NOTES AND COMMENTS

London Show: The London Canine Association has formally claimed dates with the C. K. C. through the Secretary of the Association, Mr. Fred. L. Wood. The four days chosen are Sept. 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th.

Winnipeg Prize List: The prize list of the Winnipeg Show, the dates of which are July 16th, 17th and 18th, is quite an imposing one, both in appearance and contents. Major J. M. Taylor, Rutherford, N.J., will judge all classes, and entries close on July 4th, the entry fee being one dollar.

The cash prizes offered all through are five dollars for first and three dollars for second, while third is awarded a v.h.c. card.

Mastiffs, Danes, Newfoundlands, Bloodhounds, Greyhounds and Foxhounds, amongst the big dogs, have to be content with a mixed open class, but St. Bernards and Deerhounds are given a limit class in addition; and Russian Wolfhounds, that are so frequently used in their legitimate business in the Northwest, fare better still with a mixed puppy and a mixed novice classes, while the open class is divided into one for dogs and one for bitches.

The larger sporting dogs are given an extended classification, as are the Cocker Spaniels, while Collies have no less than eight classes. Bulldogs are well looked after, as are Fox and Bull Terriers, while the other breeds of Terriers and smaller dogs are given a classification commensurate with their popularity in the West.

There is a long list of specials, no less than ninety-one in all, and many are valuable. This list may be added to. Several English and Continental Clubs are supporting the show with medals, and

Dr. Bell's finesse is evident here. Canadian and American Clubs have also been liberal, and we think that this is the first show held in Canada at which the extremely handsome medals of the Kennel Club, England, are offered.

There are nine five-dollar cash specials offered by the Winnipeg Exhibition Association for kennels of four. Copies of the list may be had from the manager, Dr. A. W. Bell, Winnipeg, and for the use of Eastern exhibitors there is a small supply available at the office of The Canadian Kennel Gazette, Toronto.

Vinemount to U. S.: We hear that Mr. Goodwin has purchased a place in Aurora (East Buffalo), so we fear that Canada is to lose this good fancier and his Bulldogs.

Black Mask: Another item that indirectly reaches us is that Mr. Goodwin's recent importation, Black Mask, is a very sick dog indeed; in fact, he may by this time have gone to the dog's heaven—if there is such a place. This is too bad.

Messrs. Trimble sent their Truestone to receive Black Mask's attentions, but for the reason given above had to have the bitch sent on to Collingwood to Tremail Temagami. By the way, Messrs. Trimble themselves are on the move to more extensive premises at North Toronto.

A Prolific Mother: Dr. Murrough C. O'Brien, of Dominion City, Man., who, by the way, we are glad to welcome to C. K. C. ranks, reports a cast of unusual interest. To use the Doctor's own words:

"I have to report a matter of interest to all dog breeders, showing how prolific a bitch can be—as far as I can learn, the most prolific of any dog I know of.

The bitch Jess, a Deerhound (at present owned by Mr. Geo. Merriek, of Winnipeg, and formerly bred and owned by me), whelped in April, 1901, has just had her fifth litter on Sunday, May 26th, the total number of puppies she has had in the five litters being 78—14, 16, 18, 14, 16, respectively; she raised 12 out of first litter, 12 of second, 13 of third, 10 of fourth, and of fifth litter killed all but 5. This about makes a record."

A. K. C. Stud Book: Is vol. twenty-three going to prove an unlucky number for the A. K. C.? It doesn't look so from the extensive mass of details between its covers. There are no less than 2,425 pages, consisting of registrations, show winnings and other matter of value to the breeder of thoroughbred dogs. The registrations total dangerously near the ten thousand mark, being in exact figures 9,729, Collies and Bostons leading, with the former safely in front. We don't envy the editor or editors of such a work.

