THE National Live Stock Exhibition is almost upon us and already promises a great success, there being every evidence that many entries are to be expected, both from the United States and our Northwest, as well as from nearer home. It is well that the dog men have taken it up so enthusiastically and we urge every one to make every effort to push this show to a splendid climax, for the dog show has had more than one narrow squeak. The exhibition, as a whole, has its enemies, and for want of a more reasonable object for their opposition, the dog show

was seized upon. It was urged that there was no connection between a dog show and a live stock show, and it looked at one time as though the dog show might be thrown as a lunch to delay the wolves from devouring the whole exhibition. Fortunately, the committee of the show are composed of the very best of sports, with the broadest possible views on the scope of such an exhibition, and who never for a moment thought of surrendering even our dog show, and they won the day. Now it is up to us to show them what we can do so that we will have an additional argument and a strong one next year, namely, the big success of 1913.

Of course, it is hardly necessary for us to point out to our readers the absolute rottenness of the argument against a dog show in connection with a live stock show, or, in fact, any show or interest to our farmers. At a risk of repeating ourselves, we urge that our farmers are seeing the need of recreation and amusement and sport to vary the monotony of the daily grind. What can possibly combine all of these objects so well as raising dogs, and with an additional advantage of a good chance of profit? The mistake has been, if any, that the big cities and centres have monopolized the sport, whereas the farmers should be leaders, having every natural advantage over us in the city.

We have never been able to go as far as our English friends in the matter of cropping dogs, for we cannot reconcile ourselves to the appearance when uncropped where such is our custom; we confess that to us they entirely lose their character. But we strongly contend that the process of cropping must be done in the most humane manner, and that therefore in every case an anaesthetic should be compulsory. Under advanced modern knowledge it can be administered with practically no danger, especially by a vet-

erinary surgeon, saving the dog from all unnecessary suffering. Besides this, the successful result of the operation can be much more certainly secured by reason of having the dog absolutely still during the process of cropping and being able to perform the same deliberately, and finish up with proper dressing and bandaging before the dog becomes conscious.

Dog men in general, however, cannot be accused of deliberate cruelty, and only through ignorance are they guilty. We think we can give the palm to poultry fanciers for genuine cruelty. To remove twenty-five per cent of the feathers from a chicken to secure an even surface color is necessary in some breeds. We have seen a cockerel on exhibition with his earlobe sewn back to hide a defect, and this by a well-known and reputable fancier. But the acme was reached in the case of a show bird we know with only one serious fault, his comb, of the rose comb type, stood up behind instead of close to the head, as called for by the standard. He was sent to one of the best known fanciers in America to be faked. A wedge-shaped piece was evidently cut out under the offending point to allow it to come down to the desired position near the head, but, to keep it in place, the comb was skewered full of steel needles, and in such condition he was sent back to its owner to heal up. It was a good job and the bird won frequently afterwards.

We cannot too heartily commend to our readers and to the doggy public in general the plan mentioned in Mrs. Donald Shaw's article in this number towards interesting the general public in the maimed and halt in the animal and human world. Under the name of the "Lame Dog League," she has started a club with the object of educating our youths and maidens in the knowledge of the needless pain helpless animals are made to suffer. We think a very large part of the trouble is due



to ignorance and thoughtlessness. There are occasionally cases of wanton cruelty, mostly due to utter depravity, but the large majority of humanity are naturally inclined towards the love of

animals. It is generally through ignorance of the pain given or of how to avoid it, that cruelty is most commonly caused. The idea of educating the young to a thorough knowledge on this

subject is undoubtedly an excellent one. We confess we have no use for either the adult or child who is not familiar with some form of animal life, more especially as a hobby.

## CRUELTY AND EDUCATION

It is so long since I wrote anything for "Kennel and Bench" that the editor's request that I would continue the series for the November number came as something of a shock to me, and having moved in the interim and mislaid my papers, I am not sure where I left off, so I crave the indulgence of the readers of "Kennel and Bench" and inflict upon them a general and rather personal article this month. The Home Kennel shall be continued in the December number.

