Mr. Fred Charbonnier, Montreal, laid a formal charge against Mr. J. F. Lakin, Toronto, for failing to have the necessary documents delivered as promised, essential to the registration of the English Bulldogs, Kersal King and Kersal White Gladiator.

The Secretary reported that he had this case in hand, and read correspondence from the English Kennel Club confirming the pedigree of the dog Kersal King.

It was moved and seconded that in the absence of expected further information from England at an early date, the Pedigree Committee pass the application for registration of the dogs named in the Charbonnier charge.

This being all the business coming before the meeting, it was moved that the meeting be adjourned.—Carried.

GENERAL MEETING OF THE CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB.

A general meeting of the Canadian Kennel Club was held in the Board Room of the Administration Building, on Wednesday evening, Sept. 3rd, 1919, at 8 o'clock. The President, Mr. Jos. Russell, M.P.P., in the chair, and called the meeting to order at 8.40. The following members were present: H. Clayton, J. H. Kenyon, C. W. Dickinson, Donald Wheeler, Peter Herd, S. C. Taylor, Jack Milner, M. V. Bates, R. L. Wainwright, B. B. Finnie, Wm. McIntyre, T. Huckle, Geo. Ashbee, "Dad" Ward, "Ted" Ward, A. Lowenstein, Bert Swann, J. W. Hinds and the Secretary.

The President gave a resume of the general affairs of the club and emphasized in a very striking manner on the question of club revenue and its possi-

bilities. The ensuing discussion was of a constructive nature and will no doubt be resumed at the annual meeting in February. No votes were taken.

Mr. T. A. Russell, President of the Canadian National Exhibition, visited the meeting and enthusiastically expressed himself on the continued success of the Dog Show feature of the Exhibition, and in order to better accommodate and stimulate further successes a new Dog Show Building would be one of the first to be built from the present programme, and likely on the site of the present Dog Show Building. This item of good news was received with hearty applause.

John G. Kent, General Manager of the Canadian National and Past President of the Canadian Kennel Club, also attended in the course of the evening and expressed his appreciation of the Dog Show and the continued activity of the Canadian Kennel Club. Mr. Kent also referred to the immediate possibility of a new Dog Show Building. A hearty round of applause was given Mr. Kent's remarks.

After the distinguished visitors had retired, it was moved that the meeting adjourn.—Carried.

IMPORTANT.

Notice to all members of the Canadian Kennel Club, whose membership fees were paid prior to September 30th, 1919, a full list of which appeared in our October issue.

Nominations are now in order for the Board of Directors. Exercise your privileges by nominating the best man or men in your respective Provinces. Nineteen-twenty will be the banner year of your organization since its inception over twenty years ago.

Remember

that nominations close November 15th, and that—

Nominations must reach this office on or before the 15th day of November.

No member shall hold office or be entitled to vote at a meeting if at the time in arrears for membership fees, and no member shall be entitled to vote who was not a member of the club at the time the notice was given calling such meeting.

The President shall be elected in each September preceding. Nominations for year previously to the annual meeting of this club by ballot of the members

in good standing on the 30th day of September preceding. Nominations for President shall be made in writing, and shall be signed by at least two members in good standing, and shall be sent to the Secretary of this Club, so as to be received by him on or before the 15th day of November.

The Vice-President and Second Vice-President are elected in a like manner.

For election of Directors, see Rule 4, on page 9 of Constitution.

A member in good standing in respect to voting or holding office is a member whose membership fee for the current year has been paid on or before the 30th day of September in the then current year.

For the year 1920 the Province of Alberta shall be entitled to one Director; the Province of British Columbia, two Directors; the Province of Manitoba, one Director; the Maritime Provinces, one Director; the Province of Saskatchewan, one Director; the Province of Ontario, seven Directors, and the Province of Quebec, two Directors; total, fifteen.

Nominations of Directors allotted to each respective Province shall be made in writing and shall be signed by at least two members in good standing in the respective Provinces, and such nominations shall be sent to the Secretary of the Club so as to be received by him on or before the 15th day of November in the said year on, which date all nominations close.

NOTES FROM THE FAR WEST.

The fall show in connection with the exhibition at Vancouver has come and gone. The entries this year were not up to expectation, due, no doubt, to conflicting advertisements, the premium list for the Exhibition advertising the show for the last three days of the Exhibition and the premium list for the dog show calling for the first four days. If the Exhibition directors want to make a success of this show in future they should take the local kennel club into their confidence and try to cultivate that harmonious spirit among the fanciers so necessary to the running of a successful show.

