The big dogs grow no better, rather the reverse. Mr. Kenyon's Crash was the only Mastiff, and added another blue ribbon to his list. We have frequently described him. He is not a Beaufort, but a fair one as Mastiffs go now.

St. Bernards were disappointing, but five in all, with Max the best. Charlie Mitchell, frequently shown, was the best of the Newfoundlands; indeed, the only one given a card.

Danes were not good, and Borzois found Kubelik, in poor coat, once more at the front.

Greyhounds turned out well, far better than for some years, Kitty Grey waaning out, but being unfortunately entered and winning in the limit class, for which she was not eligible, may lead to complications. Queenie is a nice bitch, put up on good legs. She beat the well-known Defender in open class.

The Toronto Hunt had little opposition in English Fox Hounds, and won first and second in each class with a good, sound lot. Fowler, on the big side, won in American Hounds, with Merry Girl, well known, occupying the same place in bitches.

Hempstead Prince, a big dog, that wants substance; Baron Faskally, and Devonshire Maxim were the judge's choice in Pointers, though Maxim, that we have often eulogized, was unfortunate in being beaten by the catchy Baron. Queen Flo won out in bitches, where Jingo's Della was rather hardly treated with but three letters.

Mr. Marsh Byers' judging of the English Setters called forth a good deal of criticism, but he had not very many good ones to adjudicate on. They are

better left alone. Poor old John Davidson was sadly disappointed.

The entry in Irish was a good one, and contained a lot of good stuff in both sexes. A very decent Gordon was shown in the selling class, and was picked up quickly.

Bostons have grown rapidly in favor in Canada, and a far better entry was seen here this year than ever before. Mr. Mortimer expressed his pleasure with the quality, and said the winning dog was the best youngster shown for some time. The bitch that won out, Canadian Duchess, was of similar type, and an all-round good one of medium size, active, and not a bit cloddy.

Airedales were strong classes all through, and local dogs had better stuff to tackle than they have had yet. The same may be said of the Irishmen, where we were glad to see that good stamp, Rampant Rolph, win out. There is, as we have said from the first, a lot of Terrier about him.

Scotties were a nice little lot, where Mrs. Le Moyne showed several "Barbers" of quality, and Skyes were well up to Toronto standard.

Bedlingtons and Welsh were good classes, Miss Beardmore, a heavy winner in the latter, with several new ones added to her lot, and Mrs. Coleman retaining her prominence in the former, Punch again winning out.

Black and Tans we always look for here in both quantity and quality, and they were well up to the mark. Mail Carriere won in puppy dogs; a nice one all over, but wants age to finish up. He won again in novice. Mr. McGaughey was first and reserve winner with Selwonk Imperial, Bellerophon Morley

Bull Terriers at Toronto, 1905.

By the Judge.

When a man writes a review of a breed he has judged his best opportunity to say something that will interest the fanciers of that breed lies in telling why he put where he did certain dogs whose placing did not please the critics. That opportunity is denied me at present for two reasons: Firstly, the scribes who usually can be depended on to see that a greenhorn judge has his mistakes held up to him have not yet opened their vials of wrath. Secondly, the boys up there were so universally courteous that they never gave me a chance to hear a criticism. I know there must have been plenty of them, for there were many close decisions to make, and some of them I was not pleased with myself afterwards.

Next to talking about where the other fellow goes wrong is telling yourself where you were right. In the very first class there was a little uncropped puppy that I thought was one of the best balanced Bull Terriers I had ever seen, particularly for a little one. Beautiful front, feet and pasterns, good body and tail, long head with a well filled up foreface, a small, black, perfectly shaped eve set high in his head and very obliquely. Not wide enough between the ears nor flat enough in skull, but likely to improve a lot in this respect. But about the second or third look I began to notice, that peculiar expression we all recognize and fear, the expression that accompanies deafness. An experienced judge would have known what to do. I didn't. I had seen dogs before that I felt in my bones could not hear, but they were not good enough to entitle them to much consideration, anyhow. But here was one good enough to go to the top if sound. I know now that the thing to do is to call the veterinarian, then if he says the dog can hear, put him where he belongs; if he cannot, send him out of the ring. This puppy's handler assured me twice that his dog was sound. I did not feel sure enough that he was unsound to send him out; and I felt so sure that I couldn't put him over other good dogs that I knew could hear.

