with this important work that will ultimately improve the quality of life for our canine companions who bring so much to our lives," said foundation president Marg Moran McQuinn.

Proposals are due by July 1, 2014, and will then be peer reviewed with recommendations provided to the CKCF board of directors for final approval. Successful applicants will be announced by November 1, 2014. The foundation has previously donated \$15,000 to a Quebec veterinary college for a research project as well as a nominal amount to each veterinary college in Canada.

To receive CKCF funds, organizations must be meet Revenue Canada's definition of qualified registered charity donees under the [Income Tax Act](#).

The CKCF has two streams of available funds: the health research stream and the “community” stream. Funds have been designated for applications to both in 2014, with the health research applications first out of the gate. The call for applications for the “community” stream will come later in the year, which could conceivably fund eligible applicants in the training/equipping of service dogs, education on responsible dog ownership, creation of off-leash parks, etcetera.

The CKCF is a federally registered, non-profit charitable corporation (#82733 RR0001) and was established approximately seven years ago by a group of dog lovers including Canadian Kennel Club members and directors, veterinarians and other non-profit groups. It is dedicated to the enhancement of the health and welfare of dogs and the education and promotion of the benefits that dogs bring to communities and society.
