

NOTES AND COMMENTS

The wanderers return: Leaving Montreal for Toronto on a recent Friday evening, we ran into that genial and evergreen dog lover Dr. J. S. Niven, of London. Dr. Niven was on his way home, having been in Europe during the summer months. A dog of any breed has an irresistible attraction for "the Doctor," and this time, accompanying him, came a West Highland Terrier from the kennels of Lady Aberdeen. This is a good colored dog, practically pure white, and is by Oronsay, a championship winner at the Kennel Club show and at the Scottish Kennel Club show of 1907.

This, as far as we know, is a breed new to Canada, and one that might readily become popular.

Built on Scottish Terrier lines, white in color, with a bit more hair on face, breast and body, and with perhaps a bit lighter foreface, the picture makes an attractive one.

Dr. Niven told us a good Bulldog came over on the same boat, destined for a breeder in Winnipeg. Barring being a bit long in face, as good as anything we have here, and an active one withal.

Mr. and Mrs. James Lindsay were also at the station, Dr. Niven and Mr. Lindsay being very old and warm friends. As Mr. Lindsay said, he and Dr. Niven are two of the old guard and "there aren't many of us left." That may be so, but we opine that either of the gentlemen mentioned can give the rising generation several valuable pointers on the gentle art of keeping young. May they never grow old is the worst we can wish them.

Mr. Lindsay hopes to spend a few days at the Thanksgiving season in and around Toronto, where he is always welcome.

C. K. C. cups: Owners of dogs who have completed the required number of points to qualify for championships should apply to the Secretary of the Canadian Kennel Club for these cups.

Cups are open to members of the Canadian Kennel Club only and the distribution is governed by the following rules:

"The winner of ten points in this class shall thereby become a champion of record, be so recognized by the C. K. C., and will, if registered in the Stud Book, be entitled to a Canadian Kennel Club championship cup. In the latter case, however, all points must have been won while the dog was owned by a member of the C. K. C."

"The above rule took effect on March 1st, 1907.

"Any dog that previous to this date has partially qualified for the championship title, shall be allowed to complete his championship under the old rule which was in existence previous to August 31st, 1906."

T. K. C. show: The Toronto Kennel Club has claimed May 23rd, 24th and 25th as the dates for their next annual show. A list of the monthly members' shows, given by the club, is printed elsewhere in this issue. The first show was held on Oct. 12th, the next being scheduled for Nov. 9th.

Mr. Walter Sands has been elected by the T. K. C. as their representative on the Executive Committee of the Canadian Kennel Club.

"Rideau": We are glad to know from Mr. P. G. Keyes, Ottawa, and from his own pen too, that he has not lost entirely the interest he once had in dogs. Mr. Keyes has one of the best Cockers he ever owned, and hopes soon to be able to commence

again where he left off. The Rideau Kennels at one time were strong in the Obo blood in Cockers and contested many a hard fought battle for supremacy.

Mr. Bailey retires: "Owing to pressure of business I find I have not at my disposal the necessary time to continue as an exhibitor and breeder of smooth Fox Terriers. I have disposed of my interest in the Clapton Fox Terrier Kennels to Messrs. Armstrong and Sutherland, who no doubt will continue to exhibit the Clapton Fox Terriers in the future. Thanking you for the space. Geo. W. Bailey."

Airedale arrivals: Messrs. Clayton Bros., Toronto, are receiving the congratulations of their friends in the arrival of a litter from their "Sweet Briar" (Champion Littleton Viking — Clipstone Dame). There are no less than ten-nine dogs and one bitch. They are by Fontmel Chief (Champion Crompton Oorang — Woodman Sceptre by Champion Master Briar), a great winner in England and recently imported by the Fontmel Kennels. The puppies are strong and healthy, showing good bone, and promise to make future winners.

Parbold Provost dead: The sudden death of the noted imported Collie Parbold Provost, is a bad blow for his owners, of whom Mr. Ormiston Roy of Montreal is one. We understand he left some good ones behind him and this may help alleviate the loss. It appears the bursting of a blood vessel was the cause, the dog being found dead in his kennel.

