NOTES AND COMMENTS

C. K. C. Annual Meeting: An official report of the annual meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club will be found in this issue. Radical changes in several directions have been made. The annual fee has been advanced to \$3, and the privileges attached of free and reduced registration have been cut off. It is no secret that the C. K. C., to exist, must find a larger revenue. The club has outgrown the system in vogue for some years. Whether the changes made at the annual meeting will add much, if any, to its annual income, remains to be seen. A large membership of, say 1,000, at a low fee, would have made the club independent, and this we have stated many times. The members of the club have apparently let this opportunity pass, and an immediate increase in revenue has become a necessity.

Then the change in the qualification for championship is a radical and probably desirable change. Practically confining the necessary wins to Canada may for some little time give rise to adverse comment. It is at any rate worth an extended trial.

The Americanizing of the puppy and novice classes has for some time been anticipated, and should be helpful to the owner of the "home-grown." The broad interpretation of "American bred" is in keeping with the past record of the club, though it may be unfortunate that the word Canada is not retained in the qualification.

Ontario Kennel Club Show: This club is early in the field for next season, and has claimed dates with the C. K. C. for March 28th, 29th and 30th, 1907. If the first effort of the club is any criterion to go by, then an assured success must result.

A New Arrival: Mr. Jno. Miles, Toronto, has imported from England a good specimen of an old breed, the white English Terrier. It is several years since we saw one in Canada; in fact, not since the dog owned by Dr. Griffin was so successfully exhibited. Many of the breed seem merged into the Bull Terrier, but the true representative has many distinctive qualities. Floss, the bitch in question, is two years old, and is by King Dick IV., ex Princess Buff. Both sides trace back to King Dick. We wish Mr. Miles

Wellesbourne Victory Sold: Mrs. Gordon has sold her winning Collie, Wellesbourne Victory, to a breeder in the U. S. for a good round sum. The dog is to remain in Mrs. Gordon's kennel until next spring, when he is to be despatched to his new home.

Champion Matchmaker: During Toronto Show we had several enquiries as to the absence of Messrs. Fraser & Lindsay's great wire dog, Champion Matchmaker. He has been retired by his owners, his last win being made at Montreal under Mr. Mason. Mr. Mason also gave him his first blue ribbon on this side at Ottawa, where he also won the special for best dog or bitch of any breed in the show, the runner-up being the famous Russian Wolfhound Kubelik. Mr. Fraser tells us the dog is in splendid condition, and when we saw him last age had not in any way taken from his wonderful character and individuality. Those having Matchmaker blood in their kennels should prize it.

Bronze Plate Dead: We were sorry to hear at Toronto that the Bloodhound Bronze Plate had died some little time ago. The dog was not in condition when we saw him last in May, as shown by his staring coat and listlessness. We have so few good Bloodhounds in Canada that we can ill afford to lose such an one as Bronze Plate.

Our Loss: In the death of Rev. Thos. Geoghegan—to his intimate friends and his many poor folk Rev. "Father" Geoghegan—we have lost one for whom we had a most sincere affection, that we know was reciprocated. The Canadian Kennel Club is a severe sufferer, as the club's First Vice-President Mr. Geoghegan took a warm interest in its affairs, and attended many meetings at great personal sacrifice. A native of the Emerald Isle, his affections went out to the Irish Terrier, several fair specimens of which breed he always had around him. Though a man of the kindest nature, he had strong opinions on the subjects dear to his heart—opinions that he did not fear to express freely. We shall miss his ruddy, kindly face, his ready sympathy and warm hand-clasp. Mr. Geo. H. Carley in this connection writes us:

"I am indeed sorry that it becomes necessary to lament the loss of Rev. Thos. Geoghegan. He was certainly a sterling fellow, who did much for the suffering poor without giving one thought to his own welfare."

Bulldog Bits: The way of the Bulldog breeder is certainly strewn with thorns. Here is Vinemount Kennels with news that Vinemount Squire died suddenly a few days before Toronto Show—a great loss to Mr. Goodwin. Then his great brood bitch Vinemount Princess, the dam of Champion Vinemount Folly and others, successfully whelped eight puppies during Mr. Goodwin's absence at Toronto Show, and lost the whole litter, due to milk troubles. It is most aggravating to see a big litter like this all go, but Bull breeders seem to be inured to it.

