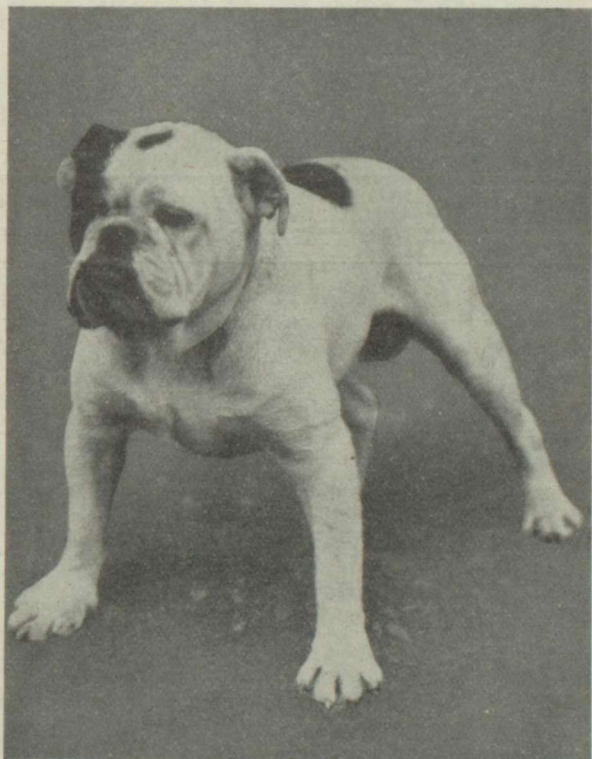

WE do not for a moment believe that a recently published attack on the Canadian Kennel Club was inserted with the knowledge of the retired secretary of this club and our opinion is endorsed by every officer and member who has mentioned the subject. From his knowledge of the affairs of the club he cannot but know that statements contained in the articles are impossible, and the whole tone of the attack is entirely foreign to his frequently declared unswerving friendship and loyalty to the Canadian Kennel Club.

Our short experience as publishers of "*Kennel and Bench*" does not give us any license to pose as advertising experts, still our advertisements have received some favorable comment, most of the credit of which is due to our printers. From this short experience, however, we have learnt one or two salient points that are worth recording for the benefit of our advertisers. The object of an advertisement should not be directly to sell a dog, or to get him stud work; if it is, the result will be a disappointment, for very seldom is business done directly from an advertisement itself. The object should be to arouse the interest of a possible customer to the point of inquisitiveness, and if that leads to correspondence the advertisement has accomplished its purpose. Now, it stands to reason that if an advertisement tell everything, there is nothing left to write about, therefore it defeats its end. Again, if it tell everything, some unfavorable point such as age or color or size or price may at once decide the reader to go no further, whereas correspondence might modify these objections and bring out the virtues. It is very seldom that a buyer can find exactly what he wants in dogs at least, by correspondence you might convince him that what you have to sell, though not exactly what he wants, is the nearest he can get. In short, correspondence may bring the two ends, buyer and seller, closer together, and greatly increases the probability of a sale. Individuality can enter into correspondence that cannot enter into an advertisement. Again, very few readers read an advertisement of small type or the small type in an advertisement. Life is too short and eyes too tired. A few strong words, standing out, will do the work intended, far better than details in small type. Let us illustrate. You have a dog to sell for fifty dollars, and you state the price, though probably you might take forty.

You get replies from the man who is willing to pay fifty dollars or perhaps the forty, but the man who thinks he will only pay twenty-five does not reply, though by correspondence you might convince him he must pay forty for such as he wants and that you have the dog. Nor do you get a reply from the man who thinks he cannot get what he wants for less than seventy-five dollars, though, if you did, you might get him to think your dog was up to his standard of quality and make a sale. If you had not mentioned price in your advertisement all of these might have answered you.

As to size of advertisements. We see large advertisements inserted once. In some cases where something extremely attractive is offered for sale, and the sale is desired at once, this will be satisfactory, but for regular business, a four-inch advertisement inserted regularly for six months, will get better results than a page inserted once, and cost less. In the case of stud advertisements we are convinced there is only one satisfactory way, and that is regular advertising, no matter how small. The substance of an advertisement should also be changed at least every third month; better still, every second month. In no case have we, in the above, advised increase of space or more advertising. We think we have carefully avoided that and made it clear we wish to show how our customers can use their advertising appropriations to the best advantage. We feel convinced that nothing hurts a journal more than whining or begging for advertising, or the forcing of advertising by constant importunity, from unwilling advertisers. It is a direct confession of weakness.

