Mrs. Bradley-Dyne, in a chatty letter, says:

"We had a good show in Victoria, the number and quality of the dogs being better than ever, though in Collies the entries were very scarce. However those there were high class. San Francisco sent over thirty dogs, and those their best, and these proved a good attraction, old Ivel Rustie coming in for a great deal of attention. My old companion, Loyne Ruffian, captured the special for best Terrier in show, over the renowned Ch. Woodcote Wonder, chiefly for being so brimful of character. I had the misfortune to lose a whole litter by him this spring, but I expect another shortly out of a bitch whose puppies are always high class. I also have a grand dog pup from last year by Ruffian who, unless I get anything still better later on, will be destined to take his sire's place when the old fellow goes the way of all flesh. This a grand bodied pup, like a small cobby cart horse and with a very decent head and ears. He is not straight in front, but neither is Loyne Ruffian, and yet the latter can sire straight fronts as I know.

"I think that with all my importations of stud Irishmen a home-bred one is the dog who will make the most mark by his progeny. I raised ten puppies from three different bitches by him (Luckpenny Peter) and there isn't a bad one among them. One in particular we think the best that has been bred in the kennels. If he turns out good in coat (I mean by that a coat that has not to be trimmed) will satisfy much of my aspirations. Coats are my bugbear, for you know how hard they are to get just right in the Irish Terrier, and from what I hear, read and know of by our experience English fanciers are too easily content to bring art to bear in showing their Terriers, instead of breeding to get the

coat right by nature. Still I'm pleased to say that with me natural coats are in proportion fifty per cent., and I attribute it to the Irish Ambassador blood, though whether I'm right or wrong I cannot be sure. I have made up my mind that coats are to be the foremost aim of these kennels."

* * *

The following letter from a well-known physician makes clear a recent treatment given in the Gazette.

"In your treatment for burns you mention carron oil, which is a mixture of linseed oil and limewater. I thought I would let you know the latest, or more modern treatment, especially in human, and I suppose it is the same for dogs. It is a solution of picric acid, as in this prescription: Picric acid, grs., 15; alcohol, 3 drs.; water, to 4 ozs. This is, I think, better; it is more antiseptic than carron oil. Please excuse my correcting you, but we see things in treatment others do not notice."

MONTREAL SHOW

Montreal show may be put down as an emphatic success from every point, of entries, management, with exception noted, and the attendance of Montreal's best people. The officials responsible for the running of the show are as follows: Superintendent, H. M. Walters, Stock Exchange Building, Montreal; veterinarians, Dr. O. Bruneau, V.S., Dr. A. Lesperance, V.S.; dog show committee, A. F. Brittain, S. Britcher, S. Coulson, Dr. W. H. Drummond, Arthur F. Gault, W. Henry, Jos. A. Laurin, D. W. Ogilvie, N. C. Ogilvie, J. A. Pitt, Jos. Reid, D. Robertson, W. C. Roy, F. Stuart, D. Taylor, H. L. Thomas, H. M. Walters; secretary, J. R. Innes. Judges were Mrs. John A. Pitt, of Montreal, who took all Toys except Pugs, and Mr. James Mortimer, of New York, who handled all other breeds.

The dogs entered numbered 471, but the absentees were more than usually numerous. The entries, including the many local classes, were about 1,075, so that under A. K. C. rules Montreal ranks as a two-point show.

The benching was not quite ready on Thursday a.m., so that judging did not begin until 2 p.m., Mr. Mortimer sticking to his work manfully until 10 p.m. The spring-like weather had evidently acted as a tonic to his staying powers, as at the end he finished as fresh as when he began. The Arena is a splendid building for a show, ample room, wide aisles, a large stage for judging ring and the best of light. The decorations of the horse show held the previous week were allowed to remain, and the bunting, shields, etc., lent quite a festive appearance to the scene. The attendance, especially on Friday night, was better than ever we have seen at a show in Canada,

and it is plain that dog shows in Montreal are destined to take a leading place in the people's amusements. The show was kept clean, the work in the office was efficient, though not due to the superintendent. To Mr. Douglas W. Ogilvie, who was happily able to leave his room late on Thursday; Messrs. Pitt, Taylor, Reid, Innes, Thomas, Smith and others, our thanks are due for the very friendly manner in which we were received, and the many courtesies extended.