Vinemount Orange Girl also lost two out of her litter of three to Champion Vinemount Lord Angus, but as a solace the remaining one is really of unusual promise.

By the way, Lord Angus attained his championship at Ottawa under Dr. Ford, and now bears the coveted title.

Mr. Goodwin has sold the young dog Vinemount Cavalier to a gentleman in Quebec for a very substantial figure, and his new owner is much pleased with him.

Importation of Wires: Mr. Goodwin has imported the wire Fox Terriers Champion Tamanend Nailer, by Meersbrook Ned, by Champion Meersbrook Bristles, a Terrier all over, and a big winner. He has been placed at stud at a popular fee. Also a grand bitch, Smallwood Duty, that has done a lot of winning on the other side.

The Holyrood Collies: We notice with regret that Col. Robert McEwen has decided to greatly curtail his breeding operations, and that practically the whole of his large kennel of Collies is for sale. A glance through the list will show what an opportunity buyers now have of getting something of the very choicest breeding, selected by Mr. McEwen personally. Many of the dogs have won and can do so again. Truant a truant: Mr. A. A. Maedonald has sold his Toronto winning smooth puppy to a breeder in the U. S., and already regrets it. Aldon Truant, as we saw him in the ring, is a snappy little Terrier, full of quality, and one that should last and improve as many of the others in the ring at same time surely will not.

He Doesn't Hank-er: Field and Fancy, in an appreciative notice of Mr. Donovan's services to the press as secretary of the C. K. C., in regretting his proposed retirement, refers to him as "Hank." Mr. Donovan, whose ear we have, tells us he doesn't Hank-er after the appellation, which isn't any part of his front name.

Presentation to Dr. A. W. Bell.

About one hundred breeders and fanciers assembled in the Ontario Government tent at the Exhibition Grounds, Toronto, on the Friday of show, to do honor to Dr. A. W. Bell, who for so many years had taken an active official share in the working of the big Fair. Mr. William McNeil, London, made the presentation, the address being read by Mr. H. B. Donovan. The sum subscribed was quite a substantial one, about \$450, and given quite spontaneously.

The address read as follows:

To Dr. A. W. Bell:

Dear Sir,—We, the live stock, poultry and dog breeders of Canada, assembled at the Canadian National Exhibition of 1906, desire to express to you, at this, the first opportunity we have had since your removal to the great Western part of our beloved Canada, our deep appreciation of your uniform courtesy to us at the many exhibitions that you have managed. We appreciate further the energy, enthusiasm and talent that have always been manifest in your work for us as breeders and exhibitors. We congratulate you on the attainment of your present important position, one that we know you can so ably fill. As some small token of regard, we tender you this address, with the accompanying purse of gold. Indeed, we do so with more than mere regard. Will you permit us, sir, to add, esteem and affection.

If the future should lead you back to old Ontario again, you may be sure of the warmest welcome we can give you. In fact, we can with all heartiness echo the old refrain to "Bonnie Charlie" of Scotland, "Will ye no come

back again?" Here followed the names of the subscribers.

Mr. McNeil very heartily endorsed Dr. Bell's work, and was sorry to see him leave Ontario.

Dr. Bell hoped the time would not be far distant until he saw all present in the West.

Mr. W. Hammall wanted him back again.

Mr. Jno. G. Kent, chairman of the Dog Show Committee, and a director of

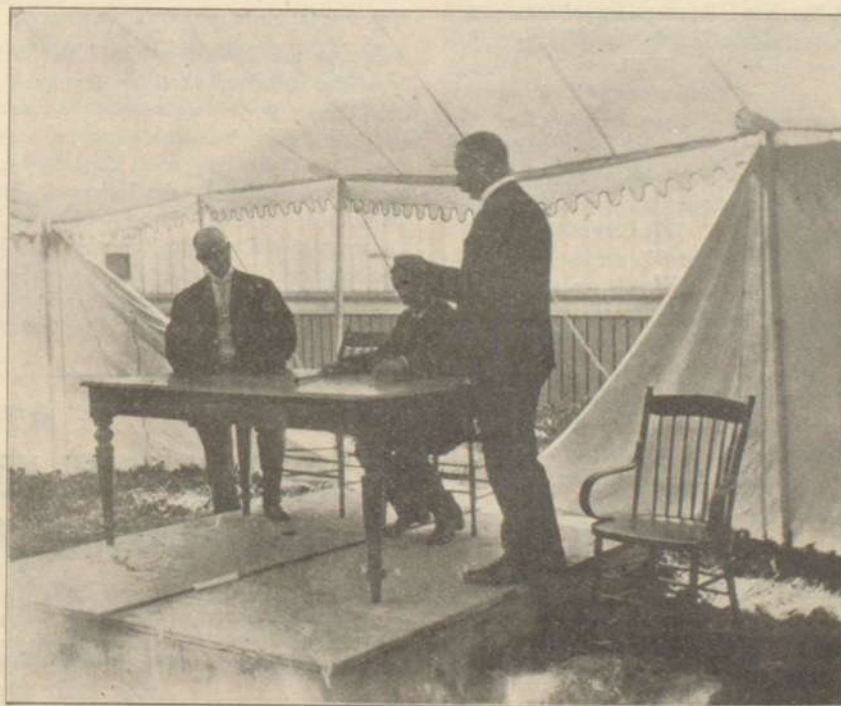
the association, said in losing Dr. Bell I lose my right hand man at the Dog Show. I don't know what we can do if we don't get him back again. The association greatly appreciates the work he has done.

