NOTES AND COMMENTS

When faking is not faking: We read with unusual interest Mr. Theed Pearse's report on his classes at the recent Victoria, B.C., show. The report is printed in this issue. By a kind of negative affirmative, Mr. Pearse shows when faking—so called—is not faking at all, but inexperience. If faking means something done in an attempt to deceive, then faking (?) overdone, so that it becomes plain to him who runs, is not "faking" at all.

In the cases Mr. Pearse cites, it looks as though lack of timely preparation was the real cause of the trouble. Attempting to do the preparatory work of weeks or months, in a day or two, will never prove satisfactory to either exhibitor or judge.

Kennel Legislation: Mr. D. J. McMin, Ottawa, gave us the opportunity of laying the municipal law as it applies to license of dogs in the province of Ontario before Gazette readers. The whole question was referred to Mr. G. F. McFarland, LL.B., of the firm of Kerr, Davidson, Patterson & McFarland, honorary solicitor to the Canadian Kennel Club, and himself a well known Bull Terrier breeder.

Mr. McFarland, in his letter to the Canadian Kennel Club, goes into detail and prefixes his replies with the questions that brought them out.

Mr. McFarland's opinion is as follows:

Dear Sir:

I acknowledge the receipt of yours of the 28th of March, containing certain questions asked by Mr. D. J. McMin,

of Ottawa, and asking my opinion on the points submitted. I will take them up in their order:

(1) "Has a Municipality outside of the City of Toronto the power under the Municipal Act and Sheep and Dog Act to fix a tax on bitches at \$5.00? and to cite any Court decision.

A Municipality has this power under the Municipal Act, and probably also under the Sheep and Dog Act. The latter depends on the provisions of a recent amendment to the Sheep and Dog Act made during the last session of the Legislature, but which has not yet been published. There are no Court decisions.

(2) "Is a puppy under one year old taxable? What Court decision?"

A Municipality has power to tax a puppy as soon as it is born. No Court decision.

(3) "What is the opinion of the Legal Department of the Canadian Kennel Club on the law forbidding dogs to run at large when the license is paid?"

This will depend largely upon the wording of the By-law of the particular Municipality, but I believe there is no doubt of the right of the Municipality to pass such a By-law.

I trust these answers will satisfy your interrogator.

Sheep Protection and the Dog License: The following appeared some little time ago in a Toronto newspaper:

TO PROTECT SHEEP.

Proposal for an Increase in the Dog Tax is Approved.

"The Legislative Agriculture Committee decided yesterday morning to increase the tax on dogs, with a view

to protecting sheep. Mr. P. H. Bowyer, East Kent, was the sponsor of the measure that received a very vigorous support from the legislators. The Kent man explained that dogs were doing much damage to the sheep throughout the Province. He proposed, with the idea of discouraging the keeping and harboring of vicious canines, that every dog be taxed at \$2, and every bitch at \$5. The bill, he explained, did not refer to kennels. Mr. J. J. Preston, East Durham, opposed the bill in all its compulsory features.

The sheep-breeders were present and extolled the bill.

On the suggestion of Mr. Neely, Middlesex, the bill was amended to make the tax \$3 for the first and \$5 for all additional bitches, and thus passed. The committee decided that the law would apply to all municipalities, so that the province would be under one law. No petitions asking for a repeal of the dog tax law will be considered."—Globe, March 3, 1910.

It seemed so important to the secretary-treasurer of the Canadian Kennel Club that he thought it wise to draw the attention of the Club's honorary solicitor, to the matter. The following correspondence will show what is being done.

By the way, it is timely to ask here, are you a member of the Canadian Kennel Club, or are you willing to stand aside and let others help do the work of the Club?

