Our Recent Shows From East to West

Toronto Kennel Club

Toronto Kennel Club's Seventeenth Annual Spring Show, was voted the best to date. The officials were on hand all the time, Secretary McFadden was a wonder, and anything he lacked by way of inexperience, he made up for in courtesy, accuracy and speed.

The building was ideal, though at times a little chilly, still it came pretty near being the best building secured by Toronto Kennel Club in many moons. Visitors were plentiful, every Province east of Manitoba being represented. James F. Strachan Montreal, was in constant attendance for the duration of the show, and when the breed associated with his name, came to the "block" it was quite noticeable that he was perfectly satisfied.

"Bob" Ross was bearing the Ermine with his usual equanimity.

REMARKS

Commencing with Big Breeds we first came to Mastiffs, and found a useful-looking collection, all of them being products of the Wingfield Kennels. St. Bernards came next with five entries, from the well-known Clanmont Kennels, the choice of these being Ch. The King's Son. Two fair Bloodhounds was all this variety could muster.

Russian Wolfhounds were plentiful and of good quality. A. V. Webley, of Ottawa, produced the Winners' dog in Orloff of Tolstoi, and A. O. Beardmore the Winners' bitch with war Baby. They were a nice, uniform lot and much admired by the visitors.

Greyhounds, Beagles and Whippits call for no comments, the quality and quantity of the exhibits being of a moderate order.

A useful collection of American Foxhounds were up for competition; W. J. Archibald produced the winners in both sexes. Only three Setters were on hand, which is rather regrettable, as this useful and pretty variety have many admirers.

Cocker Spaniels had 48 entries. The outstanding dog in this section was Dr. J. A. Campbell's Oakley Jackdaw, who carried off Winners' solid color and Special for best of breed. Imp. Trey, owned by Chas. Bowerbank, was Winners in parti-color. Mrs. T. Worthy's typical bitch, Jenny

June, was easily the best amongst the solid color bitches. Midkiff Christina went to the top in parti-colors. She is a new one, brought out by R. Tyrwhitt, and will do some winning.

Airedales were plentiful and made a nice, uniform collection. Claycliffe Tip Top carried all before him until he reached the Open, where he met that sensational Terrier, Ch. Polam Maxim, who carried off premier honors with ease. Claycliffe Colonel was placed second to his kennel mate, Tip Top, in all his classes. Representatives from the Claycliffe Kennels also figured well in the bitch classes. Claycliffe Beauty and Claycliffe Aviatrix ran a neck-and-neck race, and were only separated in the Open class when Parkton Arlette stepped in between them. The latter is looking her best and is hard to fault.

The Irish Terrier, Ch. Mendon Mike, was put down fit and won with ease, his nearest rival being North End Muddler. J. D. Strachan's newly imported Cairns carried off Winners in both sexes.

The sensation in Wire Fox Terriers was Mr. J. F. Strachan's puppy, Ormsby Snowball, an eight months old son of Ridgeway Dark Boy. This youngster is showing exceptional promise, and will make a name for himself. His quality can be gauged from the fact that at this show he was placed over such good dogs as Claycliffe Corker, Wycollar Terrier and Parkton Collarbone. Bitches was an easy thing for Ormsby Artist Model, who was put down in tip-top form.

Karswood II. was Winners in the Smooths. He, however, was closely pressed for that position by Peerless Prince. The Winnipeg bitch, Ch. Madison Atlanta, was easily the best of opposite sex.

Bull Terriers were few in numbers, and produced nothing sensational. Mr. F. Coles' good bitch, Belle Mahone, was shown in A1 condition, and was easily best of breed.

Bulldog with 57 entries was quite an attraction. The placing of the Montreal dog, Who Goes There, to Winners met with the approval of the ringsiders. Reserve to him was Southport Joffre. That typical bitch, Princess Pat, once more went to Winners. We considered her daughter, Jellico Lady, unfortunate in not being Reserve, as they are both the same type and make a wonderful brace.

