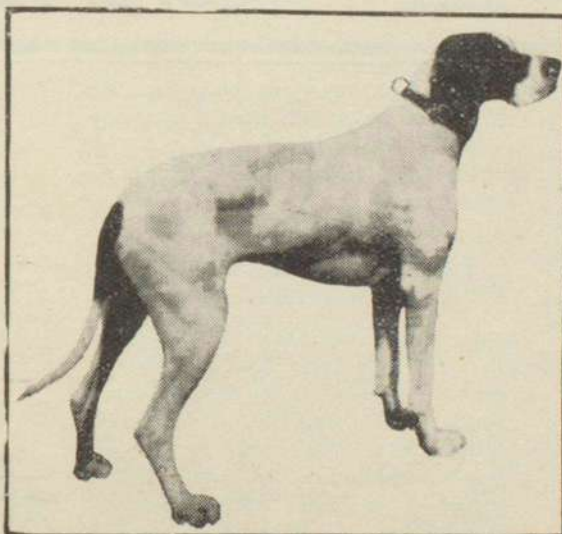

NOTES AND COMMENTS

Ottawa Show: The dates for the Ottawa Kennel Club's show are September 17th to 20th, and Mr. James Mortimer is to judge all classes. Mr. Mortimer needs no introduction from us; he is well known to all Canadian exhibitors, and those who show at Toronto will have the opportunity of getting his opinion of their dogs at the Capital. We are glad to know that the recent fire at Ottawa Exhibition grounds will not affect the dog show in the least, except favorably, as an increased number of visitors will likely result.

Liberal cash prizes will be offered and several cups that are unique.

Mr. George Tyrell, the Secretary, affords us additional information in the following letter:

"In reference to our show, we expect this year to have the best ever held in Ottawa, and have an extra large list of valuable cups, among them being one from His Excellency Earl Grey, valued at \$150, for the best in show other than Fox, Bull, or Black and Tan Terriers; also one from Sir F. W. Borden, Minister of Militia, for the best novice Wire-haired Fox Terrier. The premium list will be out about the 16th of August."

Ottawa has held manfully to the field, despite many drawbacks, and we shall be disappointed if an increase over last year's entry is not received by the Secretary. We have none too many shows in Canada, so that an organization that announces its "seventh annual show" is deserving of all the good things we can give them.

Toronto Dog Show: This issue of Gazette may reach exhibitors in time to remind them that entries for the Can-

adian National Exhibition close to-day, August 15th. The prospects for a record-breaking show were never brighter, and it looks as though several breeds that heretofore have been seen but in small numbers at Toronto would reach a record before unthought of for Canada. Stick a pin in this.

The management tell us that entries for the big dog show at the Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, in the second week of the show, extending from September 2nd to 6th, close with the Secretary, J. O. Orr, at the City Hall, Toronto, on Thursday, August 15th. As much as \$7,000 is given in prizes, cash and kind. There are 293 classes, covering nearly every species of canine. Besides some 300 specials, kindly donated by many specific breed societies and dog fanciers, the following amounts are given to the different breeds by the Association, which also provides some 300 medals:

Ch. Aldon Cadet Sold: Mr. A. A. Macdonald has sold the smooth Fox Terrier Champion Aldon Cadet to Mr. R. W. Harker, East Liverpool, Ohio. Mr. Harker has got a good, typical stamp of Terrier that should prove useful to him.

Young Cadets: Mr. Geo. W. Bailey, proprietor of Clapham Fox Terrier Kennels, Ottawa, announces that his smooth bitch, Aldon Trile, first in the puppy class at Ottawa, 1906, has just whelped a litter of five by Champion Aldon Cadet, three dogs and two bitches. Mr. Bailey has, he states, a smooth dog of the same breeding, whelped Feb. 2nd, 1907, that should make the best of them hustle at the coming shows.

David Taylor Dead: We were surprised the other day to learn of the recent death of Mr. David Taylor, Montreal, one of the old guard. "Davy" Taylor, as his familiars called him, had an all-round knowledge of dogs, and was able and ready to write pleasingly of them. With the sporting breeds he had more than a passing acquaintance, as might be surmised from his Scottish birth. He had a lengthy connection with the Montreal press and leaves many friends amongst newspaper men and others. Our own acquaintance with him

extended over many years, and we have many pleasant memories of his kindness during our visits to Montreal.

Poison: Mr. Jno. Bowden, Secretary of the Brantford Kennel Club, is again a victim of the poison fiend, his great Foxhound Champion Fairfax Bud being the victim. A good Greyhound and a Cocker Spaniel, the property of neighbors, went the same way. This is the second champion Mr. Bowden has lost by poison, the other being Champion Russell's Flossie.

