The band of fanciers who comprise this organization are composed of what might be called "one dog men," i.e., exhibitors who keep a few dogs for the pure love of the fancy. These little gatherings bring together a type of exhibitor from whom we may look for dogs carefully bred and reared. Small shows give these men—and women, too, of course—a chance to show what they can do with home products—breeding, not buying, being their ambition, and that must be the backbone of the fancy at large.

The locale chosen was Grand's Horse Repository, a good building for the purpose, but so secluded on an out-of-the-way side street that any hope of a satisfactory "gate" was out of the question. Even with this handicap, 1,400 people were present on one day.

REVIEW OF MR. LYNDON'S CLASSES.

As I did not make any notes at the show, I must trust to memory.

I am sorry to say, with the exception of Airedale and Welsh Terriers, the Terrier division made a poor lot, taken all around. Airedales mustered quite strong for a local show. The winning puppy was anything but fit. Bar being light in eye, he is a big, sound Terrier, with a grand front, immense bone, and I liked his size. Second was very close up, better in coat and color, but beaten in head and front by the winner. There was a nice young dog in this class, who moved very badly behind. He was supposed to have hurt himself, but his hind action, to me, was all wrong, so could do nothing for him. The gem of the lot appeared in the open class, Columbus in name; while he did not show very well to begin with, he kept on improving in that respect. He is a beautiful puppy, grand color, sound coat, of the right texture, and his body, bone, legs and feet leave nothing to desire. To be critical he might have a little more length of face, but he has a nice dark eye and lovely expression so hard to get in this breed. I am sure he will do a lot of good if properly used in Canada.

Irish Terriers a terrible disappoint-

ment to me. With the exception of the winning dog and bitch and a young bitch of Mr. Britton's, they were a bad lot. What the breed wants is some hardcoated bitches with sound legs and feet. I well remember when they were equal to Fox Terriers in front and bone. My old dog, The Canadian Ambassador, now fifteen years old, who is blind and deaf, could still beat the winners at this show in front. The winning dog, Fair Play, is real Irish, always with a chip on his shoulder, still not quarrelsome. He was just between his coats here, and is wide in front. He has a nailing good head and ears, with a nice, racy outlook, and is sound behind. He is a dog always wants showing on the light side. The winning bitch should have been shown at the fat hog show in Guelph, as she was easily four or five pounds too heavy. She has a grand coat, lovely bone, legs and feet, and showed for all she was worth. There was nothing here to make her gallop, fat and all. Her faults are a very slight plainness in skull and she could do with a bit more foreface. Bred to the right dog, she should get a clinker. Quite a few of the Irish did not attempt to show themselves, which seems out of place in this breed.

Scottish Terriers, just one, a big but hardy looking customer.

Skye Terriers just fair, the winning dog quite a good one. There was also very nice puppy bitch.

Welsh Terriers, thanks to Miss Beardmore, made quite a showing, the winning dog puppy, I think, won winners also. He is a good, sound Terrier, with nice legs and feet, and lots of real Welsh Terrier character; he and the second showed to perfection. The balance of them just utterly refused to show. The best one of the lot is quite bully in front, and absolutely refused to show himself, and had to be contented with v.h.c. Now, there is no reason why those Terriers should not have good fronts, at all events straight.

Fox Terriers were simply awful, but as I know, there is some grand blood in Canada they must certainly improve in the next year or two. The winning dog puppy of Mr. Sands, I hope, goes on the right way. He won everything in Fox Terriers with ease, and was easily the best Fox Terrier in the show. He is a very taking little Terrier of the small brigade, might have more foreface, as he looks just a little bitchy; such beautiful neck and shoulders, with the best of legs and feet, short back and a grand shower. Mr. A. A. Macdonald, I think, won second in this class, shown very fat and cannot tell what he would be like in condition. In the absence of Mr. Sands' puppy in the limit



and open class, the fight lay between Binks, Aldon Cadet and Oxford Blue, placed in order written. Binks won comfortably enough from Aldon Cadet in head, neck and shoulders, he is also much better in expression. I found it hard to separate Cadet and Blue, but the little dog from Ottawa is quite done in front.

