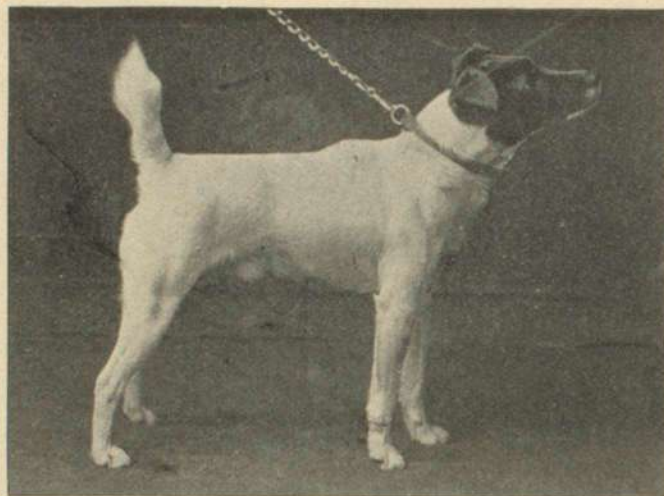

Cropping of dogs ears.—It was decided to take a vote by mail of the Club members on this question.

Fred Kirby suspended.—Moved by Mr. Boyle, seconded by Mr. Sweetnam, that in the matter of the Industrial Exhibition Association versus Fred Kirby, that owing to the non-payment of entrance fees, he be suspended for one year from this date. *Carried*

W. B. Palmer's name was ordered to be removed from the roll of membership.

Mr. A. Murdoch, Hamilton, on motion of Mr. Boyle, seconded by Mr. Sweetnam, was elected to fill the vacancy on the Executive Committee.

1895 Stud Book.—Moved by Mr. Sweetnam, seconded by Mr. Boyle, that it is in the interest of the Club that the publication of the registrations for 1895 be left in abeyance for the present. *Carried.*

The late Alfred Geddes.—Resolved, that at a meeting of the Executive Council of the Canadian Kennel Club the Secretary be instructed to convey to Mrs. Alfred Geddes, the wife of the our late respected member, our vote of sincere sympathy on her sad bereavement by the loss of her husband, whom we found on all occasions an enthusiastic and hearty supporter in all efforts to improve and elevate matters in the canine world. THE annual meeting of the Montreal Kennel Association was recently held in the large hall of the Natural History Society and was well attended, the President, Dr. Wesley Mills in the chair. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. The chairman of the executive then gave the meeting a verbal report of what had been done during the year touching only the more important points in view of what would be told them through the Secretary's report. The Secretary then read his report, which we print in full elsewhere. After its adoption the business report was read showing the Association's finances to be in good shape, this was also adopted. The election of officers was then proceeded with resulting as following:—President, Dr. W. H. Drummond; 1st Vice President, J. A. Pitt, Esq.; 2nd Vice President, W. T. Virtue; Secretary and Treasurer, Geo. K. Lanigan, (re-elected); Executive Committee, J. A. Laurin, Arthur F. Gault, F. G. Kenndy, H. M. Childs, W. C. Finley, Campbell Nelles, J. H. McNally and Dr. E. M. Robb. Ten new members were added to the roll. The President made a formal presentation of the Sir Donald A. Smith cup to Mr. W. T. Virtue, the owner of the winner, the Russian Wolfhound Adrooski. He also took occasion to thank the members for their confidence and assistance during the past year. It was moved by Mr. Lanigan, seconded and carried, that a vote of thanks be tendered the President and retiring officers for their services.

THE MONTREAL KENNEL ASSOCIATION,

ever active in all that pertains to the well being of dogs in the city that lends the Association its name, has recently sent to the police authorities a number of recommendations which we are able to give through the courtesy of the Secretary Mr Geo. Lanigan. The paragraph explaining the action is also his writing :—

It having being intimated that it was the intention of the police authorities to seize and to destroy at once by hanging or shooting all dogs found on the streets without the license tag, the Executive of the Montreal Kennel Association held an emergency meeting on Tuesday evening, Oct. 29th.