Calgary Prize List: As before announced in these columns, Mr. Chas. Lyndon is to take all classes at Calgary at the show to be held on July 10th, 11th and 12th. Entries positively close on July 1st with the Secretary, Mr. Chas. Rodden. Mr. T. W. Bryant will play the part of Superintendent. The plan of entry is that adopted last year at Toronto, embodying a reduction after first class a dog is entered in. The fee here is one dollar for first class a dog is entered in, and but half this for each subsequent entry of the same dog. We recommend such a sensible plan.

The cash prizes offered are five dollars for first and three dollars for second, while the third dog is given a ribbon; surely a liberal classification for such a very moderate fee. Popular breeds are

well catered to, and all have a look in. The Secretary, Mr. Chas. Rodden, has an abundant supply of lists for those who ask for them.

No show in Brantford: The Brantford Kennel Club has been obliged to abandon the show usually given in the spring or early summer, for the reason that no suitable hall is available. A show in the autumn or winter may, however, be held in its stead.

Fox Terrier Advents: Mr. T. R. Jones', Toronto, wire bitch Champion Aldon Donna, has whelped six fine puppies to Champion Aldon Tipster, who has proven and is proving his value as a sire. Mr. Jones' smooth Bedford Jewel, too, is nursing a litter of two to the same dog. Her last litter, same breeding, produced two winners at the Toronto Show from a litter of four. One other died, and the fourth will be shown and is good enough to be well up.

Bostonians: Mr. Meadows tell us that breeders are evidently alive to the value of Combustion as a sire, as several bitches have received his services since his advent here. Mr. Linten reports a litter from him, as does Mr. Little.

Mr. Meadows has bought the Boston Bitch Pansy, now in whelp to Combustion. Pansy is the dam of Miss Teck, the puppy winner at the late O. K. C. show. He has just pulled Abbey Model through a severe case of distemper, and as he considers her the best he has ever

owned, he is congratulating himself and the vendors of Dagget's Distemper Cure, which was used in this case, and which he gives a very hearty recommendation.

Dr. D. C. King, Peterboro, has added another good Boston to his string in Little Anthony, C. 9246. He is by the great sire Sir Anthony, and weighs but 16 pounds. In color he is a rich dark mahogany brindle, with correct wide white markings, four white feet. He has a nice cobby body, with a two-inch kink tail. He has youth on his side, and is a proven sire. Dr. King has some other good Bostons on the tapis that we hope he may succeed in securing. Both Little Anthony and Tito Melima are offered at stud.

Mrs. Gordon's Farm: Mrs. Gordon's Collies are now enjoying the lake breezes and the liberty of a forty-acre farm at New Toronto, where their owner has leased Mr. Hammall's place on the Lake Shore Road. In addition to the score of Collies on the farm, there are several horses, a cow, pigs, chickens, and even a nanny goat, the latter at the disposal of Collie babies. Coats can be grown here, and that liberty of action acquired that is so desired in "the Sheep Dog."

MONTREAL DOG SHOW

Four hundred and seventeen dogs. Number of points, three.

The Victoria Rink is an admirable place for such a successful show as that given last month by the Montreal Canine Association. There was room and to spare; the bedding was clean, and the clerical work efficient. Mr. Innis has now the 'work at his fingers' ends, and he was ably seconded by many members of a hard working committee.

From a social side, too, the show was a pleasant one, and the number of ladies that graced the aisles was unusually large. As exhibitors, also, many ladies took their ups and downs quite as philosophically as did those who are supposed to be of the stronger sex, and so we presume are looked upon to bear the disappointment consequent on the exhibiting of dogs with more equable tempers. It has been whispered to us that this was not the case in Montreal in all cases. But we mustn't tell tales.

Our visit had, perforce, to be a flying one, but it was not too short to enable us to partake of the hospitality of the M. C. A. at an informal little dinner that took place on the Wednesday evening. Mr. Hersey, the very able and affable president of the Association, was at the head of the table, supported by Mr. Lindsay, Mr. Laurin, Mr. Thomas, Mr. Innis, and several others. Mr. Lacy, Mr. Donovan, and Mr. Williams were amongst the guests. Mr. Hersey in no set speech spoke of the pleasure it gave him in being one at such little affairs as that at which they had gathered. He extended the hospitality of Montreal and the M. C. A. to all outsiders. Mr. Donovan replied briefly, and just as informally, expressing the pleasure it gave him in being one of such a jolly and enthusiastic lot. There were no set speeches, but pleasant table chat that made all feel at home.

