**Wanted, a reducer:** A Gazette reader sends the following:

"I do not know whether you answer enquiries through your paper or not, but I am anxious to know how to reduce the weight of a Cocker bitch which I have. She has gone up to 28½ lbs. and I am afraid to breed her. What is the best diet for reducing fat? I give her all the exercise that I can spare the time for. Would buttermilk be a good diet?"

It is evident you are not giving exercise enough. Cut out all starchy foods and feed once a day at night on dry "Spratt's" and a bit of lean meat. Don't attempt to reduce weight too rapidly or you may do more harm than good. Some families of Cockers seem to put on flesh readily, especially as age advances, say three to four years and over.

The Cocker is a sporting dog and should be kept in hard flesh.

**Montreal-Toronto:** The editor of the Gazette spends a good deal of time in Montreal, going up and down each week, and frequently meets doggy folk en route. At least twice Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Laurin have been in the same Pullman and so gave us the opportunity of a pleasant hour's chat on kennel interests at large and Airedales and Scotties in particular. Mrs. Laurin is quite as keen as her husband on dogs, in fact, as Harry Lauder has it, she is perhaps "the thicker of the twa."

Mrs. Laurin is getting together quite a little kennel of Scottish Terriers and

a little lady of this breed is her constant companion—a faithful one, too. The well known sire and show dog, Aberclyde, was imported as chief of the clan, but alas! a letter dated January 12th, tells us of the death of this grand Terrier.

He had done considerable winning at the leading shows in England, and was the sire of winners although only two years old last November. He was an extra cobby, low, thick-set dog, with a great head on a body, if anything too short, but of extraordinary depth and spring of ribs, powerful hind quarters and loin, great bone, very small fine ears, and keen hazel eyes, extra thick dense double coat. Weight, 18½ lbs. Color, grey brindle. By Ems Pretender, who is by Champion Ems Chevalier, out of Champion Ems Cosmetic, his dam is Aberheath, the dam of thirteen winners in four litters to different dogs, and by Champion Seafield Admiral. He was bred right and would have been very useful in the kennel, which already contains five bitches. But, try again, says Mrs. Laurin, and there are a few good ones left. Mr. and Mrs. Laurin expect to go to Europe next month when a personal choice will be made.

The Airedales have not been forgotten in any way, the Colne Kennels being the richer by one of the best three in England, Ch. Colne Freeman Terror, who has won over two hundred firsts and specials and no less than six championships. It was on his record as sire, however, that he came to Canada and not because he was a winner. He has sired many noted winners, chief being the sensational young bitch Champion Albion Lass, said to be the best Airedale in some years.

Another great Airedale to join the "Colnes" is Colne Cuidich an Righ, a big dog with the best of fronts and a tail that is set on to perfection.



New York Judges: Mr. Mortimer sends us the usual list of judges for the Madison Square Show of 1910, the 34th annual show of the Westminster Kennel Club.

Boston Show: The entire charge of the Boston Show has been placed in the hands of our old friend, Jas. L.

Little, of Brookline, Mass., the well-known Scottish Terrier breeder. The show dates are February 22nd to 25th, 1910.

Mr. Little pointedly says there will be no monkeys or trained dogs, but that the show will be all dog and nothing else. Canadians are specially invited to enter at and attend the show, and they will be given the freedom of the show and the city.

Another letter gives us the list of judges and a few general remarks regarding matters so far. He says:

"It may interest you to know that the N. E. K. C. Show for 1910 looks well as far as we have got. The management of the show rests in my hands this time. Mortimer & Lacey will be the all rounders. Fraser will take Scots and White West Highlands; Mr. Keyes (C. W.) will take smooth and wire Foxes; Winthrop Rutherford will take Irish and Airedales; Arnold Lawson, Bulldogs and Toy Spaniels, and Prouty will take Foxhounds. There will be others, of course, but so far we cannot say who for sure. It will be a straight dog show. The interest in this show and the general interest in dogs runs high down here this season, and as we are going into a year of great prosperity it will be none too soon to say the show will be a success. Wish us well, as I do you for a Happy New Year."

