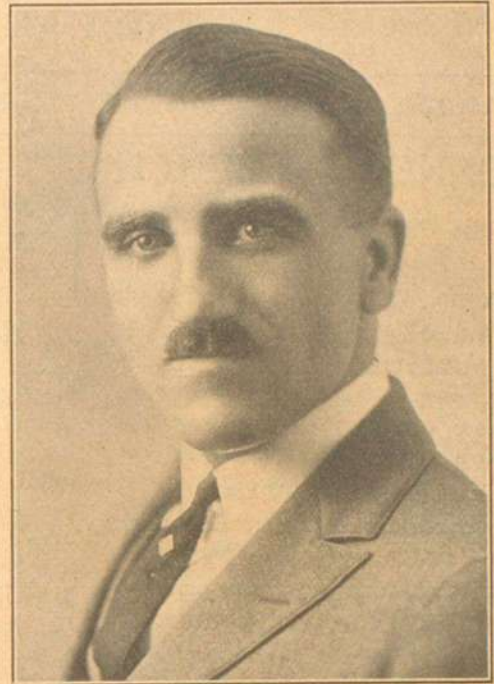

A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB will be held at the offices of the Club, 774½ Yonge Street, Toronto, on Thursday evening, October 18th, 1923, commencing at 8 o'clock.

### Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club was held at the Club Offices, 774½ Yonge Street, Toronto, on Thursday evening, September 20th, 1923, at 8 o'clock. The Vice-President, Mr. Harry Clayton, was in the chair, the President, Mr. Joseph Russell, still being unable to attend. The directors present included Messrs. N. K. Swire, J. T. Waggitt, Col. G. F. McFarland, Dr. J. N. MacRae.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Secretary, and on motion were declared adopted as read.

The Secretary reported on the Madden vs. Malovitz complaint, and was instructed to ascertain from the complainant the competence of "Mount Challenger" at this date, also if "Maid of Woodland" had proven herself, also if "Tam Hin's" papers had been attended to.

The Secretary reported that he had taken up Mr. F. W. Walkerdine's complaint against Mr. George Kynoch, Winnipeg, who had been advertising his Bulldog "Ace of Aces" as a champion in various western mediums of advertising (exhibits on view). In extenuation, the Secretary advised that the Canadian Kennel Club had been contributor to the unfortunate trouble in so far that "Ace of Aces" was shown in Stud Book 25 as winners dog at Fort Garry Kennel Club Show (October, 1922), which was a typographical error, and should have read "reserve" winner ("Ch. Durandside Captain" taking winners at the show in question), and further, that he (the Secretary) had referred to "Ch. Ace of Aces" in error, when reporting Westminster Show in March issue of *Kennel and Bench*. The Secretary further reported that his reason for not mentioning Mr. Kynoch or his dog "Ace of Aces" (now champion) in the minutes of the June meeting was because of its possible

effect on the Bulldog entry at the Canadian National Exhibition, where the defendant was to act as judge. The directors were unanimous in their opinion that Mr. Kynoch knew that his dog was not a champion, and instructed the Secretary to write warning him against a recurrence of the offence.

Correspondence was read from Mr. A. McCloy and Mr. Harold Kneen, our British Columbia directors, relative to the suspension of Mr. N. McConnell, North Vancouver.

It was moved, seconded and carried, "That Mr. N. McConnell having satisfied the Board of Directors in the matter, his suspension be now raised."

Correspondence was read from Mr. John McCorquodale, Montreal, who tendered his apologies for having infringed Dog Show Rule 25 at the show held by the Montreal Kennel Association, May, 1922, for which offence he had been suspended.

And it was moved, seconded and carried, "That Mr. John McCorquodale be re-instated in the Club forthwith."

The Secretary read a letter from Mrs. J. Parker, Toronto, who sought to be re-instated as a member in good standing of the Canadian Kennel Club. Further, to Mrs. J. Parker's request was a letter from Mr. John MacNab Wilson, Manager, Toronto Humane Society, who made intercession on Mrs. Parker's behalf, and which was given due consideration.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, "That the application be refused, and that no further action be taken in the matter."

The Secretary, in the name of Mr. R. S. Tyrrell, Bottrel, Alta., presented



to the Canadian Kennel Club for its office adornment, a magnificent painting in oils, suitably framed, the subject being the four world-famous Russian Wolfhounds — "Champion Morvich," "International Champion Neva Romanoff," "Champion Tippy Dowidiago" and "Champion Borloff." The painting was an example of Mr. Tyrell's own craftsmanship and had been hung at the late Calgary Exhibition, where it had been very favorably commented upon, and had won second prize in the professional class, from amongst over one hundred other exhibits, and one day would have a historical value, besides its present great value as a work of art of the highest class.

The Vice-President accepted the gift on behalf of the Club, and expressed his appreciation and the appreciation of the directors, and instructed the Secretary to convey to Mr. R. S. Tyrell, their hearty thanks for the splendid gift.

The Secretary reported that Mr. Charles Bowerbank had been notified to be in attendance at the meeting, as requested by the Board at their most recent meeting, and "It was agreed that unless he appears before the Board of Directors at their next meeting and there give a satisfactory explanation, he will become automatically suspended from the privileges of the Club."

This being all the business coming before the Board, the meeting was declared adjourned.

#### HALTON COUNTY KENNEL CLUB?

#### POMERANIAN CLUB OF CANADA RUSHES THE SHOW SEASON.

Tuesday evening, Sept. 18th, ushered in the winter evening show season in Toronto, when the Pomeranian Club of Canada held forth for all breeds in the basement of Community Hall on Carlaw Ave. The building is a miserable failure for an all-round evening event, and an ideal one for a showing of one, or possibly two, breeds. Convenience and consideration for east-end members, we believe, was the Committee's concern when the hall was taken, but after an actual demonstration of the impossibility of handling the dogs and the large gallery of followers comfortably, it is not very likely that the experience will be repeated.

Crowds of dogs were on hand, and in some of the breeds several of the classes wore a Canadian national appearance—Bostons, Bulldogs, Collies, Pekes and Poms were out in strength. Whilst Terriers, never very numerous at a Toronto parlor event, were very strong at this show, with some snappy specimens coming together. Mr. Maurice Williams, the smiling Secretary, had the assistance of the "faithful" of his club, and these included several of the ladies, who had charge of the allocation of the many special prizes which were up for competition. Thirty dollars were taken at the gate, which shows that there were more than actual exhibitors in attendance.