Most of the specials were not awarded until Saturday. Mrs. Pitt who, we believe, donned the ermine for the first time, was cool and collected, and her work, though not heavy, was efficient and met with nothing but praise. Quality was present in nearly all classes, but, of course, in a show of this kind there are bound to be many specimens whose merits are more appreciated in the privacy of home.

BULLDOG CLUB OF CANADA.

Late on Saturday night a specialty club for the Briton's national breed was most auspiciously launched. Mr. Donovan occupied the chair during the preliminaries. On motion it was decided that a Bulldog club be formed, the name to be The Bulldog Club of Canada. The officers elected were: Mr. D. W. Ogilvie, president; Mr. H. B. Donovan, first vice-president; Mr. J. P. Roche, second vice-president; Mr. W. H. Tallis, secretary-treasurer, Grand Mere, Que.; and an executive of the president, secretary, Mr. H. L. Thomas, Mr. F. W. Jacobi, with power to add to the number if desired. This committee is to report on standard, constitution and by-laws at the next

meeting, which is subject to the call of the president.

The Canadian Kennel Club donated a challenge cup, and Mr. Donovan also guaranteed one from Mr. John G. Kent, the president of the C. K. C. Cups were also offered and accepted by Mr. Roche, Mr. Tallis, Mr. Thomas and Mr. Ogilvie, so that the club will have a most attractive list to offer members at shows they decide to support. The C. K. C. cup and Mr. Kent's cup are, of course, open only to shows held under C. K. C. rules.

IMPORTATION OF FOXHOUNDS.

On Saturday the Montreal Hunt received ten couples of grand hounds, per S.S. "Rosarian," personally selected by Mr. Nichols. They are a level lot and will, all well, make things interesting at New York next winter.

SALES.

We did not hear of many sales being made, but it will be interesting to breeders on both sides of the line to learn that Mr. Ogilvie sold the wire dog Bank Note and the bitch Flashlight to Geo. Thomas; Mr. Webber, of the Longueuil Kennels, bought the red Cocker Waverly Prince and the black bitch Greta from "Pop" Dunn.

THE DOGS.

The list opened with St. Bernards, of which there was a big entry, but a large assortment as to quality. Novice dogs had 14, limit 12, and open 13. The only puppy entry (dog) was absent. The novice winner, Barrie, is a brindle and white, an active dog with good legs and fair head. Mr. McDougal's King Afton is a big and attractive looking fellow, but black and white in color, with a little shading over the brows. A bigger, more massive and better headed one than the winner. Third, Mr. Betts' Blanco,

good in body, with a mean head. The limit winner, Mrs. Belasco's Prince, as none too big, a sound dog, good skull, fair muzzle, nice color; second, the novice winner; third, the big black and white. Bayview Baden Powell won out; he out-classes the rest in type and character, but was shown in poor coat. Reserve winners went to Prince; these two followed by the novice winner in open.

The puppy entry in bitches was only good enough for third, an almost white one with poor head. Mr. Moore's Alpine Abbess, a sound, smooth, with decent head and bone, had the best of it in novice and limit, and was reserve to Mr. Miller's entry in winners. Mr. Burrow's Lady Ormonde has more substance and size than Rosy O'Grady, and also beats her in color. Trilby is a fair one, washed out in color, with but a moderate head. Prince, Barney and Rosy O'Grady, the best of the locals, were mentioned above.

In Newfoundlands Mr. Turner's Wallace is the best in type and head, good body, fair coat, light eyes. Mr. Kendrie's Nig beats those behind him in coat, eye and head.

But three Danes, all brindles; the winner, Nellie, has it in head, neck and eye. Busco is wide in front and light in eye, an uncropped one. Sandor's Lady Smith also fails in eye, and is weak in foreface.

