Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club was held at the Club Offices, 774½ Yonge Stret, Toronto, on Thursday evening, October 18th 1923 the Vice-President, Mr. Harry Clayton, was in the Chair. The President, although happily regaining steadily in strength, was still unable to be present. The Directors in attendance were: Messrs. H. M. Jackson, J. T. Waggitt, N. K. Swire and General C. M. Nelles.

The minutes of the September meeting were read by the Secretary, and on motion were declared approved.

The Secretary reported that he had been advised by Dr. Chas. Madden that he would report on the information required by the Directors, but to date the report had not come to hand, and it was agreed to lay the matter in abeyance meantime.

And it was moved, seconded and carried:—"That the applicants be received to membership in the Club."

The Secretary read the following complaint and protest submitted by James Cassina:—

"Dear Sir,—I beg to enter herewith a formal complaint and protest to the Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club, under the provisions of Section 3, sub-section 10 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Club, against William Stockdale, for refusing to deliver to me a dog named "Dauntless Dan," entered by him at the Dog Show held in connection with the Canadian National Exhibition on September 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th, 1923, at the price of \$200.00 which

dog was claimed by me at that price in accordance with the rules.

I submit herewith in support of my complaint a statutory declaration made by myself and exhibits referred to."

Declarations were read and exhibits carefully scrutinized and as the principals were in attendance the Board agreed to hear them. Mr. James Cassina was supported by his agent, Mr. Bert Swan, and a witness in Mr. Thomas McEwan, while Mr. Wm. Stockdale appeared in his own defence. After hearing both sides, there was a doubt remaining, that it was considered the Superintendent of the Canadian National Exhibition could only break, and the matter was left over for decision until Mr. F. W. Jacobi could be present or make a statement.

The Secretary read correspondence from the Canadian National Live Stock Records Office, and was instructed to prepare an article for Kennel and Bench on the matter, and it was agreed:—

"That Mr. C. S. Scott be prohibited from becoming a member of the Canadian Kennel Club, and that the registration of any dogs bred, owned or imported by him be excluded from registry dating from Dec. 8th, 1921, the date on which he fyled the spurious pedigree."

The Secretary reported that he was waiting to hear further from Dr. Charles Madden in respect to the Madden vs. Malovitz complaint.

A petition signed by twenty-four members of the Canadian Kennel Club was submitted, which read as follows:—

"We, the following members of the Canadian Kennel Club, request you to call a Special Meeting of the members; you to state date and place."

The Secretary reported that the petition only showed nineteen members signing who were in good standing in the Club, and pointed out one signature who had not paid dues since 1920. The Secretary was advised to communicate this intelligence to the party concerned, that was impracticable, there being no address showing whereby any principal could be communicated with. Agreed to lay the matter on the table.

Mr. Charles Bowerbank was present by invitation of the Board of Directors. Upon entering the room, the Secretary told of the several complaints that had come from Mr. Bowerbank's customers, from the Records Office, of his (the Secretary's) own complaint. The corre-

spondence was on exhibit. The Secretary told also of abuse received from Mr. Bowerbank over the telephone. Mr. Bowerbank indignantly denied the several impeachments, and after he had retired it was moved, seconded and carried:—

"That Mr. Charles Bowerbank be given 30 days to tender an apology to the Secretary of the Canadian Kennel Club."

This being the business coming before the meeting, the meeting was declared adjourned.

DOGGIE DOINGS AT VICTORIÁ, B.C.

The Victoria City Kennel Club opened their winter programme with a Parlor Show on Saturday evening, Oct. 13th. Mr. C. A. Goodwin judged the shooting dogs and Mr. J. W. Creighton judged the remainder.

Twenty-seven different breeds were represented, and the total entry was ninety-seven dogs.

Mr. Creighton started off with Pomeranians. The sizes of these varied somewhat. The bigger ones were truer to type, but they certainly were larger than the prize winners at home. There was one marvellous little miniature model called "Baby Huffy." It took the special for best Toy puppy in show, best novice Toy dog and best non-sporting puppy. This puppy stood out (in spite of its absurd size) among the other exhibits.

