

AIR TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS FOR PETS THIS SUMMER

If you plan on flying with your dog or shipping your pup this summer, be sure to check with your airline carrier as there may be pet travel restrictions due to high temperatures and heavy loads during peak summer travel periods.

WestJet accepts pets as checked baggage during the summer, with the exception of select locations from May 15 to October 31. WestJet Cargo planes are temperature controlled and can transport pets during the warmer months on domestic flights only. For more information, including details about shipping dogs, please call WestJet at 1-888-937-8538 or WestJet Cargo at 1-866-952-2746.

Air Canada is not able to transport pets as checked baggage from June 20 to September 10. However, Air Canada Cargo is specially equipped for the transportation of animals during the summer months and will accept pets during this period with the exception of select cities. Importantly, Air Canada Cargo does not accept warm-blooded animals for transport when the outside ground temperature is higher than 29.5°C (85°F). If the temperature is 29.5°C or higher at the **departure city**, the **destination**, or **any point in between** on a route with connections, animals will not be accepted and will therefore be rebooked for the next available flight(s).

Just a reminder that Air Canada and Air Canada Cargo does not accept <u>Brachycephalic breeds</u> on any flights, due to an increased risk of heat stroke and breathing problems.

As always, we encourage CKC members to review countryspecific regulations regarding restrictions on the entry of animals and vaccination and documentation requirements for **WestJet** and <u>Air Canada</u>, prior to booking.

CKC WELCOMES BARN HUNT AS A TITLE RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Effective January 1, 2018, CKC will be recognizing Titles from The Barn Hunt Association.

Barn Hunt is a fun sport which is becoming increasingly popular in Canada. The CKC is thrilled to be able to adopt this Title Recognition Program, beginning in 2018. Barn Hunt is based on the traditional roles of many breeds in ridding farms, barns, crop storage areas and homes of destructive vermin. Barn Hunt offers titles, levels of increasing difficulty, and championships.

To obtain a CKC Title and Certificate, your dog must have a CKC Registration Number, a Performance Event Number, a CCN Number, a Miscellaneous Certification Number or an Event Registration Number, along with providing CKC the fee of \$20 plus applicable tax and completion of the CKC Barn Hunt Title Application Form located on our website under Forms/ Exhibitor Forms.

Titles earned from The Barn Hunt Association prior to January 1, 2018 will not be recognized by CKC.

NOTICE TO CONFORMATION JUDGES AND CLUBS RE: POLICY FOR NEW BREEDS BRAQUE D'AUVERGNE/AUVERGNE POINTER

Effective July 1, 2017 the Braque d'Auvergne will be eligible to compete as a Listed Breed in Group 1 (Sporting).

In accordance with policy passed by the Board in March 2014, prior to receiving approval to judge this new breed, judges shall be required to write and successfully pass an open book test.

The Open Book Test for the Braque d'Auvergne is now available on the CKC website at <u>www.ckc.ca</u> under the Events tab, then CKC Breed Standards, Conformation Open Book Tests. Please print the test, complete it, and mail, fax, or e-mail to Head Office, as designated below, by June 30, 2017.

Please note:

- If you are an All Breed Judge then you must complete the test.
- If you are licensed for all breeds in Group 1 (but not an All Breed Judge), you must complete the test.
- If you are a permit judge for all breeds in Group 1 you must complete the test.
- If you are a judge on permit for half of Group 1, and you are licensed for the other half, then you must complete the test.
- If you are a permit judge for only half of Group 1, and you are not licensed for the other half, then you are not required to write the tests at this time.

The Breed Standard is posted on the CKC website in the same place as the Open Book Test. It will be forwarded to judges in the appropriate format in due course. We appreciate your cooperation. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the staff in the Event Planning Department in Shows and Trials.

In the meantime, we will continue to approve Judging Panels for events after July 1st. If the Judging Panel that has been submitted to Head Office does not include this breed, we will communicate with the club to assign them to a judge on the judging panel.

NOTICE TO CONFORMATION CLUBS AND JUDGES RE: CONFORMATION SHOW RULES -CONFLICTS

The following motion was passed at the March 2017 Board Meeting:

"THAT, the Conformation Show Rules & Regulations, Section 4.2.2 be amended effective January 1, 2018 to read as follows:

- 4 JUDGES
- 4.2 Conflicts
- 4.2.2 A judge must not accept an assignment to judge the same breeds, groups, or general specials at shows that are held less than 90 days apart if the distance between the shows is within 350 road miles (562 km). An

administrative charge as set by the Board will be levied against any judge who violates this provision in the rules. Disciplinary action may be taken against repeat offenders."

Please note that contracts signed prior to January 1, 2018 will be grandfathered.

Since many clubs have standard contracts, please ensure that you check the distance in the contract so as not to violate this rule. To check distances between events please contact the Event Planning Department in the Shows and Trials Division. We will be happy to map distances between events for you if you are not certain.

CKC SUPPORTS TORONTO CITY COUNCIL'S NEW RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING DOG COLLARS

CKC is pleased to report that Toronto City Council amended <u>Chapter 349, Animals</u> late yesterday, and <u>repealed Section</u> <u>8.1</u> which prohibits the use of choke collars, choke chains and prong collars "or any similar device at any time on a dog", in favour of further public consultation.

City Council has recommended that the Executive Director, Municipal Licensing and Standards (MLS) undertake public consultation with a variety of experts and professionals who rely on the use of prong, choke and slip collars. Toronto MLS is expected to report back to the Licensing and Standards Committee on September 18, 2017.

CKC reached out to Council prior to yesterday's Council meeting, to reaffirm our opposition, remind Council about the recent survey results opposing a complete ban and requested a more extensive review on such collars, with a view to repealing the ban. We thank our many members and Toronto dog-owners who went on public record to voice their growing concerns with the ban.

We applaud the efforts of the City to strengthen its animal control bylaw and appreciate Council's decision to move forward with the new recommendations, in support of responsible dog ownership.

CKC continues to support positive and humane training methods for dogs and believe that positive owner influence and education are paramount throughout the training process.

In the last 10 years, two-thirds of non-profits have reported a D&O claim.