Old English Sheep Dog color: A breeder in the West asks the following question:

"Would a Sheepdog (Old English), sable color, be disqualified on that ac-

count, or would it have a chance to win, other points being extra good?"

We submitted this to Col. McEwen for his opinion, but he is non-committal. He says: Your favor of Sept. 14th on my return home I find awaiting me. The question of your correspondent I would not attempt to answer, as I am not an authority. In your varied experience I doubt if you have ever seen a sable O. E. Sheepdog and I should not be surprised if the tyke is nondescript."

We are inclined to agree with Col. McEwen. We certainly have never seen a sable but do not know if a hard and fast color line is laid down. Who knows?



TORONTO KENNEL CLUB.

This live organization held its first meeting after the summer recess on Tuesday evening, 28th inst., at the Club Headquarters, Wolseley Hall.

A very satisfactory report was tendered by the Secretary-Treasurer, both of the annual show, July 1st, and of the general finances of the Club.

A committee composed of Messrs. Bonser, Wilson and Leach was struck to look after all the details connected with the monthly club shows, the first of which will be held at Headquarters on Tuesday, Oct. 13th.

The shows are open to all breeders, and a list of the breeds to be taken up each month will be compiled by the committee immediately.

The Club has already filed claim for the dates for their next annual show.



BULLDOGS AT TORONTO.

May I crave sufficient space in your columns for a few remarks anent your "special report" on Bulldogs at the late Toronto show.

Your reporter prefaches his criticisms with the remark that "the judging of any exhibit of dogs is only the opinion of an expert," * * * "and should be accepted in the best of spirit, both by the ups as well as the downs," with which very worthy sentiments few will be found to cavil, especially when, as it is in the great majority of cases, the unbiased opinion of the judge.

If the "special reports" appearing in the kennel press were always of the same character — that is to say, the unbiased opinion of an expert — they would doubtless be accepted with better grace by those most interested.

It is scarcely necessary to mention to any one who has read the report that

dogs referred to are Crusader and Moston Leader. I shall pass over the "expert testimony" given as to the formation of Crusader, and confine myself as nearly as possible to replying to the criticisms made on his winnings.

In juniors the report reads: "The puppy, Crusader, was again placed first, the bitch, Milo Peggy, was fourth, they might easily have changed places."

I will just say that Milo Peggy was also at London, where Crusader was placed over Toll Bar Lil, the bitch which beat Milo Peggy at both shows. So much for the opinion of your reporter. The reader can take which he chooses, the opinion of Dr. Boulbee, or that of two experts like Mr. Maxwell and Mr. Mason. Further on the report reads: "Moston Leader took winners in a walk (Yes, and a mighty slow one at that), but how Crusader got reserve is a conundrum, his position was the serious error in the Bulldog judging."

How "serious" the error was, may be judged from the fact that the week following Crusader and Moston Leader met at London, and the judge, Mr. C. H. Mason, actually forgot himself so far as to place this twelve months old dog over the great Moston Leader, the dog that "outclassed" and "swamped with ease all his competitors" at Toronto, and Mr. Mason didn't even ask me the age of my dog. Here, again, you can take Dr. Boulbee's opinion or the opinion of an experienced and unbiased judge like Mr. Mason.

Moston Leader is referred to in the report as the most active Bulldog in the show. Well, if he was, he had the most delightful way of concealing it. His favorite attitude appeared to be that of the "Weary Willie" in the park — on his posterior.

When one man can exhibit dogs, hold an interest, direct or indirect, in an advertised stud dog, while he officiates in the judges' ring, and acts as special reporter on his own exhibits, it would appear to a casual observer as though there were "something rotten in the state of Denmark." What other sport I ask, would tolerate such conditions?

Trusting, Mr. Editor, that I have not encroached too far on your space, I am, very truly yours.

X FORMED DOG CLUB ON WHITE STAR LINER.

For the first time in history a dog show has been held at mid-sea, and it proved so successful that the Adriatic Kennel Club was immediately formed on board the White Star Line vessel of that name, for the purpose of holding annual dog shows at sea.

