GENERAL MEETING OF THE CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB.

A General Meeting of the members of the Canadian Kennel Club was held at the Administration Building of the Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, on Wednesday Evening, September 3rd, 1924. Mr. James F. Strachan, 2nd Vice-President, occupied the chair. Members present included-Messrs. F. Lewis, E. J. Orpwood, R. Wilkinson, C. Stone, C Clark, R. P. Sparkes, P. Herd, J. Lockhart, R. M. Richmond, J. Marsden, Chas. Sheehan, W. B. Steel, E. Robertson, N. R. Miller, G. Eastham, E. J. Usher, B. Swann, C. L. McQuillan, S. Bamford, J. H. Crocker, R. Johnston, Geo. Ward, H. Clayton, M. U. Bates (Metagama, Ont.) N. Levine (Timmins, Ont.), G. Kynoch (Winnipeg, Man.), J. Bewick (Detroit), W. R. Aitken (Montreal, Que.). Mrs. W. J. Mountain was the sole representative of her sex in attendance.

The Secretary read the minutes of the last General Meeting, and on motion they were declared approved.

Mr. James F. Strachan advised the meeting that the President, because of health reasons, was unable to be present and that the Vice-President was on vacation, and so the honor of presiding had fallen on him. He was glad to notice so many members present. Reporting on the financial standing of the Club, he advised that never at any time in the history of the Canadian Kennel Club had the Club been so strong financially, and expressed the hope that it would continue to prosper, and to be active in the interests of Canadian dogdom. No business had come in to the Secretary's office intended for the meeting, so it was open for any business or discussion that the members had to bring forward.

Mr. Reg. P. Sparkes advised that he, with Mr. C. L. McQuillan and Mr. Wm. Stockdale had attended a meeting of the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair Board, where the idea of a dog show being held in conjunction with the Fair had been discussed. They, the representatives, had been informed that they would be advised of the next meeting. They had not been so advised, and now they heard of a show to be held by the Metropolitan Kennel Club, or the National Kennel Club, the particulars of which were unknown to them, and as the representatives of the Canadian Kennel Club to the Royal Winter Fair they felt they were being ignored. Mr. McQuillan added to Mr. Sparke's remarks, that he believed the gentlemen forming the new Club were all reliable, but without experience in running dog shows, and he believed that a gentleman was to be asked to come over from the United States for the purpose of handling the show, but he thought that there were just as good show managers in Canada and that one should be found.

Mr. H. Clayton speaking as a member of the National Kennel Club said a lot of the discussion was news to him, and he believed that any Club who could talk business with money behind it, could receive the attention of the Royal Winter Fair Board.

Mr. C. L. McQuillan spoke of the Canadian Kennel Club handling the show themselves and with their money.

Mr. J. H. Crocker said that when the proper time came, no doubt the Canadian Kennel Club would spend money, but members of the Club East and West from Ontario would be unwilling for shows to be held in Toronto with their money. It would be best for the Canadian Kennel Club to look ahead and arrange for something definite requitable for future years to assist and encourage the shows. He did not think that a Show would necessarily be a failure, even if it was run at a loss.

After further discussion it was moved, seconded and carried; "That the matter be left in the hands of the Canadian Kennel Club's representatives to the Royal Winter Fair Board."

Mr. James Bewick (Detroit) asked

The Alsatian entry was a popular exhibit and many of the visitors were curious to learn of the breed's possibilities which argues well for their future popularity in Canada. Mrs. Geraldine H. Dodge of the Giralda Farms, Madison, N. J., had a nice pair benched in charge of Mr. McClure Halley. They were "Iso von Doernerhof", a black dog of immense size, and great courage. "Iso" is thoroughly trained and is absolutely obedient, and we have just learned that the Marajah of Jund, an Indian Prince, has just offered \$10,000 for this dog which is not for sale at any price. Giralda's "Fritzie von Oeringen" was a pretty nice looking lady who shared the bench with the beautiful "Iso." Of course these two animals won the winners prizes. Mr. W. F. Condy's (Hamilton) Erich van Bern, the well known Canadian winner, made the nearest competition for the Giralda

Pekingese and Pomeranians were both breeds to show lower entries than those of previous years, but when we failed to find Mrs. R. C. Richardson Mr. T. Nightingale, Mrs. W. Wylie, Mr. Jack McNaughton, Mr. Wm. Wickham, etc., as we scanned the exhibitors, we felt that there were a bunch of real old time exhibitors, and that we were poorer because of their absence from the Show. Messrs. Treleaven and Hatcher's home bred "T'san Pam of Balcroft" won for his sex, whilst the same owners "Dahling of Forton" won the Bitch Section, a splendid win for these promising fanciers. The winners ribbons for both sexes in Pomeranians were won by Mrs. J. W. Bruce's "Perivale Ambergold" (Imp.) and her "Melbourne Lucielle", a lovely little home bred mite by "Ch. Cheswick Marquis ex Melbourne Night Shade", and barring accidents, a future champion.

All in all it was a wonderful show. All the old faces and many new ones were met, and the Show days passed speedily into history. Mr. Joseph Russell, our Canadian Kennel Club President, was one of the old faces that was missed by many, and many

enquiries regarding him had to be attended to. Mr. Russell is not at all himself at present but is slowly improving as we write. Mr. George Kynoch visited our President in his bedroom and found him in full possession of all the doings of the dog show. Mr. Russell's Smooth Fox Terrier puppy bitch "Claycliff Noreen" won from puppy to winners, 3rd puppy Airedale, and our show awards will mention the several prizes won by Claycliff dogs in the hot Wire Fox Terrier competition.

Other notes we made aplenty, but as we anticipate hearing from the several judges, and there are many show reports to record in this issue, we deny ourselves and our exhibitors the pleasure of specially mentioning all the things we saw, and the people we

a new record will have been made by the Canadian Kennel Club in the amount of licensed fixtures held under their rules in any one year to date.





Peterboro Industrial Exhibition Dog Show

When the Peterborough Industrial Exhibition claimed September 12th and 13th, 1924, as dates to hold a dog show under Canadian Kennel Club rules, there were many old time fanciers who thought that Peterborough "had gone to the dogs" for the first time in its existence, but of course this is not according to history as it has been written. There was a bench show of dogs held under our rules in the Market Building at Peterboro, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, January 18, 19 and 20, 1898-26 years ago. At that time they paid straight cash prizes in all classes of \$4.00, \$2.00 and \$1.00. The entry fee was \$1.00. The Secretary at that time was Dr. B. R. Poole, and our records say that "His work was simply perfection in the role he played" (Superintendent and Secretary). A banquet was held on the first night of that show, and we are told that chicken men and dog men commingled perfectly. One of the former delivered a treatise on removing "foul feathers from otherwise good fowls." This could hardly be interesting to the dog fanciers, who, at that time-as now, no doubt had the subject down to a science. Another unique sidelight of the old time show was the winning of a suit of clothes as a special prize by Mr. A. A. MacDonald, Toronto, for having the largest entry. Mr. A. A. MacDonald, at that time held the distinction of being the "Wire Haired Fox Terrier 'King of Canada," and proprietor of the "Aldon" prefix registered, and we would like to see this old timer back in the game again.

We trust our readers will pardon our raking up this ancient history, but perhaps it will serve to show that our shows of yesteryear were not so far behind our modern shows by way of their handling and arrangements.

Getting back to the Peterborough show of 1924, it was indeed a pleasant fixture on our calendar and one long to be remembered by those who were able to get there. The Chairman of the dog show committee, Mr. Wm. S. Merrell, had been indefatigable in his efforts to secure a good entry for his show, and to his credit it must be recorded that his efforts to satisfy will hold good until the whole work of the show is cleared up for this year-and after. He was on the job all the time. Supporting him were Messrs. Earl A. Brown and Vic Mathewson of Toronto. Both men were excellent in their respective positions. As Superintendent Mr. Brown was sympathetic and courteous. As Ring Steward Mr.

Mathewson was curt, yet courteous as a ring steward whose duty it is to "speed up things" should be.

Other "workers" who must not be overlooked were Messrs. Kenneth Sine, who worked hard in raking in specials for the Collie entry. He actually secured 19 specials for the breed, and what is better (for him) he won them all himself; that was no fault of Mr. Sine's, as there were no strings and fewer dogs, which combination favored this hustler. Cecil Wolfe and L. McGuire seemed to be at the disposal of visiting exhibitors and officials, and were out with the glad hand all the two days of the show-and afterwards. James Mc-Martin, who was master of ceremonies and at all time available for everything and anything, from handling a dog to paddling a canoe, James was always on hand. He can sing a good song, too, and that is something some of us knew nothing about before this show. Albert Smith, who shared the duties of ring steward with Mr. Mathewson, and last but by no means least, Mrs. Herbert Routley, who, we were told, was a powerful aid in the preparation of the affairs of the show, expert with the pen, the paddle, the rod and the gun, a lover of a beagle and a spaniel (springer), in fact, an all-round sportswoman and a genial and generous hostess. It was just another of the pleasures of this show for those who were privileged to partake of Mrs. Routley's hospitality, and the door was open night and day to one and to all.

