BROKEN BONES AND HOW TO SET THEM.

ACCIDENTS resulting in broken bones should be very rare among sporting dogs ; still they do occur from time to time. As a writer of a series of articles on "Ailments and Accidents of Sporting Dogs" in the *Shooting Times* tells us it is often difficult to account for these mishaps, for except the dog be run over, or some such cause originates the damage—a cause which is self-evident—the injury is done at a time when the eye of the dog's master is not upon it. Fractures may be one of three different kinds—simple, compound, or comminuted. The two latter, involving invariably the soft parts of flesh or muscle around the bone, are practically incurable in the dog ; but a simple fracture or a series of simple fractures can easily be mended if the dog be in good health otherwise. A simple fracture is when a bone is snapped in two. This occurs most frequently in the legs, thighs, and shoulders, and can be easily distinguished and remedied.

In the case of complete fracture of the leg bones the pendent state of the injured limb will be sufficient evidence of the seat of the injury, but otherwise considerable swelling of the part injured accompanied by great sensitiveness, convulsive twitchings, and what is known as crepitus, or the grating sound produced by the two broken ends of bone rubbing one against the other.

These are purely local symptoms : the constitutional ones will be regulated by the nature of the injury. The action of the dog itself will tell if a leg or thigh be broken ; indisposition to move and lack of sensitiveness points to injury to the bones of the back or neck, and whole or partial loss of consciousness suggests injury to the bone of the head. In any case the breathing will be quick, and the distressed look of the dog will also point to broken bones somewhere.

In attempting to deal with a fracture some knowledge of canine anatomy is required, and as a properly set-up skeleton of a dog is not always at hand for study, the would-be bone setter before attempting to set a broken limb or bone must make himself acquainted with the structural features of the dog from illustrations used in connection with the study of a sound dog.

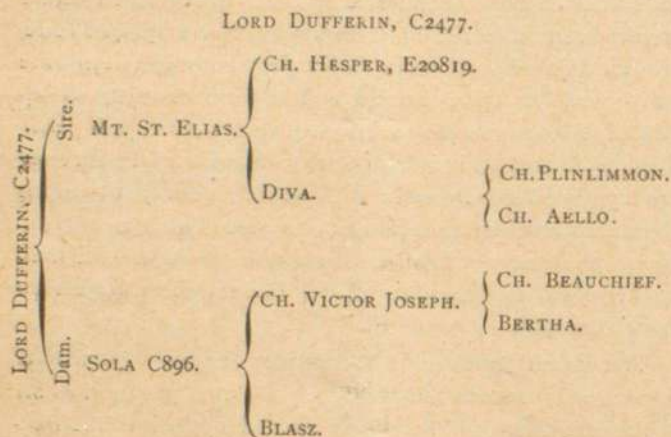
When the fracture is very simple, and no displacement has taken place, the operation of bringing the two fractured ends together is not very difficult. To do this effectually some force may be necessary, but it must be very carefully applied, and with a proper knowledge of the anatomy of the part affected. Having re-adjusted the bone, it is necessary to satisfy oneself that the adjustment is correct, and that

the bone has been brought back to its proper form and position throughout. In the case of a broken leg, the fracture having been so far repaired, means must be employed to retain the injured portions in their correct position until the two pieces of bone re-unite and a permanent join is attained. Various means for this purpose are employed. Bandages, splinters, adhesive plasters, and indiarubber sheeting are equally effective means, and one that is always to hand is the starch bandage. In connection with this form of bandage, splints may at first be necessary to maintain the limb in the position proper for it, after the starch bandage shall have hardened.

The starch bandage is made very easily. All that is necessary is to soak the bandage in starch prepared as for the laundry, then roll the linen up and apply it to the fractured leg, rolling it evenly and firmly round, commencing from the bottom and working carefully upward until well above the fracture, being very careful always that the bones are properly set. The leg should then be placed in splints until the bandage is firmly set and dry, when they may be taken off, as the starch bandage will then have formed a stiff and closely moulded sheath to the injured leg. Care should be taken to bind up the whole leg from the toe to well above the place of injury, otherwise any portion not subject to equal pressure will swell, cause pain, and eventually necessitate the removal and correct placing of the bandage. The injured limb must remain five or six weeks in the perfect mould which this bandage ensures, after which it may be removed either by careful cutting of its whole length or equally careful removal of it piece by piece. The bone will by this time be completely healed, and after having thoroughly washed the parts which were bandaged, a little vaseline judiciously applied will act as a healing ointment, and promote the growth of the hair.