There was not much competition in Pekingese, and these again would not go far in strong competition. The winner, an imported dog, "Sutherland Avenue Mitzu," was quite good. Personally, I prefer Pekes to be chun red in color and do not so much like fawns or sables or parti-colors or blacks. However, "Mitzu" eventually took the special for best Toy dog, and he deserved it.

Maltese, Japanese, Welsh Terriers, Sealyhams and Bull Terriers produced one specimen only, and therefore had "walk overs."

Two excellent specimens of Griffon Bruxellois were shown. They both belonged to the same lady, and were called "Pinochie" and "Fudge" respectively.

There was more competition in Spitz—in fact they were the largest class in the show. Four white ones and one black one competed. The "colored gentleman" had faulty ear carriage. The others were a level lot, but one was not up to standard in coat.

The Airedales were distinctly good,

but came in singly with no compe-

Wire Fox Terriers were disappointing, but I fancy the best one met with an accident and did not compete.

The Smooth Fox Terriers had nice, long lean heads and straight fronts, but were far too big.

Irish Terriers again gave no competition except in open dogs, when two specimens came in the ring. These were all larger than they ought to have been, and one was not true to color.

There were only three Scottish Terriers; one of these, "Craiglands Heather Bloom," was best Terrier in show and best members' Terrier.

The White West Highland entry was poor—one puppy and one adult.

Three Bulldogs were exhibited, all of them white with pied markings. The winning dog was a great fellow, and he took the special for best non-sporting dog, and richly deserved it.

There were several Boston Terriers. This is a breed that is never seen in England, so I must hide my ignorance under the cloak of silence.

In the Collies there was a puppy 1 liked immensely. He had great length of head and dense coat.

The English Setters were a really nice lot. The winning puppy, "Broomfield Challenger," also took three specials. He was best sporting pup, best dog pup, and best puppy in show.

Gordon Setters could be improved upon, and there was only one Irish Setter, and he was a huge dog.

The Spaniels, Springers and Cockers were, as might be expected, good.

One team of Retrievers was shown. They were a lovely lot, especially the dog "Puck." I understood he was imported, and he certainly favored the type of Flat-coated Retriever that I know so well. This dog took the special for the best sporting dog in show.

From my experience of show specimens it appeared that some of the dogs were bigger than their show standard. This was most noticeable in the Smooth Fox Terriers and the Irish Terriers. Some of the Toy dogs were shown out of coat, which was a great pity.

All the same, it was a very nice little exhibition, and it is most cheering to know there are so many good dogs in Victoria.

Nova Scotia Kennel Club Show

Nova Scotia is the baby club in Canada in name only. As it has been written down in history that their first show earned the possible number of championship points, an achievement when the geographical location is considered, is nothing short of phenomenal. With fear and trembling, their venture was born, and from a few local supporters their club grew in strength, until barristers, ministers, King's councillors were all enrolled as members, and to their great and lasting credit they all felt it their duty to "take hold of things," and they did. Mr. Robt. A. Ross, the Montreal "ace," was selected to place the entries, and Robert ("Bobby") Laskey was imported from New Brunswick to superintend. So with these two hustling "Bobbies" steering the show ship it ran in smooth waters from first to last, and at the banquet which followed Mr. R. H. Murray, K.C., the club's president, who presided, was enthusiastic as to the success of the venture, and to all who had in any way made the show the huge success that it certainly was. Many little helps were called in while the club was organizing, and the show problem was being considered. Our New Brunswick director, Mr. W. W. Laskey, going down to Halifax when transportation was practically at a standstill, by the will of God. Bill, having wide experlence in show work, no doubt proved a tower of strength to his Nova Scotia friends, and he is deserving of much credit for his voluntary assistance, Mr. J. H. Crocket, Field Secretary for the Canadian Young Men's Christian Association, a valued member of the Canadian Kennel Club, and the sportsman unanimously selected to be general supervisor of Canadian athletes at the Olympia, also did his little bit to encourage the lads of Nova Scotia, who were just "tuning in" on doggie affairs. On top of this a secretary was found who proved himself a diamond, Mr. C. St. C. Stayner, his assistant, Mr. T. L. Mac-Donald, was an "aide-de-camp" worthy of the name. Mrs. M. G. MacKinnon, show secretary, also calls for special mention, but we are advised that the effort was a common one, and no slackers were found in the outfit responsible for the fixture. We are able through the courtesy of a Nova Scotia admirer to reproduce a picture which serves to show in a practical way the public support given. See the crowd around the ringside? It is as dense as any to be found at any of our larger

