but he looks 50 per cent. better now, and if he shows as he can do, he will go up to the top again.

You will no doubt see the Vancouver premium list ere this, and I think you will agree that the effort is very creditable. If one compares it with those of the big cities of Portland, Ore., and Seattle, Wash., it is a not-

able achievement, but then theirs is a very unattractive affair, and yet Portland people are wondering why we don't travel 700 miles to show our dogs! If the win counted one might go in spite of any other lack of inducement.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

Toronto Kennel Club Show: The Toronto Kennel Club will hold a one-day show on July 1st under C. K. C. rules. The show will be held under a large tent, to be erected on the grounds of the Technical School on College St., the judging to begin promptly at 10 a.m. Mr. F. W. Jacobi, who has piloted so many dog shows to the safe haven of success, will superintend, and this means that the show will be well run.

A one-day show in Canada, under recognized rules, is an innovation that is being looked forward to with a great deal of interest, and the success that this show will undoubtedly prove will, we hope, open the avenue for many similar shows in other places.

Canadian National Show: Mr. Jacobi will also manage the Canadian National, Toronto, this autumn, and he and the committee are already at work on preliminaries on the "best and biggest" yet held. The list has been still further extended and many well known specialists have been invited to participate in the judging. Without mentioning names, we may state that specialist judging will be a feature of the show.

An Ottawa Blenheim: Mrs. F. C. McLean, of Hull, has just imported from Glasgow, Scotland, a high class Blenheim Toy Spaniel. This is the only one of the breed in this district and is considered a first-class show specimen. Through a mishap to the steamer the wee mite was two and a half weeks in transit, but in spite of this landed in the best of condition.

This is another evidence of the growing popularity of the toy breeds in Canada.

Montreal Show: As entries close on May 16th, this notice will, we fear, do nothing to add to the entry at the show of the Montreal Canine Association, to be held on May 26th, 27th and 28th, under C. K. C. rules.

Bulldogs are favored with a specialist judge, and one who well knows the breed, Mr. Samuel Longmore, of London, England. Mr. James Wat-

son, of Hackensack, N.J., takes Irish Terriers, Bostons, Fox Terriers, Airedale Terriers and Collies, and Mr. Chas. H. Mason, New York, all other breeds.

Toys, as is unfortunately the case at most shows, will not be left until the last, but will be judged on the first day, a procedure that we hope to see followed by other show committees.

Mr. James R. Innes, as noted a month or two back, will again superintend, and we know from experience what a capital place the Victoria Rink is for a dog show.

The show is a ribbon show, but the many specials offered, varying from cups to biscuits, will help draw the entry.

From St. Bernard to Pom.: Miss A. Burns, of Montreal, reports the death of the St. Bernard, Lady Juno, after an illness of some time. Lady Juno was the winner of several prizes, including the medal at Ottawa three years ago, and Miss Burns feels the loss of her seven years companionship keenly. However, a tiny Pom. of the most aristocratic lineage helps to make up for the loss of the larger dog. This recent purchase is a six months old black puppy that will probably be shown in Montreal this month.

Calgary Show: Mr. James Cole, of Kansas City, Mo., will judge all classes at the show of the Alberta Kennel Club, to be held in Calgary on July 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th. This is the fourth annual show of the Alberta Kennel Club, and added prestige will be lent to this year's gathering owing to the fact that the Dominion Exhibition will be held in Calgary this year, and the dog show is being held in connection with the Exhibition. Mr. Geo. A. Hull, the secretary, will no doubt give us full details for next issue.

Aldon Trifle: Geo. W. Bailey, Clapton Kennels, Ottawa, has bred the winning smooth bitch, Aldon Trifle, to Warren Remedv's great sire, Ch. Sabine Resist. Trifle is by Ch. Tipster

out of Ch. Diversion, and is a young bitch of great quality. Mated to Resist, she should give the young owner something worth while.

Winnipeg Show: Dr. Bell takes the bull by the horns this year and guarantees at least three points, with a possibility of four, so that he must have confidence in the owners and breeders of the west to manfully support him.

The dog building has been enlarged by taking in some three thousand square feet extra, and two hundred additional wire divisions have been ordered.

The dates of the show are July 14th, 15th and 16th, and Mr. James Cole, of Kansas City, Mo., will judge all classes. Write Dr. Bell for a prize list.

Lamented: The death by his own hand, of Montague Smith, Forest, Ont., will be sincerely regretted by many of the older dog lovers, who knew him years ago as a votary of the English Setter. A lover of clean sport, a gentleman by both breeding and instinct, his end is a sad commentary on the futility of political strife.