Mr. Henry Wade, registrar of live stock, said he had an application for a man to manage the new State Fair in Virginia. The only man he could recommend had gone West.

Many others spoke in like terms, including Mr. Harding, superintendent of the sheep department; Mr. C. J. Daniels, for fifteen years superintendent of the poultry department; Mr. Greig, president of the Winnipeg Fair Board, who expressed for himself and his fellow directors the great appreciation of his work at the late exhibition. Dr. Bell had entirely satisfied the management.

Mrs. Coleman, of Hamilton, ("Kit" of the Mail and Empire), on behalf of the lady exhibitors, desired to thank Dr. Bell for his uniform kindness to and unvarying patience with the novice exhibitor, one that frequently gives the show secretary a great deal of trouble.

Mr. H. B. Donovan briefly eulogized his work, and Mr. McNeil stated in closing that the presentation was quite spontaneous, from the manager of the Exhibition, Dr. Orr, who was a sub-

L. K. A. OF MASS.

A meeting of the Ladies' Kennel Association of Massachusetts was held to-day at Copley Square Hotel, this being the first autumn meeting, Mrs. E. H. Seagrave in the chair. Present: Mesdames Annabel, Clark, Humphrey, Jenkins, Parmenter, Smythe, Talbot, Thayer, Misses Brooks, Fisher, Jackson and Sumner. Excuses for absence were received from Mesdames Whitney, Anderson, and Miss Whitney.

Reports of previous meetings were accepted as read, also the report of the treasurer, showing a goodly balance after the expenses of the late bench show are settled; same was accepted. Report of the Cup Committee shows all specials delivered, except where decision has been delayed on account of change of address. Hereafter all specials will be withheld until the dues are paid, at present there being so many with unpaid dues for the current year. Some time ago the Executive instituted a novel method of sending a medal for the best sporting and non-

sporting dogs, for which members could compete at the show. This has been found to be impractical, so that the old way of donating a medal for the breeds as they occur in the catalogue of the shows will again be practised. Dates for the show for 1907 will be announced shortly. It was decided to put the association's Puppy Bowl up at all of the shows, as confining it to the larger shows makes the competition too long. It will be forwarded to Methuen and South Framingham.

It was voted that one-half the dues from the members shall be devoted for specials to be competed for at such shows as may be decided upon from Sept., 1906, meeting until the show of the Ladies' Kennel Association of Massachusetts, in 1907. Owner winning it the most times to take the special. In case of breeds represented by one or two members, said breeds to compete together, and the special to be known

as the Variety Trophy, the special to be described as follows: Boston Terrier—Ladies' Kennel Association of Massachusetts' Boston Terrier Trophy, either sex, bred by exhibitor, by a member of the Ladies' Kennel Association of Massachusetts. To be competed for at shows designated by the committee from September, 1906, to Ladies' Kennel Association of Massachusetts' show, June, 1907. To become the property of member winning it the most times. Specials for the coming Bull Terrier Club of America's show were extended as follows:

BLOODHOUNDS AT TORONTO— SPECIAL REPORT BY THE JUDGE.

Disabuse the public mind of the erroneous impression that the English Bloodhound is ferocious, and he would spring into popularity.

There were seven entries of this breed at the recent Canadian National Exhibition Dog Show. And the star attraction thereat was the Dartmoor Kennels, the property of Messrs. C. H. Hall & Son, of King, Ont. Their benches were tastefully decorated.

