In Danes, Mercedes, a nice type, cleanly put up, and in good shape, won out. Marco II., second to her, is a big one, but roached in back. Queen Elizabeth has a good head and body, but looks more than her catalogued age, two and a half years, as she is very grey. The others we have mentioned in previous reports.

Kama, the Terra Cotto Kennels' new bitch, was put over Kubelik, possibly on condition, though the bitch was shown not any too clean on back, especially. Kama's head is good, but no better than the dog's; she is sound, deep-chested, and had more coat than Kubelik. On the other hand, he simply smothers her in size, is quite as good in front and expression. St. Ivans was third all through.

Two Deerhounds, the winner showing more quality.

The judge rather upset things in Greyhounds. Lansdowne Royal, a white

and brindle, with a good head and front, nice, shoulders, but slack in loin, and shown none too well, won. Nellie Coulter beat the dog later, shown in splendid fit. She excels in front, bone and neck, but fails a bit in head. Fawn, a toyish little one, had no right to beat Defender, Dictator or Dominie. Only two English Foxhounds Hector and Satellite, that we had at Ottawa. American Foxhounds a mixed lot, most of them simply lightly put up English Hounds.

Pointers made nice classes, and there was quality amongst them. Young Lynn, a nice-headed, good-bodied dog, won in novice class. Lady Simcoe second, a bit loaded in shoulder, but has substance and a good head. Doc Surrey is throaty, good body, fair head. Miss Flirt is good in front and body, but also fails in head. Meteor Dot II. won in open, but lost to Young Lynn in winners, though he is the straighter and stronger dog of the two. Fairace Lady was the best of the bitches, the others repeats.

English Setters turned out well, and brought to the front a recent arrival from England in Ulverstone Rap. A dog with a tremendous coat, great chest, nice head and lots of bone, but he looks "all bunched up," and if he is anywhere near right then the rest are all wrong. He ran through his classes to winners, with Rock Surrey taking the reserve. The latter a free mover that is on the light side all over, and short of coat. Duke of Kent's and Pride of London's best points are between their legs, both good in middle piece, with plain heads. Pera, a nice type, won in bitches, though we thought Dell, with her better front, deserved the place.

Irish Setters turned out well, as they always do here. Many of the good ones

were shown far too thin. Sir Patrick, first in puppies, was shown fat, good head, fair body. Those behind him on the light side. Shamrock Bobs, a dog with a nice head and grand sound color, good legs, and a nice mover. Shan Lanigan fails to him in head and neck. Shot III., a fair one, poor expression. St. Elvan, in grand shape, went to the front despite his throatiness. Toronto Blaney, first in open to him, and reserve in winners, a grand old type, that shows age. Rory O'Moore, a high quality dog, a bit cleaner in neck. The bitches were not large classes, Sig's Girl, in perfect shape, winning out. St. Lambert's Kathleen was shown coatless, or would have done better. The winner in bitch puppies has more substance than her only competitor.

No Gordons entered.

Poodles had five entries, and five kinds,

in which Selnonk Gambo, a good black, was easily ahead.

Dalmatians, with seven entries, were an improvement over former shows. The winner, Ladysmith, is an indistinctly marked, clean cut bitch, none too big. About the same remarks apply to Clara and Topsey, who were second and third.

Wee Bessie, a nice puppy, was made the best of the Beagles. A six-months-old bitch, with good expression, legs, feet and head, where she beats Lansdowne Gilder. Little Ben is a good-bodied, small one. Lord Bobs is a useful sort. Nigal is good in body, with sound legs and feet.

Dachshunds, rather a mixed lot. Ruby from Cleveland, has length, but is over-shot. Waldman, a bit on the high side, and plain, is a very sound black and tan. Ch. Venlivette, a beautiful-bodied bitch,

but failing in head points, we made the best. She is quite sound, and excels in character. Jerry was lucky. His head is good, but he knuckles over, and has bad elbows. THE SHOE ON THE OTHER FOOT.

I notice in The Canadian Kennel Gazette for August a letter from Mr. W.

B. Wells, protesting against the judging of English Setters by a Fox Terrier man, Mr. George Raper. I have a similar grievance—but reversed, as at the recent dog show at Brandon all dogs were judged by two gentlemen, who no doubt are excellent judges of sporting dogs, but not of Fox Terriers.

