NOTES AND COMMENTS

Col. McEwen's new Collie: One of the best additions to Collies in Canada and one that we predict will add to the reputation of his owner, Col. Robt. McEwen, of Byron, Ont., is the strikingly colored sable and white puppy Hollyrood Professor, that at the recent Toronto show captured every first he was eligible to compete for, winning first junior, first limit, first open, winners and four specials, including that offered for the best Collie in the show. He is a richly bred one, having for sire Parbold Professor, and for dam Tyneholme Ideal, a daughter of Ch. Parbold Piccolo. He is a nice model of the up-to-date Collie, possessing good clean-cut head, nicely placed dark eyes and bright lively carriage, those most necessary requisites to an impressive sire. This is a dog we can confidently recommend to breeders, and bespeak for him a liberal patronage.

Boston bits: Dr. D. C. King, of Peterboro, is very liberally offering \$20 in gold at the 1908 Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, and \$20 in gold at the next Ontario Kennel Club show, Toronto, both on Bostons. These prizes are put up for the best Boston, male or female, sired by any of the stud dogs owned by Dr. King, while inmates of his kennel.

Dr. King has made the following sales of Bostons: Two bitches to Mr. T. A. Clark, Peterboro; a bitch to Mr. A. W. Waterman, Peterboro; a bitch puppy to Mr. Loveking, Peterboro, and a dog to Mr. Fairbrother, Toronto. Little Egypt whelped, last month, a nice litter, all correctly marked, by Othello, and he expects his good bitch Etauda to whelp to same sire on October 20th. It is interesting to know that Dr. King has received so many enquiries for Boston

puppies that he cannot supply the demand. Amongst other points that his advertisement in the Canadian Kennel Gazette has brought enquiries from are, Tampa, Florida; Fernie, B.C.; Rochester, N.Y.; Cleveland, Ohio; Ottawa, Whitby, London and Toronto, Ont.

Napanee to Kingston: Mrs. Cartwright's Bulldogs are now charmingly located near Kingston, Ont. Glen Lawrence is on the St. Lawrence, and about two and a half miles outside the city. Mrs. Cartwright has been greatly disappointed in the bitch that was supposed to be in whelp to Stone Lion. No puppies resulted and the bitch has been quite sick, but is now much better. "Better luck next time."

New Brunswick for the C. K. C.: It is with great pleasure that we are able to say that the next show of the New Brunswick Kennel Club will be held under C. K. C. rules. The show will be held in Saint John, the dates claimed being November 12th, 13th and 14th.

St. John has already held several successful local shows under the guidance of Mr. J. Verner McLellan, secretary-treasurer of the N.B.K.C., and the management think that this should be an auspicious time to launch a full-fledged dog show under C.K.C. rules. We bespeak for them a healthy entry, especially from Montreal and the East, and hope that the encouragement they will receive will enable them to continue the show on an enlarged scale. It will be a ribbon show, but many specials will be put up and, of course, the one or two points gained will count towards championship honors.

year ending October 1st, 1908: Col. Jas. Blaine, Honorary President; Dr. George A. Hetherington, President; Heber Vroom, First Vice-president; Thomas McCullough, Second Vice-president; J. V. McLellan, Secretary-Treasurer. Executive Committee—LeBaron Wilson (Chairman), Walter Carnell, Henry T. Bailey, Alexander McMillan and Alexander H. Campbell.

The constitution and by-laws of the club have been printed in neat and handy form, Article 1 of constitution reading: "This organization shall be known as the New Brunswick Kennel Club, and shall be affiliated with the Canadian Kennel Club." Good!

King Reginald: Mr. Emil Kiewert, Toronto, is gratified on having the pedigree of his imported red Dachshund, King Reginald, C. 9332, to find that the dog's genealogical tree extends back for twenty generations, some sixty years, and no less than twenty-five champions appear in it. He is by Remus, ex. Esmerelda, and has sired two litters since his arrival in Canada. Mr. Kiewert intends to try the dog further afield and will likely show him at some of the spring shows in the U. S.

