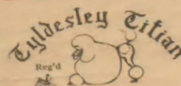


"Bunny" taking her third Best Canadian Bred Puppy in Show, this time under Mrs. Ramona Van Court at the Metropolitan Kennel Club show November 4, 1973, handled by Mrs. Phyllis Barry.

"Happiness is" a 12-year old breeding program which starts to produce. For Titian Kennels, 1973 was the year of the puppy. For three generations (in a 12-year period) I have chosen puppies on the basis of sound structure, good health and good temperament. Such attention to basics does not quickly produce spectacular show winners; however, in 1972-73, with the puppies of "Mr. Smith" (Eng. and Can Ch. Vulcan Champagne Goldsmith, 1971 Xmas cov-

er dog) and "Percy" (Ch. Bibelot's Songmaster Titian, 1972 Xmas cover dog), we began to get it all together. Our cover dog, "Bunny," is the product of two outcrosses. She arrived a generation earlier than I had expected, but two days after she was born I knew she was one to watch. She was one of 12 puppies, six black and six cream, and I had determined before the litter was born that I was inter-

## IT4YOU UPDATE: CKC MEMBERS TAKING PART IN USABILITY TESTING

As part of the IT4YOU Steering Committee mandate, CKC members are playing a significant part in the development of the new computer system. Currently, a sample group of members from across the country is helping the IT4YOU team by participating in a usability test.

Usability testing refers to evaluating a website by testing it with a group of typical users. The goal is to identify any user problems and determine the participant's satisfaction with the website.

The test group in this case is comprised of CKC members from several different regions and includes breeders, judges, and exhibitors. The first usability test will focus on a newly created Dog Profile page, and will measure the test taker's ability to complete tasks and how long it takes them to do so.

The test results will help the design and development teams identify problems before they are coded; the earlier issues are identified and fixed, the less expensive the fixes will be and the greater the chance of a successful launch.

The new system is scheduled to "go live" in June 2018, and as they move forward the design and development teams will continue to request input from CKC members throughout the project.

## NOTICE TO AGILITY CLUB AND EXHIBITORS TRIALS RE: MOVE UPS

Please be advised that in accordance with the Agility Rules & Regulations, Section 6.8.1 dogs are only eligible to move up "prior to the commencement of each trial". Dogs are not permitted to move up within a trial.

"A dog that is individually registered in the records of the CKC or has an Event Registration Number (ERN) or a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) or a Performance Event Number (PEN) or a Canine Companion Number (CCN) and has received 3 qualifying scores from at least 2 different judges, may be

transferred to the next level provided that a written or electronic request is received *prior to the commencement of each trial* or in accordance with the conditions advertised in the premium list."

Section 6.8.1 regarding move ups in the Agility Rules has not changed from the previous rules. However, effective 2017 clubs are eligible to hold 1 trial with 2 of the same classes and levels (e.g. 2 JWW for each level). This seems to be causing some confusion about when a dog can move up.

Although clubs are permitted to hold 2 of the same class and level within 1 trial/event number, dogs are still only permitted to move up in between trials, not within the same trial.

So, for example, a dog entered to run in the Excellent JWW twice within 1 trial, cannot run in the first Excellent JWW and then move up within the same trial to the Master Excellent JWW. Both clubs and exhibitors are responsible for understanding the rules.

Please note that 1 event (number) is equal to 1 trial.

Further, the last part of the sentence "*...or in accordance with the conditions advertised in the premium list*" refers to the requirements to move up. These words do not allow a club to negate the words "prior to the commencement of each trial". It means a club can set different conditions with regard to move ups. For example, whether it must be only in writing, or how far in advance of the trial an owner can request a move up, etc.

## REMINDER: CKC WELCOMES BARN HUNT AS A TITLE RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Effective January 1 2018, CKC will be recognizing Titles from The Barn Hunt Association.

Barn Hunt is a fun sport which is becoming increasingly popular in Canada. The CKC is thrilled to be able to adopt this Title Recognition Program beginning in 2018. Barn Hunt is based on the traditional roles of many breeds in ridding farms, barns, crop storage areas, and homes of destructive vermin. Barn Hunt offers titles, levels of increasing difficulty, and championships.

To obtain a CKC Title and Certificate, your dog must have a CKC Registration Number, a Performance Event Number, a CCN Number, a Miscellaneous Certification Number or an Event Registration Number, along with providing CKC the

fee of \$20 plus applicable tax and completion of the CKC Barn Hunt Title Application Form located on our website under Forms>Exhibitor Forms.

Titles earned from The Barn Hunt Association prior to Jan 1 2018 will not be recognized by CKC.

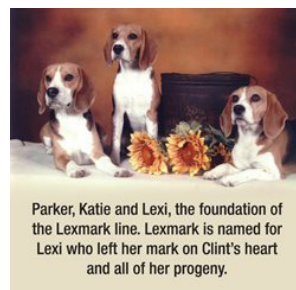

If more than one application is received, the priority dates will be granted to the qualified club that has maintained its accreditation with the CKC for the longest time. If more than one application is received from clubs having the same earliest accreditation date, a draw shall take place between these clubs and the winner of the draw will be granted the dates. Applicants will be given an opportunity to send a representative to observe the draw.