We noticed that many of the judges were the old dependables, and that some were breaking into the laws of the "rule" for their first offence. Mr. A. Craddock, Bostons; Mr. Johnston, Bulldogs; Mr. James Gray, Collies; Mr. Matt Gracey, Irish Terriers; Mr. Robt. Johnston, Airedales; Wm. Robertson, Pomeranians; Mrs. Tompkins, Pekingese. The Children's Class was a thing of joy—thirty-two little tots of various ages, and all busy showing the merits of their "Buster" or "Tootsie." Here a Bulldog was showing off his "spread"; there a Terrier showing "both ends"; or a Collie "playing his ears"; or a Pom with a step like a blooded Hackney. "The things they say and the things they do"; the way they say them and the way they do them is sufficient recompense for a committee catering to the Children's Class.

# 1924 -- ELECTIONS -- 1924

Read the following excerpts from the Constitution carefully and they will guide you in making your nominations:

## Who Are Entitled to Vote?

Members in good standing in respect to voting, or holding office, are members whose membership fees for the current year have been paid on or before the 30th day of September, 1923.

## Article 3, Section 9, reads:

No member shall hold office or be entitled to vote at a meeting if at the time in arrears for membership fees, and no member shall be entitled to vote who was not a member of the Club at the time the notice was given calling such meeting.

## Article 7, Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 reads:

1. **PRESIDENT.** The President shall be elected in each year, previously to the annual meeting of this Club, by ballot of the members in good standing on the 30th day of September preceding. Nominations for President shall be made in writing and shall be signed by at least two members in good standing, and shall be sent to the Secretary of this Club, so as to be received by him on or before the 15th day of November.

2. **VICE-PRESIDENT.** The Vice-President shall be elected in a like manner and at a like time to the election of the President.

3. **SECOND VICE - PRESIDENT.** The Second Vice-President shall be elected in a like manner and at a like time to the election of the President and Vice-President.

4. **DIRECTORS.** Directors shall be elected in each year previously to the annual meeting of the Club, by ballot of the members in each respective Province in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and shall hold office until after the close of the next annual meeting.

The number of Directors to which each Province is entitled for the year 1924:

The Province of Alberta shall be entitled to one Director; the Province of British Columbia, two Directors; the Province of Manitoba, one Director; the Maritime Provinces, one Director; the Province of Saskatchewan, one Director; the Province of Ontario, seven Directors; and the

Province of Quebec, two Directors. Total, fifteen.

## How to Nominate:

Nominations for Directors allotted to each respective Province shall be made in writing, and shall be signed by at least two members in good standing in the respective Provinces,

and such nominations shall be sent to the Secretary of the Club, so as to be received by him on or before the 15th day of November of this year, on which date all nominations close.

Do not nominate anyone before first referring to the list of members given hereunder, and thereby making yourself sure of their eligibility.

There are Russian Wolfhounds and Russian Wolfhounds in the world, and divergencies of opinions aplenty are heard wherever the devotees of the Borgoi forgather. This is not at all characteristic of the followers of this splendid variety of sporting hound, unfortunately it is general with all breeds, but we are indeed fortunate in being able to reproduce on a large scale a head study of Mrs. Harold W. Clayton's splendid Russian Wolfhound.

### Champion Czarina of Tolstoi,

which is as true to type as anything we have ever seen. This noted female first saw the light of day at Toronto, Canada, on the 5th of May, 1921, and is now in her very prime. By "Ch. Johnston's Krilenko"—who was by "Ch. Nazitka Orloff." Out of "Zahftra," who was by "Ch. Sarvoi of Romanoff," out of "Ch. Clontarfe Krassai," and is a logical product of an exquisite breeding arrangement, and furnishing a further proof to the truism, "blood will tell." It has been a supreme pleasure for us to follow this Canadian-bred female's triumphs in her adopted country. When only nine months of age she came out at Westminster Kennel Club show in February, 1922, under Mr. J. Bailey Wilson, the respected Secretary of the Russian Wolfhound Club of America, who placed her 1st novice, 2nd open and reserve winners. In the race on that day she passed contenders who had already won their championship honors. "Czarina" went to the Glenwild Kennels, kept on the circuit and soon made a place for herself amongst the champion elite of her breed.

At the Kennels "Czarina" never seems to realize her great importance in the Russian Wolfhound realm, and comports with her kennel mates in splendid fashion, whilst visitors are amazed to find her so gentle and agreeably dainty, banishing completely and forever any preconceived prejudices held against the disposition of the breed, and a day spent at the Glenwild Kennels is something of a revelation in that respect.

Every hound—and there are good ones at Glenwild, as our readers well know—answers to his or her own name, and each one is eager for the love and attention that is theirs to expect from their fair owner, who does not fear to confess that her devotion to the breed amounts to actual passion, and fortunate, indeed,

is any breed of dogs whose admirers are so intensely interested in their welfare. It is this element that causes the trained dog to so readily respond to its owner's wishes without trace of fear.

Curious episodes are continually developing that make the commercial side of the kennel very interesting to the owner. Quite recently a couple drove into Glenwild out of sheer curiosity, and had no intention at all of buying a dog. At the first runway, however, an 11 months old puppy jumped with delight at their approach; as they neared the fence, the little rascal flirted with his visitors, and totally won them over by offering them each a paw to shake simultaneously, with the result that little "Brownie" found a new home that very day, and the latest report to hand says that he is a fixture with his adopted family.

A remarkable litter came to Glenwild three months ago, sired by "Ch. Duke Boris," out of the all-quality dam, "Zaplia of Ralova," who lacks but three points of her American championship. One of this litter has been secured by Dr. A. Downs of Portland, Oregon, and is now crossing the continent by motor, and when at home, and when he has reached the fulness of time as required by A.K.C. dog show rules, will take in all the shows at the coast. A litter brother has gone to Baltimore, Md., to be shown in the East, and his enthusiastic owner writes:

"Our puppy is certainly a beautiful specimen. I am surprised at his intelligence, and judging by him, I am at a loss to understand why some people claim that the Wolfhound to be stupid. I intend to show him at the big show here in the spring, and have no doubt at all that he will shortly after become Champion Rurik of Glenwild."