T. K. C. Show: Mr. W. P. Fraser judged the Irish and Fox Terriers at the last little club show of the Toronto Kennel Club. This is a feature that is making the old T. K. C. more and more popular and is a reminder of what the Club did in its palmy days.

Mr. Fraser's placings were as follows: Fox Terriers, smooth, dogs—1, Walter Sand's, Broadway Double; 2, A. A. Macdonald's Aldon Orion; 3, A. D. Armour's Beppo. Bitches—1, A. Greenwood's Bradford Beauty. Wire dogs—1, T. Harlowe's Rolliston Star. Irish Terriers, dogs—1, Frank Britton's Crowgill Michael; 2, W. C. Browne's Crowgill Shandon; 3, A. D. Armour's Muddler Mixer. Bitches—1, Frank Britton's Crowgill Princess; 2, W. C. Browne's Crowgill Countess. The members are all on the qui vive about the Dominion Day show, as being held under C. K. C. rules all wins will count.

Whoever had this in charge must have blundered badly. Can you suggest any way out of the difficulty? I enclose copy of the rules as they should be. Amongst the most serious mistakes are the following:—Rule II. Listing is given as costing twenty cents. Rule 15, (1) The end of the first paragraph has been omitted. Rule 15, (2) The word "first" has been left out before the word prize. Rule 15, (3) The word "four" is left out before the word first, and so on. This is a matter that should be attended to immediately.

Consequently, Acadian Nellie, having beaten Toots N. in one of the classes, is naturally placed ahead of her in the winners. There is no judging in this case, previous records stand—that is, a judge may not reverse a previous decision when it comes to the winners class, though he is allowed to do so in any other class. Dear Sir,—The Victoria Kennel Club are going to offer cash prizes at their next dog show, April 1 to 4, but as I interpret the rules we will have to get special permission from you to give them. The idea is to offer cash prizes of \$3, \$2 and \$1 for prizes with a class of 5 entries, or \$3, \$2, with a class of 4 entries. It is impossible for the Club to offer these prizes without the above limit to the entries, as they would not be in a position to pay them; but with the provision as mentioned above it would be feasible and a popular move, as in the case of the club while under the old Western Kennel League rules. It would also increase the entries and make the show more popular. You will quite understand the necessity for the above provision when I state that we get practically no gate receipts, last year's being only \$135, and the whole expenses have to be met by the exhibitors. Under these conditions we would ask as a favor that you grant our request (if it conflicts with the rules) and send us an immediate answer.

Dear Powell,—Yours of yesterday duly to hand and contents noted. In reply to same will say that I am both hurt and surprised that the advisory board do not understand Western conditions better, as we know that it is absolutely impossible to give cash prizes indiscriminately on the coast without some restrictions on them. The present C. K. C. rule is absolutely unworkable out here and I thought the committee of which you have the

honor to be secretary, would see it in that light and sanction our wishes in the matter. Under these conditions I would strongly advise that your committee reconsider its decision, and let me have an immediate answer. Our club wishes to give these prizes as they did under the old rules, and if the C. K. C., through your committee, do not grant the request, which is a reasonable one, I am afraid it will be disastrous to the interests of the C. K. C. in the future, at least in Victoria. Personally, I assure you that in the interests of the dogs and the fanciers in the future I shall myself advocate that our club holds future shows under other rules, and if we cannot then work to the advantage of the dogs and exhibitors, then under rules of our own.

Dear Sir,—Yours of the 25th inst. received, and am very much surprised,

as you have only yourself to blame in the matter. You went over the heads of the advisory board and applied to the C. K. C. direct. They referred your letter to me, at the same time issuing the order that permission could not be granted. Under these circumstances we are powerless to do anything.

You state that "I thought the committee of which you have the honor to be secretary would see it in that light, and sanction our wishes in the matter." I can only reply that you never gave the committee an opportunity to do so.

It seems strange that in view of the stand you took last fall, as secretary of the P. A. B., when Mr. Welsh, on behalf of the Fox Terrier Club, applied direct to Mr. Donovan for dates, that you should now do the same thing and go directly over our heads; and further still, that after applying direct to the C. K. C. and receiving their judgment, you should appeal to the board to reverse their decision.

As to whether the rule is workable or not is not for me to discuss, but if you think it should be changed then your representative can bring the matter up at the next meeting of the board, which will be about the middle of May.

The whole tone of your letter is most slighting, and in view of the fact that you were once secretary, and that you did not give us a chance to act, is entirely uncalled for.

I may add that I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. Gunn, secretary of V. C. K. C., applying to the board to grant the same request. Owing to your unfortunate action this is now impossible. But, by what right did you make the application? On whose authority did you do so? I have to inform you that only officials can act on behalf of a club unless someone else is authorized to do so, and then the authority must accompany the request.