The bitches need no comment, the winner only deserving of any mention, being a nice, showy little Terrier, and should breed something good. Mr. Macdonald won in the puppy class with, I should think, a fair bitch, were she shown in half decent condition, but was pounds too fat, and soft as a sponge. Wires can all be passed over, with the exception of a nice, sound puppy from Montreal, Millbrook by name, a rather nice one, who went through to winners. Smallwood Duty won winners, bitches, a slovenly shower.

Pomeranians, just four. Berwyn Mite first, is a real mite, but was shown in wretched condition; he, however, won casily over the second, a chocolate, a very nice dog, but too big. Duda won in open bitches, a good, sound black, over-sized. French Poodles, the least said the better, and were all shown in straight coats. King Charles Spaniels, two very young puppies looked like being the best; still too young for show, and had to give it to the older ones. A very fair Prince Charlie won the next class from a Blenheim. Yorkshire Terriers had two very nice ones very close together, but the first showed so well and kept asking for it all the time, so he got it.

General specials, the first special for best in show. After weeding out, I had the Collie, Sheepdog, Irish Setter and Bulldog. The Collie and Old English Sheepdog were in beautiful condition, and besides showed for all they were worth. The

Irish Setter is not quite ready, was very light in flesh; I would also like him a size or two smaller, still with time he should make up into a grand dog. The Bulldog was pounds too fat, and always shows a mouthful of ivory, and lacks real Bulldog character. I placed the Collie first and the Sheepdog reserve. Would like the Collie a size larger, but he has beautiful head and ears, and a sound one all over. The Sheepdog is also a big, sound dog in beautiful bloom. The rest of the specials follow those, with the exception of the Irish Setter winning the Sporting special. I have to thank my stewards for the way the dogs were brought to the ring, which enabled me to get through the first day.

Chas. Lyndon.

The St. Bernards made a brave show, there being a marked improvement on previous years. Junior, dog or bitch (rough), Lucerne of Parkdale, from the Parkdale Kennels, was the winner in this and two subsequent classes, also taking winners bitches. This is a good-headed, weighty bitch, with correct eye and type, enormous bone and sound. Too light in color and a shade low on leg are her failings. Second, Edward's

Prince, a big young dog, with good bone, who wants to fill out in body and is too staring in eye. Third, Mrs. Softly's Duke; too small and light all through. Novice dogs or bitches: First, Sir Noble Bolt, massive in head and big in bone; he is a sound, useful dog, just wanting a little in finish and character. Second, Prince Charles, another goodheaded dog, excelling in color; too low on the leg and full in eye. Third, Jumbo, the tallest dog in the class, with fair bone and color; too straight in face and shallow in muzzle. Limit and open, repeats. Smooth dog or bitch, novice-First, the grand-headed, good-

eclored King Lear of Parkdale. He appeared a bit light to-day and did not show as he can do. He also won limit, open and winners' prizes, and with Lucerne of Parkdale took the brace special. The latter also won two specials for best St. Bernard in show, Sir Noble Bolt being reserve.

O. E. Sheep Dogs—The Harkaway Kennels were here well represented by that grand brace Edward Rex. and Ch. Sir Wallie Harkaway, the former just winning on the day. These were followed by Sharp Bros.' Leo Harkaway, a big, typical dog, with lots of coat, but fails in color.

DRUMCLAMPH 12.07 Bluebonnets, P.Q

Collies held premier position in point of numbers and some recent importations added to the class and quality of the exhibit. There is abundance of room for the good ones from across the ocean, and ample scope for many more breeders who will take up the fancy and follow it with the assistance of judgment founded on experience. The few highciass specimens we see produced here show how difficult it is to breed one. The show records across the border also support this fact.