Mr. Walters' puppies, Epsom Reliance and Epsom Sirus, were the pick, They resemble very closely their sire, the winning puppy at Toronto last year. They and the rest of the litter, Epsom Siren, Epsom Jap, and Epsom Countess Grey, showed better than any case I have seen in this breed what can be accomplished in reproducing a certain type by consanguinous mating. Note the dam and sire of these puppies. They are very much alike in type and are bred on the same lines. The latter and not the former is what accounts for the similarity and eveness of this litter. They are the long, lean-headed, straight-headed, narrow skulled kind. That is the type that has the most admirers. My own preference is for a wider and flatter skulled dog with head gradually tapering to the nose, and with a decided down-ness of foreface. In this type one is more apt to find well filled-up forefaces and, above all, correctly shaped and correctly placed eyes. This latter condition is particularly important. If I were asked what one characteristic more than any other distinguishes a Bull Terrier from any other white dog, my guess would be eye placement.

Call for an eye to be placed high on the head, close together and obliquely. and right there you have the prime distinguishing feature of the breed. I have heard often people talking of "Bull Terrier expression." When asked what they mean by it you usually get a few more or less enlightening gestures and a few enthusiastic but vague remarks ending up with "well, just Bull Terrier expression." Show one of them a dog with eyes as described and he will say "yes, that's what I mean." At the same time expression is of varying degrees, and if he does not know specifically what gives it, I don't see how, when judging two dogs, he can put the proper relative value on the points which go to make it.

But this is not telling about the dogs at Toronto. There was another good one in the puppy class in Wentworth Kip, a little chap with points that are hard to get in a lightweight, a well filled foreface and a small eye. In better condition and a few more months to fill out, he will be heard from again.

In novice there was an extreemly nice headed dog called King Dodo, whose bad front and crooked pasterns kept him back.

Limit brought out another high class one in Rockcliffe Blazer, excellent headed

but a little long cast. The going between him and Epsom Reliance was close. Blazer's head is more to my liking, but Reliance is a puppy that can't be severely criticised at any point. The remark anent heads, is, by itself, too general to be instructive, but read in connection with foregoing remarks on type will be understood. Ch. Bloomsbury Blazer was placed over Reliance in open. Dissimilar in type and with widely varying degrees of goodness and badness at different points they were hard to separate. As they stood in the ring the puppy tired from much showing, Blazer fresh, particularly well shown and looking better than I remember having seen him before, figured out on paper a few less in the number of cuts. Given my choice I would take the puppy without hesitation, but if a handler is able to partly conceal faults in a dog which the judge from previous knowledge knows him to have I believe that the advantage of such expert handling should be accorded the dog. Bloomsbury Blazer should be shown with head up and looking upward and should be kept facing the judge as much as possible. The former cleans up his throat and straightens his crooked elbows; facing the judge brings out what is typical in his head and eyes, at the same time concealing his dished profile and loose lip.

In bitches the best thing out was Epsom Siren; beautiful in formation of shoulder, upstanding and a good shower. In head much like her litter brothers, which type of head goes better on a bitch than a dog, to my way of thinking. Her head is much on the order of that of the famous Marguerite of Navarre. Not quite so good in eye, but better in finish of muzzle and without Marguerite's lippiness, better in front and pasterns, and infinitely a better shower and mover.

Another classy bitch was Rockclife Marguerite. Mr. Elliott had another called Gold Dust, which I see was since placed over the first named at Ottawa. Either there has been a mixup in the numbers somewhere or I am away off the mark. Marguerite was the one I liked and she was the one with a fallow mark on one side of her head. She was more on the order I like than Siren, and if she had been in good condition, as good a shower and all white would have given Siren a very close argument.

In puppy bitches there were two called Ottawa Vera and Epsom Countess Grey. There was not much between them and they were placed V. H. C. and H. C. In the next class the absence of some of those in the first class moved these two up to third and reserve. Then I saw that what little there was between was in favor of the Countess, There was so little I thought it better to preserve the same order than to reverse a decision. A more experienced judge wouldn't have made the first mistake. He would have compared those in the V. H. C. division as carefully as those in the money. Also he would have reversed himself when he found he was wrong. That is what I will do next time I make such a mistake, regardless of how it may be criticised.

