NOTES AND COMMENTS

One day shows: Now that the Toronto Kennel Club have proved that one day summer shows held under canvas can be made successful, it appears to be reasonable to suppose that similar shows could be made "go" in other places. The management is, of course, all important. The work is not all done the day of the show. It requires weeks of careful thought and planning. And this the successful show just held in Toronto had. The officials are workers and Mr. Jacobi an old hand at the trick.

There was some disappointment expressed that the minimum winners value only resulted. But this, we think, should not give cause for disappointment or complaint. Our estimate of the show was two hundred to two hundred and fifty dogs, and those sanguine club members who anticipated four hundred or over probably did not estimate the amount of work this would involve and all crowded into the hours from ten a.m. to six p.m. The show was an experiment. It proved a success, and the entry for a first time was quite big enough.

Mr. Jacobi's labor saving system of identification card and pass combined, and his no less easy working secretary's book, on the loose leaf plan, made this part of the work comparatively easy. The Canadian Kennel Club new judging books were used for the first time and worked like a charm. All show secretaries should adopt them.

"Pop" Dunn dead: We don't think we mentioned the death of that good old Spaniel breeder, Geo. Dunn, of Woodstock. It occurred a few weeks ago at his home. Even in death the ruling passion was strong, and just before he passed away he had his dogs

brought to his bedside where he looked them over for the last time. For many years "Pop" Dunn was a familiar figure at dog shows on both sides of the line, and in his time he owned, bred and showed many a good Cocker Spaniel. Low voiced, gentle in manner, with the experience that many years alone can bring, he was as good a loser as he was a winner, and that is saying much for him. His memory will long remain dear to many of the younger generation.

en as an indication that we are afraid to face it, prefer to let sleeping dogs lie, or is it simply hot weather lassitude. That trimming of coats is being overdone must be admitted, and there are other artificial means taken for whitening and stiffening coats that need these aids. If these abuses are growing—and we must admit they are—and need correction, now is the time to set the machinery in motion. Following precedent, no radical change of this kind could be made at next annual meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club, but notice of motion given for

Penalty for tampering: In the report of the Canadian Kennel Club executive meeting, given in May Canadian Kennel Gazette, discussion was invited on the subject of penalizing for tampering with dogs when shown for competition. This matter was brought to the notice of the executive by the Pacific Coast Advisory Board and was referred to the next annual meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club.

We have not since had a line on the subject pro or con. Is this to be takaction at the meeting of 1909.

Are championships too easily won?: This is another matter that is troubling the minds of some of our foremost breeders, especially those wise men of the east—from Montreal. They put up a good argument in saying that with the advent of ribbon shows "winners" is too easily taken, and often with dogs of very mediocre quality. Some go so far as to state that the whole system is wrong from

the foundation up, and that the number of points to be awarded in each class should be left entirely to the judgment of the individual judge. In addition to this, the advocates of this plan say, and with reason, that the total number of dogs in a show has no bearing on the number of dogs in any individual class, and none whatever on quality or lack of this very necessary essential in the show dog. The Canada is not alone in this. same state of affairs, even in perhaps a more aggravated form exists in the United States and also largely in England.

The charge is that championships are too easily won, often by dogs of very moderate quality, and that no discretion is left to the judge as to the value in number of points of a winner's win. A man might feel justified in giving one or two points to a dog where he would hesitate to give four or five. An opportunity for preliminary discussion will be given at the August meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club executive when we hope those who desire a change may be well represented.

Too many winners?: Still another point bearing on this question. Are too many winners classes being offered? Why should Cocker Spaniels, for instance, be given six winners classes, covering three divisions of color, while Collies are confined to two where all colors must compete? Why should winners in Poms be divided according to weight, while other breeds have to compete together in the various divisions of weight and height, Beagles, for instance. The secretary of the Canadian Kennel Club is often asked to decide questions of this kind when really all he has to base a decision on is precedent, no existing rule quite covering the point. These are matters that should be decided on, notice of motion for some definite schedule of winners being given at next annual meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club.

The Canadian Ambassador: Lyndon tells us that this sterling old Irish Terrier is gone. Old age infirmities brought about a painless death by chloroform. Being Mr. Lyndon's particular pet and house dog, he is greatly missed, but sixteen years must be accounted a good age for a dog kept as well even as the old Norfolk manager's dogs are kept. It does not seem so many years ago that we first saw him on lead with his breeder, Mr. William Brodie, Blackpots, Scotland. A black and tan Terrier came over with the Scottish Ambassador, as Mr. Brodie was quickly called, at the same time as the Irishman.