The 903 cabin passengers who returned on board the vessel had an unusually large number of dogs as pets and discussion as to their merits led to the holding of the dog show on October 5. Ten classes of dogs were entered. Dr. Ford, of Canada, and J. P. Manning of New York, noted dog fanciers, who were on board, acted as judges, and awarded the ribbons.

No. of Dogs 153. - Winner's Value 1 point.

SPECIAL REPORT BY THE JUDGE, H. W. LACEY.

Considering local opposition and the clash with London, the members of the Ottawa Kennel Club may well feel pleased over the good lot of dogs gathered for their show, Sept. 14 to 16. The arrangements for the show were good in that an excellent building is provided, but situated off in one corner, the dog show does not command the immediate attention of the passers-by, the flea circus and other exciting shows evidently being considered of more public interest in a bucolic atmosphere than man's best friend.

It seems to me that fair associations make a mistake in not catering more definitely to the dog. The wise farmer is indebted perhaps more than he realizes to the dog. As a watchdog, he has no equal! The Collie and its various alliances is a daily help — the cattle and sheep man cannot get along without a dog, yet this very useful animal, that in his variety and beauty draws better than almost any other exhibit at a fair, is usually side-tracked to some corner of the lot, while crotchet and quilts are given an elaborate building in the centre of the grounds. It doesn't seem to fit, somehow.

At Ottawa the judging ring is under a tent to one side of the show building, communication being through a covered alley, and I rather think that a sign to the effect that judging was in progress would attract the visitors. The ring was well served, Mr. A. N. Payne being very busy, assisted by Mr. Turner, Mr. Walters, Mr. Hillsdon and others. Everything passed off very nicely and judging was completed the afternoon of the second day.

In the language of the classics, the Ottawa officials had been "up against it." A house divided against itself is in a pretty bad way. Here, in a Canadian paper, it is not for me to jump into the merits of the snarl, but it is very difficult for an outsider and a sportsman to understand the carpeted and narrow nature that would insist on trying to spoil a show because the acts of the majority did not play to their hands.

The quality of some of the dogs was very good, especially in English Fox-

hounds, Bulldogs, Bull Terriers, Black and Tans, Fox Terriers, some of the Collies and Toys.

The special for best in show — the Earl Grey Cup, brought together a nice group, from which the Airedale, Colne Matchless Monarch, the Bull bitch, Lady Grey, the Fox Hound Rowdy, and Collie Lucy Glitters seemed to stand out. Mr. Thomas assisted in this work, and being much impressed with the charms of Lady Grey, she was finally placed reserve to the Airedale. Afterwards it was found that Mrs. Laurin was not a member of the Club, so the Bull got the honor, though the Fox Hound and the Collie were equally deserving.

A very pretty and keen competition was for the Ottawa Cup, given by Mr. Kent, President of the C. K. C. Mr. McLean showed his handsome Terrier Willowdale Golden Rod, Mr. Walters his very smart, well turned Bull Terrier, Epsom Lady of the Snows, and Mr. Hillsdon his clever Fox Terrier Oxford Rake. It was very close between the two former, the Bull Terrier losing in feet and through her disinclination to show off her tail carriage while the black and tan was showing in a way typical of his breed, and won. The Inaugural Cup and the Woods Cup followed this award, and then the special of best team of Terriers brought the Bull Terriers and black and tans together — a grand sight for one who fancies these breeds. Lady of the Snows, among her family, showed off well this time, and it was just a toss-up, the ears dropping over on some of the black and tans about deciding the issue in the others' favor. Either team would be difficult to beat in any country, and I doubt if it could be, as few kennels have four of such equal merit. There was a goodly number of breed specials that followed the awards mostly.

Mr. H. L. Thomas, the Montreal Bulldog expert, judged that breed, Mr. H. W. Lacy taking the remainder, and I would like here to thank the exhibitors for the kind expressions of satisfaction which were offered. It is so seldom that a judge gets anything but the "cracks" that this bit of smooth going was duly appreciated.