It is well that we have to stand by our own efforts, sometimes. A glance at the breeds, for the improvement of which we must depend on ourselves.

only, and not on importations, will convince us that it is better when we are left to ourselves. Look at Cockers, Bull Terriers and Bostons.

The following is an answer to a letter received. We publish it with names omitted and a few additions that have suggested themselves subsequently:

There is something radically wrong with nearly all judging, and the (name of breed) judging is no exception. I do not for one minute wish it to be understood that I think it is crooked. Nor is it on the level. What I wish to convey is that it is "diplomatic" or "biased" or "cliquey." It is nearly always known where certain well-known dogs will be placed, if a certain judge officiates. So strong is this that some exhibitors will not show under some judges, and will under others. This does not amount to a matter of opinion only, but to a certainty, which does not allow for the introduction of unknown dogs, and their possibility of winning, or of variation in condition of a dog at different shows. Now, I do not wish to offend you, but must risk it, and hope you will take it as meant, simply as an apt and convenient illustration. When you were in Toronto you were absolutely sure that your bitch would win at a coming show, I think it was at ———, and were anxious that (name) should be sent to meet her. I do not know who the judge at that show was, but I question if he ever saw (name), or at least had ever seen her in competition with your bitch. You could not, or should not, at that time have known what the competition would be at that show, nor could you know what condition (name) would be in, or the condition of those competing against her. Your mind should have been in a state of uncertainty as to the result, but it wasn't. And your bitch won, I believe. Cannot you see that such as the above must throw doubt in the mind of anyone capable of thinking, and knowing the facts? And it spoils the whole game of showing. These things occur and are talked about everywhere. In your case it did not amount, I am sure, to any more than a knowledge of the opinion of the judge on your bitch, of which you were aware, but in other cases we see exhibitors ready to bet anything that a certain dog will win, and you hear of such spoken of as a

certainty among the exhibitors before the judging.

The spice of the whole thing is the uncertainty. All we want is an open field and a fair field. What do you think?

The town of Weston, just outside of Toronto, is having a lively mix-up over a rabies scare and issued the following proclamation:

PROCLAMATION.

We have been officially notified by the Provincial and Dominion authorities, that the dog which was running at large in the village during a day or two in the fore-part of this week, was afflicted with Rabies (mad dog). As a number of other dogs were bitten by him, I, for the Board of Health, issue the following Proclamation, viz.:

"That owners of dogs are prohibited from allowing them to run at large, and must keep them penned up or on a chain, in their own premises. Dog owners in adjoining municipalities please take notice. Officers have been appointed to see that this order is strictly enforced, with power to shoot any dog found running at large."

This order continues in force until there is no further danger.

Parties not complying with this order, in addition to having their dogs shot, are liable to prosecution at law.

The consequence of this proclamation has been that the town has gone "rabies mad" and there is no question that the scare has done a great deal more harm to nervous people than the mad dog or dogs have or would have done. The town constable has paraded the streets with a double-barrel shot gun and killed numerous dogs and has wounded others. We would rather trust ourselves to the mad dogs than to the streets of Weston with a constable at large whose aim is so good (?) that he cannot be sure of hitting a dog with a shot gun. We do not wish to be understood as belittling the seriousness of rabies, but we do say it is extremely rare. This is due, no doubt, to the care taken of known cases, but we think the town of Weston might easily have done what has often been done before, establish a pound, and segregate all dogs found at large for a certain period, sufficient to guarantee safety and fine the own-

ers for their negligence; moreover, we do not believe the town of Weston has any right to take such action as stated in its proclamation. We go further and wonder that men, who hold public positions which are supposed to accompany a certain amount of brains and common sense, can possibly handle such a simple matter as this in such a childish way.