The Canadian Ambassador was by that great stud dog, the Irish Ambassador, and was also a grandson of the same dog on his dam's side. His dam was also well known. Tyress Dunbar, and she was out of Moya, who was by Champion Gilford. What Irish breeding!

Some travelling: How does this strike the fancy of some of our Eastern exhibitors who fear the journey from Toronto to Montreal? On June 18th, Mr. E. C. Powell, Vancouver, wrote us:

"I am taking a string of dogs to Calgary and Winnipeg. Have taken a car and expect to have from twentyfive to thirty dogs. It is 1482 miles to Winnipeg, or nearly 3,000 miles return. Nice trip with about thirty dogs in the hot weather. From Toronto to New York and return about five times."

We hope Mr. Powell's enterprise and that of his confreres was liberally rewarded.

Winnipeg show: While on Western subjects we might add that that indefatigable worker, Dr. A. W. Bell, wired us on July 8th that Winnipeg would easily be a four point show with the possibility of reaching the limit of five points. This will enthuse the British Columbia men, and we hope to see some of their dogs at least at Toronto.

Specialty shows: Another coast item. A little bird bears us the comment that it is altogether likely the British Columbia Fox Terrier Club and the newly organized British Columbia Cocker Spaniel Club will hold specialty shows on Thanksgiving Day. Of this we hope to have authentic information soon.

Capital Punch: Mrs. Pitt's very excellent pug, Osborne Punch, a good specimen of a breed that is becoming too rare here, is now owned in Ottawa. Mrs. Pitt hopes to have something to replace him soon, however, so that Montreal will not be quite nugless.

Otterburn Orthodox: The very typical Collie head that we use in this issue is that of Dr. C. Y. Ford's Otter-

burn Orthodox, the seven months old puppy. The engraving was made from a snap shot taken without any posing whatever. Otterburn Ornament, the stud dog of Dr. Ford's Kennel, in addition to winning the stud dog prize at the last Canadian National Show, sired the best dog and bitch at the recent Hamilton show, and Pride of Strathmore, who won both puppy and novice classes at the Ontario Kennel Club Show.

The well known show bitch, Otterburn Baroness, has been sold to Mr. Cleland, of Scranton, Pa. She is by the well known Ch. Balmoral Baron and is in whelp to Otterburn Ornament. The same gentleman got the young dog, Otterburn Clyde. Otterburn Ophelia also went to Scranton in whelp to O. Ornament. The Buffalo winner, Otterburn Mermaid, went to Quebec and has since produced a fine litter by Ornament, too.

VANCOUVER

The Vancouver Kennel Club held its annual show on May 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th, and by the courtesy of the officers of the 6th Duke of Connaught's Own Rifles had again the great advantage of the use of the magnificent Drill Hall on Beatty St.

The results of past experience were shown in the great improvement both in the benching and managing of the show. In fact, the efficiency of the management and the individual care which was given to the dogs surpassed anything in my experience either in this country or in the older centres of the dog world.

Mr. H. S. Rolston, the president, and Mr. E. C. Powell, secretary, assisted by Mr. T. W. Mailer as superintendent, together with a host of well organized committee men and kennel attendants, kept everything up to time and insured a prompt adjustment of all difficulties as they arose.

The judge was Mr. Geo. S. Thomas, of Mass., whose experience and ability are of world-wide reputation.

The entry was a capital one, 311 dogs showing up, and thus securing a five point show-quite a feather in the cap of this young but energetic There were 530 entries altogether.

The following notes in detail on the prize winners may be of interest to your readers :-

Yorkshire Terriers.-Only one specimen of this breed turned up. Burrard Buzzy is very small and full of quality, though somewhat light in color.

Maltese did not bring out anything particularly good. Princess Oki is on the large side.

The Japs benched did not show as much quality as usual.

The Poms were all of the large Spitz type. Dick, the winner, has a Chow expression and is hardly up to the standard.

FAREWELL.

In Schipperkes, Bellview Flossie was alone, being the first of this breed to be shown here. She is a very good specimen, with good ear carriage but somewhat wide in front.

