

## CKC REMEMBERS LARRY KERELUKE-A PASSIONATE, **INSPIRED LEADER IN THE** DOG COMMUNITY



The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) is deeply saddened to announce the sudden death of Board Chair Larry G. Kereluke, September 9, in Etobicoke, Ontario.

"Shock still prevails from the recent and sudden loss of Larry Kereluke. Many kind and

deserving words will be said about his contributions to the dog fancy, his gentleness and integrity, for a long time to come. His commitment to our club was unwavering and I think it fitting to share comments made at the final board meeting he chaired on September 8.

He opened the meeting with optimism and inspiration for the future of CKC. This included moving boldly forward with open minds to modernize the CKC while not forgetting the purpose and successes of the past. He extended thanks and appreciation for the efforts of members, volunteers and staff. He also reminded us of the importance of respect and cooperation in the pursuit of our shared goals to keep the CKC and the dog fancy vibrant and viable.

Larry fell ill the very next day and passed quickly. An undeniably special and caring man that was a friend to so many. You are already greatly missed, Larry."

It was in the late '60s that Larry first made his foray into the dog fancy by showing his first Afghan. He was quickly "hooked" and acquired his first breeding animal a short time later. Natural progression followed with the development of his breeding



program as well as professional handling at shows for clients. Under the kennel name Timang Afghans, and with limited breeding, Larry and his wife, Lorraine, produced over 35 champions and showed many dogs to Best in Show in Canada and the United States. In 1985, Larry began his pursuit of his

CKC judging license. Approved as an all-breed judge in 1995, he judged in Canada and around the world.

Larry was passionate about protecting and growing the dog fancy into the future and worked tirelessly in many volunteer positions to contribute to that goal. He was pivotal as he helped shape and support many dog clubs over the years. Larry served as President of the Northwinds Dog Club in Winnipeg, the Afghan Hound Club of Canada and was an active member of the Manitoba Gazehound Association and Manitoba Hound Club. Larry was also a former member of the Education Committee of the Canadian Dog Judges Association.

Larry's dedication to CKC was marked by his tireless and inspired leadership as a Life Member, at the board table, in his committee work, in his interaction with members in his constituency— Zone 8-Manitoba, as well as with members across the country. He was elected to a three-year term as Board Chair beginning January 2018, having served as a Director for Zone 8 since 2012. He served on numerous committees and councils including the AGM Planning Committee, Discipline Committee, Legislation Committee, Conformation Council and



the Executive Director Review Committee. Larry was supportive of his fellow members in their pursuits, helping whenever he could.

A knowledgeable judge who really knew his breeds, Larry was supportive and encouraging to all. His tremendous impact on the dog fancy will continue to be felt by all in the decades to come. He will be sorely missed.

## **CKC WELCOMES A THERAPY DOG** TITLE RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Effective January 1, 2019, CKC will be recognizing Titles from CKC Approved Therapy Dog Organizations.

## What is a Therapy Dog?

It is a dog and their owner/handler who are evaluated and tested via the Therapy Dog Organization and if successful, volunteer their time and visit people in hospital and community facilities. These dog teams promote emotional support for both short and long-term patients as well as the elderly, disabled, children in a variety of hospitals, homes and schools.

#### How does your dog get started?

You must enroll your dog with a Therapy Dog Organization and complete the required program. The Canadian Kennel Club has approved six Therapy Dog Organizations.

## What does it mean that The Canadian Kennel Club approved Therapy Dog Organizations?

If you and your dog successfully complete the required levels of accomplishment at one of the following organizations, you are eligible to apply for a Canadian Kennel Title Recognition and Certificate.

What criteria does my dog require to be eligible for a Canadian Kennel Club Title Recognition and Certificate after they have successfully accomplished the requirements of the Therapy Dog Organization?

- CKC Registration Number or a Performance Event Number (PEN), a Canine Companion Number (CCN), a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) or an Event Registration Number (ERN).
- · A Canine Good Neighbour Certification (CGN).
- CKC Therapy Dog Record of Visits Form or equivalent form from the Therapy Dog Organization. https://www.ckc.ca/ en/Files/Forms/Shows-Trials/Exhibitors/Therapy-Dog-Record-of-Visits-Form-No-150-37-71.

## What are the various Canadian Kennel Club Recognition Titles for Therapy Dogs?

Titles include Therapy Dog Novice (THDN) with the completion of 10 visits, Therapy Dog (THD)-with the completion of 50 Visits, Therapy Dog Advanced (THDA)-with the completion of 100 Visits, Therapy Dog Excellent (THDX)-with the completion of 200 Visits, and the Therapy Dog Distinguished (THDD)-with the completion of 500 Visits.

## **NEW EVENT SCENT DETECTION** LAUNCHES AT CKC **JANUARY 1, 2019**

#### What is Scent Detection?

It is a fun event open to all dogs to enjoy the challenge of locating a scent and communicating with their handler that the scent has been located. The trial is done in a variety of environments allowing a dog to use their strongest natural sense. Dogs will be divided into height divisions within the classes based on the height indicated on the entry form. Titles are awarded upon the dog acquiring the required number of qualifying scores within the class entered.

#### Who can hold Scent Detection Trials?

All interested CKC recognized clubs may apply to hold Scent Detection events provided they have the experience, equipment and location to hold a safe event. Scent Detection events either can be a stand-alone event or may be held in conjunction with other CKC events. A minimum of one (1) Sanction match must be held prior to holding a Scent Detection Trial.

## When can I start holding a Sanction match?

The CKC Board of Directors approved a motion at the June 2018 Board meetings, stating

"THAT, clubs be permitted to hold sanction scent detection events as of October 1, 2018, following the rule books that start on January 1, 2019."

## How do I apply to host a Scent Detection Trial?

Once your sanction match has been approved and the match is completed, you can apply to host a Scent Detection Trial using the Event Date Application form found on the CKC Website. In order to jump-start this program, the CKC is waiving all late fees for clubs applying to hold this event in 2019. A club may hold unlimited number of events annually.
