To these may be added Fox Terriers, Airedale Terriers, Irish Terriers and other Terriers used or designed for sport. There has always been more or less dissension as to whether these are sporting dogs or not.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

Leaving Canada: Mr. Wrightson Thorp is leaving Canada to reside in New Jersey, his dogs having already preceded him. We understand that a position as kennel manager at a substantial remuneration is the attraction that takes Mr. Thorp south of the border.

Airedale winnings: Mr. Wrightson Thorp showed a brace of his well known Airedale Terriers at Mineola, N.Y., where he did wonders with them. Clipstone Sunbeam went through to winners in bitch classes, and Clipstone Imperial took a 1st and a 2nd his first time out. These dogs also won a cup for best brace.

Winnipeg show: The schedule for Winnipeg show, July 14th, 15th and 16th, has been mailed to all who have asked for one, and to many hundreds of others. Dr. Bell has some left that may be had on application. It should be noted that the date of closing of entries has been changed to July 6th.

Money is offered in all classes—five dollars to first, three dollars to second, while third is solaced with a V. H. C. card. This amount, too, is given without distinction, all classes being served alike. This is liberal for the very low fee of one dollar which is all that is asked by the Association.

Naturally, Pointers, English Setters, Cocker Spaniels, Collies, Fox Terriers, Bulldogs and Bull Terriers have the widest classification, but other popular breeds, such as Airedales, Russian Wolfhounds, Bostons and, to get the local entry, Irish Wolfhounds are well looked after. Mr. James Cole Kansas City, Mo., as we before announced, will take all classes, and he is scheduled to begin his labors promptly at

one o'clock on Tuesday, July 14th.

Dr. Bell has worked hard on the special list, and has accomplished wonders, as the list shows. There are specials from England, Ireland and Australia, as well as from clubs and individuals located nearer to hand. All he wants now is the entry, and this he will get. There is a movement on hand to bring dogs in carload lots, not alone from Calgary and other Western points, but from the Pacific Coast. We hope to get a photo of the dog show building in next issue if not in this.

Prunella goes east: Mr. and Mrs. Bulloch, Gananoque, whose purchase of a young Collie dog from the King Edward Kennels we noted last month, cast envious eyes on a matron of the kennel when in Toronto. The result is that King Edward Prunella has also gone to the Gananoque home. This excellent bitch is by Ch. Squire of Tytton ex Ch. Parbold Prunella.

Bulldog Judge: We had the pleasure of meeting Mr. Samuel Longmore, of London, England, at the late Montreal show. Mr. Longmore judged the Bulldog classes at this show very creditably, and should he decide to make Canada his home, which is altogether likely, will make a good strong addition to our ranks as a judge, breeder and importer. We are obliged to Mr. Longmore for a report of his classes, which appears elsewhere in this issue.

New Bostons: Mr. J. Arthur Carson, Toronto, has a remarkable litter of puppies, as far as quality, color, marking and breeding go. The litter consists of four dogs and one bitch, all perfectly marked and with grand

tails. They are sired by the cobby little lightweight, Happy Day, out of a Kinsman bitch. This combination of blood ought to produce some winners, as Happy Day has the double cross of famous Goode's Buster, and the bitch has the cross of Sullivan's Punch, Cracksman and Buster.

Toronto Kennel Club Show: Arrangements are complete for the Dominion Day Show of the Toronto Kennel Club. This is the seventh show given by the Toronto Kennel Club, though there has been a considerable lapse between that of 1908 and the next preceding. The dogs will be benched under canvas on the Technical School grounds, College St., and entries close on June 19th with the Secretary, Mr. A. Greenwood. Mr. F. Jacobi's experienced hand will be at the helm. He is acting as Superintendent, the other members of the dog show committee being Messrs. E. J. Campbell, A. Atkinson, W. C. Browne, J. A. Carson, F. Harlowe, J. Perkins, and C. Woodhouse.

The judges' list is quite formidable and should ensure quick despatch provided a sufficient number of ring stewards are available.

The class list contains about everything under the sun—and moon—and winners should be easily made. This end of the show business is running to seed, and some limit should be placed on it. Cockers have six winners classes, and Poms three, the latter an innovation.

An entry of at least four hundred dogs is expected, the aim being to make the show a three point one at least. The list of specials is both long and valuable.

Lee Bank Squire: This is the name of Mr. A. A. Lees', Hamilton, new Bulldog that has just recently crossed "the briney." Squire is a beautiful golden brindle weighing forty-three pounds, rose ears, good skull, is very low set and is absolutely sound. An active dog with immense bone, he has perfect legs and feet, and with true Bulldog expression.

He has done a lot of winning in England under good judges, and at Birmingham Mr. St. John Cooper awarded him the special for best dog in the show.