Mr. Lacy was still feeling the result of his recent accident, but was recuperating fast. Mr. Ed. Outhet was given a parting word of praise and regret at his leaving. He goes to the U. S. to take charge of a big Pointer kennel, and the "Devonshires" go with him. Another recent loss to Montreal is "Auchairnie" Smith, though his place in the Colne kennels, we hear, has been well filled by an expert from the Old Country.

Mr. "Joe" Reid appeared in native costume, knickers and a tam. We hope

next time to see his sturdy frame in kilts. Mr. Lindsay also donned the knickers. He is a bigger man than we thought. Mr. Lacy said if this kind of thing became popular, he would, if invited to Montreal again, wear pajamas and a tall hat. Better come in warm weather.

Mr. Reid had a grand lot of Collies to judge. His work was done at night, and we were unable to see much of it or the dogs. "Coila" had a field day, as the list will show. Heads and coats are being produced in Montreal. Nearly two hundred entries in Collies kept the judge hustling during two evenings.

Mr. Lindsay's Classes.

In many respects one of the best shows ever held here. The cleanest show I ever attended in Canada. I fancy Montreal can lead America on a ribbon competition, as we have a strong local entry in Collies, Airedales, and some good Irish, and a few Fox Terriers above the average.

I think the time has now arrived for the Montreal Canine Association to run another annual fixture, with a little money up; do away with many classes and all those specials, that give everyone a lot of trouble and are hard on judges, superintendent and secretary. I know my friends in the Collie fancy do not agree with me on this point, and they have recollections of disastrous results from (money prizes) shows; yet with good, clean, close management, and a working committee, one that will take hold, I am of the belief that a money show will go. As I have said, in Collies and Airedales we have a show right here in the city of those breeds; but can we say that of the other breeds? A few nice Irish, and a few Fox Terriers. I am referring to Terriers, not the larger breeds, that I know nothing of. Many of the poor specimens here is where I think, money up, will improve our shows.

I know personally two well-known lady exhibitors (I can almost see some of my friends smile now), one a Bulldog breeder, the other a prominent Cocker breeder, who told me they could not come to Montreal another year and make a big entry and bring their kennelmen and pay express rates, travelling and hotel expenses, all for the sake of a few ribbons. Put up a little money, gentlemen, another year; go easy at first, and with conservative management I think it will go, and let Montrealers see the classes that have been weak grow stronger. I have no axe to grind; old "Matchmaker" is over ten years of age, and his race is pretty well done, yet lively I hear; perhaps like one of his owners—a bit stiff, but still able to gallop a little on a fine day.

I was sorry to hear that the good Irish Terrier "D. Fairplay" died a few hours after I had the pleasure of judging him—a dog we can ill afford to lose. I thought him a bit short in coat, yet in pink of condition, as far as I could tell from handling him; and he impressed me

as being a cool, collected Terrier, not looking for a scrap everlastingly, as many Irish Terriers do. I am sure I only express the sympathy that Terrier breeders will feel for his owner on such a good Terrier being carried off.

Fox Terriers, smooth and wire, were well represented, the quality of both showing an improvement on former years. The best of the smooth was Mr. A. A. Macdonald's well-known Aldon Cadet, a smart little Terrier, whose quality is bound to attract attention. Mr. Benning showed a nice pair of puppies, by Oxford Blue, Ochell Teddy and Ochell Tibbie, and both will probably be heard of later. The former was placed first in puppy, novice and local classes, but had to give way to Cadet in limit and open. The best of the wires was Miss Eadie's Cavall, by Champion Sylvan Result, an exceptionally high-class Terrier, who never does himself justice in the ring. He was closely followed by his litter brother, Caerleon, owned by Mr. Stanford, who was put down very fit and is a grand shower. Mr. Thomas Moore showed three high quality puppies, in Donnington Cackler, Topper and Syren, by Donnington Admiral, which promise well for the future. Cavall won the special for best Fox Terrier, wire or smooth. Scottish Terriers were few in number, and of average merit. Miss Eadie's smart little black Terrier Carnoustie was first in limit and open, also the best in the show. Mr. Watson's Newcastle Fidelity, which came all the way from Winnipeg, had to be satisfied with second place. Mr. H. Mackenzie's Coma Topsy

