Toronto (Canada) Show.

To all who have not seen the Dominion of Canada Industrial Exhibition, held annually at Toronto, I would say go, read, mark, and learn.

It is truly the greatest show on earth, and even an American will tell you that he has nothing like it in size in his own country. We have nothing approaching it in England, and to anything like rival it one would have to take the whole of a "Royal" Show, and the whole of a flourishing popular exhibition at Earl's Court, and plump the lot down on to one large tract of ground, with, mind you, permanent buildings of the very best kind for the accommodation of everything, and a grand stand capable of holding 14,000 to 18,000 people.

I, of course, am only to deal with dogs, but I was fortunate enough to be able to "do" the show thoroughly, thanks to the great kindness of Mr. J. G. Kent (the President of the Canadian Kennel Club) and of Drs. Orr and Bell (the Director and Deputy-Director of the exhibition), and everything in the way of live stock was well worth seeing, the cattle, sheep and pigs being quite the equal of what we have in the old country.

The dogs were all benched in a commodious permanent building, on excellent benches, and there were two big rings in the middle, with wire-netting all round, and a proper gate entrance, a most inexpensive and highly-desirable addition to our English judging rings.

All the dogs are not judged or tried to be judged on the first day, the show lasts five days and the judging takes place on three of them, so that on the first day, Mr. Lindsay, of Montreal, judged Irish Terriers, Mr. Lacey (a well known man in the dog world in England some few years back, but now a resident

in America), the all-rounder, a few of his classes, and I, my Terriers.

FOX TERRIERS, SMOOTH.

Smooth Fox Terriers were the first on my list, and a very excellent lot they were. Puppy dogs came first, and an awkward class it was to judge, for the reason that by far the best Terrier in it had a most abominably plain head and throaty neck; in legs, feet, coat, style and character he was perfect, while his bone was truly superb, in fact he, Warren Deacon (W. Rutherford), smothered anything in the class in these points, but had much the worst head and neck of the lot. I convinced myself, however, at the finish, that he won, and that fairly easilv; 2nd, Mr. Macdonald's Aldon Tipster by St. Leger, a legs and wings puppy at present with a long head, but weak jaw, and his feet are but moderate; his quality was good, and if he does not get too big he will do well later on; 3rd, the Norfolk Kennels, which means Mr. George Gooderham's Norfolk Brilliant, just a fair sort, well beaten by those above him. Reserve, Sabine Kennels' Sabine Bandit, very bad feet and a moderate skull, otherwise useful.

Novice dogs brought out the champion smooth dog without his knowing it, as you might say, for he was only entered in this class, wherein he won with supreme ease; he was shown dirty—he was apparently the second string, for his kennel mate, entered in the same class, was entered all through—he has two faults, the worst being that his coat is a bit short, the other being that there is not enough of his head, though what there is of it is all right, and his eye is excellent. Warren Voucher (W. Rutherford) is his name, and a very high quality type he is —a grand body, any amount of spring

of rib, with a perfect shoulder and excellent loin and quarters, he excels also in bone, legs and feet. 2nd, Warren Drastic, a most taking little dog, his feet must always handicap him, though at times he can hide what bad oner they are by standing right up on his toes, but the flat, weak, thin foot is there for all that; he looked a drawing-room dog alongside the winner, who smothers him everywhere except head and coat. 3rd, Norfolk Kennels' Norfolk Designer, very -ood in points, but too big. Reserve, Viola Spendthrift (Ingraham), very nice again, excepting for bad feet and a bitchy face, high quality, and no one could grumble at his size.

Limit dogs saw the Norfolk Kennels' Norfolk All Blue win. A fine Terrier, good in all points, with a marvellous head, raw and unfurnished for his age (14 months), he is in reality too big, but he beat those below him so much in feet that up he was bound to go. 2nd, Warren Drastic. 3rd, Spendthrift. Reserve, Sabine Kennels' Sabine Brightlight, cow-hocked, and moved behind like a cat on hot bricks, otherwise very nice. V. H. C., Norfolk Parader; and it appears here it was where I put the cat among the pigeons, and yet I have not the slightest doubt the dog was in his right place. I am told Parader won the special at the last New York Show for the best smooth in the show, beating amongst others Ridgewood Result. With deference to the judge, I can't see it. A long head on a long back is an easy thing to breed, but when it comes to a short head and a back as long as a wet week you can buy and breed them by the score. A very nice Terrier (and he looks a Terrier, and shows for all he is worth) is Parader, but we must not forgive a long back if at the end of it is a short, quite puny head.

