Hamilton Show: Our friends beneath the mountain are to be commended for their persistent attempts in the dog show line. Now that the

show has been made a Victoria Day feature, we hope that renewed effort will result in larger and better exhibits and this annually.

Perhaps we may be permitted to point out that eleven more dogs would have doubled the winners value of the late show, and would have placed Hamilton amongst the two pointers. Committees owe it to their supporters to lose no effort to give the wins made by their dogs all possible value, and it is as a rule but a local matter to drum up quantity sufficient to make up the deficit.

Then, again, exhibitors owe it to the shows and to their fellow exhibitors, as well as to themselves, to see that the dogs they enter are actually present. If eleven absentees had been present it would have meant two points for Hamilton, instead of one.

An absentee list of say ten per cent. of the total entry is not too great a proportion to expect, so that show promoters can gauge with a fair degree of accuracy how many dogs are required to run over the specified number for any number of points. Say, for instance, a two point show is aimed at, then it is safe to say the entry should include 275 dogs.

Rolling Stones gathering wins: Four winners in one litter is a record to be envied, and this is what Mrs. R. Manders' Bulldog, Rolling Stone, produced. This is what the quartette in question did at Buffalo and Hamilton.

A rare old Irish lady: Mr. Godfrey, of the Armagh Kennels, reports the death at the good old age of eleven years of the Irish Terrier, Armagh Blossom. She was the granddam of Celtic Tormentor, and produced several good ones while in Ireland. She was bred by that well known Irish Terrier breeder, W. H. Gillespie, Armagh, Ireland. As Mr. Godfrey has a nice litter of six from a daughter of Blossom, he still has the old blood that he so highly values.

An old friend: It was a pleasure to hear from such an old friend as E. N. Barker, erstwhile editor of Field and Fancy, though the news his letter contains was at the same time saddening and calls out our sympathy for him. Mr. Barker lost his beloved wife in March last, Mrs. Barker, at the time, being at her old home at Newburgh-on-

the-Hudson, N.Y. In consequence of this Mr. Barker resigned his Government position at Cardston and is now connected with the Alberta Homestead, a weekly farm journal published at Edmonton, Alta. He is to judge the Calgary show, noted in this column, and hopes to be able to keep well in touch with dogs and their doings in the North West.

New Scotties: There is no nicer house dog or companion than the sensible, canny Scot, and none more ready to live a rough and tumble existence when it becomes necessary. For this, if for no other reason, we are glad to see the breed gaining popularity in Canada. We recently noted Mr. Laurin's importations, and now another Montrealer, Mr. A. J. Stacy, has imported a kennel of the breed. Mr. Stacy, who has had an extended experience in dogs, in both England and South Africa, has been holidaying in England, and brought the dogs over with him. His kennel will be represented at the Montreal show. While his favorite breed is the Bulldog, he is cosmopolitan enough to love all breeds, especially the various Terriers, many of which he has bred.

Now a Champion: It did not take long for Mr. H. Burne's, Vancouver, well known Fox Terrier, Leading Chance to attain to championship honors. Three shows under three different judges gave him the honor, i.e., Vancouver, 1908; B.C. F. T. C., 1908; and Victoria, 1909. The judges were Mr. Geo. S. Thomas, Mr. R. P. Forshaw, and Major J. M. Taylor. For good measure he won another four points at Vancouver, 1909, again under a new judge, Mr. Jack Bradshaw. Since Vancouver, he has also taken winners, Tacoma, Wash., and at Portland, Ore., each three point shows under A. K. C. rules.

Just here we might say that Western kennels will very likely be represented at Toronto this fall, as they were in 1908. But then, why not reciprocate? An invitation, and an urgent one, is extended to Easterners to "come west." Why not accept it?

A smooth combination: The Clapton Fox Terrier Kennels, Ottawa, are going in for breeding high class smooths on a larger plan than ever before. Some three years ago Mr.

Geo. W. Bailey started the foundation of the above kennel, and as Mr. Bailey informs us, without any serious intentions of getting into the fancy with any great number of Terriers. But breeding Fox Terriers is a fascination that once it gets going the keen fancier soon finds he is possibly more deeply interested in the hobby than he really expected to be at the start. The Clapton Kennels, starting in a small way, are an instance of this, and the object of this note is to announce the partnership of Messrs. Armstrong, Bailey and Sutherland, having joined forces in the breeding of high class Fox Terriers.