All the good ones are not kept by any means, and we notice that at the show held at Far Hills, "Petrofski of Glenwild," by "Ch. Duke Boris," ex. "Int Ch. Neva Romanoff," won for winners dogs and best of breed, and "Peterhof of Glenwild," also by "Ch. Duke Boris," ex. "Int. Ch. Neva Romanoff," won for reserve winners dogs. A nice day's work for a pair of brothers, but to add further to this, we find that at Del-High, Pa., show, Sept. 15th, the same pair again won, only their placings here were reversed,

which seems to indicate their good qualities are about equal, and judges' opinions may pardonably vary in their case. At this show, we notice that "Kremlin of Glenwild" was also in the prize money, and when Mrs. Cluxton gets the papers and sees what her young "Glenwilds" have been doing in the bench, there will be an extra pat on the head for each of her own kennel inmates.

### MICH. STATE FAIR DOG SHOW Canada's Premier All-Round Judge Gives Satisfaction.

The fifth annual Dog Show held in conjunction with the Michigan State Fair took place in the new Coliseum at Detroit, on Sept. 1st to 3rd. This was a record show in every respect, over 470 dogs being benched, and the crowds of people that passed to and fro amongst the aisles would lead one to think that Detroit was "going to the dogs."

The Coliseum is an ideal place for a show, lots of room and air space and an abundance of natural light. The management left nothing to be desired. Mr. Frank A. Howes made an ideal superintendent and had everything in nice order, while the genial Dr. C. H. Greenfield showed the visitors a good time. The ring stewards were very efficient and got the dogs into the rings with dispatch. Mr. J. J. Lynn judged all Terriers, except Airedales, this variety being passed upon by Mr. A. L. Zeckendorf. The classes in Terriers were well filled with our best specimens. Mr. R. Wilson had a large entry of Shepherd Dogs and his awards were well received. This variety along with the Boston Terriers were the largest entries in the show; the latter breed were of excellent quality and ably judged by the local fancier, Mr. H. Waldron.

All the other breed were judged by Mr. N. K. Swire, of Toronto, Canada. Mr. Swire came to us with a reputation second to none and he certainly lived up to it for we never saw a better display of judging in Detroit. Breed after breed came before him and his methods and placings were highly satisfactory and everyone seemed greatly satisfied that they had had a square deal.

# Canadian National Exhibition Dog Show

WITH REMARKS BY  
JUDGE WALTER REEVES, ESQ.

The thirty-fifth International Dog Show held in connection with the Canadian Exhibition, proved an all-round success. Probably more than twenty thousand visitors visited the Dog Show Building. The management could not possibly have been improved, and, judging by the interest taken in the dogs, it appears to me that a week devoted to dogs would prove a paying attraction to the Exhibition. I am confident it would also do much to bring dogs more to the fore than they are at present in Canada. I would suggest that the first three days should be devoted to the big breeds, and the last to Terriers and Toys. I had the pleasure of renewing my acquaintance with Mr. Robert Millar, the popular President of the wonderful C.N.E., who holds so prominent a position in cattle circles. Mr. J. G. Kent, the General Manager, takes a great interest in dogs, and did well with his recent importation, the Greyhound "Towyside Tarquin," who, I believe, was awarded the championship at Crufts. The Superintendent, Mr. Fred W. Jacobi, certainly knows what to do, and his arrangements were particularly well carried out. He was greatly assisted by Mr. Peter Herd. I received invaluable assistance from my ring steward, Mr. W. C. Ingram.

Owing to the fact that I have not received an award Catalogue, have no notes, and that the majority of the winners and their owners were new faces to me, I cannot go very fully into the merits of the winners, but I will try to do my best to oblige Mr. J. D. Strachan, who has asked me to give my impressions to Kennel and Bench.

Airedale Terriers were big classes, but the quality left a lot to be desired. The winning puppy owns an exceptionally good head, but needs time to strengthen in quarters. The winning dog stood out from the rest of the competitors, being better in head proportions than the second. Mr. E. Ward was exhibiting in many ways, a remarkable dog, which may make a mark as a sire, but he is, to my way of thinking, far too big for an Airedale Terrier. The winning bitch is really a beautiful terrier, belonging to that good fancier, Mr. Harry Clayton, who is also her breeder. Fox Terriers, all through, were very good in quality. Mr. Geo. Sinclair was pre-

sent, and took the greatest interest in the Smooth judging. Easily the one best Smooth dog or bitch, was from the Bytown Kennels, "Walnut Distinct," who I believe I judged on his debut at the American Fox Terrier Club Show a couple of years ago, and also recently at Montreal. He is a real terrier, and should be invaluable as a sire. Second to him in open, was another good all-round Terrier. Mr. Bailey had, I believe, the winning bitch, who is a useful stamp all through. Wires were hot classes, and I am more than sorry at not being able to criticize the principal winners. Mr. J. F. Strachan had the winning dog and bitch, 1st junior. "Ormsby Metagama" is well known—on the day shown, with too much fluff on his legs, but a sterling good all-round Terrier, with very few faults. "Ormsby Lightning" is one of the best of any breed I have ever seen, and I sincerely congratulate her owner and breeder in producing so beautiful a Terrier. Her nearest opponent was from the Bytown Kennels, "Bytown Bit O' White," a really beautiful Terrier, who has not improved in feet or pasterns since I judged her at Montreal. There were many extra good Terriers, but I have neither notes or names to help me, so, much against my will, cannot criticize them. I really believe, judging from the quality and type of the Terriers which came before me, that Canada will produce Terriers that can well hold their own with the best sent over from England. Irish Terriers came up well in numbers and quality. Mr. Ben Lewis' "Lansdowne Basham Brentmoor," is a well built, racy Terrier, with undeniable legs and feet, and a real Irish head. Mr. Edwards was showing "Joe Ripper," who, I believe, he recently imported from Ireland. He is a real nice Terrier, who evidently has not quite gotten over the "crossing." The winning bitch was a charming Terrier, and can hold her own in the best of company.