Dear Sir:

I must apologize to you for not sooner answering your letter of March 7th, regarding the proposal before the Agricultural Committee of the Legislature to increase the tax on dogs. As a matter of fact, I was out of town when your letter arrived, and did not have time to take the matter up before the close of the Session. However, I think there is nothing to fear as far as our members are concerned, because I take it that the proposal mentioned would take the form of an amendment to the Sheep and Dogs Act R. S. O., Chap. 271. This Act specifically excepts from its operation kennels of pure bred dogs which are registered in the Canadian Kennel Register, and provides that the proprietor of such a kennel, on producing a certificate from the Treasurer of the Municipality of having paid to the Municipality the sum of \$10.00 as a tax upon such kennel, becomes thereby exempt. You will notice that the newspaper clipping which you sent me, and which I return herewith, states that the sponsor of the amendment explained that his bill did not refer to kennels, which I take to mean that the same exception is preserved. It is pretty hard to get at the wording of the amendment just now, but it should be issued in printed form very shortly, and I shall then take the matter up and advise you exactly where we stand.

Kennel License: Right on the heels of this comes a letter from Mr. R. S. Wilson, of Oakville, who has felt the pinch of the new law.

Mr. Wilson also gives us an item or two of interest and we are sorry to hear that the pleasant little outing to Oakville, that we have always so greatly enjoyed, has this year to be counted among the things not to be.

Mr. Wilson writes:

"Could you inform me what course I would have to pursue in order to secure a kennel license? The taxes here for this year are three dollars for first bitch and five dollars for each additional bitch. Well, I have three bitches, which would make my taxes \$13.00 per annum. I contemplate buying another bitch, which would make my taxes still higher.

I sold my Oakville Lord Chummy to Mr. Forman, of Buffalo, at Buffalo show. I got \$100.00 for him. I have a new bitch pup that I bought from Mr. E. E. Frank, of Irvington, N.J. Its breeding combines the best blood England and America ever produced. I will have her registered the first time I am in Toronto.

"The rabies scare has knocked the dog show here for this year. Although scare might be over before show time comes. I had committee fully persuaded to have C. K. C. show, but at present am keeping very quiet. Hoping you can furnish me with information re kennel license, I remain, sincerely,

Boston Terrier Show: While the Boston Terrier Club of Montreal had to abandon its Spring Show this year, owing to the rabies scare, we are pleased to know that it is now proposed to hold a show in the autumn of 1910. By that time, we hope, rabies may be a thing of the past.

A Sad Death: We were sorry to learn of the death of the wife of Mr. Jos. Smith, Guelph. Mrs. Smith was quite young in years and took a good deal of interest in her husband's fancy. He has our sympathy.

Rabies Again: A collie shown at the recent Ontario Kennel Club Show in Toronto, by a breeder in Winnipeg, still remains in Toronto, the express companies refusing to return any dog from a point inside the proscribed area to one outside. Their authority for refusal is contained in the following ministerial order issued on March 7, 1910.

We may add that according to the ruling of Dr. J. G. Rutherford, Veterinary Director-General for the Dominion, this order also prevents the shipment of dogs to the United States from points within the scheduled area. We have Dr. Rutherford's official ruling on this point. Following is the Order in question:

J. G. Rutherford, Veterinary Director-General, and Inspector under "The Animal Contagious Diseases Act," having reported that Rabies is known to exist in many widely separated districts in that part of the Western Peninsula of the Province of Ontario, lying west of the Eastern Boundaries of the counties of York and Simcoe, the said area is declared to be an infected place within the meaning of the said Act and under its provisions it is hereby ordered that for the period of three months from the

date hereof, no dog shall be removed from or allowed to move out of said area.

Dated at Ottawa, this seventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and ten.

On being questioned as to the reasonableness of the prohibition of shipments of dogs to the United States, Dr. Rutherford courteously gives his reasons. He says:

Ottawa, April 2nd, 1910.

Dear Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 1st, asking why this Department should forbid the movement of dogs from Canada to the United States, so long as the American Government does not object to such exportations.

In reply I would say that this Department has, of course, no jurisdiction in the United States, but it is quite within its rights in forbidding the movement of dogs from any part of Canada. It must not be forgotten that if any person within the scheduled area in Ontario were desirous of sending a dog to some other part of Canada, say Winnipeg or Montreal, it would, if there were no restrictions on the movement of dogs to the United States, be an easy matter to evade the regulations by shipping via that country.

Special Report on Terrier Classes at Victoria, B.C., Show.

JUDGED BY THEED PEARSE.