A New Fox Terrier: Mr. Thomas Moore, of Montreal, has imported the Fox Terrier bitch Manton Lady, in whelp to Champion Briar Sportsman. Her daughter by Raby Gamecock, a son of Briar Sportsman, produced Manton Matader, said to be the best puppy brought out in 1907, and is the winner of twenty prizes at thirteen months old. Manton Lady is the dam of six prominent winners in England, and is a nice short backed Terrier with extra good head and coat. She should greatly benefit the already famous Donnington Kennel of wires.

Stone Lion to Rochester: Mr. Edwin Garner, Toronto, has sold his recently imported Bulldog, Stone Lion, to Mr. Singleton, Rochester, N.Y. To take Lion's place, Mr. Garner is already negotiating for another dog, in England, this time a "flier." He is fifteen months old and in five weeks in August and September won over twenty prizes. He has beaten many good dogs, including his sire, Champion Royal Stone, and at Hesham got the special for best dog in the show of any breed.

Toronto five points: The number of dogs actually benched at Toronto was six hundred and sixty-one, so that the show will count five points towards championships. The necessary certificate to enable the C.K.C. Secretary to make this official announcement was not received in time for last issue.

New Westminster C.K.C., too: On October first we received word that the show in New Westminster, October 2nd to 4th, would be held under C.K.C. rules. Too short notice, we regret, to enable us to be of any service to the show, which we trust proved successful. The intention was to hold it in connection with the Agricultural Association.

Irish at Toronto: Mr. Jas. Lindsay, the judge of Irish Terriers at Toronto, was not greatly impressed with the quality of the specimens that came before him. With the exception of one young dog and the Montreal bitches, he thought they were very moderate. He also says that but for the shocking condition in which some of them were put down that they would have done better.

Mr. Carriere's new Black and Tan: Faultless Ch. Selwonk Imperial, is the

lengthy and rather peculiar name given by Mr. C. D. Carriere, Ottawa, to his new Black and Tan Terrier. He was whelped in 1901, is by General, by Ch. Jeddah, out of Duchess, by Ch. Sir Alfred, ex. Benham Clytie. He is a quality dog of nice size. He is the sire of the winners at Toronto this year, and we wish this good dog under a new name much success.

Fusilier dead: We regret to learn through Mr. Wrightson Thorp that that good wire Fox Terrier, Fusilier, was so badly hurt by a street car that it became necessary to chloroform him. Fusilier was bred by Mr. Arthur Atkinson, passed through Mr. Fraser's hands, and was latterly owned by Mr. A. D. Armour, Toronto, a true sportsman, whose loss we greatly regret. In Mr. Thorp's opinion—and we agree with him—Fusilier (late Oxspring Billy), was one of the best wires in America. He possessed a short, compact body, sound legs and feet, an excellent head, and a pin wire coat.

An Airedale Club: We understand that an Airedale Club for Canada is now an accomplished fact though particulars have not yet reached us. Too many specialty clubs that Canada has given birth to heretofore went to pieces from simple neglect and a lack of enthusiasm, or, worse still, the wire pulling of selfish and interested members. If conducted on broad minded principles there is a big future for the Airedale Club. The breed that gives it name is growing rapidly into popular favor and is a dog entirely suited to Canadian climate and conditions. Here's luck!

Oakville show: An Open air dog show was one of the features of the Oakville Fall Fair, held last month. The dogs,

quite a respectable entry too, were tied up to the fence and posts, and were judged by Mr. W. P. Fraser, Toronto. The show was quite informal, but proved such an attraction that a more pretentious C.K.C. show is mooted for next year. Oakville is a beautiful little lakeside place and lying as it does between such doggy centres as Toronto and Hamilton should draw extensively from both these cities, especially if the show, as it was this year, be limited to one day.