Scottish Terriers produced quite a good sized entry. Puppy D. or B. Dundreggan, the winner, is rather high in the leg, has fair coat and good expression. Glenarty Floss. young for exhibition, has a soft coat, and is rather full in eve, but is short in back, and has good ear carriage. Novice D. or B., Dundreggan 1st, has been already mentioned. 2nd, Saanich Skittles was from Mrs. Bradley-Dyne's kennels; has good coat, but wants more head and muzzle. 3rd, Jock, is high on leg and somewhat coarse. His coat is not of the best. Open dogs: 1st, Lindsey Laverock, recently imported for Mrs. Bradley-Dyne by Mr. Colin F. Jackson, one of the bunch of successful dogs picked out by this gentleman on his recent visit to England, was an easy winner. He is almost correct in front, has a grand coat and eye, very short back, and well put together. Full of the true Scottie character, he could do with a little more substance. He has good ear carriage and very strong head properties. 2nd, Bravo, has good coat but rather weak in head. 3rd, Jock, mentioned before. Open bitches: Sandown Brownie has good front, coat and expression, but wants foreface, and is too long in back. 2nd, Glenrosa, is not so good in coat. 3rd, Saanich Fairy, has the best head in the class, and good conformation, but

is not so good in front as the others. In this breed, Mr. Jas. Allwood benched five fair specimens for exhibition

Dandy Dinmonts: Owing to several unfortunate accidents which have occurred recently in the kennels of the fanciers of this breed, a very small entry turned out. The only one put down in good form and fully furnished was the English Ch. Katrine Whist, now the property of Mr. Robt. Martin. He has a great head, well domed skull, profuse topknot, good large dark eye, strong jaw, is low to ground and has great length of body. His body coat is too soft. In bitches, Tatters, a very fair puppy. beat her own mother, Skookum Kelpie, who was dead out of form and lame from a cut foot.

Dachsunde: Tackel Topsy, with plenty of substance and sound in leg, beat the finer bred Rubin, who is not sound behind.

In Boston Terriers, Arroyo Ameer, with good head and well sprung rib, beat Presto Boy.

Fox Terriers, Smooth: A large entry turned out, showing lots of quality. In puppy dogs, Devon Dream, Mr. Anthony's new purchase, won well. He is a very good pup with flat skull, long head, good top, legs and feet, carrying his ears a triffe wide. He is likely to give a close run to the best in the future. 2nd, Fighting Chance, bred by Mr. Burns, his owner, is even better in eye, has a fine head, but not so long as the winner. He has good shoulders and very good ears, but is not good in back and front. 3rd, Sunshine Buller, has a fair head, good ear and shoulder, but rather long in the back, and not very good in feet. Novice dogs: 1st, Fighting Chance, 2nd, Sunshine already described.

Buccaneer, has a grand head and eye, with strong muzzle, and sound in body and legs. He is a trifle large, and was only beaten on account of small pink markings on his nose. If he grows out of this difficulty-which is altogether likely, being a young dog-he will give a good account of himself. 3rd, Sunshine Buller. Limit dogs: 1st, Sunshine Beau Brummel, locally bred by Mr. Welsh, is a credit to his kennels. He has a grand head and is a rattling good terrier all over. He might be a little shorter in back with advantage. 2nd, Ingartestone Rusten, who was sick and quite out of form, was, consequently, unable to do himself justice. He is a very high class dog, with probably the most typical head in the show. He is the correct size, and will give a much better account of himself in the future. 3rd, Devon Dream, already mentioned. Open dogs: A very good class faced the judge here, the blue ribbon going ultimately to the Portland dog. Champion Multonomah Boy. This dog has immense length of head, has a fine skull, a good coat, is very good

in feet and shoulder, but not clean in leg, and is heavy in ear. He excels in points taken in detail, but taken as a whole lacks that essential terrier character which is the charm of the breed. 2nd was won by Sunshine Beau Brummel. 3rd went to Leander Club, a dog with great back, legs and feet, but shown fat and getting rather chunky in skull. Puppy bitches: 1st, Bellew's Blossom has fine head and expression and a good coat. Novice bitches: 1st, Sunshine Bubbles is not pleasing in eye and rather long in back. 2nd, Bellew's Blossom. 3rd, Aldon Fashion, is better than either in head, rather light in eye and wide in front. Limit bitches: 3rd, Multonomah Dark Gold, the winner at Seattle, is altogether too large. Open bitches: 1st, Multonomah Blue Girl has good head, ear and coat, but is rather thick in shoulder and too large in eye. 2nd, Sunshine Bubbles. 3rd, Wandee Ruffles, carrying a very good head, but is not so good in front and coat as those placed over her.

