There are 'friends beyond price' even in dogs."

Without treading on any one's corns, we are safe in saying that, to the energy and executive ability of the chairman of the committee, Mr. John G. Kent, and to his able henchman, Dr. A. W. Bell, superintendent and manager, is due the swing and life that sent the show along. Mr. Kent for months prior to the show had been hard at work on details that are often left till too late, and he spared neither time or strength.

The chairman was ably assisted by Mr. Fraser, Mr. Trimble, Mr. Stone, Mr. Jacobi and the other members of the committee, who are all practical dog men, with only one end in view—the success of the show.

The building looked the better of a fresh coat of whitewash, and the decorations added greatly to the effect. Many stalls were also nicely decorated by their owners, Mrs. Waters' kennel of Pointers being particularly neatly stalled with appropriate names and mottoes in burnt wood work. We heard complaints that it was often very difficult to find a dog when wanted, and this system of "kennel benching" will always be a drawback to consecutive numbering, which is, after all, the better plan if the visitor is to be consulted.

The weather was all that could be desired, cool, bright and pleasant, and

with plenty of "Spratts" the dogs fared well.

The visitors' room was improved in appearance by the addition of bright rugs on the floor and pictures of famous dogs on the walls.

The exhibition building was enriched with several gems from the chairman's think factory, including the following legends, painted in black on a white background. We hope the advice tendered was well taken:—

"Your think counts for 364 days.

Let the JUDGE have to-day's think,
And DON'T KICK."

"Look pleasant, be cheerful,
It will be your turn next time—
Maybe."

"If the Judge does not give you the
Ribbon you think you should have,
don't blame him.

Look your dog over again."

Mr. O'Connell quickly got through his little lot, Mr. Maxwell, with the larger share, taking more time. Mr. Farewell's first engagement will, we should judge, not be his farewell visit, if careful handling and the intelligent placing of type counts for anything. He got

through in good time, and tells us elsewhere what he thought of his classes. Dr. Ford was at home with the Collies, and put them through their paces quickly. Mr. Mason also finished in good form and in schedule time, while some of Mr. Lacy's big classes seemed to take some care in the placing, judging by the time occupied, and Dr. Glover also took ample time to get them right.

Big dogs grow fewer and fewer here, while the Terrier breeds are on the increase.

Bulldogs, Bull Terriers, Irish Terriers, and Boston Terriers all show a greatly increased entry, while the opposite is the case in St. Bernard's and Great Danes, though the handsome Russian Wolfhound is more than holding its own, and the Bloodhound has found, at least, one more strong admirer in Canada.

Smooth Fox Terriers at Toronto.

What the Judge, Mr. Desmond O'Connell, has to say of the Breed.
Good feet and fronts few and far between.

I have much pleasure, at the request of the chairman, Mr. J. G. Kent, in giving my idea of how I found the Terriers which came before me individually, and also as to how I found them as a whole, and any suggestions which might prove of service to breeders here in general.

Before doing so I should like to place on record the extreme kindness and courtesy I received from every member connected with the management, and, in fact, from everyone I came in contact with. Nothing could exceed the thoughtful consideration shown to me, and I shall long cherish the most pleasant memories of my visit to Canada.

Might I also say it was a disappointment not to have the Sabine Kennels represented owing, I understood, to the absence of their manager in England, and also not to see Warren Drastic, a dog I had heard much of. This dog, though entered and sent to the show, was smothered on the way up. I am sure all Fox Terrier men will sympathize with his owner, Mr. Rutherford, under such hard luck.

I was quite prepared to see some real good Terriers on this side, and in this I was not disappointed. Most of the winners are quite in the front rank anywhere, but the breed as a whole could, with more attention, stand much higher. There is plenty of good material, and if general evenness was striven after and careful attention paid to mating the result would soon be apparent in a better class of dog all round. I would at once say that really good feet and fronts were conspicuous by their absence. I am not a stickler for these points at the expense of every other, but many

breeders here seem to think what we in England would consider a fair foot, is quite good enough, and if a dog is straight from his elbows nothing more is to be desired. Let them strive after good flat shoulders, well laid back, good round bone and the best of feet. Thin feet, though not open, or arched feet that are, won't do, they must be both arched and close. There are very many good dogs here brim full of real Terrier character with beautiful heads and the best of quarters which, if put to Redmond bred bitches would, in a short time, give the result I wish to see. Keener enthusiasts than there are on this side I have never met, and I feel sure they have only one desire—to produce the best.

My first class to judge was puppy dogs. The winner, Warren Searcher, is a nice dog, good head, bone, body properties and the right size. At present he is a bit loose all through, in elbows, carriage of ears and action, but no doubt will harden up. His feet are open. Whipper-in, second, is a dog of great bone, good feet and all round balance, but is too big and is long coupled, otherwise his head is thick and he lacks quality. Niola Dago, third, would not show himself, otherwise he might have changed places with the second. He is round in skull and his ear carriage is low. Novice dogs brought out Norfolk Splinter—about the best Terrier in the show. He is too big and long coupled, otherwise good all round—a stud dog if ever I saw one. Second to Warren Searcher. Third Niola Sandy, a smart little dog, not clever behind and carries his stern too gaily.