Seven Russian Wolfhounds. The puppy winner, Argoss, has improved since Octawa. Riga, a dark-colored bitch, that is not attractive in color or coat, rather good in foreface. Mrs. Coulson's St. Ivans won out to winners: a big, tall dog, badly shown; good legs and feet, very long head, good skull and foreface, quite big enough in ear. Captain Crepeau's Moscow is beaten in front and face. Alexis was absent. The winning bitch is too fat, good chest, decent head, fair front and bone. Mr. Short's Olga stands well, is a bit fine all over, nice

eye, poorly set on ears, nice but fine in foreface.

The one Deerhound, Athol, is a fair all rounder, strong in head, has plenty of bone.

Third was the best given in a poor lot of Greyhounds, just a trio present.

In English Foxhounds the Montreal Hunt's brace were the only two present, a good, sturdy pair. The dog, the New York winner, is grand in body and stern with the best of legs and feet. In good, hard condition. The bitch rather better in head and eye, but has just left puppies and is soft.

Mr. Williams' Hank's Gimerack went to the front in the American class, far the best in type and shown in hard condition. The winning bitch beats the other in cleanness of head and neck and in color of eye, though both fail here.

Duke of York was absent in Pointer dogs, and the others were rank bad, but one receiving a card, and that only a third. The ladies were much in advance, a very nice class. The novice winner was picked in the liver and white ticked, Blazeaway, owned by Mr. A. Allan, a rather good headed one, but light in eye and but moderate in front. She was second in following classes to A. J. Taylor's Malva of Kent, a high quality bitch, better ribbed up and straighter in bone. Same owner's Glory Jingo fails in muzzle.

English Setters.—A good one came out in Mr. Price's Rex, who won in puppies open and winners; a good bodied dog with nice bone and front and a decent head. The second, a litter brother, Max, is beaten in skull and muzzle. Mr. Wooten's Sutton Boy is a nice bodied dog, but is well beaten in head and expression. Sutton Nip (same owner) is better in eye and expression, but not so good in body. There were several fair dogs back of these, but coarse heads and light eyes are too prominent.

Irish Setters were a good lot and the entry better than of late. The novice winning dog, Royal Grand, is sound in color, in good coat, nice front, rather heavy in head and throaty. Mr. Brittain's St. Olave, second, is a bigish dog not so sound in color, and light in eye. Merlin, etc., third, is plain headed and light in eye, fair front and bone. No limit class, and first, second and third and reserve open were in the novice. St. Lambert's Tory and Duke were absent, and the only card given was V.H.C. to Bob, plain in head, poor expression, but good in coat and bone. The puppy winning bitch, St. Lambert's Kathleen, went through to winners; a grand one in color, nicely chiseled head, clean neck, good legs, a bit out of coat. Alice May, second, is well beaten all over. Sig's Girl is well known, but this time went down to better stuff. The best of the locals are mentioned above.

Gordons drew a blank.

Irish Water Spaniels, an even quartette. Mr. Wooten's Mollie Bawn, in none too good coat, won in a mixed class, good in head and muzzle, fair front. Brian Boru, second, is not so typical. Pat, third, is ragged and none too good in expression. The V.H.C. is lighter in middle piece, fair head.

In Field Spaniels we found but a third in novice, a fair black. Prime Minister was absent in the next classes. Saybrooke Judge, well known, won in limit and open (black), and also in winners. Duke of York reserve to Judge is a fair black with good body and fair head and front. Sir Lucius O'Trigger is well beaten. Saybrooke Popcorn was out for specials only, and was adjudged the best Field present. Mystery, from the same kennels, had a bloodless victory, the only bitch.