The following are copies of press reports:

"Our Dogs" says:—"In limit dogs Lee Bank Squire won, a short-backed,

heavy-boned dog, low to ground, wide front, good skull, wrinkle and ears."

Again "Our Dogs" writes:—"Birmingham, March 30th, 1908, judge, St. John Cooper: Lee Bank Squire took special for best dog in show, a short good bodied brindle, with good shoulders, front, bone and tail, good skull, stop, big nose; 2nd, Bob Upaowyn; 3rd, Torbay Doctor; reserve, Rory O'More."

"Field and Fancy" of recent date, under heading of an English Bulldog show, specially reviewed for Field and Fancy by Mr. Thos. Baker, says:—"Open dogs saw Lee Bank Squire an easy winner, a well put up brindle, low to ground and owning a grand head with true expression."

Billy Obo: A good picture of Mr. Farewell's beautiful stud black Cocker Spaniel adorns the front page of Gazette in this issue. So few good black Cocker dogs are in existence to-day that we may be forgiven for drawing particular attention to Billy Obo and Forbes R., both sturdy Cockers built on true lines and showing their close and carefully thought relationship. We may say here that Mr. Farewell does not believe in rank out crosses, but is an advocate of in and in breeding along intelligent lines, and as long as the stamina and character of the dog is not affected. That he is right the dogs he has bred are evidence of.

Billy Obo is by Olie Obo out of Deer Park Flirt, a well known show and brood bitch. Billy Obo, through the great Willard, his sire, goes back in a straight line to that Cocker pillar, Ch. Black Duke. On the dam's side he traces back to Champion Brant, another of the old time quality Cockers.

Forbes R., who owns the same sire as his older kennel mate, we hope to refer to at some length in next issue, when we also hope to use a striking picture of the dog.

Kildare, the well known winner is but one of Billy Obo's good sons, and is evidence that his many excellent points in head, body, legs, feet and general conformation are transmitted to his progeny.

The Sabine Draft Announcement: The semi-annual draft of smooth Fox Terriers offered for sale by the famous Sabine Kennels, of Orange, Texas, will be found in this issue. This has now become a regular procedure with the Sabine, and many A1 dogs can be picked for very little money. In fact, just at this time the dogs comprising the present draft are offered at figures much below the normal. It is realized that dollars are scarce commodities just now, hence the dogs are offered at really but a small part of their value. Fuller particulars will be sent if desired, but this seems hardly necessary, as details are given. As many of

these dogs will be picked up at once, intending purchasers will be wise to order by wire and so secure first choice.

Vancouver Show: One of the main features at Vancouver was the very excellent show of Fox Terriers that without question showed most substantial advance in quality over all previous shows. Mr. H. Burnes' win in the wire division was emphatic, and he is to be congratulated at his first really serious attempt to reach the top. Leading Chance, that was overlooked at Victoria by Mr. Jas. Cole, went straight to the front. We understand that Mr. Geo. Thomas made several attempts to buy him, but as he was imported for a specific purpose, Mr. Burnes could not be induced to part with him. The wires won the kennel prize against Mr. F. W. Welsh's very excellent team of smooths and Dudthorne Hops took the special for best wire coated Terrier in the show. Altogether this kennel won seven cups, including the grand Challenge Cup, four Canadian Fox Terrier Club medals and many other specials, in addition, of course, to the regular cash prizes offered.

We heartily congratulate Coast Fox Terrier breeders, and should greatly like to see some of the large kennels represented at Toronto in September, or if not, then at some of our other large eastern shows.

and 9th are the dates for Calgary Show, which, of course, will be held under Canadian Kennel Club rules. Entries close on June 20th, with the Secretary, Mr. Geo. A. Hull, Calgary, Alta.

This show is being held in connection with the Dominion Exhibition, and has been granted one thousand dollars from that body toward its funds.

The entry fee is but \$1 the first time a dog is entered, and but half this sum for each subsequent entry of the same dog. The prize money offered is the same as given at Winnipeg, namely, \$5.00 for first and \$2.00 for second with a ribbon for third. The classification, too, is largely similar to that offered at Winnipeg, with the sporting breeds, Collies (a large factor in the West), Fox Terriers and Bull Terriers given the extension they merit. MONTREAL CANINE ASSOCIATION SHOW

NUMBER OF DOGS PRESENT, 405. VALUE 3 POINTS.

A good idea of the interest taken in the dog by Eastern fanciers may be had from the turnout at the show of the Montreal Canine Association. Four hundred and five dogs, nearly all local, at a ribbon show is something to be proud of, and spells good hard work on the part of the officials. The prize list was extremely well arranged, being swelled out with a long list of specials and local and veteran classes, and the quality of the dogs was well up to the mark.