An old dog in the game may be allowed to say a word to our Ottawa friends, and that is to get together and the officials prove that the calumnies circulated were altogether unfounded; and then if the disturbers are not past redemption, and have any of the true fancier spirit, sink all differences and begin right now to build up a stronger club and so have all interests united for a bigger show next year.

Mr. Broderick, a prominent banker, supports his officers in every way, and it was unfortunate he should be called away on business in the West the week of the show.

Turning to the breeds I found nothing to crow over in St. Bernards, in fact several prizes were withheld, the only fairish one, light in muzzle and short in body, was Ch. Lochinvar. The bitches were very ordinary and winners were withheld.

The Great Dane was just a meat dog, and the Greyhound was too fat, otherwise would have been quite shapely. The English Foxhounds were a clever lot, the two best dogs being smartly set up with good running gear, third dog was a bit chunky and thick in shoulder and neck and wide in front. Mr. Wright had the best Americans, scoring in type over one or two English models, especially in bitches. Pointers were fairly good, the best headed being a leggy aeroplane sort of a dog that could do no better than second and third to a Montreal Pointer, a neat sort all over. Crystal Spring Florist was the only bitch present, Mrs. Waters' well known Pointers being absent. Mr. Walters' heavy colored Clonel showed age and was too chunky. There were no English Setters, but the Irish were very fair. The winning dogs were typical and one of the best had a broken tail and had to go to third. There was a very smart bitch, St. Elvans' Molly, out of St. Cloud's Rose, that scored all down the line.

Cockers came forward in fair numbers, so far as the ladies were concerned but the dogs were nil, owing possibly to the disaffection spoken of elsewhere. The black bitch, Rockfield Dusky Gem, has a capital head but

was out of coat. Cascade Daisy is a nice bodied Cocker and the soundest and most typical, all things considered, second a parti, very nice quality, but long in body and the third, Black Stocking, is rather too doggy and cocky, high on leg and carrying tail the same way.

Collies were a feature, and we were much impressed by a clean headed sort, although perhaps a bit bitchy in expression, well coated, well formed all over, that went through, Bobs by name, Ochill General being rather plain over the eyes, but a large, good coated one. King Edward Model is a good sort but out of coat and not so neat in the head as winner. Mr. Binning had most of the honors in bitches, and put down a real good one in Lucy Glitters, a cheap bitch at \$75; you cannot fault her much except her ears might be a little gayer or rather held closer and more erect. She was in superb condition: a tawny sable and white. The best bobtail, Bruno, scores a lot in head and size and body. Dalmatians had not enough white, and less fat would be more comfortable for coaching dogs.

Bulldogs had a nice showing for Mr. Thomas and his best dog was a good bodied fawn with black points, good skull, little high on leg. The puppies were leggy, both winners lose in depth of foreface, Lennox Bendigo the most, a long tailed dog with fair turnup. A cracking good bodied bitch, Lady Grey, a white with some fawn marks, scored in her sex and for the special; she is very good, deep and short in body, a bit wedge faced and skull recedes too flatly. Bull Terriers were a warm lot and Mr. Walters put down a team that would be hard to beat. He showed a very nice dog in Primical, one of Faultless Defender's, a slashing sort that "may or may not." Pat is not strong enough in muzzle and the lightweight was beaten before the eye. In the under 20 pounds we met one of the smartest of her weight, a miniature Bull Terrier, excellent eye, head and body, toes might be a trifle closer, but such style behind! The bitches were very strong. Epsom Lady of the Snows is a finely made bitch, excellent head and eye, well turned body, with lots to it; had she carried her tail at all and been a trifle closer in toes, she would have beaten the black and tan for the special. Ep-

som Muggins is a good sort but could be filled up better, and Epsom Lady Beautiful scored over Ch. Epsom June II. in cheek, muzzle, body and front. Lady of the Snows was returned the best in show.