was first of her sex, with Miss Eadie's Peggy second.

As I will be in Canada for a few months, breeders will have an opportunity of using these famous sires. It is well known that they are Terriers with a world-wide reputation and not at all local. Mr. Lacy's Classes.

Mr. Lacy says in American Stock Keeper:

St. Bernards.—A more wretched group we never saw at a show, and their demoralization was evident in their temper, for they got real mad about it and had several dust-ups. Had the showing been made in the States the gate would have been held wide open for their exit. Yet years ago they had some nice stock here. Bulldogs, mainly through the efforts of a local breeder, Mr. Thomas, are growing in numbers, at any rate, and taken all through, the exhibit was commendable. Still we have seen better individuals benched at Montreal in this breed. Greyhounds and Russians have fallen off, simply because it does not pay for outside kennels to take in the show, for Montreal is not next door to the big fancier centres.

And what shall we say to Cocker? They were just a local lot, but not to compare in quality with those that

are brought together in the ribbon shows this side the line anywhere in Massachusetts. The big breeders simply could not afford the expense and time. When money was up, these were shown and the quality was in the ascendant. The Setters are making no headway—English, we mean—nor are the local Irish coming along, though from outside some good ones appeared. The Pointers were, outside of the Waters and Outhet dogs, a pretty ordinary lot, and sadly in need of the Outhet blood.

But the Poms. were a revelation. To be sure, there were not many of them—we mean the really good ones, but these were what are technically termed "corkers," or they seemed to be in that show. A good deal goes by comparison in show quality; one dog may look like a topper at one show and be with the others at another. There is one breed in which Montreal has made progress, and that is the Griffons Korthals, which we were called upon to gravely be-ribbon. They were the first.

As stated, St. Bernards were poor. The best was Lochinvar, a son of Sir Hereward II., lacking in muzzle and substance, though a very fair dog otherwise. The best Newfoundland was third, lame and rather dickey behind. The best Russian Wolfhound, Vintka, had the quality and the right type and coat. The Greyhounds were poor.

English Foxhounds were a fine lot, the best we have seen in Canada, or at any rate at this show. Three packs were represented, the Montreal, Quebec Hunt, and the local Fox Hunters' Association. There was a good deal of uncertainty about numbers, and we fear some got twisted a bit. There was a rare good Hound shown by the Montreal called Playmate, and only when it came to winners did we consider his shoulders adversely, and then because the other, Triner, one of the Quebecs, by North Cheshire, was so clean all

over. The second puppy was not a better one than third, but the latter had an over-shot mouth. The bitches were very nice, good sweet quality, lean heads and square, level body formation. The pack competition made lots of fun, for it is no easy matter to gather three packs in an ordinary judging ring, without pens as at New York. The Montreal with huntsman in pink had the best pack, even color and a level sorty lot, which we expect to see at the Hound Show on Saturday. Pointers had a very fairish dog in Honkawa, son of Lord Bang, who did not show up in the novice class, but did better after, scoring Winners. Most of the others were lacking in head properties and bad in form. The bitches, Maxim's Venus and Bernice Winners, in their classes clearly outclassed the rest, Winners having a capital body and style.