The Cocker entry was excellent and lots of good stuff was shown. The puppy winner in dogs, Mr. Watson's Bob II.,

is a decent black with good body and bone, fair front and head. He did well in later classes. Miss Simpson's Peter Jackson, second, is fairly beaten all over. Knoydart Blue Coat we did not see. Red Bill is not typical in head, fair body. Mr. Fenlin's Duke, winner in novice, blacks, is a son of the late Black

bodied red with fair front and head and in nice fit. Mr. Dunn's Waverly Otho is a nice bodied black and white in good coat. Blue Boy, Mr. Dunn's first limit, is one we liked, nice clean cut head, but a trifle undershot, nice, short body and good front. Same owner's Waverly Prince is a good all rounder, with nice

Duke, and is a nice all round one; long enough and high enough. He won again with little trouble in limit, open and winners. Bobs, second, was in the puppies, as was Peter Jackson. Miss Macdonell's dog, in beautiful trim, won out in part-colors; reserve winners going to Mr. Wilson's Larry, who won in novice and limit, was second in open; a beautiful

dark eye. The Liskaveen dogs went cardless. Mr. Webber's Trilby, the puppy winning bitch, is a black, with a rather plain head, good bone and body. Knoydart Blue Girl was gone. Jess, Mr. Dunn's, is a nice little one with a good eye and rather neat head. Ottawa Jessie, Mr. Armstrong's beautiful black, won all through, as she should. Greta

(Mr. Dunn), second, a nice type, fair front and body. Black Dolores is heavy in head. Tribby, reserve, the puppy winner. The same order in limit and open classes.

The color classes were light, Mr. Payne's entry, and Mr. Webber's Fluff, being easily ahead of the rest.

Bulldogs had thirty-two entries, something unusual for Canada, and the local (Canadian) dogs did remarkably well. Mr. Thomas' Duke of Wellington, a nice brindle, good in head and front and with a well-shaped body, was the best in puppies. Those behind him (Mr. Tallis) are litter brothers, fawns, sturdy customers with decent heads, but rather plainly built. Mr. Tallis' Tippoo Sahib, a good all round dog was easily the best dog, and won in limit and lightweight open; second going to the puppy winner. He was beaten for winners by the typical Pressmore Fopp. Messenger Girl was absent in bitch classes. Rose of Kent, the bitch we mentioned so highly in our Ottawa report, going to the front. Hacknell Belle, a nice type, following. Mr. Tallis won the brace prize for puppies, the other specials following the awards.

The only French Bulldog entered was at home.

After Ottawa the Bull Terrier classes looked light. Newmarket Pride won in puppies, a decent sort, beats second well in head. The other two entered were absent. In novice dogs Newmarket Dick is the best of the three present, but is bad in front and skully. Newmarket Don absent. Ottawa Major, the well-known marked dog, was first in limit, but went down to Mr. Doles' grand brace ch. Edgewood Faultless and Edgewood Candidate. The former might now be given a rest; he hadn't much to beat here. Faultless won in winners, his kennel mate taking the reserve. Lady Gray, the novice winning bitch, is a clean built one, none too heavy in bone with a nice-

ly placed eye and good foreface. She was afterwards second in open and reserve in winners to Mr. Doles' ch. Edgewood Estelle. June is skully and is marked on head and wide in front. She has a good dark eye. Sally is a keen looking one, clean headed, but long enough in body. Edgewood Violet, a nice type, won in limit and was third in open to Estelle and Lady Gray. Estelle was adjudged the best in show, and Mr. Dole was also fortunate in winning the brace prize with Faultless and Estelle.

Boston Terriers were rather a nice little lot, Bother winning out, on head and formation, followed by the keen looking Edgewood Ready. The bitch classes were slim.

The Airedale classes were mostly remarkable for the number of absentees, the twenty-five entries showing eleven blanks. Good all round specimens won in all cases.

Round Plain Kennels showed a good team of Beagles, and easily accounted for the prizes, taking all specials, including team class. But one bitch present.

Dachshunds were a fair lot. But one present in puppies, a toyish red, weak in head, Rodi Junr, in Mr. Saunder's hands won in limit, but went down to Murki, who has more length but is not nearly so good in head. Nothing special in bitches.