Airedales produced a well built dog in Colne Matchless, rather smutty in tan but otherwise good color, a nice clean made dog, good top, lean long head, flat and well proportioned, Airedale expression, good ear and excellent front, tail a bit curved; he won the special. A son of Lucky Baldwin was the pup, The Groomsmen, excellent color, coat, good front and style, will do well we fancy but not furnished enough for the old dog. A very sweet bitch, if that term can be used on an Airedale, and I dare say she could show her temper on occasion like many another sweet lady, is Colne Estelle Drummond, also by Lucky Baldwin, who certainly seems to be making good as the daddy of something worth looking at.

Boston Terriers — Well, the best was a portly sort of rich coloring, the next best was thick in cheek and skull and was not so good in front as the winner. There were some others. Fox Terriers were also a smart lot, and there were some real nice Terriers, notably that bunch of nerves, Oxford Rake, owned by that good sport, S. Hillsdon. This is a cobby, good fronted sort with a nice sporty head and ear, just the size you like to see 'em, and gassy all over. The catalogue does not say what he is by. Oxford had another, Rector, that scored some in cleanliness of cheek, but not otherwise. Epsom Gilt as we remember it, was a bit on the leg but a good headed sort. In the bitches Lawrence Walters showed Epsom Lady, a very clean headed Terrier, good front and body but absolutely would not show at times, though a better, cleaner made Terrier in head and cheek and quite as good elsewhere as Lady; she had to give way for that reason. In wires, a cobby sort of good coat, was Paymaster, a son of Carleon. Bytown Clinker had a good head—what is known as a smooth head, but that was about all. Rideau Belle was far away the best bitch, the other two being off in ear and short heads and soft in coat.

Irish Terriers were a gay group, though there was nothing to get ex-

cited about, with the exception of the Drumclamph entries the class was just so so. They showed a good dog in Fair-Play, that is all big enough, and he took the special over their good bitch Red Crest, a nice bodied one with shapely head; another nice bitch not in coat was their Peggy O'Neil, and then came the bitch pup Donneybrook Peggy, rather a long backed one but nice, clean head and looks like making into a fair sort. Fullwell Lucy has a dandy coat, but is rather chunky built and short in face but a real sort. In Scotties the dog was long backed, faulty in ear, not pricked. But the bitch, one of the Colnes, is a very taking sort, excellent coat and front, cobby, might be a bit longer in head but capital ear, and why not? for we note she is a daughter of Invader, out of Clonmel Music. And Oh! you black and tans! Anyone who "favvers" this breed, as they would style it in the land where they came from, would have watered his "een" over such smart Terriers. There's a capital dog there, Willowdale Golden Rod, that is just about it, lean, flat head, good eye, nice markings and a short, smart body, short whip tail and any amount of style. Willowdale Kaiser is another that seemed to be better in ears and coloring than Gold Stick, the latter being dark. In bitches, limit had two good ones, but when it came to open and winners the superior head and body of Ch. Willowdale Beauty scored. The best we could do under the circumstances was ribbons in the classes and withhold winners. Of course we all know that Ch. Osborne Panch is the real thing, and though graying a bit he can still put to shame most of the pugs we see nowadays. A brown Pom with too much grey, and a Yorkshire that hadn't enough blue and tan, and another Yorkshire bitch that had not broken in back color yet, were among the troubles of the judge. The local class all got first prizes and there was a nice headed, rich colored Gordon

there, Crystal Spring Marvel, though a bit leggy. And then the McLean Blenheims. The bitch with a little more skull and face would be a real dandy, and she is one now, for her body is cobby and action good, the dog is on the leg and longer in body, a good headed one but has not the beauty of type that the other possesses. THE BROADVIEW BOYS' ANNUAL SHOW, TORONTO.

A dog show at the fall fair of this live institution has now become an established thing. The large marquee containing upwards of 100 dogs, all well benched, was by no means one of the lesser attractions. It bids fair to become the leading feature of the whole exhibition in a very short time. For the more popular breeds there was an open class for both sexes, in fact in one or two cases there was a puppy class as well, while those breeds not specially provided for came into competition in two very comprehensive classes, dogs under twenty pounds and dogs over twenty pounds.