Wire Haired Fox Terriers.-Here the judge promptly settled a question which has given rise to endless discussion amongst the local fanciers by turning out every soft coated dog at the outset. Puppy dogs: Bare Chance, with excellent head and eye and good coat, won out from Sailorman, who is on the small side but carries a very fair coat and nice ear and true expression. He is not quite correct in mouth. 3rd, Oarsman, is a dog with a fair head, but falls away in stern, and has a light eye. Novice dogs are a repeat. Limit dogs: 1st was awarded to Leading Chance, whose hard luck in Victoria I mentioned in my notes at the time. He has a grand coat with great bone, good front and good head, expression and ear. He is just a little pinched before the eye, and not

quite short enough in back, but he is easily the best wire haired Fox Terrier on this coast. 2nd, Essex Pedro is a very taking type of small terrier, with excellent front, well carried ear, and good coat. Carries his stern a bit gay. 3rd, Bare Chance. Open dogs are a repeat. Puppy dogs: 1st, Mr. Forshaw's Untrimmed that was alone here. Novice bitches: 1st, Mistress of the Robes, a good type, but rather short in muzzle and shown very fat. 2nd, Peggy Van, has good terrier head and expression, but wants more head, and is not quite sound in front. Limit bitches: 1st, Maid of Orme, has grand coat, good short back, with rare terrier expression, Her skull and ear are particularly good, but she wants a little more muzzle. 2nd, Dudthorne Hops, has a very good head, ear and eye, and excellent coat. 3rd, Trewanta Weaselle, has light eye and ear, coat is not of the right texture. Open bitches are a repeat of the last class.

Among the numerous specials awarded to the Fox Terriers, the Armstrong Challenge Vase for the best kennel, all wire, or all smooth, was won by Mr. Burns with his wire haired trio—Leading Chance, Dudthorne Hops and Bare Chance.

Irish Terriers.—Puppy D. or B.: 1st, Western Administrator, has grand coat, good head, muzzle and eye, rich colour and right size. This pup also won in novice, and beat the winner in the open in the winners class. 2nd, Western Speculation, is also a classy pup, but is not so strong in muzzle nor so good in color as the winner. 3rd, Lady Heiress, is light in eye and not so good as those above her in feet and front. Novice D. or B.: Sport, who was second here, has a good head but is light in eye and wide in ear carriage. Open dogs: Champion Boy

from Tacoma was off the bench when these notes were made. 2nd, Nip, is built on good lines and has a good coat, but fails in eye. Open bitches: 1st and 2nd were off the bench. 3rd, Killarney Molly is not good in ex-

pression and wants bone.

Bull Terriers .- Puppy D. or B.: 1st, Williamette Starlight has a good clean head, tight lipped, has sound front, good back and quarter, and clean in neck. Is rather light in eye. 2nd, Western Gipsy, is a good little bitch, but inclined to be cheeky. 3rd, Lady Edgecote is not so good in eye or front. Novice D. or B.: 1st and 2nd are already noticed. 3rd, Vancouver Prince, is moderate in head properties and lacks bone. Limit dogs: 1st, Willamette Demon, is an immensely strong dog, but wants more muzzle. 2nd, Saint of Offley, has better muzzle, but is coarse in head and not so heavy in bone.

Airedale Terriers.-Puppy D. or B.: 1st, Bellew Bloom, one of the litter by Admiral Togo, which distinguished itself in Seattle, came first. He has a good eye, head and coat, but his ear carriage is not good, and his feet need to tighten up. 2nd, Hiyu Doctin, was off the bench when these notes were written. 3rd, Romp, has good length of muzzle and fair coat, but is large in eye. Novice D. or B.: 1st, Lakedell Ambush, has plenty of size, but is only fair in quality. Limit dogs: 1st, Matlock Bob, the dog recently imported by Mr. C. F. Jackson, who won right through the Airedale classes at Victoria, Portland and Seattle, added another to his victorious record. He was fully described in my Victoria notes and has since then improved in head, his muzzle having strengthened. He was not quite up

to form here, being stale from the long succession of shows at which his reputation has been made. This dog was sold to Mr. Stewart, of Colorado, after the Victoria show, where he will render service at the annual big game hunts in which President Roosevelt takes part as Mr. Stewart's guest, Bob having shown a disposition to excel in work, as he has done on the show bench since his arrival in this country. 2nd, Clonmell Flockmaster is a well proportioned dog of high quality but small. 3rd, Rex, rather rangey, but improving in coat since he was shown in Victoria. Open bitches: 1st, Highgate Kitty, atoned for her bad luck at Victoria by beating everything except the winning dog here. It would be hard to find a fault in this bitch. 2nd, Bellew Bloom is a good sound bitch. 3rd, Highwood Maude has a poor eye and is weak in muzzle.