The Association felt that as one of the main objects of its existence was to guard the interest of the owners of dogs, and to prevent cruelty to these animals, it was bound to act in the premises, since it appeared that in all probability the carrying out of the contemplated regulations would tend to cruelty, and to unnecessarily offend the feeling of those attached to their canine pets, especially if the animals are put to death without sufficient time elapsing after their capture to allow of their recovery.

Accordingly the following recommendations were unanimously agreed to:—

- 1st. That regulations be enforced regarding the keeping of dogs, and regarding their presence on the streets.
- 2nd. That owners of dogs be taxed for the same.
- 3rd. That pure bred dogs registered or listed in the Canadian Kennel Club be free from taxation in order to encourage the breeding of high class animals instead of worthless mongrels, but that in case of persons breeding dogs a kennel tax be enforced, the amount to depend on the number of brood bitches kept, as is done elsewhere.
- 4th. That dogs not found tagged if seized on the streets be kept 48 hours before being destroyed.
- 5th. That destruction by shooting and especially by hanging are too slow and uncertain to be free from possible and probable cruelty, and therefore to be unhesitatingly condemned.
- 6th. That the lethal chamber in which dogs may be killed by carbonic acid or chloroform is a means widely adopted, and because it is easy of application, more rapid and painless, is recommended as the mode of destruction most in harmony with science and modern conception of humane treatment of animals, and is moreover not an expensive method.

Dr. Wesley Mills presided at the meeting and gave the Executive the benefit of his scientific knowledge and experience.

REDUCTION IN LICENSE.

In Toronto a civic law exists whereby pure bred bitches registered with the Canadian Kennel Club may be licensed for two dollars each, the fee for unregistered bitches being five dollars. This we may say is very actively enforced by the local inspector and is worthy of the attention of dog owners in cities where such a by-law is not in force.

TEN DOLLAR KENNEL LICENSE.

For those who have large kennels of dogs a kennel license costing ten dollars may be procured anywhere in Ontario, with the proviso that all dogs are registered with the C.K.C. This may not be generally known.

INTERNATIONAL FIELD TRIALS CLUB.

A meeting of the International Field Trials Club was held at Chatham, Ont., on the evening of November 4th. After the preliminary business, officers were elected as follows:—President, L. H. Smith, Strathroy; 1st Vice-President, W. Brailsford, England; 2nd Vice-President, Ed. Armstrong, Detroit; Secretary-Treasurer, W. B. Wells, Chatham; Executive Committee, Thomas Guttridge, I. L. Nicholl, C. B. Atkinson, J. Kime, Chatham; R. Bangham, Windsor; Dr. Totten, M. Smith, Forest; T. G. Davey, London; W. D. Tristem, Detroit; Geo. H. Briggs, Toronto. Thos. Johnston of Winnipeg, and John Davidson of Monroe, Mich., submitted their resignations.

The issue we have seen apparently covers two months September and October, and the leading feature of interest therein is a beautifully illustrated description of the Kennels of Her Majesty the Queen. Pictures of the kennels from various points as well as of several of the inmates are given. Under the head of "Notable Dogs at

Home" Mrs. H. Carthew's beautiful place Rove Hurst Chase is pictorially described. Very excellent indeed are the several illustrations printed with a pleasing softness on cream paper. Mrs. Hebe Carthew is evidently as great a lover of the horse as of "our friend, the dog" as several plates of cobby-looking specimens of the equine race are given as well as those of the dogs. The latter include photographs of Irish Terriers, Deerhounds, and a taking one of the Dalmatian Rugby Beauty and his mistress. Mrs. Carthew's first fancy was the Irish Terrier but this breed has latterly been in great part supplanted by the Deerhound.

MR. C. V. FORD

succeeded in winning first with his nice Champion Christopher Collie bitch, Otterburn Olive, at Providence. She is spoken well of, though a size small, being particularly good in head, eye, and ear carriage.