I have always been against the idea of a judge giving more than one V. H.

C., but I can see where it would save him a lot of trouble where the classes were many and large.

This story is getting very long, but I would like to say a word about the brindles. There is no established type for a "brindle." There is an established idea of what a pit dog should be, but the color is not confined to brindles. Brindle is not even preferred. I talked to the owners before trying to place their dogs, and no two of tuem seemed to agree exactly on what they wanted. wanted them judged according to the accepted idea of a pit dog; some according to the standardized white Bull Terrier. One of the latter wanted any white markings penalized. When the fanciers themselves of this variety do not agree as to what they want it is foolish to try to judge them and still more foolish to give classes for them. The majority seemed to want a brindle dog as near the standard as possible for conformation. If they had been judged for pit dogs the dog that got nothing would have been first, being the right thing, deep chested, round muzzled, strong under-jawed. I am dead against recognizing a standard calling for a brindle or any other colored dog to be judged after the present standard for whites. Here is one reason strong enough to prevent it if no other appears: The first thing the brindle admirers will do to get longer heads will be to cross with white ones. Most of the produce will be either brindle and white or white; occasionally there will be one only slightly marked or all white. The white ones will be shown, sold and bred to as white ones, bringing back into the white variety the markings we have worked so long to eliminate.

Ottawa Dog Show.

Mr. H. W. Lacey, the principal judge at the Ottawa show, says in his paper, the Stock-Keeper, that Ottawa show was one of those unqualified successes it is a pleasure to be associated with. From start to finish there was an evidence of fancier interest and the people from the outside poured into the building in goodly numbers, so that instead of a deficit as hitherto has been the experience, the management may have enough over to reimburse them for last year's losses, at least we hope so. The whole fair shared in the good times. Nearly \$500 was taken in at the dog show gate.

On Tuesday, September 11, Mr. Mc-Lean, the well-known black and tan breeder, judged the Terriers of that breed and had about the hottest lot ever seen out, the entries numbering over fifty, a tribute to the judge. It was highly satisfactory that when it came to the allround specials the Terrier he made his best, Lady Faultless, was also chosen by Mr. Lacey as his candidate for the best of any breed in the show, the Fox Terrier Aldon Tipster and the the Skye, Silver Queen, being the runners up out of about twenty very good dogs. In the special for the best kennel the very even team of Bull Terriers, owned by Mr. Walters, scored over the Toronto winning team of Mr. McGaughey, whose darkness of coloring in some examples lost the trophy, but a grand team nevertheless. Mr. Nicholls, the well-known huntsman of the Toronto Hunt, judged the Foxhounds and had a merry lot, several winners being familiar to the Toronto show lists. In Americans the quality was also good and competition was very strong. This left about 600 entries for Mr. Lacey to tackle, and beginning at 2 p.m. Wednesday his work was completed by the middle of the afternoon next day. We should like to see some of these shown down here. Great interest centered in the meeting of the Pointers Queen Flo and the wellknown Devonshire Maxim. We made the bitch score in body, front, back rib and hind legs. Maxim booked very shelly. Mrs. Waters showed her good kennel, in fact, the ladies were strong in the sporting classes. A very pretty local Cocker was shown in Idahurst Aileen, a black that took most of the specials. We are indebted to the services of Mr. Estoll as steward, he working hard both days in conjunction with Mr. Hillsdon, the secretary who, though new to the game, never shirked his duty a moment. Notes on Bull Dogs and Fox Terriers at Toronto.