Smooth Fox Terriers.—Taken all through these classes were disappointing if the average quality is any criterion, with exception of the winners there was nothing of value, and some classes were rank bad. The absentees were numerous. In puppies the Cairnsmuir entry did not keep his engagement. Norfolk Kennels brought out a flyer in Norfolk Huntsman, who wants a month or two to finish him. He will then run with the best. He is a long, clean headed one with true front, yet a bit light in mid-

dle piece. He had no trouble in winning in this class, nor in limit, but was beaten in open by the Terrier characteristics of Mr. Carnochan's Terence, whose mature claims were too much for him. Mr. Ogilvie's Blucher, third in novice, is well beaten in head, front and ear, but has more substance than the winner.

Blue, that is a model all over, was alone in puppies, Cairnsmuir Rosebud and Smallwood Pineapple being absent and Princess Ida justly cardless. Norfolk Bluegown, dam of True Blue, won in novice. All but one other absent, and that one cardless. The winner in open and winners was again Norfolk True

Mr. Hooley's Wandee Blizzard is a dark headed dog, fair all over. In limit Terence won, followed by Norfolk Huntsman and Blizzard, in order named. In open it was Terence at the front, then the neatly set-up Norfolk Richmond, Norfolk Huntsman and Blizzard. Terence won in winners with Richmond reserve. That very grand bitch, Norfolk True

Blue, with the hard bitten Elmwood Electra second in open, and True Blue's dam reserve in winners.

In wire puppies the Cairnsmuir entry was again absent; first going to Osborne Prodigal (Mr. Pitt's), a good bodied dog with a fair head. Mr. Tallis' Long Face, with a hard jacket but getting skully, won in novice, followed

by a very fair brace second and third. The famous Bank Note divided Mr. Carnochan's Barkby Ben and Endcliffe Bristles, neither shown in any too good coat. Barkby Ben is an attractive Terrier with lots of character and disposed of Bank Note we thought rather easily. The latter wants dash, and is getting a bit loaded. Bristles is well known. The same order in open, with the novice winner reserve. Barkby Ben won in winners, Bank Note getting the reserve. The former was adjudged the best Fox Terrier dog in the show.

Irish Terriers made up a good exhibit. Rev. Father O'Gorman and Rushford Kennels providing most of the quality. Blarney Blue was at Ottawa, he won in puppies with two fair ones following. Bullet Proof was beaten in limit, open and winners by Rushford Meddler, whose better front helped him through. Blarney Briar, a daughter of Bullet Proof and a very grand bitch all over won in puppy bitches also taking reserve in winners to Rushford Nora, well known. Kinkora Gypsy is a workmanlike bitch with keen expression. Some fair ones followed those named.

Of the thirty-one entries in Scotties but thirteen filled. Why? None will ever set the St. Lawrence on fire. We looked for a good turnout in Montreal.

This was not a Black and Tan show. Kaiser II. died during a fit whilst in the building. If Topsey had more size she would be a flyer, as it was she won in puppies. Starlight and Croseus second and third were at Ottawa, as were most of the others. Daisy, looking fitter, won in limit, open and winners, with Roche Pearl, also at Ottawa, reserve. Ringleader beat Daisy this time, and rightly so.

Mr. Caverhill's kennel of Skyes are invincible, Queen being placed as best in show. All were shown in good coat

and condition, and are a credit to their caretaker.

There were no Pugs or Poms, and Mrs. Pitt was liberal in awarding equal firsts in several of the Toy Spaniels and Yorkshire Terrier classes.

REPORT ON COLLIES AT MONTREAL CANINE ASSOCIATION SHOW.

(By a Specialist.)

Montreal seems to be the hotbed for Collies, as no less than two hundred and twenty-three entries were put before the well-known States judge, Mr. Mortimer, and his decisions gave general satisfaction, unless a few that did not know any better, being the first time they ever had shown a dog. Puppy dogs (22) brought out some very promising youngsters, first going to Mr. Roy's Coila Clooty, a big one with long head, but inclined to be thick. He showed his ears all right in the ring, but in the second class was getting them up and therefore should have gone lower, but the judge, I suppose, could hardly change his decision; second went to Mr. Hill's Balgreggie King, a newly imported one, a big dog, long head, good ears and coat, but seemed to be sick and out of condition; third, Mr. McGee's Doctor's Special, ran his opponents very hard, having a nice head and ears, good legs and feet, but lacks frill and mane; reserve going to E. Bourrasa's Musketeer, a good Knight Errant II. puppy; the judge considered a long time over this dog and had he been shown in form would have been higher, he has a nice head, on the short side, but flat skull and nice eye and expression, beautiful ears, good coat but strangely marked, having sable body and white head. Amongst the V.H.C.'s and H.C.'s some good ones were shown. Guy Long, first prize at Ottawa, had to be