A wire-haired dog, sired by Go-Bang, which came direct from Mr. Carnochan's kennels, was there placed second to a decidedly inferior animal. Mr. Carnochan recommended the Terrier to me as being an invaluable stud dog, and he said that it should win without doubt in the West of Canada, though, of course, not good enough to compete with the crack dogs shown in the East. My dog, I know, has several faults, chief of which is his size, but the dog which beat him has all his faults and several others to boot, such as large Poodle-like ears, and soft, long coat almost silky in texture. My dog was sent to the show in first-class condition, yet a paragraph was inserted in the local paper that he was shown "in miserable coat"! This, no doubt due to the ignorance of the writer as to what the coat of a wire-haired Terrier should be like. My dog excels in coat, it being of that hard, wiry nature which is so desirable in the wire-haired variety, and as he was good enough to win a third prize as a puppy at Philadelphia, I think he ought not to have been beaten when shown for the first time in Western Assiniboia, where this particular breed is very scarce.

At nearly all the big shows in America, I believe, there is even a separate judge for the smooth and wire-haired Terriers respectively, so I certainly think that there should be at our Western shows, at least different judges for the sporting dogs and the Terriers. Yours Truly,

Davis, Dundas, with some good Cockers, who won for him; "Top" Dunn, Woodstock, whose Black Knight of Woodstock attains his championship; Mrs. Mark O'Rourke, Hamilton; Mrs. Gammon, Hamilton; W. B. Wells, Chatham, who largely swells the Setter entry; W. J. Jackson, who has done well in Cockers, and many others.

The show was located in a large, well-lighted building, used in winter as a skating rink. The roof is leaky in places, and, as it was raining, the building was damp and the earth floors rather sloppy.

Mr. Collins, Mr. Ross and Mr. Ferguson were the workers, and they were at it early and late. St. Thomas' best people patronized the show liberally.

A look through the catalogue and over the benches showed little quality in St. Bernards, but three very ordinary specimens, from whom all firsts might have in justice been withheld. One Mastiff, a very fair one, with a decent head. Two Bloodhounds, both poor; only one prize given, first, to Silver Tongue. Newfoundland, two; poor. One Dane, a lightly put up brindle. Russian Wolfhounds show quality, where the tall, light, flat-ribbed St. Nicholas II. is put at the head; Kellar can beat him. Greyhounds have some quality, but General, who was placed at the top, is loaded in shoulder, too short in neck and cheeky, and should have given place to Defender, that beats him fairly and pretty well all over. Foxhounds, big classes. Pointers but few; some fair stuff. English Setters are very big classes, W. B. Wells supporting the show liberally and supplying many of the winners. Irish Setters fair, and but one Gordon.

The Cocker classes are big and a good lot of stuff is visible. Geo. Dunn, W. J. Jackson, H. C. Davis and Mrs. Macdonald are all well represented. Collies, with one or two exceptions, are a poor lot. Bull Terriers few. Bostons, quite a big lot for Canada. Fox Terriers have Mr. Macdonald's new dog, Mr. Bell's Fordham, Aldon Vanquish, and a few other good ones; many mediocre specimens, with bad heads and full eyes, are here. Scotties have no entries. Airedales two, and Irish classes small, but

good. Black and Tans are nice, and a grand, all-round bitch comes out in College Girl. Mr. McGaughey's team comprises the Toronto winning dog, Wellesbourne, Duchess of Cornwall and Roche Pearl, all good ones. Beagles, a fair lot. Dachshunds, good, Sid Saunders, the Guelph breeder, being strongly in evidence. Bedlingtons have twenty-two entries. How is this for an unpopular breed? Robbie Burns, just a fair one, represents the Skyes, and the best of the Poms, in fact, the only one, is Mrs. Macdonald's Lady Brown, that won at Toronto.

Mrs. Collins, the wife of the hustling secretary, proved a hard worker, and many a poor tyke owed a clean and dry bed to her oversight.

REPORT OF THE CLASSES.

Mastiffs had but one entry, Mr. Hon-singer's Prince Victor, a fair-bodied dog with decent head points as they go now. The St. Bernards were a rummy trio, and all prizes might, with justice, have been withheld. There was nothing good to recommend them.

Two bloodhounds, one of which was given first and winners, all other prizes withheld. The winner must have been of the "Cuban" variety. He lacks type and character.

Newfoundlands—Two, neither true to type. Nero best in coat and body, Bobs, a lanky, upstanding mongrel.

King Edward is a fair all-round Dane, an active brindle that should develop.