Dr. Clayton was judge of all breeds, and right well did he do his work. His decision in placing an English Setter dog best of all breeds and an English Setter bitch best opposite sex was received with applause.

OUR RECENT DOG SHOWS.

OTTAWA.

Ottawa dog show has gone down to history, leaving memories at once pleasant and lasting. Improvements many and varied had been boasted in the advertising columns of Kennel and Bench, and it is only fair to say in the language of the real estate broker, "The improvements were all in." Ottawa has kept her word.

The dogs benched numbered 265, with 730 entries, and the quality was higher than the quantity. This was very particularly noticeable in the brace and team varieties on the closing night of the show. Seldom has finer quality been on exhibition anywhere.

Attendance was a revelation, even to the Ottawa officials. 17,000 persons attended. Yet never was the spacious building uncomfortably crowded. The Executive was always on hand, and the judging was done to schedule. "Bob" Ross, fresh from Cornwall show, went over the breeds allocated to his charge very carefully, and while we never have and never will see the show where the "grumbler" will be a negligible quantity, still there was very little audible kicking at Ottawa show.

Bert Swann, the "ace" handler, had 36 dogs in his charge, and, as usual, played havoc in the prize and special list. It almost verges on the "uncanny" the way this handler controls his dogs at the crucial moments. Sam Bamford and Jos. Perkins each had a string, while Dr. Villeneuve and Alf. Lepine were on hand with some of Montreal's representative dogs. The Winnipeg handlers, Kynoch and Picard had evidently finished at Toronto, so the Western dogs were absent.

Cocker Spaniels were in the "sun" with 23 entries, Bostons 23, English Bulldogs 21, Airedales 20, Fox Terriers 17, Foxhounds 17, Scotch Terriers 12. In Toys, Poms counted 14 and Poodles 13.

Next year will see all the old benches disposed of and new sanitary benches will take its place. This, together with a fresh coat of whitewash, will make the dog show building attractive enough to satisfy the most exacting for many years to come yet.

Dr. Tolmie, the new Minister of Agriculture, and the Hon. Mr. Arthur Meighen, Minister of the Interior, were

the distinguished visitors, while the Governor-General was an exhibitor. Jno. W. Brant, of the National Live Stock Records, was another exhibitor and had a comfortable win with his Spitz dog. Mr. S. Harvey, of the N.L.S. Records, was also an interested visitor, spending a few hours looking over some of Canada's best dogs.

Hospitality to the out of town fanciers was all that could be desired and was often remarked upon by the recipients. Ottawa is on the right track and intends staying there.

Why cannot the Executives of Ottawa and London get together, with a view to separating the dog show dates of these two cities? This year both earned two championship points, and it is safe to say that next year they could raise that to three. Let us hope this will be attended to.

The New Brunswick Kennel Club dog show, held recently, will go down in history as without a doubt the best yet held, for the even quality, and high grade of the dogs exhibited. Although the show failed to attain the customary three points, this was balanced by keen competition and the fact that there was not a "cull" on the benches, and it is very gratifying to know that the New Brunswick owners are breeding and producing better specimens right along.

The show, as usual, was held in the Old St. Andrew's Curling Rink, and it was a real treat to see the decorations and the general cleanliness of the building. An improvement for which the Show Committee deserves great credit was the introduction of a second exercising ring far removed from the judging ring.

Mr. R. A. Ross, of Montreal, Que., who judged all breeds, has left a memory in St. John that will live for many years by giving universal satisfaction. His careful attention and methodical manner in examining every dog brought before him. In many cases he took the dog under his own control to bring out his best points, and many an exhibitor is treasuring the advice given him by Canada's most popular all-round judge. There is no doubt that the desire of the exhibitors will be to again see Mr. R. A. Ross handing out the awards at one

of our future shows. One of the most pleasing events of the show was the presentation to Mr. Ross of a caricature showing a small boy's idea of the judge's attitude in the ring. Needless to say the inevitable pipe was in evidence. As the small boy said, "He's some smoker."

At the conclusion of the show, the club members presented Mr. W. C. MacKay, the hard-working secretary, with a gold signet ring, in appreciation of their esteem, as Mac was the right man in the right place on this as on other occasions.

Mr. Ross remarked that New Brunswick is more than holding its own as the home of the best sporting dogs in Canada, and it would be hard to find a better representative of English, and Irish Setters, Cocker and Foxhounds than may be seen on the benches at St. John show. As New Brunswick is without a doubt the best game, fishing and sporting Province in the Dominion, abounding as it does in moose, caribou and deer, and holds the record of the largest moose head in the Dominion, and in addition, being an extremely well-watered country, and the rivers teeming with fish, and no Province can be found to equal New Brunswick in the woodcock and partridge shooting, the natural life for the sporting dog.

