

ABVMA DECISION AND PROPOSED **CHANGES TO ALBERTA ANIMAL** PROTECTION ACT

As many of our Alberta CKC members are aware, the Alberta Veterinary Medical Association (ABVMA) voted in favour to ban veterinarians from completing several procedures, namely, cropping, docking and front dewclaw removal.

CKC was in contact with the ABVMA prior to the membership vote, providing scientific evidence to support cropping and docking procedures. This information was also complimented by a presentation to ABVMA on January 15, 2019.

Despite the recent news, CKC continues to support freedom of choice for breeders of purebred dogs who can continue this practice to promote safety in performance activities and support hygienic animal husbandry. CKC is working to understand what the next steps and timelines are for ABVMA, for the bans to take effect, and if there are other opportunities for discussions prior to implementation.

CKC is also aware of the proposed amendments to Alberta's Animal Protection Act (AAPA) and the petition that is circulating. The draft changes to the AAPA include a ban on cropping and docking procedures and a mandatory licensing of all breeders.

CKC is working to secure the opportunity for stakeholder consultation with MLA Rick Fraser, the MLA who has started the proposal, to provide input and feedback. We have learned that many stakeholder groups have been included in the process to create the proposed amendments, but to our knowledge, no purebred dog clubs have been requested to participate.

Animal welfare is important to all CKC members. CKC encourages balanced legislation that considers all stakeholders that it impacts.

The Canadian Kennel Club is pleased to announce its new partnership with Sweden-based non-profit International Partnership for Dogs (IPFD). Founded in 2014, IPFD is an international, independent, multi-stakeholder, multidisciplinary organization that facilitates collaboration and resource-sharing with the aim of advancing canine health and welfare globally.

Bringing together kennel clubs, academic institutions, breed specific interest groups, educational and professional organizations, and the pet industry, IPFD's audience covers health-conscious breeders, breed clubs, veterinarians, researchers, dog owners, and more. Contributing partners include Agria Pet Insurance (Sweden), Royal Canin, and Wisdom Health, as well as the Kennel Clubs of Ireland, Norway, Finland, France, Germany, Sweden, and the UK. Collaborating partners include VetCompass, Canine Genetics and Epidemiology, VetStream, Dog Breeding Reform Group, and the Federation of Companion Animal Veterinary Associations (FECAVCA).

Dr. Brenda Bonnett, CEO of IPFD and a Canadian owner of purebred dogs, is encouraged by this new partnership, believing strongly that this will lead to tangible benefits for CKC members and dogs in Canada. "Access to the wealth of information available via IPFD and DogWellNet.com will undoubtedly empower breeders and breed clubs to make educated decisions about breeding programs and strategies for long term breed health and well-being. IPFD's strength lies in its membership and the collaboration that results. The Canadian Kennel Club will add and gain significant value with their IPFD membership," said Dr. Bonnett.

IPFD has launched a comprehensive online platform at dogwellnet.com, which has been well-received by the dog community. Meant to serve as an information hub and a platform for building community, the site's vast array of resources can easily be accessed by the public and more by creating a member account. This includes a comprehensive collection of scientific papers, breeding strategies, and articles. Furthermore, the site features message boards where members can interact with dedicated breeders, veterinarians, and researchers from around the world. A growing web resource, DogWellNet.com is accessed by users internationally from the United States, Australia, the UK, and Europe.


A major initiative of IPFD and one of special interest to the CKC and its members is the Harmonization of Genetic Testing for Dogs (HGTD). The HGTD has started with a database of Genetic Test Providers and listings of available tests by breed but is expanding to include many counselling resources to help breeders, owners and advisors to navigate the complex world of genetic testing.

IPFD's work extends to co-hosting International Dog Health Workshops in various countries, and to date three have taken place in Europe with a fourth scheduled this year in the UK. The Program for the 2019 International Dog Health Workshop focusses on issues such as health testing, the concept of breed and how it affects health and well-being as well as strategies for preservation, preventing extremes of conformation through health and breeding considerations and much more. Plenary speakers include distinguished veterinarians, kennel club breeding advisors, and acclaimed scientists. The information gleaned from attending sessions is vastly beneficial to kennel clubs seeking to advance the welfare of purebred dogs within their countries. CKC is expected to be represented at the 2019 International Dog Health Workshop by a member of the Genetics & Medical Committee.

CKC is proud to partner with IPFD to further our access to a wide network of experts and volunteers working diligently and passionately to improve the health and well-being of purposebred dogs. With a mutual belief that the world is a better place because we share it with dogs, this partnership is surely a step towards protecting and strengthening the bond between humankind and the dog.

CANADA'S KAYLA PENNEY IS OFF TO CRUFTS!

Our Junior Handling National Champion is heading to England for the International title



14-year-old Kayla Penney of Chilliwack, B.C. won the Canadian Junior Handling National Championship in October and is now headed to Birmingham, England to compete in the Crufts International Junior Handling Competition on Saturday March 9th, 2019. I had the chance to ask this representative of Zone 12 - B.C. Interior and Yukon some questions before she takes off across the pond.

When did you get your first dog? I got my first dog 2 and half years ago from Valerie Berry in Mission, BC. He's a Portuguese Water Dog "Tanaki's Happily Ever After", call name Kash.