In the open class the only new-comer was Norfolk Huntsman, who came third. A very nice type of Terrier, and sound in his movement, with good legs and feet; he is, however, a bit light in body, with a soft coat, which is not long enough.

Norfolk All Blue was, I think, beaten with a good deal to spare for the dog championship by Warren Voucher. The former had certainly the pull in coat, as his coat is of exceptionally nice class and texture, and also easily in head in all other points, and especially in Terrier character and size, Voucher had the best of it.

In puppy bitches Norfolk Busybody won fairly easily; a very nice stamp all over, except that she had a rather full, too prominent eye. 2nd, Warren Ruby (W. Rutherford), a taking Terrier, with any amount of substance and excellent bone, legs and feet; a bit heavy in ear, and not absolute in front. 3rd, W. M. Glendening's Clifton Truelove, light all through, but Terrier-like, the latter remark applying also to the reserve, Macdonald's Aldon Gossip, whose teeth were slightly undershot, which of course handicapped her.

Novice bitches, as in dogs, introduced me to the champion bitch in Mr. Rutherford's Warren Daunt, by Dauntless II., who seems by the catalogue to be a useful sire. "Daunt" is quite a great bitch; I would improve her in three ways, if it was possible to do it. First, I would give her a bit more ginger; secondly, a smaller eye, and thirdly, a lighter and more compact foot. Her body is beautifully turned, in fact she is quite a model in this respect. Her head is long and of excellent mould, her coat is good, her shoulders, front, and bone really grand, whilst her size, character, movement and liberty are all perfect. She was some streets ahead of any smooth I judged. I shall watch her career with interest, and I rather fancy she would do herself justice in the ring if her owner was to get a litter from her as soon as he can, that is of course, providing she has not had one. 2nd, Norfolk Truest, useful, but shown pounds too fat. The rest moderate.

In limit bitches, Daunt won easily; 2nd went to the Sabine Kennels' Sabine Beatrice, a sound Terrier all over. 3rd and reserve very close together, for 3rd has a long back, but won in coat, feet and bone from reserve, whose teet were bad: their names respectively were Norfolk Truest and Sabine Lavender, the latter I see being by St. Leger, out of the celebrated Flossie Clark.

The open class was a repeat.

The veteran class produced a high quality little bitch of some nine summers bred, I see, by Mr. Tinne, by Tom Newcome ex Brockenhurst Margaret.

Canadian classes followed, they being

mostly repeats.

The wire-hairs were collect vely better than the smooths, and also more numer-

In dog puppies, 1st went to Miss Eadie's Makeup. I can see some plous frauds-the gentlemen who never touch themselves, but leave it to their kennelmen, ahem ! ! remarking not a bad name for a wire, either!-who is clearly and as a fact by Matchmaker. Makeup is quite a beautiful Terrier, just a little big, and his teeth are a bit tartared, but his head, expression, style and liberty leave nothing to be desired. 2nd, Mr. Carnochan's Cairnsmuir Eye Opener; he is not Il this, having an indifferent head and skull, but he is a sound oup, with grand quarters and loin, and excellent bone, legs, feet and coat. 3rd, Cairnsmuir Bub, a high quality Terrier, with a beautiful head, though a bit bitchy; he is weak behind, and has moderate feet. Reserve, Cairnsmuir Campfire, too big and sloppy, but possessed of a wonderful head; he quite refused to show now or later in other classes. Mr. Scully's Monocle and Mr. Laidlaw's Bexley Pinte, V. H. C., were both niceish Terriers, but both were bad behind.