Bulldogs .- Novice D. or B.: Taka has better expression but is lighter all over than Togo. He is rather high on the legs. Open dogs: 1st, Endcliffe Advance has a good head, turnup and front, is better in back and lower on legs than Little Nipper Jr., a dog of good quality, but not sufficiently let down in chest. Open bitches: 1st, St. Queenia, better conformation and nearer the ground than Rose of Glenwith, who has a fair head.

Cocker Spaniels.—There was a very fine show of Cockers, all the best local dogs as well as those from Bellingham and Portland competing. In black puppies Kulshan Collar is only a fair pup, and was alone. Novice D. or B., Jesmond Roy has a good head, but is light in eye. 2nd, Kulshan Elliott, together with the most of Mr. Gamwell's dogs were off the bench and therefore could not be criticised. 3rd, Prince Rex is coarse. Open dogs: Victoria, the winner, wants muzzle, but was good enough to beat that highclass dog, Jesmond Promise, whose expression is not as good as it has been. Limit bitches: 1st, Fairview Belle, is a high class bitch, but somewhat large. She has a very good head and eye. 2nd, Queenie, has a very well shaped head, but is somewhat pinched before the eye. Her feet are fair but coat somewhat curly. Open bitches: Jesmond Cricket, inclined to be snipy. Was alone, and beat all the others for winner's prize.

Red Cockers were better in quality than the blacks. Puppy dog or bitch : Red Bluff is a very good type, but unfortunately he has cholera quite badly, and has also, apparently, only the sight of one eye. Novice D. or B.: 1st : Pacific Red King is a lovely model of the small type and well deserved his victory in a strong class. Jesmond Frolic is a good dog but short of coat and not so good in expression. Limit dogs: Red Duke, 2nd to the winner in the novice, is wellknown, has excellent head, coat and

muzzle. Open dogs: 1st, Red King. who also won the winner's prize, has very good head, not quite good in front. Jesmond Buster, who is especially strong in foreface, was sold to a local purchaser after the judging. Limit bitches: Jesmond Ruby has a very good head and eye. Jesmond Red Queen 2nd, is not so shapely in body as the winner. Open bitches: Jesmond Pearl has excellent head and expression, is well put together with good quarters. In the parti-colors, the old Ch. Portland Kid beat all comers again. He is looking very fit. Spider, the winner of the bitches, is an exceptionally good specimen. Mr. Aetzel, of Vancouver, took the special for the best kennel of Reds.

Springer Spaniels.—A large entry turned out in this breed. In puppies, Jim was pronounced the best of the trio shown by Mr. Hargreaves, of New Westminster. They are sound, well-grown puppies, straight on the leg, but none of them promise very well in head properties. In the novice class, a rather heavy bitch. Jennie, beat a strong entry. In the open dogs. Mr. Jackson's Chum was an easy winner, excelling in character, coat and body properties. He is full of the true Spaniel character and took the winner's prize. Open bitches: Jennie again won. Her expression is not satisfactory. Ruru is a useful little bitch, but rather plain in head. She was placed reserve winners.

Clumber Spaniels.—Mr. Crickman's Drake won in the dogs. He is not quite long enough in body or low enough on legs for a typical Clumber the winning bitch. Tassel being more characteristic in these respects.

Irish Water Spaniels.—Burrard Rock Diver, heavy in bone, strong in fore-face and very fair coat, beat Mr. Taylor's new dog, Lunesdale O'Hara, who is also a high class dog and won in Seattle. Burrard Rock Pegov with excellent coat, beat Burrard Biddy in the bitches.

In English Retrievers, Nigger, a very good coated curly dog with a very poor head, beat a flat coated one in Simba.

In Labradors, Shot is a grand dog, but was, unfortunately, alone, as he is

fit to win in hot company.

Pointers.-Puppy dogs: Sidney Boy. who was alone, but asserted himself later by carrying off the winners prize over the heads of older dogs, is a well-developed pup with good muzzle, lovely feet, front and shoulders, and clean neck. He needs to fill up in chest and may ultimately prove rather long in the coupling. In novice dogs, Tod Sloan, coarse in head and light in eye, but with great bone, well shaped body and good feet and shoulders, won out. Limit dogs: Victoria Boy. well known in the west, was off the bench. Jack's Williams, 2nd, is a strong dog but plain in head. Point is not so typical in expression and feet. Open dogs: Mason's King, with a grand head, barely beat Victoria Boy. In bitches, Walla Walla Rush, who experienced what we considered very hard lines in Seattle, won out from a strong bunch. She fails in eve and expression but behind the ears is an exceptionally good pointer-far better than anything else in her class.