content with V.H.C. Son of a Gun, big dog with grand coat, but bad head and ears. Kincairdine Bruce, a nearly all white puppy, nice head and ears, coat, legs and feet, but small. Crawford Star, a good puppy but shown entirely out of coat. Novice dogs, twenty-seven, were a hot class, first going to that good old dog, Mr. Brousseau's Farmer Boy, shown in the pink of condition, beautiful coat with immense frill and mane, his head is flat, has nice eye and expression. If he could get his ears a little higher he would be hard to beat in the best company in his condition to-day; second brought out that newly imported Ottawa dog, Balmoral Kennels' Ormskirk Cre-more, now Balmoral Hope, and a nice dog, and ran the first dog hard; he is a perfectly marked sable and white, long lean head, nicely carried ears, good coat and shown in tip-top condition; could be a little better in his shoulders. He is only thirteen months old and will still improve and make it hot for some of them yet; third, A. B. Stalker's Prince Rightaway, a big tri-color, with long head, good, straight legs and feet, but wants more coat and although he can carry his ears well could not get them up in the ring; reserve going to that good quality little dog Braehead Royal Scott (Mr. Gault's), nice all over, but small. Amongst the V.H.C.'s Coila Clooty, Balgreggy King and Baden, a big sable and white, good coat, legs and feet, nice ears, but getting thick in head.

In limit dogs Old Joe Perfection got second to Balmoral Hope; this dog was reported at Ottawa as being about what fanciers are looking for, but his age is now against him, long (eleven inch) head, small, perfectly carried ears, hard coat, dense under coat with the best of legs and feet; third, Logan's Earl, shown entirely out of coat and condition; reserve, Braehead Royal Scot. Open dogs, only one new one handed up, that

being King Edward VII., looking his best and keeping himself in the same place as at Ottawa, and eventually beating the bitch for the best Collie in show, Mr. Mortimer changing the decision of Mr. Watson; second, Farmer Boy; third, Balmoral Hope.

Bitches, puppies (15). Here again that nice quality bitch St. Louis Violet walked right through her classes winning no less than eight firsts, winners and five specials; she is improving every day and has a great career in front of her. Mr. Roy's Coila Hizzie taking second all along the line to Violet; nice long head, good coat, legs and feet, but could be improved in eye and carriage of ears; third, Cairngorm Belle (Mr. Binning), a pretty little bitch with nice head, expression and ears, grand coat, with the best of legs and feet, might have taken second place. Reserve Lassie (James Miller), a nine months' old puppy, with age, will improve. Amongst the V.H.C.'s were Logan's Lilac Blossom, only six months old, too young to say much about. Ben Loyal Beauty and Gardenville Patti are both nice quality, but small. Novice bitches, Violet, first; Coila Hizzie, second; Strathardle Queen, third, a sable and white, nice head and ears, but too small; reserve, Cairngorm Belle; V.H.C., Clintonscot Bonnie Bessie, an all sable bitch from New York, nice head and ears, but small and shown heavy in pup. Limit and open and local classes were a repetition of former classes.

COLLIES AT OTTAWA.

Mr. Watson being a specialist on Collies brought out a very large entry, there being no less than thirty-six in novice dogs.

In puppies, dogs, Guy Long won, a tricolor shown in fine condition, has nice expression, head, ears and coat, but carries his tail over his back. Coila Brunkstane, second, had he not shown his ears had been weighted, would have won. He is very near what the Collie fancy are looking for, and with age will be heard of again. Cawning Hero and Pilot Bob are both useful Collies.