Since I last wrote for "Kennel and Bench" a tragedy has happened to me, a tragedy which has left me dogless for the first time for many years. Always before, even though they might be temporarily boarding elsewhere, there were one or two dogs waiting for my return, but now I have nothing—nothing but an empty collar and a useless tag—shorn of all I possessed of canine wealth in one short month. First little Down South, my faithful little lady, who never of her own free will was parted from me day or night since, at the sacrifice of several nights' rest, I brought her back from the jaws of death in a severe attack of gastritis. She was stolen, and in spite of all advertising and enquiries, has never been traced.

Next came the calamity which took from me Gowdburst Dandy, who, with his little mate, crossed the Atlantic only a year ago last September. He fell a victim to strychnine poison, administered by the hand of a neighbor. Dandy was the kind of dog who could be left in charge of the house or the children, with perfect assurance that it would be only across his dead body that harm would befall either. He bore on his wise face the honorable traces of many a street battle, and the dog did not live that he would refuse to tackle. Many of them had cause to rue the day when his vice-like grip fastened upon their throats.

The crowning blow that broke the family heart came when Spottie, the

one and only puppy remaining to us out of Down South's first litter, dropped in convulsions under the dining table one Sunday and in ten minutes was dead, killed through the same inhuman means as his father.

Spottie was one of those dogs that are born with good manners, born to be a man's companion and a child's playfellow. Had poison been administered to a child no one would have rested until the murderer was punished, but because it was only a dog that suffered nothing could be done, although the police themselves were as sure as though we had seen the deed accomplished, of who the culprit was.

So there it is, there is one home the poorer and one lawn which is never now defaced by the little paw marks which raised such venomous hatred in a man's heart. All this is as a preface and an explanation of what I really want to say. What has happened to me raised the question in my mind, "What kind of a brain must a man have, what kind of an education must he have received to render him capable and desirous of inflicting a terrible death upon flesh and blood, of wilfully robbing his neighbor of his property?"

And the answer undoubtedly is that the remedy lies more in the direction of general education than of punishment of specified cases. If children are universally taught that animals can feel almost, if not quite, as acutely, as themselves, if they are instructed along the lines which tend to widen their sympathies and give them an understanding of the physical and mental characteristics of the inhabitants of the animal world, they will naturally be less likely either in youth or maturity to inflict unnecessary suffering on dumb animals or fellow men.

There is often a good deal of misunderstanding as to what is cruelty and what is not, and many people, with the best intentions in the world, confound the two, and are apt to think

that a little wholesome discipline, a little wholesome starvation, is cruelty, while at the same time they would be astonished if they were told that they themselves were guilty of cruelty in keeping a dog in too close confinement or of housing their pet canary in one of those gilt abominations in the way of cages which are so popular.

The average Canadian household is generally devoid of pets, and the children are discouraged from keeping them. Yet I think if mothers realized that it was really better for the children to keep as many animals and birds and living things about them as space permits in order that they should learn by this means to understand them better, they would sacrifice a little floor polish and run the risk of a little disturbance of their immaculately-kept rooms for the good that may result therefrom to the human and animal worlds.

Children lose much both in childhood and after life by not learning to understand animals and nature, and there is no possible doubt that where the study of both is taught and encouraged in a rational manner there will be a corresponding diminution of the terrible needless suffering of the dumb creation which now goes on practically unchecked. Public opinion is the strongest power that can be brought into force, and so soon as public opinion can be made to realize to the full what is taking place every day before their eyes there will be no need for Humane Societies and their off-shoots. It is the natural desire of everyone to raise a monument to those loved ones who have departed from this life so that all men may know of their loss and grief. It was my natural and instinctive desire to raise such a monument to the memories of Down South, Gowdburst Dandy and Spottie, three of the most loyal and loving friends ever bestowed upon a human being.