Setters.—Mr. Hickford's dogs came to the fore again. Ch. Mallwyd Bob holding his own and beating Fleet's Count—a decision which was not received without question at the ring side, Fleet's Count being very much superior to the Champion in action and better sprung in rib. He is a very good dog and looks a thorough workman. Fleet's Count beat Rockline Young Boy in the open, the latter is beginning to show signs of age, although he still retains a shapely head, clean neck and decided Setter character.

Irish Setters.—There was a keen competition between Mr. Ella's Prince and his sire, Mickey Green, the younger dog winning, being better in eye and forefeet, although neither are perlect in the latter. Prince is a grand dog all over, beautifully rich in color, well shaped head and strong body.

In Gordons, Ch. Messenger Boy headed the list again. He is well known and carries his years lightly.

Collies.—Puppy dogs: Glen Tana Robin has immense bone, long head, and will undoubtedly develop into a very high class dog. He may be a triffe heavy in ear. Novice dogs: Mr.

McFarland's Coila Clinker beat the puppy winner on age alone, being much more profuse in coat. dog shows great quality, especially in body, legs and coat, but carries his ears rather wide. He could also do with greater length of muzzle. Limit dogs: Mrs. Jackson's Ballyarnet Student, bred in the Parbold Kennels, beat Coila Clinker, and was in turn beaten in the open by the imported dog, Glen Tana Squire. The competition between the two last named in the open class was very close and interesting, the judge taking infinite pains before giving his award. Student has more classical head and expression. He has truer Collie action and is very characteristic in coat. He is smaller in ear and carries them right over his head. Glen Tana Squire is a stronger dog, heavier in bone, and shorter in coupling. He is not so good in ear nor so good in expression. The decision was a close one and might have been reversed if Student had not been in such poor condition. Puppy bitches: A very fine little bitch in Kirkdale Queenie won here. She has a beautiful head and expression with a profuse coat, but was shown rather fat and needs to get higher on the leg. Novice bitches: Queenie was beaten by a tri-colored bitch from Spokane, Glen Tana Catherine with great length of head and, at the present, more shapely in body than Queenie. Limit and open: Ormskirk Hollyhock, recently imported by Mr. C. F. Jackson, was an easy winner, beating the imported bitch, Glen Tana Sybie, without difficulty in the open class. Ormskirk Hollyhock is one of the best Collies ever seen on this Coast, and is developing beautifully since She made eight points towards her championship at Victoria and here, besides winning all before her in Seattle. Glen Tana Sybie, 2nd in open, is a very sweet headed bitch, but short on the legs and not rangey enough in body.

Of the remaining breeds, the St. Bernard showing most quality, Star of the North beating Victoria Chief. There is very little between these two, who have alternately beaten each other. They are both dogs of immense bone and great quality. The Chiel.

The Toy classes were an attraction here and could be made more so at a summer show of this kind. Osborne collar.

BULLDOGS AT TORONTO KENNEL CLUB SHOW.

Report by the Judge.

I was very agreeably surprised to find a great improvement in the Bulldogs at Toronto since last fall. While the classes were not so well filled, the quality and type of the dogs was a lot better. Another pleasing feature was the absence of cripples. There were still a few with straight hocks.

A nice bodied, fair headed dog won in puppies, Blackstone Ivel. Second, Ashland John Brophy, big skull and bone, but plain in face and body. Third, Yorick, nice in expression, but needs turnup, fair body. Reserve, a nice headed one, Little Night Watchman, but nothing to him behind the

Novice Class the winner was Keystone of Sherwood, better all round than the others, needs to break up in the skull, is tight-skinned. Second, John Brophy. Rest repeats except Brookdale Temeraire, a big, coarse white dog, very plain in face.

Limit was easy for Lee Bank Squire. The other new face, Rodney Black Mask, has a short face, but lacks substance in front of the eyes, and is shapeless in body.

Open (over 45 lbs.) was a walk over for Rolling Stone, in good shape. A good big one, large flat skull. He has not improved with age in bone, body or face.

Open (under 45 lbs.) brought together the two best dogs in the show, placed as written, The Little Nipper and Lee Bank Squire. The former won, having a very good head, wonderfully short in face, which is very square and deep. His skull is also A1, being long, square and flat, good in bone, ribs and hind quarters. Lee Bank Squire also owns a good typical head with a big nose, but is not so good before the collar as the winner. He is a sounder in his left pastern, bigger and better shaped ribs and a shade bigger in bone, but fails to winner in shape of hind quarters and set on of tail, which is, however, a screw tail. Both moved fairly well. They made a nice pair, were well matched and easily outclassed every other dog or bitch in the show.