Collies turned out well, there being some keen contests amongst the 65 entries. The sensational dog, Ch. Alstead Aeroplane, made his initial bow in Canadian show-ring, and created quite an impression on the Collie "fans." His superb quality landed him on top and Special for best of breed. Ch. Quarrybrae Coleen was put down in nice form, and won over that good bitch, Weston Attraction.

In French Bulldogs the Wainwright Kennels of Brantford produced the winning dog in Henderson Jacques Fournier. Pride of place in the opposite sex went to Doncella, who had travelled all the way from St. John, N.B.

Twenty-four Boston Terriers were benched, representing an entry of 55. A new face in this popular variety was M. J. A. Gouins' Yankee Speed King, who went to Winners with ease. Reserve to him was that good dog, Jackson's Paddy Dee. Speed Queen, owned by A. T. Calhorn, was Winner of the opposite sex.

Mr. J. W. Weldon showed two nice Yorkshire Terriers, which went to Winners.

Pomeranians, with over 60 entries, were the best collection in the Toy section. The Montreal dog, Stormlight of Dara, was awarded Winners; Rotherville Merville being Winners' bitch. There was the keenest of competition in this section, and many good dogs had to be placed amongst the "also rans."

Pekingese were the next best collection, and are making headway at a rapid rate. The quality in this variety was very noticeable, and we saw one of the best collections ever brought together in Toronto. The Peke "fans" were somewhat disappointed in the placings, as many of the best specimens had to be content with red and yellow ribbons. Yen Li was placed as best dog, and Yuk San of Eccleshall as best female.

One English Toy Spaniel and two Maltese were all these varieties could muster.

Mrs. Delaney's Lord Bobs was Winners' dog in Italian Greyhounds, and his kennel-mate, Ch. Lady Grace, Winners' bitch.

Toy Poodles was an easy thing for Mrs. J. W. Weldon's Snowball 8th. A still easier victory was the same owner's Miss Snookie, who got Winners bitch.

Three moderate Chows brought the Breed Classes to a conclusion. Then followed the Variety Classes which created much interest amongst the exhibitors and ringsiders.

The Bulldog Club of Canada

This enterprising specialty club, held their annual Specialty Show at Montreal, under Canadian Kennel rules, on Saturday, April 17th, 1920, when Harry Peabody (late of Peterborough), Toronto, veteran breeder and exhibitor, was on the woolsack, and, by special arrangement with Kennel and Bench, herewith tells "his reasons why.—Editor.

Judges' Report, by H. Peabody, Toronto.

The Bulldog Club of Canada Show was held at the Stanley Hall, Montreal, a highly fitted building for a Specialty Show, being large, well lighted, free from drafts, a sensibly large ring with plenty of sawdust.

The executive worked splendidly together and the record entry, and numerous specials made it quite a gala day for the ancient and historic bulldog.

First fourteen classes were confined to exhibitors resident within 25 miles of the city of Montreal, and produced some most excellent specimens, and considering the long trying winter were in splendid condition.

In dogs "Alban Bunch" was a real good low to ground type, might be better in pasterns but the winter does not permit of much exercising, good body, and in front of the eye classic.

In bitches (25 miles radius) "Lady Douglas Haig" was also a good one, without any glaring faults. "Realmont Blaze," is a really good type low, cloddy, and genuine bulldog character. She was much in evidence in the open classes.

Limit (under 45 lbs) was headed by Diamond "Thornfeild Pride," beating "Lord Darkie" who needs time to make up into a good dog, possessing as he does many excellent points.

Open dogs (under 45 lbs) brought out "Roxton Boy" and a real good bulldog, excelling in underjaw. Stop, turn up (and in fact, you can touch his underjaw, and top of skull, without touching his nose by a quarter of an inch), short backed, roach, big in skull for his weight, and though appearing lacking in heart room, really was bigger round than "Diamond Thornfeild Pride" when the tape measure was used, by 2 inches.

"Diamond Thornfeild Pride" is a brindle pied, very typical, low made, good ears, bone to burn, with a good body, but is not so good in squareness and turn up, loses to above in facial properties.