Some weeks ago a school teacher resident in Derrygonnelly, Co. Fermanagh, presented a friend of his living in Dublin with a Greyhound. The dog was forwarded to town in due course by rail, and was put up in the usual way at his new owner's residence. But the change was not evidently to his liking, for, taking advantage of the first opportunity afforded him, he shook the dust of the metropolis from off his feet and started off in search of his old home in the land of the Maguires. He was missing for several days, but eventually turned up one afternoon, very much fatigued and foot sore, after a long and wearisome tramp of over 100 miles.—*The Kennel &c.*

OUR ILLUSTRATION.



THIS grand young dog whose portrait is given in this issue is admittedly the largest St. Bernard ever bred in Canada, and from his great size, immense bone and superior breeding should prove exceedingly valuable as a sire, and a grand addition to the ranks of St. Bernard stud dogs in Canada. The combination of the Hesper, Plinlimmon and Victor Joseph strain contains the richest blood in English and American St. Bernard geneology. Lord Dufferin was bred by Mr. H. Gorman, Sarnia, Ont., and is out of his well-known prize winning bitch Sola, herself a grand sample of Victor Joseph stock, standing 31 inches in height at shoulder and weighing 160 lbs. Lord Dufferin at the time the picture was taken, from which this engraving has been made, was thirteen months old; stood 33 inches in height at the shoulder and weighed 182 lbs. His other measurements were: Length, tip to tip, 85 inches; Chest, 41 inches; Loin, 33 inches; Skull, 26 inches; Muzzle, 16 inches; Forearm, 14 inches; Leg, 11 inches; Length of muzzle to stop, 4½ inches; Length of head, 12 inches. These are remarkable figures for a dog of that age, and indicate what may be expected when he arrives at maturity. In color Lord Dufferin is a snowy white with rich orange tawny badges. The head markings are of the typical kind, including a magnificent blaze extending over the skull. His coat is all that could be desired in length, quality and texture. We predict that this grand young dog will make his mark as a sire and on the bench after he has attained his development. Lord Dufferin was purchased by Major Guillot, of Windsor, a few days ago, that well known St. Bernard fancier and breeder having selected him after personal examination in which he satisfied himself that he was the best specimen of the breed he had yet seen, of his age.

FOREIGN DOGS.

I send you a photo of a rare collection of dogs, and their owners, Mr. Maurice Barrymore and Mr. S. Miller Kent, of the Aristocracy company, which recently played an engagement in this city. Mr. Kent has a Belmont Fox Terrier bitch and a pair of Chinese Toy Spaniels, while his friend Mr. Barrymore has a pair of Esquimaux, a pair of Chinese Toy Spaniels, a Chow dog and a Clydesdale Terrier bitch. I have met doggy men before, but, Mr. Barrymore is a true dog fancier, cares nothing for the money part, glad to present his friends with a puppy as a souvenir. Having been a constant reader of the doggy papers of England for the last ten years, we drifted to English dog news and as Mr. Barrymore had visited many dog shows in that country he felt more at home on British dogs, and we were right in the thick of it when a news paper man appeared, with the usual amount of grizzle these people carry. This man went right in to stop our talk, but seeing that his man would rather talk dog, he turned to me, Mr. — don't you see that you are blocking the wheels of the press? I beg your pardon, Sir, I said. You seem to be very fond of dogs Mr. Barrymore; said the reporter, indeed I am, I can find pleasure with my pets at all hours. These dogs which you see, together with my birds and a pair of skunks, which are in my dressing-room over there, (we were on the stage) have been with us all over the Pacific coast. During the performance I spent the greater part of the evening in the dressing room, and it reminded me very much of a menagerie, and every time Mr. Barrymore entered the room, a great reception awaited him each one jealous of the other, he would go all round and pat each of the dogs, isn't this a beauty? he said, passing me one of the skunks. I never took the trouble to examine that animal before, but I am quite free to say it was a handsome little creature. The *eau de cologne* had been removed however, when they were young. He had these skunks trained to come when he called them, and to see them make a plunge at the Toy Spaniels to drive them off was amusing. Should Mr. Barrymore ever visit your city call and see him, I believe he would go out in his dishabille to see a good dog or his owner. Mr. Kent is not an old fancier yet, having recently joined the ranks, but he will make a good one in time as he looks well to his friends stock when Mr. Barrymore is attending to business. FOREIGN DOGS, BY W. K. TAUNTON, ESQ. In *Vinton's Almanac* 1888.