Novice dogs—Brandane Abbot won, he is a big tricolor, shown in tip-top condition; has nice head and ears rightly carried, grand coat; his gaily carried tail spoils him. Guy Long, second; Coila Brunkstane, third; reserve going to Sir Humphrey II., a sable and white with nicely chiselled head and well carried ears, good coat, but shown very thin in flesh. A hardly used dog, getting H. Several others getting commended tickets showed lots of Collie character. Limit dogs were much the same, excepting King Edward, who won over Brandane Abbot. King Edward was shown in better coat and condition than in New York, but still lacks under coat and is getting heavy over his skull, and therefore might have given way to Brandane Abbot. Open dogs were a repetition of the same.

Bitch puppies—St. Louis Violet won easily and went right through her classes and at the finish winning out over King

Edward for the best in show. Violet is keeping herself well, and as she stands to-day can win in the very best of company. Second went to Coila Kelpie, a sweet bitch with fine head and good coat, her low ears spoil her. Third, Heather Gip, is too small.

Novice bitches—St. Louis Violet, 1st; Coila Kelpie, 2nd; Dominion Patti, 3rd, is showing age, but a good, useful bitch,

and is proving herself to be a grand brood bitch, being dam of St. Louis Violet and the now States winner Coila Victor. Reserve went to Lassie, a big sable and white, good head, ears and expression; only wants a little more under coat to make her a good one. Others, behind reserve, hardly worth mentioning. Limit and open classes a repetition of former class. Old Breeder.

THE ST. THOMAS KENNEL CLUB.

Enthusiastic Meeting Held.

A very large and enthusiastic meeting of the St. Thomas Kennel Club was held recently, at which officers were elected for the ensuing year. The president, Dr. Teskey, occupied the chair.

The first business before the meeting was the secretary's report. Ald. McCully, in a very humorous speech, moved the adoption of the same, seconded by Joseph Ferguson. The report was adopted.

The treasurer's report was next read and adopted, and showed a handsome surplus.

The officers elected: Honorary president, His Honor, D. J. Hughes; president, Walter Ross; first vice, J. H. Price; second vice, W. E. Nesbitt; third vice, Robinson Swinn; secretary, W. T. Collins; treasurer, Dr. Lipsey; executive committee, Sam. Reynolds, Dr. Ramsey, V.S., George Hill, Amos Barnes, Jos. Ferguson, Charles Dyer, E. O. Penwarren, Charles Waters, H. Brinker and Dr. McClellan, V.S.

Dr. Ramsey was elected veterinary surgeon of the club.

The secretary's report was as follows: It is with a great amount of satisfaction that I am able to present the following report of what the club has accomplished since its organization, also its prospects

for the future. The club was instituted on October 24, 1900, with the object in view, as stated in the preamble, to create a greater interest in the breeding and management of man's most faithful friend, the dog, and I am satisfied the result so far will warrant us in assuming that we have made considerable progress in this direction, as our citizens generally are taking greater interest in the dog, and a great many instances can be cited where the dog of doubtful ancestry has been supplanted by the pure-bred article. The club has also been able by petition to the City Council to get the taxes on dogs reduced from two dollars on the male to one dollar, and from five dollars on the female to two dollars. This in itself should be sufficient incentive for every owner of a dog to become a member of the club, and apart from this is the fact that there is a standing reward of \$50 for sufficient evidence to convict any one guilty of poisoning a dog the property of any member of the club, and it is a noteworthy fact that there have been comparatively few cases of poisoning since the club took this action. On June 3, 1901, at a regular meeting of the executive committee it was decided to hold a bench show, and committees were appointed to solicit sub-

scriptions from citizens, in which they were very successful, receiving very liberal donations from hotelmen, brewerymen, cigar manufacturers, merchants, business men and private citizens. The list of names is too long to include in this report, but it is in the hands of the secretary, and it is due to them to say that the support which they gave the club in their first venture has, in our opinion, laid the foundation for future annual