Colwyn Buller, a really good all

round little one, that will come out on top when matured. I expect a big future for this dog as he excels in the foreface, low, and general appearance open dogs (over 45 lbs) was headed by the grand heavy weight dog "Tam Hin," good ears and skull but very long caste.

Bitches were very good, and all shown in grand condition. "Miss Cheetham" winning first in Canadian bred, is well known, and considering her age, wears well, and is still up to show form. "Strathtay Supreme," a good quality bitch was second.

"Sally of Montreal," first in limit class (over 40 lbs), a splendid bitch all over, underjaw might be better, and turn up more developed.

"Dundee Lady Rhoda," first in open (under 40 lbs), a real high class bitch, on the small side, reminding me very much of the celebrated champion "Queen Mabs."

"Roxton Miss" appeared in Junior, a really good bitch, big in skull, wide in chop, good turn up, good bone, excellent feet. She beat "Sally of Montreal" in head properties, feet and bone, and lost to her, in spring of rib.

She was winners in bitches after considerable pains in adjudicating, further criticisms might be advanced, but I must not transgress too far on our valued space.

Guelph Kennel Club

The First Annual Show held under the auspices of the newly formed organization took place on April 14th and 15th, and will go down in history as one of the best "first attempts" it has been our pleasure to review, and we extend our hearty congratulations to the Guelph Society on their splendid achievement. The officials, one and all, had a thorough grip of the requirements of the present day dog exhibitions, and left no "stone unturned" in their efforts to bring the event to a successful issue.

The official returns show that 130 dogs were benched, representing an entry of 286. Add to this a clean and spacious building, cash prizes for the successful ones, specials galore, a competent and willing staff of officials, and a judge who knows his dogs, and we have an ideal show that any town ought to be proud of. The attendance during the two days was remarkable, and would put to shame many we have seen at our larger cities. Toronto was well represented both by exhibitors and dogs, and cut a wide swath in the prize list. We

also noticed several from Oakville and Hamilton, and a few from far-off Winnipeg and Montreal.

That capable all-rounder, Mr. "Jack" Meadows, of Oakville, was the judge-elect, and to say his decisions met with the approval of the exhibitors and ringsiders is putting it mildly. His work was characterized by careful and honest placings, and we heard no kicking, everybody being satisfied that they had received a "square deal."

In conversation with Mr. Meadows regarding the merits and demerits of the exhibits he adjudicated upon, he volunteered the following brief criticisms: The winning St. Bernard is just a moderate one and could be improved in hindquarters. "Lady Romanoff," the winning Russian Wolfhound bitch, is very typical and sound; her companion, "Ch. Petrofski of Addlestone," is a slashing, big upstanding dog, just beginning to age. "Nolan's Dempsey, a young Beagle," impressed me very much, and will do some winning when matured; for quality and type he stood alone in this section. There was nothing worthy of note amongst the Foxhounds. Cocker Spaniels turned out well; "Oakley Jackdaw," a black dog of exquisite type and conformation, was far away the best. It was in the Open Dogs for Parti-colors where the closest contest appeared, and very little separated the first two. The bitch classes brought out nothing outstand-

I was much impressed with the quality of the Airedales, a section that was made interesting by the presence of the Claycliffe representatives, who had eight dogs entered. Their good dog "Tip Top" lost on the day to "Harvie Warlock" in length and strength of foreface, bone and coat. "Claycliffe Colonel" was a close contender. Bitches were particularly good. Several youngsters of exceptional promise came before me that will bear watching in the future. The Open Class was a mighty hot one, and brought out Canada's best. "Parkton Arlette," whom I gave Winners, is looking at her best and scores over the Reserve, "Ch. Parkton Sweet Olive," in shortness of back, spring of rib and all-round conformation. Next to this pair was "Claycliffe Aviatrix," a real good one, but does not do herself justice in the ring. "Mona Liza" is a useful one, but was shown short of coat.

Irish Terriers were few. The newly imported dog, Moorlaugh Manus," is a real good stamp of a Terrier and won easily. The Winners' bitch, "Mendon Patricia," is also a useful one.

Scotch Terriers were a nice, even lot, and very little separated them.