The Esquimaux. The theory that the wolf and the dog were originally identical receives strong confirmation upon a comparison between the wolf of the Arctic region and the Esquimaux dog.

The latter is so extremely wolf-like, that great difficulty is frequently experienced in distinguishing between the two animals at a distance. The principal difference being the carriage of the tail, which in the dog is curled over the back, but in the wolf is carried low, and the extra size of the last named animal. Those who have had an opportunity of inspecting the Arctic wolf remember that it is much larger than animals of the same species found in other countries. In addition to the general resemblances between the Esquimaux and the wolf, we find the oblique eye in both a peculiarity which I do not think is to be found in any other breed of dog. If it were possible to trace the pedigree of some of these dogs, we should probably not have to go far back before discovering a direct cross with the wolf. That such a cross is deemed desirable is evident from the fact that some of the largest owners of Esquimaux dogs have lately obtained a couple of wolves for the purpose of breeding from them with their dogs. It would naturally be supposed that such a cross would produce a dangerous, treacherous brute, not safe for any one to handle; but I have myself owned two Australian dingo bitches, whose dam was a cross between a wolf and dog, and they never showed the least sign of treachery or bad temper from the time they came into my possession till their death. In its native land the Esquimaux has to undergo an amount of hardship and fatigue that would prove fatal to any other breed. Yoked together in teams they travel long distances at a high rate of speed, and have to work hardest when food is scarce. Very exaggerated statements are sometimes made as to the size of these dogs, but the average height does not exceed 22 inches at the shoulder. Nature has provided them with a dense thick covering as a protection against the intense cold which they have to endure. This covering is formed of two distinct coats, the outer one consisting of hair about three or four inches long, very harsh, standing out from the body like bristles, especially along the ridge of the back, underneath which is to be found a second coat, consisting of a thick soft wool. These dogs would probably be far more sought after were it not for the idea entertained by many that they are more like wild animals than dogs. It will be

found that in disposition they are most affectionate, but at the same time very jealous, and they cannot bear to see any other dog noticed in their presence. I have owned many imported specimens of the Esquimaux, and have bred a large number myself, and although their appearance conveys the impression that they are treacherous and bad-tempered, I have never had a single instance of such being the case.

The dogs of China, vary considerably, the kind best known in this country (England), is the Edible dog, or, as it is more commonly called, the Chow or Chow Chow dog, but why it should be so called I do not know, as I cannot learn that it is known by any such name in its native land. These dogs are commonly eaten by the poorer class in China and the black variety of the breed is looked upon as a greater delicacy than the red. In Canton it is not an uncommon thing to see notices at some of the restaurants, saying that the flesh of the black dog and cat can be served up at a moments notice. These dogs somewhat resemble a large coarse Pomeranian, and are probably related to the Esquimaux. They have a keen scent, and are used in packs in the north of China. The great peculiarity in the breed is the black or very dark blue tongue. It was not till I myself commenced to breed the variety that I became aware that they are born with red tongues, and not being acquainted with this fact, I was on the point of destroying the first litter I bred, but fortunately refrained from doing so. In the course of a few days I observed a small black spot, which gradually increased and spread till the whole tongue became of the orthodox color, and all the puppies afterwards became prize winners.

China also possesses a small breed of Toy dogs very much resembling the Japanese Spaniel, with which the public are familiar from the specimens exhibited from time to time at our different shows. They are about the size of a small Blenheim Spaniel, with long, silky, wavy coats, black and white. The nose is not so short as in our modern Toy Spaniels. These dogs come from Pekin and thereabouts, and are obtained through the Nepalese traders who go to Lhasa in Thibet, and get the dogs from the Chinese caravans which go there."

As I have already said, Mr. Barrymore had a pair of Esquimaux dogs, very fine, a pair of Chinese Toy Spaniels, a Chow dog, black, all of which answer the description given by Mr. Taunton. The Esquimaux bitch was in whelp, having been bred in Seattle, Washington territory. I hope the photo which I sent you of the group, will be good enough to find a place in the GAZETTE. I must thank the very genial and popular photographer Mr. Lear for the picture.
