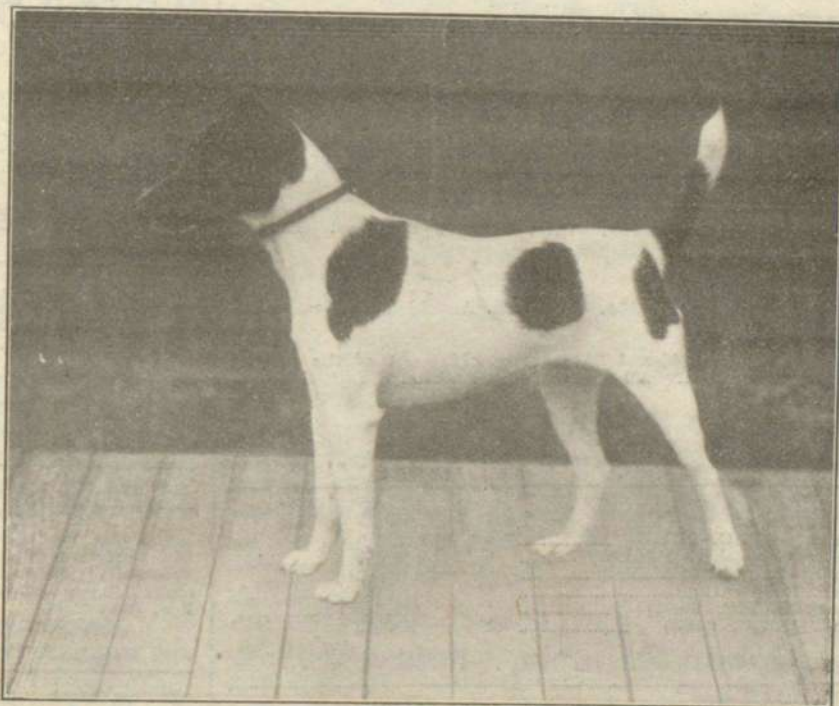

NOTES AND COMMENTS

The Old English Sheep Dog: In last issue of the Gazette appeared some correspondence on the Old English Sheep Dog. A question was there asked that we were unable to definitely answer. The difficulty is now set at rest through the kindness of Mr. Jas. Mortimer, the well known judge and show manager, of Hempstead, L. I. Mr. Mortimer not alone defines the color question, but gives us the opportunity of printing the whole Standard relating to the breed. Such a sturdy fellow as the O. E. S., with his immense coat of cold resisting quality should be more popular in Canada than he is. Some four or five years back there was evidence of a growing interest in the breed here, but this interest has largely waned for no good reason that we can see. As a sensible companion, as well as a worker, the O. E. S. will, we know, suit those who have sufficient time to spare in attending to details of coat and exercise. The dog is no house pet.

Mr. Mortimer writes:

Having been for many years a great admirer of the Old English Sheepdog as a utility dog and companion, and seeing the query, in your last issue, of a Western breeder, I will with your permission, give the Standard of the Old English Sheepdog Club of England as applied to this breed:

Skull—Capacious and rather squarely formed, giving plenty of room for brain power. The parts over the eyes should be well arched and the whole well covered with hair.

Jaw—Fairly long, strong, square, and truncated: the stop should be defined to avoid a Deerhound face. (The attention of judges is particularly called to the above properties, as a long, narrow head is a deformity).

Eyes—Vary according to the color of the dog, but dark or wall eyes are to be preferred.

Nose—Always black, large and capacious.

Teeth—Strong and large, evenly placed, and level in opposition.

Ears—Small, and carried flat to side of head, coated moderately.

Legs—The forelegs should be dead straight with plenty of bone, removing the body a medium height from the ground without approaching legginess, well coated all round.

Feet—Small, round; toes well arched and pads thick and hard.

Tail—Puppies requiring docking must have an appendage left of from 1½ to 2 inches, and the operation performed when not older than four days.

Neck and Shoulders—The neck should be fairly long, arched gracefully, and well coated with hair, the shoulders sloping and narrow at the points, the dog standing lower at the shoulder than at the loin.

Body—Rather short and very compact, ribs well sprung and brisket deep and capacious. The loin should be very stout and gently arched, while the hindquarters should be round and muscular, with well let down hocks, and the hams densely coated with a thick jacket in excess of any other part.

Coat—Profuse, and of good hard texture; not straight, but shaggy and free from curl. The undercoat should be a waterproof pile when not removed by grooming or season.