Scottish Terriers were particularly good, and it was a pleasure to me to see the quality of the puppies. Mr. Geo. Robertson's "Hazelbrae Clegg" could easily win in puppy classes in England, as could the brace of puppies shown by Mr. O. McKellar. "John McGraw" is a low, compact—well set up—little "Diehard," with an extremely typical head. The open dog winner owns and extremely nice head, good short, deep body, with

capital front and quarters. A few nice West Highland Terriers were present—Mr. McKellar's "Argyle O' The Glen" winning, and, I believe, in open, from "Ch. Fruchan," who is a little too much on Scotty lines. In Bedlington, Major Cawthra was showing "Deckham Shepherd, who I have not seen since the National Terrier Show (England). He was looking very fit, and had little of anything to spare from "Guiseley Phyllis," bred by her owner, and I am doubtful if there is a bitch in England to beat her, for she nears perfection in type and outline.

Manchester Terriers carried me back a good many years, when the breed was popular in England. Needless to say, I was more than surprised at the quality of the Terriers exhibited. In Pomeranians, the competition was keen. Some exceedingly nice puppies were forward. Mrs. Bruce's well known black "Chiswick Marquis" is a little gem, to-day rather shy of coat, as was his kennel companion, "Sunflamme Exquisite," who also rather favored one of his hocks. The all-round quality of the Yorkshire Terriers speaks well for the future of this charming variety. Pekingese were a surprise to me. Mrs. Richardson's two beautiful dogs, "Ch. Lo Hai Chi" and "Ch. Prince Cha of Alderbourne," are models to breed up to. A fawn dog who did well in the minor classes, also impressed me very favorably. Bitches were hardly as level in quality as the dogs, but with so many good dogs available, this beautiful variety should continue to improve.

In conclusion, I would like to express the regret that was heard on all sides at the absence of Mr. Jos. Russell, who was prevented from being present by illness. He is so esteemed by all, that I know I am only voicing the wishes of the whole of the Canadian Fancy, when I wish him a speedy recovery.

The immediate resources of the "Field" fund are nearly exhausted, and new money must be immediately forthcoming for further progress and expansion, and if everyone who owns a dog would only contribute a small amount the Research Committee

would at once have as much as is estimated as necessary for their whole three-year programme. Our English brethren, from His Majesty the King and the Prince of Wales to the humble owner of a terrier in the Midlands, are contributing their donations, running the gamut between \$525 and the humble (shilling) 25c.

It is also right to add that, while the whole of the funds are devoted solely to investigations of canine disease, we are assured by the highest medical authorities that there is sufficient connection observable between the symptoms of distemper and those of influenza to warrant the hope that when more is known about the first there will be far better chances in dealing with the second. The issue involves a protracted and extensive task and calls for our closest co-operation, and no doubt we will welcome this opportunity of saving our four-footed friends from the agonies of so distressing an illness that only too often ends in permanent disability or death. The problem will be not only difficult, but long. It will need not only money, but patience. It has never been conducted under such well-organized conditions of co-ordination and united effort. In the end, whether it takes three years or 13 years, or even 30 years, it is believed that the results obtained will rid the world of a scourge that has decimated the canine race, causing not merely grave financial loss, but deep personal distress to many thousands.

# Central Canada Exhibition Dog Show

Ottawa was again favored with a remarkable entry this year, when about 250 were entered, and of this amount 226 were actually benched. Several disturbing elements interfered with the entry, which otherwise would have been much stronger, and it is an open secret that the officials at Ottawa insist on having 300 dogs or better, benched at their fixture annually, and arrange their premium list, so that the offerings made to the fancy will ensure, at least, that showing. American Foxhounds were a splendid entry for quality, the chief awards in both sexes going to Mr. W. C. Baldwin of Hull, whose stock has become a household world on this continent. Airedales and Bostons were well represented, and Wire Hair Fox Terris brought the Bytown and Ormsby Kennels out in full strength. And this is a statement full of meaning, because we have seen contention so keen between these noted establishments that truly decisions, in many instances, were of the hair-splitting variety. At Ottawa, however, the noted Wires who won winners and reserve winners, respectively, at the Canadian National Exhibition, repeated at this show, with the exception of the winning dog at Toronto.

"Ormsby Metagama," who was replaced by "Ormsby Typhoon" at Ottawa, where the latter completed his Canadian championship. At this fixture, "Typhoon" also won in 1922. Pekes, Toy Poodles and Poms were strongest in the Toy section, and for the first time at many shows Toy Poodles outnumbered in dogs entered the Pomeranian entry. The judges were Messrs. Robt. A. Ross, Montreal, a hardy annual at Ottawa in one way or another, and Sam Bamford, Toronto. Both these gentlemen had their awards accepted by the exhibitors in a manner commensurate with their well-known knowledge of the different breeds.

Mr. Cecil Bethune, Chairman of the Dog Show Committee, had the old experienced Mr. W. F. Turner in the Superintendent's office and Mr. Jack Ferguson as Steward, and Ottawa Show-goers know that that combination is rather hard to beat.

## Western Fair---London Dog Show

### A Few Impressions by "Fairplay."

For many years I have visited the Dog Show held in conjunction with the Western Fair at London, and I am quite safe in saying that the one held on Sept. 11 to 13 was the best ever staged in this town. Over 200 dogs of real high quality were benched, making it a two-point show, and the management are to be congratulated on the splendid manner in which they carried this pleasant event to a successful issue. The attendance was exceptionally large, and the gate receipts proved that the dog show was the star attraction of the fair. Mr. R. Oke, the chairman of the committee, was on the job, watching that everything ran smoothly. Miss L. Short, of Fox Terrier fame, acted as secretary in a very able manner. Mr. Charles Webber, the well-known bulldog expert, filled the role of ring steward to the "King's taste," and it was largely due to his untiring efforts that the judging was carried out in clock-like order. The old stand-by, George Bowman, was here, there and everywhere as per usual, helping everybody in his pleasant and untiring ways. All the other officials did their "bit" in helping to make the show one of the best conducted it has been my privilege to attend.

The international judge, Norman K. Swire, passed the rule over all breeds. His cool and gentlemanly manner, combined with his expert knowledge and honest decision, was the feature of the show, and strengthens the universal opinion that he is one of the best judges of all times.