Mr. Andrew Armstrong, the veteran fancier, in future will have full charge of the business and the dogs at the Clapton Kennels, and Andy promises to turn out something worth while from the breeding stock of the kennels, and as the number of brood bitches now numbers twenty, with even a little good fortune, there assuredly should be some good ones produced.

The latest addition is a Warren bitch of great quality, sent over in whelp to Warren Distinct by Ch. Sabine Resist. The above bitch is by Ch. Warren Blue Blood, out of a daughter of Warren Remedy by Dusky Don II. We are told this batch is really a top notcher and will take some stopping.

Mr. Andrew Sutherland, the other partner, is a new force to the fancy, but he is a keen sportsman and is identified with the hockey and lacrosse clubs of the Capital, and is just the stamp that we can gladly welcome to the fold as his motto is the best is none too good, which means the producing of good stock and the betterment of the breed in general.

The Clapton dogs are now in their new and well appointed quarters at Mr. Armstrong's residence, Ottawa West, just outside the city. We join in wishing the new kennel merited success, which we are sure they will attain, and we look forward with greater interest than ever to the Fox Terriers to come from the Capital in future.

BENCH SHOW AT WINNIPEG EXHIBITION, JULY 13-16, '09.

Those of your readers who are contemplating exhibiting at Winnipeg Exhibition Dog Show are reminded that entries close July 1st. Winnipeg has easily taken a unique position among the bench shows of Canada, standing now almost on a par with that of Toronto, Montreal, and other large eastern shows, and in fact the management have this year guaranteed a five point show, the maximum number any Club can attain under C. K. C. rules, towards a championship. We understand Mr. E. O. Ostell and Thos. Moore, of Montreal, are interesting themselves in sending out a personally conducted car from Montreal and Ottawa; Calgary and possibly Vancouver are also contributing, so that it looks as if last year's great success will this year be eclipsed. As an added attraction, Bea Lewis, the judge, should draw out a record entry, especially in Pointers and Setters.

MONTREAL CANINE ASSOCIATION SHOW.

The Montreal Show is again in full swing, this year in the large arena, spacious, light and well ventilated. The benching, which caused the postponement of the show for a week, is the best we have seen in any show in Canada. Everything is running in first class order under the guidance of Mr. J. R. Innes, the Secretary and Superintendent, and his right hand man, Mr. A. J. Stacy. There is a big drop in the number of entries this year, only about 360 dogs being entered, which will bring it down to a two-point show. The general quality, however, is good, especially in Irish Terriers, the leading class, and a very even lot. The bulk of the judging devolves upon Mr. Chas. Lyndon, who, in addition to his original allotment of classes, has been forced to take Boston Terriers on account of Mr. C. H. Mower's inability to officiate. Mr. Jas. Lindsay takes Irish Terriers; Mr. Jos. Reid, Collies; Mr. W. A. William, Bulldogs; Mr. T. Moore, St. Bernards, Great Danes, Newfoundlands, and all breeds except Beagles; balance of classes to Mr. Lyndon.

The big dogs, as usual, are not strong. In St. Bernards, Messrs. Stuart's Agawa Duke is easily head and shoulders over the rest of the class. He is in good form, and his great bone, massive head and good expression stand out in great style. Same owners, Queen Alexandra, is the winning bitch, small, but with St. Bernard expression. Newfoundlands, a very good entry compared with other years, the winners dog, Mr. Kerchan's Black Douglas, being a very respectable specimen. Russian Wolfhounds, good average quality, the leading one being Mr. Zuercher's bitch, Raskida of Spring Farm. Deerhounds and Greyhounds small classes and ordinary quality, while in English Foxhounds, outside of the Montreal Hunt's pack, not entered for competition, Mr. Bannister's Watchman is the only entry; he is a good strong substantial hound, well known on the Canadian bench. American Foxhounds were also light in point of numbers. Mr. Gibson's dog is heavier in bone than Mrs. Ross's Merry Bud, but is more of the English type of hound.

Pointers are fairly light class. Mrs. Water's grand bitch, Jingo Della, shown in good form, easily on top.