While the quality of the dogs shown was not high taken all round, there was a fair Collie or two, a nice stamp of Fox Terrier shown by the Stoneleigh Kennels, and a good brace of Bostons by Mr. R. S. Wilson.

New Airedales: Mr. Rand, of Toronto, has imported the crack Airedale, Ravensdale Rose, a winner of many prizes in England. Canada is running strong in this hardy breed, and this augurs a good outlook for the new club.

Airedale Club: Since writing paragraph re this club, particulars of the preliminary meeting have reached us. The meeting was held on October 7th in Toronto, a good round dozen Airedale breeders being present. The name decided on is the Airedale Terrier Club of Canada and the annual meeting will be held yearly on the third day of the Canadian National show, Toronto. A number of good specials have already been promised and the affairs of the new club are in the hands of men able and ready to push them. The standard of the English Airedale Terrier Club will be adopted without change.

DR. FORD'S CLASSES AT TORONTO.

Spainels, other than Cockers, were a short story, as usual, the Clumber and Field not meeting with general favor and just enough of those useful dogs, the Irish Water Spaniel, to give one an idea what the true type really is. This year that good fancier, the Rev. T. Moore Smith, sent on his crack Ch. Erin's Dr. Terry, well shown in rare condition, by Mr. Armstrong. This dog takes one's memory back to the days when Mr. T. A. Carson's wonderful Ch. Marguerite was queen of all sporting Spaniels. He is brimfull of quality, with a head and top knot of much merit, and the dark brown eye so hard to get in this breed, where light eyes are a common failing. His neck, shoulders and fore legs, body and stern are A1. His coat is correct in color and texture, and he is a good mover. For work he lacks substance and stamina, but judging dogs on the bench was the order of the day. Mr. T. A. Carson came second with his good bitch Nora McShaine, who was nearing her maternal duties and naturally not up to the fine form she is usually shown in. As a worker we would much prefer her to the dog. Barney, who was credited in some of the kennel papers as having won, is a very bad specimen, and was rapidly eliminated from the ring.

St. Bernards—Exorbitant express charges seem to have just about robbed most shows of this historic breed. Of those shown, Mr. Stephens' rough puppy Agawa Duke, has a fairly massive head but lacks expression. He is of good size and has immense bone. Mr. McMurrich's Dundas Jess is of good size with the correct markings and shadings. Her head is rather weak. The best of all was Mr. Kenyon's Lucerne of Parkdale, a really good one hailing from the Alta Kennels. She has both size and quality and is a very typical specimen. The only smooth, King Lear of Parkdale, has a good head, but is very bad behind.

Newfoundlands, as usual, were merely black dogs of doubtful breeding, and first prize was withheld.

Great Danes—Thanks to Dr. Irving Johnson's good brace of fawns the quality was saved. His Rex Gloria—a Muss Arnolt importation, I believe—has a good head and neck and moves well. He is a bit shelly in body. His kennel companion, Signa, is of immense

size, and has quality as well. A very nice brindle puppy, named Tiger, easily headed a rather large class. He is a big sound youngster and likely to be heard from again.

Scottish Deerhounds had an unusually good entry in which Mr. Stephen's Bruce, whose better size, neck, shoulders and hindquarters put him over Mr. Harvey's Caesar. The latter gentleman showed a kennel their failing being lack of size.

Dalmatians—As usual there was a good turn out of this now popular breed that was in danger of only being remembered by their being depicted in old sporting prints. The principal point is that of markings, the spots being taken into consideration by their evenness of distribution and highly prized when found on the ears and tail. The Dalmatian must have a good nose and good legs and feet, together with a well knit body and plenty of room for a stout heart and good lungs, for be it known his vocation is to gamely face the storm of stones and dust that fly from the horses' heels, for a well trained coach-dog is always found well under the vehicle. Of those entered the best was Mr. George Pepper's Prinnie, an unusually good one and an ornament to his master's stable of show horses. Mrs. Martin's Lansdowne Lady Peggy is well marked, but not as well ribbed up as the dog. The remainder were quite good.