He was poor as a show dog, but looked as if he lived in the lap of luxury and was not in show condition and had too good a home for he was fat and in full coat. The rest were all good. It is a long time since I judged as good a lot; in fact, collectively, I do not believe I ever judged better. I have always predicted that Canada would be the big Airedale country. Before long the men in the States will go scouting in Canada to get their Airedales, and not send to England. Another thing that impressed me was that they were all put down in good shape, that is if the owners knew the art of putting a Wire Terrier in show condition. Joseph Russell has a wonderful lot of dogs, and they are mostly all of his own breeding. Also Harry Clayton, the master of them all in breeding good ones. I believe the foundation of all his stock was the blood of Ch. Kenmare Sorceress, and what better foundation could one have than from that great bitch who was best of all breeds in the Westminster Show a few years back? One thing impressed me more than anything is the good

sportsmanship of the Canadian Airedale men. There was not a single kicker. They took what they got and said nothing. We all know condition and showing are everything. Those that went down at this show may win the next time out. Capt. H. Dudley Waters was a king of stewards. He got the dogs in quickly and only a judge knows what a great help it is to have an able assistant, for which I wish to thank him.

Should Claycliffe Colonel come along he will make them all step. 2nd to a litter brother, Claycliffe Tip Top, a fine little terrier, does not look at all like the winner, a fine little terrier, but has a light eye. 3rd to Silver Illuminator, a good terrier, and showed all the time, but should have at least five pounds more on him. Reserve to Harvie Warlock, a stylish dog, broad in front.

Canadian-bred dogs—1st again to Claycliffe Colonel, beats 2nd, Walnut King Nobbler in coat, color, eye, front and shoulders. 3rd to Claycliffe Tip Top. Reserve to Harvie Warlock.

George S. Briggs, Toronto, made the trip to Winnipeg with his Pomeranians, Bellville Fortune and Lady Mayfair, and justified the long journey to the West by annexing winners dogs and bitches, while Bellville Fortune was awarded best Toy and reserve best in show.

Mr. W. C. Baldwin, of Ottawa, Judges American Show

An incident of note, more especially to American Foxhound breeders on this side of the line and to all Canadian dog men in general, was the combined bench show and field trials of the Brunswick Foxhound Club of Massachusetts.

This is the oldest Foxhound Club in America, having been founded in 1888, and the only one whose show and field trials are recognized by the A. K. C., this being their twenty-ninth annual event and was held at Barre, Mass., during the week of Oct. 13th to 18th.

Mr. W. C. Baldwin, of Ottawa, was the first and only Canadian that has ever attended one of these meets, and also the only Canadian that ever judged American Foxhounds in the United States. He officiated as bench show judge and also was one of the field trial judges at this meeting.

The bench show classes were Derby dogs, Derby bitches, all age dogs, all age bitches, couples of hounds.

In the field trials there were two stakes in the Derby, one for dogs and bitches eighteen months and under, and the, all age.

Mr. Baldwin states that they were the finest lot of American Foxhounds that he has ever had the pleasure of seeing together, and were altogether, all round extra good standard type. Of the hospitality shown him, our friend Baldwin cannot speak too highly of it, as he says it was one of the finest, and one of the best bunch of fellows he ever met.

In passing comment we do not know whether our national war activities are drawing our two countries closer in friendly ties and recognition, but we do say that the above is a great compliment to Mr. Baldwin, and Canada, after his many years of successful breeding of winning American Foxhounds.

The following clipping is taken from a Boston paper:

Good Scoring in Second Day of the Derby Stake at Barre.

Barre, Oct. 14.—The second day of the Brunswick Foxhound Club Derby trials to-day was one of the best in the history of the club. The hounds were cast off on the Rogers farm in the west part of Barre at 6.30 o'clock this morning.

Although the hounds ran for several hours, the judges were unable to finish the trials to-day, but will conclude them this week.

A fox was started shortly after the pack was cast off and the chase led out to the northwest with eight hounds in hot pursuit. They barely got out of hearing when another fox jumped by the remainder of the pack and the chase led off towards Ruggles hill, where the fox was played for more than two hours, giving the judges ample opportunities for a good scoring.

Spectators at the trials to-day witnessed some of the finest running ever seen in the Derby trials. One party seated on a side hill saw three foxes within 15 minutes.

The race kept the judges on the jump, and Otis Daniels, president of the club, who was acting as judge, proved to the satisfaction of all that there was no Derby hound fast enough to get away from him. He made three pastures, hedges and four stone walls in no time for a record.