In the puppy class Mr. W. A. Brodie's Canada's Pride sustained her name by her excellence. She is a magnificent specimen.

The prizes in the limit class were awarded to Dartmoor King, Dartmoor Pandora and Judge, in the order named. King is a grand hound, with too smooth a head. Pandora is a good, all-around bitch, without any distinguishing characteristic. Judge fails to bear a clear impression of the Bloodhound stamp.

There were three entries in open dogs. Dartmoor King received the blue ribbon, Dartmoor Ulf the red, and Judge the yellow. Dartmoor Ulf is a large hound, full of type and character, but is unfortunate in markings and carriage of stern.

Open bitches brought out some good representatives. Dartmoor Venus and Dartmoor Benefice are two splendid hounds, but the former scored over the latter in foreface and wrinkle. Dartmoor Pandora took the third place.

All the specials were won by the Dartmoor Kennels, including the medal from the Ottawa Kennel Club for the best Bloodhound in the show, Dartmoor Venus.

Canadian National Exhibition Dog Show, Toronto— A Record Maker in Entries, in Number of Dogs, and in Attendance.

The catalogue of the Canadian National Show just closed at Toronto tells us there were seven hundred and thirty-seven dogs benched, and that the number of entries was one thousand three hundred and forty-four. There were six hundred and fifty-eight dogs last year, and the total entry was somewhat smaller also, though this was not so apparent as the increase in the number of dogs this year.

The weather was hot and the building during judging very much overcrowded, especially on Labor Day, but it was a good-natured if sweltering crowd, and Old Sol surely put out a big effort to give us "Exhibition weather" during the whole show. Not a break occurred. If the show keeps on growing—and it will—a new building will become an absolute necessity, and the management of the Exhibition are wise enough to see that it is erected and in a position on the grounds that will ensure that "he who runs may hear."

We reveal no secrets when we affirm that Mr. Jno. G. Kent, the indefatigable worker, is the mainstay of the show. It is his unending work, forethought and urbanity that, coupled with a practical committee, have placed the show in its present position.

Mr. Supervisor Trimble had the show well in hand, and with "Teddy" Carlisle, grown in years and experience, if not in stature, as outside man and general factotum, the details were not forgotten.

There were many new exhibitors of the right kind—a healthy feature. The dog lover is the man we want, and not the dollar chaser or mug hunter.

WHAT THEY SAID.

During brief chats with some of the judges the following was brought out:

Mr. Mason: "The entry certainly is a splendid one, and there must needs be some poor specimens. The quality on the whole is, however, very good, and the Cocker classes are a wonder." Mr. Mason had an immense amount of work to do, including many specials

that fell to his lot, and was hard at it right up to Thursday.

Mr. Payne said: "I feel greatly complimented by the immense Spaniel entry; it beats all records, and the quality is very high, with an even average." Mr. Payne, even with his large ring full to repletion of Cocker Spaniels, kept his head, was cool as a cucumber, and stuck to his sensible type right to the end.

Dr. Jarrett: "I find the bitches very good indeed, but some of the best dogs are absent. Breeders up here in general seem to take very little care or trouble in conditioning for the show ring. It handicaps a Collie badly to be shown with a lot of old coat on or with great tufts of old hair behind the ears. Your Collie exhibitors should take more time in preparation. Neither do they seem to have sufficient confidence in their own ability to know what they want." Dr. Jarrett said he had a find in a bitch catalogued at a ridiculously low figure, and one that he expects will do him some good. The bitch referred to is Newport Queen, that has gone to Dr. Jarrett's kennels.

Mr. Lyndon: "The Terrier entry is certainly a great one, and Fox Terriers beat New York. In many of the classes I found a diversity of type that does not help in making decisions. In Irish Terriers, while there may be no great dogs that stand out very prominently, as in some previous shows, still the average quality is far better, and there are fewer poor ones."

Mr. Jas. Mortimer, who has so frequently judged at Toronto, was a visitor, and expressed himself as greatly pleased with the increased entry.

"Since your present chairman took hold the entry has steadily increased. Keep him there," was Mr. Mortimer's advice. He did not think the Terrier classes as a whole were quite up to the mark, though containing many grand dogs.