The energy of these men so deeply engrossed in their endeavors, resulted in an entry of 243 dogs most of which were benched, and amongst them the aristocrats of many breeds, many of whom were champions or near champions. A few as might be expected were far removed from any standard, and the judges being careful to look for quality before handing out their favors, left the impression deeply rooted that to win, one must have a representative specimen of merit, and there will be a good market for A1 specimens from now on. In fact we heard of one of our champion Yorkshire Terriers, "Ch. Monitor's Cricket" having been left with Mr. George Graham, "mine host" at the Empress Hotel, a thorough sportsman whose likings run to dogs, horses and game fowl, and an old time friend of our late Yorkshire fancier, Mr. John H. Kenyon. And as Mr. Graham expressed himself, he was as "happy as a kid with a new toy" and we had no reason to doubt his declaration.

Another fancier was created when the Toronto fanciers subscribed for and presented to Mr. W. S. Merrell a most typical Boston Terrier puppy.

The thought was a happy one, and arrangements were quickly conceived and concluded. The surprise of the recipient was real. At a mid-day luncheon at the Empress Hotel 24 fanciers came together at the festive board, the cares of the show were thrown off absolutely, and happiness had its innings, and as the apple pie a la mode was about to be served the Secretary of the Canadian Kennel Club called on Mr. Merrell to receive the puppy from him, as a trifling expression of the good fellowship so apparently existing between Mr. Merrell and the visiting fanciers, who appreciated the warmth of their welcome and the generous hospitality they had received at the hands of the Peterborough officials. The surprise was welcome as it was unexpected, and Chairman Merrell received the visitors' gift with a broad grin and a hearty word of thanks. The youngster was christened "Merrell's Merrymaker" by the writer with the consent of the recipient. To recite all the various kindnesses extended to out-of-town fanciers would make interesting reading, but our space this month being at a premium, we must leave this colorful side of the show for another issue. Messrs. Brown, Swann, Mathewson, Routley (another pastmaster in the art of entertaining) and others all spoke of the pdeasures of the show.

The show was covered in by a comfortable marque, the judging ring in a sensible sized tent adjoining. The benching was all new and had been very carefully prepared, and so satisfactory was the dog show feature to the Exhibition Management that a permanent building will be erected for the dogs in time for the show next September. Dr. F. L. Robinson had charge of the veterinaries' duties, and with the exception of releasing the two Cockers belonging to Mr. Joe Hill, Toronto, who had won so elegantly at the Toronto Exhibition Show, his duties were very pleasant. Mr. Hill's dogs showed signs of having caught cold, and their release was considered to be a precaution in the interests of the dogs themselves.

It was remarked by the fanciers who had travelled in from Ottawa and London, that the Peterborough show was the feature show of the Fall circuit for hospitality, and for number of entries, the Toronto Show of course excepted. Special prizes were abundant and handsome, interest was manifest everywhere and all the time, and the closing moments of the Show were as bright as those which marked its opening. When the dogs paraded for the best in show special, Judge Mr. Norman K. Swire had a collection of really first class dogs before him that would be hard to duplicate. He finally found the crack Russian Wolfhound. "Ch. Nazimona," owned by the Romanoff Kennels of Brantford, to be his choice, the selection winning a most elaborate trophy cup outright, the gift of the Exhibition. "Ch. Nazimona' was handled by Mrs. A. Paterson, the owner. The runner-up was Mr. Jas. Cassina's noted Bulldog "Ch. Dauntless Dan," who was in rare form and was superbly handled by Mr. Bert Swann, Oakville.

The Boston Terrier entry was in the capable hands of Mr. Arthur Craddock, Toronto, and he had an entry of 42 specimens, all of them good. Mr. Craddock is absolutely fair, has a full knowledge of his dogs, careful to a degree, and his placings were well received. We will be surprised if there is not a strong demand for Mr. Craddock's services in the specialist judicial capacity in the near future.

OUR FRONT PAGE ILLUSTRATION

Our feature dog for September issue is no less a personage than "Champion Globe League O' Nations". Who heads the well-known Globe Kennels of Messrs. Lunan and Perry, London, Ontario.

When the special for the best male Boston Terrier was called at the Canadian National Exhibition (there was no special for best of breed) the ringside was given a thrill when the flashily marked, bright little "League" took his place on the block for the first time that day, and showed to all comers that "Champion Globe League O'Nations" was still in his prime and still capable of defeating the fastest field that could be placed against him. Once more the "League" carried off the special. Never was the "Globe" champion in better shape, never was he more on the alert or more striking in pose. At London the following week he repeated his Toronto win, getting best male Boston against a large entry.

It will be remembered that "Ch. Globe League O'Nations" made the championship title in Canada in nine weeks, without meeting a single defeat, and finished at the age of fourteen months. Some said in those days that the dog was too good to last, that he would coarsen up, and things like that. Dogs made of the stuff of "Globe League O'Nations don't coarsen, they last, and this has been demonstrated time and again when he has won the special for best Boston or best male Boston in the show since becoming a champion, for it has been the policy of the Globe Kennels to show their champions for specials only. If this policy had not been strictly adhered to Ch. Globe League O'Nations" would have had sufficient points to make him champion over and over again, for he has defeated the winners dog at plenty of shows. To-day we have in "Ch. Globe League O'Nations," at four years old, a great dog at his best, one of the most striking Bostons alive.

Not content with being a great show dog, the "League" is eclipsing his show record with his record as a sire. Foremost among the winners he has sired is the incomparable "Internation Champion Nation's Little Queen," whom many believe to be the greatest Boston of all time, and certainly the only Boston Terrier that has the distinction of being returned winners at six important Boston Terrier specialty shows. This little female was from one of the "League's" first litters.

It has taken time for the breeders of the good little Boston to realize that they must send away from home sometimes to produce what they want, and for that reason the London champion did not get his fair share of Canada's good females: but that has all changed now and the visitors to this little dog in late months have included some of Canada's very best show females, with the result that from several quarters are reported embryo champions in the baskets claiming "Ch. Globe League O'Nations" as their sire. Just how the owners of these litters will see their hopes fulfilled remains to be seen, but the puppies at least have the heritage of the best blood of the breed.

There is nothing remarkable in the fact that the "League" has proven a great sire when one considers his immediate ancestory. He is a son of "Champion Globe Sweet William" and that good old female, "Revolo Mazie," who in her day defeated champions, and he is one of a little of four good ones—two males became champions, and the two females both won the blue ribbons in fast company.

BARKS AND BITES IN LOCAL DOGDOM.

Under this caption we noticed in a Montreal daily of recent date the following interesting article:—

"R. Halliday, of Lachine, writes to say he wants 'Witty' Warren to come out to the Ladies' Kennel Club Show on the 17th September and meet his, Halliday's, dogs. He writes: 'I am willing to leave it to the judge who is appointed and match him on the bench for any money he wishes to put up. If he wishes to get a match it can easily be arranged through the Montreal Whippet Club which is running races week after week all over the Province of Quebec, and as the two best dogs in Eastern Canada have been matched for the cup given for the Eastern Canada championship and \$50 side stake he is welcome to challenge the winner if he so desires or enter in a \$50 sweepstake on a winner-take-all basis and silver cup donated race shall be run under the Whippet Club rules and be recognized as official."

We don't know what Brer Halliday's trouble is, but we have noticed from the returns made by the Ladies' Kennel Club that the dogs came together as suggested in the article, and that "Witty" came out with the "purple" ribbons for dogs and bitches, and wonder whether the \$50 sweepstake has yet been taken on and when it will be decided. Mr. Halliday is, no doubt, a sport, and is now at least partly satisfied.

Notes From the American Side

IN our last number we spoke of the question of size in the game little Sealyham, but little did we imagine that the impressive Whippet would also get into the limelight. quent awards, however, thoroughly demonstrated the fact that the question of size and weight in the "miniature racer" is paramount just now and, strange to say, it was brought about by a noted Anglo-Canadian fancier, to wit, Mr. Alfred Lowenstein, who it may be recalled was quite prominent around Toronto a decade back, when his very useful "Prince Charming," a very symmetrical red by "Ch. Granite Oak Masterpiece," was well up in the running, both on the track and bench.