Dear Sir,—Your letter of the 26th to hand and contents noted. In reply, will say that your letter is the most insulting of any that I think I have ever received since I was connected with dog shows, and only goes to show how very small some men can be when they have a little authority conferred on them. I wrote to Donovan about the matter of cash prizes because the matter was left in my hands at a general meeting of our club. We are quite conversant with the C. K. C. rules, in fact perhaps more so than some of the present members of the advisory board, and knowing that we were asking for a concession of the rules, thought it advisable for this reason to write direct. As you and your committee are directly opposed to the proposition, that settles the matter, and your remarks which were uncalled for in your letter are quite unnecessary, and also a surprise to me, as from my former connection with you when you were secretary of the Vancouver K. C. and I secretary of the advisory board, led me to think that you were quite a different sort of a gentleman. If you remember, on several occasions then, I helped your club, and you personally, out of more than one tight hole, and also in connection with the Terrier Show, which matter you have thought

it in your wisdom to bring up at this time. I quite understand the necessity for some rules, but I also know from experience that a committee such as you are secretary of should have sense enough to know what rules should be applied to coast shows. Under these circumstances, I have much pleasure in handing you, as secretary of the advisory board, my resignation as a member of the Canadian Kennel Club, which kindly send to the proper authorities and oblige,

My Dear McConnell,—Yours of the 23rd inst., enclosing resignation, received, for which I am very, very sorry. I would, therefore, ask you to reconsider same. I do this on account of yourself, the C. K. C. and the dog. You have been with the dog all your life, a member of the C. K. C. for years, and to lose you now would be a blow injurious to all. To resign now would mean, in a sense, severing your connection with old friends. You would probably go to the A. K. C., there make new friends, and gradually drift away until you were but a remembrance. The dog has not too many friends on this side, and to lose you would be to lose one of the best. Not only the dog would suffer but also the C. K. C., and more particularly the Victoria City Kennel Club, of which you have long been such a staunch mem-

ber. Think the matter over quietly; think of the dog, of your own interests, and don't leave the old flag.

With regard to the difference at point, between us, if you will read my letter over carefully and calmly, I feel sure you will agree there was no insult, nor was any intended. I can only repeat that our committee did not have any opportunity to act. That Mr. Donovan distinctly stated "that permission could not be granted." With reference to last fall, if you remember correctly, Mr. Welsh applied, not knowing the powers of the advisory board, to Mr. Donovan direct, receiving sanction. A few days before the show, so Mr. Welsh informs me, you wrote a rather hasty letter asking by what right, etc., they were holding the show under the C. K. C. rules. He replied rather warmly that he had Mr. Donovan's sanction, whereupon you did the only possible thing, gracefully acquiesced. The cases are exactly parallel, i.e., going over the head of the board and not giving it an opportunity to act, only in one case it was favorable and in the other unfavorable.

You did a lot for the Vancouver Kennel Club last year, in fact, had it not been for your kindness our show would have been little better than a failure. No one realizes this better than I, and it will always be remembered by me as long as I have anything to do with dogs. Not only will it be remembered in the ordinary sense of the word, but when the opportunity shows itself you will find that I shall be on the spot. To that case and the present is the difference that we gave you the chance to act, while in this you didn't give us any.

I sincerely trust you will act in the interests of all concerned, that you won't leave the fold, and when we have our show in May you will come and pay us a visit as of old. I expect to visit Victoria, but I believe you will then be in California.

Dear Sir,—In the march number of the Gazette you publish Appendix II. of the English Kennel Club rules on the "Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition," and ask should the C. K. C. take the matter up?

From this I take it that you wish

for an expression of opinion from the various members.

This matter has been discussed a great deal on the Coast during the past six months, and the very large majority were so much in favor of it that I wrote you asking if the rules I enclosed conflicted in any way with the C. K. C. rules; and if not would there be any objection to the Vancouver Kennel Club adopting them. Your reply (unofficial) was to the effect that you did not see any objection only that some might object to it limiting the powers of the judge. We then adopted them, and a few days later they appeared in the Gazette with the question, Should the C. K. C. take the matter up?

If a judge is what he should be, I do not think that they would limit his powers, because if a dog is faked he should be given "the gate." If a judge is strict or sincere, these rules would not interfere with him in the least. If he is lenient, or should inadvertently let a dog slip through, then an exhibitor would have recourse by right of appeal. If a judge knew that these rules were in existence and that there was an appeal from his decision, I feel sure that it would tend to make him more careful, and not pass anything which was not truly legitimate. I do not think that any honest judge would object to these rules.