Color—Any shade of grey, grizzle, blue or blue-merled, with or without white markings, or in reverse; any shade of brown or sable to be considered distinctly objectionable and not to be encouraged. To this the

Old English Sheepdog Club of America adds "Pigeon or slate blue with white markings much preferable."

Height—22 inches and upwards for dogs; slightly less for bitches. Type, character and symmetry are of the greatest importance, and on no account to be sacrificed to size alone.

General Appearance—A strong, compact looking dog of great symmetry, absolutely free of legginess or weaziness, profusely coated all over, very elastic in its gallop, but in walking or trotting he has a characteristic ambling or pacing movement, and his bark should be loud with a peculiar pot casse ring to it. Taking him all round, he is a thickset, muscular, able-bodied dog with a most intelligent expression, free from all poodle or deerhound character.

For those who are interested in the breed I would strongly recommend "The Old English Sheepdog," by Aubrey Hopwood. It is written by one who is so thoroughly enamored of his subject that every line is a tribute of love and admiration for one of the most beautiful as well as the most intelligent of all the canine race. While the numerous illustrations (photographs of all the most noted dogs from the early history of the breed down to the present time) are object lessons, instructive as well as interesting.

Mr. Bates, too: Our Kingston friend, Mr. H. C. Bates, also adds his quota to the discussion and again definitely alludes to the color question and with Mr. Mortimer settles it finally. Mr. Bates' letter reads:

In this month's issue of the Gazette I notice a breeder from the West asks "whether sable color would be disqualifying, or if one of that color would have a chance to win, other points being extra good." In answer to that question, I would refer him to a book called "Show Dogs," by Theo. Marples, F. Z. G., recently published by "Our Dogs" Pub. Co., Manchester, England, page 179: "Color, any shade of grey, grizzle, blue or blue merled, with or without white markings or in reverse, any shade of brown or sable to be considered distinctly objectionable and not to be encouraged." So that I would say if that color is not correct I don't see how a dog of that color could win, certainly not under a judge who knew the Standard description adopted by the Old English Sheepdog Club."

C. K. C. appreciated: It is quite evident that the honest and persistent efforts of the Canadian Kennel Club to intelligently return a part of the funds entrusted to its care are being appreciated. Here is what Mr. Percy E. Dunn, of Longford Mills, writes regarding the medal he recently received:

"C. K. C. medal came to hand in good shape, and I am more than pleased with it, for I think it is of a beautiful design, and well got up. Later on I expect to have one of your Ch. cups to place among my collection." We hope so too.

Mr. H. M. Dymont, Barrie, Ont., goes further. He likes the cup his champion Cocker won, and in saying so also gives us an item or two of news. He writes:

"I must acknowledge receipt of Champion Brookdale Violet's cup, which is very pretty indeed, and shows good taste on the purchaser's part. Thanks for forwarding same in such short order.

"I showed Brookdale Bonfire and Champion Brookdale Violet at Danbury. The latter was in very poor shape, as thin as could be. She got two thirds to Lansdown Lady Santoi, a bitch that she defeated at Toronto Exhibition. Bonfire was 1st limit and

3rd open to Mepals Shotover and Champion Brynwood Rainbow, his (Bonfire's) sire."

King Edward Collie sales: The King Edward Collie Kennels report the following sales: K. E. Albina, K. E. Fancy and K. E. Pilgrim. Albina and Pilgrim have gone to Mr. H. W. Drury, of Englewood, New Jersey. Fancy remains in Toronto, sold to Mr. Gilbert Allen, of Wychwood. Fancy is in whelp to K. Edward Pilgrim, the sire of the winning bitch at the last Canadian National Dog Show. Fancy is by Ch. Wishaw Clinker, ex. K. E. Albina. Mr. Allen is only starting to breed Collies, and he surely is starting right.

Setter sales: Mr. Jno. S. Hickford, whose address is now Thoburn P.O., Victoria, B.C., has recently been sending some of his well known English Setter stock east. A recent shipment consisted of three dogs and one bitch. One buyer wrote the dog was as good as any he had seen, and was also sound in field sense. Mr. Hickford's persistent effort has been to produce dogs good enough to show and win combined with more than ordinary ability in the field. In his kennel just now are over twenty English Setters and one Pointer bitch.