Fox Terriers drew out a miscellaneous lot, nothing over a third rater in the class. The quality in Bostons was better, the blue eventually going to an active little dog, not a bad sort. Cocker Spaniels were about as even a class as shown. There were a couple of very fair blacks, the winners going to a lad named Huckle—a name somewhat familiar in Cocker circles. Dachshunde were also of good quality and fairly numerous. The judging simmered down to a little red bitch and a black and tan dog, both sound but of entirely different type. The small one was given the preference, a gay tail weighing heavily against the Black and Tan. A Bull bitch, not unknown to our regular bench shows, had everything else outclassed in her breed and in the end won special for best dog in the show, with a sweet little Toy Spaniel reserve. Bull Terriers were a motley crowd, mostly brindles. Collies were about the strongest class in point of numbers, two dogs standing well out in front, the winner, a sable and white that has a "King Edward" look about him and the other a very decent tri which gave him a good run for the money. A fair Foxhound and a few Beagles, a very promising Irish Setter puppy and a good Greyhound rounds them up so far as we can remember. In conclusion, "boys will be boys," and every real boy wants a dog. It is our privilege to cultivate their interest in the thoroughbred canine, and when opportunity arises let us do all in our power. As one of the judges (don't think me precocious—the title was forced upon me) let me commend this good common-sense organization to Gazette readers, and if any one, in a generous mood, should feel like helping the cause along, either by subscription or any other means (a thoroughbred puppy would make an acceptable special prize), he will not only be encouraging the boys and their instructors but will also be doing something for posterity of dogdom.

The former will be judged by Mrs. J. F. Fulton, of Victoria, who has always given satisfaction in other parts, while Mr. Roland G. Gamwell will officiate with the Cockers. There are nineteen classes allotted for Fox Terriers, besides sweepstakes, seven for Bull Terriers, five for Irish Terriers, eight for Airedales, forty-one for Spaniels, twelve for Pointers, twelve for English, twelve for Irish Setters, seven for Gordon Setters, twelve for Collies, whilst every other breed is on the schedule. Mr. W. Coates will again act as Superintendent in his usual jolly way and Mr. E. C. Powell looks like having another busy time.

In looking through the schedule I find there are no selling classes, some of these I venture to say would haveing an opportunity to fanciers to dispose of their surplus stock, also helping to fill the coffers. Again a class might have been inserted for fanciers who have never won a prize so as to encourage every novice. We hope that some of our Eastern friends will patronize the west, as they will find their dogs will be in respectable company. Entries positively close on Saturday, October 16th, and the entrance fee is one dollar for each dog and a dollar for every additional class.

LONDON DOG SHOW.

(NO CERTIFICATE OF NUMBER OF DOGS PRESENT RECEIVED BEFORE GOING TO PRESS.)

There was nothing much in the big dogs, a fair Bloodhound and a pair of fair Danes, till we came to Russian Wolfhounds. Here, the winning dog, Prince Alexis, is a good bodied one with the right sort of a head but not enough of it, easily led the class. In Greyhounds the winning bitch, Toney, has been a good one, but now shows age. English Foxhounds were pretty well represented, all the winners and reserves going to the London Hunt, with Glenmore Friar, Governor, Tulip and Dinkie. Only one Pointer, King, fair in head, light in eye, poor front but in grand condition. Setters were very ordinary. Mrs. Waters had the only Irish Water Spaniel on exhibition, a rather nice one that should look better a little later on. Cocker Spaniels were the pride of the show, both numerically and in quality. Puppy dogs went to Bobby Kerr and Brookdale Garry respectively, Martello again easily swept everything before him in the black dogs, being followed by the same owner's Standard II., a good headed dog, but not too good in front and in hindquarters. Winners dogs, A. O. C., went to Speculator with Mr. Dyment's red dog, Brookdale Bonfire reserve. Mr. Tomlinson again won in puppy bitches with a black bitch called Lydian. We liked her very well, though she is a trifle light in eye and could do with more foreface. In A. O. C. bitches, Mr. Dyment's Brookdale Violet and Nellie O'Neil were placed in order named without much trouble. Beagles made a fair showing, Messrs. Smith's bitch Welcome being the best in the class. Dachshunde were good. Mr. and Mrs. Saunders Daisy S. and Doctor from Guelph being winners and reserve respectively. Collies made up a comparatively large class, though there were not many new faces that got into the money. In dogs Skyboo Perfection and Otterburn Prince, and in bitches Prinella and Holyrood Trig went to the front. Sheep dogs few, Shenstone Mike again leading the van. Poodles fair. Dalmatians ordinary. Bulldogs were fairly well represented, but the awards in places puzzled us just a little. Mr. Dale's Crusader stepped out from novice and was put right through to winners, beating Mr. Hill's Moston Leader. We failed to