The following despatch appeared in the Montreal papers of January 18th. It isn't pleasant reading, but we give it for what it is worth. Mr. Lacey, in his report of the Ottawa Show, in *Gazette*, presages some such disaster. We are glad to know the annual show will not be jeopardized. We have all too few and can afford to lose none:

#### OTTAWA KENNEL CLUB DISBANDS

Ottawa, January 14.—The Ottawa Kennel Club is no more. There was a meeting last night, which was to have been the annual, but after reviewing the past season, it was decided to disband. There was a serious split in the club last summer, and it was felt by Mr. A. B. Broderick, president, and the other officers, and it would be useless to continue as a club under the present conditions.

The annual bench show, however, will not, like the club, become a thing of the past, for the men who were be-

hind the club have decided to form a joint stock company. Incorporation will be applied for, likewise permission from the Central Canada Exhibition Association to operate the bench show at Lansdowne Park under the usual conditions. Many very prominent citizens will take out stock in the new company.

From the American Stock-Keeper: Dr. Ford has certainly kept his advent into Scotia very, very quiet. Following is from the A. S.-K.:-

If there is one Scottie more than another that has appealed to us as a show dog, and a sire, it is Ch. Ems. Chevalier, and we shall not forgive Dr. Ford for not giving us the tip when we met him at the Waldorf last month, that he had purchased him from Mr. Cowley. Two years ago the dog was offered here at \$1,000, and though he is now 5½ years old, he is said to be better than ever. He is a Terrier that has not always been used as well as he might have been, but for all that his sons and daughters are trying hard to make up for it. He has sired two champions already, and champions don't grow on every bush on the other side, and he is the sire of the latest sensation at the Kennel Club show, Laidon Lennox. A dog like this should do us a lot of good, even if his home is to be in Canada, or perhaps the Doctor will keep him at his place in New York State. Anyway, congratulations.

## Boston Terrier Club Show.

NUMBER OF DOGS NOT RECEIVED.

The Boston Terrier Club of Canada held another very successful show on New Year's Day. Some sixty dogs were benched, and for quality they were about the best we have seen in Canada. Several Buffalo dogs were over, including Mr. Spangenthal's well known Delhi's Punch, and a string of Mrs. Brennan's "Revilo" dogs, all getting well into the money. The show was held under the Canadian Kennel Club rules, and though we have not at time of writing received the official marked catalogue, presume it will count for two points. Mr. Geo. C. Peters, of Buffalo, N.Y., officiated as judge, and with one or two minor exceptions, his decisions were just and not hard to follow. The show was a great success in point of attendance and the quality of the dogs, and we understand that it will leave a balance on the right side of the sheet.

Junior Puppy Dogs, not exceeding nine months—1, Buffalo Bill, a cobby one with a fair front, by far the best finished in the class, but thick in shoulder and a little coarse in head. 2, Jack, very young and ring shy, but a promising puppy. 3, Pony's Surprise, raw, but will improve. Senior Puppy dogs—1, Revilo Oxonian, a very clean cut puppy, but wants filling out. 2, Falconwood Boy, very fair all over, longer in body and tail. 3, Little Tim, loses in head to winner, and is low set. Novice Dog, under 17 lbs. repeat. Limit Dogs, under 17 lbs.—1, Revilo Oxonian; 2, Tom Boy, a nice one that might be fuller between the eyes; 3, Ted Shongo, a clean cut Terrier, but shown thin. Open Dogs under 17 lbs.—1, Lord Bellrock, an easy and very popular win. We have always liked this little fellow for he is a true Boston and full of character. If he were a little stronger in muzzle he'd take some stopping; 2, Revilo Oxonian; 3, Tom Boy. Novice dogs, 17–22 lbs.—1, Revilo Yankee, a nice dog, long in body and a little shallow in muzzle; 2, Willis' Derby Boy and 3, Happy Boy, fair ones. Limit dogs, 17–22 lbs.—1, Delhi's Punch, a white dog and a top notcher. He has a wonderful head, is short in body, clean cut all over and a good cobby mover; 2, Yankee; 3, Derby Boy. Open Dogs,