Novice dogs was a repeat, except for Mr. Rutherford's Warren Bristles II., who, with a decent coat, was the best Terrier in the class. His coat was a really bad one, so I put him reserve.

Limit dogs saw Mr. Carnochan's Cairusmuir Barkeeper win with Makeup second. Barkeeper was out of coat, but, despite this, he won. He is very sound all over, of just the correct size, and has wonderful bone, legs, and feet. I liked this dog very much indeed, and should think in form he was the best wire I judged. 3rd, Selwonk Kennels' Selwonk Nipper, a useful sort, handicapped by his bad hind movement, whereas Selwonk Vanquish, reserve, was handicapped by his coarse head; otherwise very nice.

The open class was a good one, and it was a near thing between Selwonk Topper and Ch. Cairnsmuir Bull's Eye for first place. I put them in the order written. They are both high-class Terriers; in many points I made them equal, but the winner scored rather decisively in shortness of back, ear and condition. Bull's Eye has it in head and eye, but he is to my way of thinking just a bit light and shelly all through, and is not the compact, sizable Terrier that the winner is, who is really a great Terrier. 3rd, wonderful old Matchmaker, shown far too fat, and he of all dogs cannot afford that. His obesiveners, however, failed to his wonderful character, style and keen Terrier outlook. He belongs to a brace of rare good sportsmen who were most tremendously good to me during my short visit, and I beg to wish them all luck with the young Matchmakers, of whom there were a goodly lot at the show. Reserve, an old type of Terrier, with an excellent jacket, in Hillcrest Fencer, just a bit bitchy all through; he belongs to Mr. C. W. Keyes, to whom, if he will allow me, I will apply the same epithets as to the owners of Matchmaker, but if I go on writing in this strain, making remarks about owners as well as dogs, my task must be a long one, for everybody I met was so awfully nice and put such cheery countenances on over my many mistakes that it is impossible for me, Mr. Editor, in fairness to your space to continue on these lines.

The bitches were not so good as the dogs. In puppies Cairnsmuir Cherry won, just a fair one, with a nailing good coat. 2nd. Mr. J. Stanford's Dressmaker, a promising-looking brood bitch. 3rd, Mr. A. Smith's Kincardine Sawdust, and reserve, Warren Brooch (W. Rutherford) will neither of them set Lake Ontario in all its glorious beauty on fire. In the novice bitches the winning puppy could only get 3rd, first going to the Selwonk Divinity, very nice all over, 2nd going to a sterling bitch of Messrs. Fraser and Lindsay's (by my old friend Dusky Twitcher, I see), by name Flax, shown

too fat, with not a wonderful mouth, but a rare old sort, and ought to breed a rare type of pup.

In limit bitches, Selwonk Natty won, and well named she is; I seem to remember her in England under some other name; she is a quality bitch, with a good wire coat. Flax came 2nd and Cairnsmuir Echo 3rd, a stylish bitch this latter, spoilt by her softish coat, rather full eye and unclassical head, but for all that a Terrier.

Open bitches saw Ch. Cairnsmuir Make Believe win easily; she was too fat, and has very bad ears, but she has a grand coat and body, and bears analysis. 2nd, Selwonk Fearless, a very doggy dog, by mistake a bitch, coarse in head, but truly marvellous bone, legs and feet. The rest repeats.

Old Matchmaker accounted for the veteran class, and several Canadian classes followed, which were mostly repeats.

THE AIREDALES

were not numerous. There was a decent dog in Mr. Laurin's Colne Lucky Baldwin, a big dog, inclined to coarseness, especially in head and eye, who won easily in his classes until the special for best in show, when he fell before Mrs. B. F. Lewis' Lansdowne Flirt, an exceedingly nice bitch, with heaps of bone and a very good head, but her coat might be improved. Colne Consort was also a nice type of bitch, but a bit snippy in her face.

SCOTTISH TERRIERS

were very moderate. Mr. Cameron's Reel o' Tulloch was a fair quality dog, and just beat Mr. E. H. Goeby's Bobbie Black, who was the best Terrier in many points, but had a very pronounced curly tail, which, a very bad fault, quite spoilt him.