In bitches, Sherwood Stepping Stone is a nice little bitch but not enough of her and in poor shape. Ray Ray is a good big one but shown too fat. Ashland Prim is on the plain side but should breed a good pup. Lady Scorpion, a sound brindle brood bitch. Lady Grey, a very good boned and bodied white bitch, with a nice head, but too small in size. She is marred by a light grey eye. Ivanhoe Kitty, behind the eyes is a good type and sound, very nice body and bone. Needs a little improvement in shoulders and is a good bitch spoilt by a plain face and poor underjaw.

Her eyes are too close together, she is too tight skinned, is very heavy and wide behind, and straight in hocks. Had Ivanhoe Kitty had a better face, these two would have changed places.

The French Bulldogs were the poorest bunch I ever had before me. I considered the winner such a poor specimen that I withheld the winners prize. My reasons for doing this were that I do not consider it in the interest of any breed to give points towards championships to poor specimens. It is a pity this is not done more often by judges. I was very sorry for the owner of the dog, who, I hear came all the way from Montreal. I hope if I ever have to judge French Bulldogs in Canada again that I will find the same improvement that I found in the English Bulldogs.

THE SCHIPPERKE SCALE OF POINTS.

I would be very much obliged to you if you could see your way clear to publish this in the Gazette:

Head .- Foxy in type, skull should not be round, but broad, and with little stop. The muzzle should be moderate in length, fine but not weak, should be well filled out under the eves. A Schipperke should have a foxy head but less pronounced cheek bumps and not so fine a muzzle as a fox. The skull should be flat, with no protruding forehead or ridge, and should not be boxy or "domed." The base of the skull to tip of nose should form a V. The muzzle must not be thick and blunt like a Chow's, nor square at the extremity, whilst toyishness and snipiness are to be avoided. The chin should be receding.

Nose.-Black and small. A Roman nose is a disfiguration, though not uncommon.

Eyes.-Dark brown, small, more oval than round, and not full, bright and full of expression. Nothing detracts more from the appearance of the Schipperke than a light colored eye. The large, round, full yellow eye is a fearful thing as it banishes all Schipperke expression. The eye cannot be too dark, though I have never seen one actually black.

Ears.-Shape: of moderate length, not too broad at the base, tapering to a point. Carriage: stiffly erect and when in that position the inside edge to form as near as possible a right angle with the skull and strong enough not to be bent otherwise than lengthwise. The most common faults under this heading are rounded tips, semi-erect, "leafy," ears, carried too closely together or too wide apart, ears too large. Another failing is when too thickly covered with hair on the inside, thus donating a Pomeranian cross. In Belgium the ears are preferred to be carried with a slight slant forward. The size of the ears must be in keeping with the dog, though it is a rarety to find them too small. In puppies the ears may

be inclined to be "floppy," especially at the teething period; some puppies are not "fixed" until well advanced in puppyhood.

Teeth.-Strong and level. An undershot mouth is a great objection, and is very severely handicapped in the ring, though some judges take but little notice of it unless the deformity shows without the mouth being opened. Some doubt existing in my mind as to what actually constituted an undershot mouth, I asked the question of a well known dental surgeon. He said one of the front teeth out of place was an irregularity, two or more was undershot. A puppy with an overshot or pig-jawed mouth is not so heavily penalized as the above, nor is the dog which has one or two teeth slightly out of place.

Neck .- Strong and full, rather short, set broad on the shoulders and slightly arched. Should be muscular without any suspicion of throatiness.

Shoulders-Muscular and sloping. Must not be bossy.

Chest.—Broad and deep in brisket.

Back.-Short, strong and straight. There should be no sign of slackness. It is the short back that gives the Schipperke his distinctive appearance. Loins-Powerful, well drawn up from

the brisket.

Fore Legs .- Perfectly well under the body, with bone in proportion to the body. A Terrier front is not required and is impossible if the body is the correct pear shape. The pasterns should be short and straight.

Hind Legs.-Strong, muscular hocks. well let down. The Schipperke should not be "cat hammed." From his vocation he should stand firm on the ground with his feet not too close together.

Feet.-Small, cat-like, and stand well on toes. Considering the Schipperke is an excellent water dog, and used to running about on the wet and slippery deck of a barge, it is somewhat difficult to understand why the feet should be tough and hard. Toes nicely arched and turned neither in nor out.

Nails.-Black. Should be strong and short. Long nails, which show want of exercise, are a frequent cause of the dog being down at his pasterns.

