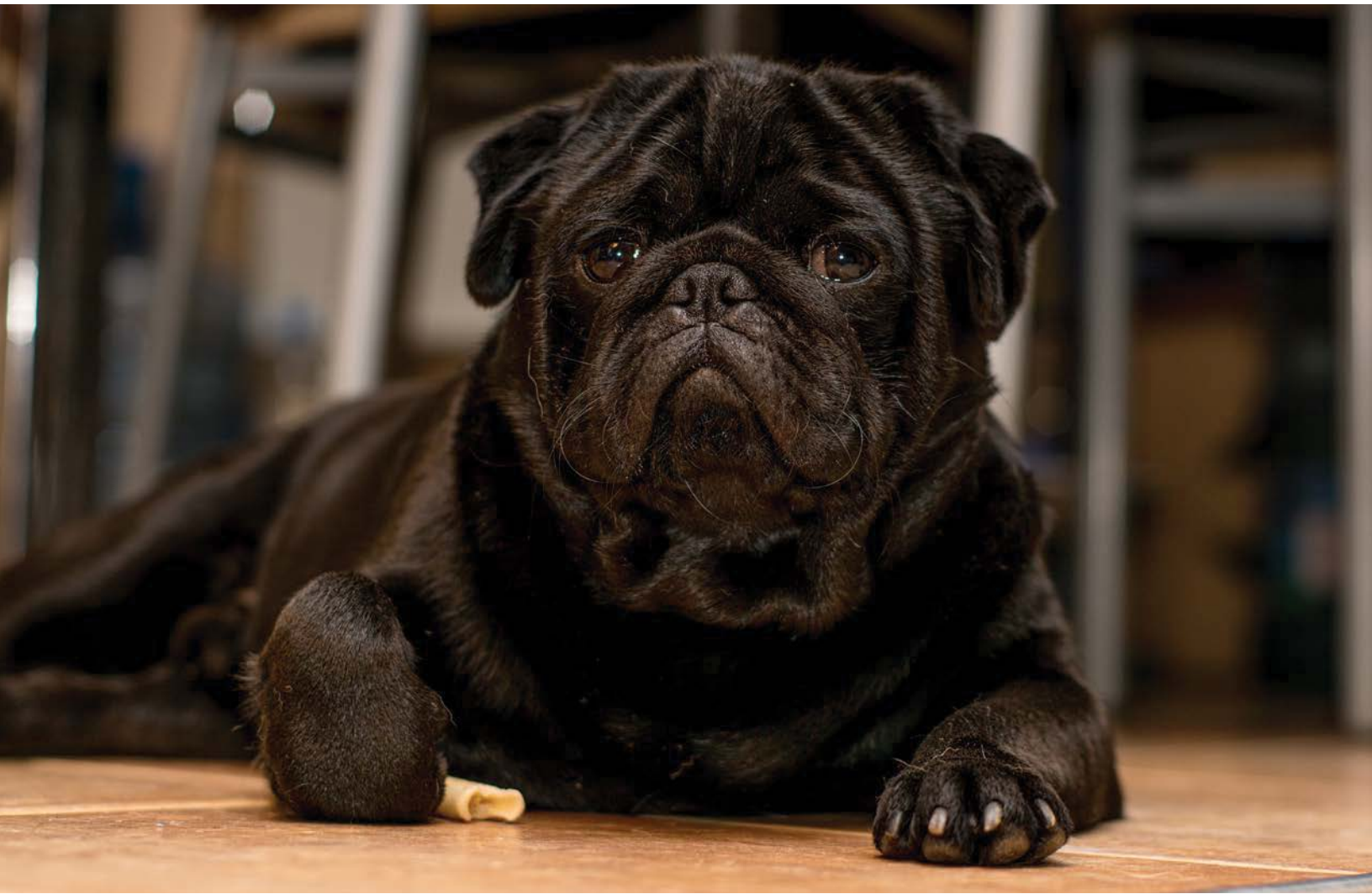

## FRENCH BULLDOG


For playfulness he has few peers,

## SILKY TERRIER

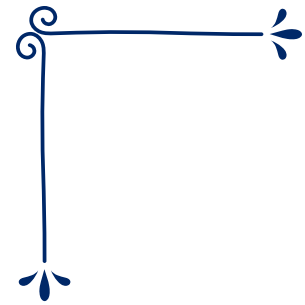
This Australian will vermin get

With hair that covers hazel eyes.

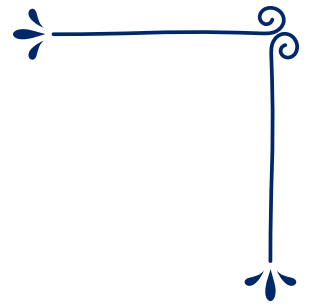
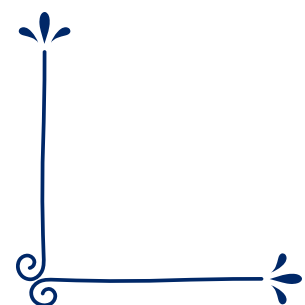


## SPINONE ITALIANO

## STAFFORDSHIRE BULL TERRIER

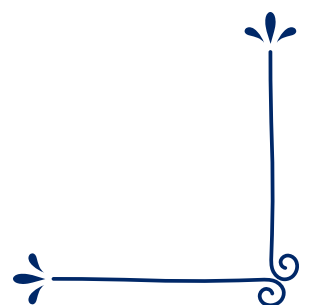
With the days of dog fights spent

That act as snowshoes, which is neat.

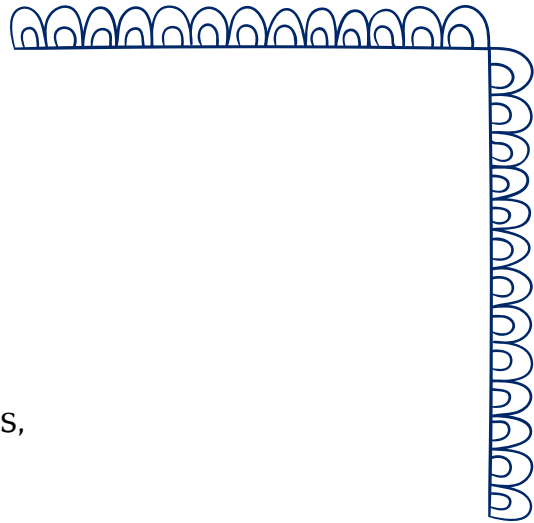
## VIZSLA

Home- loving and intelligent.

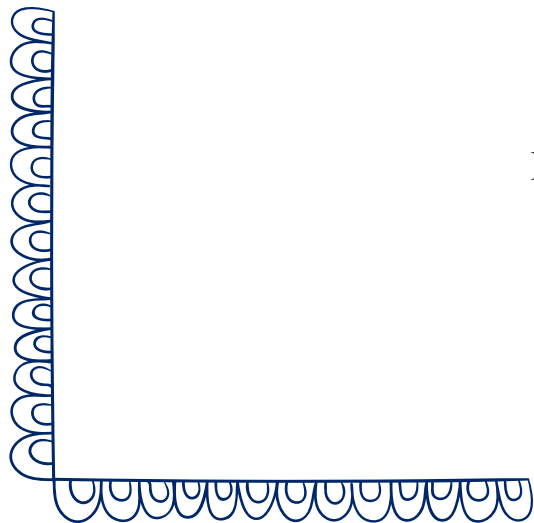


## WELSH TERRIER