Mr. Samuel Longmore, of London, Eng., judged Bulldogs; Mr. Jas. Watson, Irish, Boston, Fox and Airedale Terriers and Collies, and Mr. C. H. Mason, all other breeds. Mr. Innes, the Superintendent, kept the judges "on the go," as well as looking after the numerous other duties pertaining to his office, and, assisted as he was by such men as Messrs. Hersey, Roy, Stuart and Thomas, conducted the show in a manner which reflected great credit on himself.

As usual, awarding of the Strathcona Cup for the best dog, any breed, in the show, drew a large and interested crowd. It simmered down to Mr. Laurin's Airedale, Lucky Baldwin, Mr. Thomas' Bulldog, The Little Nipper, and Mr. Roy's Collie, Balmoral Rex, finally going to Rex.

The Montreal Association always extend a hearty invitation to western fanciers to exhibit at their shows, and we can vouch for any westerners who accept the invitation the very best of treatment.

St. Bernards: A very fair class. Parkdale Kennels' Lochinvar easily best dog in the breed. He might be larger, but he has a good head, expression and coat. In bitches, Mr. Dier's Dolly Gray got first place. She is also on the small side, but has a good skull and muzzle. Mr. Benoit's Jessie was placed next to her, a larger bitch, but inferior in head; while Messrs. Stuart's Rainbow got 3rd place, a young bitch with great bone, but neither smooth nor rough coat and only fair head.

Only four Newfoundlands, Mr. Kenchan's Black Douglas easily heading the list.

No Mastiffs and only one Dane, Mr. Perron's Fido, a very coarse specimen,

No Bloodhounds, but Russian Wolfhounds (only 3) brought out a nice one in Mrs. Laurin Barry's Colne Belina, a splendid headed one and large. Mr. Gladwin's Princess Nada is smaller and has not such a good head.

Two Deerhounds, fair ones, Dr. Brodeur's Stella Bella the better.

Only two Greyhounds, also only fair, Mr. St. George's Spring taking winners. He is rather on the coarse side, especially in head.

The Montreal Hunt Club showed a great pack of English Foxhounds, but not to compete in regular classes.

Low's Mac went to winners. He has too much of the Bloodhound expression to suit us.

Pointers, although few in number, were of great quality, although Mr. Wootton's Edward VII. was placed ahead of Mrs. Water's Nippewa, we are not sure that he is a better dog. Nippewa has a splendid head, good action, and was shown in the pink of condition, but is a little light in eyes and large in feet. The other dog is certainly a grand pointer, but has not Nippewa's head. The only bitch, Mr. Daze's Dolly, shows lots of quality, but wants a better head.

A fair lot of English Setters. The winning dog, Mr. Wootton's Tommy

Atkins, is not any too good in head nor is the 2nd, Mr. Lowrey's Rex S. In bitches, Mr. Campbell's Winona B. easily wins, a good all round bitch only a little on the small side. Mr. Knight's Lady is another small one short in head, but with good expression.

Irish Setters made a good class. Puppy dogs brought out a nice seven months' old one in Mr. Trudeau's Royal St. Elmo. He should make a good one. The winners dog, Royal Grand, still retains his good qualities in spite of years. He has a remarkable color, grand head and shows up pretty well. She is on the small side and light in color, but has a sweet expression and good head and eyes.

Four nice Griffons Korthals on hand, especially Mr. de Chiree's Ajone-de-Joliette.

Gordon Setters, only 3, Mr. Dufresne's Colne Duchess of Gordon easily best and only a fair one at that.

There were more and better Dalmatians than we expected to see. Mr. Constantineau's Perfect Bond got 1st, open dogs, and has better markings though not so good a head, than Mr. Lesage's Oneta, which was placed first puppy. Not much choice between Mr. Ducharme's Queenie and Mr. Lesage's Gypsy, the two winning bitches.

Boston Terriers were the banner class of the show in point of numbers, and the quality in light and medium weights was likely the best ever seen in Canada. In puppy dogs, Auburn Kennels' Auburn Lucky won 1st and went reserve in winners, being beaten by his sire, Auburn Happy. Lucky is a small eight months old puppy, true Boston head and type, but has not so good a muzzle as his sire. Another typical short bodied 16-lb. Boston, 2nd puppy, was Mr. Strother's Brutus, a nice small, dark brindle and white. Novice dogs brought out Mr. O'Brien's Advancer, 2nd, another good one and larger than Lucky, and might have

Old English Sheep Dogs. Mr. Ross's Bergerville Whiskers was the best of the lot, a fair sized one with good bone and well covered.

Poodles made a nice little class, Montreal Bird and Kennels Co.'s Lenoir, going to winners.

Bull Terriers, some 15 or 20, were a miscellaneous lot, and it was not hard to pick out the good ones. Mr. Gorman's Cobalt Buster is a good all round terrier, only a little cheeky. Mr. McFarland's Haymarket Doctor, placed 2nd to him, was very fat and consequently did not show to good advantage. Mr. Cameron's Captain, a terrier, but short in head and low set, took 3rd place. Not much choice between the winning bitches, Mr. Pagel's Beatrice and White Rose, both nice with fair fronts and eyes.