The Edgelock Kennels showed a brace of workmanlike tykes, but hardly up to

show form, and being so terribly light in their middle pieces.

WELSH TERRIERS

were quite a nice little lot. In novice dogs there were only three, all coming from my kennel. In limit dogs, Dandy Bach, despite his really bad coat, won from Brynhir Baker, beating him in ear, shoulders and front, though the latter is decidedly the better in type and color. In open dogs I placed Sunny Dragon 1st; he is a bit light in body and bone (for his size), and he is not absolute in shoulders. Ch. Ringwood Nailer, 2nd, has deteriorated in coat, in which particular and in type the winner scored decisively. Miss Beardmore's Plausevin Kist is a useful brood bitch, and ought to do well for her new owner in this respect. The two best bitches by a long way were Selwonk Mystery and Lassie of Cedarvale, both beautiful little bitches. but not quite enough of them. Lassie's bone is quite phenomenal for her size; she was, I thought, just beaten by Mystery in coat, color and Terrier character, though in truth it was a very near thing between them, and to me I think the most difficult point I had to decide during my long day's judging, which, with great thanks to everyone, committee, stewards and exhibitors, was to me throughout most pleasant,

On the third day I endeavored to assist Messrs. Mortimer (who I was delighted to see looking hale and hearty), Lacy, Codman (whom I remember well this side years ago). Jarrett, Payne and Lindsay in awarding the cup for the best team of any variety. Mr. Rutherford's smooths were my selection of the classes I judged, but Mr. Lewis' English Setters gained our unanimous award, and a very grand team they were, Mr. Rutherford's representative utterly spoiling his chances by bringing in a bandy-legged brute in place of his winning puppy.

Montreal Collie Club Show, October 15th, 1903.

The sixth show of the Montreal Collie Club was held Thanksgiving Day, Oct. 15th, 1903, at the Corporation Quarries, Outremont. As this adaptable show ground has been fully described before, it is not necessary for me to give a description of it again.

The weather was all that could be desired. Some forty-nine dogs, or one hundred and five entries greeted the judge. The dogs were chained in sections. Section 1, puppies under three months; section 2, puppies under six months; section 3, puppies under nine

months; section 4, puppies under twelve months; section 5, novice dogs and bitches; section 6, open dogs and bitches.

In spite of the large number of classes and entries, the judging was finished about 4 p.m., after which refreshments were served gratis to all members and visitors. A cordial invitation had been extended to all interested in the Collie, consequently a large number were present, including many ladies.

As this was a ribbon show and open to members only, no entry fee was charged, and the general public were also admitted free to the grounds.

As the object of the M. C. C. is to promote the breeding of pure Collies and advance the interest of the breed, I believe everybody will agree with me when I say that the Montreal Collie Club is filling this out to the letter.

The judge, Mr. Sparks, of Ottawa, after the judging was over, was besieged by many of the members, who asked him to give them personal advice as to the faults, etc., of their Collies, which he did, and was very much appreciated.

Notes on Ladies' Kennel Association Show, New York.

The regrettable absence of Mrs. Kernochan deprived the show of its particular radiance, which made it the oft told tale of the play of "'Hamlet' with Hamlet left out."

The quality of the exhibits was particularly good in many classes, and, as usual, many prizes were carried away by dogs from Canada. I shall go over briefly the three breeds which are most popular in Canada.

Sporting Spaniels were the largest classes in the show, and a compliment to the English judge, Mr. Harding Cox, who, unfortunately, was too ill to cross the Atlantic. Clumber Spaniels were unusually well represented. I fear there was a rather upsetting of foregone conclusions, and I shall try to explain why they took place. Of the three puppies

shown Coneyhurst Glory was quite the best type, but her badly undershot mouth put her in third place. Open dogs-Though rather plain in head, Norwood Joe was declared the winner. His body, bone and style are all good. Lord of Sussex, second, also fails in head, but is a sound Spaniel. Norwood Shot is quite the best in head properties, but his shockingly bad forelegs forced me to out him in third place. Open bitches-Here was a bitter pill for the talent to swallow, namely, the defeat of the "peerless" Maggie of Eaton Park, by Norwood Harmony, from the same kennel. It is true she scores well in head, but nowhere else. Had she showed well and not been listless and inert, the issue would never have been in doubt. It is an easy matter to criticize dogs on the bench or on past performances, but as they appeared in the judging ring I could only judge them as they showed. Belle of Brighton, third, has a good body, but moderate head.