It has become an accepted fact, both in England, where she was undefeated, in the States, where her record has been truly phenominal, and in the Dominion, where she also has had an undefeated career, that "Nomad Nancy of Oxon" is the beau ideal type and size, both as a show Whippet and as a racer; her recent display of speed and game running stamps her as a racer of the first flight, yet we find at the recent Westbury show, where a select entry greeted Mr. Lowenstein, that the decidedly large size, so strongly demonstrated in "Sam of Oxon" (a brother to "Nancy"), but much over weight, was adjudged best of the breed. In view of the fact that several of the very best were competing, and the somewhat immatured "Nomad Sister Sue," quite one of the most symmetrical Whippets of either sex, won her classes handily, and her famous dam, International Champion "Nancy of Oxon," was present, the win of the big dog who, by the way, had been declared too big for show by his former owner and breeder, the noted English authority, Mr. H. H. Adcock, brought about much discussion as to the orthodox weight in this most interesting breed.

One could not get the exact weight of the recent importation, "Sam of Oxon," a very sound and most symmetrical fawn, who should do a heap of good as a sire being a son of the famous "Ch. Willesbeaux (now owned in Cleveland), ex the well-known "Lark Song," but from a casual glance one imagined that he was nearer 25 than the accepted 20 pounds.

Several compared him with the late "Int. Champion Galloping Dominoes," and declared "Sam of Oxon" to be no heavier than Mrs. Damon's famous son of "Ch. Black Prince," who, unfortunately, was killed a few

weeks back, one feels justified in saying that "Sam" is at least four pounds heavier than was "Galloping Dominoes" when in form, such as the Canadian fanciers saw him in at the recent London and Toronto shows. This in no manner decries Mr. Robt. S. Bullock's impressive dog, but if no concerted action is taken on the most important question of weight we shall have a "Commassie" or some such undersized Greyhound competing in the Whippet classes, and if type alone is considered we may see a repetition of the Westbury awards.

They seem to have the question of weight well in hand on the Coast, that is around Los Angeles, where such enthusiastic fanciers of the Whippet as Messrs. John Matthews, Freeman Ford, Chris. Shuttleworth and others are having great sport just now with the miniature racers. Meets at Pasadena attract record crowds, and fast time is being made. One hears of a brood matron in the noted "Foothill" Kennels, owned by Mr. and Mrs. John Matthews, which had just weaned her puppies, equalling 12 seconds for the full two hundred yards. It is pleasing to know that the majority are straight and game runners, and well within the Then, again, the orthodox size. officials know the rules and have only experienced men at both ends. It is the lack of knowledge by the average starter and judges at the meets around New York City that is handicapping the racing game. "Get down to brass tacks," you Long Island fanciers, and we may see a repetition of the great meet held on the J. S. Phipps' estate at Westbury two years ago, when Col. Mitchell, of Toronto, sprang such a complete surprise with his fast fawn dog. A well managed International meet, with prizes worth while, and thoroughly experienced men in charge, should see a record number of Whippets competing at Westbury, where a splendid course could be arranged on the J. S. Phipps' polo field; but up-to-date methods must be used, with plenty of publicity, time allowed for training, and a list of prizes worth while; then see the merry little racers attract a huge crowd: but the important question of weight must be paramount.

The second annual event of the Westbury Kennel Association was a complete success, even though a miniature cyclone did try to wreck the tents. The management was perfect with a topping good group of judges and a list of prizes quite alluring, especially the trophies which, by

the way, were all "solid" and worth winning. This was rightly expected, as such experienced fanciers as Messrs. Leonard Brumby, Chas. Marsh, Walter Burrows, L. Iriberry, Geo. Borthwick, Chas. Trayford, F. Brumby and others of fame have become disgusted with the cheap plated stuff they have won on the circuit, and went out of their way to make the prizes won at their show worth while. The writer takes this opportunity of sincerely congratulating them on the marked success of their association.

Sealyhams and Fox Terriers were quite the star attractions; the former were judged by Mr. Gordon Howard. a well-known Cocker Spaniel fancier. who certainly kept to type and size, and pleased the majority when he awarded best of breed to the local bred puppy, "Scout," shown by Mr. J. S. Phipps. By the noted "Ch. Lanside Rascal," the all white son of "Barberryhill Gin Rickey," which Billy Livesey claims is the best allround "Sealy" alive, "Scout" is a very promising youngster, a replica of the sire in color and type, albeit he is not quite so powerful in muzzle, in all a beautifully balanced sort with the best action possible. The next in order was "Felcourt Squire of Gulph Creek," also all white, possibly a shade heavier in bone but is not so pleasing in ears, being somewhat of the "Fox Terrier" order, small and carried high, a real "Sealy," however. and a hard one to beat. Then came the specialty show sensation, "Brecknock Burglar," quite the best boned one and exceptionally good in quarters, but he was between coats and not at his best. In bitches it was nip and tuck between "Brash Bettina," dam of the winning dog, and the very useful home-bred "Balgownie Buelah." with "Burnholme Bliss" well up in the running; the first named had the pull in quarters and texture of coat; best of breed rightly went to "Scout."

Fox Terriers were interesting in view of the fact that the winner of the Fox Terrier Club Show, "Penlee Powder Plot," was competing. The majority seem to think that he was decidedly lucky to have won at the Club Show. Here, however, he was rightly placed behind the very evenly balanced "Croydon Olcliffe Collar," the better in expression, ears and body lines. As a matter of fact there were several here that were more impressive, possibly the best conditioned being the very sound pair shown by Charles Buttons, viz., "Grosse Point

Whistler" and "Self Starter," the latter might have gone right through to Winners as he was in rare form and had the pull on many in bone and quarters The ultimate winners were "Conejo Music Box," an impressive home-bred of Mrs. Roy Rainey's by the old favorite, "Ch. Wireboy of Paignton." and "Croydon Olcliffe Collar." with mightly little between them; had the latter been in top form he might have won. While there were no "Ch. Ormsby Lightnings" present, the competition was keen in bitches, when "Chappoqua Deity," "Pride's Hill Lookout," and other good ones were grouped in a close finish to be placed as written. Then came best of breed, a comfortable win for the well-known "Ch. Chappaqua Wrangler's Peggy," later to be declared best of all breeds, a well merited and popular award.

Mr. George Sinclair, of Toledo, had the pleasure of making his wellknown "Dumbarton Visitor," best in Smooth dogs, which gave him the necessary points for the title of champion. In bitches, the local favorite, "Heathside Lesterlin Sobel," won handily.

Collies, while a small entry, had lots of quality, with a very attractive blue merle, "Bournbrae's Eltham Park Blue Blossom," rightly best in her division, later to make it very interesting for the noted sable dog, "Belihaven Braveheart," easily best in dogs, for the special, the dog winning.

Bull Terriers were only fair, but the winner "Ch. Cloudland White Mist," in rare form, is exceptionally good, both in head, expression and body

Airedales were interesting in view of the fact that the Newport sensation, "O'Patches Folly," cleverly shown by Emmett Warburton, found a close contender in Bartlett's "Catherine II," which won her classes, finally beating the winning dog, "Briarcroft Sensation," for the special a very near thing, the bitch scoring in coat.

While the type of Bostons was decidedly mixed, the actual winners were quite in order. In dogs it was a race between "Bushwick Sensation" and "Mosholu Bambino," while in bitches the much discussed "Flash of Sunny Hill" and Bierman's "Mip Victorious" put up a great race, the former winning with little to spare. While cleaner in shoulders and moves better, she lacks the beautifully balanced head and cobby body of the stylish Bierman home-bred. "Little Tommy Tucker" was rightly best of breed; as was the grand headed "Ch. Evergay Charmer" in French Bull-

Bulldogs were very few. but exceptionally good so far as they went, with a newcomer "Hefty Brigadier," a topping good red with white markings, easily best in his classes, and might easily have been adjudged best of breed, awarded to the brindle bitch, "June Caprice," excelled in turn-up and shoulders, but is on the leg and long in body. "Hefty Brigadier" is a replica of the well-known "Sobriquet," the same beautifully balanced head and body, with perfect roach

and sound quarters; he should hold his own with the very best out to-day.

There was a decided upset in Chows when the unknown "Mah Jong Min Sing," a very sound red dog won for best of breed, for which the majority had picked the noted "Ch. Ledgeland's Sancho," who had the pull in expression and bone Another very useful sort was "Amwell Poo Woo," placed reserve in dogs. There were a very evenly matched trio left in for the best in bitches placed as follows: "Sun Fire of Clairedale," "Sum Mary Jane" and "Ledgeland's Wick See," a most promising black puppy, which should make history when fully matured.