Dachshunds seem to have taken a new lease of life, and were well represented. Mr. Sid Saunders of Guelph who only fancies the best procurable, has again joined the ranks of exhibitors, and showed a wonderful specimen in Rote Hexe Forst, a champion in Germany and Austria. She has great quality

throughout, a long body and stern that is faultless. She is a sound one and in faultless condition. Mrs. Hutchinson's Lady Pump Kikle is another good one. Mr. Kalbfisch's Waldine III. is a very typical black and tan with a good head, body and stern, and in rare condition. Of the remainder Miss Rodi and Crook S. are both good. The others were mostly too big and too coarse and far removed from the German standard.

Bedlington Terriers—Toronto can always muster the biggest classes in America, and this year found more than ever, thanks to Mr. John Kenyon's importations. With such an enthusiastic and plucky fancier as Mrs. Theodore Coleman, the breed will never be neglected. The winner, Crouner, is a pale mustard dog with a long head and powerful jaw, but was not in good shape. Mrs. Coleman's good blue Playboy would have won but refused to show. Mr. Kenyon was successful in the open class with another good one in Hazlington Dark Blue. The others lacked the quality of the winners.

Toys were big classes for Toronto. Pomeranians and Yorkshires having record entries. The former breed is going ahead in leaps and bounds, and with Mrs. A. A. Macdonald, Mrs. W. Wylie—just over from Scotland—Mrs. O'Rourke and Dr. Foster, we may look for lively competition. In puppies Mrs. Macdonald introduced a lovely mite in Redcroft Ouida, a daughter of Ch. Redcroft Darkie's. She is a black of tiny size, less than three pounds, short body and typical head and ears. She is as sound as a Terrier and full of the much desired Pom style. At present she is a bit short of coat. Bar accident, she must attain championship honors in a short time. In the adult class for bitches, Mrs. Wylie

had the winner in Kirndee Tot. This is a wonderful little bitch with a splendid stand-off coat, a sound black in color. Her head, expression and body are of the best, and we know of no adult bitch in America to beat her at present. Dr. Foster showed a nice little sable in Funny Fanny, who should breed well. The best dog was the same owner's Berwyn Mite, a grand little black dog with the right sort of coat, both in quantity and quality. He showed well and is a hard dog to beat. Mrs. Macdonald's Carl of Hanley, just off the ship, is another good black, but not in full coat. He was sold for a big price. In the class for those of more weight, a wonderful coated chocolate, Pipi, won, though close pressed by Mrs Macdonald's stylish and typical Redcroft Dinah, who lost in coat only.

Yorkshire Terriers—There were extraordinarily large classes and seem to be again in public favor. With such a man as Mr. Frank Score taking up the tancy in earnest, we may, another year, expect to see him with a strong kennel. The best dog was Mr. Band's Prince, who won well in coat, head and ears. Mrs. Worr's Silver Tip, another good

one, loses in tan. Mr. Score's Sandow has correct tan and color, but was not in good coat. Of the bitches Minnie was the best in size and color, though Mr. Score has a good one in Peggy.

Toy Spaniels were also good classes. Miss Metcalfe's Breakwater Fairy is a rare little Blenheim. Messenger Boy,

from the same kennel, is another good one. Mrs. Best as usual had a good entry of King Charles.

Pugs—Mrs. Pitt has a rare little dog in Osborne Punch but he had a good one to beat in May Queen. The best Toy Terrier was Mr. Dickert's Busy Hussy. C. Y. Ford.

Collies at Toronto.