In the puppy dog class Triumph Perfection, a handsome tri-color, with good, clean head, bright carriage of ears, good expression and coat, had no difficulty in getting the coveted first, Endfield Hope, good style of sable and white, in nice coat, winning second. Might be darker in eye and carries his ears carelessly. King Edward Baron, third, a six months old tri-color, shows the right character and type, but is out of coat and could be improved in expression. Reserve went to Walden Black Watch, also too young to show to advantage: a good clean headed one, with good ears. Prince D. and an unnamed sable and white accounted for the H.C.'s, a nice entry of 10.

Novice dogs introduced King Edward Leader, a well-grown Canadian-bred son of the great champion Southport Sculptor. This is a very nice young dog, in good coat, with a good long, level head, good legs and feet, that just misses being the best Collie in the show, a good wearing sort, that got the decision over the winning puppy. Otterburn Orion 3rd is weak in muzzle, but a good bright Collie, with good ears and built on galloping lines. Max McC., reserve; is a dog put down in good shape, a bit overshot, and loses some in quality. Sefton Ralph, H.C., lacks in cleanness of head to those placed over him.

In limit dogs King Edward Kennels' Southport Star defeated that good dog

Edgbaston Dandy. He is a nice headed dog, well-carried, small stands on good legs and feet, but shown out of coat, and consequently had his work cut out for him to win. Dandy, shown in good bloom and carrying his three years well, with sweet head and expression, loses to the winner in style, carriage of ears and liberty of action.

Open dogs and Canadian breds brought no new faces.

On the whole, the bitches did not show up as strong as the male division. Walden Violet, the winning puppy, too young to bench to advantage, possesses a good, long, level head, nice ears and expression. but has not yet come into coat. King Edward Beauty, in better coat, came second, Walden Primrose, not just straight in front, following, with reserve going to Hazelbrae Lady Jane off in ears and front legs. Dundas Lassie, H.C., fails in head and ears. Walden Silverbell, lacking in head and body, lost to same owner's Violet in novice bitches, James' Lassie winning third.

In limit bitches King Edward Kennels' Prunella could not be denied. Her clean-cut appearance, quality and condition, notwithstanding her down face and need of just a little more command over

her ears, put her over Janet of Rosemount, that did some winning at the National last September. Janet has developed into a great big, strong bitch, and now lacks refinement in head. In open bitches Nith Marvel, owing to her recent maternal duties, was not in condition to seriously endanger the position of the winners of the previous class. Canadian-bred bitches and the green class had no new ones.

Bull Terriers at Ontario Kennel Club Show, Toronto, made a very good class, with dogs in good condition. This breed was greatly admired, and why not? Are they not the breed that has made Canadians famous as breeders at New

In puppy dogs I found a good lightweight in Stockwood Battle, that went through to winners' dogs. In puppy bitches, Mr. B. M. Armstrong, Jr., showed a very nice bitch in Lysonby Elizabeth, with a nice eye, good head a good strong, punishing jaw, and if she straightens up in front and pasterns will be a good one. In lightweight bitches that good little bitch Berwick

The Bostons.

The following is my report of the Bostons at the O.K.C. Show:

Bostons made a great showing, 33 in all, or 13 more than ever came together in Canada before.

SCOTTIES TO-DAY.


I attended the New York Show, and I presume that great exhibition may be taken as an example of all that is representative in the various breeds. My interest is centered chiefly in the Terrier division, and particularly with the Scot tish Terrier.

You seem to have an idea that the Scot needs no coat, except on his muzzle, and a body of the shape of a thick music role is the correct medium between head and tail. Depth of chest, comparative shortness of body and lowness on leg seem attributes tost sight of in the American breeds, and the foreign dogs are trimmed down so in body coats they are almost smooth. I see you are also getting the whisker eraze—taking all the hair off the rest of the dog so that the bunch of stuff on his lips may make him appear to have the massive, powerful jaw the Standard calls for. This square finish of muzzle made by a bunch of whiskers has given several novices an erroneous idea as to the shape of a Scot's head. The Scot's muzzle is perhaps more pointed than any other Terrier's, and if some of the critics will read their Standards they will find that the proper shape of the head, which includes muzzle, is the sort where the nose projects over the mouth giving an impression of the upper jaw being longer than the under one. This feature and the tapering of the muzzle down to the nose are lost sight of under the fluffy whiskers which, if removed, would probably reveal the shape I allude to; the sharp, keen look is lost.