Bull Dogs, though not numerous, were of much better quality than is usually found adorning the benches at this show. Puppies were few in number, the best by far being Mr. Lydiatt's Peggy Stone, who has an excellent body and a head that will improve. The dog classes brought forward some exhibits of more than usual merit. The fight for final honors lav between Capt Roosa's Leed's Quaker Boy and Mr. Goodwin's Uxbridge Morgan. On first inspection the latter looked the victor, but on closer examination the former scored so heavily in head properties-a very essential asset to a Bull Dog and one that I remember used to carry the champions of their day, King Orry and La Roche, to victory -that award went to Quaker Boy, a handsome brindle in poor condition, Uxbridge Morgan is a white dog and shown in splendid trim, behind his head he is hard to beat, but this does not imply that he is a poor headed dog, for he owns a very fair head piece and small ears. Mr. Brown's Excelsior is a good stamp of light brindle, but is handicapped by a chronic skin affection. Ben Jordan has a big skull but is higher in the leg. Capt. Nelles' Master Chinosal's best point is his body. The bitches were not as meritorious as the dogs. Mr. Goodwin, however, supplied a rare type in Miss Aubrey, who would have won the special for the best specimen had her maternal duties not been near at hand. Mrs. Cartwright had two very useful bitches in Miss Chergwin and Royal May. Exhibitors in general would do well to observe the equanimity with which this rare sportsman takes victory and defeat. Her presence in the ring was most pleasing to judge and onlookers

alike. Capt. Nelles' recently imported Emsdale Merlinette is a very useful, lightweight and should breed well.

Smooth Fox Terriers were very numerous and brought out a larger number of what are aptly termed "one dog men," and those who were driven to cover some years ago by the big Norfolk kennel with its hundred brood bitches and galaxy of stud dogs-"purchased abroad regardless of price." As this kennel has been disbanded and the good blood it contained widely disseminated, we may look for more exhibitors and larger classes at future shows. The dog puppy class contained nothing likely to be heard of again. Novices were headed by Mr. Rutherford's Warren Dabster, a little dog with a long back and short legs, just the sort for a dog in the woods, but hardly the orthodox show type. Mr. Hillsdon's Oxford Blue, w Norfolk Kennel product, seemed to hypnotize the judge. He is a small dog with rather heavy shoulders and uncertain hind quarters. However, he is a catchy little Terrier and looks a worker. It is too bad a quality of this sort is absolutely out of place in the show ring. Mr. W. P. Fraser's For'ard On, a son of Champion Don Caesario, was hardly treated. He is a Terrier of exquisite quality throughout and just wants more substance to go bang to the front. His individuality and quality should be taken advantage of by breeders. The limit, open, breeders' and Canadian classes fell to the lot of Mr. Macdonald's sterling Terrier, Aldon Tipster, whose faults are few and merits many. It is a long call from Aldon Tipster to Warren Dabster and Oxford Blue in type. It makes one ponder "where we're at" and must confuse the novice and beginner who comes to learn and be taught. The bitches were not up to the dogs in quality. Mr. Macdonald went to winners with Aldon Tinsel, a daughter of Tipster. A good stamp of a bitch, rather lacking in quality. Mr. Rutherford's Warren Dandle, though not in good shape, has a good head, bone and front and seemed hardly treated when the winners class was judged. Mr. Fraser is to be congratulated on owning Norfolk Busybody, a bitch that should throw a champion. The remainder were mostly of good brood-bitch stamp, but not fit for keen competition. The veteran class was interesting and easily went to that grand old dame, Norfolk Handicraft, the heroine of many a close contest, and though not as sprightly as she once was, retains her Terrier qualities and is willing to enter into an argument with any of her sex. Raby Baron, a good dog, and old Norfolk Patient, made up the class.

Wire Haired Fex Terriers.

Puppies were rather poor, the winner being Warren Bandit, who is light and shelly in build. Fearnaught second has more substance. Limit class fell to Selwonk Briar, a very smart Terrier in head, front and outline. The open class was headed by Selwonk Topper, a many times winner whose one fault is a rather soft jacket. Matchmaker, the ever green, was on hand, but not feeling himself. His wonderful head piece and expression are a never ceasing pleasure to lovers of a true Terrier. The bitch classes were rather light, the best being Selwonk Divinity, beautiful front and good coat. Mr. Arthur Atkinson showed two grand coated bitches and mated them to Selwonk Briar. As Mr. Atkinson is a true fancier and a sportsman all over, we trust he may be rewarded for his enterprise.

COLLIES AT TORONTO.