But the monument to their memories is not of stone or marble, it bears



no record of those who lie silent beneath it, it stands to-day in its infancy before the world in the form of a league for encouraging children to understand animals intelligently and to do their part towards helping to relieve the terrible needless suffering inflicted by the ignorant and thoughtless upon the dumb creation and upon the human race.

Weekly Mail and Empire may be aware that a new feature has been introduced into it this month—The *Lame Dogs' League*. Its motto and its rules explain its purpose.

#### THE BULLDOG BREEDERS' ASSOCIATION OF CANADA.

##### October Meeting.

This association held another of their successful evening shows, at which some puppies of more than usual merit made their first appearance in the ring.

Very keen interest was evinced in the challenge issued by Mr. Farquharson, who, with a three-month pup by Homewood Jumbo, challenged any pup under six months of age. Mr. Bailey accepted, and put in the ring a puppy of very great promise, sired by his own stud dog. These two pups are veritable rods in pickle and will, when a little older, make some of the older ones travel.

The judge for the evening was Mr. Preston, who performed his duties in a very capable manner. His decision in the challenge was in favor of the Homewood Jumbo pup, who won probably on a little more maturity than his more youthful competitor.

An open class for dog and bitch puppies under six months brought out two bitch pups of the cart-horse type, sired by Mr. Morris' Hazelmere Orry, and a nice pup by Argo. The two dog pups mentioned above were first and second in this class, third going to one of Mr. Morris' puppies.

Next class, for pups over six months, produced a dog pup owned by Mr. Wilson, and a bitch pup owned by Mr. Farquharson. The award went to Mr. Wilson's entry, a wonderful fronted and ribbed pup, but losing in skull and under jaw to the bitch pup.

In the open class for dogs and bitches, Mr. Schumacher's Iron Chancellor got the blue. Kordell's Rydal Stone, a good second, and the rest not in sight.

#### MAD, ALL BUT THE DOG.

A mad dog does not rush!

A mad dog does not attack!

A mad dog does not froth at the mouth!

A mad dog will not fight back even when cornered!

The symptoms usually described as those of rabies are only those of a simple form of epilepsy or nervous disorder and they are not contagious.

Hydrophobia is not caused by heat; epilepsy is. Hydrophobia is only communicable by a bite; epilepsy is not communicable at all. Dogs suffering from hydrophobia do not froth at the mouth; epileptics do.

The people should bear in mind that a certain number of stray dogs come into the city from the surrounding counties. They are very naturally frightened by the noises of the city, and when hunger and thirst are added to this fear, a harsh word or a stone thrown at them may start a running fit.

By far the greater portion of dogs developing these symptoms are suffering from intense nervous excitement; nearly all of them have an increased flow of saliva and the eyes assume a look of terror when the animal is pursued by a yelling crowd. These dogs, of course, are not suffering from hydrophobia, and their one idea, overcome with frenzy, is to run away from their pursuers.

Many dogs when constipated are subject to fits, which are preceded by a period of confused running along the streets and followed by a short period of unconsciousness. They have no tendency to bite.

Let a poor little house dog, unaccustomed to roughing it for himself, become nervously excited by the din of the street, or overheated on a hot summer day, and some fool raises the cry of mad dog and shies a brick. The dog

runs, and that is enough. Men are but savages under restraint and anything that runs must necessarily be guilty, and soon a howling mob is in pursuit and the dog is lucky indeed that escapes.

Every large city has a dog pound; hundreds of men are employed as dog catchers. They are frequently bitten. Did any one of them ever have hydrophobia?

Hundreds of men in this country keep dog kennels and raise dogs for sale; other hundreds make a business of training dogs for field trials, hunting and performing? They are frequently bitten. Did any of them ever have hydrophobia?

Keep your dogs indoors and in as cool a place as possible during the hottest portion of each day, letting the animal out for exercise in the very early hours of the morning and in the cool of the evening.

The reason for this is that the nervous system of animals is, if anything, more susceptible to the effect of excessive heat than that of human beings.

This is all the more pronounced because of the heavy coats of hair with which many of our domestic beasts are covered.