17–22 lbs.—1, Delhi's Punch; 2, Revilo Yankee; 3, Sir Preston William, a fair one that is pretty well known. Novice Dogs, 22–28 lbs.—1, Leon, a good headed one, but stilty and flat in the rib; 2, Owasco, a better bodied; he might have won; 3, Phantom, pinched in muzzle and lame, but otherwise a good one. Open Dogs, 22–28 lbs.—1, Peter Pan, a little lame; 2, Leon; 3, Owasco. Winners brought Delhi's Punch, Peter Pan and Lord Bellrock into the ring, all well handled and scrapping, winners and reserve going to two first named in order mentioned. Junior puppy bitches, not exceeding 9 months—1, Revilo Beauty, a grand little bitch of uniformly excellent quality, but just a little timid in the ring. She went right through her classes to winners; 2, Lady Selwick, a nice one, uncropped, and could be cleaner in front of eye; 3, Gypsy Girl, little low in shoulder, long in body and poorly cropped. Senior Puppies—1, Lady Selwick; 2, Gypsy Girl; 3, Pauline, a good bodied bitch, but with too much of the bull dog expression. Novice Bitches, 12–17 lbs.—1, Revilo Beauty; 2, Preston Peggy, an even, clean cut one, half white in head; 3, Lady Selwick. Limit Bitches, 12–17 lbs.—1, Revilo Beauty; 2, Victoria II., a grand headed bitch that loses to the winner in style, action and tail; 3, Miss Fritz, loses to winners in muzzle. Open, 12–17 lbs.—1, Revilo Beauty; 2, Victoria II.; 3, Auburn Miss Evelyn, long in body and lame, but splendid in head. Novice, 17–22 lbs., 1 Bell Rock Dazzle, an easy winner, and a good bitch, though a little thick in shoulder; 2, Topsy P, a fair bitch, poor color, long cast and wrinkled; 3, Cupid, also just a fair one. Limit Bitches, 17–22 lbs.—1, Lady Bell Rock III., grand in body, but head wedge shaped; 2, Topsy P; 3, Cupid. Open 17–22 lbs.—Repeat. Novice, 22–28 lbs.—1, Lady Helpless, fair bitch, bad front; 2, Abbey Belle, long in body and under shot; 3, Trixie B., a coarse specimen. Limit, 22–28 lbs.—1, Katy Didn't, a good bitch for a heavy-weight; 2, Miss Hurley, pinched in muzzle; 3, Abbey Belle. Open, 22–28 lbs.—1, Katy Didn't; 2, Miss Hurley; 3, Bolyston Lil, rather good bitch and

not unknown. Jean Berand, a very good toy, was the only one in that class. Winners, bitches—Revilo Beauty, Reserve, Victoria II.

be a parti-colored dog. Shaded sables should be shaded throughout with three or more colors, the hairs to be as uniformly shaded as possible, and with no patches of self-color. In mixed classes, where whole and parti-colored Pomeranians compete together, the preference should, if in other respects they are equal, be given to the whole-colored specimens, 15. Total 100.

## Points of the Pomeranian.

As adopted by the Pomeranian Club, the North of England Pomeranian Club and the Midland Counties Pomeranian Club, Dec. 10th, 1909.

Appearance.—The Pomeranian in build and appearance should be a compact, short-coupled dog, well knit in frame. He should exhibit great intelligence in his expression, activity and buoyancy in his deportment, 10.

Head and Nose.—The head and nose should be foxy in outline, or wedge shaped, the skull being slightly flat, large in proportion to the muzzle, which should finish rather fine, and be free from lippiness. The teeth should be level, and should on no account be undershot. The hair on the head and face should be smooth and short-coated. The nose should be black in white, orange, and shaded sable dogs, but in other colors may be "self-colored," but never parti-colored or white, 10.

Ears.—The ears should be small, not set too far apart, not too low down, but carried perfectly erect like those of a fox, and, like the head, should be covered with short, soft hair, 5.