Pomeranians were interesting, with the right type and size winning, when the noted sable bitch, "Pomland Little Venus," won for best of breed; it was no easy victory however, as the winning dog, "Little Rajah," a stylish sable, and the well-known "Vimmie Sable Girl," were in form; as a matter of fact they had the better texture of coat and sounder action; the winner, however, is exceptionally good in type and all head points.

Pekingese were keenly contested, with at least four good enough for top honors. The special went to the rare bodied red dog, "Ch. Bagatelle Dan of Toddington" who could be better in finish of face, but his rare bone, nice front formation and heavy coat stood him in good stead. "Ho Chee of Clamarlow" was reserve winners dogs; while in the opposite sex it was a mighty close race between "Greenwich Tung Tsu," "Nanking

In view of the fact that the winner was bred. owned, conditioned and handled by the owner, P. Hamilton Goodsell, an out-and-out amateur, the award proved most popular. Shepherd Dogs, of which there should have been a record entry, that is if an experienced judge had been selected, were only fair, but there was no questioning the claims of the noted black bitch. "Ch. Freia von Humboldpark," which easily won for best of breed. It is to be hoped that in such a popular breed there will be no more experiments made in trying to foster a "judge" who has had absolutely no experience in the breed such as the judge selected for East Hampton.

Newport was a vast improvement on East Hampton, and rightly so, as the list of judges were of the very best calibre Here the usual unclassified specials were substituted for the club's challenge trophies, and all Best Americankeenly contested. bred dog or bitch was a popular win for the St. Bernard, "Hercuveen Indomitable," a richly colored orange and white with dark shadings, shown by Mrs. Wm. Burden, a new exhibitor, whose victory was greeted with much applause. "Freia von Humboldpark" was best in Shepherds, with the much improved "Giralda's Astor Mein Augenstrost," a popular selection for the winners in dogs. Here is the "modern angulation" to a marked degree, with one of the best heads and general carriage out to-day. "Ch. Evergay Charmer" was best in French Bulldogs, and the runner-up to the St. Bernard for best of all Americanbreds. Best sporting dog or bitch went to the English setter, "Willow Brook Don," which had little to spare in beating the rare conditioned Cocker Spaniel, "Waycross Wampum. Then came the typical Shepherd Dog. "Fredo of Joselle," as the best bred by exhibitor

A quality show, well managed and a decided improvement on many of the previous events given by the Rhode Island Kennel Club, which we are pleased to note is coming back to its early prestige when Newport was one of the best outdoor shows.

The Orange Pomeranian

By LILLIAN C. RAYMOND-MALLOCK

The Orange Pomeranian is one of the colors which has steadily increased in public favor, and it stands without a rival to-day as regards popularity. Too often when a new color is introduced there is a sudden craze for it, which, after lasting a few years, dies out. The oranges, however, have won their present position on their own merits and hold their own in competition with any of the other colors. In the main, I think, this is due to the fact that the oranges which first popularized this variety were themselves sufficiently perfect in type to hold their own in mixed colored classes. It is always bad for a color when its representatives cannot hope for success in the show-ring except in classes confined strictly to that color in order to come out "top dog." The general type must be of superlative quality and this the oranges can show from the very start.

It is rather a pity that the term orange is so loosely applied to orange Poms. In a class confined to oranges one finds deep creams, the bright oranges, more or less deep reds and even reds with black hairs provided the latter are not too noticeable. The latter color is the most objectionable. They are really bad colored specimens of the sables. It is one of the penalties of popularity that dogs which have any pretentions to orange are included as such by their owners instead of being entered in their proper classes. The deep creams also have no business in an orange class. They are sufficiently beautiful to hold their own as creams. It is probably with this end in view that the standard for the orange color was altered some years ago specifying that they should be "deep" and "even" in color. I do not think it possible that the framers of the standard intended to give the reds preference over "real oranges" but they certainly did intend to penalize creams, and whites with lemon shadings, from competing in orange classes.

Probably one of the reasons why oranges as a whole are so good in type is that they are largely discarded from the blues, shaded sables, and blacks among which colors a large proportion of the outstanding sires of the past can be found. Perhaps the black has been as little used as possible, but I mention it because that perfect specimen of an orange dog "Ch. Gold" was bred from a black dam, his sire being that old pillar of the color "Ch. Mars." This dog was among the first of the oranges to bring

the color prominently before the public. He was a descendant of "Ch. Boy Blue" to whom he owed his wonderful body and type. He showed his blue blood in the frequency in which blue puppies appeared in his litters, although these generally changed to orange sables on assuming their adult coats.

"Rudolph Rassendyl" was another Orange (bred from a black dam) who did his bit to improve this color. He was the loveliest shade of orange I have ever seen, and a winner as well as a first rate sire.

Another dog who, although not an orange himself, certainly deserves a place among the pillars of the orange color, is "Ch. Dragon Fly." His influence on the present day oranges can still be seen in their wonderful coats. I can remember seeing this grand old veteran when he was 13 or 14 years old, and although past his show carcer, the coat he was even then carrying would put many of the present day big winners to shame. The texture (although it had lost its extreme harshness) was still wonderful. I believe he is chiefly represented among our modern stock by the rich deep color, whilst "Ch. Mar's" descendants are mostly the clear golden orange. Both these colors are extremely attractive but personally I prefer the

sunny bright color with not a single black hair either in body coat or muzzle, to the deeper color, and apart from exhibitions, the general public have shown a decided preference for the brighter color.

In exhibiting orange Pomeranians (especially in mixed classes) I advise exhibitors to give the preference to open air shows, where the dogs are shown on grass. This may not be so important for the deeper shades but the bright clear orange shows up to perfection when standing on grass. The green carpet seems to enhance the color, while boards or gravel take away from the pleasing effect. It is also worth while choosing green hangings for the pen, as the dog will then be shown to the fullest advantage to the public who visit the show.

I have mentioned three of the originators of the orange, whose prestige is well upheld by some of our present day champions who supply ample proof that the breed and color is still progressing. Among these and which are likely to leave their mark on the breed are, Mrs. Fred Brown's "Ch. Minegold Double" and "Ch. Minegold Monsieur." It is claimed that the latter has sired more winners than any orange Poms living. "Ch. Minegold Double" who is a son of "Monsieur" and whose dam was by "Ch. Little Minegold" is a dog of outstanding merit, who has already sired a great many winners. Mrs. Judge-Brown's team of orange champions are another great asset to the orange fancy, comprising "Ch. Offley The Star," "Ch. Sunbright Tatcho," "Ch. Gold Sun of Sunbright," "Ch. Sunbright Gold Premium." and the bitch "Ch. Sunbright Sun," the last mentioned dog being as well known as a sire, as a bench winner. A more recent champion is Mrs. and Miss Crawford's "Ch. Perivale Mist of Gold," who got his full championship at this year's Pomeranian Club's show, having won the Championship also at this important show in 1923. He is a real clear bright orange, with a marvelous coat, and charming head. He is already the sire of one full champion, and two more of his puppies have won challenge certificates.

So long as the "Oranges" are represented by such perfect type and color as those superb specimens I have just mentioned, as well as by many lesser lights, there is every good reason to believe that the orange Pomeranian will continue to retain its present pouularity as "first favorite" in this delightful breed.

NOMINATION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS FOR 1925

ARTICLE 8 of the Constitution standing in respect to voting or holdand By-Laws of the Canadian Kennel Club reads as follows:-

"A list of members in good standing as on the 30th day of September in said year shall be published in the official organ.

"Nominations for Directors allotted to each respective Province shall be made in writing and shall be signed by at least two members in good standing in the respective Provinces, and such nominations shall be sent to the Secretary of the Club so as to be received by him on or before the 15th day of November in the said year, on which date all nominations close.

"When nominations are closed, a ballot slip, showing nominations for officers and Board of Directors, shall be sent by mail to each member, with instructions to return same to the Election Commissioner. All ballots must be mailed to members on or before the 30th day of November in said

"All ballots must be sent by the voter to the Election Commissioner in a special envelope marked 'Ballot', provided for this purpose, and must be in his hands on or before the 21st day of December. A member in good ing office is a member whose membership fee for the current year has been paid on or before the 30th day of September in the then current year.

"Default, other than wilful default, by the Secretary of this Club in supplying a ballot paper to any member, or the non-receipt of such ballot paper by any member within the prescribed time shall not invalidate an election held in the manner herein provided. Only those ballot papers bearing the seal of the Club and the initials of the Secretary, and which shall be received by the Commissioner on or before the 21st day of December next, shall be counted. If a member votes for more than the number of candidates to which he is entitled to vote. this shall spoil his ballot.