Ch. Sabine Fernie: This famous inmate of the Sabine Kennels is a litter sister to Ch. Sabine Rarebit, is by Ch. Sabine Ruler, ex. Ch. Sabine Fad, by Result. She was whelped July 6th, 1907, and is registered in the A.K.C. under the No. 118,644. She has been shown six times, winning eleven firsts, three seconds and nine specials. She usually does team work with her famous litter brother, and together they generally account for any specials for which they are eligible. It is interesting to note that at Philadelphia and at American Fox Terrier Club Show she was defeated by Ch. Warren Remedy, while at Boston the reverse was the case, the younger bitch turning the tables on the Rutherford Kennels' great Fox Terrier that has been so many times "best in show." There is a third member of this famous litter that is almost as good as Fernie, but for ears that are not just right. The photo of Ch. Sabine Fernie given in this issue of Gazette is a striking likeness of her.

Clapton wires: Clapton Blue Bloom, that beautiful bitch sent over to the Clapton Kennels last spring from the Warren Kennels by Donald Munroe, and fresh from her long trip to Vancouver Dog Show, only stayed long enough in Ottawa to catch the first train to Toronto, where she has been sent for service to Mr. Charles Lyndon's well known wire Wande Co. guard. We are told this is a starter for a foundation for some wires that will at some time in the future appear at shows with the "Clapton" prefix. In other words the Clapton Kennels consider they have the smooths pretty well founded, and from this out will give a little attention to breeding a few good wires.

En route: Clapton Blue Blade and Blue Bloom exercised and fed at Winnipeg and Calgary on their long journey from Ottawa to Vancouver to attend Thanksgiving Day Dog Show. Alderman W. R. Milton, of Winnipeg, an enthusiastic dog fancier, met the train on which the Clapton Fox Terriers were expressed at Winnipeg and saw that the two campaigners got a good square meal of meat, etc., and at the same time exercised them. Mr. J. D. Barker, of Calgary, did likewise at Calgary, and by doing so enabled the dogs to arrive in pretty fair condition at Vancouver. This is a pointer for other Eastern fanciers who might contemplate sending to the coast in the spring. It certainly was a great help, and, needless to say, was greatly appreciated by the energetic proprietors of the Clapton Kennels, and no doubt the dogs also appreciated the kindness.

Taking advantage: Mr. W. Coats, Vancouver, B.C., bred a grandly bred smooth bitch to Champion Clapton Blue Blade during this famous dog's recent visit to the Vancouver Thanksgiving Day Show. We wish Mr. Coats every success and a flyer in the lot.

Death of Mrs. Oldham: We are pained to learn of the death of Mrs. E. M. Oldham, who, better known in Toronto as Mrs. Jack Brazier, was a frequent exhibitor of Scottish Terriers—and good ones—a few years ago. Mrs. Oldham died on November 9th, but no details have reached us.

London-Ottawa: Dr. F. P. Drake, Kennelworth Kennels, London, Ont., has mated the well known smooth bitch, Kennelworth Blue Bell, to that short-bodied, game little Terrier, Clapton Persist, by Ch. Sabine Resist, ex. Little Dutch, by Champion Dukedom. This breeding should prove successful, as Kennelworth Blue Belle is by Forard On, by Don Caesario, out of Norfolk Blue Bud, by Eton Blue. Dr. Drake is also contemplating sending another bitch to the above dog. Clapton Persist was placed 1st Canadian bred dog class at the recent Toronto Exhibition Show by Mr. Desmond O'Connell.

Some promising smooths: Mr. Arthur Delcorde, Pembroke Fox Terrier Kennels, has received a fine litter by Ch. Clapton Blue Blade, out of his smooth bitch, Flare Up, and another litter from the smooth bitch Sand Flare, by Clapton Persist. Sand Flare is the dam of Clapton Broker, by Ch. Blue Blade, reserve winners, Toronto Kennel Club and Winnipeg shows.

Bulldog sagacity: Dr. Alfred Boul-
bee, in the following incident, gives us an illustration of what first impres-
sions will do in the case of a dog. We persistently underestimate the intelli-
gence of "man's best friend," and the aptness with which he brings his rea-
soning powers (?) to bear on any prob-
lem that may perplex him. Dr. Boul-
bee writes:

The following circumstances of "Bulldog stupidity" or "canine sagacity" might interest the readers of the Gazette. Early last May I imported from England the Bulldog puppy Sherwood Regal Baron. He was whelped Oct. 27, '08, so was then about seven months old. Before his arrival I had arranged with Mr. Walter Sparks, Oriole Road, Deer Park, to keep him for me, so that on his arrival he was for about three hours at my residence, 27 Isabella Street. He was never again at my house or past it until Oct. 23. On that day Mr. Sparks left him at his house about 10 a.m. At 12.30 he was on my front door step. I

might explain our houses are two miles apart, through a thickly populated district. When it is considered that the dog was not yet one year old, was a stranger to Canada up to seven months old, the short time he was with me, and the fact that the once he made the journey, five months previous to his return, was made in a street car, how can you explain the circum-
stance? Some may say it was a strange coincidence. Hardly, I think, for Mr. Sparks took him home the fol-
lowing day (during his stay with me he was never out), and kept him on chain to break him from wandering. About ten days later one of his sons, desiring to exercise him, took him off the chain and went indoors to get his hat. When he came out the dog had vanished. An hour later he was in my back porch, having made the jour-
ney in the dark and pushed through two gates to get in. So much for the "stupid" Bulldog.

