CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB.

ANNUAL MEETING HELD ON SEPT. 7, '98-A REPRE-SENTATIVE AND ENTHUSIASTIC GATHERING.

HE annual meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club was held as called by regular notice, on Sept. 7th, in the board room of the Industrial Exhibition Association. While not as large in numbers as could be desired, much enthusiasm and unity of purpose was displayed and many new and progressive ideas proposed for future action by the Executive. Mr. George B. Sweetnam, the retiring President, occupied the chair and prefaced the routine business of the meeting with a few pointed remarks, touching on the past and future work of the organization,

THE MINUTES OF LAST MEETING, as published in the GAZETTE, were taken as read.

THE SECRETARY-TREASURER'S REPORT for the past year, as follows, was read and received.

SECRETARY-TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING AUGUST 31ST, 1898.

Mr. President and Gentlemen.-

Appended I beg to submit my annual report for the past year. It gives me the greatest pleasure to be able to congratulate the Club on the substantial increase in membership, an increase in the number of dogs registered and on a largely augmented bank bal ance. In addition to the latter twenty-five dollars has been returned to exhibitors in the shape of five special prizes of \$5 each at the Toronto show.

After the troublous times the Canadian Kennel Club has recently passed through this showing is most encouraging and is strong evidence of the ability of Canada to manage her own affairs in connection with dogs.

REGISTRATIONS—The total number of registrations made up to August 31st, 1898, is 4665. Number of registrations from Sept. 30th (date when registrations were received by C.K.C. after abrogation of C.K.C.-A. K. C. agreement) to August 31st, 1898, 268. Number of registrations from Sept. 1st, 1896, to July 17, 1897 (when agreement noted above came into force), 219.

MEMBERSHIP—The membership for 1897-8 is 92for 1896-7 63.

Constitution and Bylaws—I find great need of these-for the use of members who are continually asking for what I have not got to give, i.e., Constitution and Bylaws of the Club in printed form, revised to date. I would suggest that your Executive be asked to give this matter their early attention.

Show Classification—The members are all doubtless aware that the entire classification has been changed by the A.K.C. for shows using their rules, and it has been suggested to me that Canada should follow suit. This is worthy of discussion, personally I am "antiquated" enough to think it better to stick to the classification now in force. I fail to see where it has been greatly improved on.

Constitution—I would be strongly in favor of kennel clubs being represented on the Executive Board in addition to the club-elected Executive which we now have. Further, I would favor accepting a reduced fee from members of clubs who come in as a club. Briefly, my ideas are somewhat as follows:

- 1. Elect Executive as at present, but reduce number if thought necessary.
- 2. Give each club whose secretary sends in at one time ten or more names with a fee of \$1 each (subsequent names at same rate) the privilege of electing a delegate to act on Executive Committee and with the full powers of a member of that body.
- 3. Each individual member to be formally elected in the usual way and to have full privileges of the Club.

\$469 38 I have given this feature a good deal of thought and

the more I think of it the better I judge some such an arrangement would work. It would give the various kennel associations in Canada the direct representation they appear to covet and should tend to largely increase the club membership, and at this time we need members more than money, as I see it. The necessary funds to properly equip a greatly enlarged club will come later.

CLUB REPRESENTATION—The paragraph in the Secretary-Treasurer's report regarding the representation of kennel clubs on the Executive Board was very favorably commented on and the incoming Executive requested to give the matter their careful attention.

FINANCIAL REPORT was adopted subject to audit.

CROPPING—A petition re cropping was circulated by breeders of dogs where cropping has been in vogue, and on motion of Mr. Charlesworth it was decided that rule re cropping be obliterated.

All matters of doubt or dispute respecting this stake shall be decided by the committee of the Club. and its decision shall be final.