English Setters, a fair turn out, the winners dog and bitch, Mr. Piche's Ben of Glendrift and Mr. Campbell's Winona, properly placed winners, a pair of uniformly good ones. The reserve winners dog, Mr. Ross's Max F., is a very fair one, though not a show dog. Irish Setters, best of the Setter class. Mr. J. C. Hanna's Marcus is a good one with the advantage of youth over Mr. Trudeau's Imperial St. Elmo and Mr. Campbell's Royal Grand, placed in order mentioned. Mr. Campbell's dog is better in head than St. Elmo, which is quite gray in the face, but the latter showed himself in good style while Mr. Campbell's dog became excited and persisted in carrying his tail and ears high. The winners bitch, Miss Bowman's Irish Molly, is a nice bitch, but we would like to see more of her. Dalmatians, about the usual, with Mr. Constantineau's dog, Perfect Bond—now a champion—easily best in class.

Field Spaniels, only fair in numbers and quality. Cocker Spaniels, a pretty good turnout, though not an overabundance of good ones. In black dogs Mr. Montgomery again swept the board with Little Joker, a good dog and a well known warrior, while Mr. Cook's Rockfield Dusky Gem, a bitch of quality with particularly well set ears, went to winners in black bitches. Mr. Armstrong's Ottawa Oarsman (parti), and Ottawa Red Light (red), placed in order mentioned in any other color classes, are a nice even pair, both excelling where so many Cockers fall down, in being nicely cut out under the eye and depth of muzzle. The winners bitch, Mr. Stewart's Red Cherr—did not look prepossessing on first glance, but on closer inspection proved to be a rather good headed one. She might carry her ears lower. She was followed by Mrs. R. A. Stuart's parti, Black Stocking, little high up, but otherwise a very fair specimen.

Collies were not up to the usual standard in numbers or quality. June is a bad month for them. Mrs. Roy's team, Balmoral Baron and Balmoral Rex, and Mr. Reid's Heather Blossom II., were on exhibition only. Mr. Waugh's Newport Billy and Mr. Launder's Bonnie Briar, the winners and reserve winners dogs, cannot be called classy Collies. In bitches, the winners, Mr. Roy's Coila Spaurfe, is a good one all round, with exception of

feet being a little spread, while the reserve, Mr. Binning's Lucy Glitters, is another good one, well known. Old English Sheep Dogs, fairly well represented.

Bull Terriers, a fair string but no really hot stuff, winners and reserve dogs going to Mr. Benjamin's Prince and Mr. Broderick's Major, and in bitches to Mr. Larue's Lachine Pansy, and Mr. Pagel's White Rose respectively. French Bulldogs a fair lot.

Boston Terriers made quite a turnout, but as usual the good ones were not plentiful. Miss Smith went right to the front with her splendid little dog, Lord Bell Rock, shown in grand form. He was followed in winners by Miss McGillis's Sugar Boy, a dog not so deep in muzzle as Mr. Coghlin's Kweenee Spur, but with less wrinkle. Winners bitches went to a sweet little one shown by Mrs. Comstock, called Winks, and reserve to Mr. Wilson's Trilby 5th. Mr. Campbell's Taxman, had he shown up, should have been close to the front, but he had no life in him.

Airedales, of course, were very strong, Mr. Laurin's string cleaning up nearly everything. Colne Matchless Monarch, a great big dog, and to our mind the best in the show, was placed winners over Mr. Stroud's Edgewater Whinfield Rebuff and Colne Caidwell Queen over Colne Lady Strathcona in winners bitches. In specials, Colne Master Royal was put over Monarch. The old dog is a good one, but of course shows age, and we think should hardly have been given precedence to Monarch.