THE VANCOUVER SHOW — A COMEDY OF ERRORS.

The Vancouver Fall Show was held in the commodious Horse Show Build-
ing under ideal conditions and which, I hear, has turned out a financial suc-
cess. There was a good array of can-
ines and several new faces were wel-
comed to join the ranks in the arena. The quality of exhibits were better than has hitherto been seen in the West. I was pleased to see a few of the Eastern Terriers being present, the smooth Fox Terrier dog in particular is really a good specimen, although I do not propose criticising the dogs singly. To comment on the Terrier judging I can safely and unhesitatingly say that it was the worst of its kind I have ever witnessed, the judge appearing not to know the first thing about them. No doubt the judge acted according to his convictions, but at the same time some of the awards were unpardonable and I will prophecy that if we get a few more of that ilk we shall see dog shows getting their quietus in Vancouver. It is high time that something was done in the selec-

tion of judges and let the people of the West have their pets overhauled by one who thoroughly understands and who has seen the real thing. Another act which should strictly be forbidden (and which is not permissible in the old country shows) is that all stewards and officers of any kind should not be allowed to enter the judging ring to show their dogs with their badge of office in bold type thereon, which could not possibly escape the judge's eye. I noticed a few of the leading kennels of British Columbia were not represented, notably Mr. Bruce's and Chalmers' contingents, also the Eversholt Collies, Mr. T. B. Chappel's and Forshaw's. No doubt these gentlemen are now congratulating themselves on their sound judg-
ment.

WHIPPET DOGS RACE.

Oakley Flyaway Wins the Dufferin Handicap — Results.

The Dufferin Handicap, the Canadian Whippet Club's Handicap for Whippet dogs, was run on a recent Saturday at the Dufferin Park track, Toronto. Eight dogs were entered, E. Call's Trixie's Pride, Anderson's Prince Albert, J. Murray's Fred, W. Smith's Nip, Campbell's Oakley Flyaway and Oakley Swallow, Tovey's Steady Girl, W. Miles' Mrs. Nancy.

In the first heat four dogs started, Trixie's Pride, Nip, Steady Girl and Oakley Swallow. Trixie's Pride was first under the wire, with Steady Girl second. In the second heat, Prince Albert, Fred, Oakley Flyaway, and Mrs. Nancy started. Oakley Flyaway won by a length from Prince Albert.

The final heat proved a surprise to the talent. Trixie's Pride was conceded to have more than an even-money chance to win. The winner, however, proved to be Campbell's Oakley Flyaway, with a handicap allowance of 33 yards. At the crack of the gun all four dogs were slipped evenly. Oakley Flyaway jumped into the lead and set a terrific pace on the rail. Steady Girl and Prince Albert fought it out neck-and-neck four lengths behind the leader. Trixie's Pride was last, eight lengths behind. The favorite, however, running strong, closed up a big gap, but she was unable to catch the galloping Oakley

Flyaway. Campbell's dog won by a length and a half. Steady Girl got the place from Prince Albert by a length. The time was fast, 14 seconds flat. Summary:

First heat—1, E. Call's Trixie's Pride; 2, S. Tovey's Steady Girl; 3, J. A. Campbell's Oakley Swallow; 4, W. Smith's Nip.

Second heat—1, Oakley Flyaway; 2, Prince Albert; 3, Fred; 4, Mrs. Nancy. Time, 14 2-5 seconds.

Final heat—1, Oakley Flyaway; 2, Steady Girl; 3, Prince Albert; 4, Trixie's Pride. Time, 14 seconds flat.

TORONTO KENNEL CLUB SHOW.

At the monthly show of the Toronto Kennel Club on Tuesday evening, Nov. 9th, Mr. D. J. D'Arcy acted as judge of the Cockers. He awarded the first prize in puppy bitches to Mr. Flett's and second to Mr. P. S. Herd's Belmont Violet, and third to Mr. George Kynock's Rosama.