"The Election Commissioner shall forthwith after the last day for receiving ballot papers, open the same and proceed to count the votes, and he shall deliver to the President of the Club, his certificate sworn to before a notary public declaring the result of the Election, which shall be final and conclusive. In the case of an equality of votes the Election Commissioner shall have a casting vote.

"The Election Commissioner shall seal the counted ballot papers in pack ages and deposit the same with the Secretary, who shall preserve the same until the first day of July following, after which date they shall be destroved.

"The Secretary shall notify by post prepaid each person elected of his election and shall announce the results at the annual meeting. The Board of Directors shall have the power to fill vacancies which may occur among the officers through resignations, death or otherwise. Committees may be appointed by the Directors either from among themseves or the other members of the Club."

This article shall govern the election of our Officers and Directors for 1925. and for that purpose we have prepared the following list of our members whose fees for the current year have been paid. Kennel and Bench for October will be held back until we shall have received from the Records Office the names of the members who may have paid their 1924 membership dues during the later days of September. This late list will necessarily appear as a separate list, but will be as complete as the returns made to this office.

Head Study

Quite one of the most important importations into the Dominion this year is that of the above named Alsatian, which was brought into the country by Mr. M. G. Dover, of Calgary, Alta., and students of the breed will find many outstanding characteristics in a study of the pictures illustrating this short review. Particularly does the head study show a very definite strength of masculinity, fearless and sagacious. The illustration showing the body compares favorably with many which claim to be pictures of the best specimens, and truly our Western Provinces are fortunate in having this wonderful Shepherd dog in their midst.

Leo has distinguished himself by his motion picture work, his winnings in European show rings, and by his years of work with the Berlin criminal police. He has won 34 honor prizes under Germany's most severa judges, and on ten different occasions he has received the highest qualification possible, i.e., Voorzuglich. Adding to these honors it is significant that he carries the further distinction of being "Ange Kort." As a sire he has been given the rigid examination by the experts of the German Shepherd Dog Society, and officially certified for stud purposes.

The list of prizes won by Mr. Dover's importation up to and including the year 1921 will be found in the 1922 issue of the "Korbuch," on page 95. The Shepherd Dog Society of Germany have awarded Leo von Stenschewo the official certification of P. H. (Polizeihund), and he has

repeatedly won the highest honors at training shows under Germany's strictest judges. He stands 26 inches at the shoulder, and is a lovely wolfgrey color, with a darkish saddle.

Mr. Dover's other holdings in high grade Alsatians include:

Berta von Luisenplatz, S.Z. 99707, who was whelped Nov. 6th, 1920, at Koln-Nippes, Germany. She stands 22½ inches at the shoulder, and has a flashy yellow color with black saddle, high, erect ears, dark eyes, correct tail carriage, a beautiful gait and excellent body conformation.

Berta's breeding shows the most reliable blood lines, too. Her sire, Harras von der Juch P.H., is the 1921 Grand Champion of Garmany. Since this race originated and has been perfected there, the Grand Championship of that country is the most highly coveted of all honors for a Shepherd. There are only four of these Grand Champions of Germany living in all the world, and Harras is one of them.

Renee of Carnagey is another, a young bitch of great promise. Her sire, Preishutensieger Aldo von Bodestrand, H.G.H., is the 1920 Grand Champion of Germany for Herding. Aldo is the only "Preishutensieger" ever to come to America and there are only two living.

Major von der Krone, another young male, recently took "Reserve Winners" at the Calgary Show last July, under Judge Walter H. Reeves, of Belleville, Ont.

A two-months'-old bitch puppy by Leo von Stenschewo, ex Berta von Luisenplatz, is being carefully developed with a view towards that day when maturity will make her one of the kennels' most valued assets.

It will not be surprising for us to learn that the dog featured in this article will soon be associated with the police staff at Calgary, if not by actual purchase, then by arrangement, as a dog of Leo's training should be utilized to its utmost in a manner calculated to be productive of the best and most valued results.

Mr. Dover is due the thanks of every Alsatianist in Canada for his having brought the valuable blood lines we have mentioned into the country.

Monday, January 1st, 1917. Everything ready for the 9th Annual Show. Dr. C. F. Sullivan of Boston was on hand to do the judging. The entry was a record one—nearly one hundred dogs being benched. Mr. W. B. Levack had been taking a very active interest in the Club affairs, and although not present at the Show owing to illness, was chiefly responsible for the big entry.

The Puppy Classes, Junior and Senior, were won by Mr. H.E.C. Brennen's "Derby Speed". (This little dog afterwards made his Championship). Second to him was Stanley Hicks' "Kenmore Raffles," with Marchand and Brown's "Torontonian," third. Novice lightweights was also a repeat.

Limit and open lightweights was won by John Dietschler's (Buffalo) "The Fascinator" with G. A. Beaumont's "Kid Raffles" second.

The Middleweight novice class was won by F. W. Warren's "Earl Worthy" with A. Fraser's "Dominent" second. Limit Middleweight was won by W. B. Levack's "Little Pete 2nd" and open by my own "Clifton Peach" with "Little Pete 2nd" second.

Novice heavies went to T. E. Milburn's "Hillcrest Tommy." Limit heavies was won by "The Spirit" which latter dog had been purchased during the year 1916 from Mr. Eberhardt of Buffalo, by Messrs. Brown and Phillips of Toronto. Open heavies went to W. B. Levack's "Dowd's Glory" with "The Spirit" second. "The Fascinator" got winners with "Clifton Peach" reserve.

Puppy Bitches Junior went to H. Foster's "Hasty Cora" and senior to Mrs. W. C. Ingram's "Little Woman" with "Hasty Cora" second. "Ingram's Little Woman" also won the Novice lightweights with J. H. Brown's "Dainty Girl" second. Limit and open lightweights went to W. B. Levack's "Fashion Plate" with D. D. Elder's "Rexonian Little Lady" second. Novice middleweight went to Mrs. Proudfoot's "Queenie"—limit to Wm. Austin's "Lady Verna" and open to John Dietschler's "Rexcellia."

In heavyweight Bitches, W. A. Currie's "Maxine Belle" was first and W. F. Cummings' "September Morn" second.

more and more interest taken in the Club, and the Boston Terrier in general.

At the Annual Meeting, Mr. Milburn was made Hon. President and Mr. W. B. Levack was elected President, with W. C. Ingram Vice-President, and myself again Secretary.

However, before the Show time arrived, Mr. Levack had resigned his position as President and after considerable persuasion Mr. Milburn again took his seat in the chair. The Club had a heavy loss during the year, by the death of Chas. T. McKay of Kingston, who had been Vice-President the previous year, and had always been one of its most able and generous supporters.

After the Annual Meeting the members took hold to prepare for the coming Show. Jno. Dietschler was selected to judge, so after a busy day of preparation, the stage was set for the 10th Annual Show, to take place at the Labor Temple, Toronto, Tuesday, January 1st, 1918.

FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE ON THE WANE.

The Golden Gate Kennel Club was obliged to cancel their original dates because of the prevalence of the dread foot and mouth disease. We notice that the show will be held at the Civic Auditorium, San Francisco, on August 15th and 16th, and take it as pointing to a lessening of the anxiety on the part of the officials whose office it is to guard against the spread of the scourge.

ALLAN C. A. CHISHOLM LOSES LADY LORNE.

When Mr. Chisholm set off from Montreal to take in the Canadian National Exhibition Dog Show, accompanied by his three good entries, "Hefty Rival" (Imp.), Failsworth White Challenger (Imp.), and "Lady Lorne," his hopes ran high with the prospect of their meeting and competing with the very best in the land, but his hopes were partly blasted when he discovered the latter a good daughter of "Rhoodee John" (Imp.) dead in her crate. apparently from suffocation. The two dogs gave satisfactory accounts of themselves, and we can only conjecture what might have happened in the bitch's classes had she been spared to compete in them. As it is, "Lady Lorne" had travelled considerably over the road that leads to championship honors, and her chances at Toronto were considered quite rosy. They say the good die young, and here is another case in point. "Lady Lorne being about 21/2 years old, Friend Allan endeavored manfully to hide his disappointment, but only partly succeeded in doing so. "Lady Lorne" was a favorite, besides being a valuable kennel asset, and her place at St. Antoine Street will be hard to fill. He knows the rules of the game, however, and has had all its bumps before, so we will soon see another good bitch there to take "Lady's" place.

TORONTO YORKSHIRE WINS AT DETROIT.