Poms at Vineland: From Vineland Fruit Farm, Ontario, comes the news that Mrs. Wylie has arrived safe with the precious charges in her care—the Pomeranians she brought over for her new kennel on this side of the Atlantic. They comprise several of the best Poms which went to make up her kennel in Scotland,

and she is making arrangements to have them registered with both the Canadian Kennel Club and the American Kennel Club, that she may take up the exhibitions and repeat her successes on this continent that she had abroad.

The dogs comprise two black bitches, both dams of winners in the Old Country, one of them since arrival having given birth to two nice dog puppies to her own stud dog, Little Victor. It may be interesting to know that the small four-pound stud dog Little Victor is already well represented on this side of the Atlantic, he being the sire of the two fine importations by Mrs. Thorpe, Tam o' Shanter and Soutar Johnny.

Mrs. Wylie has also brought out a small black bitch by the same dog in Cairndhu Tot, which at the leading shows in Scotland and England has won premier honors, notably at the Scottish Kennel Club, when, ten months of age, she won

reserve championship; at Glasgow, first open; at Toy Dog Society, first puppy and second open; at North of England Pomeranian Show, third open, and altogether in three months winning over thirty prizes. Mr. Harold M. Morgan is proprietor, and our good friend, Mr. E. Bjorkland, is manager, is applying to the C. K. C. for registration of the prefix Stoneycroft and kennel name Stoneycroft Collie Kennels. The intention is to breed Collies extensively on the farm as a side line, the pick of Mr. Bjorkland's old strain being the basis. None but the best dogs will be used as sires.

Rats: This is the name of an imported Fox Terrier with a history, not the popular expletive. Mr. R. S. Anthony, of Vancouver, gives it to us. He says:

"Rats has quite a little history. She belongs to Mr. H. M. Cottingham, but is in my keeping. Candidly, I believe she was sent out here as being no good. She was bought from a prominent member of the London Fox Terrier Club, who secured her from another man to fill the bill. She had been mated once and failed; then she was mated to Dark Blue and sold to Mr. H. M. Cottingham in whelp (?) She failed again. She is a smart, handsome bitch, of the choicest of breeding, and took the bitches' classes at our last show. After failing to Dark Blue, she was mated to a local son of

St. Leger, and again missed. Then she came to my kennel, and we laid ourselves out for a mating about which there could be no doubt. We secured the services of a vet., who performed a trifling operation and immediately afterwards we gave her service. She caught on in good shape and is now heavy in whelp to Dartmouth. Dartmouth has a history, too. I bought a dog by Durham, from the vendor of Rats. He came out in rotten shape and died almost at once. Then I had a little dealing back east, paid my money, but got no dog. At a show about fifteen months ago I saw a pup for sale, with a

His son, Devon Dusky, has also a couple of firsts to his credit, and is better, I think, than his sire. He is producing good stock with much consistency, so you will agree was a pretty cheap investment.

"P.S.—Rats has now six beautiful puppies by Dartmouth, all dogs. My last litter, three weeks ago, by Dartmouth, consisted of six dogs and one bitch, six of whom are doing well."

He is but thirty-five minutes from Buffalo, and is very accessible for Canadian dogs, indeed, more so than he was when located at Vinemount.

London Dog Show: The prize lists for the show to be held in London in connection with the Western Fair are now ready, and copies may be had from the Secretary of the London Canine Association, Dr. F. L. Wood. The show is being held under the auspices and control of the L. C. A., of which the following are the officers:

The judges are too well known Can-

adians, Mr. James Lindsay, of Montreal, who will judge all Terriers; and Dr. C. Y. Ford, Kingston, who will take all dogs but the Terriers. The judging of these gentlemen is accepted with such favor that we need not comment further on it.

Entries close August 31st, and of course Canadian Kennel Club rules will govern. From the additional rules we see that no dog will be received before 6 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 9th, nor any after noon on the Tuesday following. The entry fee is \$1 for first entry of a dog and 50c for each subsequent entry of the same dog, a wise following of the Toronto procedure. All selling class dogs will be benched together. The duration of the show will be from 10 a.m. Tuesday to 4 p.m. Friday, the building being open daily from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. Judging will begin on Tuesday promptly at 2 p.m. We notice that, wisely, puppies may be removed after 10 p.m. on Wednesday, September 11th, if the classes in which they are entered have been judged.

The following is a novelty, and one that should take:

"A cash prize of \$25 is offered for the exhibitor or handler who wins most

points in the show, and a cash prize of \$15 for the one making second highest points. A first prize to count 10 points, a second prize 8 points, and a third prize 6 points."