You don't want an Irish Terrier front on a Scot, but the appearance should be broad in chest, with depth in keeping, in fact, the brisket should be noticeable. The Scot wants lots of lung capacity in his work, and whatever we may say about the show dog, we should ever keep in ming the original properties the dog is bred for, else we should soon lose the breed's characteristics. The greatest harm a breed can experience is to become a handler's fad. By that I mean that judges become influenced by the catchy way the so-called clever handler trims his Terrier, and which has done so much to speil the individuality of the Airedale, the wire haired Fox Terrier, the Irish Terrier, and the Welsh, and now the Scot, by trying to make them all look alike in head and style.

Another point that is apt to be misconstrued by the amateur is the term well ribbed up. This does not mean spring of ribs. The Scot does not re-



quire spring of rib if he has the breadth and depth of chest that he ought to possess, for no dog that has to go to ground and in clefts of rocks, as was the original avocation of the Scot, is now in his own country, wants spring of rib, but he does want to be well ribbed up, so that he may possess a strength of loin for the work before him. This means the depth of the back ribs and the close junction with the loin.

Several of the winners I saw had no ccat scarcely, and what was on was plastered down to the outlines of the dog's

anatomy. This is not right. The Scot should have a very hairy appearance, and should show at least two inches length of coat. This gives him a very strong and sturdy appearance, and the denseness of coat desired by the Standard should not be obtained by continual stripping and showing in a half-grown condition, at the same time Mr. Scot should be put down in well-groomed form, not with here and there a hair on reck and chest an inch longer than another. I notice that one very smart typical sort was criticized as being too small.

Death of Dr. W. H. Drummond

The grim reaper is taking heavy toll. Elsewhere is recorded the passing of R. W. Boyle. Now it is one of Canada's most famous sons, the poet of the Habitant, Dr. William Henry Drummond. In his full manhood, with the zest of life strong in his veins, having reached the apex of fame as a writer, he is taken suddenly away.

Dr. Drummond was largely interested in Cobalt mines, and it was there suddenly, without warning, came the stroke of paralysis that carried him off in his fifty-third year. At his bedside were his devoted wife, his brother, Mr. T. J. Drummond of Montreal, with the physicians who had been in attendance on him.

He was greatly beloved in Montreal, home, as indeed he was all over enada. His last appearance in Montreal was at the St. Patrick's Society banquet on March 17th at the Windsor Hotel, where he recited a poem he had composed for the occasion- entitled "We're Irish Yet." Born in Ireland, the son of an officer in the Royal Irish Constabulary, he was brought to Canada at an early age, his education being completed at Bishop's College, Lennox-

His visits to Toronto and the West were frequent, and were invariably looked forward to with pleasurable anticipation. Just a week before his illness, Mr. W. P. Fraser received a photo from him, depicting an open fireplace at Carrigmore, Kerr Lake, Cobalt. It bore the following inscription: "Not a bad corner when the mercury is 42 degrees below zero." He was a great admirer of Henry Newbolt, and in conversation

with Mr. Fraser, pulled out a copy of the following verses and read them to him:

VITAI LAMPADA.

There's a breathless hush in the Close to-night—

Ten to make and the match to win,
A bumping pitch and a blinding light,
An hour to play and the last man in.
And it's not for the sake of a ribboned
coat.

Or the selfish hope of a season's fame, But his Captain's hand on his shoulder smote

"Play up! play up! and play the game!"

The sand of the desert is sodden red—
Red with the wreck of a square that
broke,

The Gatling's jammed and the colonel dead,

And the regiment blind with dust and smoke.

The river of death has brimmed his banks,

And England's far, and Honor a name, But the voice of a schoolboy rallies the ranks.

"Play up! play up! and play the game!"

This is the word that year by year, While in her place the School is set, Every one of her sons must hear,

id none that hears it dare forget.

This they all with a joyful mind