Mr. John H. Bell, well known to Toronto fanciers, and who now resides in Detroit, showed a Yorkshire Terrier puppy at the Michigan State Fair Dog Show and after winning the class, was placed reserve winners. The puppy was by Mr. Harry Draper's "Lord Byng" ex Mr. Bell's "Bluebell," and it is heartening to know that our Canadian fanciers stick to the old game in their new homes across the imaginary boundary.



Vancouver Exhibition Dog Show

Mr. Editor: - Complying with your request I will endeavor to give you my impressions of the Voncouxer Exhibition Dog Show and on some of the dogs which I had the honor to pass judment on there. This report will, of necessity, be brief. As I set out with the best intentions in the world of taking copious notes there, and later blossoming forth as a budding canine journalist; but alas-yes, Mr. Editor, I have to admit it-I neglected to take one single solitary note, and the best excuse I can plead is the fact that I had some very energetic ring stewards, whose sole aim in life seemed to be to make anything that could move move faster, and as the "bally hoo" man remarks, "There was no waiting," permit me to pause here to tender my sincere thanks for the very valuable assistance given me by my clerk, Mr. Albert Kerr (late of Ottawa). He knew his job, and did it well. I have never had a show secretary that suited me better. He is quite unique in one respect-he does not talk. The energetic stewards mentioned were Messrs. "Sandy" Mc-Lean (yes, he's Scotch too), Billy Oates and George Stock. They rendered me yeoman service by keeping the ring filled all the time. The superintendent of the show was the redoubtable Fred Wilds, of Boston Terrier fame. Fred is a glutton for work. A former judge described him as the "Geo. Foley of Canada." I cannot do better than endorse that statement, and believe me, sir, that speaks volumes. As to the exhibitors, they accepted my decisions like the good sportsmen they are. The quality of the dogs, as a whole, was exceptionally good, with a sprinkling of bad ones here and there.

The Dog Show Building is a clean, well-lighted structure. It had evidently had a fresh coat of limewash and was very nicely decorated with evergreens that, with the bunting, flags and decorated kennels, gave the show a gala appearance. The show earned a five-point rating, well over the 300 dogs for the limit rating being benched. That popular and wellknown handler, Mr. George Kynoch, of Winnipeg, had a very creditable string from the 'Peg and district. I noted his charges were all in fine form, and I scarcely need mention, were well handled. "Scotty," as is his wont, made a host of friends at this show by his sportsmanlike manners and his sunny smile, regardless of the position he held on the block.

to the now famous Bulldog, "Ch. Kingsway Man O'War.' he could not be denied premier honors. He has been so often reviewed that any further comment than that he was looking better than ever would be superfluous. Best opposite sex going to one of the finest English Setters I have seen for many moons, "Saxon Beauty" -a very aptly named one-wonderful type. In color, lemon and white, excelling in head, outline and expression; grand body, legs and feet; a sound mover, and shown very fit. Best Terrier in show fell to a sterling young Airedale "Martley Squire," a home-bred one and a real one, possessing a real terrier head with plenty of foreface; neat ears, well carried, level top; straight front; good body and A1 hindquarters, and moves well. He has a good jacketin fact is a hard one to fault. He was put down very fit and is a credit to his breeder. Best Toy in show brought out a bevey of good ones. I made "Ch. Torquil," a heavy-coated orange Pomeranian, best of this lot. He is a grand coated one; neat head and ears very sound color, is sound, and a perfect showman.

I will not attempt a critique on any but the winners of the various breeds. Japanese Spaniels winners dogs, went to a lovely little black and white "Tama"—a nice sized one, very short in face, real Japanese type. The winners bitch was an exact replica of the dog, with the exception of being a shade shallow before the eyes. Pekingese winners dogs, "Ras Tus of Kennadali," with a wonderful head, plenty of bone, and a rare

bodied one. I would describe him as a big little one. Winners bitches found "Barls of Alderbourne"-also a small one, possessing a real fine shaped body, and a very pleasing head, very low down and a good coated Peke. Winners dog, "Ch. Torquil" (mentioned). Winners bitches went to "Juliet"-a very sound black, pleasing head and a good "stand off" coat; a shade low on the leg Black and tans were all too immature. Whippets brought out a stormer in "Flossie of Castlemore," the winning bitch. In color, red, nice size, a deep-chested one, with splendid front and shoulders, galloping hindquarters, nice head, with a neck "set in" right, quite the best I have seen for some time. Winners dogs, "Peter"-a red; very good type; rare body and quarters; a little slack in feet. Fox Terriers (Wire), winners dogs, "Crack 'Em Hard'"-a nice headed one, straight front, good feet, harsh coat. He could be better in top, and a little more rib would improve him, otherwise a nice Terrier. Winners bitches, "Kirby Flapper"-a heavy marked black and white very nice head, keen expression short coupled level top; good legs and feet, and a good coated one, but shown in rather full coat, and a shade too fat. I make her a very nice Terrier. Fox Terriers (Smooth), winners dogs, "Clapton Reckoner"-a real goodbodied one, excelling in front, legs and feet. Rather an odd marked head, which gives him the appearance of being thick in skull. However, on handling him, his skull while not being quite as clean as it could be, passes muster. Airedales, winners dogs (already mentioned), winners bitches, "Killarney Kimm"-a bad colored one, but plenty of terrier character, excelling in front and shoulders, was a bit lucky not to have met much competition.

Boston Terriers, winners dogs "Ch. Bantam's Little Boy"-a flashy marked one, capital head, short coupled, good front, a short kinked tail, plenty of neck and very sound. Winners bitches, "Steeve's Lady"-a very neat bitch, well marked, well put together and a real headed one, carrying no wrinkles. She could win in better company. French Bulldogs, winners dogs, "Ch. General Hunks"-fair head, a little too long in body, but the best there. Winners bitches. "Lady Pierette"-a nice sized one. short back, fair head.

English Bulldogs winners dogs, "Sandy McNab"—a smashing young heavyweight, by Dr. T. E. Sleeth's

"Ch. Man O'War," with a massive skull, good turn-up, and plenty of cushion, for a youngster, lots of finish of foreface and wrinkle; low to ground; a good fronted one with bone like his sire; good short body. fair roach, sound hindquarters and a real mover; good spring of ribs. Winners bitches found "Kingsway My Reverie" at the top. She is also by "Ch. Man O'War"-a white one and a model; built like her sire. Such a head; plenty of length from eye to ear; finish of foreface; lots of wrinkle; nice placement of eyes; neat ears. This bitch has a real bulldog action, and a body and front like her sire. She is the goods!

English Bull Terriers. Only one. Winners bitches "Philander Countess"—a very nice heavyweight; topping bone face, good black eye "set in right," and a grand body.

Cockers were quite numerous, and I really think they were quite the best collection I have ever seen on the Pacific Coast. Winners dogs, black, "Ch. Matlock Durbar"-a nice sized. short-backed good fronted specimen. This fellow has plenty of bone, and for one so short coupled, he has a good neck; very straight front; good shoulders. His head is rather inclined to be a little effeminate; has very expressive eyes and ears put on low; could have a little more lip. Winners bitches, "Black Ruby" won here. She is a well "put together" Cocker, and a good headed one, too; nice eye and good ears; short in back, not so nice as she might be; better in shoulders, rather

inclined to crouch in the block, and did not make the most of herself. Parti-colored winners, bitches "Ottawa Helen"—a red and white; good body, neck and head; straight front; plenty of bone and good feet. A little smaller than I like them. Winners dogs, parti-colored quite the opposite to the bitch in size, but a good Cocker. His weakness, as I saw him, was lacking in rib.

Springer Spaniels, winners dogs, "Trailfinder"—a liver and white, a good bodied Springer; nice neck, good front; a little more size would improve him, but quite the best there.

Irish Water Spaniels, winners dogs, "Barney McShane"—a good one, shown in wonderful form, and the best fronted Spaniel I have seen. He moves well; a real coated dog; good body and quarters; just a shade thick in skull, with a little more rib, I think he would be a real topper. Winners bitches "Wild Irish"—quite a decent bitch, but shown in shocking condition; put down fit, she will go a long way.

English Setters, "Snowbird's Babe"
—a very nice Belton bitch; good body, legs and feet; good arched neck; pleasing head; trifle off in shoulders. Shown in very good form. Winners dogs, "Credential's Pathfinder"—same type as "Saxon Beauty"—a very nice Setter, and a good headed one; a sound mover and nice ootline. He was shown a little light in flesh. When fit, he will go a long way towards the front.