Wire-haired Fox Terriers provided an eye-opener. Seldom, if ever, have I seen such a collection in Canada as came before me in the class for Open Dogs. "Walnut Master Key," whom I placed on top, is a grand Terrier—nice size, good bone and excellent coat. "Wycollar Terror" and "Claycliffe Corker" gave him a close run for top place. I was much impressed with a young bitch named "Judy Mulvaney," who has the makings of a real top-notcher, and is hard to fault.

Smooths were not so plentiful, the outstanding ones being "Peerless Prince" and "Ch. Madison Atalanta."

The only Bull Terrier present was "Belle Mahone," who was put down in top-notch condition, and shows all the qualities that this breed of terrier calls for.

"Southport Joffre" was easily the best Bulldog. A short, compact dog with nice bone, his closest contender was the old warrior, "Baron of Lambare," who is looking as well and fit as ever. "Lady Godiva," the Winners' bitch, is a low, cloddy one, and won over a moderate collection.

"Ch. Alstead Aeroplane," the tricolor Collie, had matters somewhat
his own way; his wonderful head,
front, bone and general Collie character made him an easy winner. The
Reserve dog, "Coltness Commander,"
has improved beyond recognition since
last I saw him, and can do some good
winning. The Winners' bitch, "Ch.
Quarrybrae Colleen," is looking well
and won with a big margin.

Two fair Dalmatians and one French Bulldog call for no comment.

My hardest task was in Boston Terriers, where, after awarding Winners' dog to "Yankee Speed King," I was confronted with the above-mentioned dog and the two Toronto dogs, "Ch. Joyce's Prince" and "Ch. Count Dee Cee" for Special for best of breedthree grand dogs, all showing their best. Very little separated the latter pair, and it is a case of "splitting hairs" to divide them. After a most careful scrutiny I decided in favor of "Count Dee Cee." "Pretty Mickey," a promising young bitch, was the best female. The next best was "Wonder Girl." Both these young maidens are by "Ch. Count Dee Cee."

The two outstanding dogs in the Pomeranian classes were "Lillyhill Model" and "Jumbo." The former scored in coat and color. "Chocolate Dot" was easily the best female, and won with a big margin.

Pekingese produced a few of the best. "Walnut Mannikin," the winner, is better in head and hindquarters than the Reserve dog, "Sunni of Somme." In bitches I placed "Mowata Tai Pey" over "Tuk San of Eccleshall." The latter has a good coat, plenty of plume and feathering, but lacks the type of the winner in every other essential.

One pair Toy Spaniels and one pair Maltese we will pass by. "Snowball" and "Miss Snookie" are two Toy Poodles that impressed me very much, and were easily the best in their respective classes.

I wish to thank the officials for the excellent service they rendered me in the ring, and in conclusion must express my appreciation on the splendid management of affairs.

Importing the Illegitimates

Hundreds of inquiries have come to this office seeking for information under this heading, most of the inquirers being of the opinion that dogs born during the "prohibited period" (September 7, 1917, to January 24, 1919) could not be registered.

Here are the details; save them for future guidance:

On September 7, 1917, the Kennel Club (English), in consequence of communications from the British Government, were obliged to pass a resolution that from the date of the resolution they would not register any dogs born after September 7, 1917.

On November 20, 1918-after the signing of the Armistice-it was decided that on and after November, 22, 1918, breeding operations might be resumed, and that puppies born on or after January 24, 1919; would be eligible for registration.

On February 5, 1919, the committee of the Kennel Club (English) carefully considered the question of registration of dogs which had not been born under the license of the Kennel Club, and decided that they be registered, and referred the matter to the Annual General Meeting, held on February 26, 1919. At that meeting the decision of the Committee was upheld, and it was further decided: "That dogs born between September 7, 1917, and January 24, 1919, should be allowed to be exhibited not for competition only.

The registering of the dogs in question is made in the regular way, and on the regular forms, the difference being that the words: "This dog if exhibited in Great Britain or Ireland must be shown as 'Not for Competition Only," are stamped across the face of the certificate of registration.

Therefore the only privilege now denied the "Illegitimate" is that he cannot be shown in Great Britain or Ireland for competition. But he can be registered.