The Terriers comprised of some good specimens, but at the same time, there is much room for improvement—all varieties.—This being the first Coast Show that I have attended, makes it impossible for me to compare it with others, but there is no doubt, there is the foundation blood for breeding good show specimens. Certain prominent faults seemed to run through the different varieties, for instance in Airedales, light eyes and soft coats, Scotties, soft and too long coats. Smooth Fox Terriers, many lacked foreface and in Wires, the soft, silky coat was to be found in many specimens. Breeders should try and guard against these faults when mating up.

There is one matter, above all others, that I wish to draw attention to: The trimmed condition of the coats of many of the Airedale and Wire hair Fox Terriers, I have never seen dogs exhibited in such really disgraceful condition as were some of these. At first I was much puzzled as to how to deal with these dogs, that they were all liable to disqualification was undoubted, but here were cases in which the faking was so open and unquestionable and admitted that, in the true meaning of the term, could hardly be called faking and could not have been done with the idea of deceiving the judge. It lacked the malicious intent of true faking, and therefore it did not seem right to brand either dog or owner as a faker, which disqualification would have done. Consequently,

I did not disqualify any, but with the exception of two specimens that had been clipped down to such an extent as to make judging them a farce, and which I passed over, I penalized the individual heavily for condition of coat, thereby giving the dogs shown in proper coat a great advantage. Should I have the pleasure of judging the same dogs again, and on an equality for condition of coat, I anticipate some very considerable reversals of my awards here. I do not want exhibitors to think that I object to legitimate trimming, as I like a dog put down in the ring in good form; just as at this show were many specimens that were over trimmed, so also, were there many that would have been vastly improved by a little attention to their coat.

I should like to take this opportunity of thanking the Stewards who helped in my ring and also exhibitors for the way they received my awards.

The first class was for Bull Terriers and the only dog present was a Pit Bull, therefore, not qualified to compete. In bitches there were three moderate specimens. Mrs. Thomson Sharo's Lyncole Bedelia won in head and bone, but much too long in back and her eye, though small, was very light in color. The second was much too full in eye, though better color, lacked bone and weak foreface.

Bostons' had five entries, not much between the two dog entries, both much too long in back, the winner had best bone, front and muzzle. The

winning bitch, Narkeese, was much too fat, but had nice short back, good bone and body. Miss Kimberley, Second, very light in bone and long in back, very fair head.

Smooth Fox Terriers.—Mr. G. Florence's Coversea Revelry, had the dog puppy class to himself, nice in front and coat, but not good in ribs and bitchy in head. He also won Novice dogs with Caesar, too small and light, but a thorough little Terrier, that showed well. Second, Braeside, much too big, but in front and bone an easy first, thick in head. Mr. Coates easily won the Limit class, with Ingatsone Rustem, but had to go down in the next class, before Mr. Welsh's Beau Brummel, it was a near thing. Both dogs were put down in good form and well shown. Rustem is the better type and behind the shoulder wins being better in top, body, ribs, hind quarters and bone, but Beau has it in shoulders, neck, head and expression. Neither is particularly good in coat, nor a first class mover. One could make a nice Terrier out of the two. Beau Brummel subsequently won the C.K.C. medal for the best Terrier.

Old Champion Speedy came a good third, of course his age put him out of court in competition with these two dogs, but he is a wonder for his years; later on he won special for best Veteran in the show and well deserved it.

Smooth bitches.—Mr. Welsh brought a new one to win in puppies, but one I fear is not going on, she is too big already, long in back and very bad behind. Her neck, shoulders and legs are all that can be desired. She has a long head that looks like improving with age, and is full of quality. 2nd and 3rd to Mr. Florence, both bitches, too short in head, 2nd nice front, but too leggy, 3rd had good body and top. Novice repeats and Limits introduced Mr. Coates' Lady Rustem also winners, much too fat, lacking foreface and ears not nicely set on, but she is quite a useful stamp, good in coat, body and hind quarters. Second, another of Mr. Florence's Veterans, and one that shows she has been a good one.