There was considerable quality in Russian Wolfhounds, St. Nicholas II. going to the front, an award we cannot indorse, as, while he is high up, he is also shelly, flat-ribbed and light. Kendal is best in quality and substance.

In Greyhounds again the dog put at the top has little claim to excellence. He is cheeky, too short in neck, and loaded in shoulder. The white dog Defender beats him with ease at all points.

Fox Hounds were big classes, the judge going in for quantity in most cases. The Harrier just a fair one.

Pointers quite a nice lot. St. Clair Doctor is a fair, all-round dog, whose expression is somewhat spoiled by a light eye. Willie Sanko, second in novice dogs to Bang, is just a fair dog. Bang has good body and head, but moderate front. St. Clair's Lad is weak in muzzle, rather sour in expression. Limit awards repeat, as were those in open class. Two puppy bitches, where St. Clair Patti wins with ease from the thin, weedy Norme, Patti being far the better in head and body. She has a rather light eye. Miss Flirt was absent in novice. The winner, Lady, has a rather good body, but is a bit throaty. Nellie was left at home.

The English Setter classes were well supported, Mr. Wells' kennel being responsible for most of the winners in dog classes. Grouse was well beaten in puppies by the rather plain Tip o' Tib, who carries a fair body and bone. Selkirk Hope, who won through to winners, was shown very short of coat, good body, chest and bone, has nice expression and good eye. Sutton Nip, a nice dog. Blue Beach is heavy in head and staring in eye, but has a good body. Repeats in limit and open classes. Bitches a mixed-looking lot. Clip is a big, rangy bitch, good chest, a bit coarse in head, dead out of coat. We preferred Dan Windem's Girl, who shows more character, good chest, bone sufficient for her size, nice body, and in far better coat. Selkirk Amie is undersized, with a bad head and muzzle. Clip went through to winners, the only new one being Don, who was placed second in limit class, a big black and white, high off the ground. Too many weedy bodies and poor heads.

Irish Setters quite a nice little lot. Sir Patrick was shown like a fence rail, and this exaggerates his lack of chest and rib, a good colored dog, with decent head.

Shawn Rookh is a rangy dog that lacks depth of chest, fairish head, good front. Phyllis Fen is undersized and has a bad head, but good chest. Brown, nine years old, has best body in class, but shows old age too badly to do better. Lalla Rookh, who won in limit, has a moderate head, excellent legs, feet and front. The puppy winner second, and Phyllis Fen third. Young Larry is a good, sound color, good body, front and muzzle, not quite clean in neck. He won in open and winners. Nora Shannon, the new one in open class, is a free mover, with a nice front, but is weak in color. A good deal of quality in this last class.

But one Gordon, the well-known Lady Janson, who looked well.

Field Spaniels had no entries, but Mr. Kennedy had quite a nice lot in the Cocker class.

The puppy dog winner, Black Pepper, has a nice head and body and fair front. Johnny Canuck is a stylish red with a plain head. Black Diamond, a moderate one. Black Pepper won again in novice dogs; Duke second, a cobby little dog, but thick in head. Active, who was first in other color novice, carries a nice body and front, and is light in muzzle. Johnny Canuck second; Red Duke third. Black Dominio was alone in limit blacks; he is well known. In the same class for colors Union Jack, a very nice bodied Cocker, a trifle high up and light in bone, won. Knoydart Robin Hood, second; Dandy, just a fair one, third. Adventurer, the high-skulled black and white that won at Toronto, won in parti-colored limit class. He was alone. In open blacks, Geo. Dunn's Black Knight of Woodstock won, and also in winners, which we believe now puts him among the champions; Black Domino, second; Willard C., absent, and Ch. Hamilton Jack "for exhibition only." Braeside Blue Jacket won with ease in the open color class; Union Jack, second. Five puppy bitches, first

to Lady Pepper, nice in eye and skull; Daisy, second, is light in bone, while Red Beauty, third, is a bit high up. Novice, bitches, black, had but one entry, Queen. The color class had seven, with Regal Roma and Princess Chic absent. The winner here, Dolly Varden, is grand in skull, has a good body and nice color, but is a bit light in bone and her front is bad. Queenie, second, is light in color, and a bit weak in muzzle, but she has a nice eye. Victoria, third, has a nice straight front, but fails in muzzle. Kola, looking well, went through the remaining black classes with ease; the same kennel's Office Girl taking a similar position in color classes. Both are the right sort. The others are mentioned above.