In the absence of a marked catalogue, I can only give a few "impressions" as I saw them. Boston Terriers were the best and largest collection ever seen at London. Mrs. W. Ingram, of Toronto, showed a well-matched pair, and got winners in both dogs and bitches. Mr. H. O'Neil, of Hamilton, also had a nice, useful brace that followed the Ingram entry very closely. The Globe Kennel, of London, had several good exhibits. As years roll by I can see a big improvement in this popular variety. They are getting more and more uniform in type and size.

Airedales and Fox Terriers were plentiful. The former useful variety of terrier was somewhat of a mixture at this show; some over size, some under size; others put down fit, while others were either overdone or underdone in coat. The sooner our fanciers learn the correct size and the correct coat the Airedale Terriers need so

soon shall we see our benches graced with the good terrier the standard calls for. "Chamberlain Dick" duplicated his Toronto victory, and won best of breed. The ladies in this breed were more to size than the dogs, but there was only a few good quality ones shown.

Fox Terriers made a good showing. The outstanding exhibits in the wires were Mr. E. Ward's "Scamp Ontario," Mr. H. Doyle's "Wrose Tickler," and a promising young dog shown by Miss Short, who also showed the winner and reserve winner in females. The winner, Forest City Vanity, impressed me very much, the correct size, with lots of quality and a real coat; she was rightly placed best of breed.

Smooths brought out two nice youngsters that will do a lot of winning when ready. They were "Cavalier Ophame" and "Myrtina Ophame," both owned by Mr. E. Ward. The same owner also showed a real classy dog, "Firthpark Cavalier," that went with ease to winners. That enthusiastic local fancier, Mr. H. M. Whitsitt, brought out a few good ones, and won winners and reserve winners in bitches.

An Irish Terrier dog, "Joe Ripper," owned by Mr. E. S. Edwards, looks like following in the footsteps of his illustrious sire, "Celtic Play Boy," nice size, good type and a good colored coat of the right texture.

There was a real nice stamp of a Sealyham went to winners dog. It's too bad these useful terriers are not more popular in this country; they are workers and real pals. Russian Wolfhounds caused quite a flurry of excitement. Mr. E. M. Burke's Ch. "Ostrand o' Valley Farm" was winners dog, defeating the good youngster, "Bolinia of Glenwild," from the Romanoff Kennels. "Zorka of Tolstoi," owned by the Beck Brothers, was winners in bitches. The excitement ran high when the winners dog and bitch came in for special for best of breed along with the Romanoff Kennels' entry, Ch. "Nazimova," who was looking in tip-top form. The judge, after giving them a real "going over," handed the green ribbon to Ch. "Nazimova." It will be interesting to see these two quality ladies meet when the Beck entry is in full coat.

The only Collie worthy of special mention was Mr. Donaldson's "Laund Link," one of the largest and soundest dogs we have, and possesses all the hall-marks of a champion. He should do the breed a lot of good. A real smart and attractive American Fox-

hound was the winners dog, "Eagar," just a young one, but when ready will do a lot of winning.

Bulldogs were quite a show, the Toronto winner, Ch. "Walfleigh Sensible Fred," being a show in himself, an all-white natural bulldog with few faults. Second to him was the good Toronto dog, "Hefty's Best," a low-to-ground, sound compact little fellow. I was much impressed with the head of "Bunker's Buddy"; it is quite a study. "Beechpark Buddy" and "Exterminator" helped to make the competition worth while. A good-headed, useful bitch, "Pretty Mickey," was winner, with "Jessie Marne" reserve. An all-white bitch of intense type named "Lady Betty" absolutely refused to show her qualities, and behaved indifferently in the ring. If they can get this female to show she will do a lot of winning.

Mr. R. Oke's parti-colored Cocker dog, "Dough Boy," was the pick of a rather mixed bunch. Mr. J. Tomlinson's black bitch, "Woodland Bessie," being the choice of the females, closely pressed by "Miss Major Oak" and "Red Lady."

Shepherd Dogs (Alsatis) were a small but select group. The best dog in the show, "Eric von Bern," refused to display his fine qualities and form, and was dropped to second place. His kennel mate, "Elsa von Bern," was winner bitch. They are a well-balanced brace.

A nice entry of English setters was headed by Mr. G. D. Crowther's "Mona's Major," a high-class dog and well shown. He won with lots to spare, and is the best setter we have seen in London for many a long day.

The Toy varieties were few in number. Mrs. J. H. Bruce got winners in Poms with her black dog, "Chiswick Marquis," Mr. Hinde's "Sunbright Mite" and "Parkgate Swell" being second and third. Pekingese brought out two fair bitches, Miss Kilgour's "Bloom Ophame" and Mrs. Tomkins' "Chau Wei Wei," placed in the order named. The former is a showy and typical fawn, the latter a nice-headed parti-color, well-marked, and can do some winning when ready. A few high-class Yorkshires were shown. Mr. J. Edgar's "Lembachs" wonderful type, color and coat gained for him the winners prize and special for best Toy in show.

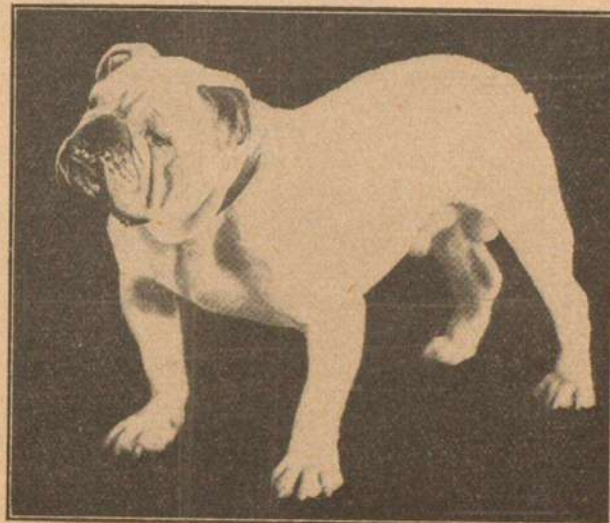

## Sherbrooke Dog Show

This show took place on August 29th and 30th and was well managed and well attended, the excellent classification and the liberal prize money and specials offered deserved a larger entry. The quality and numbers of the exhibits showed an improvement over past efforts, the genial and big hearted C. S. Ives was here, there and everywhere looking after the visitors' needs. Mr. F. Keene, of Boston Terrier fame, was the busiest man in the show and deserves great credit along with the other officials for the smooth running of this event. We noticed several of our leading fanciers from Montreal, Toronto and Ottawa showing their good dogs. The judges were: Mr. A. L. Mulcahy, of the Star Kennels, Mass., for Alsatis, and the popular all-rounder, Mr. N. K. Swire, of Toronto, for all other breeds. In reviewing the exhibits from the ring-side as we saw them, we will just mention a few of those that appealed to us—Mr. F. C. Schipp's Russian Wolfhound "Lodica" was best of breed, she being a shade small and not in good coat; Mr. J. G. Kent's Greyhound "Tonny'side Tarquin" was admired by all and showed to perfection by that peer of handlers, Bert Swann; Mr. P. Doyle had a nice brace of Irish Setters, very ably shown by Mrs. Enright; Mr. J. Neville's Aire-dale dog "Adena Glenbirness Get" won in all his classes, he was hard pressed for winners by Mr. H. Clayton's good dog "Silver Birch Musketeer."