In Wires, the winner, P. Alberto's Tobasco is quite a good little dog and a credit to his sire, Swansea Result, nicely balanced all over and a thorough Terrier, he wants bone and the less said about coat the better. He won Novice. Limit class was taken by Mr. McConnell's Swansea Result, and here I incline to think was the best Fox Terrier in the show if put down in proper form, to-day the condition of his coat was against him and then, too, he was dead out of form and a mass of honorable scars, as the result of a fight with a bear, but in legs, feet, quality of bone, he takes some stopping, a coat that is good, short back very well ribbed up, he moved stiffly and lacked go. Mr. Dorrel's Swansea Ormonde Bristles was

second, a dog that is perhaps hard to pick to pieces, and yet one that does not fill the eye, a nice corky little dog that would have made a lovely bitch. Third, Trewanta Pengelly, only fair, fails in skull, coat and wants bone, good body and style. Open and winners went to Mrs. Dempster's Bunch, who won on condition. A very nice fronted dog, but long in the back and too leggy, his head is short and lacks foreface. Bitches were poor; in Novice the winner had bone and a fair coat to recommend it. Limit bitches and winners, R. Large's Swansea, good body, short back and nice bone, coat only fair, inclined to be open, shoulders very loose and not straight, nice expression though head short. Second, Hanson's Trewanta Weaselle had the longer head and better ear, a good stamp, but barren in other points. In Scotties, Mrs. Bradley Dyne had quite a big entry. She won first and second in dog puppies with two brothers, terribly shy, but they beat Mrs. Wilson's Huntly Jock in head bone and front, though this dog showed well. Saanish Seafeld won in limit, easily, fairly, nice eye, but lacks foreface. Second, Mr. Maclaren, a showy little Terrier, but lacking in foreface and bone, very fair coat and body. Lindsey Laverock romped home in open, quite the best Scotty in the show. He ran the Airedale close for special. Bitches were short, Mrs. Maclaren won with Jill in puppies, showy but wants bone and foreface. An old veteran in Sandowne Brownie took winners, good coat though hardly enough and very fair eye.

There were three white West Highlanders, of which Mrs. Maclaren's Alastin was easily best, but he fails in color and coat, shown well.

Irish Terriers.—The winner in puppy Novice was much too light and bitchy, no body, color good and head and front very fair. Limit dogs and winners, C. B. Thompson's Western Arbitrator, won easily, none too good in front or coat, but in eye, head and general Irish characteristics, scores well. Second, shy and moderate in head, third too big. Winners in bitch to J. Wallis' Western Mona, good coat, but bad car carriage and full eye. Clodagh Second was too fat, hard coat but very plain head.

Airedales numerically were the strongest classes. The winning dog puppy Turk has missed being a nice one in legs, feet and bone, takes some beating, coat too is good, but horrible eye and expression and ear carriage bad and long body. Second, Western Jock, also bad in eye, thick head and coat very fair. Third, McConnell's Colne President, his very poor coat puts him back, has good head, fair eye, straight and nice front, lacks bone. Novice dogs, Prince the winner won in front, but long in body and short in head. Third shown in wretched condition, open coat, good length of head, nicest bone and front,

Limit dogs, Western Jock first. Second, a monster, but capital front, coat and body. Third lacks bone and foreface. Matlock Bob won in open, too big and light eye, but still a dog that takes some getting away from, his front, bone, coat and body are good, he falls away in hindquarters and is tending to coarseness in skull. Bitch puppy Dixie Girl, long in back, poor coat, fair front. Novice easily won by Palmer's Lake Dell Magnet, rather shy but put down in proper form can beat more than can beat her, in front, bone, head and color she is good. Limit and winners went to Majestic, nice quality and color, straight but weak in pasterns, coat good but lacks power in jaw and wants more bone. Second, moved very badly but better in bone, legs and feet.

Yorkshire.—Black and tans brought out one entry each and not striking.

Bulldogs were represented by Prince Royal II, who won special for best Bull, Boston or Bull Terrier. In French Bulldogs, the winning bitch was far ahead.

Daschund were all from Mrs. Douglas' kennels, some nice sorty specimens.

The Ontario Kennel Club Show held in Toronto, March 24-26, adds another success to the list of the O. K. C. In the face of the embargo placed on the shipping of dogs, the members managed by hard work to have it lifted for the outside exhibitors, and so held a very nice show of about 260 dogs. The building was an improvement on last year, the show being held in a new store, of which three stories were used to bench the dogs. The judging was finished in fair time, though a bit late. Enthusiasm was strong among the exhibitors, and the O. K. C. treated their visitors in a hospitable manner.