In the dog puppies, Mr. Flett's Brooklyn Hero got first place, Mr. E. V. Babcock's Braeside Peter got second, and A. L. Bartlett's Echo Duke got third.

In open bitches, Mr. P. S. Herd's Belmont Queen was placed first, Mr. T. H. Bonser's Resnob Lillian second, and Messrs. Bell & Kelly's Red Stone third.

There was only one entry in dogs, Bell & Kelley's Blue Stone and parti-

quently the match between Mr. H. A. Wilson's Red Diamond and J. A. Meadow's Argo.

Bulldog puppies were pulled off, Messrs. Boulton, Manders and Perkins being the trio of judges and all being unanimous in favor of Argo. This, however, being outside of the regular programme, does not entitle Argo to compete for the cup.

At the next show, to be held on Dec. 14th, Terrier night, Fox, Irish, Black and Tan, Scottish, Skye, Welsh and West Highland Terriers will be on the carpet for regular programme, besides this there will be a match between a three months smooth hair Fox Terrier bitch puppy, owned by Mr. J. Perkins, and each puppy not more than four months old, also Mr. G. Kynock's

Diamond, whelped in Canada. They are out of his bitch Balgreggie Lass. They are all sable and white and splendidly marked. We wish Mr. Parry luck with them.

DISTEMPER NOTES.

Germs do not at all times attack the same organs and membranes. But the discharge from the particular set affected contains the distemper virus in its most concentrated form. This accounts for the dread breeders have formed, through experience, of the nasal discharges of an affected animal, and for the vigorous objection frequently raised at a dog show by some veteran owner who has observed a careless attendant allowing the dogs to drink from a bucket he is carrying from stall to stall instead of filling the dogs' pans. Distemper is not transmissible to man, but is to cats, wolves, foxes, jackals, hyenas and monkeys; and as is the case in many highly contagious diseases, one attack successfully overcome with but few exceptions renders immunity from a second attack of the malady. One of the theories advanced as an explanation of this fact is that in contagious diseases the specific poison combines with some chemical constituent of the system which is essential to the production of the disease, and that after this constituent has been destroyed—as it will be through combining with the germ—and the animal has recovered, it is impossible for the germ to produce systemic disturbances again because the constituent necessary for its combination is absent from the system.

There are innumerable channels through which a dog may be infected with distemper. The germ is of remarkable vitality, and is conveyed through the air or on a person's clothes, or a dog which has already had the disease can convey the germs in its coat from a sick dog to a well one. The use of kennels, feeding dishes, or shipping crates that have been previously used by an affected animal are common modes of inoculation. Dog shows are a fertile source of the spread of the disease. The popular fallacy of a meat diet being productive of distemper is entirely at variance with all scientific knowledge, as all carnivorous animals are markedly free from specific germ disease. The morbid poison of distemper attacks in different ways,

color. He was shown against Belmont Queen for best Cocker in the show, but the lady captured the position and is therefore eligible to compete for the Prince George Cup.

The first place in English Sheep Dogs was awarded to Mr. A. Rumley's Woodbine Laddie. This completes the list of the contenders of the Prince George Cup for this monthly show, subse-

Silver Queen and Mr. H. A. Wilson's Red Diamond will come together to be judged for best to entitle the winner to compete for the cup. In addition, the French Bulls which were left over from the October meeting, will be added to the regular programme of cup contenders.

A hearty vote of thanks was passed to Samuel H. Thompson, proprietor of the Prince George Hotel, for his liberality in putting up the Prince George Cup for the best winner in all breeds of the sixth monthly shows.

OTTERBURN DIAMOND PUPPIES.

Mr. H. Weston Parry advises us that he has the first litter of puppies by Otterburn Diamond, formerly Wishaw

but breeders and practitioners as a rule recognize as typical only those cases in which the virus affects the mucous membranes of the eyes and nasal passage and produces a catarrhal discharge. In some cases the intestinal tract is the particular field upon which the virus exerts itself; or the liver may be affected, or the bronchial tubes. But the action of the virus that is least understood, and the symptoms most commonly ascribed to some other cause, is when it is concentrated upon the brain and nervous system, the animal dying from collapse without any premonitory symptoms, or developing epileptic spasms and convulsions, and other symptoms that the breeder ascribes to worms; and the puppy is dosed accordingly. I have had such cases in my own experience as a breeder, and my attention has been frequently called to this condition of things by others whose puppies have died in from a few hours to a week with all the symptoms of worms-fits, careful dissection, however, failing to reveal the presence of these pests or any other exciting cause; and distemper, from an absence of all catarrhal and febrile symptoms, would be the last thing thought of.