With such an excellent judge as Mr. W. Ormiston Roy, who made his initial appearance in a judicial capacity at Toronto, it was hard to account for the paucity of entries that greeted him. From Montreal alone there should have been quite as many as were in the entire show of Collies. A big classification and very liberal prize money alone should have tempted the canny Scots of Eastern City. Still the gathering was representative of those fanciers who year after year support the great Industrial Fair. The dog puppies were not an inspiring lot, the best being two young to do themselves justice. Mr. Harry Willis' Lord Braemir has good quality and fair size, and was also successful in the novice

class. The limit and open classes brought out a new one in Col. McEwen's Holyrood Professor, a son of Parbold Professor, and bred by the well known English breeder, Mr. Hugo Ainscough. This is a large sized pale sable with white markings. He owns a most typical head and a small crafty eye which gives him the true Collie expression. His ears are small and a trifle too highly carried. His body is of good length and he impresses one as a dog who could gallop all day and not weary. He is only ten months old but at present carries a fair coat. We congratulate Col. McEwen, who has been breeding and showing Collies longer than any man in America, on being the possessor of so typical a

Collie. Mr. Wheeler was second with Edgbaston Dandy, looking well. His rich sable color, harsh top coat and true undercoat are rarely seen in the modern Collie. Oehill Chief, a big tricolor, rapidly shedding his coat, is very ordinary in head, but has perfect ears. Those that followed are not likely to play an important role in Collie history. Bitch puppies were better than the dogs. Mrs. F. A. Metcalfe won with her tricolor Waldon Violet, a very sweet bitch with a long level head and good ears. With more size and better fore legs she would be hard to beat. Otterburn Opulence, second, is rather immature. The best were to be found

in the limit and open classes, where Oehill Surprise, a dark sable with a long, but rather strong, head and good ears, won. She has good legs and feet, coat and size. Mr. Joseph Reid came to the fore with his slashing big tricolor Janet of Rosemount. This is a sound bitch with a long head and good ears. With more quality she could win in any company. Otterburn Constance, a daughter of Wishaw Leader, came home first in the limit class. The stud dog prize went to Otterburn Ornament, who with Otterburn Ornate, Otterburn Opulence and Otterburn Constance won the kennel prize.

"Bull Terriers at Toronto."

Referring to Mr. Clair Foster's write-up, or tale, in Canadian Kennel Gazette on Bull Terriers at Toronto. Mr. Foster knows that I breed Bull Terriers, I don't make them with a pencil on paper. He is still harping on the Roman nosed, short underjaw, so-called down-faced type of a Bull Terrier.

Mr Foster accuses me of deserting my guns, and would try to convince people that I am breeding a strain of dish-faced Bull Terriers. Now I think I still have my hand on the job when I have bred such dogs as Champion Haymarket Blazer, Champion Edgewood Battle, Champion Faultless of the Point, Rudyard Kipling, Champion Ajax of the Point, and the dam of the winning puppy at Toronto, and my latest effort is Epsom Modesty, the winner at Ottawa in the puppy, novice and limit classes, in the largest classes of Bull Terriers in the world.

Now I would like to ask Mr. Foster a question. Was it not Ch. Ajax of the Point and Ch. Faultless of the Point, both of which I bred, that made him

prominent as an exhibitor of Bull Terriers, or was it the big dog with three-cornered eyes, that he keeps at home, and tells people about?

He heads the article he writes by stating that Ch. Marguerite of Navarre and Ch. Princeton Monarch, were probably two of the best Bull Terriers that

ever lived. Now ask anybody that ever saw these dogs if they were Roman-nosed, down-faced, or were Old Ch. Faultless, Ch. Edgewood Candidate, Ch. Edgewood Crystal, Ch. Lady Fleetwood, and other good Bull Terriers too numerous to mention.

It is too bad we are not all of the quiet, unassuming disposition that Mr. Foster admires so much in the Canadian exhibitor (but like the old proverb "Still water runs deep.") We hope yet to see Mr. Foster in the role of an exhibitor getting his medicine from an amateur judge.