Give your dog as little meat as possible, but do not forget to give him a dish of boiled liver once a week to keep his bowels in good order.

Do not permit any of your children to tease or worry the dog when he is suffering from the heat.

Give plenty of water. Give the dog a chance.

The Morris Refuge Association, of Philadelphia, in the last twenty-five years, has handled 1,001,795 small animals, a large number of which were dogs. Its superintendent says that, while its employees have all been bitten, often severely, no serious results have followed.—Southern Kennel.



# TORONTO KENNEL CLUB FIELD TRIALS

Once more has the Toronto Kennel Club demonstrated that it is entirely feasible to conduct a field trial for Beagles and Harriers. Wednesday, October 22nd, 1913, the second annual field trials of the above club were held in the neighborhood of Wilcox Lake, Ont. The club chartered a private car from the Toronto & York Radial for the convenient transportation of those desirous of attending the meet. Among those present were Messrs. T. E. Milburn, Arthur Atkinson, president Toronto Kennel Club; Geo. Tetaert, E. Sharp, W. C. Demmit, J. Aldersley, W. J. Archibald, Sam Pearsall, Dr. G. M. Trewin, Sid Perkins, C. Farrow, J. H. Webster, Dr. J. A. Campbell, A. Young, John Cornell, T. DeGeer, Ernie Jury motored out with a party, as did also J. Miller.

The day dawned dull and cloudy with every prospect of rain before night, little wind and enough dampness in the air to make scent hold good. Dryden's Corners, where the trials were held, affords pretty nearly every kind of going except swamp. Most of the hunting was in cover and second-growth poplars. The executive did all in their power to make the visitors welcome, and the hot lunch brought to the field was very good indeed. I was disappointed in not seeing any of the Guelph fanciers present, and hope they will consider favorably next year's trials and make some entries. The day will surely come when it will be one big feather in the cap of the individual who owns the champion field trial Beagle or Harrier of Canada.

The quality of the work done by the dogs was on the whole good, but the ability shown by Queen of Trump in the Beagle class, and Ring in the Harriers, was of a high order. Tom De Geer and Charlie Farrow, respective owners, may well be proud. Tireless hunters these dogs, very careful in hunting out the likely places. Ring was so quick in his movements while doing so that it was a difficult matter to follow him. He drives tremendously fast. Tony, Will Archibald's entry, considering his age, is a fast worker, too, and especially good on a warm drive. His casting is wide and rapid. Just yet a while he lacks the experience of the winner. He will probably be seen to better advantage another season.

Class A., Beagles 13 inches and under—Bugle, dog, owner T. De Geer, Toronto. This dog was put down in a second growth scrubby bush of about five acres, after a diligent hunt of half an hour nothing was started. We then moved over to the corner of the 2nd concession west, which looked good. As we were late getting away, the dog was well on, and it was decided to run Class B., 15 inches and under.

Mr. Young, the owner of Spot, was asked his opinion of allowing Bugle to run with the bigger hounds, he having no objections, Class B. was called, consisting of Queen of Trumps, T. De Geer, owner; Wee Melody, T. De Geer, owner; Spot, Al. Young, owner. These three and Bugle were cast off all in charge of their respective owners. After hunting out a lot of mixed ground without a whimper that denoted business outside of some cover, the crowd started a rabbit and the hounds were faced nose on. Wee Melody opened first and all harked to and between them made things hustle through the woods, but the fur proved too clever. Queen of Trumps hit the trail eventually and was joined by her kennel mates, Spot being thrown out, was never again in on this run. His owner said he had holed the rabbit. He may have holed a rabbit, but it was not the one originally started, as De Geer's hounds ran their quarry after a check of only a couple of minutes, down past me and on past several of the spectators back again pretty much in the same course as first, then over a rocky knoll to a check. Queen of Trumps struck the proper chord and carried us at a merry pace with one check. When the other dogs got in and drove to a boggy water hole in a hollow near some cedars to a loss. Time, 2 o'clock, and as the Harrier class was scheduled for 2.30 these hounds were called up. Hounds worked well together, harking well to one another at the first note, but Queen of Trumps proved herself superior in her wider and more intelligent casting, and always had the speed and the nose of the others.