An attack of distemper of the ordinary catarrhal form is usually preceded by listlessness and loss of appetite; the animal avoids the light and courts solitude; all the symptoms of a common cold will then manifest themselves rapidly, as sneezing, a dry husky cough and a watery discharge from the eyes and nose; the animal shivers, seeks warmth and is feverish, the pulse ranging from one hundred and twenty to one hundred and fifty beats per minute; the nose is hot and dry, the lining of the eyes reddened, and the small veins that radiate through the white portion are injected with blood; the tongue is coated, the secretion of saliva is diminished, thirst is excessive, food is rejected and prostration is well marked and so rapid that at the end of a week the dog can hardly stand; the bowels are irregular; in the early stages of the disease there is a tendency to constipation, but the matter in the intestines, through the failure to digest sets up an irritation, and the discharges are more frequent and looser than in health, and the feces are dark colored and fetid. The discharges from the eyes and nose become puru-

lent, the nostrils are covered with a glassy, yellowish fluid, the cough increases in frequency, the bronchial tubes fill with mucous, which is coughed up, giving temporary relief, the animal vomits frothy yellow matter and is unable to retain food upon the stomach; the eyelids become glued together, resulting in blinding the patient; breathing is obstructed by matter in the nostrils; the breath becomes

fetid and has a smell that is peculiar to the disease; the lips are covered with ulcers, and the animal either becomes weaker and finally succumbs, or at the end of twelve or fourteen days the symptoms mentioned above abate in intensity and the animal slowly regains its strength. Complications, however, develop early in the disease, and result in the death of the animal.—Stock-Keeper.

Fox Terriers at Vancouver Thanksgiving Day Show.

Fox Terriers outnumbered all other breeds in way of largest entries. First came the smooths, and there were some very classy Fox Terriers indeed. No doubt the vast improvement in Fox Terriers here can be credited to that very much alive Club the B. C. Fox Terrier Club. The big card at the show no doubt was a couple of Terriers sent here all the way from Ottawa by the Clapton Fox Terrier Kennels. They were greatly admired by all the Fox Terrier fanciers, especially Champion Blue Blade. The wires were not so numerous as the smooths, but they produced one very good pup in Rogue Result, and a fine dog in Swansea Ormonde Bristles. In these two the judge failed to find their fine Terrier points, but every Terrier fancier who visited the show greatly admired them both.

Taking the Fox Terriers all around they were a very fair exhibit, and some promising youngsters were among them, which no doubt will be heard from at our spring show.

Smooth hair puppy dogs: First, Robert McEwen's Clinker, by Ingatestone Rustem ex. Leander Mayflower Clinker, is full size but a real Terrier, having a good muzzle and a beautiful small eye, good ears well carried, a nice neck, a good coat, the best of legs and feet and a short coupled body, easily the best in his class, and could have easily won first in novice and limit classes. The only two dogs in the show that could beat him were Ch. Beau Brummel and Ch. Clapton Blue Blade. Second, Robt. Gilmor's High Ball, by Red Leander, ex. Lady Van. This pup wanted to eat every dog in the ring; he has a good length of head, a good foreface, the best of

ears always carried right, the best of bone, and a nice level top, but he is too long in body. Third, H. F. Loeber's Butler, by Leander Club ex. Baby, a fine bodied pup with lots of good bone but bad ear carriage.

Novice dogs, first, P. Albertos' Jack Johnson, by Ingatestone Rustem, ex. Leander Lady, has neat length of head, lots of bone, good legs and feet, but is much too large and coarse all over. Second, W. M. Coats Resist easily a better dog all over than first. He looks somewhat like a Terrier. Third, Miss M. Coxon's Gentleman Snooks by Gentleman Joe ex. Essex Jingle. This dog beat every dog in this class by a city block. It was a hard knock to this young fancier to have the best dog in the class set back to third place. Gentleman Snooks is a heavily marked dog with a nice, short, cobby body and is a fine useful looking Terrier.

Limit dogs, first, W. B. Ferrie's Fighting Chance, by Ch. King Elf, ex. Duthorne Hops, a wire bred smooth, and he has every appearance of it, with his heavy coat. A very lucky win. Second, F. W. Welch's Sunshine Budget, by Buccaneer, ex. Aldon Fashion, a very fair Terrier with good length of head, a good coat and lots of good bone. Third, Master Geordie Tupper's Essex Mephisto, by Leander Club, ex. Rejane, a poor head but a very fine body, good and level on top, the best of good legs and feet and a short cobby body. A great pity this dog did not have a good head. He is bred in the purple, being out of a litter sister to Ch. Dukedom and by Leander Club. He has almost perfect bone.