Irish Terriers made up a large class, the quality being uniformly good. Drumclaph Fair Chance, shown in great form and looking better than ever, went to winners followed by Mr. Insleay's Fulwell Briar, a dog with lots of character and pretty good all round except for a pair of rather heavy ears. The 1st puppy dog, Mr. Meehan's Kilbarron Solicitor, was also one we liked. He has good color, coat and head, but his feet and ears are not quite up to the mark. He should improve when he fills out. Drumclaph Play Fair, next him, is a nice one but out of condition. The 2nd open dog was also a rather taking one. He is Mrs. Brown's K.C., a dog with a good head and eye and fair coat, but a little loose jointed. He

beat Mr. Insleay's Fullwell Major. Mr. Insleay's Balbriggan went through to winners bitches. She is a pretty good Terrier with a rather full eye, large ear and only fair coat. The Drumclaph entré, Mrs. Casey, which won reserve, is really a better bitch, but she was out of condition, while their Red Cress, also in poor condition, should beat any of the bitches shown. Mr. Insleay's Fulwell Natty and Fulwell Cassey were rather nice ones, while Mr. Meehan showed a very promising pair of puppies in Kilbarron Peggy and Norah, both a little shy in the ring. Scotch Terriers, though not a heavy class, held some good ones. Mr. Stacy's importation, Romany Laird is a very nice all round dog shown a little out of coat and went to winners followed by Miss Ainslee's Rory Dhee. Miss Eadie's good Blue Bonnets was winners bitches, with Mr. and Mrs. Laurin's Colne Nut Brown Maiden reserve. Two good black and tans were on hand. Mr. Montgomery's Master Fred, and same owner's West End Maiden. The entry of small dogs was not extra large, but some good ones were shown. In Poms, Mrs. Gyde's Hilary Prince and Mrs. Pitt's Beautiful Mite of the Sables were the winners in dogs, while in bitches, Mrs. Gyde's Chocolate Witch and Mrs. Hutchinson's Buena were placed in order mentioned. Yorkshires were also well represented. Mrs. Moore's Tricksay and Mr. Mitchell's Prince leading the class.

Smooth Fox Terriers, Bailey & Sutherland's Clapton Blue Blade, the star in the class, looking better than we have ever seen him. He has wonderful bone and feet, a classy one all through, and a good actor. He was followed by Mr. Binning's Buster, also a nice Terrier, not so good in head and little out at shoulder. Messrs. Bailey & Sutherland's Clapton Persist, the 2nd open dog, did not show himself to best advantage. Bitches, headed by Messrs. Bailey & Sutherland's Clapton Blue Bloom, good head and ears, fair bone and shade long coat. Reserve bitches went to Messrs. Bailey & Armstrong's Clapton Felicia, better bone than the winners bitch, but not so good in head. Wire, winners dogs, Miss Eadie's Mix-Up, a dog with good bone and

length of head, but only a fair mover, followed by Mr. Moore's Donnington Rebel, a larger dog, with better coat. Have seen Mix-Up looking better. In bitches, Mr. Moore's Donnington Siren, a nice sized one, not in condition, but nevertheless shown nice expression, was winners and Limefield Kennels' Limefield Mistress, a little coarse all through, reserve. A nice bitch puppy in Aberdeen Nettle wants time. Bulldogs, a good turnout, where Mr. Thomas's brindle, Druid of Glenwyth, beat Archbishop of Glenwyth—both dogs old campaigners, well known. In bitches, Mr. Alexander's Lady Tinker got the decision over Mr. Thomas's Liza Awkins of Glenwyth.

We would like to have seen more Toronto dogs present. The Montreal show is now so well established that it should draw more of our western dogs. The programme of judges was all that could be wished. Mr. Lindsay is right at home among the Irishmen, Mr. Reid amongst the Collies; Mr. Moore and Mr. Williams acquitted themselves with honor, and Mr. Lyndon, to whom the hardest work fell, gave such general satisfaction that we were proud that he hailed from the same burgh as the writer. He knows them.

The special for the best dog owned and shown by a lady went to Miss Eadie's Scotch Terrier, Blue Bonnets.

The special for best dog, any breed, in the show, was won by Mr. Thomas' Druid of Glenwyth.

Welsh is determined to keep up his reputation regarding the inmates of his well known kennel and has sent his winning smooth Fox Terrier bitch, Sunshine Blue Girl, down east to be served by that grand dog, Sabine Resist. This combination ought to produce something better than what is generally seen here. This gentleman also informs me that he is anticipating getting a class wire dog from the old country before the fall. If Mr. Welsh keeps on as he is going he will soon have a Totteridge Eleven of Canada.

F. Welsh's Sunshine Blue Girl and Sunshine Beau Brummel had a clean sweep at the Tacoma show. Beau Brummel is now one point short of his championship honors. Br. Burns' wire, Leading Chance, also took all before him, and is now a full champion.