Pointers, winners dogs, "Ch. Don

Beverley"—a liver and white, and a mighty hard dog to fault. He sure is a stylish fellow. I never saw body, neck, legs and feet like this dog possesses. Winners bitches, "Ch. Victoria Beauty"—also a liver and white, and as her name implies, "a beauty"; built on rather different lines to the dog; not quite so good in body, but I think is better in head than her kennel mate.


Curly Retrievers, winners dogs (curly—one shown), "Narcrost Lad" —nice body, good bone, straight front thick in skull; coat in poor condition.

Collies (Rough), winners dogs, "Denny Dazzler"—a big upstanding fellow, plenty of stye, with a wonderful coat; a typey headed one, with the exception of being a trifle skully, and a bit off in one eye. I make him a very decent Collie. Winners bitches, "Lockabar Lily"—a profuse-coated sable and white; a nice headed bitch, carries her ears well and moves well.

Alsatian, winners dogs, "Doner Von Forben"—a big brindle, shown very fit and handled well. He has gotten a bit coarse with age; should sire a good pup. Winners bitches. I do not know the name of the winners bitch, as no winners marked. She is a nice, clean headed wolf grey, good expression, nice front, good ears. I make her a very fine specimen of the correct type.

Great Danes, winners dog, a fine big upstanding brindle, very soond, good body, legs and feet; nice head; ears which have been badly trimmed.





Dr. T. E. Sleeth's wonderful Bulldog, Ch. Man O' War, a very definite force in the show ring, or in the stad kennel. Considered by many expert judges to be one of British Columbia's very best dogs,

Russian Wolfhounds, "Pola of Bellecouver"-a Russian much above the average, went to winners, dogs and bitches. She has a wonderful head, with real Borzoi type; good body, nice roach, plenty of depth of chest, nice neck, very sound with good action.

Old English Sheepdogs, winners, "Rose of Lyngcurry'-a blue and white, beautiful front and body: moves well, fair head, but shown in poor condition. Winners, "Chow Chow Topsy," best of a poor lot.

Samoyede, "Ch. Snowball"-only one shown, and very common one. Maltese winners, withheld.

Toy Poodles-winners, dogs, bitches "Barney O'Neil"-a good coated Poodle, of correct size, nice head, and shown very fit.

There may be an odd breed or two that I have missed, but winners was not marked in my catalogue in these

(It is a pleasure for Kennel and Bench to find the necessary space for this critique on our far Western dogs by Mr. Jack Fletcher, and our readers will now have a better idea than ever before regarding the popular breeds at the Coast. Further, we ask readers to notice the large amount of dogs kennelled and owned by Western fanciers that have finished their championships on the circuit just closed. Another thing that stands out prominently in the Western show reports which have all been exceptionally successful during the circuit is that all the judges officiating have seen much handling in their lifetime. In fact, four out of the five shows on the circuit were judged by professional handlers, and in justice to them we bring this circumstance out clearly for what it is worth -Ed.)

The Great Le Pas Derby and Carnival

(Continued from page 15, August Verily, these Le Pas boys could "put it across." A stir of excitement in the crowd now, and on looking around there came slowly into view, and drawn by a pair of big grey horses, the Carnival Queen and her court on her way to give the word that would start the racers off on their long run. As "Her Majesty" drove slowly past, the "Rod and Gun" camera clicked again, with a very happy result shown in accompanying photograph. The movement of the crowd now was towards the starting line on the Saskatchewan River, and near the Hudson's Bay railway bridge, upon which vantage point many spectators had already taken up their stand.

By eleven o'clock all teams were in place, the last two to arrive, singularly enough, being Shorty himself and Allan MacDonald, who came in first and second at the finishing line next day. Ten teams in all, and composed of an average of seven dogs each, now faced the scratch. The line-up was as follows: B. Johnson, Big River (F. Schloegel driving); I. Pelly, The Barrier; Northern States Power Co., St. Paul, Minn. (B. L. Baker driving); Solomon Cook and Sam Pranteau, both of Grand Rapids, Man.; and Tom Creighton (Bill Grayson driving); D. Lavelle, R. Lambert, Shorty Russic and Allan MacDonald, all of Le Pas. I took several photographs of the different teams, including that of B. L. Baker, which was one of the first teams I

had seen, Mr. Baker having ridden up on the train with me from Winnipeg the day I arrived. It was within a minute or two of starting time now, so taking my last photograph of the standing teams, I rushed back and up onto the high railway bridge which commanded a wide view of the river, and from which point I hoped to get

picture of the teams in action, so that "Rod and Gun" readers might. in some measure, enjoy this spectacular view as well as myself. Silence for a moment-then the loud "Go!" -a wild "Mush-h-h!" that seemed to break from a single throat, and the dogs were away. When ten tiny specks shot into view and were moving swiftly across the finder of my camera, click! went the shutter, and the 1924 Derby was recorded for all time. When the picture was developed later, it exceeded by most sanguine expectations, as a light snow had been falling at the time, and far down the river to the west leaden snow clouds were still threatening. as the picture plainly shows. The clouds, however, soon passed, and the bright northern sunshine smiled down to welcome the mrery crowds, and to cheer the racers on their way.

The general direction of the derby course was west and south; down the Saskatchewan River a way, off on the Carrot River, then a bush trail to Camp 11, a hundred miles distant, and return to Le Pas. (See Atlas or other maps for these rivers).

Back up town now the carnival and sports were getting into full swing. In the gaily decorated grandstand the Carnival Queen and her snowy-clad attendants held proud court, and were the object of much admiring interest on the part of those assembled for the sports. The latter consisted of dog, pony, and snowshoe races, Indian races, boys' and women's dog races,—some of these 10 and 12 miles long, and for which prizes of fifty

dollars or more were taken by the winners. Friend Bancroft it was who again officiated as starter and general master of ceremonies. When the dog races for "Girls with their Sweethearts" were called, Bancroft's "Don't forget your sweetheart" and other timely adjurations bawled through his megaphone, kept the Indians in a continual giggle and the crowd in rare good humor.

It was at the finish of one of these races that we happened to get the picture of one of the "Mushing Brydges," Mrs. Harry Kramer, daughter of Capt. Brydges, and another sister of Earl, the boy champion. Mrs. Harry fortunately had her parka with her, so we are able to let our readers see what one of the Captain's daughters looks like anyway. A boy musher, W. Paylor, did most of the winning in the shorter races, up to and including the five-mile race. This boy was also fourth in an entry of 13 in the 12-mile race, and must have won close to \$50 in prize money the first afternoon. The result of the 12-mile race was: 1st, E. St. Goddard, 1 hr., 4 mins.; 2nd, Ross Moxley; 3rd, W. Lyon.

The crowd was now wending their way to their various stopping places to eat supper and change their carnival togs for the more serate habiliments of the ballroom. The Derby balls are held each year in the beautiful dancing pavilion in Devon Park, and are always patronized, so I was informed, by the elite of this outpost town. As I left my room after dressing I ran onto my two Sheik friends, Affleck and Ernest, minus their caribou coats now, and both looking immaculate in black and white. Speculation was, naturally, rife as to what these outpost belles danced, and how they danced it; but we were not left long in suspense. About one hundred couples were present, including the Carnival Queen and her full court: and partners for the Grand March were already being formed when we arrived. Dr. Orok, President of the Derby, was busy marshalling his forces; but we threw ourselves on his mercy. "Doc," we began, "we have come a long way—" "Right and Gun's" representative fell the very pleasant duty of doing honors for "Miss Winnipeg" in the person of Miss Pansy Thompson, of the Capital City; the opening strains of the Grand March sounded, and the 1924 ball was on.

And what did they dance? Exactly the same as they dance in Toronto or in Montreal, or in the more exclusive clubs in our northern Ontario towns: waltz and fox-trot, waltz and fox-trat, and every now and then—with a happy inspiration—a one-step thrown in to break any possible monotony of the former two. "Tags," "Novelty Dances," and "Moonlight Waltzes" were also on the program; and could they dance, these northern belles? The latter surmise can best be left, as the old-time writers say, to the "imagination of our readers."