The Russian Wolf Hound

(Borzoi)

By A. V. Webley, Ottawa

(Member Board of Governors, The Russian Wolfhound Club of America).

[The following very interesting essay on the Russian Wolfhound was read at the regular monthly meeting and show of the Ottawa Kennel Club on Wednesday evening, April 14th, and it gives me great pleasure in reproducing the article in "Kennel and Bench" this month for the benefit of our Wolfhound fanciers particularly.—Editor.]

The "Borzoi," or, as it is called in America, the Russian Wolfhound, is one of the most beautiful and aristocratic animals of the canine world. Its early history shows them to be one of the oldest breeds of dogs, and it seems sure that all breeds of Russian Wolfhounds came from one common root, namely, from the crossing of the Asiatic, or Eastern "Borzoi," which penetrated Russia some hundreds of years ago with the Northern wolflike dogs, and even with the wolf itself. This is proved by the ears and the long hair on the neck.

The Courland "Borzoi" seems also to have added its blood to the breed, and given to it the long, curly hair. Also there is a marked family resemblance of the long-coated Greyhounds of Eastern Russia, Persia, and that section of Europe and Asia which demonstrates very clearly that there has been for many years a defined type of Greyhound, or racing hound, which we have known in America for thirty years as the Russian Wolfhound.

In the early days of the "Borzoi" in England a few were exhibited at the Kennel Club Shows, and among the best was the Prince of Wales' "Moloditz." Later owners were Queen Alexandra and the Duchess of Newcastle, who was also the largest importers from Russia at that time,

The Russian Wolfhound is one of the latest breeds to be introduced in America, and judging by the way it has increased it has come to stay. The first to arrive in America was in the early nineties, and as far as is known it was brought from England by Mr. Wade, of Hulton, Pennsylvania, followed by several others which also came from England, and some direct from Russia.

Probably the man who gave the

breed the greatest impetus at this time was Mr. Joseph B. Thomas, of Yale University, who went to Russia and brought over to America several very fine specimens from the Grand Duke Nicholas' kennels at Gatchina and from M. Balderoff's kennels at Perchina, which laid the foundation of the Valley Farms Kennels at Simsbury, Conn., U.S.A., and which later became famous for their splendid Wolfhounds.

The three most famous Wolfhounds which Mr. Thomas imported to America were "Bristri of Perchina," "Zyclon" of Perchina," and "Yarki of Perchina." "Bistri" was three times winner at the Westminster Kennel Club Show in New York, and "Zyclon" twice winner at the same show afterwards. Their blood is still to be found in most of our leading Wolfhounds to-day.

In 1903 a Specialty Club was organized for the amelioration of the breed, and known as the Russian Wolfhound Club of America, and at its inception it contained such well-known men as the late Jas. Mortimer, Dr. J. D. Mund, and Jos. B. Thomas, and from the time of the founding of the club in 1903 great advances have been made for the breed in the show world, and the club recommends an up-to-date list of judges, and many specials have been offered for competition through the Club's efforts.

The Russian Wolfhound was used in its native land to hunt the wolves that are still plentiful in some sections of the country, and are kept in a more or less wild state for this purpose. In Western Canada they are still most profitably used for hunting wolves and coyotes, which infest the prairies, and two hounds have been known to kill three coyotes in fifteen minutes.

The Standard calls for a handsome, graceful and powerful dog, built on the general lines of the Greyhound, but taller and more developed. The Russian Wolfhound has a character that is lovable, and you also have a dog that is noticeable anywhere. He is most affectionate, and loves only his master, and is termed a one-man dog. He is most remarkable for his love for home, and when trained makes a splendid watch dog. Although savage by reputation they are far from it. They are great hunters,