Now, as a personal friend, I like Mr. Foster well, and will always try to be ready for friendly competition in the show ring with dogs that he may breed himself, under any good professional judge.

This is the first letter I ever wrote on a subject like this, and will likely be my last, as it is out of my line of business.

The London Show.

DR. FORD'S CLASSES.

After many fruitless efforts to hold a show in this historic—from a canine standpoint—city, the London Canine Association, comprised of men in the very first rank in business, society and the professions, managed to soften the callous hearts of the directors of the Western Fair Association. Led by such a gallant warrior as Col. Robert McEwen, the victory was complete, and the spoils that resulted therefrom make even the most doubting and frowning director smile with pleasure, and confess that the dog show was the most successful and paying attraction in the grounds. It is not often that a throng of people stand in the rain waiting for their turn to get into the dog show building, but such was the case in London. The building was altogether inadequate to the demands put upon it, and some forty entries had to be returned. The management was quite the best we remember seeing. The show was kept immaculate and the prize cards tacked up as soon as class was judged. When the history of dog shows in America is written London will be spoken of almost before New York. If we are correctly informed, it was here that Mr. James Mortimer, in 1883, made his debut as

judge. Here it was that Mr. Charles H. Mason showed his famous variety team of English celebrities—the first dogs to show class that were imported from England for show purposes. In those days his friend and constant companion was Mr. H. W. Lacy. This show was a great success and many others followed. Dr. J. S. Niven, of London, still actively interested and as keen a sportsman as ever, was the first man to introduce our modern show Cocker and Irish Terrier and had the honor of judging all but a few breeds at the New York show of '81. Many a good story is told by the doctor of those early days when dog politics were unknown and the true fancier's spirit prevailed. Mr. Richard Gibson, who for many years was a leading ex-

hibitor of smooth Fox Terriers, has a beautiful old place a few miles from London, and it was our very great privilege to sit down at his hospitable board and hear of the good old days, in company with Dr. Niven, Mr. James Lindsay and Mr. A. H. M. Graydon. The latter gentleman is the possessor of a fine kennel of field trial English Setters and is a crack shot. He was omnipresent at the show, and his courtesy and unerring kindness to all made the week pass off with great pleasure. Dr. F. P. Drake, who has lately joined the Fox Terrier ranks, and owns a strong kennel, is a gentleman whose influence must be for good in the fancy. His dinner party at the London Hunt Club was one of the pleasant features of the show.

Dr. F. L. Wood, the secretary-treasurer, ably assisted by a charming young lady, might well be copied by many a show official for his promptness and courtesy. Capt. Smith, Dr. Tillman, Dr. Smith and Messrs. McCarroll, Saunders, Thomas and Oke took an active interest in the show, and exhibitors and judges owe them a debt of gratitude. With these gentlemen at the helm and the many good fanciers in and about London, we may look for many successful shows in years to come. With a few more shows at this season of the year, a strong and attractive circuit could easily be formed, beginning with the big show at Toronto. Without shows the fancy lags and apathy exists. There is no reason why every fair in the country should not give a few classes for dogs, one day being quite

Bloodhounds had two representative specimens from the kennels of Mr. Harvey. Pitmilly Orlando, a fine large dog scored well in length of skull and wrinkle over Mount Vernon Dainty, a grand bodied dog. St. Bernards—The only one of merit was King Lear of Parkdale, who was at Toronto. Great Danes—A good entry, of which the mouse colored Imperator had most quality and splendid neck, shoulders, legs and feet. He was well shown by his owner Mrs. George Langley. Wolfhounds—Mr. Morris' Buster O'Valley Farm, though thin and not moving well, easily won by his superior quality throughout. Peter the Great, 2nd, is a big dog lacking quality. more Fatal, Glenmore Pasture and Glenmore Tulip. The first scored well in condition, legs and feet. All are fit to win in any company.

