Documents Required With Submission

A request in writing must be made by one (1) or more resident Canadian breeder(s) and / or owner(s) representing that breed. The written request shall be accompanied by the following:

- A written explanation of the level of interest in participation in Canadian Kennel Club events amongst the Canadian breeders and owners.
- The names, contact information (province or territory of residence) of any and all Canadian breeders and owners that support the application.
- List foreign breed club(s) or foreign breeders(s) in support of recognition in Canada.
- A copy of a certificate of registration, verified in writing by the owner as being current and accurate, for a dog of that breed from a Canadian Kennel Club recognized kennel club or an association incorporated under the Animal Pedigree Act, other than The Canadian Kennel Club.
- A copy of a three (3) generation pedigree, verified in writing by the owner as being current and accurate, for a dog of that breed from a Canadian Kennel Club recognized kennel club or an association incorporated under the Animal Pedigree Act other than The Canadian Kennel Club.
- A copy of the breed standard from the country of origin.
- A detailed information package that describes the history, physiology and breed characteristics.
- Two (2) Photos of the breed (1 front and 1 side – standing position) to be shared with judges. If colour(s) and/or markings are essential in the breed, then additional photos must be included regarding the colour(s) and/or markings.
- High Resolution picture for breed Website page advertisement. (not a show picture)
- Consent form signed for usage of pictures in public format.

The information package and breed standards will be referred to the Breed Standards Committee and Event Officiating Committee. The Breed Standards Committee and Event Officiating Committee may propose changes to the breed standard providing it is for grammar, terminology, and clarification. Additionally, where the breed standard from the country of origin has provisions for cropping, docking or dewclaw removal, the Breed standards Committee will include changes supporting breeders' right of choice in accordance with the CKC's policy statement.

The detailed information package will be referred to the Registration Committee including comments and suggested amendments from the Event Officiating Committee (EOC) and the Breed Standards Committee for their editorial review.

The photos, information package, and breed standard will be shared with Conformation judges once the breed is approved and the breed standard is final.

(1) Rules of Eligibility (ROE) must be provided with the request. ROE define the primary traits for registration of a breed, and these traits should reflect the physical essence of the breed, be observable (e.g., size, colour, coat, etc.), measurable and practical.

(2) The required fee. Please see the Fee Schedule displayed on ckc.ca for current list.

(3) Once all supporting documents have been received and verified by Head Office providing all requirements set out in policy have been met, the breed will be presented to the Board of Directors for approval to poll the membership. In the event approval is not granted by the Board, the fee will be refunded to the applicant(s).

(4) The polling results will be tabulated at Head Office and presented to the Board. If the results are favorable the breed will be added to the Miscellaneous List with an indication of the group in which the breed will be placed for conformation purposes taking into consideration all recommendations. Notice of any such addition shall be provided in the Official Publication and/or electronic posting.

(5) The president of the club or the spokesperson for the representative group shall be advised in writing that the breed has been accepted as a miscellaneous breed by The Canadian Kennel Club.