Eyes.—The eyes should be medium in size, not full, nor set too wide apart, bright and dark in color, and showing great intelligence. In white, orange, and shaded sable dogs, the rims around the eyes should be black, 5.

Neck and Body.—The neck should be rather short and well set in. The back must be short and the body compact, being well ribbed up and the barrel well rounded. The chest must be fairly deep and not wide, but in proportion to the size of the dog, 15.

Legs.—The forelegs must be well feathered and perfectly straight, of medium length, and not such as would be termed "leggy" or "low on leg," but in length and strength in due pro-

portion to a well-balanced frame. The shoulders should be clean and well laid back. The hind legs and thighs must be well feathered, neither "cowhooked" nor wide behind. They must be fine in bone and free in action. The feet should be small and compact in shape, 10.

Tail.—The tail is one of the characteristics of the breed, and should be turned over the back and carried flat and straight, being profusely covered with long, harsh, spreading hair, 5.

Coat.—There should be two coats, an undercoat and an overcoat; the one a soft fluffy undercoat, the other a long, perfectly straight coat, harsh in texture, and covering the whole of the body, being very abundant round the neck and fore part of the shoulders and chest, where it should form a frill of profuse, standing-off, straight hair, extending over the shoulders. The hind quarters should be clad with long hair or feathering from the top of rump to hocks, 25.

Color.—All whole-colors are admissible, but they should be free from white shadings. At present the whole colored dogs are:—

White, black, brown (light or dark), blue (as pale as possible).

Orange (which should be as deep and even in color as possible).

Beaver, cream.

Whites must be quite free from lemon or any other color. A few white hairs on any of the self-colored dogs shall not necessarily disqualify. Dogs, other than white, with white or tan markings, are decidedly objectionable, and should be discouraged. They cannot compete as whole-colored specimens. In parti-colored dogs the colors should be evenly distributed on the body in patches. A dog with white or tan feet or chest would not

## Don't Like Mr. Bailey's Report.

I hope you will allow me space in your valuable paper to protest most strongly against Mr. Bailey's remarks to my dog, Leander Club, in your last issue. To begin with, the dog though entered was not benched at the last show. Mr. Bailey has apparently yet to learn that head in a Terrier is not everything, but that body, bone, legs, feet, top and above all, Terrier character are very much harder to get, and I think all the fanciers here will admit that as a stud dog, Leander Club has done more for the breed in these points than any dog we have ever had on the coast. I should much like to know where Mr. Bailey got the particulars of Mr. Bruce's financial affairs, as to how much or how little he can afford to pay for a dog. As is well known he (Mr. Bruce) imported Club and several other good dogs, and all true fanciers will agree that he has spent more in procuring fresh blood than any other Terrier fancier in British Columbia. I was quite at a loss to understand Mr. Bailey placing Wandee Ruffles over Blue Girl, but since reading his advice to Mr. Dorell (that if he wants to win he must show his dog under the man he bought him from) I can quite understand. Mr. Bailey sold Wandee Ruffles and was evidently practising what he preaches. Ruffles has a beautiful head but nothing else to recommend her. She is very long in the back, and has

the worst hind quarters of any Terrier I have ever seen benched. Blue Girl, though perhaps not a flyer, is a real nice little bitch, full of Terrier character, and hard to beat in such company as we get here.

I was greatly surprised to find my old dog's name appearing in an article in the December Gazette, written by W. B. Bailey. He says "Several of the get of the much discussed Ch. Coats Rogue appeared. These dogs show that Rogue should go to the lethel chamber instead of being used as a sire for wire haired Fox Terriers." Right here I want to prove by Mr. Bailey himself that this statement is false, unsportsmanlike and uncalled for. There were shown but two of Ch. Coats Rogue's get, and he gave one first prize and the other third prize. After making these awards, as your marked Catalogue will prove, then to turn around and write such an uncalled for piece regarding Ch. Coats Rogue as a sire! I may state that Ch. Coats Rogue had one dog pup and one bitch pup of his that in the year 1909 won nine firsts, nine specials and three winners classes. Ch. Coats Rogue's get has won more prizes than all the rest of the wire hair Fox Ter-

rier stud dogs in British Columbia put together. This record can be proven by the records of the C. K. C.