There was nothing much in English Setters, just card dogs, but in Irish, always strong here, we met something better, though not on a par with several years ago. Quality and type told, and this was found in two or three of the Walters breeding, such as Royal Duke, a good-headed dog, and Radiant King, out of St. Lambert's Molly, by Royal Grand, an old figure at these shows, the latter, now owned by that good fancier, John F. Campbell, was absent. The puppy bitch showed the best type, head and

color, and Ch. St. L. Kathleen, owned by Miss Phillips, won easily enough and then beautifully shown took the special for best Pointer or Setter after a struggle with Bernice. Gordons were poor.

There was nothing in Cockers to enthrall over. Along would come a just ordinary well found Cocker, but lacking in quality, and winners in black dogs was withheld. The puppy Rusty missed the first two classes, but his good body, very fair head and color, and good legs, placed him at the top when he appeared, and he went to winners, scoring in rib and front over Red Pepper. Dummore Kennels brought two nice quality black bitches in puppies, and these proved the best all through. They came from Ottawa. In the reds a smart sort, moving well, in Cinderella, scored all through, beating Katie in muzzle and front and rib. The repetitions in these classes were simply bewildering.

The Dalmatians were pretty well spotted in some instances, but showed too much solid patch. We don't mind it on the ear, but object to it anywhere else.

Bull Terriers were an echo, as far as quality goes, to some of the exhibitions. There was nothing in the dogs to stir the wind; a fortunate one was given winners. In bitches there was more competition, but nothing of any real quality, such as we look for in Canada. The winners was a smart-headed bitch with best eye, a trifle wrinkled, but good body, and legs fair; second one of the down faced sort, with a hollow before the eyes, showing the exception to the plea that this formation makes for a better filling—it just depends where the Roman sits, methinks.

The Bostons were a big lot for Canada, the most we have ever come across, showing that the Boston breed is making inroads on the Canuckian fancy. In the novice, Mr. Mower, our Burlington friend,

showed a capital little dog. We don't know how it would fare in hot competition, but up there it had the easiest wins, and took winners, followed by another of much the same type, but not so smart in body or head. Then followed this and that one; some long faced, others short and bulky, but on the average a very fair collection for a new section, so to speak. In the bitches it was much more difficult to set the pace, as they really were of all sorts and conditions, but the smart trappy ones went to the front wherever found; there was a good deal of round high skull, and several with too deep a stop, which is a fault.

Airedales were about all from the famous Colne Kennels, that had a big row of them. Of course the best there were the famous Master and Mistress Royal. They are holding well, especially the latter, but she had been stripped and was bare and soft of coat, but her class put her ahead of a very nice bitch, albeit somewhat of a sturdier build than we like or rather are accustomed to see win, with a capital flat head of good length, and a good hard coat. In the dogs Master Royal scored, in very fair shape, beating easily in body and head the second, which was a very shapely puppy of excellent color. He is by Rock Descendant. Mr. Laurin showed two or three nice bitches in Chilperic and Betty and Alexandra, the latter light in flesh and muzzle. Beagles were mostly too long in body; the best scored in head and compactness.

The best eventually beat Blow, a capital coated one rather low set, and one of the Marland King breeding, which was reserve to the pup. In bitches they went a little smaller. A particularly nice one was third, Little Mary, but grey in plume. The winner is well coated and compact of form, with small ears; second is small, but off in coat. There were several others, but more or less flat in coat and long of ear and face. Mrs. Pitt showed a very fair little Jap, and a capital pug, but the Toy Spaniels were very so-so, the best skulled being Mrs. Pitt's Black and Tan. There were some nice small Italians, the winner, a fawn, quite good; the others were white and fawn, second losing only in the solid color we like.

REPORT ON BULLDOGS BY THE JUDGE.

Dogs, puppies—A good lot; winner is a compact white pied, nice short body, plenty of bone, well broken up face; second a light brindle, loses to winner in head, carries his ears sometimes a little high; third dark brindle, trifle high on leg, just a fair one. Novice—The winner is a heavyweight, about 60 lbs., big head and nose, might be more punched back, nice front, little lower to ground would improve him, very active, good mover, a great thing in a Bulldog, one of the old-fashioned sort, a regular, typical Bull; second and third repeats. 45 lbs. and over—first light fawn, massive head, black muzzle, good ears, nice depth from eye to ear, wide front, short body, rather flat-sided, take him all round, a Bulldog; second dark brindle, good head,

a shorter face would improve him, his shoulders might be better placed, nice roached back, wants rib, his hind action might be better. Open—The well-known Little Nipper, a compact, lightweight brindle, well broken up face, short body, a little larger nose would improve him, all round he is a nice little dog.