In females Mr. J. Swann's "Leroy Betty" showed well and won, her nearest contender was Mr. Neville's "Adena Queen."

The best exhibits in Bulldogs were shown by Mr. P. Malovity and Mrs. Smith, of Montreal, and that staunch supporter of the breed from Toronto, Mr. J. Cassina. "Yamamoto," a fawn dog owned by Mr. Malovitz, was easily our choice and won by a big margin. Mr. Cassina won both Winners' and Reserve Winners' in bitches with a brindle bitch named "Lady Stewardess" and "Ridge Princess" placed in the order named. Mr. A. Trudeau's old English Sheepdog Ch. "Sonora Billy" was looking as fit as ever and retains all his good qualities. In Cocker Spaniels Mrs. Enright carried off premier honors in dogs and Mr. Trudeau showed a very promising young female named "Sonora Peggy."

The Wainright Kennels from Brantford had a nice type of a French Bulldog on exhibition.

"Walnut Distinct," a smooth Fox Terrier owned by the Bytown Kennels, impressed us very much.

The Wire-hars were a small, but select group. Mr. H. Doyle's "Wrose Tickler" posed beautifully in the ring and is the correct size. Bytown Kennels' "Moonshine" was the most attractive dog and looked fit, but he appeared to be a trifle high for the judge's fancy; Mr. J. Steer's "Oldene Princis" was third in this class, he also is a nice stamp of a Terrier, but lacked a little in quality to the above mentioned pair. In the female classes the tit-bit of the show was brought out in "Bytown O' White," this pleasing little lady of quality was in her best form and displayed all her charms and type to advantage, going to winners with ease.

The Bostons were numerous, the classes were well filled and the competition was very close. Mr. J. R. Constantineau's Ch. "What's Wanted" got the Special for Best of Breed, the same owner's "What's Wanted Milord" was winners dogs. Other good dogs present were: F. Keene's "Little Maxman" and Dr. J. A. #### THE "ORMSBYS" GO OVER THE TOP AGAIN.

Mr. James F. Strachan, Montreal, the proprietor of the internationally known "Ormsby," Wire Haired Fox Terrier Kennels, has experienced some of the thrills that accompany the "great" wins of the Wire-haired game, where the competition is keen and plentiful. It has been pointed out that the Strachan string has actually produced the 1st prize dog, and the first prize bitch for the Canadian National Exhibitions of 1920, 1921, 1922 and 1923. Think of it, four consecutive years at the very top, in both sexes, and at the greatest show, it makes a record that will stand for many a day, and who can tell, possibly the record may yet be improved upon by the Ormsby Kennels themselves.

After leaving the Canadian National the "Ormsbys" went to the American Fox Terrier Club Specialty Show, held at the Rockaway Hunting Club, Cedarhurst, L.I., on September 8th. Here the choice of judge fell on "Winthrop Rutherford," a fancier who is popular amongst the fox terrier devotees of both coats, and one who continues to stay popular, his devotion to type in the breed being established. At this show all the many illustrious "wires" and "smooths" were assembled, and our Exhibition winner, "Ormsby Lightning," created a sensation by winning the Breeders' Cup for the best smooth or wire bred by exhibitor, a signal honor indeed when it is remembered that the Cup was open to all dogs bred by the members of the American Fox Terrier Club, a wonderful tribute to Canadian breeding generally. Other specials with similar conditions included the trophy presented by Q. A. Shaw McKean, and a \$25 cash special. Later, when "Int. Ch. Ridgeway Dark Boy" appeared in the stud dog class, he was accompanied by his likeable daughters, "Ormsby Lightning" and "Ormsby Wild Rose," and won well.

It was in open dogs that the competition became red hot and "Ormsby Snowball" held third place in the hard race for the highest honors, such celebrities as "Ch. Deykin Wire Boy," "Ch. King's Point Falcon," etc.,

failing to get a place in the strenuous race.

This all amounts to the fact that in open American competition the honor of producing the best bred by exhibitor specimen comes to Canada, and to Montreal. Mr. Strachan just smiles at these wins, naturally he is very proud of the distinction which has come to him as a breeder, but that is as far as he will let it go; he will be hard at it in the endeavor to produce something even better yet, and he will do it, too, wait and see for yourself.

As we go to press we learn that "Ormsby Lightning," the sixteen months' old Canadian-bred wonder, daughter of "Int. Ch. Ridgeway Dark Boy," out of "Ormsby Vic," won for best in show all breeds at Central Canada Exhibition, Ottawa.

For the benefit of the novices of the "Wire-haired" fancy we would add that "Ormsby Lightning" is out of a "Wireboy of Paignton"—"Matford Vic" bitch, while her sire is by "Wireboy of Paignton," out of "Cromwell Cheeky," adding proof—if such is necessary—of the wonderful "Paignton" force in "wires" breeding.

Congratulations, Sir!

#### BULLDOGS AT MONTREAL.

I was surprised at the very low quality of the dogs exhibited here, and outside of about five specimens, the rest were far below the standard of what I have seen in Montreal in times past. When I enquired as to the cause of the bad showing, I was given to understand that the middle of the week was a bad time for the owners to exhibit. Be that as it may, the fact remains that there should have been a larger entry. I placed them as follows:

Best puppy dog, awarded to A. C. A. Chisholm—"Lorne Lion"—a big, rangy, white pup, who was so fat that his head looked exceedingly small.