## Awards.

Class A., Beagles, 13 inches and under—1st, Bugle.

Class B., Beagles, 15 inches and un-

der—1st, Queen of Trumps; 2nd, Wee Melody; 3rd, Spot.

Harrier entries—Sport and Ring, C. R. Farrow, owner; Tony, W. J. Archibald, owner; Lulu, H. Sparrow, owner; Jack, Jas. Miller, owner.

No time was wasted with the big hounds. They were liberated at the edge of the road and all went to work in a businesslike way—and soon were tonguing. Ring's keen nose worked out a circling train in rapid form, being quickly joined by the other dogs, driving extremely fast right on up through the bush on over the ridge, where Lulu and Jack got thrown out—here comes pass—on came the dogs fairly flying; brilliantly they run down past me, Ring leading. He is a corker on a hot drive. I almost thought he flecked the hare once or twice, as he past me, but could not get a fair grip, Sport and Tony loping him on either side. The pace was too much for the rabbit, it was hole—or death—and he took to burrow. These hounds took no time for breathing or resting-up. They were within five minutes "hammer and tongs" after another. This rabbit was viewed going over the ridge by me. On a cast Tony picked up a turn or two, but Ring always had the speed to take the lead and did most of the driving. On over the ridge they go, across the open, and packing well gave us the prettiest hunt so far. A slushy swale checked the race. Off again over the lower end of the ridge where they holed the rabbit, going towards the road. About this time Mr. Young called Mr. Sparrow's entry off, so we will make no comments, as he forfeited all the dog's chances by his action. Mr. Miller's entry did not show up very well, but will say I have seen him run hare extremely well, being an industrious worker, true and willing, but prefers running alone.

At 4 o'clock hounds were called up. Awards—1st, Ring; 2nd, Tony; 3rd, Sport.

Before leaving for home a purse was subscribed to buy a couple of medals to be presented to the owners of best types of Beagle and Harrier conforming to the show standard, which were won by T. De Geer's Wee Melody and C. Farrow's Sport, respectively.

## DAE HOUNDS THAT HUNT

When the foliage of woods has lost its gayest color, and taken on its snow-laden winter mantle, then is the time of the year I like to hie away with a few good hounds to the deep cedar swamp where the White Northern Hare makes its home. A good swamp is the place, if hares are plentiful in it, to test and test thoroughly, if one hunts daily for a week or two, the gameness, staying qualities, and all round hunting characteristics that go to make up a first-class hound.

Having hunted hare with most all kinds and crosses of dogs, from the diminutive Beagle to the big burly Blood Hound, and finding them all fairly good workers, but not all suitable for the work, I decided to try and breed a type of hound, which, to my mind, seemed most suited for this kind of hunting. I commenced crossing from hounds which I thought most fitted in size, speed and nose for hunting hare. In the course of time, I managed to raise and have broken, two couples of real good harriers that can and do put a hare along very fast without many checks, and will keep along after them all day when required to do so.

In my different hunting excursions I have seen dogs of no particular breeding, crosses of hound on Collie, Pointer, Spaniel and Terrier, that were wonderfully good rabbit dogs, when they have been raised in close proximity to a swamp wherein hare was plentiful, more particularly if the owner was a hunter. But these dogs, when taken away from their home and the neighborhood they had been accustomed to hunt in, developed some trait or other, such as refusing to work with other dogs or refusing to work alone, that made them worthless as hunters to their quondam owners. Personally I like the pure bred hound best though, mind you, I grant exceptions.