Bull bitches, puppies—Winner is a white, a good sort, with age should make her mark on the show bench; second loses to winner in head, but still a nice puppy. Novice—Here Mr. Thomas brought out a very nice dark brindle, light weight, good head, extra good turn up, nice body; remainder repeats.

Death of Champion Drumclaph Fairplay.

The lamented and untimely death of the great Irish Terrier, Champion Drumclaph Fairplay, during the Montreal Show, was one of those unfortunate incidents that go far to spoil the pleasure of the show. The dog was found dead in his stall soon after the judging, when he won all asked for, and at first poison was suspected. This suspicion was fortunately set at rest by the examination of the stomach by the city and provincial analyst, Mr. Milton L. Hersey, no trace of poison being detected.

Mr. William C. Finley, who has our sympathy in the loss of such a good one, takes the whole matter in a sportsmanlike way, as we should anticipate, and lays no blame on the shoulders of the officers of the M. C. A.

Mr. Finley writes us, enclosing letter from Mr. Hersey, which we append.

Montreal, May 29, 1907.

I herewith enclose you a copy of Mr. Milton Hersey's report in reference to my dog, "Fairplay," which died at the Montreal Show, and would ask you to publish it in your paper, as there has been so much talk about it.

I am extremely pleased to find that there has been no sign of poisoning, as it would be hard to realize that anyone

would be guilty of such an action.

Dear Sir,—We have carefully examined the stomach contents of the dog which died suddenly at the Montreal Dog Show, and which was received here on May 16. The investigation has been very carefully followed out, and we endeavored to detect the presence of poisons, but have been unable to find anything which

might have been the cause of the animal's death. We have tested very carefully for poisons which were at all likely to cause this sudden death, but with negative results.

SOME TIMELY ADVICE.

Compton, Que., May 25, 1907.

Will you, through the Gazette, ask breeders in general, when sending bitches to stud dogs, to send them in time, and not wait until they are just going off heat. I have had two bitches sent to my dogs in the last three weeks that were so far off heat when they reached here that they would not stand, with the result that the owners of the bitches are out the express charges and a litter of puppies, and I am out the stud fees.

Some people have a silly idea that they will get more dog pups if the bitch is bred near the end of the heat. This is all nonsense, as I think the following ought to prove: The first time I bred Glencoe Princess she was going off heat. She had eleven pups and only two dogs. The next time she came round I bred her the first day she would stand, and she had thirteen pups, ten of them dogs.

Newport Betty II. bred on sixth day of heat, had nine pups, six of them dogs, and my little red Cocker, Compton Baby, was bred to Knoydart Cornet as soon as she would stand, only one service, and had nine pups, all dogs. I could mention a great many more cases to show that I have always had better luck when I breed bitches just as soon as they will stand, and of course they are much more likely to prove in whelp.

I am always willing to keep a bitch for several days if she is not ready when she arrives.

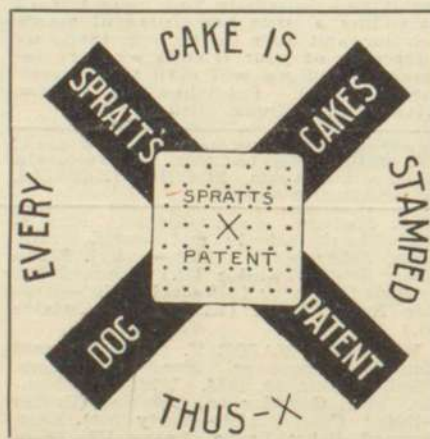