shows. The light thrown on the judging block unavoidably blurs what otherwise would be a most interesting group of fanciers and dogs. The benches, loaded down with their canine occupants, can be seen tier after tier as far as the eye can travel. Mr. Ross is down in a characteristic position "taking the quality" of the exhibits before him. The blackboard may be seen, and it is intelligently posted. The ring is commodious, and the "block" is roomy, the whole a perfect setting for the purpose of dog showing. Every dog from far and near was on the bench, and still we notice that Mr. Ross, who is the greatest exponent of withholding prizes for lack of merit, a valuable trait in the man, seldom withholds for this cause at Halifax show.

Officially, we have never done business with show officials in Canada who gave us more satisfaction than these men at the Eastern Coast. Everyything called for by our rules was lived up to, no minor detail was overlooked, and it is with much pride that we introduce to the show-attending public of the Dominion the officers and members of the Nova Scotia Kennel Club.



Fredericton Kennel Club Show

Sept. 18th, 19th and 20th, 1923.

Hearty congratulations to this goahead Society for the really excellent
show they held in conjunction with
the Fair. The entry would, no doubt,
have been much stronger if the
premium lists had been sent out
earlier, but I never remember judging
a show in any part of the world
where the all round quality of the
exhibits were so good—competition
in all classes being keenly contested.

The Fredericton Kennel Club are undoubtedly fortunate in having a sporting brace of fanciers as the brothers Laskey, who worked early and late to make the show a success, and it is certainly due to them, and my ring steward, Mr. C. Sullivan, of St. John's Kennel Club, that everything went so well. The New Brunswick Fanciers, I found a real good body of fanciers, who, one and all, are out to help along the interest in dogs, and with the many excellent dogs they own, I am of the opinion that many champions will be bred from their present stock. Very much interest was taken in the judgingthe best classes that came before me being Wire-haired Fox Terriers, Setters, Irish Terriers, Pekingese, Pomeranians and Pointers. Cocker Spaniels were somewhat disapointing, being very varied in type. The awards were as follows:

Newfoundlands: First, "Rising's Rover," a well-grown black puppy, who just needs to strengthen up a little in stifles—very nice skull, body and class of coat.

Russian Wolfhounds: First. Patterson's good hound, who held a big advantage over second, "Lehen's Rex," in head properties. Patterson also won in bitches, with a very shapely all-round hound, lacking a little in size and coat. The best of the Pointers was the winning bitch, Wilson's "Ridgeway Gamefeather," who could hold her own amongst the best in England. In English Setters, Swann's "Straitaway" could not be denied, one of the best I have seen for many years, a real Malwyd Setter in head but with exceptional shoulders and a beautiful free mover. When shown a little heavier in condition he will always be there or thereabouts when competing for best in show. Second, Ch. "Count May Fly," a sound typical Setter, who lost in quality of head, carriage of stern and shoulders, but scored to-day in body. "Bluestone Meriam Jay scored in bitches. All-round she is nice,

but could be cleaner in shoulders, and have more finish in foreface. Mr. G. B. Taylor played a very strong hand in Irish Setters, benching two grand puppies in "Barney Bing" and "Connemara," and gaining winners in dogs with Ch. "Barney 2nd." who nears perfection in outline, coat, feather and shoulders. To be very critical, he is, to my mind, somewhat eeminate in head properties. Another more than useful dog, was the winner, in J. S. Seaton's "Tyrone Tim O'Shay." The best of the Collies was Cameron's "Ormskirk Squire," a good all-round dog, who is somewhat listless in the ring. Mr. McGuire had a really beautiful bitch forward in "Campbell Stylish," who can hold her own easily in the best of company, to-day a little shy of coat.