Field Spaniels-The same old lot, of which Endeliffe Bishop was quite the best. Woolton Buller was second, and though coarse in head, he was a grand body, and was in good coat, King Bruce, third, has a good head, but was dead out of coat, and has very bad fore-

Cocker Spaniels-These classes had quantity enough, but quality was sadly in king, there being about half a dozen first-class specimens shown. Good blacks are hard to find, and reds of merit seem to have disappeared. Nowadays the particolor has taken the lead.

Puppy dogs-A very inferior lot, of which the winner, Neport Ray, has a coarse head, but a good body, bone, legs and feet. He is a merry mover, and was in beautiful condition.

Novice dogs, black-The Toronto winner, Lord Rugby, scored, but he has not improved. Mr. Clark was second with

Digby Belle, well known. Robert S., third, has a fair head and body.

Any other color-Mr. Payne won with Duquesne, a good-bodied dog, but a shy shower.

Limit, black—Knight, an unknown quantity, had an easy win. He has a well shaped head, good muzzle and ears, short compact body, and grand legs and feet. He is on the large side, but a good Cocker. Lord Rugby was second and Digby Belle, third.

In the colored division old Romany Rve, in grand shape, was an easy winner, with Lucky, a really good Cocker, second, and Buster Brown, another good one, but light in muzzle, third. The remainder were very moderate.

Bitches-When these classes were judged the light was very poor, though in looking them over afterwards I can't say I would have altered my decision,

Puppies-Nutley Peg, first, went to winners. She has a really good head and ears, and a good body. She is a splendid mover. Her pasterns are rather poor. Nutley Meg, second, loses to her sister in body and bone.

Any other color—Vera C., an old-timer, was first. She is a good-bodied dark red, but fails before the eye. Queen Lou, second, has a good head, eye and body, but light bone. Quentien, third, is a grand-headed Cocker, but too long in body.

Parti-color—The beautiful imported Selwonk Mignon was easily first, and she is a hard one to beat. Blue Mountain Belle is a good one, but undershot. The

rank and file were just fair.

Collies-Like the Cockers, there were very few good specimens shown. Though not in good shape, Balmoral Baron was returned an easy winner of everything in sight. His well shaped head, perfect little ears, combined with quality and soundness, should make him a most useful sire. Old Heachim Galopin was second, although lacking coat he is a typical Collie in head, ears and expression. The Conquerer, third, is a catchy little tri-color, but has not substance enough. Earl of Carrick, a big dog with a very long head and good ears, was hardly treated with three letters. Mr. Jarrett was well up with the winners with a big, high-quality puppy in Wellesbourne Clipper. The best in the bitch classes was Clinkerette, good head and ears, but not much coat. Hanover Express, second, had a good headpiece, but was in poor form. Brandane Marionlea has high quality throughout, and good condition would have defeated those placed above her.

Smooth Fox Terriers—Dog puppies brought out a wonder in Sabine Recruit. His head, ears, expression, neck, shoulders and front are perfection, and he only wants time to make up. The muchimproved Aldon Tipster was second; he has a high-class head, ears and expression, but is light in body. Warren Deacon, the Toronto winner, is much too coarse in head and neck. Sabine Result is a much-improved dog, but is now at his best. Of the remainder it will suffice to say that they were all at Toronto in

September. Champion True, V.H.C., but for his bad feet and aged appearance, is a good Terrier, but past his show days.

Smooth bitches-With the exception of the unbeatable Norfolk True Blue, who was marked absent, the pick of the Rutherford, Norfolk, Sabine and Mr. Harley's San Francisco Kennels were present. Bitch puppies had two good ones in Sabine Fancy and Norfolk Busybody. Limit-Here Mr. Rutherford did some winning with Warren Daunt, who, though doggy in head and listless in ear carriage, looked better than she did at To-Wandee Seabreeze and Mayse are of high quality, but very light in bone. Sabine Lavender was second to Daunt in the open class. Had she good feet this bitch would have few rivals.