On another page in this number is a letter on the prevalence of distemper after our Exhibition Dog Show, and ascribing the same to want of proper disinfection. We wish to rise in defence of the show in question. No doubt there is a lot of distemper after this show, but is there any more in proportion than any other show in the fall? We question this. Our autumn weather strongly predisposes to colds. The dogs themselves have been leading an open-air life, full of exercise and freedom, and are suddenly confined under exciting circumstances, and exposed to draughts and changes of temperature. As for disinfection, the dog show building at the Canadian National Exhibition is subject to the best process of disinfection in existence, the natural one of time and temperature. The building is used for show purposes for two weeks, for fifty it rests, and we doubt if in that time a single animal, except the sparrows, enter it. During that time it is exposed to the intense cold of our winter and the heat of summer, and most of the time to a flood of sunshine sufficient to kill the most virulent of germs. Besides this it receives at least two thorough chemical disinfections. Do the dogs really get distemper or only colds from which distemper develops? The symptoms are many and varied in different dogs and different years, and we have known but few reach distemper that have used a grain of quinine before and after the show and a good laxative after. If, however, we accept that distemper does originate at the show, we would think the trouble more in the veterinary inspection than in the disinfection. Dogs probably enter that are in the early stages of the disease. The rules of the Canadian Kennel Club are full and explicit and, if carried out, should remove all danger. Shows should remunerate their veterinary staff sufficiently and insist that inspection should be as required and carried out to the letter.

MOUNT ROYAL KENNEL CLUB

First Evening Show, Season 1914-15.

It is quite evident the public caught on to Mr. Alwyn Corestine's slogan, "Don't talk war—talk dog! Business as usual!" The attendance was fully up to expectations, and I heard the venture turned out very satisfactory financially. These shows are doing a whole lot to stimulate the fancy in and around Montreal. We noticed not only a lot of new faces exhibiting, but quite a number of the old guard who have been following the game lately coming back. This we consider a good healthy sign. The dog game in Montreal is in the very best of hands. The committee are all real dog men and are working for the good of the dog, and no breed in particular. The catalogue shows about ninety dogs entered and absentees were very few indeed.

Mr. R. A. Ross judged the following: Puppy class (Terriers) 6 months old, and under 12. Puppies of the following breeds: Airedales, Fox Terriers (wire and smooth), Irish Terriers, Scottish Terriers, West Highlands, Skye Terriers, Bull Terriers, Dandie Dinmonts, Manchesters and Welsh Terriers. Toy Class (of the following breeds): Japanese Spaniels, Schipperkes, Pekingese, English Toys and Yorkshires. Airedales, novice dogs, novice bitches, open dogs, open bitches; Manchesters (Black and Tan), open dogs, open bitches; Bull Terriers, novice dogs, novice bitches, open dogs, open bitches; Irish Terriers, open dogs, open bitches; Pomeranians, novice dogs, novice bitches, open dogs, open bitches; Dachshunde, novice dogs, novice bitches, open dogs, open bitches.

PUPPIES, Terrier bitches—1st, Mrs. Percy Stuart's Bonnie Jean, a real nice young Scot, grand head, eye and ear, straight front, short back and tail, fair coat, but must not grow any more. 2nd, Mr. Appleby's Flossie, quite a decent sort, but outclassed by 1st in substance. (also a Scottie.) 3rd, Mr. Potts' Manchester, Montreal Star, just fair.

PUPPIES, Terrier dogs, brought nine—1st, Mr. Binning's Smooth Fox Terrier, Ochill Sandstone, a nice puppy, teeming with real terrier character, sound shoulders, legs and feet, nice head and eye, needs time. 2nd, Mr. Stanford's Wire Fox Terrier, Barb Wire, a good headed one, nice short back, plenty of bone, his eye looked a little full, and coat could be improved a lot. 3rd, Mr. Williamson's Scottie, Glen Dyne, a real good type, could be improved in foreface and coat, didn't make the most of himself or might easily have been higher up. Reserve, Mr. Fred Forest's Scottie, Old Mull, a real cart horse. We were unable to handle him at all, so penalized him accordingly.

TOYS—Open dogs and bitches, Miss C. D. McGill's Jap., Cio-Cio San, a rare headed Toy this and sound as a bell, she had the easiest kind of a win. 2nd, her kennel mate, Kiko, another little one, not so pleasing in head. 3rd, Miss Auld's Yorkshire, Dolly, in poor coat, but a very useful sort.

FRENCH POODLES—Only one, Beau Brumelle, a big well-grown puppy with plenty of style and substance, shown in the rough, looks like making a good one.