Bulldogs: Winners in dogs, awarded to Malovitz' brindle pied, who is an exceptionally good headed dog, owning an immense flat skull. and wide well-turned up underjaw. He could be better sprung in ribs, and here all that is needed is time. Cassina's "Lady Stewardess," a great bodied little brindle, light weight, with a nicely finished head, which could be improved if only she had larger nostrils, stood right away in bitches, her nearest opponent being Laskey's fawn "St. Roch Daisy," a more than useful stamp, perfect in shoulders, placement and having the correct Bulldog gait.

Airedale Terriers: A very easy journey for Laven's "Chamberlain Dick," who has improved since Toronto. Second, a real nice bodied Terrier, who, with a better eye and a little more finish in head could trouble the best. Third, Kierven's "Bellevue Ranger" could be more level on top, otherwise a compact well-built Terrier. Clayton's beautiful Terrier, Ch. "Silver Birch Ladylike," was easily the best of her sex.

Irish Terriers: A very useful puppy led in puppies, "Muldoon Spitfire," who is owned by Vanwart and Laskey, capital coat and color, racy in outline and with a quality head. Second, Magee's "Maritime Dictator" is more made up than the winner, but loses in quality. In open. Gray's "Warrior Rhid Imp.," racy in outline, grand coat and color, typical head, with very fair front. Second, Magee's "Maritime Michael," in many ways a beautiful Terrier, but to-day shown in poor coat, nice type of head, ears carried a little too forward to be real Irish, might be better in front.

Third, Gray's "Wrose Red Hot," might have been at some time of his career, but not to-day, for his head lacks quality and his eye is light, racy outline with good legs and feet. Vanwart's "Munster Vixen" is a more than useful Terrier, capital coat and color, typical head and expression, with good outline, at times, a somewhat indifferent shower.

Fox Terriers, Smooth: A fight in "Bellum Clark's open between Flicker" and Laskey's "Crown Ajax," placed as written, purely a matter of taste, which way they are placed. The latter is far away the better size, the winner being bang up to size and a shade long in loin. His head and front are exceptionally good. Clark easily held the advantage in bitches with "Bellum Carrie Mia," and Opoline," two fair allround Terriers, the former being cleaner in skull. Third, McLaughlin's "Bellum Foxie," who reaches her back badly at times, very fair head and front. Wires were very strong Doyle's "Morningside in quality. Dictator," a useful puppy, who takes after his sire in body. Strachan's "Ormsby Metagama," awarded winners in dogs, held an advantage over "Preston Rightaway" in head and coat. The latter is a really nice tittle Terrier, and I should imagine. could have held his own amongst the best in his young days. Third, Dovle's "Wrose Tickler," a longheaded Terrier, who if he only had a shorter back, could hold his own amongst the best. Open Bitches: Strachan's "Ormsby Lightning," one of the very best bitches I have ever judged. She has what all breeders are striving to obtain, a long clean head and a short back. She is a beautiful size, with big ribs and quarters, perfect neck and shoulders. Great credit is due to Harry Armistead for her condition and handling. She stood right away, when competing for best, any breed in the show. Her two nearest opponents being the smart Greyhound belonging to Mr. J. G. Kent and the English Setter "Straightaway." Cocker Spaniels were disappointing. Easily the most typical dog forward of any color be-Whitebone's Ch. "Enright Centre." Madame Beland's beautiful team of Pomeranians caused a deal of favorable attention as did the splendid team of Pekingese benched by Mrs. Margeson. The many beautiful trophies were awarded as follows: Best Toy. Mrs. Margeson's Pekingese, "Ting Ling of Cedarcrest." Opposite sex to Madame Beland's Pomeranian, "Perivale Dainty Dawn." Local, to the Irsh Setter, Mr. Taylor's Ch. "Barney 2nd." Non-sporting, Mc-Guire's "Campbell Stylish." Terrier, "Preston's Rightaway." Children variety, to Master M. Shute's black Cocker, "Teddy," who was admirably handled by a very keen young fancier. The Earl of Ashburnham Trophy for the best Setter in N. S. to Ch. "Barney 2nd." Strachan Trophy for best Canadian dog or bitch, donor not competing to Swann's English Setter, "Rightaway." Best exhibit from Quebec, Doyle's "Wrose Tickler."

