- 1. Can dogs shipped in strong crates or boxes now be rated at single first-class rates as in the case of poultry.
- 2. Can bitches shipped from point to point in Canada for the purpose of breeding be returned free when regular rates are paid, as in the United States.
- 3. Can bitches be shipped for breeding purposes from one point in Canada to one in the United States and vice versa and be returned free.

Dear Sir,-Replying to yours of 20th, regarding rates on dogs. Dogs in boxes are charged double merchandise rate on the actual weight. Bitches sent for service may be returned free when double merchandise rates have been paid going. Bitches can be shipped, for breeding purposes, from any one point in Canada to any one point in the United States, or vise versa, at the regular rate, that is, double merchandise rates one way and returned free.

This has frequently caused annoyance in dogs being impounded when they were covered by the kennel license. I would suggest if feasible that four tags be issued by the city free and that a further number be sold to license holders at a small cost say 15c. to 25c. each. The fourth annual meeting of the Canadian Fox Terrier Club was held in the Walker House, Toronto, during show week. A majority of the members were present and the President, Mr. G. H. Gooderham, occupied the chair. Rule 5 of the constitution was struck out in so far as it concerns the office of President, and hereafter the President will be elected by ballot by the vote of the members of the Club. All the officers were re-elected with the exception that Mr. W. P. Fraser fills a vacancy on the committee. The financial statement showed a good balance on the right side. The winners of the Club's cups and special prizes were: Best kennel, smooth, Mr. A. A. Macdonald; best kennel, wire, Mr. G. H. Gooderham; brace, smooth, Mr. A. A. Macdonald; brace, wire, Mr. G. H. #### MR. F. T. MILLER-CANADIAN EXPRESS CO.

We regret that on appeal this famous case has gone against Mr. Miller, the plaintiff in the suit. The following clipping gives the decision: "Four lifeless dogs were the subject of a successful appeal in the Divisional Court to-day. The Canadian Express Company were the appellants and were relieved of a judgment of \$125 with costs, which Fred rick Miller, of Trenton, recently obtained against the Company as damages for the death of the dogs. The court held that there was no actionable negligence on the part of the Company, as the plaintiff had put his prize winners in an ill-constructed box." We have not heard if Mr. Miller intends to carry the case further.

#### MR. A. A. MACDONALD,

whose Fox Terriers have been phenomenally successful at the Canadian fall circuit, again offers his winners at stud. A glimpse at his business announcement will show the merits of the dogs in his large kennel.

#### MR. A. F. GAULT,

in a newsy letter dated Sept. 19th, writes: "As a show ours was exceedingly good, the exhibits being fully up to the standard, but as a financial success it was a failure. management, advertising, etc., are the causes, also, of course, poor attendance. A September show will, I think, never be a success here, as all the people have not arrived home from summer outing, and the theatres are always good in that month, Another reason is the lack of condition in the heavy-coated classes. I, personally, am a strong advocate for a spring show. What I would like to see is a Fox Terrier and Collie show combined in Toronto next spring. My own kennel did fairly well here, taking first open bitches and 3rd open dogs and kennel prize. Braehead Chriss was the sire of the sensational puppy Highland Victoria, who took 1st puppy and special for best Collie in the show, beating many old winners. Probably Braehead Chriss will go to Toronto for a few months for stud purposes, and will be advertised in GAZETTE. He will be conveniently placed so that all breeders desirous of his services may be accomoothers, Mr. Alex. Smith, of Auchairnie, Scotland, the well known Collie and Scotch Terrier judge, who has now taken

in my opinion, to the fancy, and I think would be a most only in time to see him pass away in the arms of Mr. John suitable judge for our Canadian shows, if he would officiate. He imported with him sixteen dogs, most of which have been disposed of. His dog (Collie) Auchairnie Wonder took two firsts here. He is a winner of fifteen in England and Scotland. Mr. Smith is the owner of the famous bitch Duchess, winner of thirty firsts and litter sister to Ch Ormskirk Amazement, Excelsior, Dolly, Surprise, etc., in fact of "the famous litter," undoubtedly the finest ever bred. She was on exhibition for one day and wears awfully well for an eight year old. He has at present a litter of Fox Terriers sired by Limefield Rattler, winner of sixty firsts, of which he expects great things." While in Montreal we had the pleasure of several talks with "Auchairme" and found him most enthusiastic in all branches of fancy stock. As well as his winnings in the dog show he took several firsts on a pen of Game Bantams, and was also competing in the high jumping contests. We were afforded a private peep at Duchess, a roomy bitch of great substance and coat, and which, if we recollect rightly, is to accompany Mr. Smith back to England-where he goes to bring out his familyto be bred to one of the old country cracks. She wears her years well.

#### A SAD DEATH.

Those who have kindly recollections of the shrewd face and genial manner of Mr. Gilbert, of Brantford, who no later than a few days ago was an exhibitor in the Collie classes at the Toronto show will regret to learn of his death through accidental poisoning. A local paper gives the following account of the accident:

"Citizens generally have been shocked to hear of the death of Mr. B. Gilbert, which sad event took place this morning as the result of a most unfortunate mistake. The deceased had been absent at the Toronto Industrial this week, exhibiting his well known Collie dogs, and returned home on Wednesday evening. McCann, who had also been called in and arrived a few minutes earlier. The fatal drug had done its work in less than ten minutes Mr. Gilbert had been troubled for some time with a weak heart, and with the large size of the dose this would account for the quick action of the deadly acid."