something no other club in Canada whose city, even with a population five times greater than St. Thomas, dare attempt. In addition to the specials given by the club many others were donated. We had in the neighborhood of 260 entries, among which were some of the finest specimens in America, and although we were unfortunate in having very bad weather, especially the last night, I am glad to be able to state that

bench shows in this city which will eclipse anything of the kind ever held in Canada. In reference to the bench show which was held on the 10th, 11th and 12th of September, 1901, to say the least, for the first venture it was an unqualified success, and the show committee received unstinted praise from both press and public, as well as the exhibitors who, in many cases, stated that at our next show they would double their entries. The club put up \$500 in cash prizes and \$50 in specials, which is

the show committee were able to meet all their obligations in full and to carry over a small surplus, notwithstanding the predictions of certain would-be fanciers, whose duty it should have been to assist the committee, instead of prophesying disaster. The thanks of the club are certainly due to our local papers for their generous assistance in the matter of press notices of our last show, and also for their kind offers to assist us in the future. In referring to the future prospects of the club I feel justified in stat-

ing, with the information to hand, that we will have one of the best bench shows this fall ever held in Canada. Specialty clubs are already writing for information, and with the request that they be notified before we arrange our next premium list, which would go to show that we have attracted some attention. I also had the pleasure of attending the Westminster Kennel Club Show in New York on the 19th, 20th, 21st and 22nd of February, held in Madison Square Garden, at which there were 2,366 entries, and at which I had the privilege of becoming acquainted with a great many of the most extensive breeders and exhibitors in America, and I made the most of my opportunity to boom our next show, and I am pleased to state that I received several promises of good entries, and I was pleasantly surprised to hear so many of them express the opinion that St. Thomas must be a real live town, that with a population of 12,000 and the Kennel Club comparatively unknown, could carry out successfully their first show on a \$1 entry and provide the liberal cash and special prizes which it had done, and I think we are justified in considering this a good advertisement for our city. In referring to the numerical strength of the organization (which, as I should have mentioned before, is an incorporate one) there have been admitted to active membership about 110, and to honorary membership eight, and I am pleased to be able to state that the prospects for a large increase in membership for the current year appear to be very bright. And now, Mr. President and members, while we have every reason to congratulate ourselves on the success of our organization, we have also had our sorrows, and it becomes my painful duty to refer to the loss which this club has sustained in the death of the late Dr. A. H. King, V.S., an officer of the club, and to whose efforts the formation of the club and its present

prosperity are largely due. In conclusion I wish to thank the club for their courtesy extended to me during my term of office.

Novel Question Develops During the Recent Dog Show in San Francisco.

Ownership of Ho Yow's International Trophy is Involved.

Mr. John G. Kent, who is at present at the coast, sends us the following clipping from a local paper:

The American Kennel Club officials will have a novel controversy to settle, which developed during the recent dog show.

G. M. Carnochan, who came from New York to judge Fox Terriers, placed Geo. S. Thomas' white-haired Terrier ahead of all the dogs of his class in the show. After he had won everything for which he was apparently eligible, Mr. Carnochan purchased him for \$500.

At the time of the sale neither buyer nor seller thought of further competition. The next day, however, the dog won the "international trophy," a splendid bronze, presented by Consul General Ho Yow for the best dog in the show, irrespective of breed.

As the owner of the dog when he won the trophy, Mr. Carnochan claimed the prize as his. It then developed that the sale had not been consummated, no transfer having been made and no money paid over. Mr. Carnochan at once wrote his check for the amount, but this did not alter the status of the case.

The entry of the dog was in the name of Mr. Thomas and he was the only person the Kennel Club officers could recognize in the distribution of prizes. There was some friendly bantering between Mr. Thomas and Mr. Carnochan over the matter and it is to be submitted to the governing body in the East for adjustment. This is the first case of the kind which fanciers remember.

Although the street railway strike made a comparative failure of the show, there is no deficit to be made up. There will also be a small balance available for charitable purposes. Had conditions been normal it is estimated there would have been between \$5,000 and \$10,000 for distribution among deserving charities.

The managers are far from being disheartened and stand ready to sponsor another show one year hence.