Reminding one of the lively prewar days of this long-established canine club were two reorganization meetings held at Toronto on Thursdays, October 25th and November 1st. Some of the old dyed-in-the-wool pillars of the club dropped out, some of them answering the "Last Post," as did the revered officers, Arthur Atkinson, John H. Kenyon, and the more recent loss, Tom De Geer, No doubt these deaths meant a calamity to the club, for the reason that the persons named were of the indomitable type that, no matter how hard was their gruelling experiences, they always came back with a smile, inviting more; and no doubt it is the spirit of the old association that is being felt in Toronto to-day.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. George Ward, who explained to the assembly the reasons which prompted the calling of the meeting and the purpose for which it was called. He explained and declared the meeting was open to one and all present, discussion would be open. and opinions heard. It was early apparent that the rank and file had been forced to notice in a most unmistakeable way that the all-breed club was more of a necessity than they had imagined, and that they were there to admit it in a practicable manner. Nothing but a brand new canine association was the predominating desire of the promoters, but the saner elements centered their effort on what was already a known quantity and right at their hands, and so in the end the general feeling was to collect information that would reveal the desirability or possibility of raising the new banner atop of the dormant Toronto Kennel Club.

At the second meeting the Secretary called he meeting to order, and advised the crowded room that the Acting President had been obliged to leave the city on urgent business. Messrs. J. D. Strachan, Jack Mc-Naughton and Reg. P. Sparkes were all named as chairmen, and all were old Toronto Kennel Club supporters. Mr. R. P. Sparkes accepted the honor and brought satisfaction to the position. After explanations by Mr. Mc-Naughton, the club honored itself by condescending to be known as The Toronto Kennel Club, and by so doing found themselves already supplied with good benching for over 300 dogs, medal dies and other necessary paraphernaia requisite to an active club, making it possible to start business. at once and unhampered. Against these valuable assets are several minor liabilities. The constitutionwas checked by a two-thirds vote of the members present, making it possible to nominate and elect new officers at the one stroke. The interest was intense, and the several positions were strongly contested, giving the meeting every opportunity to make careful selections. The ballot voting was adopted, and the following members were selected as officers for the first year:-

The new (old) President thanked the large gathering of fanciers for their support and confidence, and assured them that the club would function quickly and healthily under his guidance, supported by his officers. Calling for his executive to remain after the close of the meeting, he declared the session adjourned, and thus closed the best attended meeting of dog fanciers that has been held in Toronto for some years.

Canadian Bostons Go Over the Top

Specially reported by V. G. Perry, London.

The Buffalo Boston Terrier Specialty Show was probably the most successful ever held in this famous Boston Terrier city. Buffalo show is always a fast one; but this year it was a speed demon. Well over one hundred Bostons passed before the expert, Thomas Hunter, Jr., of 'round Boston way; and Mr. Hunter saw every one of them, went over them, and satisfied the exhibitors with a fair decision. Some judge, this man Hunter, without any erratic fancies; with an eye on the right end of the lead only, and a sticker for soundness, but not such a sticker that he couldn't see quality where it overweighed defects in action.

To begin with, Mr. Hunter gave a junior puppy dog winners, in a class of dogs that was superior to any we have seen Buffalo way. This puppy, "Buffalo Again," made his debut here, and annexed the first five points to a title that he will probably gain, barring accidents, before another two months have passed. He's a fast one, and was put down in grand form by Mrs. Dr. Albert Brennan-her first good one for five years, and one certainly worthy of the name of "Buffalo Again." What's more, Mrs. Brennan bred the pup herself, from her own stud dog," "Brennan's Best Pal," a son of "Why Not try."

Mrs. M. C. McGlone, of Mosholu fame, came from New York with another green dog, "Little Tommy Tucker II." "Tommy Tucker" pressed very closely the winning dog, and ringside opinion was pretty well divided. These two dogs will meet again later no doubt, and the decision of Judge Hunter can be reversed without any great hardship to the Buffalo victor. "Little Tommy" is another fast one by the great "Ch. Mosholu Blink."