#### MONTREAL DOG SHOW.

ONTREAL was greeted with an entry of about four hundred, which; considering the little effort put forth to advertise the show, must be considered satisfactory. With more push and a similar classification to that offered this year, a record entry for Canada should result next year. The Victoria Rink, where the dogs were benched, is an ideal place for a show, despite its being rather dull on dark days. The benches erected for the occasion were plain but efficient and the hall was kept perfectly clean and free from offensive odors. The Committee worked hard and Mr. Mason, whose awards gave general satisfaction, got through his long list in good time. The quality of the dogs nearly all through was high, in some classes exceptionally so. A critical report will appear in next issue. The catalogue was imposing in design but was badly put together and contained numerous errors, far too many in fact.

#### KINGSTON SHOW.

VERY fair turn out of one hundred and seventy-five dogs faced Mr. Chas. H. Mason, and considering the small amount of money offered the quality was excellent. Owing to the judge's extreme carefulness to examine each dog, unsuccessful exhibitors were satisfied that all can't win. Ben Lewis, the king of handlers, was here with a quality lot, and Mr. L. A. Klein had a big string of Daschundes. It is a treat to see a man show such a sportsmanlike spirit regardless of the almighty dollar so much sought for by the average exhibitor.

Unfortunately two of the four days of the autumn carnival were wet and seas of mud were seen everywhere. In spite of this every exhibitor, so far as I know, was paid as soon as his account was made up. Mr. Charles Lyndon and Mr. Joseph Kennedy had large strings in their charge; Mr. A. A. Macdonald had a sorty lot on hand—he introduced a new feature in the way of a cork, which by throwing it in front of him made his dogs show to the best advantage—the judge, however, thought this highly suggestive.

Nothing worth particular mention turned up in St. Bernards, Yarl, the winning dog, lacking the correct white markings so essential to expression. In Beagles Champion Ringleader was a feature of the show-his body, bone and feet are models for a workmanlike dog. English Setters were all supplied from Dr. Hare's well known kennel-Albert's Ranger, shown in good feather, was alone in dogs. In Gordons, or black and tan Setters, two distinct types came out in open dogs-Lincoln, first, is the heavy lumbering Gordon type, whereas Wang Ivanhoe is more of the racy type. Irish Setters-Messrs. Douglas & Chambers had Toronto B'eaney and Molly the letter being beaten by Red Bud Fingus, Pointers- Captain, first, is a racy black and white, well sprung ribs and any amount of go and style. The Boston winners, Shotaway and Cyrene, were shown. Great Danes-The winning dog, Earl's Hannibal, is a quality brindle, excellent in head, legs and feet. Spaniels-Mr. Carson had two good Irish ones in the well known Field Spaniels-The new dog, Mike C. and Dan C. Woolton Wonder, had an easy win; a good dog, barring his head, which is too weak. Cockers, black dogs-Guy Silk, the Toronto and New York winner, was first with Holy Smoke, a coarse one, second; a smart one in Black Beauty won in bitches-grand body and bone, a capital mover. The well known Red Obo was in the challenge class alone, and Red Dolly (probably the best red we have) won in her Collies-Otterburn Chriss (in bad condition) would have been beaten by Bisley Hero had he not prick ears. Queenie, the winning bitch, has only her good ears to win with a mistake was made in not placing Lustre first, in spite of her being out of coat. Bulls-Miss Mischief, a good one in bad condition, won. Bull Terriers-The winning dog, Wentworth Charlie, scored on account of his good head. Fox Terriers, smooth dogs-This was the feature of the show, and, as Mr. Mason said, "it is the strongest class of Fox Terriers I have judged in America," shows what there must have been. Of course Prisoner won, but Beverwyck Kingpin greatly surprised the talent, and especially his owner, by landing second; not much fault

can be found with him barring the fact of his being a bit strong in skull-he was shown in excellent form and had the best body in the class. Norfolk Joker can thank his taking markings and ability to show himself for beating Warren Smuggler, who looked starved and tucked up in the loin; in good condition the latter can win. Not much fault can be found with Eclipse Tartar barring the fact of his being stilty behind. Warren Rector and Guardian were not the judge's type; both would win under some judges. A hot one in Norfolk Pin Wire came out in wire bitchesher head, ears, bone and coat will always bring her to the tore. Irish Terriers-Derramore Biddy was easily the best shown; owing to Nutcrack's Mate being minus some teeth he could not beat Brian Borue. Black and Tan Terriers-It was somewhat of a surprise to see Perfecto beat Rhode's Orme; the former is a trifle better in head. Pugs-A new one in Otterburn Prince easily won; Otterburn Pearl, first in bitches, is well known. Fox Hounds-It was indeed a treat to see four such hounds as Ringwood, Grafton, Bracelet and Racket, shown by the Toronto Hunt; they simply smother anything ever seen in this country, being from the celebrated pack of Earl Fitzwilliam. Dachshunde-A grand entry under the Dachshund Club's classification. Mr. Klein's entries showed a consistency in uniformity of type.

NOTE.—The cup for the best dog in the show was keenly competed for by the Fox Terrier, Prisoner, winning by a small margin from the Fox Hound Ringwood.