He also states Geo. Thomas hesitated at giving Rogue winners at Portland, Oregon. This is a new one on me, the first I ever heard of it. However, Ch. Coats Rogue's record speaks for itself. In one year's time he won twenty-one firsts, twenty specials, including C. K. C. Medal for one of the four best all breeds competing at New Westminster, B.C., Doctor G. S. Clayton, of Chicago, Ill., judge, and Western Canadian Kennel Club silver medal for the best Fox Terrier, smooth or wire, in the show at Winnipeg, Man., Jas. Cole, of Kansas City, judge, and his Canadian Kennel Club championship. Ch. Coats Rogue secured winners in the following places: Portland, Seattle, Spokane, Victoria, New Westminster, Calgary and Winnipeg, and reserve winners to his own son at Duncan's. Portland was the only place where he had no entries against him. He has beaten every wire hair dog in British Columbia, but Swansea Result and Swansea Ormond Bristles. These two dogs were imported after I sold Rogue. This is Rogue's record, and I think it is a good one, and I naturally feel hurt to think anyone would write such a misleading article. If Ch. Coats Rogue never wins another prize or sires another prize puppy, he has done now what no other wire dog has done in British Columbia, or perhaps in the whole Dominion. He is now getting on in years and perhaps past his best show days, but he has left a good record behind him. Many knowing ones have often said he was one of the best shaped wire Fox Terriers that ever entered a show ring.

Mr. Bailey also speaks of buying has-beens and getting stung. I don't think the Original Bill knows what he is talking about when he refers to Leander Club in this manner, for Mr. Bruce has spent more money in importing good Fox Terriers to this country than all the other breeders put together. And I may say Mr. Bruce was talking to me about going over to England this winter, and I remarked if I could afford it I would like to get a good smooth Fox Terrier dog out, and he said, "Well, if I go over I will ship you over a real good one, and you can pay me when you



make it out of the stud fees." He told me he made the price he paid for Leander Club in stud fees, so he could not have been stung very badly with that dog. Leander Club and Ingatestone Rustem have proven beyond a doubt to be a success at stud. Both these dogs were imported by Mr. W. D. Bruce. As to the remarks of wondering why such good dogs leave England at the prices the purchaser could afford to pay. For the benefit of Original Bill do you know Mr. Bruce is a very wealthy retired gentleman, who could afford to pay almost as much for a Fox Terrier as all the rest of the breeders in Vancouver put together. He imported six Fox Terriers, and they all have helped a lot to improve the stock in British Columbia. Geo. Thomas told me when here that both Leander Club and Ingatestone Rustem would help to improve the Fox Terriers in this country, and his words have come true. Mr. Thomas understands high class Fox Terriers there, for he recognized Leander Club and Ingatestone Rustem as two good stud dogs. This is just the same as going to a high class musical concert. To enjoy it you must first understand the music. To my way of thinking there is a lot of people who don't understand high class music, and a lot more people who don't understand high class Terriers. Therefore in many cases the good ones have to suffer defeat.

In answer to Mr. W. B. Bailey's rhapsody, which he wrote in his sardonic style concerning my remarks at our last Vancouver Show, I should like to reply to some of his scurrilous peroration. It appears that my friend assumes he is a clairvoyant, as he states that my remarks re the wearing of official badges were directed at Mr. F. W. Welsh. Nothing was further from my mind, as I have always found this gentleman a genuine sportsman, and W. B. is out of order in mentioning his name at all. Again, I do not aspire to those dizzy heights of beating Leading Chance, as I have already done that before this dog ever

What I write is purely in the interests of enhancing the breed in general, and my opinion is unbiased.