BRAEHEAD BEAUTY?

not Beauty? is the correct name of the Collie bitch winner of first in the open class at Montreal and referred to in our report without the prefix denoting the inmates of Mr. Gault's kennel.

COLLIE HEADS.

Referring to the refining process going on in the heads of show Collies, the *Stock-keeper* of November first says:—

"We draw the attention of our Collie readers to the very important club notice this week. Mr. Ralph's impending resignation as honorary secretary was received with expressions of regret. Dr. Penny proposed two very important resolutions and probably enjoyed more sympathy than votes. It is this gentleman's wish to see the Standard brought into accord with the type that wins to-day. We should be better pleased to see the dogs brought back to the Standard. When Dr. Penny's suggestion was negatived, he proposed that the modern winners should be measured and photographed to see how far they differed from the type, but the meeting warily declined. From an examination of the Collies at the Crystal Palace we came to the conclusion that the Borzoi-head movement is regrettably making progress. The dogs look like bitches and the bitches like weedy Toys."

MR. H. P. MULLENS, TORONTO,

who has recently returned from England, purchased while there the well known black and tan Field Spaniel, Wansbeck Wonder. An excellent portrait of the dog, though it shows him short of feather, appears in the *British Fancier* of October 18th, and that journal praises him highly. Wansbeck Wonder was bred by Mr. F. W. Morris, of Morpeth, and is by Marvel out of Langside Thyra, being whelped in May, 1893. He is a low set, long-bodied dog, carrying plenty of bone, with good head, ears and coat. Mr. W. Arkwright, in his criticism of the Scottish Kennel Club's Show in the *English Kennel Gazette*, says, "Wans-

beck Wonder, 1st open, was the only sound Spaniel in the class. He has a good head, fair body, and nice limbs."

WANSBECK WONDER

has been freely shown and was always at or near the top. His best victory was that noted above, where he beat Rathgar Fop, a well known winner. He has also won firsts at Stanley, Crook, etc., as well as winning seconds and thirds.

ALBERT'S RANGER,

an excellent photo of which we give in this issue, in addition to his wins at Toronto and Montreal was first in both open and novice classes at Bath, England, in 1894, as well as winning the special for best dog or bitch. His wins in the United States include two seconds at Pittsburgh, third open at New York, and first open and special at Detroit, 1895. After his Montreal win he was put first at Danbury, Conn.

BULL DOGS.

Mr. Jos. A. Laurin, of Montreal, the owner of the Bull bitch, Juno II, informs us that her recent visit to the United States was ineffective, as she has proved to be not in whelp. We had hoped to give a taking picture of this bitch this month, but Mr. Laurin found it, so far, too difficult to get a decent photo. We purpose doing so later on, possibly for December issue.

DUDLEY NOSE.

Mr. Laurin has written Mr. Sam. Woodiwiss, one of the leading Bull dog breeders in England, for an expression of opinion on this point, and he promises to let us have the benefit of Mr. Woodiwiss' reply. He also writes:

"Montreal Dog Show—Mr. J. F. Kirk's criticism. Juno II is not a fawn bitch, and she was not placed first but second to Queen Dild, which had a Dudley nose. Further experience will, however, set matters all right."

BAYVIEW BOB,

who is better known by his original name of Chatham Bob, was bred by Mr. H. M. Howes, of Somerville, Mass. He is royally bred, being by Roscoe out of Lomont Kit, some of the most famous of his progenitors being Champions Starlight, Marquis, Grand Duke, Maggie May and Gully the Great, Bendigo, etc. In our special report of Montreal Show (last issue) he is well described by Mr. Kirk.

THE DANDIE, PUNCH, DEAD.

From Mr. Conlon of Buffalo we regret to hear that the Dandie Dinmont, Punch, a portrait of which appeared in last GAZETTE and who won first in the open class at the recent Toronto show, had been run over by a fire engine and killed. We have so few Dandies that we can badly spare so good a dog.