In males our Canadian dogs didn't figure high. The best of the wins went to H. M. Jackson's "Jackie's Friend." In the juvenile puppy class of thirteen he got third ribbon. Fourth in this class went to another Canadian, "Lad of League," owned by Mrs. C. E. Singleton, of London. The winners dog was first in this class, so the going was strong.

"Little Mickey Ringmaster," owned by H. J. O'Neil, of Hamilton, captured fourth place in lightweight open; but fourth was a good win in company so fast. It was nothing to see dogs that had been sold for over a thousand dollars getting left out altogether at this show.

"Ch. Globe League o' Nations" was entered, but a cold of some days duration kept him at home.

Canada came in to her own in females. Never was there such a victory for Canadians as in the female section of this big show. Not only winners and reserve winners bitches where owned in Canada, but every blue ribbon in the female classes, with the exception of the American bred, novice middleweight, and senior puppy classes.

The winning female, "Nation's Little Queen," owned by A. J. Ship, of St. Thomas, Ontario, was handled by the writer, who will not attempt to laud her praises, except to say that it was very gratifying after some recent defeats to see her go to the top in such company, and under a judge whose placings carry so much prestige as do Judge Hunter's.

The reserve winners female, "O' Glos Beauty," owned by A. A. Ogilvie, of Toronto, and put down in the best form we have ever seen her by the queen of all handlers, Mrs. M. C. McGlone, of New York, has been doing a lot of winning in the east, and indeed a week or so before went best in the show, champions barred under the same judge at Taunton, Mass.

In limit lightweight classes, first, second, third and fourth females were all from Canada. The big surprise of all was the puppy, "Chamber's Small Portion," who has come forward with remarkable strides since the Canadian National Exhibition, and is a female to be reckoned with, as she demonstrated by winning best female puppy in the show and second in the limit class to the winners female. She is owned by H. A. Chambers, Toronto, who has had her cropped since her last appearance. If she continues to strengthen in bone and body it will take a real one to pass her. "Little Cupid," owned by Lorne Anderson, of Toronto, was third in the limit and second in the open. Here is one whose quality carries her over very faulty hindquarters; but it is quality that cannot be denied, even by a judge like Mr. Hunter, who is a strong advocate of soundness and proper action. "Dee Welsh Countess," owned by I. Whittleton, Toronto, was fourth.

The middleweight limit and open went to "O' Glos Beauty." Closely running with her in second place was a fast puppy from Cleveland, "Roman Georgette," who has been annexing a number of championship points in her locality. "Kurtz Whispering Hope," another championship contender was third here. So our Canadian representative had no easy wins, but she proved equal to her competition and with something to spare.

The heavyweight classes went to another Toronto entry, "Raffles Soubrette," owned by H. A. Chambers.

The winners class was left to the three Canadian females. Think of it, three Canadians to fight it out for highest honors at this big American specialty show. The competition narrowed down to the lightweight and the middleweight, and when after a thorough gruelling, Judge Hunter handed the purple to "Nation's Little Queen" the rafters of the monstrous Elmwood Music Hall echoed with the cheers and applause, which were repeated with every bit as much force when reserve winners went to "O' Glos Beauty."

For the cup for best female in the show, "Nation's Little Queen" met and defeated two American champions.

SPARKS FROM SPOKANE.

"Multomah Prospect," the winning Wire at Spokane, held September 3, 4, and 5, has the distinction of being Canadian-bred, he having been raised at the Bytown Kennels of Mrs. I. Webster, Ottawa, and is well on his way to an American Kennel Club championship, having already travelled two-thirds of the road that leads to canine triumph.

"Stokie Buccaneer," the winning Airedale, went through his opposition easily; he, too, is Canadian-bred, and before joining P. Lancaster's stable was the property of his breeder, Mrs. Todd, of New Westminster, B.C., and a good son of Nat. McConnell's noted stud force, "Home Ruler."