Mr. E. R. Ricketts received a very tempting offer for his French Bulldog, Bon Soir, running over the five hundred dollar mark, but this gentleman could not be induced to part.

The Duncans dog show would have had a very large entry of Fox Terriers from Vancouver if they had divided the smooths and wires. It is a great mistake to put them all in one class, and was the cause of many well known kennels not being represented there.

The Vancouver Fox Terrier Club have decided to hold their annual show on Thanksgiving Day in October next. It is rumored that the competition at this event will be keener than anything hitherto witnessed, owing to the fact that imported stock is gradually working its way in, and I hear others are likely to arrive before that date. Vancouver is certainly leading the way in the west in this particular line. There are some grand youngsters likely to appear, judging from what I have seen in visiting various kennels. The judge has not yet been decided upon, but the management are communicating with a few judges across the border. It is to be hoped that the services of a good Terrier man are retained for the occasion, as they are so few and far between. I would prefer a local man who has had experience than some we have seen here who have never had the chance of knowing what a good Terrier is like. I have seen a few instances here where this has been demonstrated. I noticed in our last show a Terrier (not Fox) was awarded winners (and is a champion) over some good dogs, and when I examined him on the bench found that it was considerably undershot; it does not say much for the remainder.

HAMILTON SHOW.

239 DOGS. WINNERS VALUE ONE POINT.

Hamilton show, once it got going, was a very creditable one, but there was no small amount of trouble in getting going. To begin with, the best that could be procured for a show building was a frame, open fronted structure in Maple Leaf Park, away out in the suburbs. Then the city was at the mercy of the street railway company, who run a none too good service to the park at any time, but who had the tracks on the main thoroughfare torn up at this particular time so that they could not begin to cope with the crowds on the holiday. But this was not all. They could only get about three quarters of the floor space originally promised, and, to crown all, the park authorities, who undertook to erect the benching, again fell down. This, of course, delayed matters at first, but once started, the judging went merrily along and the management are to be congratulated at the success they attained in the face of all their difficulties.

The judging so far as we could see and hear was entirely satisfactory, but necessarily slow on account of there being only one ring. The banner classes were Cockers—very strong, Boston and English Bulldogs. The judges were:—

Mr. Joseph Kennedy, Hamilton—All Spaniels except Toys, all Foxhounds, all Setters, Pointers, Beagles, Harriers, all Fox Terriers, Boston Terriers, Airedale Terriers, Irish Terriers, Scotch Terriers, Welsh Terriers, Skye Terriers, Bedlington Terriers.

Mr. W. R. Goodwin, East Aurora, N.Y.—Bulldogs, English and French; Bull Terriers, Manchester Terriers, Manchester Terriers (Toys), Yorkshire Terriers, Old English Sheep Dogs, Collies (rough and smooth), Dalmatians, Dachshunde, Schipperkes, Pomeranians, Pugs, English Toy Spaniels, Miscellaneous Class.

The President of the C. K. C.'s classes were not heavy, and on the whole the quality only mediocre. Mr. Edward's recent importation in Italian Greyhounds, Prince Ivanovitch, was

alone in his glory; he is a good one and the judge liked him. In Greyhounds, Mr. Coulter's Queenie did not have much trouble in beating Mr. McName's Lyons. Queenie is a first class bitch and well known on the Canadian bench. The other bitch was a rather nice one, too. In Russian Wolfhounds, Mr. Colvin's St. Nicholas II. stood well out.