Judge W. C. Baldwin, who left his business in Ottawa, Canada, to act as judge, proved that he could jump a creek as well as the Derby hounds, when he made one crossing in two jumps.

Another race in which there was five or six hounds, was at the Steps. This hunt was followed by Judge Bradford S. Turpin, who obtained good scoring.

The fox, driven by the main pack, found it impossible to shake about 12 dashing Derby youngsters, and, finding that about every turn they were getting closer on his heels, took refuge in an old drain, which evidently is used by the foxes in that vicinity in just such an emergency, as earlier in the morning another fox, finding he could not match his wits and speed against a pack of thoroughbreds, took refuge in the same retreat.

Master of Hounds Starks called off the hunt at 11.45 o'clock, and hunters returned to Hotel Barre, satisfied with the day's trials.

The management was to blame for allowing this important breed to be judged outside and in semi-darkness. The judge was to blame for beginning his work outside, where there was no room to parade, "action" in a Collie being an essential characteristic of the breed.

The Collie Club of Canada officials were to blame for allowing their members to continue showing their dogs under impossible circumstances. The whole affair is to be regretted.

**The Kennel Club Stud Book, Volume
XLVI. for 1919.**

Before the war the publication of the K.C.S.B., one of the most useful "doggy" publications, used to take place just at the beginning of every year. The war had changed the aspect of many things, and the K.C.S.B. had to follow suit, viz., it did not appear each year before rather late into that year. Of course, we all know that it is not for Mr. E. W. Jaquet, the very courteous and capable Secretary of the Kennel Club, and Editor of the "Kennel Gazette" and the K.C.S.B., to cry "culpa mea," but rather to the printers, binders and publishers, and I know it as a fact that Mr. Jaquet did not receive the volumes for 1919 before the morning of the 19th of October!

The K. C. S. B. is published by the "Field," at the price of 10 shillings and 6 pence, free, London. The preface to the 1919 volume shows that it was in the hands of the printers in June last. Those who are frequently needing to refer to its pages for information—and their number is, of course, legion—will note that the sections of the Stud Book, which were omitted from that for 1918, have now been reinstated. They include the Kennel Club Rules brought entirely up to date, the Regulations concerning the Field Trials, etc., etc. All these additions do not increase the size of the volume, but we must bear in mind that there were no championship shows during 1918.

Needless to say that every breeder and fancier of dogs should possess the K.C.S.B. in his or her library, for this Stud Book can be regarded as an absolutely indispensable vade mecum of every man and woman interested in matters canine, from the breeding, regulating, and . . . governmental points of view. Therefore, my advice to all and sundry is: "go and send for the K.C.S.B. (Kennel Club Stud Book) at once."

OUR LONDON LETTER

LATEST MOVES IN THE AFFAIRS OF BRITISH DOGDOM.

As I write these lines (on Sunday, the 5th October,) the Sunday papers announce that there is hope that the great Railway Strike will be settled to-day. God grant that it will. As Mr. Marples, the esteemed Editor of "Our Dogs," correctly says: "The dog-loving public must surely be a long suffering one." It was first the great war that had stopped our dog-shows. Then came the rabies scare, which literally put a muzzle on them. After the war had been fought and won, we all began to prepare for dog-shows, which started again all over the country. The rabies scare put a "muzzle" on us again. And now the Railway strike not only paralyses the shows to come, but had the immediate effect of stopping or postponing those that had been announced to take place on such and such a date. Thus, with the granted permission of our Kennel Club, Mr. Holland Buckley had to postpone his very promising Great Terrier Show, which was scheduled to take place on the 1st of October. Needless to say with what sorrow our Terrier-men had to submit to the inevitable. Other shows, of less importance than the above, had also to be postponed. Let us hope that the Championship Show of the Kensington Canine Society, already put off on the 13th of May last, and now scheduled to take place on the 14th of October, will be a fixture this time.

With regard to the muzzling order in England, it still goes "merrily" on, and, as our Board of Agriculture has it, "there is devilish little chance of a general withdrawal of the Muzzling Order." However, we must not grumble too much, for the order in question has already been removed from certain parts of the country, notably in the Borough of Croydon, which, as your readers probably know, is quite near London, so near, in fact, that 99 persons out of 100 consider is London itself. The curious part of the matter is that we, who live in Sydenham, a stone-throw from Croydon, must have our dogs muzzled! Apropos of the muzzling order: at the Paris dog-show, on the 12th October, all the dogs will have to be muzzled, and be on collar and chain. Why? Has our rabies scare affected our French friends? I mean,

of course, the scare itself.