Open dogs: This and the open

wires were the great events of the show. The crowd around the Terrier ring watched every move of Beau Brummel and Ch. Clapton Blue Blade, two very fine Terriers indeed. The judge looked them over for about twenty minutes and to his fancy Beau Brummel looked the best, so awarded him the blue ribbon. Not a bit of applause was sounded to this decision. First, F. W. Welch's Sunshine Beau Brummel by Earl of Doncaster, ex. Sunshine Bluebell Beau, has a long foreface, almost a perfect eye, a great length of head, fair ears, might be longer in neck, a good coat, somewhat long in body with fair legs and feet. He has a very flashy appearance and is about the right size. Second, Ch. Clapton Blue Blade, by Warren Blue Blood, ex. Warren Daffodil. Blade has a beautifully chiseled head, a good strong muzzle, a fair eye, nice length of head, nice ears and put on right, and are well carried, a proper neck and almost perfect short coupled body, with good quality of bone in his legs and fair feet. His hocks might be somewhat better. He is beyond a doubt the best Fox Terrier, smooth or wire, ever shown on the Pacific Coast, bar Tallack Dasher, and with all due respects to Sunshine Beau Brummel. Ch. Clapton Blue Blade is owned by the Clapton Fox Terrier Kennels of Ottawa, Ontario. The owners proved what great sports they are when they send two dogs on a six thousand mile journey at a great cost to compete at a ribbon show. Third in the open, A. McCreery's Phoenix, by Multnomah Boy, ex. Fury, only a fair Terrier, and away outclassed by his two classy competitors.

Puppy bitches: First, F. W. Welch's Sunshine Beulah by Sunshine Buccaneer ex. Sunshine Blue Girl, a short, cobby little Terrier with fair bone and good coat and strong muzzle. Second, Melville C. Hamilton's Harmony, by Leander Club, ex. Kamloops Ellen, beyond a doubt the best puppy in the class and should have been placed first. She has every look of a good one, a good head all through, fine ears and lots of the very best of good bone right to her toes, a strong tail and put on right. This bitch was very harshly treated, no doubt she will be heard from at the spring show. Third, Miss M. Coxon's Dusky Duchess by Leander Club, ex. Wanda, a very

fine pup, and should have ranked second in this class, a good head with a good eye, a fine foreface, a very good body, the right kind of coat, legs and feet, a useful sort. This one will no doubt go higher before she stops.

Novice bitches: First, Miss M. Coxon's Dusty Duchess, in puppy class also. Second, F. W. Welch's Sunshine Bessie, by Sunshine Buccaneer, ex. Aldon Fashion, a good strong bitch, lots of bone, good coat and good length of head, a useful sort.

Limit bitches: First, Clapton Blue Bloom, a flashy little bitch with a remarkable head which the judge could not get past. She has a good coat, but is rather too fine all through, her body, legs and feet. She is owned by the Clapton Kennels of Ottawa, and is by Warren Blue Blood, ex. Warren Rariv. Second, F. W. Welch's Sunshine Baroness by Sunshine Buccaneer, ex. Sunshine Blue Girl, a big strong bitch, good length of head, lots of bone and good coat. Third, W. M. Coats' Lady Van, by Multnomah Boy, ex. Sunshine Queenie, a fine headed bitch with beautiful neck, level top, strong hind quarters, but too long in body. A useful sort.

Open bitches: Clapton Blue Bloom repeats to the surprise of everyone but the judge. Second, Mrs. J. J. Bostock's Reminiscence, by Brockenhurst Minor, ex. Dainty Pickle, a grand bitch in spite of her age. She should have been first. She has a fine lean head, of good length and flat, a perfect eye, a good strong muzzle, ears put on right, and carried well, neck just right, with a good strong body, a level back, well ribbed up, with good hind quarters and good feet, the best of style and a swell coat. She is a good one indeed, and should have been first in this class. Third, T. M. McAuliffe's Wandee Ruffles, breeding not given, a very useful bitch but much too long. Reserve, F. W. Welch's Sunshine Bluebell, by Duke of Doncaster, ex. Heyden Guilty. This bitch is a good one and was certainly treated very harshly indeed. She should have beaten every bitch in this class but Reminiscence, but instead of going second she was put last of all. This was a badly misplaced class indeed.

Sunshine Beau Brummel was given winners; Ch. Blue Blade reserve winners. In bitches, Clapton Blue Bloom

was given winners; Reminiscence reserve winners.