Mr. Sweetnam: "The Bloodhound is certainly gaining in popularity, judging by the interest they call out, and we have one more here than last year. This would have been largely increased if some recent purchases had not gone the way of all flesh."

Major Taylor expressed himself as greatly pleased with the quality of the sporting dogs.

The absence of Rev. Father O'Gorman, owing to an unfortunate accident, was a matter of regret. Ch. Celtic Badger stayed at home too to comfort his master.

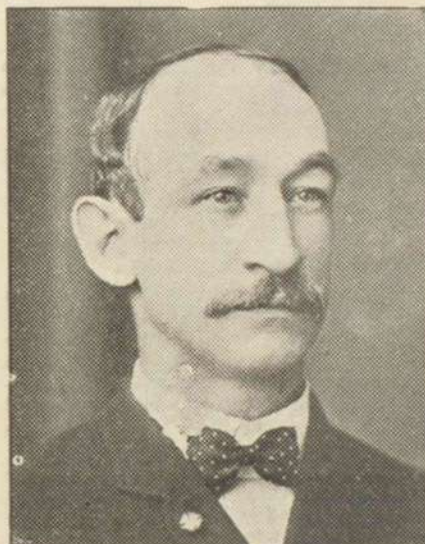

REMINISCENCES OF FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE C.K.C.

"When we get old how fast time flies; when young how slow. Another annual meeting is around, and it seems but yesterday that the last one was held. Am I to understand that I am again Honorary President? It is a great honor, and I can assure you, appreciated. I cannot do much now for the interests of our club, but when initiated I did all that I could to push the young chariot along. I am not sure, but I think the original meeting was held at London during a side dog show. Dr. Niven was in the chair, and to my surprise I was made President. What recalls the circumstance to mind was that the two judges—Mortimer and Davidson, I think—were pestered by lady exhibitors, one had Stonehenge under her arm. "Mr. Judge, please read what the greatest authority in England has to say about the breed I am exhibiting." "Why certainly, but Stonehenge has been dead for many years. I could not imagine you were acquainted with him." I mention this to show how

crude our shows were when I was President, but they were without the pale of Kennel Club rules. At that same meeting a committee was appointed to draft constitution and by-laws. If my memory does not belie me the committee was J. Lorne Campbell, Dr. Niven, Mr. Nelles, and myself. Now, this is what I am leading up to. While certainly taking some credit to myself for early efforts, and now feeling as though my usefulness was gone.

Before dropping out of the Kennel Club I would desire to offer a cup, or, if preferable, a monetary prize. While I have been more especially identified with Fox Terriers and Collies, still my

love has not been bestowed upon them alone. Greyhounds were one branch of the family's sporting idiosyncracies. A cousin bred Mineral Water, a Waterloo winner, while my good father always "walked" a Foxhound pup for the Duke of Rutland's Belvoir pack, and my Terriers originally came from Belvoir (Goosey, the huntsman, imagined he was my godfather and gave away one of his kennel Terriers.) But to the point, how would you advise my prize to be awarded.

Allow me to say I don't think any dog or hound, following out my own

observation, has ever fulfilled the contract so satisfactorily as the Foxhound. Riding after the quorn when Lord Stamford was master, the Belvoir when Cooper was huntsman, and the Meynell—a coxer on the farm—why should not my whole soul go thither. But we have them not. One blast of Treadwell's horn gathered them together like a flock of chickens when the hen wife calls them—no riot. But I am running riot—a babbler. But forgive old time reminiscences. They possess but little value only when one can't sleep o'night. What a run he can have after the hounds, every fence in memory, and then the kill, not forgetting the many falls, the jumps into the Wissendine, up to neck in water and a soft bank beyond, but never was it my fortune to negotiate successfully. But I do remember Cooper saying: "Here, youngster, take my purse. If I get in, the water will spoil the value. Here goes." He just about landed, but the bank was soft, and backward he comes. But the hounds were in view, and his "view hallo" was so inspiring that others negotiated the noted marplot and were in at the death.

When I get thinking of my young days with horse and hound I don't so much regret the absence thereof now as long as the reminiscences are allowed me. I dream of them, sometimes breaking in a four-year-old, cub hunting at 5.30 a.m., and getting Charley Needham's (huntsman for Meynell) blessing. "All right, Charley; breaking him in for you."

The old life is not the young one, and without my early days' experience I will be hanged if I could dream of anything later. Oh! bulls and cows, boars and rams. They are mercenary objects. Who could dream of them?