These classes are always well filled, a fact which the up-to-date show committee evidently appreciate, for no fewer than sixteen classes for rough and two for smooth were provided, besides extra classes for those in the Sheep Dog trials. Collies are certainly not on the wane at this popular autumn show, for despite the off-season, when most Collies are as bare of coat as the proverbial badger. exhibitors rally to the support of Toronto. Mr. H. B. Hungerford, who now hails from St. Paul, Minnesota, still retains his Belleville interests, and is as good a Canadian as ever. He has been interested in the importation of many Collies of note, and acquitted himself as a judge with uniform satisfaction. The puppy class for dogs contained nothing of especial merit, Rough Emerald, the winner, having a fair sort of head and ears; he also scored in novices. Limit sable and white dogs were more interesting in point of merit. The blue ribbon fell to Mr. Samuel Untermyer's Greystone Faughaballagh. This is a big. rangy dog, with an ultra length of head. which, however, is quite foreign to a Collie in shape, and would do justice to a Wolfhound. His expression is also alien of the breed he represents. Coila Cronie, second, is a truer Collie, but is handicapped by uncertain ear carriage. Mrs. Gordon, a rare good little sportswoman, whipped into third place with Wellesbourne Victory, a handsome Collie, but getting strong in skull. Some useful Collies followed, but were outclassed. Limit dogs, any other color-This class was a gift to the big-coated

tri-color Balmoral Rex. This is a longheaded dog, lacking flatness in skull, with excellent ears and good body, legs and feet-always a hard dog to beat. Open dogs, sable and white-Mr. Untermyer. the New York millionaire, was well to the fore with Greystone Breadalbane, a true and beautiful Collie from stem to stern. This is the type of head and ears we want, which, coupled with size. coat and outline, makes a typical Collie. In awarding this dog the special for best in show, Mr. Hungerford showed excellent judgment. Wellesbourne Victory was second, and an entry from the Coila Kennel, 657, third. This sort of entry is most misleading to all concerned. Open dogs, any other color, again found the winner in Balmoral Rex. Coila Kiltie. second, has a long head, lacking finish. Bitch puppies was a big class, and took some careful sorting out. Hazelbrae Morna, first, is a really smart tri-color. with a capital head and ears. She only wants a bit more size to fit her for keen competition. Colonel McEwen was second, with Holyrood Princess, a big. rangy youngster with a long head and good legs and feet. Mrs. Bjorkeland. wife of the good fancier by that name. won a third with Balgreggie Snowdrop. nice quality, but too small. Novice bitches-Dr. Jarrett, who was missing from the show, having been stricken down with appendicitis, must have been pleased on hearing that Wellesbourne Brenda led the bitch classes. This is a typical Collie all over, only failing in top coat. and a splendid shower. Dr. Ford was second with Otterburn Baroness, smart head and ears and good size. Hazelbrae Morna was close up in third place, only losing in size, which may yet be hers. Holyrood Princess made a good fourth. Limit, any other color-This was a

strong class, and hard to separate in point of merit. Dr. Ford's Otterburn Baroness was declared the winner. though Hazelbrae Morna, second, and Cinderella, a rare type of bitch in body . and outline, good ears and head, must have been dangerous opponents. The latter is a hard bitch to beat. Pretty Peggy is too small and was outclassed. Limit, sable or sable and white-This was a big class. Wellesbourne Brenda won. closely followed by a very typical specimen in Ardmore Elsie, a handsomely colored bitch in grand coat, smart head and ears, and good otherwise. Cairngorm Surprise, third, is a good daughter of Balmoral Rex. Southport Sylvia Reserve is a bitch of good quality, but out of condition. The breeders' and green classes contained former winners. Many not mentioned in these brief notes were of good type and quality, but in many instances handicapped by being out of coat and condition. The array of special prizes was an especially good one. the Collie Club of America offering some of its most valuable trophies.

Irish Water—Nora McShane, a new importation, stood over the class; very large, good dark coat, grand front legs and feet. Second, Wave, a fair specimen, but lacks size and quality of winner.

In fields the well-known Woolton Wonder Jr., better in skull, front and body, won.

In Cockers the entry was the largest in point of numbers and the best in quality that has been, a distinct compliment to Mr. Harding Cox, and it was a matter of universal regret that he was unable to fill his engagement. The black Cockers are holding their own, apparently, and the advances made by the reds and parti-colors are particularly encouraging to all lovers of the sporting Spaniel.