AIREDALES—In dogs, nothing out of the ordinary. In bitches, Mr. Lambton's Gipsy Queen won. She is a good sort, nice coat and color and fair all round. She was easily the best Airedale there.

MANCHESTERS—We had three. We need some improvement here.

BULL TERRIERS—Six in all, with Calumet Rosaline the pick of the lot, put down in real nice shape. This bitch looks as if she would breed a good one. There was another very nice bitch second that I would like to see when in condition. She impressed me as having been a good one, but was thin as a rail and her coat was staring.

IRISH TERRIERS—Two dogs and

two bitches. The dogs were very ordinary, Red Mike won on head, coat and color. His feet could be improved. He is the old type and too light all over. 2nd, Paddy. His coat was harder than it looked. Shown entirely in the rough and uneven in month. Bitches were better. Mr. Lindsay's Joan, a new importation, is a rich yellow red, with good length of head, well carried ears, hard natural coat, best of bone, legs and feet, and a good mover behind, but shy yet and requires more handling. 2nd, Mrs. Lewis' Sheila, a very nice type, in full coat and is plenty big.

POMS were a classy lot. Mr. Bently supplied the winning dog and bitch, both puppies, blacks, with good plume, short backs, nice heads, ears, sound coats and real showers.

DACHSHUNDE—Messrs. Silver and Aiken showed two. Nancy Lee, the better of the two, a quality one and a well-known winner.

Cup for best Terrier in show was won by Miss Eadie's White West Highland bitch, Morag, after a hot fight with Aiken & Silver's Ch. Hawes Broom. The former is a real white, with good head, black eyes, small ears, very hard honest jacket, short back and tail and has plenty of substance, is low to the ground and moves well. Broom still retains all his terrier fire and character, but we have seen him looking better.

Cup for best other than Terrier was won by Mr. H. Green's black Cocker bitch, Redeemed, greatly improved since Montreal spring show, a good sound one all round, grand head and expression and put down fit. Reserve, Miss McGill's Jap bitch, Cio-Cio-San, a good one, but not in full bloom, otherwise she might have won.

BOSTON TERRIER CLUB OF DETROIT.

The Boston Terrier Club of Detroit held its 2nd annual show on Thursday, 26th November (Thanksgiving Day). Although this club has only been in existence for two years they were able

to bench some 95 dogs, which under the A. K. C. rules gave them a 4-point show.

McQuillan, Secy.-Treas., took the long trip from Toronto to Detroit just to see this one-day show, and they report that they have hardly ever seen a show conducted in any better way than this one was.

The lucky man came from Grand Rapids, Mr. W. H. Dean receiving the winners ribbons, both dogs and bitches, and there were some good ones on the bench, such as Dictator III., Some Boy, Marchmont Duke, etc.

We were sorry, however, that Mr. W. G. Parker, of Sarnia, was not able to take Sparkling Beauty over, but the embargo prevented him doing this. The winners bitch, however, is one of the best we have seen and would like to see her come out at some of the big shows.

TORONTO KENNEL CLUB.

Evening Shows.

That old reliable, the Toronto Kennel Club, is still at the forefront in Toronto dogdom is shown in the fact that the catalogue of their usual series of evening shows has just gone to press. There will be four shows, beginning the 4th Tuesday of December. The distribution of the breeds over the various shows is the same as last year. Editor Kennel and Bench:

Dear Sir,—In reading over the Kennel and Bench, and other doggy papers, I see quite a lot of hinting about the amount of distemper cases since the Canadian National Exhibition. One paper says, so far they have heard of no deaths. Surely the dog men and dog lovers are not afraid to speak, and speak loud about the ravages among their pets caused from showing them at the Exhibition.

I know of lots of deaths, and deadly deaths, where some of the best veterinarians in Toronto could not save them.

I have had eight deaths in my kennel, and my dogs were all disinfected before and after the show, which shows that the distemper is in the building, and not in the dogs that come to the show. If every show took its toll of good dogs' lives in comparison with the percentage taken from the kennels of exhibitors at the C. N. Exhibition why there would soon be no good dogs left.