see the why and wherefore of this decision. In bitches, Mr. Preston's Toll Bar Lil won out: she is a fair headed bitch but could do with more substance. Next to her was placed Mr. Williams Sally Bombard, a fair bodied one with bad tail and front and losing also to winners in head. We hardly see why this bitch was placed over Milo Peggy or Sherwood Success. Airedales, only three, Mr. Mason reversing Mr. Maxwell's recent placing of Mr. Ussher's pair, Grayston Growler and Grayston Grumps. Bull Terriers turned out pretty well, the winners bitch, Mr. Thody's Stockwood Polly Perkins, easily leading the class. She is a medium weight of uniformly good quality with a little better shaped eye and a trifle more foreface, she would take some stopping. Reserve bitches went to Mr. Miles Queen Ann, a good bitch but with a poor pair of ears. In dogs Mr. Page's Cecil James made an easy win, another rather good Terrier outside of wrinkle on skull. Bostons easily held their own in numbers and quality. Peter Pan had not much difficulty in making winners again with Mr. Oke's Piccadilly Johnny reserve. Mr. Oke also showed a very sweet little bitch in Piccadilly Belle, which won 1st puppy and winners bitches. She is a nice fat skulled one with good tail, body and cobby action, and should improve when she fills out a little more. Bellinger Bros.' Miss Jack was the reserve bitch. Smooth Fox Terrier dogs made a pretty good class, mostly made up of the winning Toronto dogs. Lenvenside Lucifer again went to winners and was followed by Clapton Persist and Clapton Recoup, the latter a promising puppy with particularly good front and feet. Kenilworth Friar, Autocrat and Rebel were placed after them in order named. Kenilworth Bridesmaid was the winning bitch, the best of a moderate class. Wires, taken all through, were a stronger class than smooths. Nearly all the winners are pretty well known. Mixup, Rolleston Star, Oxspring Darkie in dogs, and Donington Siren and Donington Hope in bitches formed the backbone of the class and were placed as mentioned. Mr. Kenyon had everything his own way in Bedlingtons, while a very nice Pom, a good King Charles

and Yorkshire and a pair of Italian Greyhounds rounded up the small dogs.

I do not want anyone to think that I am kicking for what was handed to me, as I take it as a joke, as I have beaten the same dogs before and often easily, but when you see lame dogs that have their heads nearly pulled off to get them across the ring put at the top and perfectly sound dogs like Martello and Sunbrae Sis turned down, it is time to differ from your report that the judging was satisfactory. If I know anything about a Cocker, a good mover is a very valuable asset, and should be taken into account with other qualities. What is the use of wasting time having them move, or trying to if it does not count, as was the case.

In the red dog class there were some overlooked that are worth a yard full of some of the winners that lack bone, expression and movement. As this was the last class I saw judged I cannot go any farther, but from what I have heard from those who did see, the same farce continued.

I hope to see the opinions of others through the columns of your valuable paper, as they have expressed themselves outside.

No doubt there are cases where the best dog won, as he should do. So should every dog that has the quality to carry him through. The judging last year (1908) was the worst that came down, and your report said so, but how you can see as you do this time it beats me. It is all very fine for the judge to be a good fellow, but when it comes down to business the exhibitors pay their money to have their dogs judged honestly. Yours truly,
