I am working all day, and cannot attend to it, except at night time. The show put me on the rocks, I had to give up my business and go back to work by the day at my trade. We were up against it for fair.

You state in your letter that several members are complaining about the prize money not being paid in full. In reply, would say the committee made every effort to meet the deficiency, but were unsuccessful, and the best they could possibly do was to pay 30 per cent. of the prizes to outsiders. Local exhibitors do not get anything. They all waived their claims to any money.

And we have received replies from outsiders, in which they were surprised that we were able to pay any prize money, owing to the unfavorable weather, and stating that it would not prejudice them or prevent them from sending us a good entry to our next show.

Will you kindly let me know the reason the listings have not been printed in the Gazette, as I mailed them myself before I went away.

In conclusion, I beg leave to thank you for your kindness in inquiring about my health, and to assure you I have entirely

recovered, and am working hard ten hours a day the last six weeks at my trade, sheet iron work (and feel good).

NOTES FOR NOVICES

We will turn now to the mechanical method; this consists in giving the dog powdered glass or tin, or tobacco, or turpentine, none of which kill the worms, but make the dog's intestines so uncomfortable that they are evacuated. Of course, this treatment cannot be recommended as at all safe, for it is easy to see what a bad effect such things have on a dog's stomach, and people who do administer such irritants must not be surprised if something more serious arises. In our own opinion, areca nut is the best possible medicine to give to young dogs or delicate dogs; for older dogs in good health, and for the larger breeds, extract of malefern is the very best vermifuge, and will effectually destroy tapeworm, whereas areca nut and santanine cannot be depended upon to the same degree. It is not necessary to fast a dog for 24 hours before dosing for worms. The best plan is to give the dog a dose of sweet oil instead of his usual supper, and then, first thing in the morning, give the medicine, followed by a good dose of castor oil an hour or so later.

During the autumn and winter seasons dogs, like human beings, are prone to rehumatic affections, and it will, therefore, be somewhat appropriate if we give here a few suggestions as to the best means of dealing with cases of that kind when they arise. There are various degrees of rheumatism. The simplest is merely a little stiffness of the muscles, and the most complicated is what we should call rheumatic fever. Rheumatism may be said to originate from a double cause. There is, first of all, some more or less pronounced impurity in the blood—that is what may be termed a remote cause; and then there is the primary or originating cause in dampness, or something of that sort, which acts upon the

other, and gives rise to the condition known as "rheumatic." Probably in some cases in which this affects old dogs there is more or less of a gouty tendency, which, of course, is born of repeated attacks of rheumatism, and probably to some little kidney trouble, which gives rise to deposits in the joints. A dog which repeatedly suffers from rheumatism, therefore, naturally gets into the say way as a man does, and develops what is called a "chronic" condition. Sometimes the forelegs are affected, while in others the hind legs are most affected. The term "rheumatism" is generally applied to the latter, whilst when the forequarters are affected this is generally known as "kennel lameness." The same method of treatment obviously will answer in both cases, and we will now proceed to describe the best remedies.

First of all, a good, stimulating liniment is necessary. Something of this kind should be found in every kennel, and there are a large number of recipes, all more or less excellent. Probably when a liniment or embrocation is used the thing that does most good is the friction. The circulation of the affected parts is improved by rubbing, and the liniment may be regarded to a large extent as an adjunct of that—as a method of rendering the operation of friction more easy and convenient both for patient and operator. Our readers are aware that from time to time mendicant "doctors" perambulate the country, professing wonderful sures. Old men are brought from their chimney corners in a more or less hopeless rheumatic condition. The "doctor" smiles upon them, and pronounces their case to be not by any means hopeless, despite the fact that the medico of their own village has given them up. Then they are taken in hand by the able-

bodied assistants of the great man, and vigorously rubbed with his particular healing salve, to the accompaniment of a lusty band of music, which effectively drowns any appeals for mercy. The effect is marvellous. They have not had such a circulation through their congested joints for many years, and the fame of the "doctor" spreads far and wide. Now, this is really the secret of all external rheumatic treatment, be it concerning men or animals—rubbing as fre-

quently as possible, with the assistance of some stimulating liniment. There is nothing better than what is known as "hartshorn and oil," or the "acetic turpentine liniment" of the British Pharmacopœia. "Soap" liniment and "compound camphor" liniment, or a mixture of the two, with the addition of a little aconite liniment, are also excellent; while in many cases simple camphorated oil will answer the purpose.

Canadians at New York.

Canadians are running very strong in New York this week and many of the best things going come north, especially in the Terrier classes. Mr. W. P. Fraser judged the Scottish Terriers and Mr. Geo. Douglas the Sporting Spaniels.

The Norfolk Kennels come out strong in smooth Fox Terriers, taking one, two, three in puppy class with Parader, All Blue and Invader in order named. Mr. W. Hammall's Belgrave Verdict got two letters in the same class. Norfolk Parader after this won all in sight, including winners and special for best smooth.

In smooth bitches Norfolk was again to the fore with N. Truest in puppy class, where Mr. Hammall's entry, Belgrave Patience, was H.C. In limit Truest gave place to the imported Sabine Lavender with Mr. Macdonald's late sale, Aldon Design, third. Lavender won again in limit, where N. Truest was third and A. Design V.H.C. True Blue, another Norfolk one, had little trouble in beating Grove Venue (now Sabine Sunbeam) in open class and she also won in winners.

In wires the Toronto dog Matchmaker won in limit and open classes, but was put behind the Barkby Ben puppy Cairnsmuir Bullseye in winners. Behind Matchmaker were Hands Up, Dusky Twitcher, Cairnsmuir Terence and other good ones. Mr. Macdonald got a V.H.C. with his nice puppy Aldon Master, and Mrs. Bigger got one letter less with a Matchmaker dog Rival. Mr.

Tawse also got two letters with his Matchmaker entry.

Norfolk showed a good wire in N. Toss Up, who won in puppies and novice bitches, but was beaten in open and winners by Hillcrest Facile. Mr. Laurin's Alfredale, just over with Mr. Raper, went right through his classes from puppy to winners. He also took all specials that he was eligible for. Colne Lucky Baldwin should prove a lucky one for his owner, with this start.

Mr. Mitchell's Black and Tan Parliament Dime won all in sight, and Father O'Gorman's new Irish Terrier Celtic Badger went right through to the top of the tree.

Mrs. Coleman ("Kit" of the Mail and Empire) came, saw and conquered in the Bedlington class with her Punch, The Littlest Girl, Tyneside Lass, Mowgill, Judy and Marquis of Bedlington in order named—every award in fact.

Mutchmor & Walters, of Ottawa, had a walkover in English Foxhounds with Hector and Beatrice, and another Capitalist who won well was Mr. Cromwell Cox, of the Balmoral Kennels, whose Balmoral Duchess was first in limit and open and Merry Sheila V.H.C. Balmoral Prince was second in puppy class, where Dr. Ford's Otterburn Trust got H.C. Balmoral Prince and Balmoral Piccolo were both noticed in limit and open.

Mr. Caverhill's Skyes were much in evidence, his bitches Queen and Diamond Queen were one, two, and Moorlander second in dog class.

Lily White, the Pointer bitch that did so well at Brantford, was V.H.C. in novice and open classes and reserve in limit. The Irish Setters St. Elvan, Royal Grand, St. Lambert's Kathleen and St. Lambert's Molly all brought several prizes back.