I am not very well known among the doggy men of Toronto, for the simple reason that I have no show dogs at the present time. My dogs are producers, and some day I hope to let dog friends in Canada see the results of my foundations, but if distemper was to catch me, as it did at the C. N. Exhibition, it would take me a long time to show results.

I would insist with every dog lover to impress on the committee of dog shows that they must have a clean building to hold their shows in, by fumigating, not sprinkling, before and after the show. The "Jeyes Fluid" is fine for washing the benches and floors, also as a sprayer, but to splash it here and there on the floors once a day is not enough, only to tame down the smell of the dogs.

I do hope to see the dog clubs take a little notice of this vital question for our common friend, and faithful companion, the dog.

Editor Kennel and Bench:

Dear Sir,—Reading an article in the November issue of the Canadian Kennel Gazette, signed by J. B. Guarnera, with a headline of "Collie Records," in which appear many statements which in your valuable paper I beg to be allowed to answer.

To commence, the correction, I really ought to point out the conclusion of the letter, which states: "My only object in writing is to correct a wrong impression. I am, yours for the truth, J. B. Guarnera."

Anyway, we will now see how much truth his letter contains. His long letter was in answer to an article that was written by H. Leslie. Why didn't he get after Leslie, not Tom Milner, of Weston Collie Kennels? He states: The Weston Collie Kennels Claim to have bred three champion Collies. No sir. No sir, I did not, nor ever did. The Weston Kennels bred Ch. Weston Queen O' Quality, also Ch. Weston All Quality, a record unequalled in Canada, through being in successive generations. It was Mr. Leslie's error that Weston Riverview Quality was claim-

ed a champion. However, she was bred by the Weston Kennels and I am proud of the fact, a Weston through and through, as I bred her dam, also her grand dam. To see if the above champions were worthy of their prefix, or not, you start off with Ch. Weston Queen O' Quality, and you state: "The writer witnessed her handed the order of the gate." To this my reply is that you, or any other individual never witnessed Queen O' Quality get the gate in her whole career, and I emphatically state, come through and prove your statement. It is gratifying to say that Queen O' Quality won her championship points under the very best judges available, and away from home, under judges I have never seen, such as Donald Munroe, Jim Watson, Dr. Jarrett and others, and not under an everyday acquaintance. Mr. J. B. also states: "The point I wished to get at is, did the Weston Kennels breed her, and as is so stated in the Stud Books?" To this I answer, my reputation has spread far and wide as breeder of Queen O' Quality, but in your mind it seems doubtful, I say, once again. The Weston Kennels did breed Ch. Weston Queen O' Quality and can prove it. Good, sound, reliable information is valuable, but if you or your associates doubt the above statement, come round to my kennels with one or two hundred dollars and I will prove what I have written. Your letter says: "It is a known fact that the dam, Ormskirk Fanny, was bought in whelp to Ormskirk Foxall." Quite true in a sense, but how long the Weston Kennels owned Ormskirk Fanny before she was mated is another story. And Mr. J. B., I will convince you, if you bring along the above sum, to prove your contention. 'Tis true that Ormskirk Fanny whelped in transit, but why, is my business, not yours, and does not affect the breedership.

The above remarks, I think, should satisfy anyone that Weston Collie Kennels bred Ch. Weston Queen O' Quality. Your letter also states: "The next claim is a championship on Riverview Quality." As I said before, I never claimed such at all, but when one looks up her performance, it certainly was a credit to her breeder. In some classes were seven or eight, including three imported bitches. You also say my memory is bad and needs a little refreshing. I have not forgotten that your Imera Peacock made her debut at the same show and never got placed

in six classes, including the provincial class. From your own lips comes the statement that Imera Peacock was born at St. Paul, U.S.A.