Wire-haired Fox Terriers—Though there was absolutely nothing new of home production that might be called good, the entry was a good one. Mr. Harley of San Francisco, with Mr. Geo. Raper as showman, made a strong entry, representing many thousands of dollars. Puppies were a moderate lot. Limit dogs brought out the famous Coastguard of Notts, now Wandee Coastguard of Notts, now Wandee Coastguard. There is nothing exaggerated about this dog. He has a head of moderate length,

W. H. bitches-These were a show in themselves as far as quality went. Selwonk Lucretia has exquisite quality throughout, with a neck, shoulders, front and bone that are a study. GLEANINGS AT LADIES' SHOW

Mr. Geo. Raper, who is aptly referred to as "the irrepressible," and is notorious for paying long prices for Fox Tereriers that seem useful, told us of his latest venture. Raby coastguard having been "sold to America" for something like £400, left Mr. Raper without a dog to fill his place. As soon as it was known that a new wire puppy, Ramblin- Major by name, had been awarded challenge honors at the Crystal Palace, a "wire" was sent to "claim him at the market price." This meant £150 for a youngster Mr. Raper had never seen. The reports tell us that "Major" has a "poor eye expression" and a "skull likely to go coarse," but laud his good body and coat. Well, time will tell, and doubtless if past history is any criterion, Rambling Major will find his way into Madison Square Gardens-possibly there may be two "Majors" in the arena.

In this country there is too much of the foregone conclusion judging. In England the commonest thing is to find a dog occupying a position "out of the money" at one show, winning a championship at the next. Another rarity here, is to find a dog unheralded and owned outside a well known kennel, winning. Surely there must be in this country, as there is abroad, many dogs of merit that have never had a hearing.

A case in point is the famous Scottish Terrier Champion The Laird. The story goes that George Thomas, the well known handler, was detained at a small station in the north of England. To "kill time" he went in quest of a barber, and he had not gone many yards when he came face to face with a boy leading a "Scotty" pup that fairly made "George" rub his eyes to ascertain whether it was one of those dreams that all doggy people are heir to. It did not take long to make an exchange, by which "the boy" had "a tenner" (who'd give fifty dollars for a dog on the street in this country), and Endcliffe Chappie, as he was then called, was booked for America, A few weeks later he faced our well known specialist, Mr. W. P.

Fraser, at the New York show, winning all he was asked to. Since then he has had a successful career, never having tasted the bitterness of defeat.

Speaking of foundlings, the most interesting exhibit in the Spaniel classes was Champion Blue Belle II., Mr. Payne's beautiful parti-colored Cocker. Though verging on ten years "Old Belle" was in perfect condition, with a mouth as sound as a youngster, and as active as ever. Had there been a special prize for the best Cocker it would have been added to her long list of trophies. Unless I am mistaken, Belle, as she was then called, was discovered on the streets of New Haven, by Frank Dole. On her first appearance, Philadelphia, '95, I think, she was awarded the special over Champion Baby Ruth, by Mr. C. H. Mason. Since then her many victories are a matter of history. She has immortalized herself by producing the famous Champion Romany Rye.

It has often been remarked that the progeny of the famous wire haired Terrier Meersbrook Bristles would always be recognized by their likeness to their sire, both in type and markings. The same may be said of Ch. Veracity. This was particularly noticeable in the son of his youth, Ch. True, who though now relegated from keen competition by the ravages of time, must be invaluable to Pacific Coast breeders. In type and marking True bears a striking resemblance to his sire, as does Ch. True Blue and a host of others.

Canada has in handler R. J. Mc-Gaughey a man who excels at his business. At this show many were the blue ribbons that fell to the lot of dogs in his care. His ability to condition dogs for show was particularly noticeable in the famous Wolfhound Kubelik, who captured three firsts and the special for best in show.