In the Canadian-bred class I had a wonderful fawn dog by the name of "Yamamoto Challenger," owned by Mrs. P. Malovitz. This dog is a real Bulldog all over, and as he is a young one, will still improve with age. I would have liked to see a little more spring of rib on him.

Second, I placed "Hefty's Best," a grand little dog that, with a little better handling, would have stood a good chance of being placed first. This dog is what I term—a big little 'un.

Third was given to Chirk Jack of Spades, who was none too good on all fours.

Another one that was bad on his

legs came before me in the Junior class. He was named "Lorne Lorne," owned by A. C. A. Chisholm. This dog strutted around the ring like a hackney, and was so fat that he looked like a barrel instead of a Bulldog.

Limit and open classes in dogs: 1st to "Yamamoto Challenger"; 2nd, "Rhodee John," who is showing age, but will still keep in line and make them all step some.

In puppy bitches, I was confronted with another hog-fat one, Lady Lenah. Canadian-bred class was awarded to Lady Betty 2nd—a nice white bitch, but one that sulks in the ring, and will not show off her real qualities. 2nd, Lady Lorne, who was very near being placed over the 1st bitch.

Lady Nora was the winner in the limit and open classes.

# The Passing of the Genuine Newfoundland Dog

(Continued from Last Issue.)

"When the animal had pulled what he had hitherto supported as far out of the water as he was able, the peasant discovered that it was the body of a man, whose face and hands the dog was now industriously licking. The peasant hastened to a bridge across the dyke, and, having obtained assistance, the body was conveyed to a neighboring house, where proper means soon restored the drowned man to himself!"

A Dr. Beattie, in turn, relates another interesting anecdote of the dogs: This of a gentleman attempting to cross the River Dee, then frozen across, near Aberdeen, Scotland, and the ice gave away at about the middle of the river; but, having a gun in his hand, the man supported himself by placing it across the opening in the sheet. His dog then ran to a neighboring village, where, with the most significant of gestures, he caught a man by the coat and prevailed on him to follow him. They arrived at the spot just in time to save the drowning party's life.

"One other story," Mr. Goodrich insists, "should not be omitted of this noble breed of dogs:

"A vessel was driven on the beach of Ludd, in Kent. The surf was rolling furiously. Eight poor chaps were crying for help, but not a boat could be got off to their assistance.

"At length a gentleman came to the beach, accompanied by his Newfoundland. He directed the attention of the animal to the vessel and put a short stick into his mouth. The intelligent and courageous fellow at once understood his master's meaning, sprang into the sea, and fought his way through the waves toward the boat. He could not get close enough to the vessel to deliver that which he was charged, but the crew understood instantly just what was meant, and they made fast a rope to another piece of wood and threw it toward him.

"The dog thereupon dropped his own burden, seizing, immediately, the one which had been cast to him. Then, with a degree of strength and determination scarcely credible—for he was lost again and again beneath the waves—he dragged this through the surge and delivered it to his master. A line of communication was thus formed and every man aboard was rescued!"

"It would be easy," the dog-lover

relates, "to fill volumes with similar stories of the Newfoundlands."

The dogs are, at the same time, of a most noble disposition, proof of which is to be found in an instance recorded by a Dr. Abel:

When the Newfoundland came under this narrator's notice left his master's home, as occasion might present, he was very often assailed by a number of small, noisy dogs in the streets about. Usually he passed these with apparent unconcern, as though being quite beneath his notice.

"One small 'cur,' however, grew particularly troublesome as time went on, and at length carried his impudence so far as to bite the Newfoundland dog in the leg.

"That, then, was a degree of wanton insult beyond what the Newfoundland could patiently endure. Instantly he turned around, gave chase to the offender, and, catching up with him, seized him by the skin of the back. Holding him extra tight there, he carried him to the quay, and, holding him some small time over the water, to make the punishment seem the more terrible, he at length dropped him squarely into this!

"He did not, however, seem to intend that the culprit should perish for his offense, and instead, he waited a bit, until the small dog, unused to the element, was not only well ducked, but almost sinking, then plunged in and brought him once more safely to land!"

Dog experts aver that there are two distinct breeds of Newfoundland dogs. The one is large. The other is considerably smaller, but noted even the more for its intelligence. Specimens of the latter were taken to Europe, a century or so ago, and used especially as retrievers. They were valued particularly for the fearless fashion in which they would penetrate the thickest cover. Like their larger kinsmen, these dogs, too, were exceedingly muscular, strong and almost invariably black.

Space forbids the repeating here the countless many other interesting anecdotes that abound, all Anglo-Saxon dogdom over, of the vanishing Newfoundland dog.

Lord Byron, it will be remembered, penned his celebrated "Epitaph to a Dog" to an animal of this particular kind, and there are those, Newfoundland over, who are urging that, now that the dog which made the Island famous in innumerable quarters where it might never otherwise have been so much as known, is all but extinct

there, the Epitaph be done in enduring bronze, or else cut into marble, and such tablet be raised then at St. John's, the capital of the Island—fit memorial to the love and gratitude all Newfoundlanders had for the creatures through the centuries to come:

## The Byron Epitaph.

When some proud man returns to earth  
Unknown to glory, but upheld by birth,  
The sculptor's art exhausts the pomp of woe,  
And storied urns record who rests below.  
When all is done, upon the tomb is seen—  
Not what he was, but what he should have been!

But the poor dog, in life the firmest friend,  
The first to welcome, foremost to defend—  
Whose honest heart is still his master's own,  
Who labors, fights, lives, breathes for him alone,  
Unhonored falls, unnoticed all his worth,  
Denied in heaven the soul he had on earth.

While man, vain insect, hopes to be forgiven  
And claims himself a sole, exclusive heaven!

O man, thou feeble tenant of an hour,  
Debased by slavery, or corrupt by power,  
Who knows thee well, must quit thee with disgust—  
Degraded mass of animated dust!  
Thy love is lust, thy friendship all a cheat;  
Thy smiles hypocrisy, thy words deceit!

By nature vile, ennobling but by name,  
Each kindred brute might bid thee blush or shame.

Ye, who perchance behold this simple urn,  
Pass on, it honors none you wish to mourn!

To mark a friend's remains these stones arise;  
I never knew but one—and here he lies!