My only object in writing this is to correct a wrong impression. Yours for the truth, Tom Milner. But wait, the worst is yet to come. Your letter reads: "This brings the claim down to one (I say two), in Ch. Weston All Quality, and that Ch. Imera Whysetta beat Ch. Weston All Quality on three different occasions." Quite true. But you don't state that Ch. Weston All Quality has beaten Ch. Imera Whysetta. Yes, and did it well. Let's see, it was at Winnipeg, under Andy Armstrong, that All Quality took winners, with Imera Whysetta 3rd. It was here that Weston All Quality beat your Imera Peacock and Imera Toreador in the breeders' class. Then, again, with Weston Master Sample, Weston Riverview Quality, Weston All Quality and Weston Lady Sample, all bred by the Weston Kennels, they beat your imported Imera Whysetta, imported Ormskirk Fanny, Imera Peacock and Imera Toreador for best kennel of four. Your letter goes on to say that I claim to have put you in the fancy by selling you Ormskirk Fanny. The ambition of all fanciers, in my opinion, is to breed champions, and we have no record of your ability to do so, till you got Ormskirk Fanny, which produced Imera Peacock, who has been pushed on to every little one or two-point shows to complete his championship. At last, after two and a half years, he is champion. By the way, I see you have been coming back to the Weston strain, as I know you have bought three puppies (said to be whirlwinds) by Weston Emperor, ex. Trusty Lady, bred by the Weston Kennels).

Now comes the most important item in your letter. You say: "In July, 1908, you exhibited Imera Victor and Imera Conqueror and had an easy time defeating the best that the Weston Collie Kennels could produce, including the imported dog, Ormskirk Admiral." My memory is good, J. B., for I can assure you that you have here another incorrect statement. I never owned a dog named Ormskirk Admiral, and there never was a dog shown in Canada with that name. My only object in writing this is to correct a wrong impression. 'Tis true that your dog, Imera Conqueror won 1st novice, with Weston Belle 2nd, in a class of twenty, Weston Belle, a puppy, and bred by Weston Collie Kennels, and Imera Conqueror,

bred by R. Geifer. But your Imera Victor was beaten and well beaten by Weston Admiral (brother to Weston Belle), another puppy, same breeder, J. B. Imera Victor was also beaten by Weston Olympian. Now if Weston Belle (which afterwards was given winners) met and beat her brother, W. Admiral, and Admiral beats Victor, I make it out that W. Belle, W. Admiral and W. Olympian beat your Imera Victor. Oh, yes, J. B., you had an easy time. My only object in writing is to correct a wrong impression,

I will forward you \$20 if your gate was bad. Tell the boys to stick together. I saw Woodruff, the man that sent me Gangway out, he said Bert Finch was at his place. I hear we will be here two months, and then shipped to France. All the boys are dead anxious to get to the front, and they look a handy bunch, too. Camp life here is great. We are all well looked after, but the amount of mud is very trying. However, I am in great condition, and never felt better. Give my best wishes to all the boys. I will write to you again soon.

Mr. Grant's Killarney Marion was judged best Airedale in the show at Seattle last month, and is looking very fit at present.

Mr. Bamford's Killarney Mill Maid has improved greatly and looks to-day a very good Airedale.

Mr. Wm. McAllister, of Alberni, B. C., writes that he has a flyer sure in a pup sired by that good Airedale, Bobby Burns.

Mr. Brownlee, of Victoria, B.C., has a kennel of Airedales that looks good enough to get some of the silverware.

E. B. Cole has started fixing up his good Airedale, Bancroft Prince, for the parlor show already.

Mr. Wm. Payton can be depended upon to have his Airedale in good show form.

The Airedale game around Vancouver has become so all-fired hot I took it onto myself to butt in the game myself. I have written a gross of letters to all the leading breeders far and near and after six years looking for a good one I think I have a hum-dinger, no mistake. His sire is Bachelor Boy, the pride of the British Isles, and his dam was the pride of Lulu Island before being imported to Vancouver. Her dam was sired by an imported Ch. Illuminator dog, no doubt the longest headed Airedale of the past or present; her grand dam was herself imported and a winner, so all Airedale breeders will see my pup has all the high-class Airedale blood of the present day flowing through his veins. At two months old he is more than can be desired, his color is as black as it is possible to be every place but his legs, feet and muzzle, which are a very rich tan; his texture of coat is that much-desired harsh dense wire hair impossible to run your bare hand against; his eyes are just like two small black beads; ears small and properly placed and carried right at all times; his back is short; he has a great spring of ribs with wonderful depth and girth; his tail is set on right and up all the time; in fact, could not be knocked down with an axe; his neck has a beautiful arch; his bone and substance is simply par excellence; legs and feet could not be improved upon. Following day he broke into a cage of white mice, killing or letting escape thirty white mice, which cost me \$10 for

breaking up cage and killing white mice, making the cost of the Airedale pup \$81, and to-day somehow he got into my pheasant yard and killed an English ringneck hen that cost me \$5, making the cost of the Airedale pup \$86, and, if the game warden had known it, I would have been fined \$25 for having a hen pheasant in my possession. I have been in the Airedale game six weeks and find it comes too high for me, for that reason only am I selling the above pup and I guarantee he has all the good qualities desired in a high-class Airedale, or your money back.