Mr. Harold Kneen, who, by the way, is one of our British Columbia directors, and whose home is at Nanaimo, B.C., was judging at this show. With Mr. Kneen was his wife and Mr. N. McConnell; the trio were the guests of Mrs. C. Stiltz, who had the great misfortune of having her home, barns, kennels, and some of her beautiful Collies destroyed by fire on the opening day of the show. The Canadian guests lost all their reserve clothing, Mr. McConnell losing his gold watch, and what was a much greater loss to him was the loss of "Home Ruler," his pal dog, who has sired so many good Airedales.


JOE HILL STILL AFTER THE GOODS IN COCKERS.

DR. J. A. CAMPBELL AT MONTREAL.

Dr. J. A. Campbell, the official veterinarian for the Canadian Kennel Club, took a very prominent part in the programme of the American Veterinary Medical Convention which was held in Montreal last month, and which was easily the largest gathering of that honorable association on record. Veterinarians from all over the world were in attendance, and our Dr. Campbell was the head-liner in demonstrating his operations on small animals, for which he is famous. His methods in handling whelping cases, for which he is so well known in Canada, was of great interest to the visiting veterinarians.

The genial doctor, with his wellknown personality, in speaking to his audience, gave the credit of any skill he displayed to the fact that he had labored professionally amongst the best dog fanciers that could be found anywhere, and in the greatest dogbreeding centre in the world. It was the support and encouragement that he received from these fanciers that gave him the experience he possessed. Those of us who know Dr. J. A. Campbell best know that he is an artist in his profession, and that his staunchest clients are the oldest living fanciers. men who have grown with the Campbell surgery and who have marvelled at its development.

If our canine associations generally only realized the power that lay so close to their hand they would see to it that "Big Jim" had a place on their winter programmes for an educative talk on canine subjects. The results of such lectures could only end in the fancier having a deeper knowledge of the anatomical angle of his canine charges. Everyone cannot be an anatomist, and not every veterinary can successfully anatomize; but, as we said before, here in Toronto we have an artist at his profession, and for our mutual advantages we should make the most of our opportunities. Dr. Campbell is the curator for all the Toronto parks, a prominent Rotarian, and a good Mason; his obligations must necessarily keep him extremely busy. Nevertheless, he is easy of approach, and any spare time he may have is always at the disposal of the dog fancier for the good of the dog. Canada is proud of Dr. J. A. Campbell, B.V.Sc., and Toronto claims him as her own.

While preparing our large list of champions who finished following our recent shows, we noticed that only one Smooth-haired Fox Terrier appeared on the honor roll, and that one was "Champion Walnut Distinct." who has been so much before the public since he came out at the Canadian National Exhibition in 1921. under the "Clapton" banner as a puppy, the breeder, Mr. Sam Bamford, being particularly impressed with his quality. At Central Canada the following week he went to reserve winners, a position he held at Hamilton later in the same year. About Christmas, 1922, Dr. R. E. Webster. Ottawa, became the owner of the embryo champion, and turned the dog over to his kennel manager, Mr. Ed. Flemming, notable for the finish of all his charges wherever they appear, and it was not surprising to see "Walnut Distinct" come out in perfect condition at Montreal last May, where he scored his first two points under the expert judge of terriers, Mr. Walter Reeves, where he annexed his first two points in the championship race; from there on he has appeared at Sherbrooke, Canadian National Exhibition and Central Canada, and won at them all, finishing under his breeder, Mr. Sam Bamford.

It is not as a bench show dog that he excels most, although we have shown that he was some show specimen; but at stud is really where he shines most, and it has been said that he has sired the best in Canada and America. The New York sensation of 1923 was "Walnut Distinct," as far as smooth coats were concerned, was sired by the new champion, "By-Town Biddy," who was so much admired at Central Canada and at Montreal, is a daughter of his. "Miss Canada," who wins so well at Uncle Sammie's shows, is another daughter. "By-Town Butternut," as slick as his wellfitting name, who went from puppy to winners at Ottawa recently and clinched honors for best of breed there, is by "Distinct"; and so it goes. Tom Rice Varick, the New England supporter of smooths, has a litter by him out of that wonderful producer, "Jane of Monmouth Road," and these will surely be beard from later.