Pointers—In the days of poor Tom Davey London was a stronghold for this breed and evidences of the good blood left behind are still to be seen. The best was Lady Simcoe, a bitch with a wonderful head, well ribbed body and sound legs and feet. Highland Bessie 2nd has lots of style and quality, and looks a worker. Lad of Hawk, a good sound Pointer, easily headed the dog division.

English Setters—These were well filled classes, thanks to Mr. Graydon's entries. His Newcastle Rose a lemon and white, of good quality, but grossly fat, won well till she met Mr. Bowman's Queen Kent, a beautiful blue belton in rare form. Irish Setters—Miss Phillips' good brace, all the way from Mt. Kisco, N.Y., Royal Duke and St. Lambert's Eileen, were one of the attractions of the show. easy winner. With a sounder mouth he would trouble the best. Mira, a beautiful little black bitch, again won for Mr. Dunn, as did the good black and tan Spotless, who eventually won for best in show. Mr. John Tomlinson has a strong lot of reds just now, and with Wonder, Standard II., Lady Hunter, Bemey and Palace Queen, won a lot of prizes.

Beagles—In these classes the prizes went mostly to Smith Bros., of Guelph, who again scored with Zondler, always a good one, and who must now be almost a champion, and deservedly so. The team was made up of Wee Melody, Smith's Busy and Lady Fidget, all good heads.

Dachshunds—Mr. Sid Saunders continued his winning career, bringing out a rare youngster whose name I don't find in the catalogue, but one to be remembered. He is perfectly sound with a wonderful body and hindquarters. Daisy S., from the same kennel, made a good second.

Holyrood Meek and Duke are dogs of good type. Bitch puppies were also good, and a popular win was made by Walden Primrose, who owns a sweet head and ears. She would be hard to beat had she better fore legs and more size. It is a pleasure to see Mr. Metcalfe, who has stuck to Collies for a number of years, being at last rewarded for his patience. Coila Kennels came second with Coila, a slashing big bitch with a heavy coat, but a plain head. Sparkle, shown by Mr. D. Thody, is of nice quality, and was well up in third place. Novice and limit went to another of Mr. Thody's nominations, Rody Burch, a sable and white, with the right sort of coat, and good legs and feet. Her head is above the average and her ears small. Open bitches brought out Mr. Roy's Coila Dawtie, a tricolor. She is very typical, with a neat head and perfect ears. Her faults are a rather full eye and fore legs that are not straight. At present there is a rage for head and ears to such an extent that legs and feet and general soundness are ignored. Surely a Sheepdog ought to be a sound dog.

The Toy dogs were not numerous, but

quite representative. In Poms the battle lay between Mrs. Macdonald's tiny Redcroft Ouida and Dr. Foster's very neat little Berwyn Mite, who did not do himself justice. However the former beats him handsomely in size, head, ears and expression and general soundness, only losing in coat, which is at present only what one might expect in a puppy. The best Yorkshire was Mr. Thorp's Little Dandy, a dog of high quality and excellent color, but a bit leggy. Mr. Kenyon's Haslingden Pee Wee is very small and will be heard from later on. Toy Spaniels had nine entries, the best being a typical Elenheim—Mr. Oke's Marjory—nice size, failing a bit in shortness of face. Pugs had that rare little chap, Osborne Punch, winning a well deserved first.

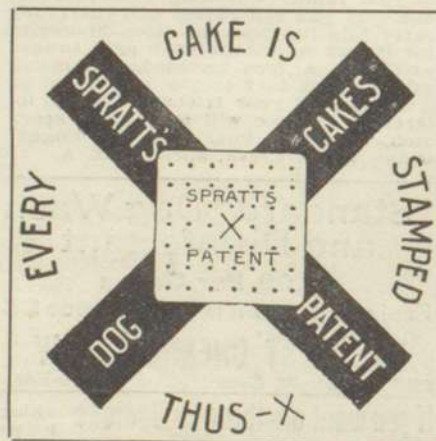