Airedales, as might be expected, were a cracking class. Nothing startling in puppy dogs. The winner, Mr. Jarvis' Inferno, easily the best. That good bitch, Oxford Brilliant, was the best bitch in the show. VANCOUVER SHOW

THE TERRIER A GREAT FEATURE—DOGS 311, POINTS 5

After our annual show in May, 1907, Mr. E. N. Barker, the judge, said in his report that the West was coming fast. Then we had about two hundred and sixty-five dogs benched, and now in our last effort we had over three hundred and thirty dogs entered and very few absentees. Yes, the West is certainly coming fast when Vancouver can put up a horse show with thirty more entries than Montreal; a field trial entry second to none in America, and the only 5 point dog show in Canada. (Eh? —Ed.)

It takes more than population, more than money, more than an ordinary secretary, and more than average enthusiasm to do this in these days of financial depression. What will happen if this crowd holds together till the good times come again, it is hard to predict. We shall probably be having a 10-point show at one go.

Mr. Geo. Thomas gave general satisfaction in all classes, and as he generally says what he thinks, without fear or favor, we may believe him when he says that the quality shown surprised him. It was a perfect treat to see him judge, as he seemed to be as keenly interested as any spectator, and one could very readily see that he is an expert in this business. Mr. Thomas misses nothing, and, whilst he is quick at the examinations, he shows no undue haste, and inspires one with absolute confidence. In fact it is almost a pleasure to be "given the gate" under him.

Then, outside the ring, he is ever willing to discuss awards, tell the defeated where they fail, and the victorious where they can improve. He will even condescend to sell one a better dog, but he does not press the matter injudiciously, for he does not need to; sales come to him like fleas to the dog.

One cannot help having confidence in Geo. Thomas: he is frankness itself. For instance, when introducing the writer of this letter to his charming wife, he referred to him as the man who was showing a "mutt" at Seattle. This was a bit rough, but the balm soon followed, when he remarked that although one might have only a "mutt" to show, some other fellow will probably have a worse one.

Anyhow, the purchase of a dog who is less of a "mutt" proved to be a healthy transaction, although this had nothing to do with our friend Mr. Thomas.

The feature of this year's show was the Terrier section, especially the Fox Terriers. Of the seventy-three benched, there were probably none of those little rank outsiders that are so often seen at even the best of shows. In the smooth variety there was a steady rise from the poorest specimen to the best, and whilst the former was not a very bad specimen, the latter was a dog of the highest quality, yet had he no easy road to victory. A difference of condition in the dogs undoubtedly resulted in the order of the awards. In the bitches probably the result would be the same under another good judge.

The wires present quite a different feature. There were two classes of these, the wire and the wireless. As Geo. Thomas remarked, the word "wire" must mean something, and so he settled the long-discussed question of coats, let's earnestly hope for good and all.

Some smart youngsters came out showing lots of quality, form, and coats that are wire right through, even on the skull, and they were shown without faking. It is a strong recommendation when Mr. Thomas offers to purchase, and he did so in

several cases, but not successfully, be it noted.

The awards were pretty evenly distributed, although unfortunately, Mr. Feicheimer, of Portland, Oregon, took the points in both smooth dogs and bitches. Unfortunately only because the points are of no use to him, he not being a member of C. K. C. We were glad to have him with us this year, and even though he beat us, we admit that he spares no pains to put his dogs down in nice shape, for which we believe he is well rewarded. He must feel satisfied with his trip, for he was persuaded to leave three of his good ones behind, one going to the Sunshine and two to the Devonia Kennels.

In wires, we were glad to see Mr. Burns' good dogs given a fair reward. There is no doubt at all about the injustice done all the wire-haired owners at former shows, the winners included, for there can be no good done to the breed when wrong types are placed ahead of right ones.

The annual banquet took place on the third evening of the show, Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper presiding, supported by those who have been connected with the Club from its infancy. The arrangements were good as usual, the menu card being got up with a style and appropriateness, for which our good friend the owner of the Essex Kennels, is famous. Speeches and songs were indulged in, the former being worthy of more attention than space permits us to give them, but the short, though pointed address of Mr. Geo. Thomas can well be quoted in part: "You've got the best organization and the best dogs in the West. Be good winners and good losers; pull together, and you'll beat the whole coast from Vancouver to Pasadena!" And we can do it with a little more effort, for we were very close to San Francisco's mark this year.

The arrangement of the benching and the serving of the ring, under Mr. Mailer's supervision, was excellent. Everything was done as though the staff had been at it regularly, instead of being green hands, as most were.

We felt like parting with old friends when the visitors from the coast cities left, with their various pieces of silver and pewter, which are certainly awkward things to pack.