MR. MACDONALD'S VON VOIT

is well depicted in our frontispiece. He is a royally bred one and should do much to improve the quality of Fox Terriers in Canada if properly mated to a type of bitches to suit him. His front is good and face long and clean, eye well placed and ears small and well carried.

TWO GOOD PHOTOGRAPHS

of the Cambridge Fox Terrier Kennels new dog Cambridge Joker will be found in this month's GAZETTE, the better one on the plate in front and the other in the stud announcement of this kennel. As a study the former is hard to excel. Mr. Mortimer's report of this dog when shown at Toronto, where he easily won first and special, leaves us little to say. The softness of coat referred to there, due in great part to his recent voyage and "tubbings" is not now so apparent.

THE OTTERBURN PUGS

will take some beating next fall if all goes well. Otterburn Treasure is proving himself a successful stud dog, his kennel mate, Otterburn Pearl, having now a nice litter of five dogs and one bitch by him, and Mr. Ford has also another bitch with four dogs and one bitch who claim him as sire. Both litters are doing well and look promising. Treasure's latest victory was at Danbury, Conn., where he was placed at the top.

SALE OF KING CHARLES SPANIELS.

Mrs. Ben Davis, Toronto, who is disposing of her kennel of Toys and leaving Canada to reside in England, has sold a trio of King Charles' to the well-known breeder Mr. F. Senn, of New York. The bitch Rose, is one; she has been shown several times and is said to have won in Toronto in 1892, 1893, 1894 and 1895, at New York in 1893 and Louisville 1894. The other two are litter brothers from Rose; Dominion Prince and Dominion Boy, and were placed first and second respectively at the recent Toronto show.

W. B. PALMER'S DOGS,

we hear, are to be disposed of by auction by the Bank with which he was connected, and George Thomas has been asked to come over and identify them.

MR. H. W. LACY

has again come east and is now in charge of the kennel department of the *American Stock-Keeper*, of Boston.

SECRETARY'S REPORT, 1895.

Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen :

AS your Secretary, I beg to submit for your consideration a report of the past year; and although it is not such a report as I could wish to have had the pleasure of reading to you, still, apart from the crude manner in which I have attempted to compile my information, you will find, I hope, sufficient to encourage you in giving to the Association the coming year such assistance as will enable it to carry on the good work for which it was formed; and in asking for that encouragement I sincerely hope you will give it in that broad, unselfish spirit, which is so characteristic of the true sportsman, and without which true unity cannot exist.

When you consider that this Association was formed with a principle and motive far beyond individual exaltation, as regards breeding or showing of dogs, you can realize the importance of joint action.

You will not have, and I am sure you are not looking for a financial reward as a result of your years' endeavors, but you have received the appreciation of the outside world, which is undoubtedly the best and safest capital you could possibly start with, for with that appreciation the necessary is sure to follow, and has been most forcibly exemplified in the handsome donation you received, through one of your most respected citizens on the very eve of your first venture.

Apart from myself, I cannot over-estimate the good work that has been done by those in whose charge you have

placed your several interests. Of the shortcomings (and there have been a few), especially in catalogues, I have received the bulk of congratulations.

Therefore, feeling my incapacity, I will not attempt to eulogize those more worthy than myself. I cannot, however, let this opportunity pass without saying that much, in fact a great deal, of the real success of this Association must be attributed to the untiring efforts of your President, Dr. Wesley Mills. No individual member has had a better opportunity of knowing this than myself, and as he has intimated his intention of retiring from the official arena, I can only say that you will miss him.