In an incredibly short time, it seemed, the supper waltz was announced; and looking at my watch I saw that it was already midnight. Evidently, no dull moments at the Derby Ball. During the daity lunch served by the Derby Committee, one had an opportunity of getting more fully acquainted with the Queen and her royal court. The Queen for 1924 was Miss Matilde Yesowski, a resident of Le Pas. Her Court of five attendants were Miss Marguerite Neale, Miss Elsie Westman, both of Le Pas: Miss Juanita Kelly, Dauphin, Man .: Miss Annie Boyd, of Star City, Sask., and Miss Pansy Thompson, of Winnipeg. Between bites of cake and dainty sips of coffee, I got the history of all the fair contestants. The Le Pas girls had taken part in Carnival events before; this was the first visit of the other girls, however, to the "Gateway of the North," but they were having a wonderful time, and

were surely coming back again, whether in the role of "princess" or not. I might add that this annual "Court Contest" arouses a great deal of interest amongst the fair residents of Northern Manitoba and neighboring points. To become Queen of the Carnival, or a member of the Queen's court, a girl must secure a certain number of votes, or donations, each donation to count for so many votes. The girl receiving the highest number of votes is elected Queen, and the next highest, and so on, to the number of five or six, her court. Successful outside contestants have their train fare, and all expenses, including costumes, paid for, and are suitably chaperoned and entertained by members of the Committee during their stay in Le Pas. The Queen is, in addition, presented with a beautiful set of silver fox furs. I saw the set presented to the 1924 Queen, and certainly they were enough to cause a flutter to the heart of any fair recipient thereof. Ambitious young ladies desirous of queenly honors, and liking a jolly time, would do well next season eary to communicate with The Secretary, Derby Committee, Le One might win the coveted honor; who knows? During the evening I had the further pleasure of meeting Miss Marie Emery, the Queen of last year's carnival, and whose office it was to crown the present Queen at this year's ball, which ceremony she very gracefully performed in the early part of the evening. Then there was Mrs. Bancroft, the very charming wife of the genial "G. R.," Mrs. (Dr.) Stephenson, Mrs Burton, Mesdames Keddie, Bagshav and Cox, the Court chaperones, an many other lovely people who helpd to make the evening the unqualifut success that it was. Nor can we f get the local "school ma'ams," v were amongst the outstanding befor of the ball. Le Pas is much les other frontier towns in this respey with this exception: in other play I have been some of the schen ma'ams have been pretty; in Le hk all of them are pretty. What or the ladies wear? I was just com? to that. Let's see, now, they havie. -I mean they had off-that is-wB. I can't remember just exactly p's they all were dressed, but they loo 2 awfully nice, anyway. The fains: plaintive notes of the "Home, Sw? Home" waltz, and the 1924 ball ha passed into history.

Some time before noon the leading racers were expected to arriv! Shortly before eleven o'clock a slow moving speck was seen in the di-

tance. Coming quickly into plainer view it proved to be Shorty with his long-legged wolfhounds. Arriving at the finishing line the dogs appeared still quite fresh, but Shorty himself was pretty sleepy from his long run. As he had broken all previous records, having made an average of over eight miles an hour for the two hundred miles, no official timer was on hand to check him in when he arrived. A hurried call, however, brought that gentleman on the run, and Shorty and his champions were allowed to proceed to their quarters for a much needed sleep. thirty minutes later two more specks both evidently trying hard for second place, came into view; they proved to be Grayson, the past champion and dog musher par excellence; and a stranger to your correspondent, Allan MacDonald, a native of Cape Breton, Nova Scotia, now a prospector out of Le Pas. Mushing a team of seven powerful Huskies, the Nova Scotian came on, with the ex-champion, though making a splendid fight, a considerable distance behind. Mac-Donald swept over the finishing line exactly thirty minutes behind Shorty, and Grayson about ten minutes behind him. Both the latter drivers had also broken the previous world's record; but Shorty and his long-legged friends had already walked off with the bacon. F. New Brunswick Kennel Club Show

The sixteenth Annual Dog Show to be held by the New Brunswick Kennel Club was held in the Agricultural Hall at the Exhibition grounds on September 1st, 2nd and 3rd, when 218 dogs were entered for the judicial inspection of the American expert, Mr. J. Willoughby Mitchell of Brooklyn, N.Y., who had just returned from a trip to the Continent of Europe with many fine dogs for imported American kennels.

The catalogue was brimful of 717 entries which had been made, but Secretary Mr. Francis Kerr found sufficient space for several snappy little stories about dogs, which evidently had been collected from many sources and which must have been useful in driving dull care away from many fanciers during the show. Here is a sample:-

"Those who have seen the famous police dog, movie actor, 'Strongheart,' known as the 'Wonder Dog,' 'The Dog that Thinks,' 'The Human Dog' and other titles, will appreciate this story.

"A little ragged urchin was observed standing in front of a New York theatre the other day. Accompanying him, and tied to a string, was what is known as a 'measley yellow cur', just dog, plain dog, with no pedigree, and so far as the boy was concerned, it didn't need any. He was 'me pal,' and that explained a lot. Outside the theatre was a big poster of 'Strongheart,' and surrounding the picture of the dog was the following in big type:- 'Strongheart the Wonder Dog, the Dog Who Thinks.' The boy had evidently been looking at the poster and reading the accompanying titles. He turned to the dog who was sitting on the sidewalk looking adoringly at his young master, and said, 'I go and name ya "Strongheart" and ya never do anything like what he does. What's the matter with ya anyhow? Ain't ya never goin' to 'mount to anything? Never, never, never?" "

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

Editor, "Kennel and Bench."

It was with interest I read your comments under the headings "Marching On" and "As we were just saying", in the Sept. issue of "Kennel and Bench," with reference to the dropping off of entries at the Toronto C.N.E. Dog Show, and the lack of support given by fanciers to certain other shows throughout the country.

There is no doubt that the dog showing game is not going ahead as it should do, and one of the chief reasons why, is that given by the well known terrier fancier W. E. Baker, Jr., of New York, in conjunction with his review of Airedales at the recent Newport show, and published in "Field and Fancy" of Aug. 30th.

Mr. Baker's remarks apply equally as much to the majority of our Cana, dian shows as they do to American, so far this season, and for the benefit of those who are not readers of "Field and Fancy", I am taking the liberty of quoting his views on this matter, of non-support and lack of interest in our dog shows. It will be noted that Mr. Baker also gives a remedy for these "ills," and one which I consider is worthy of serious thought by the C.K.C. and all show giving clubs.

This is what Mr. Baker has to say: "As is the case today, the show was chiefly local, with the exception of those being campaigned by some of the professional handlers. This is due to lack of money prizes in the regular classes. Without much question, no one except a wealthy man, being able to exhibit nowadays. Hence this more or less localization of the entries at our shows today, and the general let down in interest in Airedales, as well as the other breeds, the whole game being an entirely too expensive a proposition for the working man fanciers and those in moderate circumstances, with their often exceedingly good dogs at a home show.

The remedy, of course, is fairly obvious-the withholding of championship points from all shows excepting those giving money prizes in the regular classes, and perhaps a reduction in the number of classes, if necessary in order to give more competition. Say, a junior (nine to eighteen months), American-bred, limit and open, doing away with puppies and novices-which would eliminate a lot of the distemper cases. I can see no future in the dog game until it returns to a business basis with cash prizes, enabling a man with a really good dog to at least pay his way. The few shows that do run cash, pretty clearly demonstrate this point, but they don't help very much, and a lot of cash specials don't do the trick either, when the money should be in the regular classes, right down to fourth place.

"Anyone gets sick of putting up good money for a mess of ribbons after a while, and Airedales are expensive dogs to keep and when it's all going out and nothing coming in, what can be expected but the dropping by the wayside of fanciers, good and true, and the localizing of our shows. This also, of course, affects the sales value of stock as well."

There are, in my humble opinion, many reasons, other than those given above by Mr. Baker, why our shows are not better supported by fanciers; but I shall be trespassing too much on your space by stating them here.

In conclusion, may I suggest that the views and opinions of readers of "Kennel and Bench" be invited on this subject. A general discussion of the case through the medium of your columns can do no harm, but may prove to be the needed "tonic," to place the majority of our shows on "their feet," thereby helping them to keep "marching on," and not standing still or going back, as they are doing today.

Whilst in England gracing the show benches at all the best shows during the years 1913 to 1917, our English contemporary "Our Dogs" never let up for a moment in their praise for the grand little "Fair Test," and it has been computed that during his Stellar career on the bench that he won over 100 first prizes, amongst them many "Best in Show" awards. Mr. James F. Strachan of "Ormsby" fame imported "Fair Test" as one of his first experiments. The breeding was unusually select and could not fail to stamp itself on Ormsby's best bitches. and Mr. Strachan's wise selection lived to be all that was expected of him. A wonder on the bench, and a marvel in the stud kennel, always a favorite of Mr. Strachan's, his passing-the natural death of advanced years being the cause—is keenly felt at the Ormsby Kennels.

The other noted Wire to leave his earthly haunts for his other abode is none other than the well known "Ch. Pride's Hill Tweak 'Em," one of Capt. Shaw McKean's outstanding terriers, a sire and a show dog that was always dependable, and one who has left a kennel record behind him that will always be hard to equal, and harder still to surpass.
