The Canadian Kennel Club emphatically denounces the atrocious Yulin Dog Meat Festival and the dog meat trade. Some have written to express their shared opposition to the Festival with a connection to the 2019 World Dog Show being held in China. CKC traditionally does not participate in the annual World Dog Show and has no plans to attend in 2019.

CKC does however encourage its members and all dog lovers to speak out with a clear message confirming solidarity in the international dog community against cruel and inhumane treatment of dogs and all animals. CKC works, on behalf of its members, to promote the benefits that dogs bring to individuals and our society.

CKC is proud to stand united with other dog organizations around the world in sending a clear message against the inhumane treatment of dogs.

In the last 10 years, two-thirds of non-profits have reported a D&O claim.

Directors and Officers coverage complements the Club Liability and Property insurance by ensuring that you are protected from personal exposure for decisions and actions taken on behalf of your dog club.

CONFORMATION SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

Effective January 1 2018:

Please note the following **NEW** change that was carried by the Board of Directors of CKC at the March 2016 Board Meeting.

- 12 BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS & SWEEPSTAKES
- 12.3 Awards
- 12.3.1 (k) Judging for this award shall be awarded at every show and shall precede the selection of Best in Show. The judging of Reserve Best in Show shall be completed by the same judge who judges Best in Show.

If a puppy wins Reserve Best in Show, it then competes for Best Puppy in Show only with the Best Puppy in Group winner of the Group from which the Best in Show winner was chosen.

Note: For Top Dogs(Conformation) as of January 1 2018, the Reserve Best in Show will be awarded top dog points based on the number of dogs in show minus the number of dogs defeated in the group from which the Best in Show winner was awarded.

IT4YOU UPDATE: FULL STEAM AHEAD WITH MEMBERS HELP

The IT4You project originated in 2015 from a need to replace CKC's outdated, 30-year-old computer information technology that manages all membership, registration and event information.

The new computer system undertaking, currently in development, was christened the IT4You Project and promises to provide technology that will bring many benefits to CKC members. The new system will ensure member transactions are faster and more efficient, with improved reporting capabilities, and allow things like more timely publication of event results online. Through these improvements, members can also expect a better customer service experience.

To guide and oversee this project, the Board established the ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) Steering Committee in March 2015. Since that time, the Committee has guided the identification and documentation of business processes for the new system, polled stakeholders for their insights to drive improvements, helped define communications needs and, in April 2016, selected a qualified vendor from an outstanding shortlist.

With Canadian vendor Pavliks in place since September 2016, work has now been completed in areas like requirements gathering and gap analysis (i.e. current state versus desired state). The team is also at work on the requirements involved in moving our old APPX data into the new, sophisticated Microsoft CRM system.

Data clean-up is an important early part of this project and, as "data" is your Member information, Members can help this process go smoothly. Simply review and update your Member Profile at https://www.ckc.ca/ckcmemberlogin.aspx to ensure CKC has your most up-to-date information.

It's full-steam ahead and work to program and configure the new system has begun, with a goal of "go-live" in July 2018. Watch for more updates in the coming months.

THERAPY DOGS: AN ESTEEMED MEMBER'S PERSPECTIVE



Stanley Coren has been a member of the CKC for over 20 years. He has trained many dogs and earned numerous titles in Dog Obedience and Rally Obedience trials. Dr. Coren has participated in several Vancouver ecoVillage therapy dog events and would like to encourage others to participate in therapy dog events in their communities.

We mostly hear about therapy dogs being trained

to serve as an individual companion to support a person with StanleyCoren_dogs.jpgpsychological or emotional problems such as PTSD. Vancouver ecoVillage is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing therapeutic services for people with various types of challenges however, their therapy dog program

is oriented toward helping people at the community level rather than providing an individual support dog.

An example of what therapy dogs do in the Vancouver ecoVillage program is to participate in large-scale therapy dog events at universities, especially during exam periods when students become highly stressed. A typical event might be around two hours or so in length with 20 or more therapy dogs present and a student flow-through, which can involve well in excess of 300 students. Each student gets to interact with one or more of the dogs as they choose. Such events have been held in several universities in British Columbia. The value of such events in reducing exam related stress in students has been validated in a clinical study by the Psychology Department of the University of British Columbia using Vancouver ecoVillage therapy dogs. This was a large study involving around 5000 student participants spread over a seven-week period.

The therapy dogs used in this program are pet dogs; however, they must have earned CKC's Canine Good Neighbor title. Before dogs are allowed to participate, they are evaluated by CKC Judge Marion Postgate to ensure that they have a temperament that includes confidence, good manners, and most importantly, sociability towards people and other dogs.

Although a main focus of the Vancouver ecoVillage therapy program involves group events in universities and they also work with community inclusion groups such as the Canadian Mental Health Association, Spectrum Society and posAbilities to help connect their members to the benefits of the emotional support provided by interactions with a therapy dog. They also certify dogs to work with professionals, such as counselors, psychologists and rehabilitation therapists at their workplace.

Because of the nature of their therapy dog program, Vancouver ecoVillage is always looking for well-behaved dogs and sociable owners to take part in their petting events. Once a dog has been certified with them, it is insured for five million dollars and can work any place in Canada, although, at the moment the major focus of the program is in southern British Columbia.