In order to deal with the question of dog shows in England, as between our Board of Agriculture and Fisheries and our Kennel Club, the latter appointed a sub-committee, consisting of Messrs. George Howlett, W. L. McCandlish and E. W. Jaquet. This sub-committee drafted their suggestions for the consideration of the Board of Agriculture, pointing out that it was absolutely necessary that championship shows should be held in various parts of the country, and that open, or nearly open, competition should be allowed. The sub-committee also said that, if it were granted that a dog from an unrestricted area could be sent for exhibition to a restricted area, without any appreciable risk of spreading the disease, there would be no greater risk incurred in allowing dogs from restricted areas being shown in unrestricted areas, providing the same regulations as to the conduct of the show and the transport to and from the show were enforced. The sub-committee also called the Board of Agriculture's attention to the disabilities under which breeders of pedigree dogs have labored during the period of the war, and that the value of a dog, especially for export, was largely dependent upon his performances at championship shows.

To cut a very long story short, the Show Regulations Committee of our Kennel Club was instructed to issue licenses for championship shows and to grant challenge certificates. Thus, shows may again be held in the districts at present controlled, i.e., in restricted areas. The "Kennel Gazette," for the month of August, publishes the regulations for the holding of shows in "control of dogs districts," of which the following are the most interesting: (1) A "control of dogs district" is what is commonly known as a "muzzled area"; (2) the show authority must not allow inside the show building any dog coming from outside the control of dogs district in which the show is held, unless it has come from a place outside that district direct to the show and is sent in a suitable box or hamper; (3) every dog in the show must be muzzled, and the muzzle must not be removed until the dog is actually judged, by the order of the judge. I do not know what your readers think of it, but, personally, I

would prefer not to show my dog at all.

The breed that seems to produce a lot of discussion in our doggy press at the moment is the Alsatian Wolf Dog, which, thanks to the exertions of the very energetic Honorary Secretary of the Alsatian Wolf Dog Club (of England), Colonel J. T. C. Moore-Brabazon, M.C., M.P., becomes more and more popular in England. Colonel Moore-Brabazon tells me that his club has now a membership of 43, but every effort is being made by his committee to increase this membership. The club's active policy is now being pursued very strongly, and as soon as the more important shows are announced, classes for Alsatian Wolf Dogs will be guaranteed by the club, and it is even possible that the Club will hold a Club Show some time this year. A very clever and most correct move on the part of the Club is that dogs born in France must be registered with the French Kennel Club (La Societe Centrale), before they are eligible for registration at our Kennel Club.

SHORT BARKS FROM OTTAWA.

The last meeting of the year of the Ottawa Kennel Club was held on the 9th of October, with a fair attendance, and took the form of a free and easy round table talk, at which many bright and breezy suggestions were made for the coming season. Many good ideas were brought forward to be handed to the new officers and Executive Committee, who are to be elected at our regular annual meeting on the second Wednesday in November.

The Riverdale Kennels of Messrs. E. & J. G. Slattery lost their good show bitch, Firefly IV., in September, due to whelping. This was an exceptionally good bitch and had done considerable winning, and it is a great loss to her owners.

O. V. Webley, of Tolstoi Kennels, quite recently imported from the United States two Russian Wolfhound bitches, who will make history at our forthcoming shows. We wish him the best of luck in his activities.

Mr. C. Packman, of Vimy Kennels, has been in the limelight with his Toys at the recent Toronto, Cornwall, Ottawa and Montreal shows.

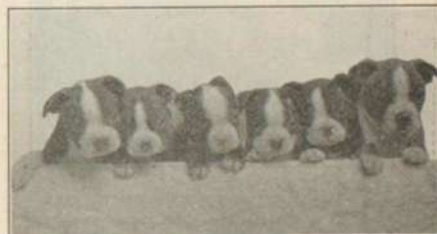

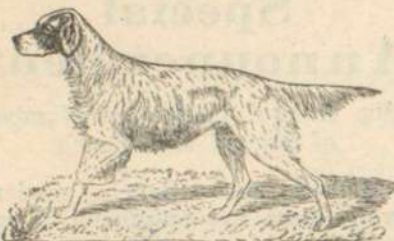

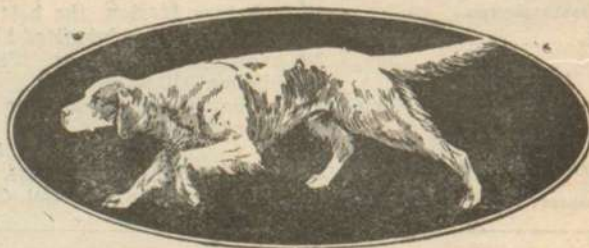
