Sixth—King Edward VII., who won first honors each time shown; also Lord Minto, who won third, following his two brothers at the late show. This was the banner litter of 1900. Jos. Montreal Collie Club Show

The first members' show of the Montreal Collie Club was held at the city corporation quarries, Bellingham avenue, Outremont, on Saturday, the 20th July. The thanks of the club are due to the chairman of the road committee, who kindly placed the grounds at the disposal of the show committee. The property is delightfully situated. Outremont is a charming and prosperous suburb a few miles from Montreal, located at the back of Mount Royal. An excellent car service brings one right to the gate, and truly, honest "John Conductor" must have been astonished at the many "Collie fares" riding on front and rear seats on that bright and sunny day. Certainly there could be no mistake as to the location, as near the entrance was a large sign, "Collie Club Show." As most of the members lived at a distance all sorts of vehicles were used to carry their exhibits to the show, from the electric car and express wagon down to the modest cab. One carriage drove up literally covered with Collies. Mr. James Watson's "Collies in front, Collies behind, Collies everywhere," pictures this conveyance. When stopped at the toll gate en route by Montreal's famous and genial ex-huntsman, Mr. Drysdale, this gentleman must have thought that an extra toll would be justifiable. However 15 cents sufficed and "good luck" given. No need to tell him where you were going. He knew, he said, that the Montreal Collie Club Show was being held that day, and no wonder, for Outremont is full of "members," and he must have seen nothing but Collies and Collie enthusiasts passing his way

for hours. To describe the quarries as a show ground is to say that it is ideal. Golf club properties and private estates had to give way to this selection. Don't imagine from the name that large stone heaps abound. About 12 acres of green, undulating grass covered with beautiful old trees and convenient benches, with a cool deep pond, a few cattle lazily browsing here and there, located at the foot of one of the world's most beautiful mountains, presents a description quite beyond words. Added to nature's beauty, a large frame building, opened in front and perfectly clean, colors a picture sufficient to "charm the eye" of any show superintendent and satisfy the most exacting exhibitor.

It was a jolly crowd that assembled on that lovely Saturday afternoon. Everyone was in good spirits and "out for fun." No competition or award could create or perpetuate enmity with that crowd. Good fellowship abounded and sport pure and simple was the game. No entry fee, no prizes, only ribbons; but still an entry of exactly seventy, not including winners' classes. A young organization of six months with such an entry speaks volumes for its enthusiasm and for the popularity of the judge; and some of its most prominent members unable to exhibit.

A cordial invitation had been extended to all interested in the Collie, so consequently a large number were present, among them being several ladies. Mr. Black of the Star and Mr. Taylor of the Herald represented the press.

The older exhibits were arranged

according to class within the building, while the puppies were placed on the grass in the shade. Printed class cards were tacked over each division. The dogs' tags were numbered on both sides in large type, so that there might be no delay in giving the judge the exhibit's number.

As this was the majority's first show, the music quite outdid the "pointer hand" on the sign.

Dr. Wesley Mills, who had kindly consented to act as judge, arrived sharp on time, so that the judging commenced as arranged at 3.30. Fortunately at this time the sun disappeared behind a cloud and stayed behind during the rest of the afternoon, so that the temperature was cool and pleasant.

Owing to the competition being especially keen in most of the classes, and the thorough and careful way Dr. Mills examined each dog, making him show to the best advantage, the concluding classes were not run off until 5.30 o'clock.

At the request of the committee Dr. Mills withheld ribbons whenever he thought the quality warranted him doing so. By this way alone can young breeders learn true type, so the arrangement met with the approval of all. The awards throughout were well received and undoubtedly correct. Only one decision was reversed, which was fearlessly done, as try as he would Dr. Mills could not at first get the puppy to show her ears. The ring service was very fair. As every steward was an exhibitor, now and again there was a little unnecessary delay in getting the dogs into the ring, but altogether very few minutes were wasted.

After judging light refreshments were served to all who wished to partake, and many pleasant reminiscences recalled. The club took this opportunity of thanking Dr. Mills for his kindness in judging and of expressing their indebtedness to him for the painstaking and able way he had made his awards.

Too much praise cannot be given Messrs. J. Ainslie, R. C. Binning and H. Mackenzie, who, living at Outremont, found most of the arrangements and paraphernalia usual to a show left more or less in their hands. That they spared no effort goes

without saying. It is sufficient to say that everything was as near perfection as possible and that their colleagues feel themselves greatly indebted to them.

To Mr. J. R. Lewis, who, though vice-president of the club, has, owing to Mr. Thomas' regretted illness, taken his duties as secretary, much of the success of the show is due. Certainly no time or energy on his part were spared, and this with his marked ability helped things to run smoothly and rapidly.

