NOTES AND COMMENTS

Poison: Mr. James Stewart, Toronto, has lost by death the English Setter, Spot Melrose, a many time winner. Mr. Stewart suggests poison. We have in Canada now so few half decent English Setters that we can ill afford to lose poor old Spot.

A sad bereavement: Collie fanciers especially will sympathise with Mr. J. T. Reeve, Toronto, on the untimely death by drowning of his only son. The lad was seventeen years old and a vigorous swimmer. In the opinion of the doctors death was caused by shock or cramp, so fatal in the cold water of Lake Ontario. The sad event occurred on August 6th.

Mr. J. T. Reeve, it will be remembered, imported Ch. Woodmansterne Conrad, a dog that made Collie history in his day.

Dr. Mole dead: The editor of this paper was one of the first to welcome Dr. W. Mole, V.S., when he came to Canada from England many years ago. He lived in Hamilton for some two years prior to his change to Toronto, where he sought a wider field for his energies and ability. Never a robust man, he, in his quiet, smooth way, gradually found a foothold here that placed him at the front rank of his profession. A man widely read, he devoted more time to the dog and his ailments than does the ordinary veterinarian. An account of his death, which occurred on August 6th, is as follows:

William Mole, the widely known veterinary surgeon of Bathurst Street, died early yesterday morning at the General Hospital. Mr. Mole himself believed his illness was due to having contracted rabies a month ago, but Drs. Fotheringham and Tyrell said death was due to nervous breakdown from overwork. His death occurred in about twelve hours after he was taken to the hospital.

Mr. Mole, who was a graduate of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, London, England, in 1876, for years enjoyed a large practice there. Ill-health brought him first to Hamilton, Ont., and thence to Toronto in 1892. He looked after the city animals at Riverdale and High Park, and was also in the employ of the Dominion Government in a consulting capacity. The Humane Society also valued his services, and his evidence in cruelty cases was many times taken in the Police Court.

Mr. Mole was an authority on most scientific subjects, being a regular attendant at the Canadian Institute lectures. He organized the Toronto Association of Veterinary Surgeons. In religion he was an Anglican and fraternally a Mason.

The widow, three sons and three daughters survive.

Our front page: The Airedale Caerphilly Marvel was whelped November 3, 1905, his breeder Mr. Wiiliam Evans, Caerphilly, Wales.

This dog is a beautifully shaped Terrier of the best possible breeding. He has tremendous bone and substance, and is one of the most compact Terriers living. He has extra clean shoulders, the very best of legs and feet, good neck, grand level top and splendidly carried stern. His head is long and very lean and well chiselled, with small, dark eyes, and he has the best coat and color of any dog on the bench.

Marvel is sire of Caerphilly Admiral, winner of fifty prizes—mostly firsts—as a puppy. Now in England. Sire of Nomination (a big winner); Nomination, sire of Unexpected, sold to New York parties at a big figure. Tyrnant Beauty, winner first Crystal Palace, London, and also at Cardiff. York Four Leaves his latest, now in New York, imported by Theo. Offerman, Esq., at a big figure. And many other good ones.

His breeding is classic, his sire being Crompton Marvel, a son of Ch. Master Briar. His dam is the Ch. Rock Salt bitch, Caerphilly Princess. Thus on both sides Marvel goes back to Briar Test.

What little use has been made of Marvel in Canada points him out as a sure stock-getter, the sire of vigorous, healthy puppies.

Mr. P. Bawden, Ridgetown, Ont., is his owner.

Montreal Show in October: The Montreal Kennel Club Company is a new organization, of which Mr. H. L. Thomas, the well known Bulldog breeder, is manager, and Mr. J. R. Innes, Sec'y-Treas. Mr. Innes has piloted several big shows, and under his management the late show of the Montreal Boston Terrier Club was a great success.

These gentlemen have purchased outright from Messrs. Spratts Patent, the benching imported into Canada some years ago. They hope to be able to revive dog shows in Montreal, and incidentally to place them on a sound financial basis.

The Company, with this end in view, has claimed dates with the C. K. C. for a show to be held on Oct. 5th, 6th and 7th next, the locale being the Coliseum, on Guy St. A liberal clas-

equally well known on both sides the line. The entry is a bagatelle, \$1.00 for first entry, 50c. for each subsequent entry of the same dog. Judging will begin at 2 p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 12th. Dogs sent on from the Toronto Show will be cared for and fed until the show opens. A representative of the show will be at Toronto to solicit and take entries, thus making it easy for those exhibitors who purpose taking in both shows.

WINNIPEG DOG SHOW.

A CLEAN, QUALITY SHOW, THE BEST SHOW EVER HELD IN THE PRAIRIE PROVINCE.

The dog show held in connection with the great Industrial Exhibition at Winnipog was without exception the best yet. The quality was good, and the entries numbered 823.

The show was well benched and the dogs had every attention. The committee worked hard with the welfare of both dogs and exhibitors ever in view.