Limit class introduced the best dog

in the show in Norfolk Huntsman, a dog of the type of Old Dominie. He is full of quality, the best of bone, good feet, rare body and the best of quarters. He is inclined to be a bit jowly and might be a trifle cleaner in neck, but that is all I could fault him for. I would ask breeders to study his pedigree, by an inbred Viçary dog out of a bitch by Hunton Bridegroom, ex Doncaster Lass, own sister to Duchess of Durham. That is the way to breed good ones. Warren Voucher was second—a stylish dog, a bit light all through and too long in his couplings. In Aldon Tipster, a St. Leger dog, there is much to like, and he should be useful to breeders from his character and bone.

Open Dogs. Norfolk All Blue got home here, a real Newton Abbott dog. Head, quarters, body and character leaving nothing to be desired but indifferent feet and not clean in shoulders; second to Aldon Tipster. Canadian and American bred classes were repeats.

In bitches the puppies came first and with them the best Terrier—smooth or wire—in the show, Norfolk Model, by Norfolk Huntsman. She is now, viewed all round, a gem. Head, front, feet, bone and quality. She is only six months old and the fear I have is that she is too finished and won't go on. If she does, the man who has a better is a very fortunate one. Aldon Truth is a real good bitch, too. She lacks head, but is a very stylish one all through, with plenty of liberty. Third, Warren Day, smart little bitch, but light of bone.

Novice bitches. Model first, Warren Day second, Aldon Gossip, a classy bitch but a bit light and on the leg, third.

Limit bitches. Warren Jenny first, wanting in fore face and not feet of the best, still a good smart Terrier. Norfolk Truest, a good roomy bitch, short in head. Aldon Diversion with better feet

(her's are thin and long) could beat either of those put in front of her.

Open bitches. Warren Daunt. I had heard a great deal of this bitch in England and was sorry I could not endorse the high opinion I know she is held in. For one thing, it was quite impossible to judge her fairly as she absolutely refused to get her tail up and would make no attempt to show herself. She won in this class, but in the highest competition her open feet and muscular shoulders would, in my opinion, stop her.

Canadian and American bred bitches, Norfolk Model won in both.

For the best bitch in show, Model beat Daunt, and in dogs Huntsman was in front of All Blue.

This closed my judging, in which I was much interested, and everything was made easy to me by the attention and kindness of my ring steward, Dr. Boulbee, to whom I tender my best thanks.

Sherbrooke Dog Show.

The dog show at Sherbrooke was not up to the standard this year, especially in point of numbers, only fifty-seven dogs being on exhibition. This decrease is due to the Toronto show coming so soon after it, and also, some of the exhibitors say, to the premium lists not being out on time; then, again, several dogs were delayed by the railway accident at Richmond.

There was only one St. Bernard, puppy, a fair one, shown in nice condition. In Russian Wolfhounds, there was also only one dog; he has a good head but only a fair coat.

The best dog in the Pointer class was first open and winners dog, an imported winner with a beautifully straight front; he was shown in good condition and shows up well in the ring. Two Greyhounds were entered, but were in the railway wreck.

The second prize open dog in English Setters has a better head than first, but he is thick in shoulder. In bitches, first open is a nice one.

There was only one Irish Setter shown, a fair one, but out of coat. First open Bulldog is only fair, and the bitch shown was a poor one.

Red Cocker Spaniels.—A poor class as a whole; first dog the best.

In S. H. Fox Terriers, first open dogs is by far the best.

W. H. Fox Terriers.—First open dogs is very coarse skulled, but has a fair coat. The winning bitch is weak in muzzle, but has a good coat. Again the railway accident barred some from this class.

The Boston Terriers were a poor lot, first open bitches being by far the best.

The winning Bull Terrier dog is a heavily built one; thick in skull.

Airedale Terriers were by far the best class in the show. Lucky Baldwin be-

ing open for specials only; he is a really good one, with great bone and head. Both the winning dog and bitch are his progeny and resemble him very much.

Only one Irish Terrier bitch is shown; she is weak in head, but has a good coat.

There was one dog and one bitch shown in Black and Tans. The bitch was off the bench at time notes were taken, and the dog carried his ears poorly. The winning English Beagle dog is an old show dog, but is altogether too fat.

The Collies made up the largest class in the show, but were not up to the standard. The first open dog is thick in head, but has a good coat and ear carriage and looks like a worker; second dog has a bitchy head, but also has good coat and ear carriage. The winning bitch is a tri-color, but is out of coat; second bitch is scarcely a fair one and is too fat.