In an article in December's issue of the Gazette, over the signature of one W. B. Bailey, I note he refers to the importer of the smooth dog Leander Club, and the wire dog Ormonde Bristles, and endeavors particularly to belittle the first mentioned. In regard to Leander Club, I can only state that he was good enough in England to defeat such dogs as King Shilling, Walhampton Lubin, South Cave Splinter, South Cave Spearmint, Lis-mara Model, Avon Makaway Winning Post and hosts of others, any one of which were better smooth dogs than Mr. Bailey ever saw. Bad as he would like to make Leander Club out, he was good enough, under G. S. Thomas, to easily defeat the only dog he (Bailey) ever owned that in any way resembled a show terrier, Sabine Renown. I do not take so much exception to his remarks about this dog, as I do to his ill-bred inference in stating,—to use a word from his butcher's shop vocabulary—that I was "stung" in purchasing him from Mr. J. C. Tinne; as all the Fox Terrier world well know I got him from that gentleman, and you, sir, could not have appreciated what your paper was publishing or you would never have allowed this portion of the article to appear in your paper.

So far as the dog Ormonde Bristles is concerned, he was imported by me,—that is to say, I paid the purchase price of the dog for Mr. Stanley Dorrell, as that gentleman was anxious to bring the dog to British Columbia, knowing him from relatives in Wales to be a good one. Indeed, I think it was from his uncle that the dog came. As to the respective merits of the dogs Leading Chance, late Good Conduct, and Ormonde Bristles, their records on the show bench in England speak for themselves. Suffice to say that I could have bought the first mentioned for six pounds, and the latter I had to pay. I think, some twenty odd pounds for.

If Mr. Bailey means by the term "novice" that I am one, (Mr. Stanley Dorrell can speak for himself) in the game, I will trouble you to correct him, and to turn to your correspondence of twenty years ago, and prove to him that I owned and bred good dogs before he was ever heard of.

Touching the matter of importing and breeding winners, I can only state that upon my return from England some four years ago, I felt a good smooth dog was badly needed here. I therefore wrote to Mr. Tinne explaining the situation, and he sent me out Brockenhurst Boss, who unfortunately died a few days after arriving. In spite of this loss and Mr. Tinne's demurring, I prevailed upon him to send me another, and he sent me Leander Club, who cost me \$300. I also shortly afterwards imported from Mr. H. D. Wraith the winning dog Ingatestone Rustem. This dog cost me some \$200, but when one glances at the breeding of the winners in recent shows here, he is forced to the conclusion that these dogs have fulfilled my expectations in the improvement of smooths on this coast, and I in no way regret having bought them. Whether or not I could have afforded to have paid more money to get other dogs is an entirely personal matter. I have never attempted to make a living out of dogs, nor have I shown a dog as being bred by me whose sire I never heard of (and very few others have) and whose dam I never saw or knew of.

I have no knowledge of the criticism on Fox Terriers at the recent show held here until it appeared in the Gazette, but consider it in the main a



very impartial one. Indeed I was only in the building during the show a very few minutes, and that after the awards were made, but sufficiently long to conclude that the judge was too utterly ignorant to have ever accepted the position. So far as the criticism went, as I previously stated, it was a fair one, but the writer made altogether too much of the open smooth dogs. Both are good Terriers, but neither of them are fit for first class company. The Ottawa dog is the better in every section (except eye, coat and hind quarters), and could not possibly have been defeated by the winner unless the judge took unusual exception to his one outstanding fault, namely his hind quarters. The winner is too long in the back, light in bone, and has very indifferent feet; neither can move, one moving like a cow behind, the other stilty. The comparison of the winning smooth bitch with Reminiscence is nothing but a joke, she being just a Terrier, and far from show quality.

In conclusion, I wish to state for the information of Mr. Bailey, that I have quite sufficient funds to pay for a first-class passage, Pullman car, etc., whether I am going to England to a dog show or New York. Finally, I must assure you that I have only the very slightest acquaintance with this person Bailey, and that gained in a show room, outside of which I do not know him, and would not take this trouble to answer him were it not for the fact that the good name of a man known the world over as one of the first gentlemen in England was besmirched by him.

So far as the game itself goes, I am afraid that when I attempted to improve matters out here, I was tackling an impossible task, and can only see one hope for it, and that is more money, less cadging for prizes, and the thorough re-organization of the Kennel Club.