## As We Were Just Saying . . .



Never before in the history of the Canadian Kennel Club has there been so many dog shows held in any one month under our Dog Show rules and regulations than there has been in the month of September which has just closed as we go to press, and if we were to take into consideration the shows that came immediately before the advent of September and those which came directly after its close, we would find substantial food for thought along the channels of our association's development, and an inspirational impetus to "walk right in" and take cognizance of what are the potential possibilities of our Club. We have those amongst us who, lifting their eyes to high heaven, implore protection for the blue ruin that their leaders are bringing upon them. Those are the critics who do their criticizing first and get their facts last, but the critic who will do us the most good is the one who already is interested in the club's welfare, one who studies carefully for its improvement, gets figures and facts in alignment, satisfies himself or herself of their power to improve, and then with courage and courtesy show the way.

Not so long ago we had triflers come along with interference in our Dog Show rules that gave us a lot of concern. One of these helpers (?) deliberately lied to our members in general session assembled. When he told them that Europe, Great Britain and America now only recognized shows of three days' duration or less. The same adviser (?) also gave us a "model" motion that we have since discovered to have been copied from the "Mother" of all Canine Governments—England. This is not playing the game according to Hoyle, or even to the requirements of clean sportsmanship, and the results could only be expected to end in confusion, as they surely did. In discussing Canada's dogdom, England must never be allowed as a comparison to be used as an argument on duration of shows. We all know England, and love it. We also know that in a single day we can traverse its length and breadth. We can be in England and Scotland between meals, and in England, Ireland and Scotland within the span of the natural day, but in Canada it is infinitely different, and we find dogs at our shows who have travelled sev-

eral days in order to get there, and the same distance has to be recovered in returning. For instance, take the Winnipeg dogs who come to Toronto each year, and reverse that order again, for there are always Toronto dogs at Winnipeg, in fact some of these have gone on to Regina, Calgary, Vancouver, and to the extreme points of Vancouver Island. Gentlemen, there can be no comparison allowed in future because of its impossibility. Even the United States the cities are more closely linked up than in our good little country, but at the Missouri State Fair the Dog Show runs from August 20th to August 23rd, 1923. Brockton Fair Dog Show, from October 3rd to October 6th, 1923, both are licensed shows, and controlled as to duration by American Kennel Club Dog Show rule xix., sec. 1, which reads:

"The duration of a show shall not exceed four days."

No mention of even a "six o'clock on the fourth day" clause. This shows how ridiculous any member of our club may become when he feels like it, but why should he be allowed to upset our equanimity by misrepresentation at a time when all our time and talents are so much required in building up our association, for most assuredly this is our building season in dogdom in Canada, and it behooves each one of us who have the interests of our club close at heart to keep 'o our knitting in season and out of season in the most loyal way.

Sept. 25 to 26, the Nova Scotia Kennel Club.

Surely this shows a remarkable interest in Canadian canines, and the best is yet ahead of us still, and no amount of destructive criticism will be able to stop the march of progress.

Men large of heart and broad in outlook are daily crossing our threshold, as our lists of new members readily show. Our old friends are returning to us from every province, and what is wanted now is a concentration of effort for the good and welfare of the Club.

Some of the shows enumerated above have been covered fully, but this month of October brings an unusually large amount of special business that takes liberally of our available space, and unfortunately we cannot begin to use the tremendous pile of copy that is on hand, and any clubs who have sent lengthy reports of their shows and they do not appear, will take the thought for the deed, and believe that we really did our best for them all.

The Canadian National Exhibition show was bang up to its usual full strength in the matter of quantity and quality. What was lost in Collies and Bulldogs was made up in Shepherds and Beagles. While the American Foxhound and Russian Wolfhound benches were crammed with quality, and had many admirers, Boston Terriers had an easy place at the top in number of entries with 90 to their credit. The crowds that thronged the building at all times during the show made an eloquent argument in favor of the Dog Show being one of the most pronounced attractions on the Exhibition grounds. Visitors gave the show an international appearance, in fact it could be almost said that all the nations of the earth were represented, white, yellow and black intermingling with each other without notice or comment. It was "International Year" at the Exhibition, and this is what brought so many nationalities together. Mr. George Kynoch, Winnipeg, Manitoba, had the bulk of the breeds under his care, and left very little to be desired, so uniformly excellent and painstaking was his work, leaving the anticipating critics with many idle hours on their hands. Mr. Walter Reeves, Belleville, Ont., who had the terriers, left the same favorable impressions with the Toronto crowd that he has left at Montreal, Halifax and the other



places where he has acted in the judicial capacity. He is a fine type of the "Old Country" judge—cool, calculating, and generally correct.

Mr. R. M. Cleveland had the Alsatian entry, and made a splendid bid for the future popularity of this breed. Mr. Cleveland's report may be referred to in one of our other pages of this issue. Dr. C. F. Sullivan had the hardest task of all, if it was only one breed, and to make matters worse—for him—he was very badly indisposed during the show, and particularly so during the judging hours. We all have our "off" days, and this was "Connie's" off day, and he had a hard task before him. This he tackled in an expert way, and stuck to it until the last dog was placed. A lot of criticism was abroad, but if Connie Sullivan does not know the Boston Terrier, then who does? Five points were earned at this show. Central Canada Exhibition and Western Fair both earned two points. Fredericton came through with three, St. John with three. The Ladies' Kennel Club and the Shepherd Dog Club with two each, and if "dame rumor" has it correctly, the baby club of Canada, i.e., Halifax Kennel Club, down by the Atlantic, has actually made the limit of five points, and we hope that the "Jade" is right this time.

The following pages will be "dry" reading to a lot of our readers this month, particularly to those of them who have not been represented at the shows, because of the many show and other reports, but we will make it as interesting as possible under the circumstances.

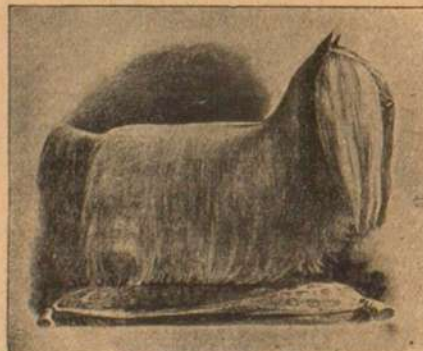