Certainly the Montreal Collie Club has reason to feel proud of its first show and of the quality of their exhibits, which were above average, and some will be heard from again. It was a gratifying success, and considering that very few of the members had any previous experience augurs well for their big show some months hence.

On motion of Rev. Mr. Geoghegan, seconded by Dr. Boulton, it was decided that decision of show committee be sustained and no change in award made.

Notice of motion was given by Dr. Boulton that at the annual meeting he would ask that the meanings of certain terms, such as "shown," "exhibited," etc., be plainly defined and added to the rules.

Brandon Kennel Club

Fourth Annual Bench Show under the auspices of the W. A. & A. A.

The show this season was well attended and the standard of dogs shown was higher than previous years but the number entered was not so great. The sporting classes as usual were in the lead, followed closely by the Collies and Cocker.

The show was judged by Messrs. H. S. Rolston and E. Hamber, of Winnipeg, the former taking the non-sporting dogs and the latter the sporting dogs. The result of the judging was universally satisfactory.

The following is the summary of the judges' report: In heavy weight Setters Mr. Morton's dog won second place, the others not being in condition and this one too fat. In heavy weight Setter bitches most were shown in very poor condition, in general being too fat. The honors fell to E. H. White's Manitoba Prairie Bird, H. J. Skynner's Manitoba Vic and Geo. Le Roy's Dan. In light

weight English Setter bitches three very good ones were shown. It was one of the largest filled classes and they were in excellent condition, honors falling to E. H. White, W. J. Currie and R. Fortune. In light weight English Setters Brisbin's Tony Lad and Hall's Nick were the only two worthy of mention, and these were well shown.

In the Pointers entry was small, nor as a class par with the Setters.

In Foxhound bitches some of excellent stamp were shown. Venus, owned by C. A. Rae, won first and special. In dogs Vulcan, the winner, must have been a good dog in his day, and though aged he has kept up his appearance wonderfully well and is good for a few more wins.

Mr. A. B. Fleming exhibited an American Foxhound which was a very nice specimen.

In Deerhound dogs the well-known Scamp, owned by V. H. G. G. Picker-

ing, of Minnedosa, won, being closely pressed by Stout's, of Rapid City. Deerhound bitches were not of high standard but were in very fair condition.

Russian Wolfhounds made a very nice showing and a few of them were very fine specimens.

In Greyhound dogs the honors fell to McKay's Fire Fly, of Souris. Dr. Elliott's Grab All and J. W. Fleming's Bruce were shown in fair condition, but all showed signs of not having received sufficient work.

One very nice Boarhound, owned by A. F. Richardson, of Killarney, was shown and awarded first prize.

In Fox Terriers the classes were well filled but the quality on the whole of low standard.

Irish Terriers were very good in quality but not well filled in numbers.

Cocker Spaniels were well filled, but in general over weight, many of them being disqualified. In dogs the first and second were very good. Third was a fine specimen but too heavy, and the rest of the exhibit was but an average lot. In bitches a fine Field Spaniel was shown, but thrown out, being too heavy for this class. The balance were a very ordinary lot. The puppy classes were well filled and some very promising ones were shown.

Irish Water Spaniels were a very inferior lot for the number of good dogs to be found in the community.

In Toy Spaniels there was only one shown and that only a fair specimen.

In Retrievers the first prize dog, owned by Mr. Pickering, was a very high class one. W. H. O. Roger's would have been a very close second

or a tie but was out of condition. Third prize dog was decidedly off in coat.

Newfoundlands were conspicuous by their absence, only one being shown, and it was too fat.

In Great Danes one very ordinary specimen was shown.

In Pugs one very good specimen, the balance being fair.

In Dachshunds one very nice one was shown, but off in eyes and short in nose.

In Dalmatian dogs first was very nice but too dark, was well put up. Second prize dog was too heavy and dark. In bitches one very nice specimen was shown, owned by Dr. Elliott, of Brandon. A very nice exhibit of puppies, also owned by him, was shown and were awarded first prize.

In Collies, large number entered and contained some fine specimens. Kruger, owned by A. H. Clark, is a fine coated dog with good legs and feet and well chiselled head.

Owing to the dogs being out of training the Setter classes were not as well filled as they might have been.

It is to be regretted that the show was not held under C. K. C. rules and a sanctioned show, but we hope that our next show will be so. H. J. E.

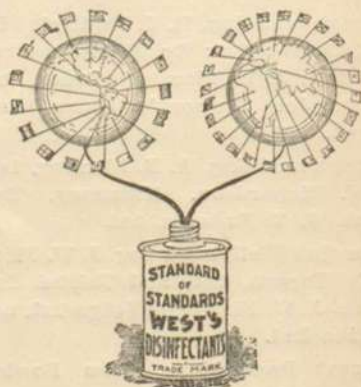