Mr. Swann, of Toronto, assisted by Mr. Kynock, took a carload of Eastern dogs out and managed to walk away with a good slice of the prize money in their pockets, the dogs under their care doing well. Dr. Foster, of Pom. fame, was also an enthusiastic eastern exhibitor and had a nice string of some 12 Berwick Poms. with him. Both Mr. Swann and Dr. Foster were loud in their praises of the hearty reception given them, anything they required being at their disposal.

Dr. A. W. Bell was as usual interested in the doggy end of the fair.

Mr. Theo. Marples, editor of "Our Dogs," came from Manchester, England, to place the awards, for the first time in Canada, using "Our Dogs"" award cards and judges' book.

St. Bernards were a nice display, Ignomar of Parkdale is a nice one, with a good head, expression and nicely marked. Prince of Parkdale, another nice headed dog, but hardly as sound behind. Keeper, second novice, is a very nice dog, but fails in size. In limit dogs the new one to get in the money was Pedro; second is a nice bodied dog, but is weak in foreface. In bitches, the smooth, Princess Victoria, won out, a nice bitch, nice size, but badly swollen in stifle. Lady May sec-

ond, a nice typical bitch. Flordelice of Parkdale a nice bitch, bit weak in head, but good body.

Great Danes were a fine class of Harlequins, The winning dog, Meadowspring Pascha, good in head and neck, foreface and color; second, Glen Rock Hylas, is a nice one, fails to 1st in foreface and front principally. Beechwood Billiken, nice, bit off in color. Bitches: the winning bitch, Meta H,, is a good all round bitch, excelling in head. Minerva H., second, was expected to win, better in color, front and chest. Beschwood Nyla third, fair. Irish Wolfhounds and Deerhounds were somewhat mixed. The exhibitors evidently did not know which was which. Russian Wolfhounds brought out a nice string, Dr. O'Brien's kennel being among the best we have seen, His winning dog, Genest of Rosseau, is a good one, nice head, well set up and nice coat, has size. Ch. Odin of Rosseau, second, is another good one and worker. In bitches, the winner Thelma of Rosseau, is good in head and has a nice body; second, Zola H., a nice headed bitch, but little out at elbows; third, Thora of Rosseau, also has a mice head, but lacks roach. Greyhounds were not strong, but contained a nice pair of blacks in Onie and Queenie. Only three Foxhounds put in appearance. Fatal won easily. Pointers were, as usual in the West,

Pointers were, as usual in the West, out in full force. The Western Pointer is generally a field dog as well as a bench show dog. Mr. Marples upset previous decisions considerably by taking a bench show type of dog, leaving the smaller field trial dogs out of it. Cash, first puppy, is a promising youngster, as yet undeveloped. Can

improve in head. Second, Starlight Peggy of Kent is snipy in head and has but a fair body. Canada Sport as first in novice, limit and open purely a bench show type of dog, hollow in back and straight in head. Unkas, second novice, but fair. Glen, third novice, second open and limit, little off in head, otherwise nice, good back, tail and front. Kamsack King is a nice one, short in back, very fair front, looks a worker. Lady Selkirk, first novice bitch and second in limit and open, is ordinary, weak in body, only fair head. Clip is fair, but coarse in head. Willing Wench nice but snipy. The winning bitch, Rodondo Prairie Queen, elegant body, all a Pointer, nice front but bit doggy. Lue Pearlstone third; good head, nice in body and front, English Setters: Ranger, the novice winner, has a nice head and front, good style. Cluaran Black Pride good in body, chest, legs and feet, but wedge shaped in head, and has too much drop before the eyes. Tige is fair type, but coarse in head. Winter's Sport, the winner, is a good one, nice head, size, an all round Setter. The winning bitch, Lucy Grey, good type of bitch, nice all round, but not up on toes. Fanny, we do not like, mediocre. Countess May Cam a nice headed bitch, very fair quality. Irish Setters were not out very strong. Killarney Mike won easily. He has a nice head and good color. Gordon Setters were only

Dalmatians, only two. Topsy is a nice specimen. Two nice Chesapeake Bay dogs put in appearance, the winner, Fieri Facias, is a very fine specimen. Irish Water Spanie's were out in goodly numbers, the much-talked-of Rass took Mr. Marple's fancy and went through to winners. He is a typical dog, good in head and body. Could have stood more fixing, looks a worker. Nora O'Brien, the winning bitch, is also a nice one. A few nice Retrievers were benched.

Cocker Spaniels a big class of good quality. Manitoba Duke took first in puppies, a nice bodied dog with a good head. Manitoba Bessie, second, is another nice one. Third, Bessie, a red bitch out of condition. Thelma, also a red one, nice but out at front. In novice, black, Ottawa Don, a very fair dog, nice in head and eye, took first, with Satan, a long bodied one, but otherwise nice, second. Third, Manitoba Duke. Limit went to that small but exquisite little bitch, Ottawa Iona, perfect in type and hard to fault. Second went to Ottawa Don, with Rellimderf Rowena, a nice bitch, with nice bone and coat, but is thick in skull and out in front. Open dogs : first, Ottawa Don. Second, Pauline's Dare, big and in bad shape. Open bitches, black, the new one here was Mabel M., third, strong in skull and long. Novice, A. O. S. C. than black, first, Ottawa Ne'lie, big, straight in front, a nice one. Polly, nice but short in head. Lady Nellie not in good shape. Limit second went to Brookdale Red Lady, a small bitch, nice type, sound. Blazer is a cobby little dog of very fair quality, fails in front. Open dogs, first, Brookdale Bonfire nice but shown fat and out of coat. Third, Rellimderf Red Man, fair, off on head. Open bitches brought in Bess, third, a big coarse bitch. Parti-color, novice, Black Hawk Fairy a nice bitch, trifle snipy, but otherwise nice head, good front. Second, Manitoba Bessie, Limit, first, Ottawa Romeo, nice, but out in front, good head, third went to Rellimderf Fairy, might be better in head, but a nice bodied one.