Collies were a peculiar collection. Walden Earl was absent, and first was given to Queen in the puppy class. She is prick-eared and bad all through. In the next class, a handsome white, with sable head, Rufus, in none too good coat, had nothing to beat. Ben is undersized and carries his tail up. Ranger is an old-fashioned one of no particular type. Otterburn Commander, in very heavy coat, with immense frill, simply smothered the others; a handsome Collie, with plenty of character. He is a bit skully, nice before the eye and toes in.

The one Poodle is a coarse, curly black.

Mr. Lee's grand brace, Shields' Rodney Stone and Zampa, farmed the Bulldog classes. The dog won in bone and head particularly.

The Bull Terriers were disappointing, as one looks for good classes in Canada. Lord of the Vale, who won in puppies, is a nice light weight, as yet uncropped, a clean-cut, good-fronted dog. Major Manie is well beaten; he is weak in muzzle. Racket divided these two in limit, just a fair one. Lord Nelson was at Toronto. He had no trouble in winning here. Dimple was alone in puppy

bitches, Wentworth Judith being the best present.

The Fox Terrier judging proved the sensation of the show. Dr. Glover was plainly at sea here, and displayed no knowledge of the breed. In puppies that grand little dog, Aldon Deserter, should have won with ease. Barring his rather long middle piece, he is hard to find fault with. His skull and foreface are grand, his front nice, and he has character. He simply smothered the others, which were a very ordinary lot. The winner is snipey. In novice class there was quality, but we can't say we liked the placing of the dogs by a long way. Bobs, first, has a moderate front, ear a bit big, weak foreface, and bad eye. Advance Guard, second, a long-headed son of The Druid, with a full eye. Aldon Deserter third. Sagacity, reserve, a nice little Terrier, with a fair front and head, should have been second, with Aldon Deserter first. Fordham, not looking any too fit, won in limit and open, and also winners. Those behind him in these classes are mentioned before. Mr. Bell showed a nice one in puppy bitches, Miss Fordham, who has a grand body and nice eye. A good Terrier that wins with ease. Those behind her were but moderate. She ran through her classes to winners. Velvet-teen is on the light side. London Kitty, just a decent Terrier, with fair front, weak in head points.

Wires proved another sensation, where Hank's Superior, a catchy young dog, with a nice middle piece, but skully and very short in neck, was placed over Aldon Vanquish and Ch. Otterburn Candidate, either of which can give him points and win. Hank's Superior was alone in puppy class. He won again in novice, with Aldon Vanquish second, a dog with a long, clean head and good muzzle, good coat, a nice Terrier, a bit long cast. Crusader is a fair one. First and second same in limit, third to Gladiator, beaten

in head and ear. In open class it was Hank's Superior, first; Aldon Vanquish, second; and Ch. Otterburn Candidate, third. The reverse order would have been correct. There were no wire bitches.

No Scotties, and but a quartette of Irish. Donegal Biddy is just a moderate one. She has a fair head, but bad pasterns, and knuckles over. Blarney Blue won over Bullet Proof, whose bad front looked worse than ever. Blarney Briar had a bloodless victory in three classes.

Black and Tan Terriers brought out an untried bitch in College Girl, a good one all over, nice clean head and front, and very sound color. She was placed over those good ones, Duchess of Cornwall and Roche Pearl. Wellesbourne, looking well, was first in open dogs, a dog with much Terrier character. Endcliffe Mascott was the best of the four Yorkshires, and Mrs. Coleman again had forward a big string of Bedlington. We don't remember seeing eight of these dogs in the ring in one class before. Mrs. Collins' Tyneside Kit was put in front by Mr. Kennedy, who preferred her head to those of the other contestants. A different one in this lot has won each time shown.

Bobbie Burns, who was at Toronto, was alone in Skyes, and won. Poms had eight, of which six were the old-fashioned white Spitz. Mrs. Macdonald's Lady Brown was the only one that had much merit on modern lines, and won with ease. Trilby is a little brown and white.

Ruby, the one Pug, was at Toronto.

No entries in miscellaneous class. The judging dragged along horribly, and we had to leave before the balance of the regular classes and the specials were judged. There was a nice entry in Bostons, and some very fair stuff. The same remarks apply to the Beagles, and Ch. Venlivette was the best of the Dachshund classes, which included McKinley, now seven years old; Waldman, that was

at Toronto; the typical Rodi Junior and Miss Rodi, who is a bit overshot, but nice otherwise.