and run by sight only. They have the speed to catch the swiftest jack rabbit and the pluck and grit to kill the wolf if necessary. They are credited with being the swiftest dog in the world, and have records which show they have done 25 yards to the second, or a mile in 1 minute and 15 seconds, or about 50 miles an hour. By careful handling and judicious breeding they have become so domesticated that they are perfectly eligible as family pets, and make splendid companions, and have always been prominent as fashionable pets also. In fact, the greatest artists the world has ever known have depicted the Royalty of various countries accompanied by this grand and stately animal, and to-day you will find many specimens in the Royal kennels of Europe. In America to-day also the Russian Wolfhound is often seen in our moving pictures with the best actors and actresses, and splendid pictures they make. They are also a very hardy type of dog, and can stand the c oldest climates, and mature Wolfhounds require no heat in the coldest weather, as they are well protected by their magnificent coats of long white hair. The coats of Show Wolfhounds on the back and neck should be brushed forward in order to enhance their rough appearance. They do not require any special food from that which is given to the ordinary dog, but must have plenty of exercise daily. The Standard for Russian Wolfhounds, as adopted by the Russian Wolfhound Club of America, is as follows:

Head.—Skull, slightly domed, long and narrow, with scarcely any perceptible stop, rather inclined to be Roman-nosed; jaws, long, powerful and deep; teeth, strong, clean and even, neither pig-jawed nor undershot; nose, large and black.

Ears.—Small and fine in quality, lying back on the neck when in repose, with the tips, when thrown back, almost touching, behind the occiput; raised, when at attention.

Eyes. — Set somewhat obliquely, dark in color, intelligent, but rather soft in expression; never full nor staring, nor light in color; eyelids dark

Neck.—Clean, free from throatiness, somewhat shorter than in the Greyhound, slightly arched, very powerful and well set on. H.

Shoulders.—Sloping, should be fine at the withers and free from coarseness or lumber.

Chest.—Rather narrow, with great depth of brisket.

Ribs.—Only slightly sprung, but very deep, giving room for heart and lung play.

Back.—Rising a little at the loins, in a graceful curve.

Loins.—Extremely muscular, but rather tucked up, owing to the great depth of chest and comparative shortness of back and ribs.

Fore legs.—Bone, flat, straight, giving free play for the elbows, which should be neither turned in nor out; pasterns strong.

Feet — Hare-shaped, with wellarched knuckles, toes close, and well padded.

Hindquarters.—Long, very muscular and powerful, with well-bent stifles and strong second thighs; hocks broad, clean and well let down.

Tail.—Long, set on and carried low, in a graceful curve.

Coat.—Long, silky (not woolly), either flat, wavy or rather curly. On the head, ears and front of legs it should be short and smooth; on the neck the frill should be profuse and rather curly. Feather on hindquarters and tail, long and profuse, less so on the chest and back of forelegs.

Color.—Any color, white usually predominating, more or less marked with lemon, tan, fawn, brindle, grey or black. Whole-colored specimens of these tints occasionally appear.

General appearance should be that of an elegant, graceful aristocrat among dogs, possessing courage and combining great muscular power with extreme speed.

Size. — Dogs: average height at shoulder from 28 inches to 31 inches; average weight from 75 to 105 pounds. Larger dogs are often seen, extra size being no disadvantage when it is not acquired at the expense of symmetry, speed and staying quality.

Females are invariably smaller than the dogs, and two inches less in height and from 15 to 20 pounds less in weight is a fair average.

A substantial handler's prize will be offered in order to get the competitive support from that quarter, while something really worth while will be offered for the "Best in Show" attraction. Montreal' premium lists will draw them the entry they want.

Trois Rivieres Kennel Club, are nothing at all if not a live bunch of good sports. Hogg of New Westminister was amongst the ribbons with his "Scottie Invertay Dirk," a really good one.

The judge, H. M. Robertson, of Lamanda Park, California, came as near giving entire satisfaction as any allround judge I have seen since the days of the late Mr. J. B. Mortimer. He deserves the highest of praise, and handled his work in a manner which clearly showed he knew his business.

One of the officials at least would have done well had he made the same study in courtesy as Mr. Robertson has command of and extended this to the judge. It does not carry away a good impression when the judge gets told where to get off at in a public dining-room for being ten minutes late through no fault of his.

I will take off my hat to the fanciers at the Coast for being a bunch of the sportiest sports I have yet met, and wish them all the success they are entitled to.