The By-Town Terriers have been summering at Maitland, Ont., and have just returned to the capital for the winter, every individual terrier as fit as the proverbial fiddle. Plenty of young stock of the By-Town type is on hand, and from these many will

be chosen to fight for their kennel colors. One has only to notice the breeding of many of the winning smooths in both countries to realize the By-Town Kennels are doing their rightful share for the breed.

GERMAN SHEPHERD DOGS (ALSA-TIAN WOLF DOGS) AT THE CANADIAN NATIONAL EXHIBITION.

I want first to express my cordial acknowledgments to the Shepherd fanciers in Canada for inviting me to judge their breed at the National Exhibition. It was a pleasure to do so, and the general quality of the animals exhibited gives encouragement that many good things may be expected of the Maple Leaf Fanciers from the beginning which has already been made.

ALSATIAN (GERMAN SHEPHERD) DOGS AT OAKVILLE.

An interesting and representative entry of Shepherds came before me at the Specialty Show of the Alsatian Shepherd Dog Club of Canada. It was a great pleasure to see the earnestness of the breeders assembled and the general good quality of the animals exhibited. I believe that the Canadian fancy has an unusually good start, and trust that they will have every success by careful selection of stud dogs and of breeding material in general.

Excellent bone and unusually well cut head, good expression, ear and tail carriage. Promise of good gait with further maturity. Excellent temperament. G.

3rd: Edi von Bern, owner Dr. J. N. MacRae. Litter brother of the First Puppy. Also well-proportioned, somewhat loose in shoulder, showing rather less good angulation than Eric. No so clean-cut in head and with ears still soft. G.

Puppy Dogs, 9 to 12 months.

1st: Eric v. Bern, already described. Competing out of his age limit, but with the best quality of his class.

3rd: Flott von Bern, owner Edward Last. Puppy with an excellent back, but too short in proportion to his height, nevertheless long and beautiful stride. Good temperament, good depth of chest and rib. G.

Canadian-bred Dogs.

1st: Wolf Pal of Mitchell, owner Mr. Gladstone Perry. Dog of striking conformation when at rest. Loose in shoulder and with too steep shoulder angulation. Also somewhat weak in hock. Good proportion. G.

2nd: Flott von Bern, already described.

3rd: Major Coleman, owner Brant Coleman. A dog without outstanding faults, but somewhat round-ribbed and coarse. F.

Limit Dogs.

1st: Eric v. Bern, already described. 2nd: Drusus v. Felsenmeer, owner Dr. H. T. Gaetz. The decision between these two dogs was very close, but I finally awarded the first prize on typical Shepherd dog structure of the immature dog. The dog Drusus is an outstanding good specimen, with a great deal of power, excellent shoulder and feet and good croup. Slightly weak in back, but this back weakness disappears in motion. He is, however, rather round in rib and wide in front, and has too much hock action or lost motion when in full trot. His gait, though powerful and outreaching, lacks the smooth effortlessness so conspicuous in the puppy. V. G.

"DOES HE BITE?"

Out exercising my bulldogs the other evening, a man asked me the above question, as my dogs ran up to him in a friendly, "how do you do" kind of way. My answer always being, "Oh, no, they are not a bit hungry." I would think that the case of a dog walking up to a person and deliberately biting him without provocation seems a very rare one. In any case it is the timid and "undoggy" person who would be the first to get it.

Those who love dogs, whatever their breed or quality, very rarely encounter even an attempt at a bite.

A judge's immunity from injury comes very much from his skill in handling dogs and his understanding of canine character. No man or woman who has an inherent antipathy to dogs ever reaches the position of being asked to act in the judicial capacity. One does not become an expert on animals one dislikes.

The dog has marvellous and unerring instinct in immediately recognizing a person who is genuinely doggy.

This can be tested by going round the benches at a show and noticing how any particular dog will raise a friendly paw to one visitor and curl his lip at another.

It may possibly depend upon the person's manner of approach, upon his confidence or his timidity, but we should attribute the discrimination to sheer canine instinct, to the dog's mysterious power of discerning on the instant whether the person is or is not doggy. It is people like these that we may call timid, or undoggy, that cause considerable trouble to owners of our most noble friend the