My choice of dog for hunting hare with is a Hound about 18 or 19 inches high at shoulder, racy built and not too much lumber. If they are well let down in chest and ribbed back well there is no end to the running they can do, if their heart is in the work of course. Without this keenness, no matter how well and favorably they are put together, they will not work perseveringly, soon become quitters if run-

ning with dogs that drive fast and continuously. The advantage of a hound of this type, all things being equal, is that they send the hare quickly around the swamp, giving more opportunities for shooting than a slow pottering dog can give, which is the object most people go hunting for. No doubt some hunters will say fast dogs do not run the hare as steadily as a small or slower dog will do; that they more often run over and beyond the scent when extremely fast. True they do, but when one is hunting with two, three or more dogs that are all pretty much of one average speed, there is hardly any time when one or more of

when Hounds are in full cry and I do like to hear their voices when running game, but the tail end dogs and the ones that are cutting across to get in with the lead dogs, are inevitably meeting the hare on its turns, and this happens so often, and usually just when you are pretty sure of getting a shot at the hare, that one feels tempted to shoot a few of the "tailers" there and then so as to get the balance of the dogs down to uniform working basis. For that reason, and for best results and most pleasure, the dogs should be as near equal in speed as can be had. This is very hard to accomplish unless sportsmen with

the dogs is not running on the scent of the rabbit, and, when hunting much together, readily hark back to one another.

You hunters who keep Hounds and hunt hare must have often been out with a pack of a dozen or more dogs gathered together promiscuously for the occasion, and noticed, no doubt, two or perhaps three extremely fast dogs doing all the driving, the others strung out through the swamp for half its length, trying as best they could by hook or crook to keep within hearing of the leaders, cutting corners, or any old way as long as the object was attained. I have. It is very musical

pretty near the same type of Hounds hunt together. Most persons who hunt hare have their own ideas, and set ones too, as to what kind of dog is the best for that purpose, and, as their fancies are so varied, it is almost impossible to get together a uniform "scratch pack" that are able to run all well bunched up. It is not my intention to disparage a slow dog, they are as pleasant to hunt with, perhaps more so than fast ones to those who fancy them. I have often listened interestingly to the question debated, "Which is the best dog to kill game ahead of, a fast or slow dog." The arguments offered pro and con by per-



sons qualified by years of experience to give an opinion, were seemingly convincing. To me their arguments could only hold good when fast dogs were run together and slow dogs likewise. All one has to do to find this out for oneself is to take a few hounds to the bush, some of them fast, the others slow, start them on the same scent or turn them loose in a good swamp. The result will speak for itself, before many hours go by, or I miss my guess. Each kind is best only when working together in a class of their own, they cannot possibly be run together and furnish good sport without a certain amount of friction.

At different times when a party of us were away hare hunting if our intentions were to hunt a week or two, we usually divided up the pack, sorting them out after their first day's hunt as well as we possibly could, running those that were as near one speed, day and day turn about. This usually gives good results, the chances of shots were oftener and we had fresh dogs every day.

Occasionally one will come across a dog that will run rabbits continuously, all day and every day, seemingly able to continue doing so indefinitely. Those are exceptionally good dogs and are rarely met with, as, no matter how soft the bed of a swamp may be, with or without snow, it soon wears the pads off the dogs' feet, one day's running sometimes crippling a "soft" dog up for a week, if not, two or three days at the most will lay up the best of hounds, particularly dogs kept in the city whose exercising is mostly restricted to a run about a yard or frolic around the block. Such dogs, no matter how willing, are unable to keep up with seasoned ones, and do not run a hare with the same ambition unless rested up every odd day. When done so with they are an advantage to the sport instead of a hindrance. Then again the dog that leaves the shooter as soon as he comes up to where the hare was killed, and starts quickly away again, ranging the swamp thoroughly, endeavoring to start a fresh rabbit without having to be urged or taken about personally to get him to start, and is as willing towards evening as in the morning "for a start," is par excellence the ideal Harrier.

There is a five-dollar gold special for the best in the show.

We did Mr. C. Plomley, St. Thomas, Ont., an injustice last month when we credited Regal Boy with winners in Fox Terriers at London, whereas Talbot Wanderer took first, limit, winners and special. Mr. Plomley informs us that he is joining the ranks of the Airedale breeders, having purchased two good bitches, one of which is bred to Caerphilly Marvel.