THE FOUNDERS OF THIS ASSOCIATION,

Dr. Wesley Mills, Dr. W. H. Drummond, Mr. J. A. Pitt and Mr. James Lindsay called a meeting for the purpose in the office of Dr. E. M. Robb, Oct. 27th, 1894, and as a result of that meeting the Montreal Kennel Association was formed, and the following compose the original members of the same, viz.: Dr. Wesley Mills, Dr. Drummond, Dr. J. C. Nichol, Dr. E. M. Robb, J. N. Morris, I. L. Smith, Dr. A. W. Haldimand, Com. R. Beaufield, W. G. Cunings, R. McCulloch, A. F. Gault, W. M. Cox, H. A. Ekers, T. W. McCallum, W. T. Virtue, Wm. Noble, R. Robertson, A. W. Farwell, J. McNally, James Hughes, Wm. Moffat, R. S. Oliver, T. W. Johnson, W. Howard, G. R. Hooper, John Hersey, G. W. Campbell, L. A. Klein, F. Dean.

From these the following officers were elected: Hon.-Presidents, Sir Joseph Hickson, Samuel Coulson; Hon. Patron, Sir Donald A. Smith; President, Dr. Wesley Mills; 1st Vice President, Dr. W. H. Drummond; 2nd Vice President, James Lindsay; Secretary-Treasurer, George Lanigan. Executive Committee: Dr. J. C. Nichol, Dr. E. M. Robb, R. Beaufield, J. A. Pitt, W. T. Virtue, I. L. Smith, J. H. McNally, J. N. Morris.

It was decided that it would be known as the Montreal Kennel Association (incorporated), its objects to be the advancement in every legitimate way possible, the welfare of dogs, especially thoroughbred dogs, to guard the interests of the owners and breeders of the same, and to provide for the dissemination of knowledge of every kind concerning dogs, and that its meetings would be held on the first Wednesday of every month. It was agreed that \$2 per annum be charged each member, payable in advance.

At the second meeting the Constitution and By-laws were read and adopted. At this meeting the Executive were given power to rent a suitable room for social purposes, and ordered the purchase of the following papers: *Forest and Stream*, *English Stock Keeper*, *American Field*, *English Kennel Gazette* and *CANADIAN KENNEL GAZETTE*.

After a great deal of trouble a room was procured at 29 McGill College Avenue, and is open day and evenings to all members, who have only to open the door and walk in, no key being required.

It is to be hoped a greater number will take advantage of this during the coming year as a great deal of useful information can be obtained from the perusal of the papers kept on file as well as to meet their fellow members in friendly discussion.

The following gentlemen were elected honorary members: Dr. J. S. Niven, London, Ont., L. A. Klein, Black Lake, Que., F. S. Wetherall, Compton, Que., P. G. Keyes, Ottawa, Alfred Geddes, Ottawa. Mr. Leslie H. Gault was added to the Executive to fill a vacancy.

The question of dog stealing was brought up before the Association and steps taken towards its prevention.

The question of cropping was also treated. This Association being the first in America to take the matter up.

The question of founding a home for friendless dogs was also discussed with the hope of success during the coming season.

The Association held eight monthly meetings during which valuable papers were read by the following members: Dr. W. H. Drummond, "Irish Terriers," Jas. Lindsay, "Fox Terriers," J. A. Pitt, "St. Bernards," Leslie H. Gault, "Collies," Mrs. J. A. Pitt, "Toy Spaniels," J. G. Kennedy and Dr. Mills, "Setters."

Some of the papers have been re-printed in England and Australia.

Your Executive held some sixteen meetings with an average attendance of eight—the roll of membership is now 181, the greater number of which were proposed by three members of the Executive. If a greater spirit of rivalry could be engendered on this subject the Association would be greatly benefited, and it is to be hoped the number will reach 500 before the end of the year.

The first bench show was held in the Victoria Rink, May 31st and June 1st, and the second, or rather the first International show, on the grounds of the Montreal Exposition Company, September 17, 18, 19 and 20th, during the progress of their Fair. Time will not allow of my giving you a full description of these shows which is perhaps known to most of you, the financial result however will be embodied in the Treasurer's report.

I regret having had to record the death of two of our most active members, Mr. Alfred Geddes, Ottawa, Ont., and Mr. W. J. Farmer of this city.

Thanking you Mr. President and other Officers for the kind assistance given me during my term of office.