Sections 1 and 2 of Law VII. of the constitution may cover this as coming under the head of "improper conduct" but how many people are aware of this? It is only the members of the C. K. C. that have access to the laws and rules of the constitution, whereas this is a matter for the whole public. I do not think that in the great majority of cases that "faking" is done intentionally. I believe that it is mostly through ignorance, that the people do not know it is against the rules, and simply do it to improve their dogs. Under the circumstances I firmly believe that these or similar rules should be adopted and printed in the dog show rules so that the public may see them.

Ottawa Kennel Club has Advanced Ideals and Aims.

With the advent of spring comes the usual stir in dog matters, and the different breeders are brushing up for the coming shows. Prominently among these are the Ottawa Kennel Club members. As all are aware, we had a first-class show last fall, but the next one is to surpass all previous ones. New blood has been infused into our local Club, and an enthusiasm hitherto unknown. This is as it should be. But with the spring we meet the difficulties usually met with each year, and the most prominent seems to be the antipathy in some quarters against the dog in general. The man with the beautiful lawn fears and dreads the mighty march of the canine tribe, and the lady with her newly planted flower-bed rests uneasily in her bed, wondering if it will

be molested. And it cannot be denied that this has grown to be a great nuisance. Our city councils are legislating against the dog, and judging from past debates it is still a very live issue. Is it not up to the dog men, and especially the kennel clubs, to look about for a solution of this question. If it can be shown to the general public that the various kennel clubs are antagonistic to the roaming

cur and seek his extermination, would we not have gained a confidence yet unenjoyed. There is no denying the bald fact that to waken up some bright morning and find your lawn and flower beds destroyed is not the most pleasant feeling, and certainly not conducive to the happiness of the canine tribe. And again, to have to lie and listen to the howls of a wandering cur all through the night does not make one's heart swell with any degree of love for the author of these noises.

Yet there must be a remedy, and is it not our duty as the friends of the dog to find it and seek to put it into force. No legislation will make the owner of the cur respect the law. If pushed into a corner, he denies the ownership and thus evades punishment. If this be so, then there must be something more drastic than fining. In one word, is that means not death to the cur. Should not the officers of each local club occupy the same relation to the law as the Humane Society officers? It seems to me so. The Humane Society man sees a man abusing his horse and he reports him and he is punished. Why should not the officer of the kennel club report the owner of a useless, roaming, disturbing cur, and should the punishment not be confinement or death to the dog? Is it not a fact that the

dog breeder and owner of a good dog suffers more by the laws adopted through this prejudice than the man with the cur? Yet the former keeps his dogs housed and at home. Is it not a fact that the owners of good dogs are summoned oftener before the courts because their dogs may appear quietly airing themselves than the owner of a cur who roams the streets every night seeking whom and what he may devour, making night hideous with his howls? The dog man cannot afford to allow his dog to roam. He is too valuable. Not only does he run the danger of annoying someone, but he runs great risk of being stolen. In Ottawa during the past year many cases of theft have been recorded, in fact it seems to have developed into a traffic. Then, how are we to act as dog men? Let us join hands with the police department; let us lend all our aid, and when we see these wandering curs report them and have them taken in charge and the owner, if any, punished. If no owner, let the cur die. The owner of the cur will plead his dog is as much to him as your good, well bred dog is to you. This is a false position, simply because anyone who allows his dog to exist on his neighbor's waste-barrels surely does not have that care the dog breeder gives his dog. The one pays his tax and kennels his dogs. The other pays his tax (perhaps), and allows him to roam, destroying property and endangering lives.

As this question is growing so important, and as the Canadian Kennel Club have the interests of the dog at heart does it not seem incumbent on

the fountain head leading the smaller and local clubs in an endeavor to stamp out the cur. The Ottawa Kennel Club stands for the upbuilding, purifying and betterment of the dog, and our every endeavor is frustrated by this growing evil.

There is another point I wish to touch, and it is this: Do our local clubs pay enough attention to the ordinary dog owner? Do they instill into the general public that the owner of a dog, not a breeder or fancier, is just as welcome, just as much sought after, and just as useful, as the great breeder? By doing this, would we not extend our field of influence, increase our membership, and educate the general public on the common usefulness of the dog? Why do not our local clubs take up the question of

lectures on the dog? All our branches of the general useful animal kingdom have their lecturing academies, and it seems to me it would be a splendid departure in our clubs if they instituted such a measure. The ignorance of the dog, hurting his case, and should be expelled. Would we not be creating more lively interest in the dog, spring valuable knowledge, and bring the noble animal into his proper status as a useful, deserving animal. All these things the Ottawa Kennel Club are going to carry out this year.