How did you get involved in Junior Handling?

My grandparents, Dave and Diane Labiuk, are involved in the dog show world and brought me to one. After seeing what it was all about, I wanted to try it. I started showing their male Golden Retriever "Fyreglo's King of Hearts". It didn't take long for me to start love showing dogs and I quickly became very passionate about the sport!

Who have your mentors been?

I have had many mentors over the years, from professional handlers, owner handlers and other Juniors. I have had the opportunity to work closely with Bev Dorma, Guillermo Fano, Jen Knudsen, Amanda Williams, Edgar Rojas, Heidi Gervais, Cynthia Seeling and Margaret Lehmann.

Tell me about your experience winning the Junior Nationals and becoming the Canadian Kennel Club's Junior National Champion for Conformation.

My experience winning the Junior Nationals and becoming CKC's Junior National Champion for Conformation feels awesome; a dream come true! My parents and oldest sister, along with some family members from Alberta were there cheering. They were so proud of me as were all my supporters. I am glad they were a part of this experience.

How does it feel to be representing Canada at Crufts?

The feeling of representing Canada at Crufts is overwhelming. I am nervous and excited at the same time. I am looking forward to the competition and meeting all the top Juniors in the world. I would love to be the next Canadian Junior to win Crufts.

How are you raising funds for your trip to Crufts?

Lots of fundraising is needed to raise funds for my trip. There are many clubs and supporters making donations to help with all the expenses. Also, my mom is helping me raise money by doing crafts and selling them, like welcome signs, wreaths and fake plant terrariums. We have been doing raffles at every local dog show and collecting bottles as well.

How are you preparing for Crufts?

I am preparing for Crufts by watching previous juniors at Crufts compete on YouTube and watching the different breed videos that I am interested in showing. I have chosen the Portuguese Water Dog and the Golden Retriever as my pick breeds to show. I also read an article about Caroline Holicka and her experience after winning the CKC Nationals and representing Canada last year at Crufts. I had the opportunity to speak with one of the previous winners at Crufts, and got some tips that will help me in this experience.

What's the best advice you've received when it comes to showing dogs?

Some of the best advice I have received when it comes to showing dogs is to focus on my own dog and show its conformation to the best of the breed, but most of all to have fun. There will be several Canadian Kennel Club members at Crufts this year, cheering on Kayla! We wish her the very best of luck and know that she will make us proud!

Remembering the Canadians that wowed at the 143rd Annual Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show

Another Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show has come and gone. There is so much to see and do during Westminster week: from the Masters Agility Championship to the two days of the Conformation Show, not to mention all the friends from all over the world you want to catch up with. As you arrive in New York City and look ahead at Westminster week, it seems long, but always passes in the blink of an eye.

There's an undeniable bond that happens when we Canadians get together to show at Westminster. We are all on one team and a win for any Canadian dog feels like a win for all Canadian dogs. Here are some great Canadian dogs that made Westminster 2019 so memorable.

Best of Breed Winners!

Of the approximately 2,800 dogs that were entered at this year's show, 103 were from Canada. 11* Canadian-bred and Canadianowned dogs took Best of Breed.

One of the first big wins by a Canadian Dog at Westminster this year was by a Spanish Water Dog, Win: CH Zorrazo Xplorer PT. Hudson is owned by Marnie Harrison and his breeder is Marika Fredrikson.

A Canadian Rough Collie took Breed this year at Westminster. GCHG CH Sylvan Argent Hollywood And Vine. This gorgeous girl goes by Marilyn outside the ring and is proudly owned by her breeders Connie DuBois and Dr Cindi Bossart as well as Jennifer Mosing, Earl Liverance and S Klaver.

In the Emergency Service it was discovered Marilyn's oxygen was low and she was immediately treated. When testing was completed it was realized that she had a thromboembolism in the lungs. She passed within two hours. My thoughts are with all who loved Marilyn at this incredibly difficult time.

Handsome Tam aka GCHP CH Gwencalon's Tam O'Shanter not only won the Beagle (Over 13 In. But Not Exceeding 15 In.) breed, but also took Group 3rd on Monday night under Judge Pat Trotter! Congratulations to breeders/owners Kathleen and William Friend as well as handler Doug Belter.

Inuk and his handler Graeme Burdon went on to break his own record and took home his 10th Westminster Best of Breed Win! It was incredible to be there standing beside Inuk's breeder and owner Sharon

Robertson as we witnessed a dog accomplish something that very well may never be done again!



"Putting into words how I felt when Inuk won breed for the 10th time is really very difficult. I watched Graeme show him, watched Inuk move around the ring and thought how much Inuk loved to show, to stand in the that ring with such a presence. As Mr. Reynolds pulled him out first and continued with his picks, my only thought was "point to him, point to him, make it official!" When he did, there were a few minutes of disbelief. Had my dog has just broken his own record? A record that will probably never be broken? So many thoughts were running through my head. I wanted to jump up and down and scream "Thank you!" I will be eternally grateful for all Graeme has accomplished with this extraordinary dog. We are back home now, where Inuk follows me around and sleeps on the pillow beside me, and probably dreams of another show. I would like to thank all of you that have supported and believed in this dog. I would like to thank so many, who, over Inuk's career have provided us with overwhelming support, too many to name individually.