The classification is a ribbon one, and is quite full, but so many cash specials of \$2, \$3 and \$4 are offered that the regular classification is almost duplicated. The cash, too, is quite impartially distributed.

The specials in kind are also very numerous and many are valuable. Amongst the most prominent we note:

The Russian Wolfhound Club of America, one club medal in bronze for the best Russian Wolfhound in the show, open to all.

The C. K. C. offer a bronze medal for best dog or bitch.

NEW ENGLISH SETTER STANDARD.

As adopted by the English Setter Club.

Head—(10). The form of the skull is an eminent characteristic. It should be long, with moderate dome with but little difference between the width of the base of the skull and the brows, and with a moderately defined occipital protuberance.

The brows should be at a sharp and decided angle from the muzzle.

The stop should be well defined and clean cut, with a slight furrow between the eyes.

The muzzle should be long, fairly square, of width in harmony with the skull, and without any fulness under the eyes.

The lips should not be too full or pendant.

Between the eyes and point of the nose the line of the muzzle should be straight; a dish face or Roman nose is objectionable.

The nose should be black or dark liver in color, except in white, lemon and white, orange and white, or liver and white dogs, when it may be of lighter color. The nostrils should be wide apart and large in the openings.

The jaws should be of equal length; an overshot or undershot jaw is objectionable.

The ears should be carried closely, hung well back and set low, of moderate length, slightly rounded at the ends; the leather thin and soft and clothed with silky hair.

As a whole, though avoiding extremes, the head should be light rather than heavy, clean cut and of length and size in harmony with the body.

Eyes—(4). The eyes should be bright, mild, intelligent, and of a dark brown color.

Neck—(4). The neck should be long and lean, arched at the crest, and not throaty.

Shoulders, Chest and Ribs—(14). The shoulders and chest should not be too heavy; they should be formed to admit perfect freedom of action to the fore legs.

The shoulder blades should be long, wide, sloping well back and standing moderately close together at the top.

The chest between the shoulder blades should be of good depth, but excessive width at this point is objectionable.

Back of the shoulders the ribs should spring gradually to the middle of the body and then gradually lessen to the back ribs, which should have good depth.

Back, Loin and Hips—(12). The back should be strong at its junction with the loin, sloping upward in a slight rise to the top of the shoulders, the whole forming a graceful outline of medium length; any sway or drop in the back is objectionable.

The loin should be strong, with moderate length, slightly arched, but not to the extent of being roached or wheel backed.

The hip bones should be wide apart and without too sudden droop to the root of the tail.

Fore Legs—(10). The arm should be flat, muscular, strong, with bone fully developed and with muscles hard and devoid of flabbiness; of good length from the point of the shoulder to the elbow; well let down at such angle as will bring the legs fairly under the dog.

The elbows should have no tendency to turn either in or out.

Hind Legs—(12). The hind legs should have wide, muscular thighs, with well developed lower thighs.

The stifles should be well bent and strong.

The hocks should be wide and flat; the cow hock is to be avoided.

The pasterns should be short, strong and nearly round, with the slope from the pastern joint to the foot deviating slightly from the perpendicular.

Feet—(6). The feet should be closely set and strong, pads well developed and tough, toes well arched and protected with short, thick hair.

They should point straight from rear to front.

Stern—(4). The stern should taper to a fine point, with only length enough

to reach the hocks, or less; the feather must be straight and silky, falling loosely in a fringe and tapering to the point when the tail is raised; there must be no bushiness whatever. It should curl sideways or above the level of the back.

Coat—(4). The coat should be flat and of moderate length, without curl; not too long or soft or woolly.

The feather on the legs should be thin and regular.

Weight, Size, Color and Markings—

(4). **Weight—Dogs.** about forty to fifty-five pounds. **Height—Dogs,** about twenty-two to twenty-three inches; **bitches,** twenty-one to twenty-two inches. **Colors—Black,** white and tan; black and white; blue belton; lemon and white; lemon belton; orange and white; orange belton; liver and white; liver belton, and solid white. **Markings—Dogs** without heavy patches of color on the body but flecked all over preferred.

Symmetry—(8). The harmony of all the parts is to be considered. Symmetrical dogs will be slightly higher at the shoulders than at the hips. The judge is specially directed to look for balance and harmony of proportion and an appearance of breeding and quality, and to avoid massiveness and coarseness.

Movement and Carriage—(8). An easy, free and graceful movement, suggesting rapidity and endurance.

A merry tail (whipping from side to side) and a high carriage of head.

Stiltiness, clumsiness or a lumbering gait are objectionable.
