REMINDER: NOTICE TO ALL CONFORMATION AND OBEDIENCE CLUBS RE: PREMIUM LISTS AND JUDGING SCHEDULES

The following motion, regarding Chapter VI, Shows & Trials, Section Y, Judging Schedules, was passed at the December 2016 Board Meeting:

1. An administrative fee as identified in the Schedule of fees will be levied against any club that fails to ensure that the judging schedule is made available to exhibitors a minimum of six (6) days prior to the first day of the event. At the time of date approval, Head Office will remind clubs that they are responsible for ensuring that event secretaries post this information on line.

The fee was set at \$100.00 and will be posted in the Schedule of Fees.

Please note that clubs are required to provide the CKC with a copy of their Premium Lists and Judging Schedules. Effective immediately, please forward a copy in PDF format, and we will post them on the CKC website at <u>ckc.ca</u> in the Calendar of Events. The Premium Lists and Judging Schedules should be forwarded to <u>information@ckc.ca</u>.

UPDATE RE: NEW BC ANIMAL WELFARE LEGISLATION

As you may know, <u>CKC has been working with the BC</u> government and the BC SPCA since April, 2016 to develop new animal welfare laws that will assist the BC SPCA in monitoring and taking action against irresponsible breeders.

CKC has held a number of discussions with BC government officials throughout the past year and also engaged our member breeders with a <u>BC Government survey</u> during the consultation process, to ensure their interests were well represented.

Throughout our discussions, we have always maintained that licensing and registration would provide an unnecessary burden to CKC members in terms of cost, duplication and an extra layer of governance, and discussed opportunities that would recognize and reward CKC member breeders.

Most recently, the BC Government introduced <u>Bill 7 -</u> <u>2017: Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Amendment Act</u>. The proposed Bill largely appears to be an enabling piece of legislation, which contemplates both licensing and/or registration schemes—the details of which will be defined by future regulations. It is our understanding that the intent will be to pass Bill 7 during this spring session, with regulations to follow in the summer or fall. We understand there may be concern about the proposed legislation, and we continue to monitor activity surrounding Bill 7 and the development of future regulations. CKC also remains in continued dialogue with the BC SPCA and the BC government, in support of responsible breeders.

CKC DENOUNCES RECENT AMENDMENT TO TORONTO ANIMAL CONTROL BYLAW

In January, CKC provided members with an <u>update</u> regarding proposed amendments to Toronto animal control bylaw Chapter 349, Animals and included the results of a City survey in which Toronto CKC members and other local groups were invited to participate during the consultation process.

Most recently, CKC learned that an additional amendment was added to the bylaw and included a ban on choke collars, choke chains and prong collars—integral and effective tools used responsibly by dog exhibitors, trainers and evaluators.

Despite the fact that the survey results showed that 55% of respondents disagreed with a complete ban on these collars, and despite a City staff report recommending a ban on such collars for tethering purposes only, the move to an outright ban was later made by Council.

As you can imagine, CKC is extremely disappointed by this recent decision that clearly does not represent the voice of our members and the many Toronto dog owners.

While we applaud the efforts of the City to strengthen its animal control bylaw, particularly where dangerous dogs are concerned, we think the decision to ban these collars is misguided and falls short of its intent to target irresponsible dog owners.

CKC would like to set the record straight and will be contacting members of Council in an effort to overturn the ban, in support of caring and responsible dog owners and their dogs.

Effective January 1, 2018:

Please note the following <u>NEW</u> changes that were carried by the Board of Directors of CKC at the March 2016 Board Meeting.

- 12 BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS & SWEEPSTAKES
- 12.3 Awards
- 12.3.1 (k) Judging for this award shall be **awarded at every show and shall precede the selection of Best in Show.** The judging of Reserve Best in Show shall be completed by the same judge who judges Best in Show.

Note: For Top Dogs(Conformation) as of January 1 2018, the Reserve Best in Show will be awarded top dog points based on the number of dogs in show minus the number of dogs defeated in the group from which the Best in Show winner was awarded.