Bedlington Terriers were not a large class, 4 dogs in all, three of which belonged to Mr. J. H. Kenyon. His winning dog and bitch, Haslington True Blue and Breakwater Cis, are of the highest merit.

MR. MUNROE'S CLASSES.

Before saying anything on the dogs, allow me to thank the officers of the Ontario Kennel Club, one and all, for their kindness shown me at their show just over. True sports, like they are, should have better support from a city of Toronto's size, where so many good dogs of nearly every breed have been raised. It was rather hard on them that the law makers got the fatal disease "Hydrophobia" on the brain, just before the show opened, and I sincerely hope that there is one sane man left in power who will convince the timid ones that all dogs acting strangely are not mad.

In St. Bernards, junior dogs and bitches, Royal Oak, a real good young dog, when filled out, will bother some of the best. He beats his brother in expression, a dog whom I would say is at his best now. Stormer, of Parkdale, first in novice, is a good sound dog, but some day will be beaten by his younger opponent, Royal Oak; third, Bruce is not so good in expression and will never be high class. Bitches, Viola of Parkdale, one of the best bitches we have on the bench to-day, she had no trouble in disposing of Flardilice of Parkdale. Great Danes had two, one good one, that will hold his own anywhere. Russian Wolfhounds had three. The winning bitch can hold her own in any company. She is much ahead of the dog, and also shown in good form.

Foxhounds had nothing at all to boast of. In pointers, Mrs. Waters showed a real nice dog, when shown fit will take a lot of beating; 2nd, Lady Testator lacks in ribs, but can be shown with credit anywhere. Irish Setters had some good ones. Puppy dogs had a very good puppy in Bailey I.; when filled out he will be heard from again. In novice he was beaten by Shamrock II., a very symmetrical dog, who can hold his own in any company. He is real good in color, and of the correct type. Third, same owners, Jumbo, which possesses a good head, very good in neck and shoulders, and with a little more ribs can hold his own with any of them. He does not move quite as good as the other two. In open, Larry McCoy II. can go on winning in any company. He is the true Irish type and shown in good shape. Second, Mr. Scholes' Bobs, a true Irish Setter type, not quite so good in neck and shoulders as the winner. Third, Fiske O'Hara is Irish in body but off in head. In bitches, Brown Betty was easily the best, next to her when ready I would say was the winning puppy, a real good Irish stamp. Dalmatians had one good dog there, Sir Robert, He can do well in any company.

Colies, puppy dogs 1st Bellevue Mae, good in body, legs and feet, but not what he should be in head, outside of the winners, dog and bitch and two others which I think were called Prunella and Fashion there was nothing to cause a sensation. Otterburn Diamond Mr. Ford's latest importation is a big handsome dog with a very long head, but inclined to be on the Borzoi order. He is not too good in his ankles and feet and I would like to see more Collie expression, the winners bitch is really a sweet bitch and with a little more length of head could hold her own with any bitch we know of, she has a nice expression, good ears, nice neck and shoulders, with lots of bone, 2nd

to her was Prunella a very good bitch spoiled by loose elbows, she would not get up on them that day—3rd, a very good bitch that should throw a good puppy, she should not have been shown as she had bare patches on her hips that made her look lop sided, but when put down right will be heard from again. Old English Sheep dogs had only one and that a very useful sort.

Bulldogs, the puppy Argo went through to winners. He is a real sound Bulldog, though he lacks in face, not having enough turn up and depth in front of the eyes, but I thought he was the best. There was another good small one there but I haven't got his name or number, and another big one but have not got his number, that is a real good dog, but showing age. In bitches, Vinemount Cameo I thought was the best, beating the puppy Kynochs Minerva in Maturity. The Beagle classes were small, the puppy Melba was easily the best. Dachshund had one entry, a very decent dog. The best in Airedales was Graystone Ginger, There were a couple of other good dogs there but I have not got their numbers. In bitches, Cotswold Dolly was the best, St. Andrew's Bell 2nd and Little Venus 3rd. Only two Scotties turned up, dog and bitch, the bitch especially is a good one who can hold her own with any of them.