Hind Quarters.-Fine compared to the fore parts. Muscular and welldeveloped thighs, tailless, rump well rounded. Looking from the front, the hind quarters should not be visible in a well-made dog. A bitch is wider behind than a dog, for breeding reasons. Most Schipperkes of to-day are rather square at the rump, the tail not being docked so closely as formerly.

Coat.-Black and abundant, dense and harsh, smooth on the head, ears and legs, lying close on the back and sides, but erect and thick around the neck, forming a mane or frill, and well feathered on back of thighs. Coat must be straight, neither too short nor too long, with a dense weatherundercoat and black resisting throughout. There must be a distinct line of demarcation between the frill and body coat, the former overrides the latter. The feathering on hind legs curves inwards and is termed the "culotte." Too much culotte makes the dog look long in body. There should be no feathering on the forelegs the presence of this donating a Pomeranian cross, as does the large frill and soft, fluffy coat. The dog carries more frill than the bitch.

Weight.-About twelve pounds. The average weight of the best dogs of recent years is about fourteen pounds. Weight is very deceptive and varies according to the dog's condition. Size is of much more importance. It is much easier to get a good Schipperke large than a good little one.

General Appearance.-A small, cobby animal with sharp expression, intensely lively, presenting the appearance of always being on the alert, Too much stress cannot be placed upon this excellent description. The Schipperke must not be racy.

Disqualifying Points.-Drop or semierect ears. As pointed out before, an undershot mouth is deemed by many as a disqualifying point. Others are:

FIELD TRIALS ARE PROPOSED FOR SPANIELS.

Field trials for Cocker Spaniels is an event in dogdom which may be held in the near future under the auspices of the recently-formed B. C. Cocker Spaniel Club.

This flourishing young club held a recent meeting in Col. Dudley's office, at which the new by-laws were read and adopted, details of the organization completed, and a lot of routine business transacted.

The matter of Standard weight of dogs for exhibition purposes evoked a great deal of discussion, and it was the general opinion of the club that the standard weight should not be above twenty-eight pounds nor below eighteen; twenty-six pounds was the weight generally favored.

Colonel Dudley said that the Cocker favored field trials for Cocker Spaniels, and said that they would be the means of bringing out a large number of dogs for show purposes. Cocker Spaniels are used extensively in the East for hunting purposes, said Mr. Leggat, the president, and especially in Muskoka and the country surrounding the Great Lakes, where they are used for deer hunting.

PORTLAND SPECIALS.

Regarding a few of the statements made by Mr. R. G. S. Anthony, in your issue of May last, relative to the Portland show, kindly allow me to correct an erroneous idea that his statement might convey; that one that might cause fanciers to think are specials are not first class.

Regarding specials, I, as a member of the Board of Trustees, of the Portland Kennel Club, will say that ours are second to none on the coast and very few eastern clubs give as handsome and costly cups and trophies as we yearly give. This year we gave eighty-one specials, of which at least seventy-five were cups, and of these seventy-five at least sixty-five of them were solid silver and ranged in value from \$15.00 to \$50.00 and averaged about \$25.00 per cup in value. other cups were copper or plated ware, probably three of them were plated silver. All our cups are presented outright yearly; there are no strings on them, compelling a winner to return his cup the next year, as they do at Vancouver and some other coast shows. Also out of all the cups offered, but sixteen were out of open competition, these being offered for Oregon bred or Oregon owned dogs, and this is surely a very liberal offering of cups. With all due regards to the B.C. shows, where we win cups that must be returned, and they are plated affairs at that, and where we win boxes of tea, cigars, ham and eggs and such other specials, I may be par-

doned for boosting for our own show and taking exceptions to my friend Mr. Anthony's letter when he says our shows are very unattractive affairs. We do not find them so, neither do we find the B.C. shows so, and I for one enjoy showing my dogs at their shows. I have not much to show for my wins there, only a few plated, cheap cups. But I have three Canadian Kennel Club Championship Cups that I prize highly and they were what I had in mind when competing up north. It is the satisfaction of winning, more than what I win that I like in the show game, although since Mr. Anthony has spoken so nicely of the list of his club's specials, I feel that I should let the readers of your valuable monthly know what Portland gives in the way of prizes. Besides the cups we donate, we give very nice silver medals for first place and bronze medals for second place in each class.

Any exhibitor who has dogs that are good enough to win some of our cups for his "den" will say nothing of the lack of inducement for showing with us. I know this from experience.

I trust you will be able to allow me sufficient space in your next issue to run this letter.