Wire puppy dogs: First, H. Burns' Next Chance, a pup with a strong muzzle and good coat, very large ears and badly carried, much too long in body and with bad feet. Second, P. Alberto's Rogue Result. This is a good one all over, the only place the first puppy beat him was in coat. Rogue Result was easily the best pup in this class and should have been placed first. He has a grand head, good Terrier expression, a fine eye, beautiful ears and carried right at all times, a nice neck, a short body, with good legs and feet and a very fair coat. Third, H. O. Hartley's Galtee Rutland, a fair pup with a long body and rather big in feet.

Novice dogs: 1st, Hugh Slater's Slat has a pleasing head and a nice neck, a very fair coat but a very bad front. His fore legs are not good by any means, just a useful Terrier. Second, Rogue Result, in puppy class also, should have taken the blue in this class also, a much better dog than Slat. Third, Swansea Salex, owned by Stanley Dorell. Salex is a very fair dog, having a good length of head, a keen Terrier eye, a good coat and the best of bone, with a good set of legs and feet under him.

Limit dogs, wire: First, W. Gordon's Galtee Norfolk, a Terrier of the proper size, short, cobby body, a very fair coat, good bone, lots of style to him. A very taking one indeed, and looks a Terrier all over. Second, Reginald Hanson's Trewanta Pengelly, a very nice Terrier with a very good coat but wanting somewhat in bone, still a very useful Terrier.

Open dogs, wire: Here is where a lot of talk was noised about the meeting of Leading Chance and the new dog from England, Swansea Ormonde Bristles, a winner of over one hundred prizes under thirty of England's leading Terrier judges. The leading Terrier fanciers awaited this contest with great interest, but were disappointed very much on seeing the judge put Leading Chance in the corner before they could get a line on the two dogs together. However, the judge placed Leading Chance first much to the surprise of all the leading Fox Terrier fanciers. Leading Chance is too big all over, much too long in body; his best feature is his coat, which is only

a fair one. Second, Swansea Ormonde Bristles, a Terrier of the proper size, with a nice lean head, a good eye with lots of Terrier expression, well sprung ribs, a nice short compact body, lots of the right kind of bone, with good feet. As I said before, this dog has done a lot of winning under England's best Fox Terrier judges, where the company was much hotter than we have here. He could not have gone back, for he is still a young dog, being younger than Leading Chance, who never did any great winning in England and has yet to beat a good dog in this country. I can't just figure this case out. Leading Chance also received winners, reserve going to Slat, a dog which is beaten easily for reserve by Swansea Ormonde Bristles, Galtee Norfolk and Rogue Result. Cheer up, wire breeders, some day perhaps a judge will come along this way and place the wires where they belong, thereby straightening up this question of what a wire hair Fox Terrier really means. I have seen on one occasion a high priced judge at one of our spring shows turn down a very high class wire, and when asked his reason simply said his coat was not good enough. This same dog's coat was good enough for the same judge to give winners to at a previous show held only two weeks before he turned him down to an inferior dog in every way, but this one point. I think the judge here did the same in the same case.

Wire puppy bitches: First, Stanley Dorrell's Swansea Siren, almost a perfect eye, the very best of good legs and feet, also the right kind of bone, but bad ears and out of coat. Second, John Price's Trixie, a very nice little Terrier of a taking kind but lacking in substance. Third, Miss Margaret Gordon's Galtee Glamorgan, a fair head of good length and a fair coat but much too long in body and with bad feet.

Novice bitches: But one entry, same winner that won in puppy, Swansea Siren.

Limit bitches: First, H. Burns' Our Chance, a very nice little bitch with a good head, keen eye, right kind of ears and carried well, nice neck, flat shoulders and short, cobby body with a good coat and put down in good form. Could do with more bone, but at that she is a good all round Terrier. Sec-

ond, R. Large's bitch, name not given, a bitch with a dog-like head, strong muzzle, short neck and short front legs, which do not give her a striking appearance. Has a good coat. Third, P. Alberto's Queen of Italy, put down in bad form, out of coat, but a very flashy Terrier. Looks like a good one all over. When in form would make it warm for the winning bitch.

Open bitches repeats. Our Chance was given winners. In the kennel F. W. Welch's smooths were put over H. Burns' wires.

Puppy sweepstake, smooth and wire: First, H. Burns' Next Chance. This was simple an outrage to put this pup over M. C. Hamilton's smooth bitch puppy Harmony, who should have been first, and P. Alberto's Rogue Result second, with Next Chance an easy last.