Fox Terrier entry was just an excuse and am really surprised that a city like Toronto couldn't send better ones, they used to harbor the best in the world there, but I am afraid they have gone to sleep. The best dog was Oxford Rake who has gone coarse; the best bitch was Dandy Blue Belle, she should throw a good puppy if bred right, being full of quality. In wires the best dog was Rolleston Star by old Coastguard, a nice dog but goes lame, and through that was placed under Queenie for best wire, she is more of a brood bitch.

Pomeranians were there in quality, if not in number, Cairndhu Narcissus, though I don't like his color when before me I thought was the best. He is a nice short backed one, and keeps his tail just where it belongs. He was shown in bloom. Sir Dandy, I thought at the time very leggy, but was told afterwards that I had looked at them wrong. I saw the dog afterwards and must admit that he did not show as leggy as I took him to be and would like to have seen them together again. When Sir Dandy is shown in full bloom later on he will probably turn the tables. In bitches, Mrs. Wylie's Dainty Mite was easily the best, she is a very sweet little bitch and shown in good bloom.

Notes From Vancouver.

The Vancouver Kennel Club held their 9th Annual Show, at the Horse Show building, on March 25th and 26th, which was probably the most successful show held in the history of the city. The exhibits show a steady improvement year after year, and several of the breeds can hold their own in almost any company. Perhaps the most noticeable improvement was seen in the Bulldog line, as several fine specimens were benched. The winner being Miss Spray's Prince Royal II, which also won last year and is now a champion worthy of the name. In Yorkshires, only two appeared, although good ones, both owned by T. B. Chappel. English Toys were fair, also Poodles. Pomeranians show an improvement. Scotch Terriers a medium lot, lacking what is hard to find—namely the good straight front.

French Bulldogs jumped from one exhibit last year to six, although Mr. Rickett's "Bon Soir" still paved the way and also becomes a champion. Fox Terriers still show very keen rivalry, and I am pleased to say here, that Mr. Stewart filled a gap that has been a long wanting one, and judged the Terriers according to the Kennel Club standard. Much interest was manifested in this ring especially after the recent controversy over our last show. It will be noticed by the

award list that several decisions have been reversed. Mr. Hamilton's smooth bitch "Harmony," which could not win the puppy class, (when it was a gift) went right through with winners credited to her name and rightly so. "Slat," the wire terrier which was reserve winner last time was given the gate and which I hear was purchased for five dollars at the show. Champion Leading Chance's career was also checked by my own dog "Swansea Ormonde Bristles," which was placed before Slat last fall.

Champion "Beau Brummel," which only competed for specials, still retained his reputation for being best Smooth in the show, "Swansea Ormonde Bristles" being best Wire. All the Smooth firsts were carried off by "Leader Club's" and "Ingatstone Rustem's" progeny with the exception of puppy dog, and that would have been captured had Mr. McAuliffe entered "Essex Major" here, as this puppy also took winners dog, running through from the Novice Class. So the imported stock indicates that the breed of Terriers has been very much improved by their progeny's subsequent wins. Mr. Stewart took ample time and carefully noted all the points in the ring, and judged in a methodical manner, scrutinizing points such as hind action, which cow hocked and stilty dogs have escaped in the past,

also teeth and eyes which do not seem to have counted in previous shows. Then again "coat" counted a whole lot.

The Irish Terriers were a poor lot and some of them never should have seen a show ring. The same remarks apply to the Airedales, although these classes were strong numerically, the quality was conspicuous by its absence, with the exception of Mr. McConnell's bitch, "Majestic," which took best in the show, and Mr. Doering's "Husky," best in the open dog. There was not a real good Airedale among the whole remainder.

Spaniels were very strong and Setters were never as good as seen here.

Pointers were also a good class, and Mr. Colin Jackson had a laborious task in placing these dogs in order.

Collies just about held their own. Great Danes are coming into prominence, but there was only one good one shown, and that was a strong cropped one with grand head properties, the rest were all too thick in skull. The winning bitch a bit on the small side. Mr. Pearse seemed to satisfy the owners of the exhibits, which were brought under his inspection.

A large array of cups and specials were ably presented by Mrs. Welsh at the close of the show, which, I hear, is a five point one, and a show which does credit to British Columbia.