The Terminal City Kennel Club has decided to hold a series of five parlor shows during the coming winter, to be followed by a regular two-day show next spring there. Parlor shows will be held in the Dominion Hall, the date for the first being November 18th, commencing at 8 p.m. All champions are excluded. The two youngsters spoken of in the above article were also bought from Mr. Jackson, and are by Seedley Sherlock, ex Seedley Smile. Mr. Jackson has three very promising Collie puppies by Seedley Standard, ex Ch. Lady Sonsie.

Lady Sonsie has greatly improved, and Mr. Jackson is figuring on sending her back this winter to all the big Eastern shows, including New York.

Dr. T. Glendon Moody has added to his kennel one of the best lightweight English Bulldogs in Canada, Mersey Pilot. He will be exhibited at all the leading coast shows.

Mr. Jack Glover has some very promising smooth Fox Terriers coming on.

M. C. Hamilton, owner of Ch. Harmony and several other good Fox Terriers, has left for England, where he will join his regiment. Mr. Hamilton served all through the Boer war. Melville will be greatly missed among the fanciers, with whom he was very popular. He carries with him all the good wishes of every member of the Terminal City Kennel Club.

Look at the set-backs he has had. And one would almost expect that the fullness of years and the long continuance in the game would entitle him to retirement. Not so, however, for we are in receipt of a letter which tells the tale of several promising puppies, which should give good account of themselves in the fall.

Mr. J. C. Eaton has purchased the Belgian Police dog "Dicko des Banés" from Mr. VanCamp, of Montreal. He is a splendid-looking specimen of the breed and won first prize at Liege in 1912. He has a reputation as a trailer of being able to find his quarry with a start of three miles, and he will dig up a hidden object, no matter by whom hidden, or how deep, and will hold it until told to drop it by his master. Even a roof is no obstacle as he can climb it like a human being and will sit down beside any object he is told to "guard" until whistled or ordered off by his master. In case of an attack, he will stand beside his master, inactive until told to "attack," when he will instantly turn to the defence and in case of the opponent fleeing, at the order to "arrest" he will run after him, jump on his back and throw him down. He can run up a tree fourteen feet or climb a thirteen-foot fence, and the common commands to lie down, sit up and stand up are so well understood that they can be mixed up or given in any order, and also can be given by signs of the hands. The order "trail" will send him back to pick up anything lost within ten minutes. Such a dog should be of great value in emergencies.

Montreal has not escaped from distemper this fall. Mrs. Gruenwald has lost eight or ten, including Little Nipper, but fortunately the rest have recovered, and her kennels are entirely free from the disease.

His eye is well shaped and of nice size, and his expression excellent. In body he is very compactly built, with well sprung ribs, carried well back, just the correct amount of roach, deep brisket, perfect front, well-turned quarters, strongly boned, the best of legs and feet and a short well-carried tail. He is one of the very best youngsters seen in years, and there is little doubt that he will gain his championship in short order."

Mr. A. E. Boothe, of Toronto, has never had too much luck in Bulldogs. He had only bought Homewood Jumbo a short time before he died at Boston Show. Now a second blow has fallen his way. Ch. Layham Pride, his good bitch, is dead. She was in whelp to Moston Marshall. A post-mortem revealed she was due to have ten puppies, two of which were dead several days, though whelping was not expected for a week.

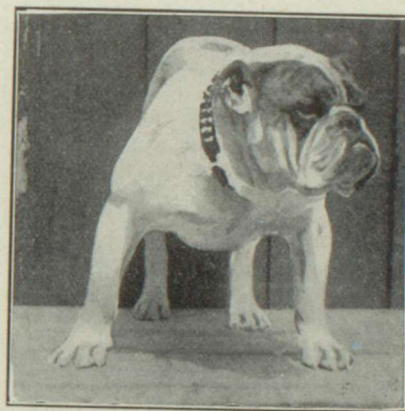