Collies: Puppy dogs was an easy win for Corona Magnet, might have been in better coat, but has the head and good ear carriage. Imera Pierre fails to Magnet in ear carriage, nice type, Sir Desmond is a nice dog but for a thick head. Novice, first, Braemar Surprise was the new-coner here, has size and head, nice front. Limit, first, Bramar Perfection, grand head, nicely carried ears, backed by a good

body. Ormskirk Oberon, nice, but hardly in shape, second. Open was a repeat. Puppy bitches, first, Corona Lily, is small, but has quality. Second, Bellina, could be improved in head. Same might be said of Imera Ruby, good body. Limit introduced the well known King Edward Prunella, who went right through to winners. She was in fine coat and is a grand bodied bitch, with a good head. Third went to Corona Daisy, nice, but out of coat. Weston Queen O'Quality a nice bitch, might have been placed higher. O. E. Sheep Dogs a fair lot. Poodles mustered six, of which Peter the Second was pick.

Bulldogs, puppy dogs, Stonehurst Beauty won from Bessie, the latter is bit long in face. Beauty is nice in face and turn up. Novice dogs, firs , Tommy Burns a nice cobby dog, nice skull, good turn up and sound. Second, Prince William, fair. Limit dogs, Kilburn Hercules, first, has a good head, foreface, but is weak in hindquarters. Third, Golden Star, a nice sound little dog, nice in front, could do with a little more under jaw. Open was a repeat through. We could not follow Mr. Marples in some of his placings. Novice bitches, first, Stonehurst Beauty. Second, Duchess Ivel, other than a plain face, has a very nice head. Crescentwood Tillie, a low bitch, well coupled, bit long in face. Winning bitch, Trafford Bullacity, is a nice one, good head, nice front and fair in rib. Two nice French Bulldogs and two Beagles were the o representatives of these breeds.

Fox Terriers, smooth puppy, Garry Bubbles won in dogs and Garry Maybloom in bitches, both dogs of qual tv in good condition. Garry Mainstay won the novice with Garry Bubble second. Mainstay is a stylish little dog, with a good head and nice eye. Bobs, third in limit, nice but long. In bitches, Sabine Famous, first in novice, has the style, good head and eve. Limit dogs, Oxford Rake, first, is a nice Terrier, could be improved in feet, but nice head, body and front. Ottawa Marquis second, and Cross Country third. In bitches, Aldon Mystery won out, a nice bitch in right trim, good head and eye. Second, Clapton Felicia nice, good head, but thick in shoulder. Open dogs brought out the winner, Clapton Blue Blade. It was a tussle between him and Oxford Rake, but Blue Blade had the best of it in legs and feet, so won out. Wires, the winning dog, Donington Prince, is a nice bodied dog, with good coat and head. Next to him was Silver Fox, loses in head, but a nice one. Donington Princess, a trifle long, but good in coat, head and front, won in bitches. Boston Terriers were few, and the winning dog, Edgewood King, is nice, but overshot. Dandy Hooker, fair, teeth gone. Lady Dimples is a nice bitch and won out.

Irish Terriers were a very fair class, the winning dog, Knockrea Moira, is a good headed one, has the stamp of an Irishman. Quarrywoods Dolinda, the winning bitch, is nice in body, good coat, but bit out in head. Airedale Terriers, Auckland Sensation excelling in head, won the puppy class. She has a good front. Jess is a nice bitch, with good coat and color. The winning dog, Auckland Lucky Stone, is a nice one, good head, coat and color, with nice expression. 'Cheltenham Venus, the winning bitch, is also a good one, has style. Grayston Reflector was second in dogs and is a good one.

Bull Terriers, the winning puppy, St. Bass, has the type and is promising, but would not stand up in the ring. Ch. Inferno again ran through to winners. He is well known. Was shown trifle fat. Edgecote Colin, second, is a nice one, good head and body, bit wide in front. Epsom Countess Grey was returned winners in bitches, she is a nice one. Lady Slick of Belmont, a light weight, was second, with Dudu Archdale third. There was quite a collection of A. O. C. Two nice Scotties, Bull Terriers. one Bedlington, Dachshunde, one Yorkshires, two one Skye. two Italian Greyhounds, two Pugs, a nice class of Whippets, two Toy Poodles, a couple of good English Toys and an excellent class of Poms completed one of "Canada's best" shows.