It would be too lengthy a matter to review all the classes, but a few running notes may be of interest.

In puppy dogs, Knoydart Cornet won handily; a really good little red dog, that with age will find few to lower his colors. Second to Red Rover, a good-bodied little dog, but weak in face and light in bone as compared with the winner.

In novice black, Little Doc won; though small in size, he is coarse and none too good in front. Politician, a fair-bodied little one with weak face, was second in an indifferent class.

In limit, Togo a big coarse one, was fortunate to win over Johnny, thanks to the condition he was put down in. Lord Rugby, third, has gone thick in skull and carried too gay a stern. The well-known Lance Farewell won in open, attaining his right to champion.

In puppy bitches, Lady Evelyn won in a strong class; a fair-headed bitch, with good skull, well placed ear, long enough in body, good front and bone and nice Cocker movement. Second to Knoydart Cherry Blossom, a good, sound red, much on the lines of the litter brother dog puppy winner. Third to the cream colored Flora, with the best body, legs and feet in the class; an all-round good bitch, that might have changed places with the winner.

Black bitch classes brought out a strong lot in Lady Pauline, Lady Eileen, Lady Olive, Lady Isabel, Lady Evelyn, Tuppence and Muriel. The latter two might well be given the title, too, as

all are ladies of quanty.

In red dogs, Golden Duke was placed This award will no doubt meet with criticism owing to his coarseness, but he is a dog of medium size, much of the style of Old Red Roland, and though heavy in muzzle and head to a fault, has equally heavy bone and sturdy body and quarters to support. He has good coat and color, legs and feet, and taken all through, considered his faults are on the right side, though no doubt but that the puppy winner will in time displace him. The Squire, dangerously near the limit in size, was a good third, with Buller res. As good a quartette of red dogs as I have ever seen at Toronto.

In parti-colors, Ch. Braeside Bluejacket won, followed by Grey Friar, the latter failing in hindquarters. Minto,

another good one, third.

In novice bitches other than black, the cream Mayflower won from black and tan Gertie. A close thing, but latter loses in bone, eye and coat.

Knoydart Cherry won handily in open reds, and Marion was best of parti-

colors,

In closing, I wish to express my thanks to Messrs. Trimble and Harvey for the very efficient services rendered me as stewards.

Mr. Edwin T. Campbell, of Toronto, writes us:

Oct. 16th, 1905.

I had rather a peculiar experience lately with a litter of Fox Terrier puppies, which may be of interest to some of the readers of The Gazette, and perhaps be the means of saving some valuable stock. On Tuesday, Sept. 19th, during the night, my Fox Terrier bitch, Princess Alice, whelped two dog puppies which have thriven beautifully. Two full days afterward and during the second night, she whelped another perfectly formed and beautifully marked dog puppy, which, when put to the dam, fed

nicely, but I noticed towards evening of its first day that its stomach was very much bloated, and during the night it died. Now, it is a well-known fact that the bitches' first milk is of a medicinal or laxative character, which purges the young and cleanses the bowels. As this had all been drawn off by the two first puppies, there was evidently none left for the third little stranger, and as far as I could see their was not the slightest sign of a passage, to which I attribute its death. Could oil or some other laxative been administered, I think I might have saved a very nice puppy. The fact of its coming so long after the first two is, to me, a rather remarkable incident, as I never heard of them coming at such long intervals before.

Princess Victoria, another of my bitches, whelped three dogs and a bitch to Mr. Walter Sands' Broadway Brier, which he imported last May from Mr. Redmond's Kennel, England. Brier contains some of the bluest blood in all England.

Dr. F. P. Drake, London, is applying for registration of the prefix Kennelworth. Dr. Drake has already registered this word as his kennel name.

Mrs. Bradley-Dyne gives us an item or two of interest in the following. We are pleased to know that the Scottie is gaining favor, be it ever so little. If there is a cannier dog existing we do not know of it:

He contracted a severe cold at Toronto Show, which brought on heart failure a few days after his return to his home at Monroe, Mich., death quickly ensuing.

Mr. Davidson had reached the ripe old age of seventy-eight years, but to see him as we did at Toronto, with back as straight as a board, full-chested, and with bronzed face, he looked good for twenty-five years more.