Mr. Herbert Chadwick has purchased the good heavyweight Bulldog bitch puppy, Cheetham's Daughter, from Mr. Joseph Perkins.

Mr. P. Bawden has had the misfortune to lose his recently imported Airedale dog, Caerphilly Oorang, through distemper.

Somerset, England, has purchased from Tilley Bros., Shepton Mallet, England, that Grand Old English Sheep Dog bitch, Shepton Pleasure. She has won many firsts and specials at the large shows, and is considered by her exporters to be the best of her breed ever shipped to Canada. Mr. Langford's kennel is headed by Ch. Sir Alex, a dog that has won prizes at all the principal shows on the coast, including trophy for best male dog in show or any breed, under Geo. A. Cranfield, at Terminal City Kennel Club, Vancouver, 1912, also the C. K. C. championship cup.

One of the most surprising cases of awful stupidity, ignorance and cruelty to animals that ever came to our notice was that of the shipment of an adult St. Bernard by a breeder in Bedford, England, to Messrs. Giles & Spence, of Toronto. This dog was a full-grown St. Bernard of thirteen months of age and standing thirty-three inches at shoulder. The dimensions of the box he was shipped in were two feet by two feet six by two feet, and was entirely closed, without any door and with a space running around the box of two inches for ventilation. It was impossible for the dog to lie down, turn around, be fed or watered from the time he was shipped until he arrived. A great wonder is that he arrived here alive, though a mere skeleton. This should be a good case for the humane society to take up in England. The duration of the trip was ten days. This dog is a son of Ch. Marion, and if in condition will be shown at the Live Stock Show.

Ch. Coats Lady O' Rustem has been lost since Sept. 27th. Mr. Owen, who handled her at Victoria, won 1st open and winners, also two specials, including Dr. T. Glendon Moody's cup for best smooth, and the Canadian Kennel Club silver medal for second best or all breeds in the show. On his return to Vancouver, at the corner of Hastings and Seymour Streets, the chain became unsnapped and away she went, and no trace can be found of her. To make matters worse, her dam, Coats Lady Reconquest, was run down by an automobile and killed about six weeks ago. Coats Lady Robinson has been missing about four months. He had her out to walk when she was lost. This makes seventeen Fox Terriers he has lost one way or another in a little over one year, valued at from \$75 to \$300.



Mr. George A. Cranfield, of Vancouver, B.C., has purchased from Mr. F. M. Overbeck, of San Francisco, the grand Bull Terrier, Ch. Bow Bells (A. K.C.S.B. 137699), a bitch that has never been beaten and won her championship in hottest competition, and is now a double champion, having gained some 40 points. Bow Bells is a daughter of the Canadian-bred dog, Haymarket Prince. She was bred and raised by Mr. Cranfield, and was not sold by him until she had won championship honors. She has beaten all the best bitches of the day, including Ch. Williquette Starlight, Ch. Monticito Princess, Edgecote Bastile, Ch. Edgecote Queen Bess, Miss Monty, Edgecliffe Beauty, Briarsdale Bangle, and Ch. Dorian Grey, the latter now owned in Vancouver, but once graced Mr. Cranfield's kennels in California. Bow Bells will now aim for Canadian championship honors, starting out at Vancouver Kennel Club's show next spring. This club has held thirteen consecutive annual shows, but failed to give an exhibition last year. It will be supported in the spring of 1914 by the elite of dog lovers and business men of Vancouver and surrounding towns.

Mr. Constant Van Camp, of Montreal, has been on a visit to Belgium and has returned with some splendid stock, with which to replenish his kennels so badly depleted by distemper last year. He has added to these some Belgium Sheep Dogs, which will be a great addition to our show ranks.

Mr. Bert Finch, of Edmonton, intends to visit England in December and will pick up some Bulldogs and Poms. for himself and Mrs. Finch. He is looking for "the best only," and is wise in going over to headquarters for them.

All of these are doing well and are nicely marked, with tight screw tails.