Mrs. Gordon's beautiful Collie dog, King Edward Cavalier, not yet a year old, was looking at his best and won not only winners for his mistress but also the silver cup donated by Mr. Goodwin for the best dog, any breed, in the show. He is a dog of good substance, splendid head, capped with small, well set ears, a nicely placed eye, good expression, thick coat, nice clean front and very stylish. His quality is uniform, it is hard to pick a defect. Another King Edward dog—King Edward Model, now owned by Mr. Bowsfield, went reserve. He is another classy one of the same breeding, with even better bone than Cavalier. He loses in color of eye. We were sorry that Mr. McEwen's puppy, Holyrood Eldon, had been removed before we saw him. In bitches, King Edward Water Witch went to winners. She shows great bone and is another all round good one—a fit associate for Cavalier. Dr. Ford's Otterburn Overture was next up. Bull Terriers were also good. Mr. Fox's dog, Indomitable, well known on the bench as a good one, went to winners, followed by Messrs. O'Rourke and Judd's Wentworth Brocton, a puppy with a beautiful small, dark, well set eye, but not clear enough around the throat. Mr. Fox's winners bitch, Wedgewood Belle, whom we mistook for her kennel mate, Pretty Polly, at the Ontario show, was shown in good form. She is a typical bitch, clean cut and substantial with good eye, skull and muzzle, and beat Mr. Miles' Epsom Countess Grey, shown out of condition. Mr. Fox also had Pretty Polly on hand, the next up, and a nice bitch, a little long coat. The winning Poms are well known, Mrs. O'Rourke's Sir Dandy and Mrs. Wylie's Cairndhu Narcissus, Tot and Floss. There were also some other very good small dogs on exhibition. Dachshunde, Schipperkes,

Dalmatians and Black and Tan classes not heavy, quality very fair.

American Fox Hounds: four dogs shown, Mr. G. Kuntz's dog Harvey, turned out the best, a little off in shoulder, otherwise a fair specimen.

Pointers: showed up stronger, with seven—three dogs and four bitches, Mrs. Water's Jingo's Della leading the van.

English Setters numbered six. A. Ellison's Gladstone Prince best dog. Peart's bitch, Queen (well known), won special over the former.

Gordon Setter: a disappointment, only one dog, shown in poor condition.

Irish Setters: Kerr Bros. showed an even pair, Killarney Kathleen and Shawn Rookh, the former winning.

Scotch Terriers: six dogs, five from Mr. Wallace's kennel and one by W. Clendenning. Clonmel Dirk, the Buffalo and Toronto winner, being the best, a dog with excellent head, coat and body, trifle out in front.

Irish Terriers were light, only three dogs shown. Quality not as good as we like to see, Killarney Kate being best on the bench.

Airedale Terriers, as might be expected, were a strong class, Rockley Ranger, the Toronto puppy, a good youngster, especially in head and front, but rather timid and large in ear, winning right through, being placed over Stoker Tim, this placing being questioned by some of the rail birds. It is to be hoped they will meet again.

Fox Terriers were not as expected, being below the mark; best in smooth was Clendenning's Checkerboard, who was afterwards beaten for the special by the winning wire dog, Rolleston Star.

Cocker Spaniels were a very large exhibit, with some quality and class. Puppy dogs brought out the Toronto, Ontario, winners, Bobby Kerr and

Brookdale Toby. The winner turned out in a very good black, Politician II., a sound typical specimen, followed by the parti, Bobby Kerr, a smart, active little fellow; 3rd going to Brookdale Toby, a good headed buff, but a little long in body. Novice, black, the winning puppy, Politician II. first, Darktown 2nd, a nice active dog, inclined to be heavy in skull. Darkie II., well known, 3rd. Limit and open classes, the same dogs repeat. Novice dogs, any other color, the winner, Nipper, is a very stylish little dog of the much desired color, dark red. Second went to Knickerbocker, much of the same type as former, but loses to winner in front and movement. Limit, any solid color: this class was strong, Brookdale Toby winning over the well known Chauncey D., who loses to the former in head and expression, Sandy II. being third. Open, solid color, placing same as in former class. Puppy bitches brought out Brookdale Violet, the Toronto, Ontario, winner, a very nice, typical little buff; Resnob Lillian and Victoria placed in order named. Novice and open bitches, black, Pearl a very nice sound, typical little bitch, was placed over the well known winner, Calmo Baby, the latter winning the cup for the best Cocker owned by members of Ontario Kennel Club. Open bitches, A. O. C.: seven dogs faced the judge, Brookdale Violet winning over Lady H., the latter not being at her best, being heavy in whelp; 3rd going to Garrick's Lady. Limit, A. O. C., the winner was the well known Dutchess Nebo, who is showing age. This bitch got her first blue ribbon under the same judge six years ago at Sherbrook, afterwards winning at Toronto and New York.

Bostons made a grand display, most of them being well known campaigners. The winners dog went to Peter Pan, Sir Preston William reserve. Winners bitches was captured by Queenie. Reserve, Lady Lou.
